## NO HELP FOR ALTERNATE CLASS

### Plea for assistance turned down by Gulf Islands School Board

A request for an aid to assist the teacher of the alternate class at Ganges was turned down by the Gulf Islands School Board on Thursday.

A delegation of about 12 parents of alternate class students attended the school board meeting at Ganges.

One spokesman for the group, Mary Williamson, asked the board if any consideration had been given to the request for more money for the class.

"We have the maximum number of students in the class now," she said, "and there is a considerable waiting list of students wishing to get into the class."

"The teacher, Reid Collins, needs more help," added Mrs. Williamson.

"There are 20 students of varying degrees in the class now and they range in age from grades one to 10," she explained. "One teacher is not enough."

Another spokesman, Phyllis Coleman, told the board she felt that it was humanly impossible for one teacher to handle the class at its present size.

Ann Foerster suggested that the teacher to be engaged for the hospital and homebound program could help with the alternate class. However, some of the delegates felt that this teacher would not have sufficient time.

#### MONEY AVAILABLE

One spokesman said that they had been led to believe that money was available for the hiring of an assistant. A number of delegates as well as trustee Ivan Mouat and supervisor of instruction Larry Holbrook agreed that they had heard the sum of \$4,500 mentioned in relation to possible assistance for the class.

Mr. Holbrook explained that he believed that secretary-treasurer Wilf Peck had told him of the money.

After giving the matter some thought, Mr. Peck recollected talking to Mr. Holbrook about it. The amount of \$4,500 was left over from the money allocated as salary for community worker, Nick Gilbert, explained the secretary-treasurer.

However, it was pointed out by Mr. Peck that the sum was part of a larger sum amounting to \$20,000 that was to be used for teachers' salaries. The board had already spent that money by deciding to hire extra teaching staff, he warned.

District superintendent Bob Huestis agreed that there was a disadvantage in having 20 students of different ages under one teacher. But the parents have a choice, he reminded them.

#### ALREADY A SCHOOL

"There is already a grade-school here where the parents can send their children," he suggested. "I don't think the parents should expect the board to spend more money on the alternate class."

"In June, the school board decided that the alternate class needed some assistance," Phyllis Coleman told the meeting.

Ivan Mouat agreed that the board had signified that assistance would be forthcoming.

"We said we'd try to do something for the class and so I move that a full-time aid be engaged for the school year to begin as soon as possible," stated Mr. Mouat.

Motion was seconded by Roma Sturdy but was defeated in the vote when the four outer islands trustees voted against it.

"Each one of you who helped defeat this motion must feel a lot of hostility towards the alternate class," said Phyllis Coleman in parting. "You've denied a number of parents the freedom of choice to have their children in an alternate system. You've also denied the children the education of their choice."

## Car rolls

## More Salt Spring seniors as Enrolment down slightly in Gulf Islands schools

Total enrolment of all the schools within the Gulf Islands School District is down from last year. There are 1,026 students registered in islands schools this year, compared with 1,040 last year.

The only school with increased enrolment over last year is Gulf Islands Secondary with 361 students, an increase of 19.

At Salt Spring Elementary there are 441 students this year; at Galiano Island there are 46 students; at Mayne, 68; Pender, 69; and Saturna, 21.

# Saga of a sewer

Recently it has been my lot to be faced with a barrage of questions about the sewer in Ganges, and also it has been my misfortune to be assailed by those who hold in question the work of the Sewer Committee.

I feel therefore, that I should seek to trespass upon your literary space in order to explain that the present situation . . . so wrought with wailing . . . is not the doing of the Committee.

It was in 1974 that the Planning Association set up the committee, to deal in a constructive manner, with a tirade of troubles arising from the decision of the Pollution Control Board to deny a proposal for a sewer, sewerage treatment, and outfall into Ganges Harbour. The committee set out to find alternative methods to the conventional type of sewage treatment, bearing in mind that the time had arrived for residues to be returned to the soil.

Eventually, after hard and laborious research, the committee recommended to the Regional Director

(who was a member of the committee) that consideration be given to the Coulthard process for dealing with solids and a coal filtration process for liquids.

#### LUKEWARM

The response of the Capital Regional District to the proposal

but decided to pursue the matter further at a higher political level... that of the Minister of Housing (the MLA for the island)...suggesting to him that such an experiment at Ganges, might set a precedent for other places having similar problems.

