## HARBOUR HOUSE HOTEL

### New hotelier came from Hungary in rising of 1956

There is a change at Harbour House Hotel.

George Pozderka has assumed management of the Salt Spring Island hotel. He takes the reins over from Adriene Jonkers, who left the hotel last week.

New manager is from Hungary, originally. He left the Iron Curtain in 1956 during the Hungarian uprising. Unlike some who left during the Second World War, he is now persona grata with the regime in Hungary and able to return freely.

First move was to Vienna, but he didn't stay long.

The hotel is no new ground for Pozderka. He was in the family's restaurant trade in his native land. He studied in Hungary and took a bachelor's degree in arts before he left.

Later, he studied foods and other aspects of the hotel business at an American university.

Once out of Hungary, he found employment for a time in Vienna. Later he crossed the Atlantic and stayed with his old business.

From his studies in the United States he went to Toronto and joined the staff of the Four Seasons Hotel.

#### SOLD RESTAURANT

When he moved to the west coast he acquired his own restaurant. After getting it on its feet, he sold his new venture and came to look at Salt Spring Island, when Mrs. Cristal Herzog met him.

The new manager is already planning some changes in the operation of Harbour House. Despite his native land, George Pozderka is not intending to

specialize in Hungarian dishes. He shook his head. He will be vaunting French cooking, he explained, and he is acquainted with a variety of cuisines.

While he settles in at the island hotel, Pozderka has left his wife and daughter on the mainland. They will join him when he has everything set up for them.

In the meantime he is staying at his own hotel and closely watching the entire operation.

### Free signs from Hydro for owners

B.C. Hydro will supply 22-inch "private property" signs to property owners who have a Hydro right-of-way crossing their land.

"There seems to be a general impression," reports Ed Marzocco, Hydro's Vancouver Island production department manager, "that a Hydro right-of-way is Hydro property. This is not the case. The right-of-way is an easement only across property belonging to a private owner."

Trespassers often offer the excuse that they didn't know they were on private property, Marzocco said.

## PETROGLYPH MUST GO BACK RULES PROVINCIAL BOARD

Bjorn Simonsen, of the Archaeological Sites Advisory Board has reported that Provincial Secretary Grace McCarthy has signed the order for the return of the Fulford petroglyph boulder to the shoreline at Fulford Harbour.

Petroglyphs are protected under the Archaeological Sites Protection Act, and are not the personal property of the person who discovers them.

As artifacts, they have a meaning in terms of their locations, and should therefore be left as close as possible to their original locations while being placed above the reach of the eroding sea.

#### BETWEEN TIDES

In many cases along the coasts, petroglyphs are found between high and low tide lines, and it is not known whether this indicates a change in sea level, or whether the petroglyphs carried a message from those living above the sea to the salmon-men and other creatures beneath the waters.

The Fulford petroglyph, discovered by Gordon Cudmore when bulldozing boulders at extreme low tide for the construction of the log dump on Walter Few's property, will be placed, under A.S.A.B. supervision, near the high tide line on the shore of the harbour, near this log dump.

## Farmer loses four sheep to predators

George Smith, Beaver Point Road, reports the loss of two ewes and two lambs to dogs, two weeks ago.

He reported the loss to the RCMP and expressed appreciation of the police and their follow-up of his complaint.

The dogs got into the field, away from the road and next to the barn, says Smith.

Several other lambs were bitten and remained in shock for a time, but they have recovered.

## Fighting costs \$50 in court

Douglas C. Shaughnessy was fined \$50 on Wednesday for causing a disturbance in a public place.

Court was told that a police patrol had observed Shaughnessy, with his coat off, fighting on McPhillips Ave.

Shaughnessy had been fighting over a girlfriend, it was stated, and had then entered a building and driven a beer bottle through the wall.

## He's not in it for the pay!

He gets \$600 against \$6,000 and more

Planners on Monday heard a scale of pay rates.

Local Trustee Charles Longueay explained that the local trustee is paid \$50 per month, or \$600 a year, for his services.

Regional Director receives \$6,000 a year for his efforts and the general trustee of the Islands Trust, \$100 a day for every day he is engaged in the work of the Trust.

Neither he nor Jack Fisher

took on the job of local trustee for the pay, he noted.

He is already getting two letters and 10 phone calls a day in connection with the Trust, Longueay told the Salt Spring Island Planning Association.

## Will they pay twice next year?

What price planning? Islands are paying two mills to the Capital Regional District for planning. New Islands Trust Amendment Act calls for a mill and a half for planning.

Regional Director George Heinekey says the regional levy will be retained by the board because planning is a function of the board in other electoral areas.

Local Trustee Charles Longueay figures that the regional levy will cease and the Trust levy take its place. So does the minister, Islands MLA Hugh Curtis.

Islanders now know that planning will either cost more or less next year.

## High speed chase ends in ramming

High speed chase around the north end of Salt Spring Island on Thursday ended when a Ganges RCMP car rammed the car it was pursuing. The car was forced off the road.

