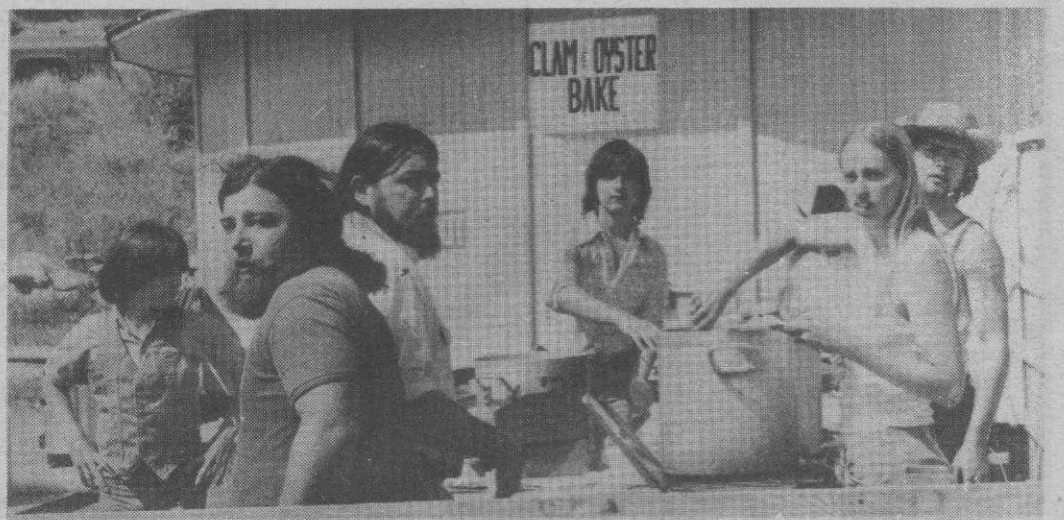




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# LADY MINTO GULF ISLANDS HOSPITAL

## Statement of Revenues and Expenditures

To the Members of the  
Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital Society

Page 1

I have examined the Balance Sheets of the Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital as at March 31st, 1978, and the Statements of Revenue and Expense for the period January 1st, 1977 to March 31st, 1978 for the

- 1) Operating fund
- 2) Plant fund
- 3) Endowment fund.

My examination included a general review of the accounting procedures and such tests of accounting records and other supporting evidence as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

I was not appointed auditor until after March 31st, 1978 and thus did not observe the taking of physical inventories at either the beginning or end of the year.

Depreciation of fixed assets in "Plant Fund" has consistently and materially been understated. In my opinion this is not in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, or the Canadian Hospital Association's guidelines for "Canadian Hospital Accounting"

Subject to above remarks, in my opinion, except for the failure to provide for adequate depreciation and reflect related costs, these financial statements present fairly the financial position of the Society as at March 31st, 1978, and the results of its operations and the changes in its financial position for the period January 1st, 1977 to March 31st, 1978 in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

- The Hospital is in the process of constructing renovations to buildings and an addition of ten extended care beds. The B.C. Minister of Health approved total cost for both renovations and additions in the amount of \$455,000.00. As of March 31st, 1978, \$18,993.08 had been expended on this project.
- All funds, other than current operating funds, had been invested in Bank of Montreal Savings Accounts, at 5¼%, or Bank Term Deposits at 7% interest, including all monies held in trust for The Gulf Islands Intermediate and Personal Care Society.
- Depreciation to fixed assets has been applied consistent with prior periods' policy, and is materially understated. No depreciation has been charged to new additions for many years. Therefore, fixed assets in "Plant Fund" as well as Operating Expenses in "Operating Fund" are significantly misstated. Management is in the process of revising depreciation policy to reflect cost realistically and in accordance with guidelines published by the Canadian Hospital Association.
- The Hospital is defending a lawsuit (Raeside), for damages which would be adequately covered by the Hospital's insurance, should they be awarded to the plaintiff.

Retro active salary increases for Registered Nurses now under negotiation will be re-imbursed by Government Plans in full when due and payable.