But, we pointed out, experimentation is of such a nature that it needs to be financed in a manner to accept failure as well as success.

The Minister accepted the idea with alacrity, his enthusiasm being echoed by three other ministers in the Cabinet.

The Chief Engineer to the CRD responded by setting up a section within his department to investigate alternate technologies in the field of sewerage disposal. Even so, much time passed and there seemed to be little progress.

#### CONCLUSIVE

The committee, therefore, made strong representations to both the Minister and the CRD, with the result that a meeting was called in Victoria at which all parties directly concerned were invited. The meeting was forthright and conclusive.

As a result, the engineering department of the CRD produced an excellent report, explaining the need for an experimental system in Ganges and advocating the Coulthard system for dealing with solids and a Rohrer system for dealing with liquids...and as part of the experiment, a coal filtration plant for information.

This report, together with a request for financial assistance to carry out the experimental part of the installation, was placed before the Minister of Housing in the middle of November, 1976. At that time I must confess to a sense of jubilation as well as fervent hope... a situation shared by the Regional Director, who communicated to the press his feelings.

Then there was silence...and

Gordon won in three exciting sets. The skill and style shown by these two young players would have done credit to players of any age in any tournament.

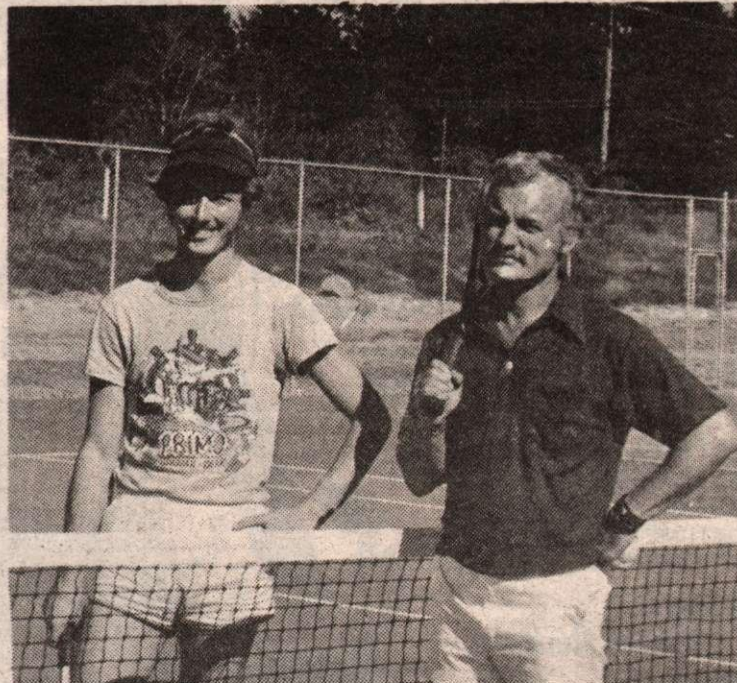
Gordon McQuiggan also won the senior mens consolation singles, defeating Jeff Savin in three sets.

continued silence . . . hopes dwindled.

### OPPOSITION GROWS

Some time later it was learned that opposition to the proposed experiment existed within the Provincial Government Offices as well as the Pollution Control Branch.

Bureaucrats do tend to look backwards...it is part of a profound procedure, and a protective device.

But the Pollution Control Branch is scientifically oriented...and as such, experiments should be part of its thinking. It became clear however, that the opposition would be more content with conventional systems....but nothing was said.

It should not be forgotten that within our administrative system exist levels of opinion which determine policy without recourse to public debate, or even discussion outside itself...or so it seems.

If, for example, the Pollution Control Board, in 1974, had made known its position and recommended additional treatment and an extended outfall into the harbour, a sewer would, today, be in operation in Ganges.

As it is, the position continues to be confused.

There is public support for the Ganges experiment; the scientific evidence for the success of the experiment is favourable; the Minister...and some of his colleagues... is enthusiastic; the CRD supports the intention. There is nothing to lose, and much to be gained.

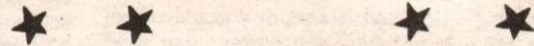
### BITTER PILL

But for those in the Ganges area who have expressed concern about costs, the pill is indeed a bitter one to swallow.

The cost of the experimental scheme is considerably less than the conventional one...and this difference is reflected in taxes. The CRD has gone to great pains to prepare estimates of the various costs, and these could be made available to the public.

