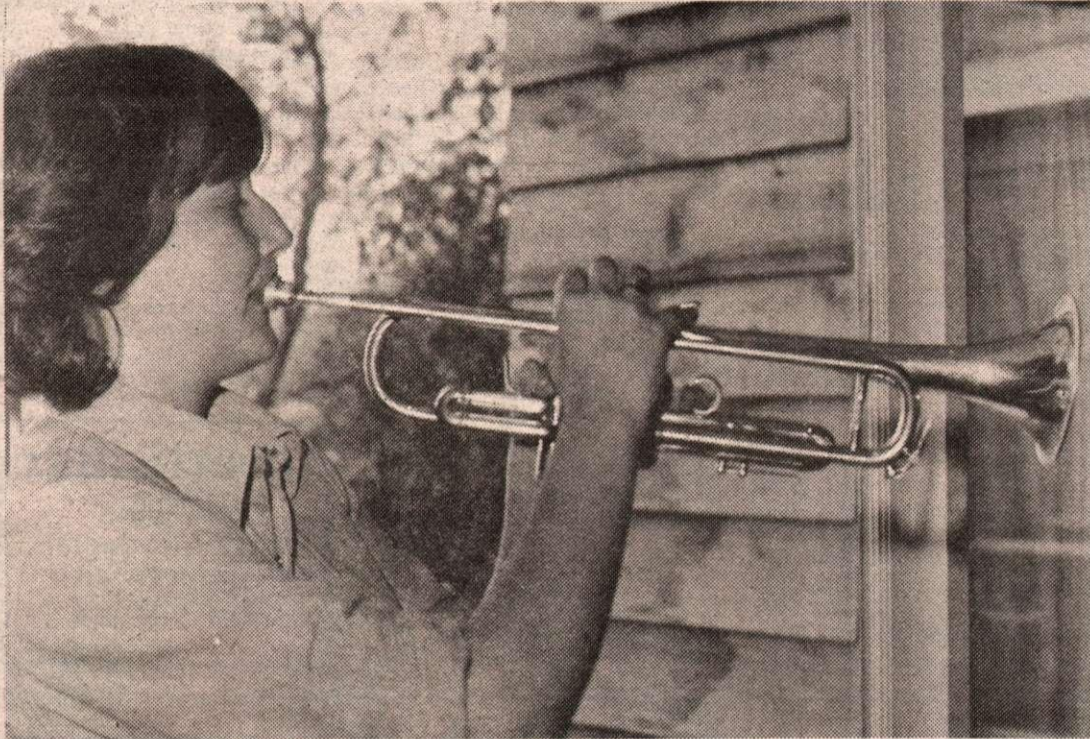

He leaves his wife, Ursula; daughter, Valerie; son, Stuart; five brothers, John, Joe, Arthur, Douglas and Donald; three sisters, Lenore, Ellen and Jessie and three grandchildren.

Funeral will be on Friday afternoon, June 3, in Ganges United Church. Rev. Dr. Vern McEachern will officiate and interment will follow in Ganges Cemetery.

## New intermediate facility about 18 months away yet

The meeting of the Gulf Islands Intermediate Care Society was held on Wednesday at Galiano. Mrs. Lorraine Campbell was in the Chair.

The financial report was prepared by A. Spencer Marr.

The meeting was informed that the 50-bed unit was approved in 1976, but no mortgage funds were available before the end of March or April, 1977.

Plans have now been prepared in rough form and it is anticipated they will be approved to permit construction to start later this year and completion could be within the next 18 months.

At the election of the represen-

tative for Galiano Island the meeting elected Mrs. Whillans for another term.

## Weed control by Primatol in islands

The growth of weeds at BC Hydro substations on the Gulf Islands is to be halted.

Hydro has made an application to the inter-ministerial pesticide committee to use the chemicals Primatol and Eramox for weed control.

Primatol, which is to be used on Salt Spring, Galiano and Parker Islands, is a mixture of Atrazine and 2,4-D. It will be used in pellet form and applied by hand.

BC Hydro environmental advisor, Harry Morgan, of Nanaimo, told Driftwood on Monday that the chemical would be used at the cable stations on the three islands.

## Dr. Saunders retires from Lady Minto

Dr. Fred Saunders has retired from the medical staff at Lady Minto Hospital. Expression of regret was heard at the annual hospital meetings last week.

We wish him a good retirement and thank him for his efforts in the past, said Dr. Peter Rowell in his Medical Staff report for 1976-7.

## Rezoned following hearings

Some of the Ganges properties belonging to Mouat's have been rezoned following the public hearing which was held last month.

They have been zoned in accordance with their present use.

