Horses and bicycles both ahead

Pony Express delivers newspaper in Manitoba ahead of regular mails

It was a straight race. The Post Office lost. The ponies won.

The Manitoba newspapers invited the Canada Post Office to compete in mail delivery.

In February the challenge was sounded by Ian McKenzie, president of the Manitoba Community Newspapers Association: can the Canada Post Office deliver as fast as the Pony Express?

The Pony Express would deliver a series of newspapers along the route from Melita to Morris, a distance of 202 miles.

Each pony ran a distance of between five and 10 miles.

The first paper to hit the express bag was the Melita New Era. At Deloraine the Pony Express picked up the Deloraine Times and so on through the route.

At Morris, the president of the Canadian

Community Newspapers Association was waiting to receive the mails....one way or another.

The galloping started on July 19. On July 20, some 15 hours later, the ponies came charging into the Morris Stampede. The mails arrived later.

Postmaster General J.J. Blais accepted the challenge and then covered his bet, when he introduced a third factor into the race.

The Post Office engaged a team of racing cyclists to take up the challenge. And the bicycles came in ahead of the ponies.

The Pony Express proved that it was quicker by horseback.

The Post Office proved it was quicker by bicycle. And the mails eventually arrived in Morris.

The event was the opener to the annual convention, in Winnipeg, of the national newspaper association.

Grass fire

Grass fire on Corbett Road in Ganges brought firemen out on Friday, July 22, when an incinerator or sparked some dry grass.

Firemen attributed the fire to an unscreened incinerator on the Wally Kowalski property.

It was extinguished without incident.

From Deep Cove to Horton Bay

A float being installed at the wharf at Horton Bay, Mayne Island, has left some residents of Deep Cove, in North Saanich, a little upset.

Federal small craft harbours branch manager William Parkinson said two weeks ago that the wharf at Deep Cove was no longer economically justifiable. It was felt that it could be used more effectively at Horton Bay.

The float is a small one, said Parkinson, and can only accommodate two boats at a time. There is also a private marina adjacent to the government wharf at Deep Cove and the government doesn't want to compete with private marinas, he continued.

Meditation instructor to visit island

Lama Kalu Rimpoche, chief meditation instructor of the Kagyu sect of Tibetan Buddhists will arrive on Salt Spring Island, Saturday July 30. It will be his first visit to the land near Mt. Tuam chosen by the Kagyu Kunkyab Chuling Buddhist Dharma Centre for its meditation retreat facilities.

He and his party will be staying on the land until Sunday afternoon and further dedication ceremonies will take place there. Transportation up the mountain will be provided for those wishing to attend.

Kalu Rimpoche has recently arrived from France where he was conducting the first three year meditation retreat for westerners in Tibetan Buddhism. He will be staying in Vancouver for about two months.

Each Tuesday and Thursday evening he gives teachings in the foundations of Buddhist meditation at the Neville Scarf Building at U.B.C. and a five day seminar is planned at the land on Salt Spring from September 1 to 5.

Bulk mailing, copying and typing services

Telephone answering service to be fully operational by August 1

The new telephone answering service on Salt Spring Island may be a new endeavour, but it has quite a history.

Excitement surrounding the service is high, not just because self-employed islanders, small businesses and service club members will enjoy new freedom.

The service, which becomes fully operational on August 1, following two weeks of professional training of employees, is the culmination of months of volunteer efforts by islanders.

Last fall a group of parents, foster-parents and teachers of the handicapped, boarding home ope-

rators and the handicapped themselves met to discuss common concerns; employment that used the full capabilities of the physically handicapped and training for the mentally handicapped.

Ruth Clarkson, Bev Saunders, Wendy Coombs, Mary Lou Speed and Kathy Lightman took on the job of realizing these aims. They are to be joined later by Pamela Jay.

Singlehandedly the group raised funds through a quilt raffle and monthly car washes to set up a telephone answering service. Such an endeavour met the criteria of the committee: it would provide employment with which physical handicaps would not interfere in

performing a quality job. It would fill a real community need. It would be self-supporting and not compete unfairly with existing island businesses.

Any profits in excess of expenses and salaries would go toward establishing a training program for mentally handicapped adults many of whom have never had access to education which would provide social skills and employment preparation.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICE

The group cannot stress too strongly that this is first and foremost a reliable, professional service. It has been set up with the assistance of Pamela Jay, a former