The committee, during its deliberations, was mindful of rising costs, and expressed concern on behalf of the taxpayer. In fact, interest in the tax structure was also expressed, but the Director, in his wisdom, decided not to consult the committee on this matter.

### Second trip to Calgary stirs memories for reporter

What could there be on the other side of the mountains?

Why? Alberta, of course!

It was the annual convention of the Alberta Weekly Newspapers Association last week, in Calgary and I was one of a small number of British Columbians to attend.

Calgary was nothing new to me. I recalled the Palliser and the pride of the Calgarians in mentioning this colossus of tourism in the downtown spot. And I knew Calgary as the city where the street cars jumped off the tracks.

I found the Palliser and recognized the landmarks around it, but I could find no street cars. Calgary runs on gasoline today.

Still a very clean city, except for the entrance to one department

store. Calgary echoes with the beat of hammer and the song of the saw as its citizens proudly head into the second half million people.

### COMPASSIONATE TAXI-DRIVER

We found a philosophical taxi-driver whose plan was clear-cut. His family would be out of the nest by the time he was 45 and he was going to take things easy from then on in.

Same taxi driver expressed his indignation with the state of the country when he took an Ontario couple on an unsuccessful search for reasonable rental accommodation. They had spent their savings on coming to Calgary, but there was no rental accommodation in the city which they could afford to pay. So they returned home flat

broke and the taxi driver fumed at the state of the nation which can no longer serve any but the wealthy.

If there were any strong Trudeau men in the city, they remained well-hidden. From Calgary Joe Clark looks like a colossus. They even had his picture on a program at the convention.

Calgary Airport is a reminder of the past. There are but two urinals for male passengers and I was too delicate-minded to enquire of the facilities in other areas. If you want a cup of tea you have to fly to Edmonton. The restaurant only serves meals and the coffee stall serves only a brand of coffee distilled from crude oil and soft drinks.

Grubby, inadequate and ill-tended, the airport reminds me of Gander in the 1940's, or Montreal in the 50's.

Alberta is open, prosperous, easy to travel and everybody knows everybody. To prove their prosperity they constantly remind visitors that the Province is the only one remaining which does not levy a sales tax.

Progress is prosperity and prosperity is growth. The whole pattern is so simple in a bustling, aggressive city like Calgary.

I was so delighted with my visit to the Alberta city that I have decided to make it a regular habit. I went back and it is 35 years since my last visit. I have promised myself that I will have another look at Calgary in the next 35 years.

It kind of grows on you!

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## Planners call on Trust to hold up zone change

The Salt Spring Island Community Planning Association decided Monday evening to advise the Islands Trust to withhold passage of a rezoning by-law. The by-law would change the zoning of property belonging to Alex Mussick from residential to commercial. The property is situated south of the Valcourt Business Centre.

The planning association also wants the Trust to review by-law 66 with a view to adding a shoe repair business to the category of home industries.

Mr. Mussick applied for rezoning some time ago in order to set up a shoe repair business. Quentin Wilson told the association that none at the public hearing over the rezoning was in favour of the property being zoned to commercial.

"Alex Mussick had never even heard of By-law 66 and didn't know what home industry was," Wilson told the meeting.

### ALSO ASKING

Betty Galt, who owns a piece of property next to that of Mussick's, said that she was also applying for rezoning of her residential lot. After she made the application, though, she discovered that her property and a number of others had been given commercial zoning on the map of the proposed Ganges Plan. There are about five lots

affected this way, a number of them front on Desmond Crescent.

"None of the property owners in this area have been told that their zoning is going to be changed," said Miss Galt. "I've had to pay \$200 to apply for rezoning but the property is already on the map as commercial."

A voluntary Provisional Standard has just been issued by the Canadian Government Specifications Board and, although it will help ensure minimum performance standards in future years, it does not affect lids already on the market.

Consumers are advised to review methods and to follow the lid manufacturer's directions carefully.

Peck. She reported that there are no longer any really bad curves.