Pursuit started when police were advised of a juvenile carrying a shot gun.

Juvenile was driving at high speeds to evade the police car.

When the chase stopped, the youth fired his shot gun into the ground and threw it down. No shots were exchanged with police.

Driver was apprehended. Damage to the police car was estimated at \$1,100.

## Young Canada's \$678,000

Allocations to the four federal constituencies on Vancouver Island total \$678,000 for the Young Canada Works program.

On a constituency basis, Comox-Alberni will receive \$211,000 to create approximately 100 jobs for students; Esquimalt-Saanich will get \$129,000 for 61 jobs; Nanaimo-Cowichan and the Gulf Islands will receive \$161,000 for about 77 jobs; and the constituency of Victoria-Oak Bay will receive \$177,000 which will provide about 84 student jobs.

## Drinking costs him \$500 fine

When Barry William Popowich, of Ganges, appeared in Ganges Provincial Court last week, he was fined \$500 for driving while his ability was impaired by alcohol.

The charge was waived from Courtenay and Crown counsel told the court that all documents referring to the charge had not yet been received. He offered no evidence or witnesses and Popowich pleaded guilty.

Popowich's license was suspended.

# We're being sold a white elephant

Recently the House of Commons rejected my amendment asking it to express the opinion "that the proposed construction of a MacKenzie Valley pipeline is not in the best interests of the

Canadian people".

The Liberals and Conservatives voted solidly against the amendment. Prime Minister Trudeau accused us of "jumping the gun", but under questioning he would not give an undertaking that this project would be submitted to Parliament for a vote prior to any agreement being signed for the construction of the pipeline.

### WHAT BENEFITS TO CANADA?

The truth of the matter is that the proposed MacKenzie pipeline will bring no real benefits to Canada. The primary purpose of the pipeline is to carry Alaskan gas from Prudhoe Bay to the United States.

We are being sold a white

elephant on the dubious proposition that the line will allow us to piggy-back gas from the MacKenzie Delta to Canadian consumers. The proven reserves in that area do not exceed five trillion cubic feet of gas and most of it has already been contracted to gas companies in the U.S.

Even if we get all the gas in the MacKenzie Valley - which is most unlikely - it would represent the equivalent of what we already export to the U.S. over a five-year period.

It is a travesty to suggest that Canada should spend \$8 billion; and the cost is more likely to be in the neighbourhood of \$10 to \$12 billion; and at the same time suffer the economic dislocations of such a huge expenditure, as well as the environmental damage and the disturbing impact upon our native people, in order to procure a quantity of gas which could be found by a more intensive exploration program in the southern areas of Canada.

### DON'T NEED MACKENZIE GAS NOW

We are not in a situation where we need MacKenzie gas to meet Canadian needs.

We have proven reserves of 60 trillion cubic feet of gas; we produce 2.5 trillion cubic feet each year, of which we consume 1.5 trillion cubic feet and export 1 trillion cubic feet to the U.S.

With the recent discovery of more gas in Alberta, two gas companies are already applying to the National Energy Board for permission to increase their exports to the American market. Canada can probably meet its own gas requirements for the next 20 years or longer.

Even if we get supplies from the MacKenzie Valley they would, in all probability, be exported to the U.S. since the National Energy Board Act allows any gas surplus to our needs to be exported.

My opposition to the proposed pipeline is that the huge financial expenditures, the environmental problems of laying pipe in the fragile terrain of the Arctic, and the need to settle the claims of the native population are a high price to pay for a project we don't need at this time.

We will get all the headaches

and the Americans will get most of the gas.

### THERE IS AN ALTERNATIVE

But what about the plight of the Americans who are naturally anxious to move Alaskan gas to the U.S.? Shouldn't we play the good neighbour and help them resolve this problem?

Well, there is an alternative proposal which, in my opinion, should be considered; it is called

ers. Over a period of five years this would save us five trillion cubic feet of gas, which is all we could receive from the MacKenzie Valley Pipeline.

3. That, from the time an agreement is signed, all exports of gas to the U.S. should be on a "swap" basis. This would mean that we would have the right to demand six to seven trillion feet of Prudhoe Bay gas should we need it in the 1990's or at any time we face a gas shortage.

### PRESSURE FROM WASHINGTON:

My fear is that pressure from Washington will stampede us into a hasty and ill-considered decision on the MacKenzie Valley pipeline.

A Washington press report quotes a Canadian official as saying that Mr. Trudeau has promised President Carter to speed up a decision and that "he would like to be in a position not to embarrass him". This smacks of a colonial mentality.

It's time we started to act like an independent nation or stop singing those words in our national anthem, "The true North strong and free; We stand on guard, Oh Canada, we stand on guard for thee".

the Alcan pipeline.

It would transport Alaskan gas from Prudhoe Bay through the Yukon and along the Alaskan Highway to the U.S. It has the advantage of passing through less environmentally sensitive terrain and with less social impact on the native population.

It has the added value of costing less money and, because of the highway, work can be carried on throughout the year so the project could be completed sooner.

