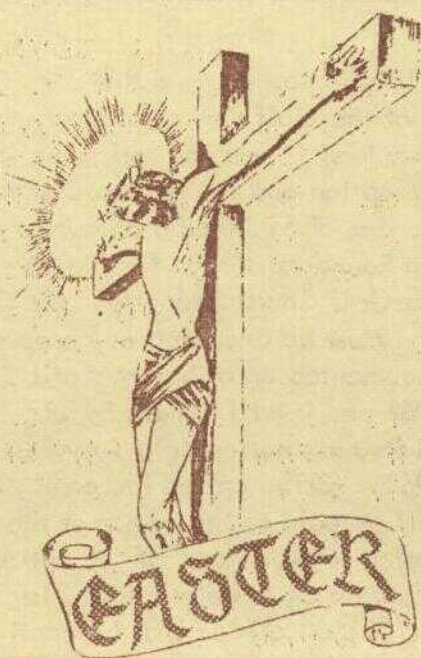

## THE LEGEND OF THE DOGWOOD

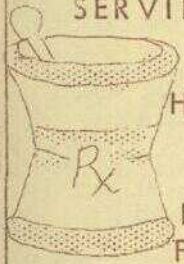
At the time of the Crucifixion the dogwood attained the size of the oak and other forest trees. So strong and firm was the wood it was chosen as the timber for the Cross.

To be thus used for such a cruel purpose greatly distressed the tree and Jesus, nailed upon it, sensed this and in His gentle pity for all sorrow, said to it: "Because of your regret and pity for My suffering, I make you this promise: Never again shall the Dogwood Tree grow large enough to be used for a Cross. Henceforth, it shall be slender and shall be bent and twisted, and its blossoms shall be in the form of a Cross - two long and two short petals.

"And in the center of the outer edge of each petal there will be nail prints. And in the center of the flower, brown with rust and stained with blood, will be a crown of thorns - so that all who see it will remember it was upon a dogwood tree that I was crucified, and this tree shall not be mutilated nor destroyed but cherished and protected as a reminder of My agony and death upon the Cross."

### TERMS REVEALED

It has been learned that Mr. C.W. Harrison, owner of the Golf Course property, has offered the Founders' Group the following terms for obtaining the option and the purchase of the property: (1) For the sum of \$1,000.00 an option may be obtained by the Founders' Group for the purchase of the Golf Course Property. (2) The option must be executed and properly documented on or before April 15, 1961 and it will remain in force until its termination date July 31st, 1961. (3) The option fee of \$1,000.00 will be paid to the owner at the time the option is executed. If the option is taken up on or before July 31st, 1961 the \$1,000.00 fee will be applied on the purchase price of the property. If the option is not taken up by July 31st, 1961 the option fee will be forfeited and the owner's commitment to the Founders will be concluded. (4) Purchase price of the property is \$27,500.00. (5) Terms: \$15,000.00 cash, purchaser to assume existing mortgage on the property, \$12,500.00. Principle payable 1965, interest at 6% payable monthly. (6) Included with the property is a set of three gang mowers purchased new July 1960, also lockers and other fixtures in one of the buildings on the property. (7) Adjustment on taxes, insurance etc. to be made at time of sale. (8) Purchaser will be responsible for the legal, registration and other incidental expenses in connection with the drawing up of the option and sale. (9) Vendor, at time of sale, to remove certain fencing on the property that was erected to contain sheep. (10) Signing officers appointed by the Founders' Group to sign the necessary documents must be legally empowered by the Founders' Group and signed copies of the motion giving this authority must be available for



attachment to the documents. (11) The above terms are being offered to the Founders' Group only.

The above terms have been offered by Mr. Harrison after much consideration and after two meetings with the Negotiation Committee of the Founders' Group. He states that this offer is final and feels that there is nothing more to be gained by further negotiation. Mr. Harrison also states that, if the Founders' Group purchase the property from him in accordance with the above terms he will undertake to subscribe \$1,000.00 for investment in the corporate body proposed by the Founders providing six other parties undertake to invest a similar amount. If this challenge is accepted by six other community-minded citizens phase No. 1 of the major project is virtually assured.