A lot adjacent to the Legion Hall on Hereford Avenue belonging to Joyce Bowden-Baker has also been rezoned from residential to commercial.

# Hospital report shows surplus as near \$1 million budget is close in 1976

In a total budget of nearly \$1 million, Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital showed a surplus of \$6,737 in 1976. Administrator Harold Hoffman made the announcement at the annual hospital meetings in the islands last week.

The acute care wards were slightly down in total patient days and the extended care wing showed an increase.

Total of 636 patients were admitted to the acute care wards during the year and 10 to the extended care section. These compared with 701 in the acute care and 11 in the extended care wards in 1975.

Babies were out of luck. In 1975 there were 56 newborn children during the year. By 1976 the figure had fallen to 44.

Occupancy was also down. In the acute care wards occupancy averages 61.77%, as against 74.88% in 1975.

Extended Care wing was more than full. In 1975 the occupancy rate was 107.50% and by 1976 this rate had risen to 118.44%.

### OUT-PATIENTS

Out-patients showed an increase over 1975; 5,217, against 4,839. Physiotherapy was similarly higher, with 2,268 against 2,162.

Dietetic counselling showed 13 last year and nothing in the previous year.

Laboratory worked harder to

keep patients out of hospital than inside. In patients represented a reduction in work for the laboratory, while out-patients pushed the "units of work" upwards. The arbitrary calculation shows trends, rather than measures of time or number. In patients took 54,806 units in 1976 and 60,748 in 1975. Out-patients absorbed more units last year than in 1975, leaping from 105,640 to 119,546.

X-rays were all down for the year. In-patients accounted for 464 last year, a drop from 524, while out-patients fell from 1,953 to 1,807.

Rated capacity of the hospital at Ganges is 25 acute care beds and 15 extended care. There were 22 acute care beds set up and 15 extended care.

Laundry bill was up, with 139,775 pounds going through the cleaners, against the previous year's 126,342.

## Red Cross for three months here

Red Cross campaign will be offered on Salt Spring Island over a leisurely three months.

Campaign director Bud Kreissl reports that the campaign will run June, July and August to ease the pressure of rural canvassing.

### MEALS DOWN:WHEELS UP

Meals were down, from 42,066 to 40,067 and Meals on Wheels, which are prepared by the hospital for Salt Spring Island, rose from 1975's 2,474 to 3,061.

The hospital board is encouraging continuing education programs among the staff, reported Hoffman, is going steadily forward.

Highlight of the year was the granting of full accreditation for the hospital, having met the standards of the Canadian Council on Hospital Accreditation.

Commending the work of the Hospital Auxiliary, Mr. Hoffman described them as adding a "tremendous amount of humanitarian spirit to the hospital".

In conclusion, he expressed his gratitude to the board of management for their guidance and support.

## Public hearing in Ganges is challenged

Public hearing in Ganges on Monday was challenged by the Salt Spring Island Planning Association.

Speaking for the association, Mike Clement cited an irregularity in procedure.

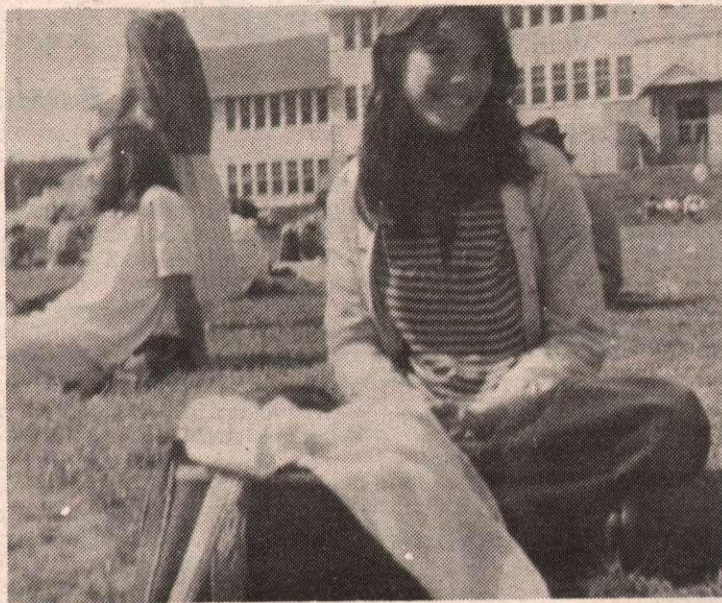
Presentation of the proposal

## New facility at Saanich is linked to islands

New facility near Victoria for the physically disabled is intended for the people of Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands.

It is the accomplishment of the Vancouver Island Housing Association for the Physically Disabled.

And it is an accomplishment to the sponsors. Recognizing the need, they provided the means.