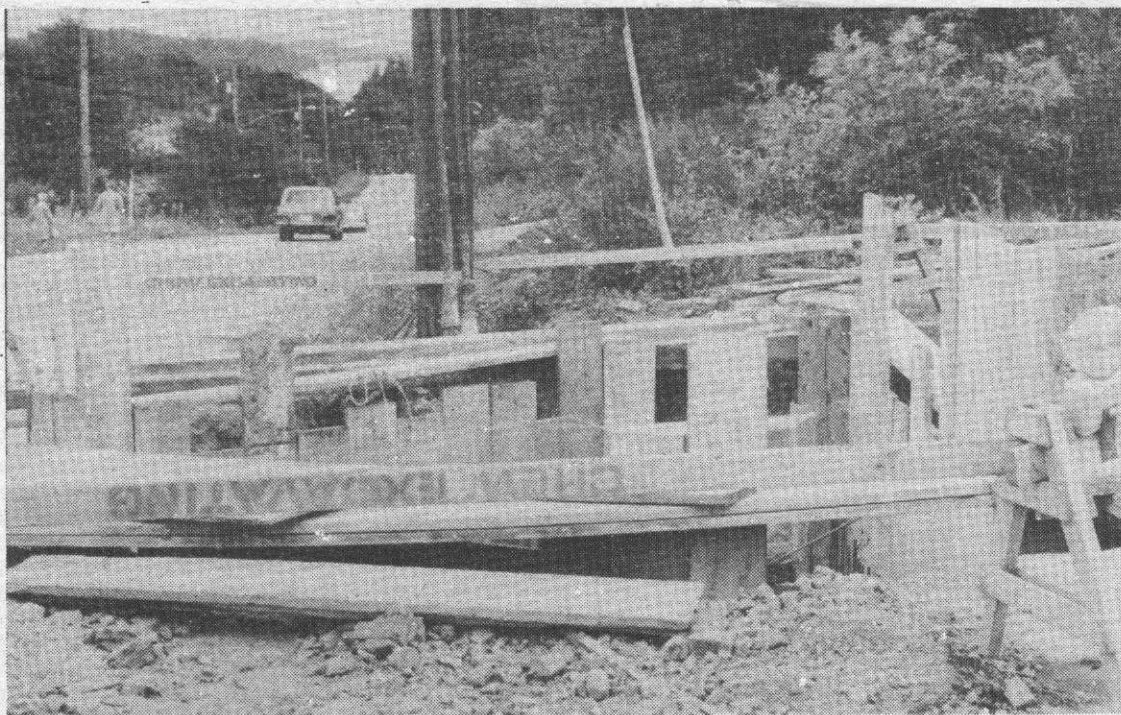
The next scheduled tournament for men is the Jensen Cup. This is a nine-hole handicap medal tournament for men who are 70 years old by December 31.

We had our first recorded "Hole in one" last week when Hugh Ross turned the trick at number 11 hole.

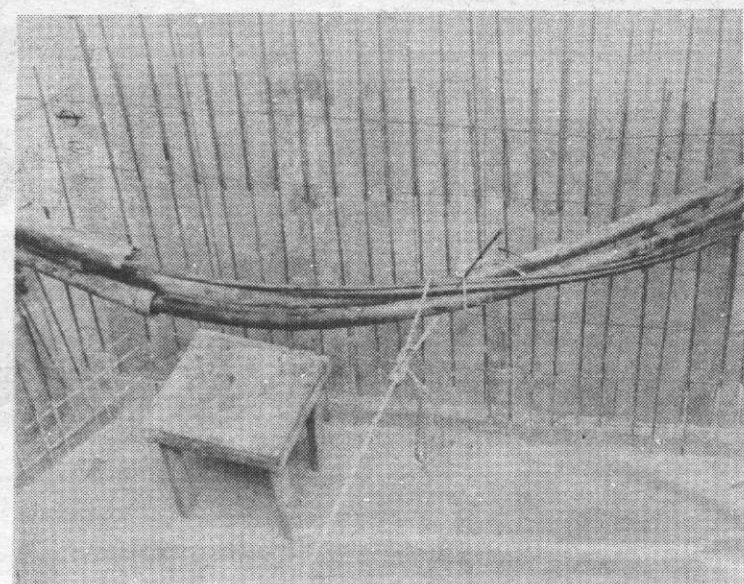
Hugh stresses that it wasn't a lucky shot, it was skill. He says he got lucky when he got back to the clubhouse and the bar was closed.