### THREE CONDITIONS

Before agreeing to some modified version of the Alcan project, I contend that the Canadian Government should lay down three conditions:

1. That the Americans should pay the entire cost of the pipeline since its sole function will be to transport American gas to the U.S. market.

2. That in return for providing the Americans with a right of way across Canadian territory, the U.S. should assume Canada's long-term contracts to deliver 1 trillion cubic feet of gas each year to American custom-

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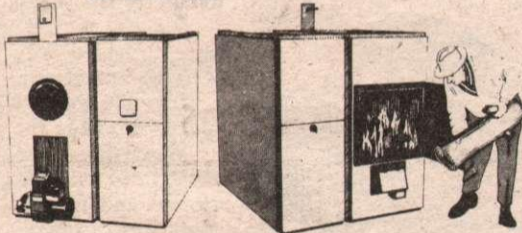

**TOURISM AND RECREATION**

Director Pat Baines reports that a very positive meeting was held with Grace McCarthy in Victoria, on Friday, March 4.

While no definite solutions were forthcoming regards funding the information booth staff for Salt Spring, Mrs. McCarthy arranged for Mr. Baines to contact other government officials in charge of such programs, and was also quite helpful in suggesting various methods to promote Salt Spring to the tourist.

Mr. Baines has meetings scheduled over the next two week period and results of these meetings will be printed in this column.

Our busy director, Pat Baines, also had a meeting with the Provincial Minister of Highways in Victoria Friday and reports that the minister was "unaware" of the controversy over the notorious St. Mary's Lake access, next to Blue Gables resort. The minister did promise, however, to hold further meetings with highways people involved and to hold another meeting with Mr. Baines in a short while in order that the situation may be resolved.

**TOURISTS OR NO TOURISTS?**

Comments attributed to Pat Baines, published in last week's Driftwood regarding tourism on Salt Spring Island, were taken from the context of a report given by Mr. Baines concerning access to St. Mary's Lake.

There has been a great degree of resistance by residents whose drinking water is supplied by the lake as well as residents living on the borders of the lake to recreational use.

It is the feeling of the Chamber of Commerce, reports Mr. Baines, that there must be adequate input from all parties involved before any steps are taken towards creating any type of access to the lake so that the interests of all be taken into consideration.

**RETAIL AND SERVICE BUSINESS**

Surveys of both the service and retail merchants on Salt Spring are nearly completed, report the directors involved, and a favourable response has been indicated towards the plan to hold seminars on the island to discuss ways of improving merchandising and service to the island consumer.

Plans are now underway to hold these seminars in the near future, and as soon as plans are completed merchants will be advised.

It is the hope of the Chamber directors that these seminars will help to provide improved services for the island consumer, as well as more communication between the consumer and the businessman.

Due to the rather haphazard weather conditions the games will be scheduled through notification of the coaches as only the play-offs remain.

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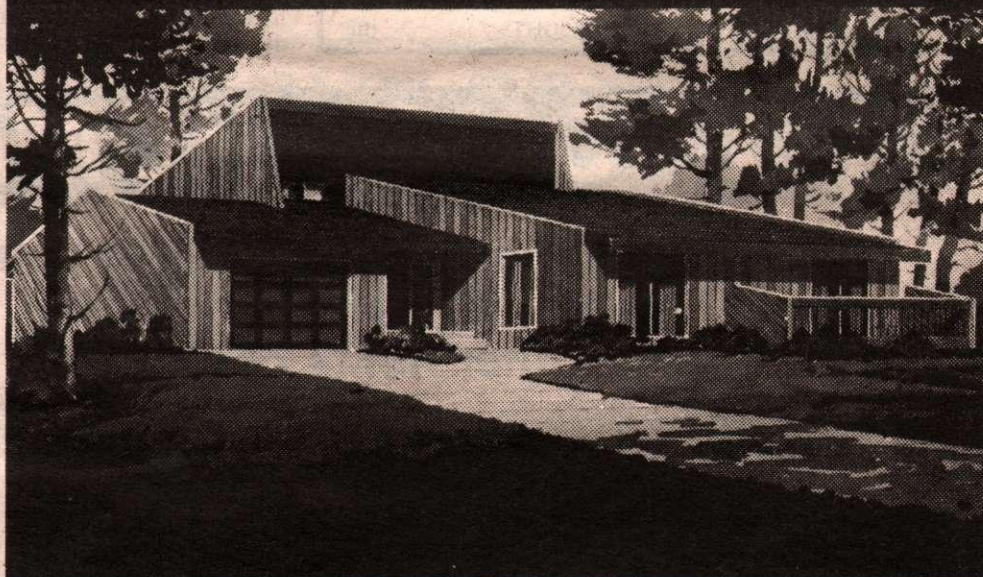
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**Inflation**

The Anti-Inflation Board has increased to 298 from 274 the number of companies required to give 30 days' advance notice of intended price increases.

At the same time the Board has tightened up its reporting requirements so that these companies must give notice of price increases that are smaller than at present.