New facility is named Nigel House and is located on Nigel Avenue in Saanich.

Nigel House has been designed by Architect John A. di Castri and constructed with the handicapped in mind. It is geared to the resident in wheel chair or using other artificial means of moving around. At the same time, it is designed to make each individual as nearly independent as possible.

That's the mechanics of it.

### IN PROPORTION

The resident enjoys assistance with the rent in direct proportion to his income. If the resident is in receipt of \$275 a month; and the sponsors point out that disabled people may be limited to earnings in this area; then he, or she, pays a rent which will leave about \$50 for pocket money. The subsidy is reduced as the individual's income rises.

It is a unique facility, in that no such provision exists at the

present time.

The link with the islands is two-fold. The facility extends its services to islanders in need of them. It was also boosted by an islander several years ago when an anonymous donor offered a two-acre island property as a draw prize to raise money for Nigel House.

That's the crunch. The structure has enjoyed considerable help from the community, but the need is still there.

Cost of furnishing the building has been estimated at \$43,000 and the sponsors need that \$43,000. They have invited the general public to subscribe. A single room costs \$800 and a

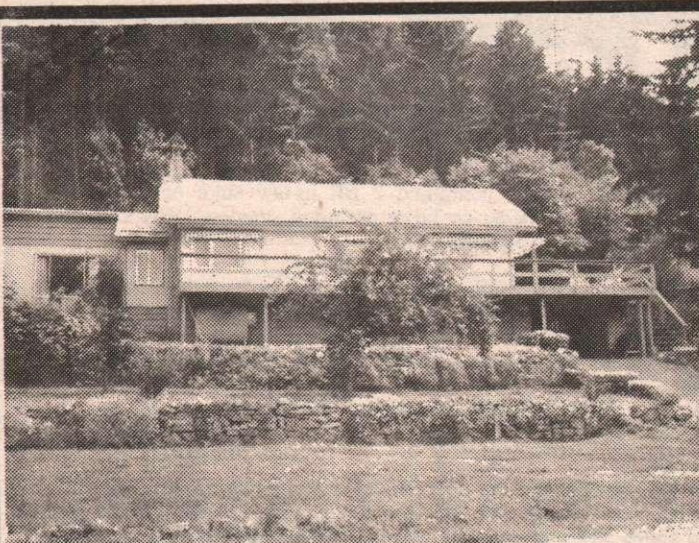

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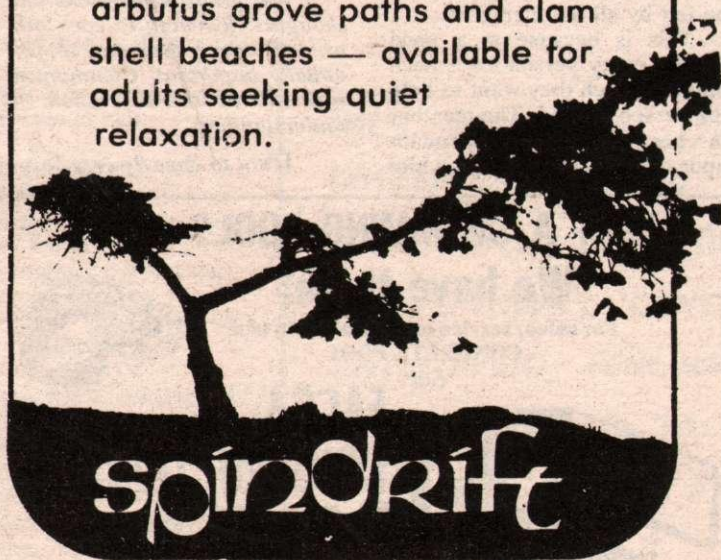

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# Nathaniel wanted to know Booth Canal: and who was he and when?

Nathaniel Booth was on Salt Spring Island last week. He was looking for a distinguished member of his family who has long since died. An uncle was John P. Booth, who once owned a substantial holding on Salt Spring Island, who went to Victoria to represent islanders and who left his name to Booth Canal.

Nathaniel Booth was from California on the island. Recently married he was spending a honeymoon in the shadow of his Canadian family. He also came here with the hope that Salt Spring Island Booth might be named Nathaniel. His dreams

were frustrated. During his short stay here, Nathaniel Booth, of California learned but little of John Booth of Booth Canal.

**IN 1859**  
He did not learn that Booth came here in 1859 and was one of the first two white men to settle on Salt Spring Island. The other early white settler was Mr. Sampson. The authority for this information is Margaret Walter's Early Days Among the Gulf Islands, lent to me by Mrs. Jessie Toynbee.