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# CURTIS ON TRANSIT



## Minister speaks to newsmen at Ganges

The weekly newspapers of British Columbia have frequently commented on government actions, recalled Municipal Affairs Minister Hugh Curtis in Ganges last week, but they have been very fair in their criticism.

Curtis was greeting and addressing the summer convention of the British Columbia and Yukon Community Newspapers Association in Harbour House Hotel.

He also noted that while he represents Saanich and the Islands in the provincial legislature "there is more activity in the Islands than in all of Saanich".

Curtis rode his new hobby horse when he spoke to the publishers of the new transit proposals he has introduced into the provincial house, the British Columbia Urban Transit Authority Act.

Looking back into the history of urban transit, the minister recalled that when four street cars were put into operation in Victoria in 1890 only two cities in Canada had electric street railways, St. Catherine's and Windsor, in Ontario. Electric power was less than 10 years old.

The interurban line between Vancouver and New Westminster was opened in 1891. It was the first of its kind in the western half of the continent and the second interurban line in all of Canada. That line was 12 miles long.

"I find it interesting," noted the minister, "that almost 90 years later, there is a suggestion to solve our present problems by applying a similar technology in approximately the same location."

### 16 COMMUNITIES

Transit services are provided in Victoria and Vancouver and another 14 municipalities in the province. Of the 114 million trips taken by passengers on public transit in BC, 105 million are on BC Hydro vehicles.

"On an average day in Vancouver, Hydro carries four times as many passengers as all of Canada's scheduled airlines combined."

By the time the morning rush is over, the Hydro fleet has travelled a distance equal to circling the globe, he noted in his statistical tour.

And the biggest statistic of all: cost of transit is now more than \$100 million a year.

In the smaller centres, operating deficits of the transit system are shared, 50:50, between the province and the municipality concerned. In Victoria and Vancouver the local council pays no share of the deficit, said the minister.

He explained the Urban Transit Authority.

### ADMINISTRATION

The authority will consist of a board of directors and three regional commissions.

Members of both board and commissions will be elected representatives of the various communi-

ties. A Regional Commission will be appointed to each of the three regions, Lower Mainland, Capital Region and the remainder of the province.

Primary purpose is to plan and finance transit in partnership with local governments.

For the listeners from outside the communities served by transit services, the minister offered a new assurance of the elimination of an old sore. The long-established system of financing transit out of electricity sales will be limited to areas enjoying a transit system. Power surcharge will be applied

only where demanded by the elected representatives of the community. The additional gasoline tax is also introduced by the minister as a means of financing transit deficits.

Curtis spent another half-hour answering questions from various parts of the province.

The most simple and often most effective method of early detection lies with the woman herself. By examining her own breasts once a month a woman can learn to detect subtle changes long before a doctor would discover anything significant. The five to ten minutes that it takes for a simple self-examination could save her life, warns the Family Centre.

The technique of breast self-examination will be discussed on

Wednesday, June 22, at 1 pm at The Family Centre. Films and literature will be supplied by the Canadian Cancer Society. Women who can't make it at this time, may drop in at anytime and pick up some free literature.

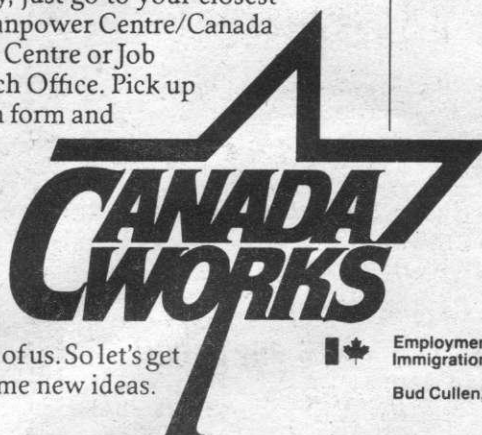

# Leave Stowell Lake as it is meeting decides

The lake is small and shallow, he continued, and the water isn't needed for Fulford.