The pre-notification procedure allows the Board to monitor significant price changes and ensure that the increase does not reflect more than increased costs incurred by the firm and will not generate "excess revenue".

The Board's new list of companies required to provide this advance notice of proposed increases included 85 firms that were not previously on the list. Another 61 companies were dropped from the list in the light of changing conditions.

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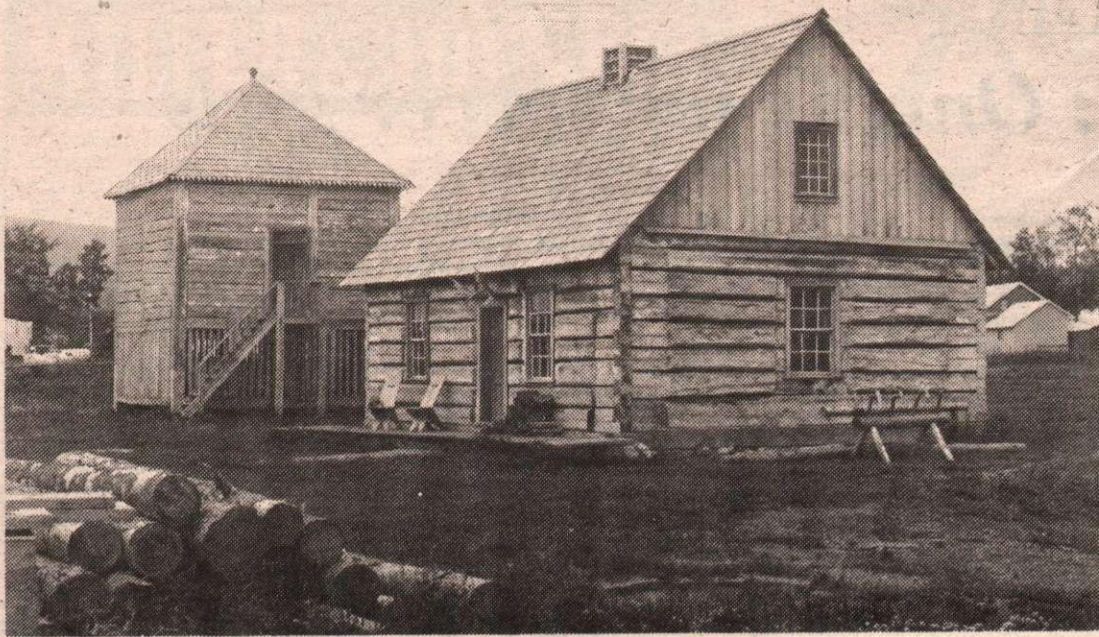
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Building on the left is the elevated fish cache built in the Red River frame style. On the right is the bunk house with dovetailed corner joints.

**ROAM AT HOME**

**Fort St. James is  
back on the map**

In the days when Fort St. James was a fur-trading fiefdom, Fort St. James was the capital of all New Caledonia, one of the few settlements west of the Rockies and north of Mexico. But, as fur trading became less important and new communities grew up to the south and west, Fort St. James slipped into obscurity, one more town off the beaten track in the northern half of the province.

Now Fort St. James is on the way back. Fifteen acres (six hectares) of the townsite have been declared a national historic park and the buildings of the fur fort are being restored in a re-creation of the fur trading and provisioning fort.

**FOUNDED BY FRASER**

Fort St. James was founded by Simon Fraser in 1806, on one of his trips west for the North West Company. After the union of the Norwesters and the Hudson's Bay Company, it became the capital of New Caledonia -- what is now the northern two-thirds of British Columbia.

Perhaps its best-known resident was James Douglas. Long before he became governor of British Columbia and received his knighthood from Queen Victoria, he was a clerk at Fort St. James. He even married the boss' daughter: Amelia Connolly, daughter of Chief Factor William Connolly.

**BUILDINGS GONE**

The buildings that originally stood on this site are gone now, but five of the fur trading buildings that date from the 1880's still remain and are in the process of being restored.

Largest and most striking of the buildings is the 1,800 square foot (160 square metre) fur warehouse now standing at the head of a former tramway from the lakeshore.

Built in 1888, it is one of the largest and best examples of the traditional Hudson's Bay Company construction style termed "Red River frame".

**RAISING BUILDING**

The 10-man restoration crew faced the major task of raising the building and setting it down

on a concrete foundation. If it had been raised in the normal way, it would have collapsed like a deck of cards.

Steel brackets were fashioned to hold the building together, and in May, 1974, the project was successfully completed.

Workmen have replaced rotted floor joists and planks, using axes to shape and lever the wood as the original fur traders did.

Upstairs in the warehouse is a trove of historical graffiti, for paper was in short supply in those days and many records were kept by writing on the walls.

**OTHERS ON SITE**

Other buildings being restored on the site are an elevated fish cache, also built in Red River frame style, and the clerk's house and a bunkhouse built in the more common dovetailed corner log style. The factor's house is scheduled for future restoration and the wooden compound that originally surrounded the fort will also be reconstructed.