Although not to be included in the above six parties, Salt Spring Lands, Ltd., agents for Mr. Harrison, have also indicated their willingness to help this community project. They will undertake to invest \$1,000.00 in the proposed corporate body if the sale to the Founders is completed.

These two substantial offers, if accepted by the Founders' Group, would get the new Golf & Country Club organization off to a flying start. These offers of assistance will undoubtedly stimulate more subscriptions from the people of Salt Spring Island and bring this project to a happy and successful conclusion.

A meeting of the Founders' Group has been called for next Tuesday, April 4th. at 8:00 p.m. at the Harbour House Hotel to take action on the above terms. It is hoped that every Founder will attend. A printed notice of the meeting is on page six of this edition.

### POZZOLAN SHARES OFFERED TO LOCAL RESIDENTS

Holdfast Natural Resources, Ltd., owners of the Pozzolan plant on S.S.I. have offered 33,000 shares in the company for sale to local S.S.I. residents. The shares, of \$1.00 par value, are part of a 1,200,000 stock issue of which 654,990 shares have already been sold. Mr. Frank Herbert, President of Holdfast, feels that the local people should have the opportunity of investing in a local industry if they so desire. 30% of the shares for S.S.I. residents have already been sold.

roads and rehabilitating the equipment there. Major construction should begin sometime in April with the plant being in production by mid-summer.

**POZZOLAN DISCOVERED ON S.S.I.**

It was learned recently that substantial pozzolan has been discovered at the site of the pozzolan plant at Welbury Bay. What turned out to be one of the best kept secrets on this Island for a long time was revealed when tests taken some time ago showed a good grade of pozzolanic material was found to exist in the shale. It is estimated the proven reserves are 5 million tons. This will eliminate the cost and problems of barging pozzolanic shale from Port Alberni to the local plant for processing.

**AN OLD KENTUCKY GARDEN**

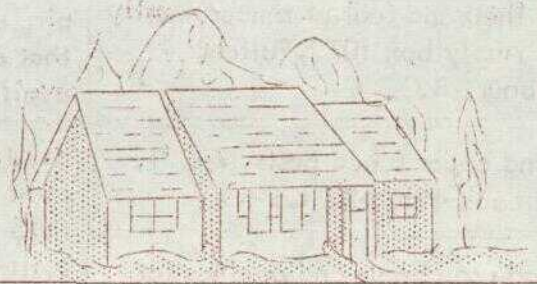

He could'nt possibly have done anything wrong. But there he lay a-grinning and a-grinning at Mr. & Mrs. Rudy Olson, when they unearthed him during the Spring gardening at their Beaver Point home. He was such a nice skeleton. Such lovely teeth, especially the lower ones- they were perfect, anyway, he turned up on Saturday morning as Mr. Olson was digging - and what a turn he gave Rudy Olson! And all it(the skeleton) did was grin at being found. How did he know they would turn him in? But that's what happened-and now poor old bones will most likely end up in the Victoria Museum. 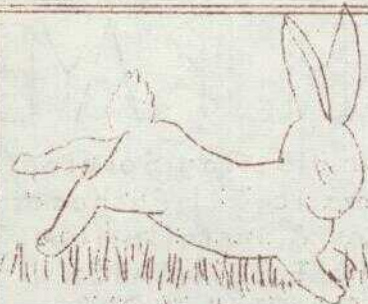

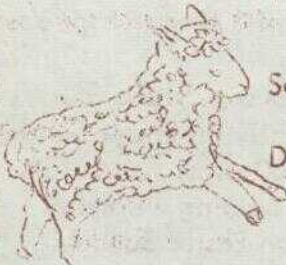

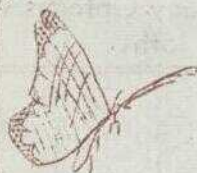

However, as you know, at the present time and for some time past, the Gulf Islands enjoy far more service than is needed and all the ferries serving this area are carrying only fractional loads most of the time with the obvious exception of holiday weekends and other special occasions, particularly such periods as Christmas and Easter. It was for this reason that the "Island Princess" was withdrawn from the Ganges service. At that time, Salt Spring Island was being served by no less than 4 ships with a combined capacity of over 800 (CONT'D P. 10)