The motion passed easily with the support of nearly everyone at the meeting.

The plans for the building were available for perusal and will provide a much needed addition to the available hospital care supplied by Lady Minto Hospital.

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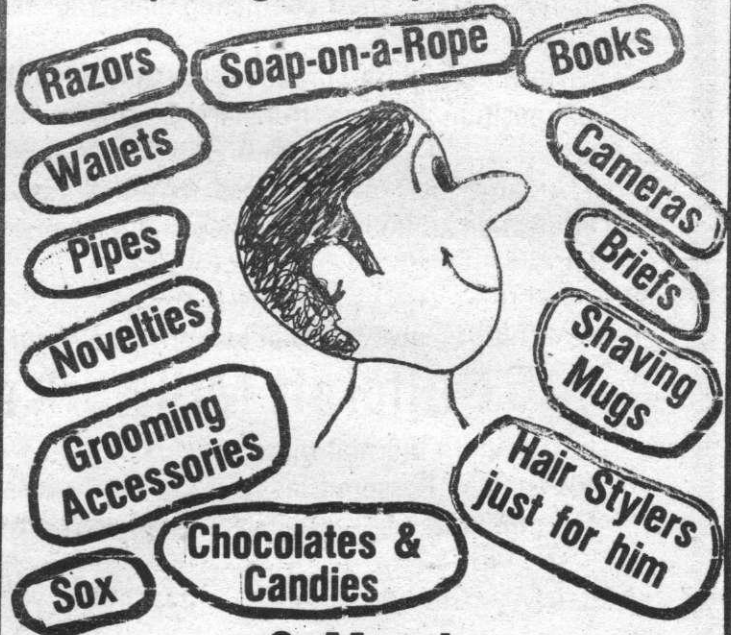

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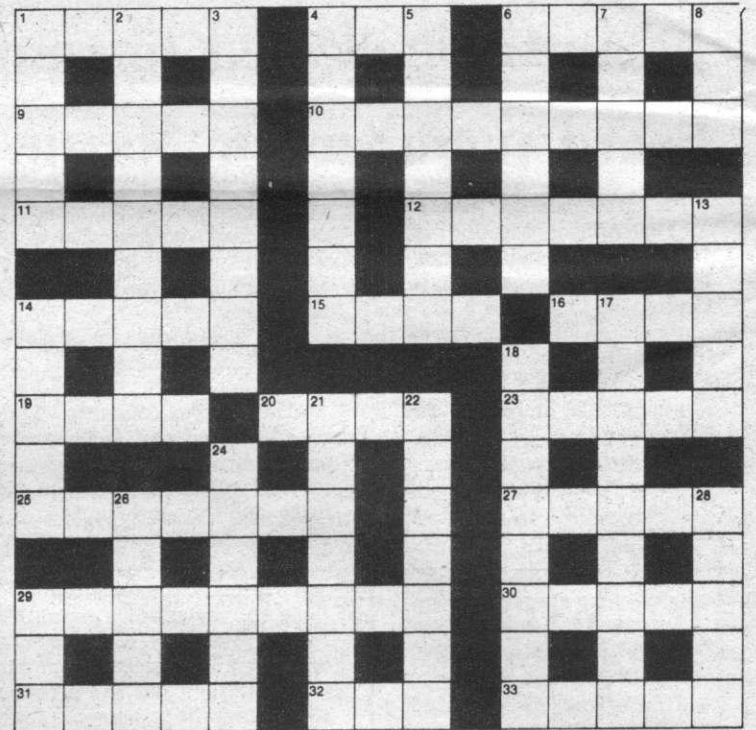