The restoration of the fort is only part of the restoration of Fort St. James fortunes. In the 1960's, a paved road finally linked Fort St. James to the rest of the province and opened up the territory to fishermen and holidayers. It may never be the capital of the region again, but Fort St. James is back on the map.

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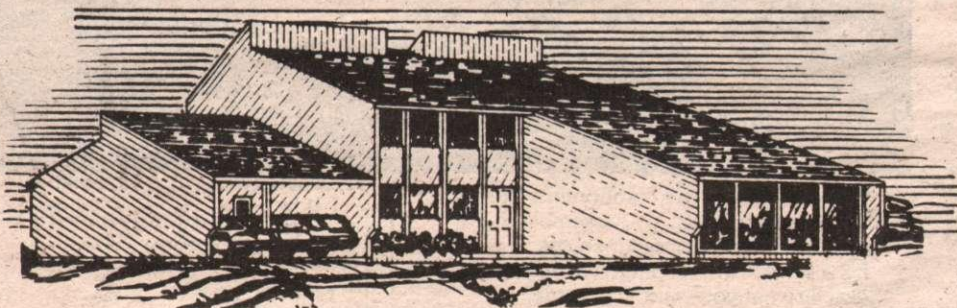

**INFO/HEALTH**

Love may make the world go around, but when a patient complains that his world is going around, the diagnosis is usually dizziness, not love!

Dizziness, known medically as vertigo, occurs when a person has a sensation of movement when none exists. The individual may feel that he is in motion or, alternatively, that objects are moving around him.

Patients frequently say that they are dizzy when they are really feeling lightheaded or faint. The sensation of spinning or rotation must be present before true vertigo exists.

**LOT OF TERRITORY**

The loss of equilibrium that accompanies vertigo indicates a malfunction somewhere in the balancing mechanism, and this mechanism covers a lot of territory in our bodies.

The central portion consists of the semicircular canals and other structures of the inner ear, along with the nerve that connects this apparatus to the brain.

In addition, muscles, tendons and joints in all parts of the body have nerve endings that send 'position messages' to the brain. Normal eye function is

also important in helping us keep our balance.

Since so many areas of our bodies are involved in maintaining our equilibrium it is not surprising that determining the cause of an individual case of vertigo may be difficult. Once the location of the malfunction has been found, the disease involved must be identified.

**DIZZINESS**

In the ear the problem may be infection, tumor, or even wax in the ear canal. Dizziness may be caused by toxins such as alcohol, certain antibiotics, and many drugs including caffeine and nicotine.

High blood pressure and other heart and blood vessel problems, general infections including influenza, mumps, measles, and syphilis, and cancer in certain parts of the brain can all result in vertigo.

It is essential to try and identify and eliminate the cause when treating this symptom. Sometimes one or both of these goals is not attainable, and medication is used to try and increase comfort. Unfortunately, these are not always fully effective, as shown by the lack of a really good motion-sickness remedy.

**Barons goalkeeper kept at fever pitch through game**

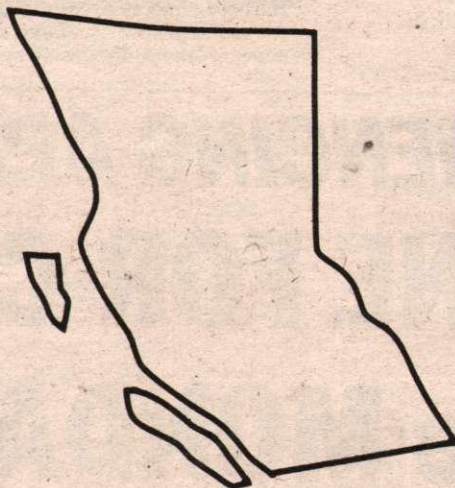

**Tax tips**

Q. What kind of expenses are deductible for child care?

A. Deductible expenses include costs of baby-sitting and day nursery care, and up to \$30 per child per week for lodging paid at a boarding school or camp. Payments for such items as food, clothing, transportation, education or medical care are not considered to be child care expenses.

Beginning this year, Canadians serving abroad in the armed forces are treated as residents of Canada and are eligible to claim child care expenses.

Q. I received a scholarship last year and had to move away from home to attend full-time courses at a university. Can I deduct my moving expenses?

A. Yes. If you moved to attend full-time courses at a university or other post-secondary educational institution in Canada you may deduct moving expenses, but only if these are claimed against award income such as scholarships, fellowships, research grants and similar awards. Be sure to include Form T1-M with your income tax return.