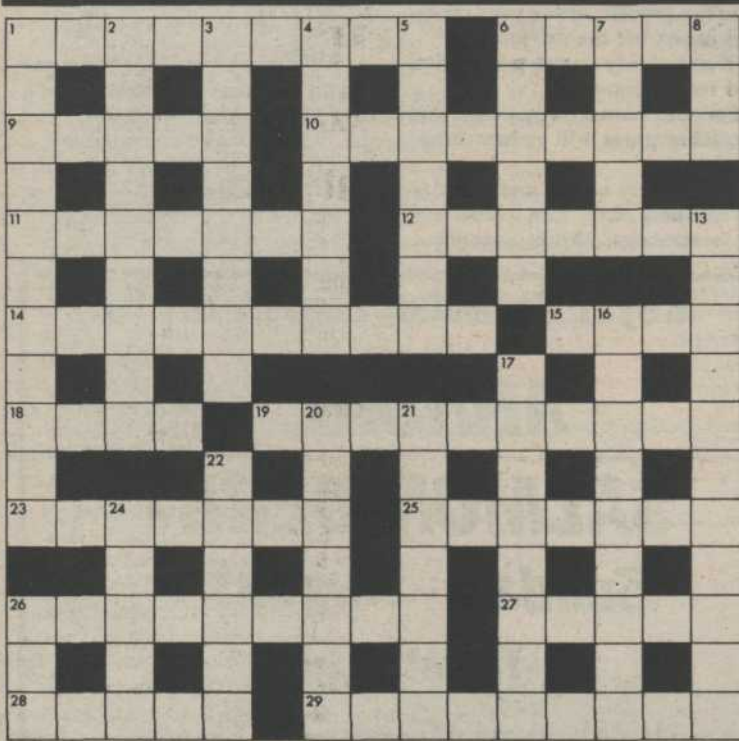

Water wastage cost — energy and money

Few Canadians who on getting up of a morning, turn on their taps, realize what a great and exceptional blessing they have in just having the water there.

Even fewer realize how lucky they are to have water that is of good quality and purity.

Of all the hundreds of millions of people who share the earth we live on, less than one in every 100,000 are able to turn on the tap and get water at will, and even fewer can safely drink it without having to boil it or treat it in some way.

Few nations look after its people's water-needs the way Canada does. Many nations think a stand pipe at the corner or a convenient well is good enough. Others pipe it in, but don't worry about quality or purity, leaving the user to cope with these problems.

SICKNESS AND DEATH

Asia houses two thirds of the world's population, but with very few exceptions its inhabitants (two out of every three of the people on earth) habitually drink and wash in water that would bring sickness, and even death, if used by Canadians.

Canadians are among the one in every 100,000 who enjoy pure water straight from the tap. It is only when you have lived in other countries that you realize what a wonderful thing it is to turn on the tap and drink without asking, "Is it safe?", "Should I boil it first?"...

Even in the great and glamorous United States, the people do not do as well as Canadians, water-wise. In the big cities the water bubbles with residual detergent, whilst, across the nation, a large percentage of the people drink coffee because the water is not good enough to make tea.

HIS LIFE LINE

In the old days no one had to remind the desert prospector to conserve his water, for those canvas water bags on his burro's back were his life line and his insurance.

Today, those who have the duty of ensuring a good and steady supply of water go to great trouble and expense to make sure that when you turn on the tap, the water comes gushing out, and it is as good as nature and circumstance will permit.

Constant vigilance and the expenditure of many, many dollars was the price paid to get it where it was wanted when it was wanted. Yet, how few of us think nothing of wasting more water every day than the old sourdough used in a week?

ENERGY AND WATER

Air and water are the greatest aids to living and, whereas most persons in recent years have become aware of the need to protect the air, few people, including some of the most dedicated environmentalists, worry about wasting water.

Before water can reach the tap it must be pumped, purified and stored, all of which is only brought about by the use of energy. To waste water is to waste energy. To save water is to save energy.

With simple steps and common-sense in any household, large

amounts of water can be saved, for water conservation benefits not only those who practice it, but the community generally. In the house some of the most effective ways of saving water are: **Toilets:** Use them only for what they are meant for; use the trash can for cigarette butts and the contents of ash trays.

To save some flush water you can weight a plastic bottle, fill it with water and set it inside the storage tank. This will reduce the amount of water used each flush.

Test for a leaking toilet by putting a few drops of food colouring in the tank. If it shows up in the bowl after a few minutes, it is leaking and needs a new rubber in the valve. Even small leaks can

waste a startling amount of water.

Showers: Having a shower uses about 10 gallons a minute. You can buy a shower flow control insert cheaply and it will save a lot of water. When you take a tub, put the plug in before turning on the tap.

Automatic clothes washers use about 30 gallons a load. If you always wash with a full load you will save water and noticeably reduce your Hydro bills.

Don't hose pathways: sweep them!

In the garden, water your plants and grass: not the driveway.

Water slowly to get penetration and reduce run-off.

Set your mower to cut high and the taller grass will reduce evaporation.

Water early or late and never at all on windy days. This avoids loss by evaporation. Make sure hose

connections are tight and fix holes and leaks as soon as they appear. Dig out weeds and cultivate frequently.

Whether your water comes from a well or a waterworks, it takes energy to get it to you, so saving water means saving energy and that's the national need.

Intercept service on your private line will be available five days a week between the hours of nine and five at the rate of \$25 per month. An alternate number to which you can refer calls when there is no answer at your own is available at \$17.50 per month for the same hours.

Expanded hours of service as well as paging and radio monitoring will be possibilities as the demand arises.

Bulk mailing, copying and typing services will also be provided upon request from the public at an hourly rate. Small businesses, service clubs and organizations that get bogged down in paper work might be interested in this service.