John Booth was a Scot. In the course of time he married a Welshwoman who had been

widowed, a Mrs. Griffiths. His marriage brought him her property, a Salt Spring Island farm now the property of the Harkema family.

Booth had been elected to the legislature as a young man. After his marriage he returned to his political concerns and was re-elected for several terms. Before his final retirement from public affairs he served as Speaker of the House in Victoria.

**BURIAL PLACE**  
Further question raised by

the California visitor was the final resting place of the pioneer legislator.

John Booth had sold part of his holdings to Arthur Walter, of Bristol, England. When the first Anglican church was built on the island, the ground was too rocky to permit of the provision of a burial ground and Mr. Walter donated part of his property for the purpose.

Upon his death, John Booth was buried in the cemetery that

# President's report looks to early start on facility near Lady Minto

Two members of the Gulf Islands Intermediate and Personal Care Society were elected for a three-year term at the annual meeting in Mahon Hall, Ganges on Friday evening.

Mary Stepaniuk and P.D. Lee were both completing a one-year term. The society is responsible for the planning of a new facility in Ganges, near Lady Minto Hospital, for those between complete self-dependence and needing hospital treatment.

Highlight of the meeting was the report of the president, Lorraine Campbell. The report is as follows:

\*\*\*  
At the first annual meeting of this society, in May, 1976, all members of the board of trustees were elected, the length of term varying from one to three years.

From now on, a term on the board of Trustees will be three years.

This means approximately one third of the board members will be elected each year.

Regular monthly meetings have been held throughout the past year. All effort has been towards establishing an intermediate and personal care facility on the property adjacent to the Gulf Islands Lady Minto Hospital.

By July, Central Housing and Mortgage Corporation had approved a start up grant of \$9,400.

The loan from the Gulf Islands Lady Minto Hospital, which had enabled this society to begin planning an intermediate and personal care facility was repaid.

**ARCHITECT NAMED**  
Ray Goldsworthy was appointed architect to design a 40 bed facility.

In October, the architect's preliminary plans for a 40-bed residence capable of being enlarged to 50 beds had been prepared. At this time the Department of Human Resources recommended that a 50-bed facility, with no allowance for expansion be planned.

Initial plans for the 50-bed facility were ready in November.

A lease agreement was entered into with the Capital

Regional District, whereby this society, for \$1 per year for a period of 99 years has the property adjacent to the Gulf Islands Lady Minto Hospital for intermediate and personal care services.

Early in December it was found that mortgage money earmarked for the Victoria area had been used elsewhere and, it was believed that no mortgage money would be available until March, 1977.

This caused a slowdown in the development of plans necessary to make a mortgage application.

**SEWAGE DISPOSAL**  
Sewage disposal has also posed a problem in applying for a mortgage. It is hoped that a sewage system for the Ganges area will be a reality by the time the intermediate and personal care facility is built. In the meantime, the feasibility of a septic tank field is being ascertained.

Preliminary staffing, budgeting, and furnishing estimates are also included in the mortgage application. Visits to several functioning facilities by board members aided in the preparation of these estimates.

I am pleased to be able to report that the application for the mortgage is nearly complete.

The local C.M.H.C. representatives are most anxious to have it before the Corporation committee for consideration before the end of this month.

The Department of Human Resources, which also has to pass on the annual operational costs, seems to want this application to go forward as speedily as possible.

**WHOLE COST**  
The mortgage is for the whole capital cost of the project as the provincial government no longer makes grants towards this type of housing.

However, the provincial government will aid in the operational costs.

According to Mr. Bennett's most welcome release, the charges for long-term care will be \$6.50 per day. This will be to all residents, regardless of their financial status.

Admittance to the facility will be based on the need for the care offered.

I would like to thank the Board of Management of the Gulf Islands Lady Minto Hospital and especially the administrator of the hospital, Mr. Hoffman, for the cooperation given to this Society's Board of Trustees.

I would like to repeat the last sentence of my report of last year. "Full support of all residents of the islands is going to be needed to assist in attaining a functioning lodge providing intermediate and personal care within this community." The Society has not been approved as a "Charitable Organization" by the Department of Revenue. During the coming year the monies for the furnishing of this facility will have to be raised. The support of all Gulf Islanders is needed in this endeavour.

## Peggy Stacey is tops

The first tennis tournament held this year at Portlock Park was won by Peggy Stacey.

Val John was runner-up and four others tied for third place.

Ten juniors, 16 years and under, played five sets each.

Using the "round robin" plan, each player played with a different partner in each set and played against a different pair of

First prize was won by Peggy Stacey - one dozen new tennis balls. The runner-up, Val John won six, and the prize of three tennis balls, for the best loser, had to be drawn from a hat, since all were such good sports. Penny Wright won.