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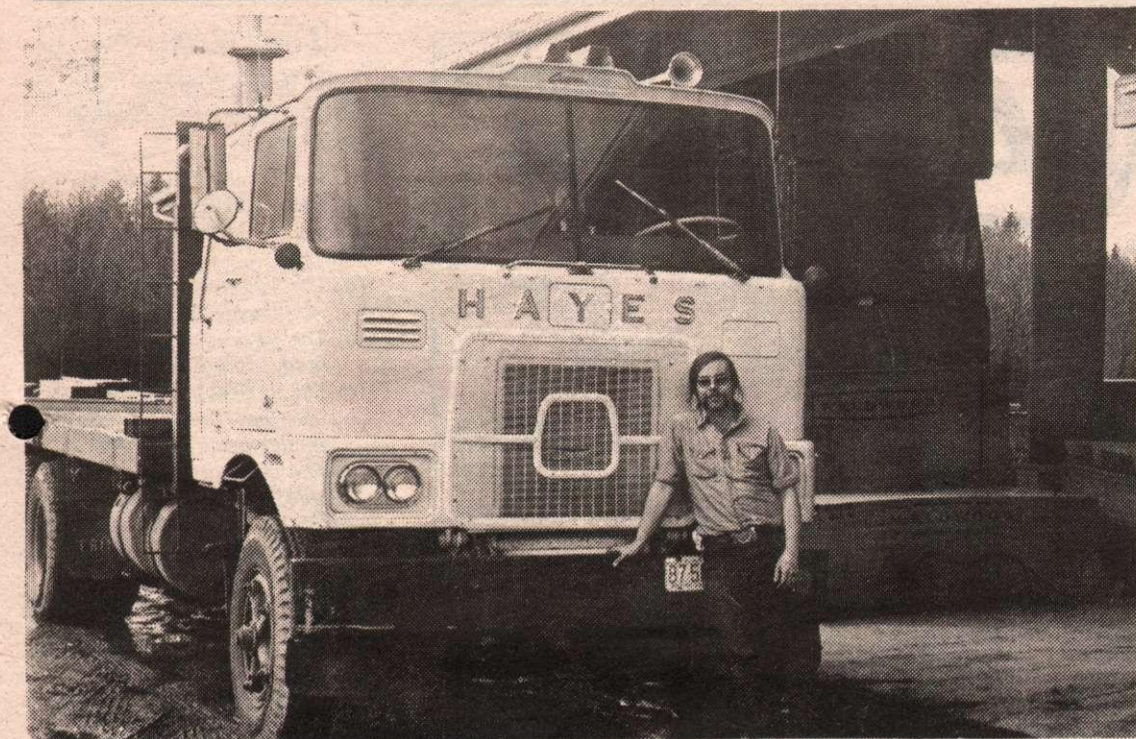
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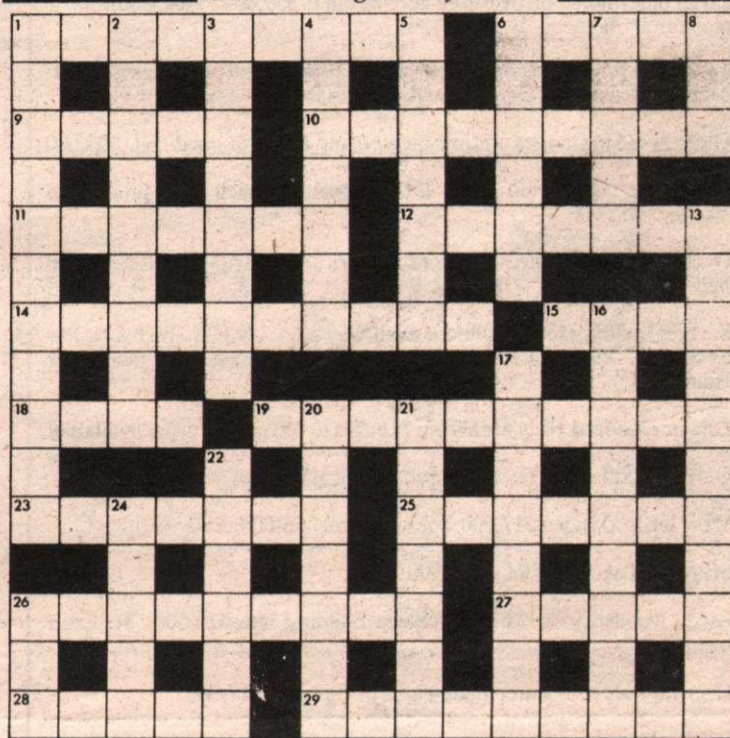

ciaries within the OAS program," Mr. Lalonde said.

"The amendments will markedly improve the consistency of treatment of beneficiaries between OAS and other social security programs, particularly the Canada Pension Plan. In addition, the provisions, as they relate to international social security agreements, will enhance the Government's ability to protect the acquired social security credits of those residents who migrate across international boundaries," he said.

Under the present Act, the OAS pension is payable either in full or not at all. Furthermore, the residence requirements attach more weight to some periods of residence in Canada than to others. The combination of these rules means that persons who have had little association with Canada are treated the same as those who have spent all or most of their lives here.

Under the proposed formula, the OAS pension would be "earned" at the rate of 1/40th of the maximum pension for each year of residence in Canada, after age 18, up to a maximum of 40 years. The effect of this amendment is to relate more directly the amount of the OAS benefit received to a person's association with and participation in Canadian society.