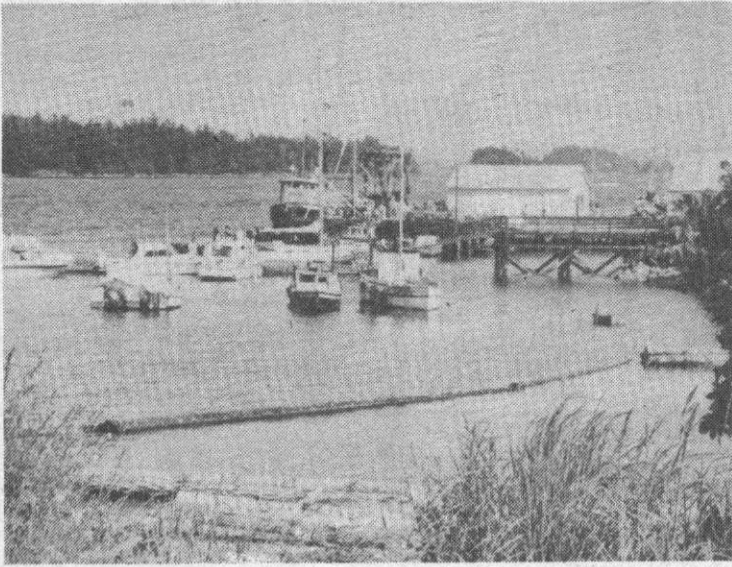

We welcome all who wish to come, but it will be first-come, first-served, in the event of over-booking.

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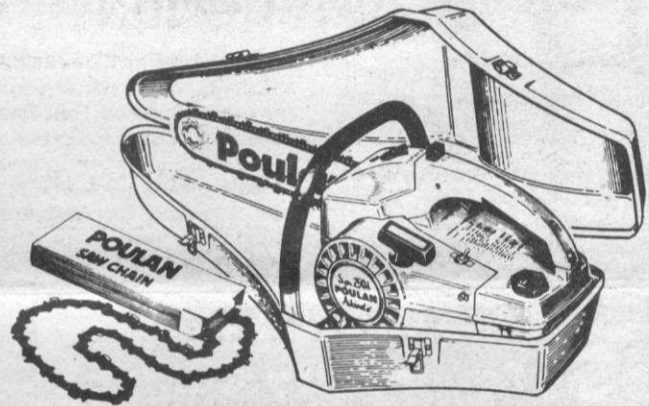

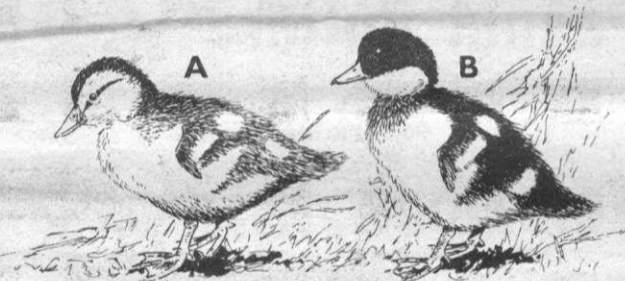

Pattern, however, is remarkably similar. Of the eleven dabbling ducks, ten have the spotted body pattern as in the mallard (A). The exception is the downy wood duck with only two small light patches low down on the back. The divers have much more contrasting color between species with light spots less prominent. In the goldeneyes (B), bufflehead, and oldsquaw, the down is almost black with the head pattern a pronounced black and white.

In the Acute Unit visiting hours are as follows—

1. All patients who are able and prepared to receive visitors may do so between 1400 hours - 2000 hours with the following exceptions:
  - a. Maternity patients may have the father visit anytime until 2000 hours. All other visitors will be restricted to the hours between 1500 hours - 1600 and 1900 hours - 2000 hours.

2. Every effort to arrange visitors with residents outside of the posted hours may be arranged with the Registered Nurse on duty.

N.B. Special arrangements may be made with the Registered Nurse on duty for visitors of seriously ill and terminal patients wishing overnight accommodations in the hospital residence.

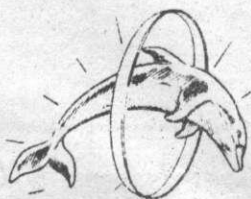
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**There are five in this quartette of pirates**

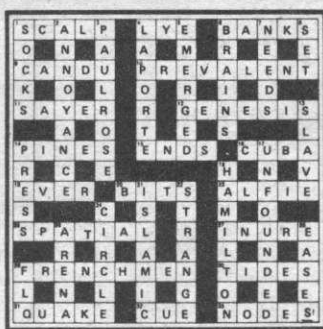