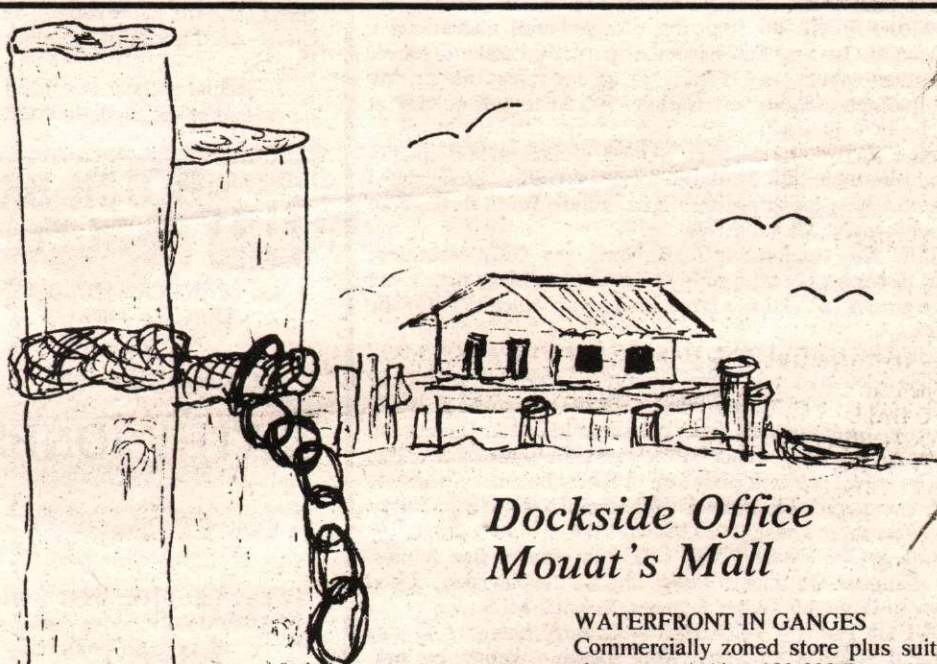

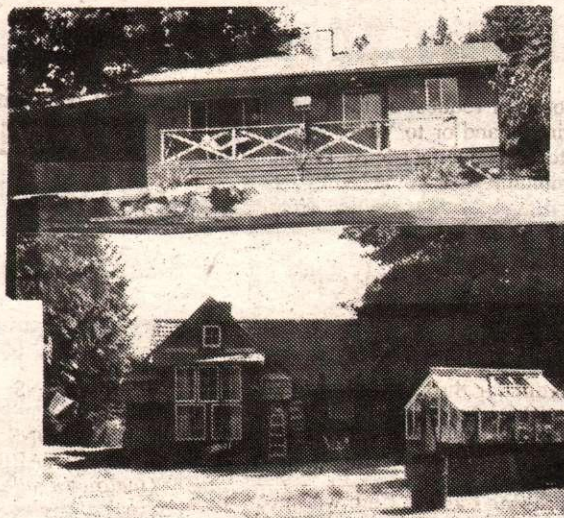

## INFO-HEALTH

**ASTHMA**  
Asthma was known to Hippocrates, and the name comes from a Greek word meaning gasping or panting.  
Bronchial asthma is caused by narrowing of the medium sized air

passages that conduct oxygen to the smaller air sacs in the lungs. The muscles lining the bronchioles or passageways may go into spasm obstructing the flow of air in and out of the lungs. In addition, the bronchial linings may become

swollen, or be narrowed by sticky secretions.

Usually the greatest breathing difficulty is encountered in trying to get trapped air out of the lungs, and a 'prolonged breathing-out time' is an important clue to the diagnosis. In the average case of asthma reaching a diagnosis is not unduly difficult.

Asthma may occur in both allergic and non-allergic people, and why certain individuals develop it is still under study. Acute asthma may occur, and chronic asthma may get worse in response to irritants such as smoke, acrid fumes, dust and cold air. Chest infections, emotional stress and strenuous exercise are other factors capable of triggering an attack.

**TREATMENT VARIES**

Treatment varies depending on whether the patient is having an acute attack or has chronic asthma. The chronically ill patient usually has periodic worsening of symptoms and then requires more intensive management.

Many effective drugs are available to treat both acute and chronic asthma, but there is no effective lasting cure except when the asthma is secondary to a permanently correctable illness. Status asthmaticus, the most severe form of asthma, is terrifying for the suffocating patient, but even this can almost always be successfully treated if facilities, knowledge and the correct drugs are available.

Management of chronic asthma is a challenge. The patient is often significantly handicapped by breathlessness and many of his activities are curtailed. The doctor (and the patient) have to balance the relief obtained from drug therapy against the possible adverse effects of long-term treatment. The newer drugs are both more effective and safer than those previously used, and this allows the chronic asthmatic to lead a more normal life.
