

Kitchen Korner

Quick breads can be nourishing accompaniments to a meal or a great pick-up alone, versatile, and rewarding for their inviting aroma.

One energetic family I know has a unique and time-honoured tradition - the men hold the guarded title of "bread-makers" and their skills provide a luxurious lunch or coffee break after everyone has worked up an appetite hiking or gardening.

PUMPKIN BREAD

This is best cold with some butter or cream cheese.

- 2 1/2 cups sifted flour
 - 1 tbsp. baking powder
 - 1 tsp. salt
 - 2 tsp. cinnamon
 - 1 tsp. ground cloves
 - 1/2 tsp. mace
 - 1/2 tsp. baking soda
 - 1 cup chopped walnuts
 - 1/2 cup shortening
 - 1 cup brown sugar
 - 2 eggs
 - 1 cup buttermilk
 - 3/4 cup canned pumpkin
- ...Sift together flour, baking powder, salt, spices, and soda. Mix in the walnuts.

...Cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy, add eggs, and beat well.

...Combine buttermilk and pumpkin and add to the creamed mixture alternately with flour mixture.

...Turn batter into a well-greased 5 1/2 x 9 1/2 inch loaf pan. Bake at 350 for an hour and 15 minutes. Turn out of pan and cool on a rack.

ONE-HOUR

WHOLE-WHEAT BREAD

- 3 cups of whole-wheat flour
 - 1 cup of unbleached white flour
 - 1 tsp. of soda
 - 1 tsp. of salt
 - 1/2 cup of honey
 - 2 cups of buttermilk
- ...Thoroughly combine first 4 ingredients. Mix honey and buttermilk and slowly stir into flours. (Batter should be thick and smooth - so reserve a bit of buttermilk/honey mixture if consistency of batter seems to be too liquid.)
- ...Pour batter into a well-greased loaf pan and bake in a 325 oven for approximately 1 hour until bread is brown, and a knife inserted in loaf comes out clean.

WHOLE-WHEAT FRUIT-VEGETABLE LOAF

- 2 tablespoons of oil
 - 2 tablespoons of honey
 - 1 cup of grated carrots
 - 1 large apple, peeled and grated
 - 1/4 cup of raisins
 - 1 cup of whole-wheat flour
 - 2 tbsp. of apple juice, or other favourite fruit juice
 - 1 tsp. of honey
- ...Mix oil with 2 tablespoons of honey, and stir in next 4 ingredients.

...Combine well and add fruit juice. Mix again and turn into a loaf pan. ...Brush teaspoon of honey over the top of loaf, and bake in a 350 oven for approximately 45 minutes, or until a knife inserted in loaf comes out clean.

IRISH SODA BREAD

Can be eaten hot or cold, and is good for sandwiches.

- 4 cups flour
- 2 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tbsp. caraway seeds
- 1/2 cup currants
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 2 cups buttermilk
- 1 egg

...Combine all ingredients and work on a board with an additional 3/4 cup flour.

...Shape into a round loaf, slash a cross on the top, place on a greased baking sheet, and bake for about 45 minutes at 350.

...Thump the loaf on its bottom. If it sounds hollow, it's done.

IRISH OATMEAL BREAD

This bread is to be wrapped in a cloth and kept in a cool place 2 to 3 days before cutting.

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups oatmeal
- 4 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 egg
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 tsp. melted butter

...Preheat oven to 350. Grease a 9 by 5 bread pan.

...Place in a bowl the flour, oatmeal, baking powder and salt.

...Beat the egg with the honey and the milk. Pour all at once over the dry ingredients. Stir just enough to blend together. The mixture must be rough and pebbly.

...Turn the batter into the prepared pan. Bake 1 hour and 15 minutes or until well done.

...Unmold on cake rack. Brush top with melted butter.

CHEESE BREAD

This is a not-so-quick bread, but well worth the time.

- 2 tbsp. dry yeast
- 2 cups milk, heated and cooled to lukewarm.
- 2 tbsp. honey
- 2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 cup nutritional yeast
- 1/2 pound of Cheddar cheese, grated
- 1/4 cup of soy flour
- 5 cups of whole-wheat flour
- Oil.

...Soften or dissolve yeast in 1 cup of lukewarm milk, with honey and salt. Mix well and let rise for 10 minutes.

...Add remaining cup of warm milk and all other ingredients. Combine thoroughly and turn dough onto a lightly floured board.

...Knead and punch dough until smooth and springy. Coat with a few drops of oil and place in bowl. Cover and let rise in a warm room until dough is double its size.

...Divide dough, shape, and place in 2 well-greased loaf pans. Let rise again til loaves are double. Bake at 375 for 50 minutes til brown.

VOTE \$7,500 FOR HOSPITAL

Auxiliary to provide access ramp for wheelchairs using new Hall

At their recent meeting, Hospital Auxiliary members voted \$7500 to the purchase of hospital equipment, plus \$1,000 to build a ramp, at Central Hall, for wheel chairs.