A minimum of 10 years residence would be required to obtain a pension in Canada. Payment of the pension abroad would require 20 years of Canadian residence.

## Tax tips

Q. Can I deduct from my farm income the wages I paid to my children?

A. Wages to children will be allowed as a deduction from income only to the extent that:

(a) The wages were actually paid during the year.

(b) The services were for the production of income.

(c) The services would otherwise have required the employment of hired help.

(d) The amount is reasonable, having regard to the age of the child, and the amount is one which would normally be paid to a stranger for the same work.

Q. I receive a pension and I am under 65. Can I claim the pension income deduction?

A. You may claim a deduction for the pension you received up to a maximum of \$1,000, regardless of age. However, some pensions do not qualify for this deduction. For more information on the types of income that do qualify, read Guide Item 46 of your 1976 Tax Guide.

Q. Under a new company contract drawn up in 1975, all contributions to our pension plan are made by the company. I did not make contributions to the pension plan in 1976, therefore, can I claim the \$5,500 I paid into a Registered Retirement Savings Plan?

A. No. You are still covered under a pension plan with your employer and therefore the maximum amount you can contribute to a RRSP is the lesser of \$3,500 or 20% of your earned income.

Q. Can I buy a Registered Retirement Savings Plan for my spouse and still claim the deduction?

A. Yes. However, the maximum amount normally deductible by you still applies. This would include your RRSP, your spouse's RRSP and your company pension plan contributions. For more details, read Guide Item 28 of your 1976 Tax Guide.

## Guides ask province for good turn to build offices

British Columbia Council of Girl Guides, which serves over 33,000 members in the province, needs a new home, and has launched a province-wide appeal for building funds.

Headquarters for British Columbia Council of the Girl Guides of Canada is presently located in rented and cramped quarters of an old office building in downtown Vancouver. This building has no provision for loading area, or on-street, off-street parking.

Last year, financial experts advised the Guides that it was time to invest in their own building. Immediately, the membership began to raise funds.

Since then over \$50,000 has been raised by Brownies, Guides Rangers and Cadets, with the first contribution coming from a Handicapped Brownie Pack that had earned \$3.75 at its school bazaar.

#### FUTURE BUILDING

In November, 1976, the British Columbia Council bought a small piece of land at 1462 West 8th Avenue, Vancouver, as a site for the future headquarters building.

In order to service its 33,000 members of which 28,000 are young girls, the B.C. Council of Girl Guides of Canada requires a new home for its paid clerical staff of nine full-time and four part-time workers, its volunteers

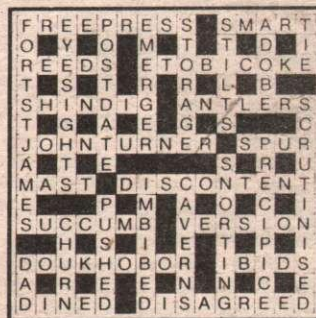
who contribute over 10,000 hours of time annually, and sufficient space for the Guide Distribution Centre and meeting rooms.

#### MAIL AND CALLS

In 1976 the Guide headquarters handled 15,000 pieces of incoming mail, 20,000 telephone calls, in addition to outgoing mail, processing of 10,000 forms and 2,000 cheques, management of the Guide Distribution Centre and other administrative duties.

Most of the money for the clerical and administrative expenses come from the annual sale of cookies and from membership assessment. The Guides receive no funds at the provincial level from United Appeal.

Now that the land has been purchased, plans have been approved for construction of the new headquarters which will be a three-storey structure on a 25-foot frontage.

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## Senior Citizens Hit Hardest by Inflation

Although most Canadians in the labor force have found that their wages have risen enough to meet increased living costs, inflation continues to inflict hardship on people whose incomes are fixed—those living on pensions, disability allowances or unemployment insurance.

These are the people most hurt by inflation. A year and a half ago, before wage and price controls were imposed, the purchasing power of those on fixed incomes was being eroded at an annual rate of 10.6 per cent. That meant that a person with a pension of \$6,000 had, in effect, about \$600 less to spend that year.

Although prices were rising their incomes were not. They were having to pay more for rent, for heat, for hydro, clothing and food.

More than a million Canadians over 65 live on Old Age Security payments plus the guaranteed income supplement. For these pensioners, their combined monthly payment averages \$216, although the maximum is now \$237 per month. That is, less than \$3,000 a year.

Although the Anti-Inflation Board is not directly involved in programs specifically directed at senior citizens, it is controlling the prices of about half the goods and services that they use.

For instance, the AIB has had a definite influence on food prices. It cannot control imports or what farmers and fishermen charge for their produce but together these amount to only about 42 per cent of food production costs.

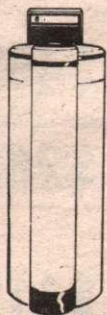

# Hartwig prepares educational book

Former Islands school principal, Don Hartwig, is now a member of the staff of the department of education. According to a report in Education Today Hartwig is preparing an evaluation booklet for elementary schools. Report is reprinted below.