Required equipment listed by the Hospital Board, for the soon-to-be-expanded acute care hospital facilities and Extended Care unit, includes: Kodak X-omatic cassettes and screen; Zeiss microscope; ethrane vaporizer for anaesthetic machine; 20-inch portable electric floor cleaner; heavy duty vacuum cleaner and attachments, and an air-conditioning unit for the new Extended Care lounge. Members agreed to donate the needed equipment, to cost \$7560.

In response to a recent request from Central Hall committee for a donation to the new building, the Auxiliary offered to finance, in part or whole, a ramp for wheel chairs at the building entrance, if such a ramp could be included in the plans. This can be done, the Auxiliary was informed. Members voted to underwrite the estimated cost of \$1,000 for a durable wood and concrete ramp for the building.

Two dozen new cups and saucers were purchased for use at afternoon tea served daily to Extended Care residents. A large 10-cup teapot was donated by one of the members.

Mrs. Pamela Wilson, hospital librarian, reported an ongoing rapid turnover of paper-back books, and appealed for more books. Patients find these light-weight volumes easy to hold when reading in bed. Donated books may be left any afternoon at the hospital

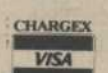

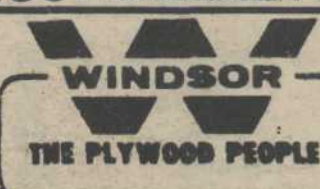

More Food for Thought

Last Thursday Dr. Guille Libresco added considerably to our understanding of the ramifications of the world-wide distribution of baby formulae.

"Bottle Babies" was the subject under discussion at the evening World Development Study group.

It is well-nigh impossible for us, reasonably sophisticated educated adults in the Western world, to calculate the impact of modern advertising on the third world. To us, a poster depicting a healthy baby is simply a photographic representation of one healthy baby, not to be mistaken for anything else.

But to an illiterate, under-nourished mother in the third world, such a poster, displayed on the wall of the miracle-dispensing clinic to which she has gone for help, is tantamount to the word of God.

This is a symbol to her of all healthy babies everywhere. In startling contrast to the babies she has around her, or those who have already died in her arms. What makes them healthy? Well, the name is right there on the poster, and, even to those who can't read, it is recognizable as the same name on the packages which are dispensed by the lady in a nurse's uniform.

WOULD YOU ASK?

If you were in that clinic, would you ask to see the credentials of the "nurse"? I'm not sure that I would. In fact, when I took my children to the Well Baby Clinic in Oak Bay, I never once questioned the qualifications of the women there who handed down words of wisdom, weighed, measured and gave my children their shots. I took

it for granted that they were what they appeared to be.

So I can well understand that third world mothers take it for granted that all ladies in nurses' uniforms are what they appear to be. Those who work in the clinics may well be qualified. But there are others who are just saleswomen employed by the multinationals who make the baby formula.

They dress like nurses and they call themselves nurses.

These are the women who invade hospitals and obtain particulars of women who have recently given birth as well as visiting those who have not yet had their babies.

They give out free samples, showing pictures of the healthy babies we've already referred to, and make follow-up visits to the women in their homes.

MAY BE SCRUPULOUS

They may well be scrupulous in giving proper instructions for the making up and administering of the formula. But it is hard to understand how they can expect women with little or no access to clean water, and virtually no understanding of hygiene, to be able to follow their instructions.

We have referred in previous columns to the disastrous effects which follow. How women water down the formula to make it last longer; how they use contaminated water, and how their babies grow (when they survive) to be undernourished and, frequently, brain-damaged.

Special areas mentioned by Dr. Libresco, which some of us had not taken into account, included the damage done to cultural heritage. Women in many parts of the third world are valued solely for their part in bearing and rearing children. Breast-feeding is part of their cultural and economic value. Take this function away, and the woman is denigrated in her own and society's eyes.

We were also invited to assess our responsibility. If the foundation of a country is its population: if the people are its greatest natural resource; what are we doing to that country when we encourage the

WHO CREATED IT?

Who created this problem? And why? Well, the market in the western world is saturated, and may well be diminishing. The birth rate is falling, and there is a move back towards breast-feeding, especially among the young mothers.

The Third World market opens up great vistas, virtually untapped until recent years. The motive is, of course, profit. However poor people are, they will starve themselves if they are led to believe something will benefit their children.

In many cases 60% to 70% of a family's total income will be spent on formula for one baby. What this represents to the rest of the family is hard to imagine.

Surely the government should intervene, was one proposed solution.

But when a multinational represents more annual gross income than a country's gross national product, a government doesn't have too much clout.

But public opinion should never be underestimated.

If you, dear reader, and all your kith and kin, suddenly stopped buying all the products put out by one multinational, and if this was multiplied by several thousand, the impact would be felt all along the chain.

The biggest problem is finding out just how many products are owned by one multinational. The second problem is getting several thousand people to act in concert. Perhaps we'll leave that for another week!

Land-use contract near end

Land use contract for a property on Baker Road, Ganges is almost completed, Islands Trust was told last week.

Property consists of 28 acres and nine homes are contemplated on a strata-title bases.

It was explained that the original application was made to the Capital Regional Board. The Islands Trust inherited the application and is now processing it.