A special nine-member committee has been established by the ministry of education to prepare an evaluation booklet for elementary schools.

"The committee has been instructed to write an elementary school evaluation booklet for use by elementary schools throughout the province which should both encourage and assist them to develop group self-evaluation procedures," according to Don Hartwig, acting director of field services for the ministry and a member of the new committee.

**OTHER CRITERIA**

Hartwig explained that the booklet will also include criteria for an assessment of the over-all school operation.

These criteria will include procedures for evaluating instructional programs and assessment methods as well as administrative procedures.

It will also provide the school staff with a mechanism for on-going evaluation.

"The booklet, similar to the accreditation booklet used for secondary schools, is expected to serve as a prototype and will be open to modification by local school districts," Hartwig said.

**EXPECTED**

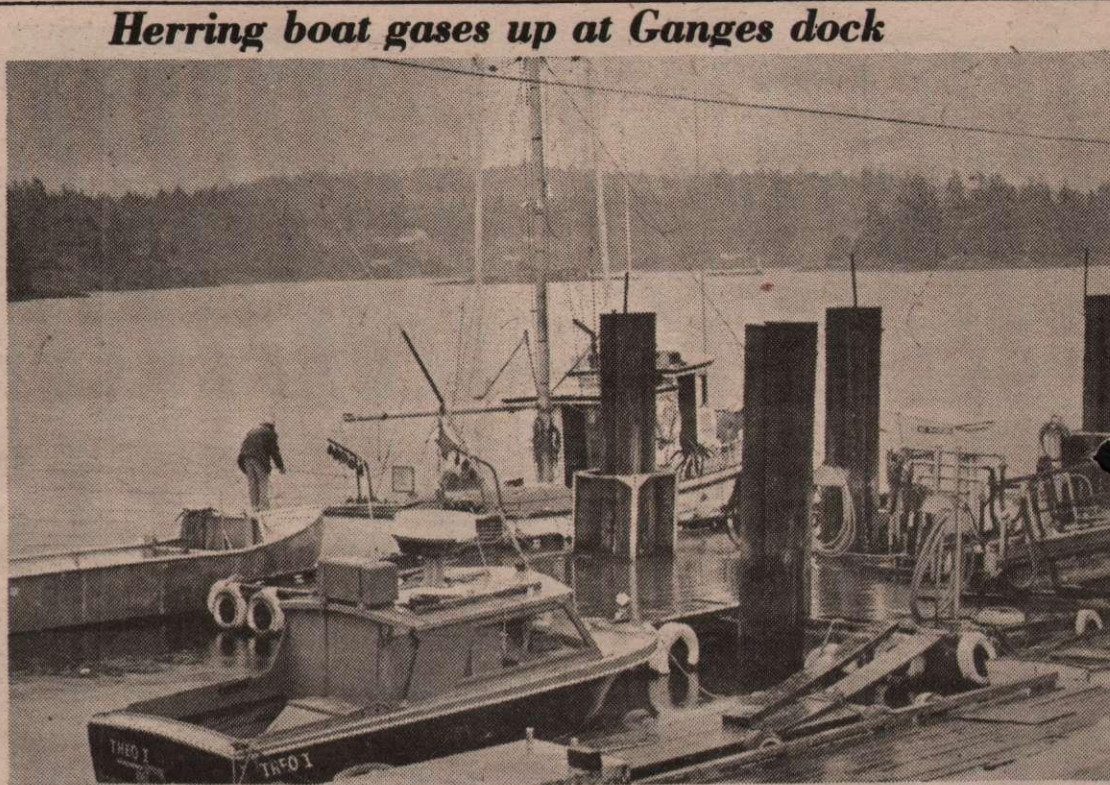
Representatives of the B.C.

Hartwig said the need for such a booklet at the elementary level has become apparent. Several school districts had begun work on their own booklets, and by forming the committee the ministry hopes to eliminate duplication of time and money.

## APPROVAL WILL COME BEFORE HIGHWAYS REVEALS ROUTE

Ganges Plan will probably be approved before the department of highways reveals where the by-pass will be located.

On Monday evening Local Trustee C.J. Longueay told Salt Spring Island Planning Association that the maps are now completed for the Ganges secondary plan and that they would be studied the following evening.

The maps have been amended in accordance with changes required after recent meetings in Ganges.

"I am of the opinion that the department of highways is a law unto itself," said Longueay.

There are four alternative routes for the highway past Ganges, but the department has offered no comments as yet.

**FINAL ROUTE**

Final route will be based on the plans and surveys to be undertaken by the department, he suggested.

There is no possibility of moving tanks in the Ganges area, noted the trustee. The Ganges secondary plan committee had suggested that one of the oil companies move its tanks, he recalled.

The company's reply had been that if the community doesn't like them where they are, they'll take them out altogether and leave the island without supplies, he reported.

The properties concerned cannot be down-zoned unless the owners request such a change, he commented in reply to a question.
