

**Food laws like fishnet**

**Watch what you eat and make move to protection of world environment**

"Food for Naught" by Dr. Ross Hume Hall, is subtitled "The Decline in Nutrition". Dr. Hall tells us to realize that food is a commodity, and as such is produced primarily for profit, not for people.

At a Nutrition Conference at U.B.C., Dr. A.B. Morrison said "It is time the Food Manufacturers paid more attention to nutrition."

Every mail brings news of more publications exposing pollution by processing and packaging firms, which take up to 70c of our food dollars.

What can we do? Stop buying packaged, frozen and processed foods. That is the first step. We can also look at our government's "food policy."

Canada's food policy has been likened to a fishnet: that is, a number of holes loosely held together by string.

Did you know that our great country has the lowest support of agriculture in the world, except Denmark? That our gross farm returns remain relatively static while costs climb?

We cater to industrialization with high tariff barriers, tax concessions and prior consideration for prime land and our economy becomes increasingly dependent on energy and technological development.

Our spree of soaring price and wage increases has been largely financed by heavy borrowing. Politicians call for more efficiency, meaning automation, chemicals, consolidation, increased size of farms and specialization, in spite of the fact that smaller, people-worked farms with crop rotation have been proved more productive and efficient.

**TRUE AND FALSE**

"Canada supplies wheat to a hungry world!" That is both true

and false. We do export a large percentage of our grains, but we also import more and more food, increasing the impoverishment and hunger of the Third World.

The Government of Norway, conscious of the maldistribution of food and concerned about the increase of heart disease, asked the medical profession to develop an optimum diet for their people. They then designed a national food policy to produce a desirable amount of wheat, milk, meat and so on.

They used public education

programmes and economic incentives to encourage people to produce and use lean meat instead of fatter, grain-fed meat, and the result has been three-fold: improved health and life expectancy; a lower agricultural trade deficit, and a reduced demand on the world's limited supply of land, water and fertilizer.

Much of this information comes from "Plow-Share", published by the Christian Farmers' Federation, which also contains a review of "Rich Christians in an Age of Hunger" by Ronald J. Sider. I quote from the review:

**THREATENING**

"Christians who are committed to the North American dream of growth, consumption and standard of living, will find this book very threatening. Christians who are committed to bring the same "benefits" of industrialization and wealth that we live with to the suffering, will be discouraged. Christians who want to keep Christ

inside the walls of the church and home, and out of social, economic and political affairs, will possibly label it heresy. However, no Christian can seriously read Sider without being gripped by his penetrating analysis.....

"Sider makes his case that in our world today the rich (Christians included) are oppressing the poor. The oppression is usually done by willingly and thankfully sharing in, promoting and loving the consumptive lifestyles of Western culture. Corporations, of all dimensions, are so bent on supplying the "more", the "bigger" and the "good life" which we all demand, that they stop at nothing in their exploitation of man and creation. Sadly, the poor are most easily exploited.....Sider concludes Part 2 by saying:

"Zacchaeus should be our model. As a greedy tax collector, Zacchaeus was enmeshed in sinful economic structures. But he never supposed that he could come to Jesus and still continue enjoying all the economic benefits of that systemic evil. Coming to Jesus meant repenting of his complicity in social injustice. It meant giving public reparations. And it meant a whole new lifestyle."

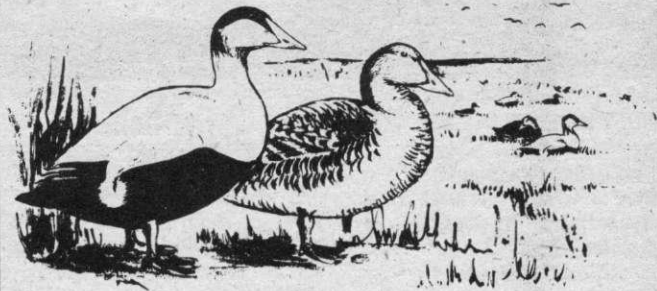

**THE COMMON EIDER** — This large sea-duck nests colonially on coastal islands in eastern Canada. To protect her clutch of 4 - 5 eggs from nearby nesting gulls, the female eider remains on her nest almost constantly during incubation. Such fasting causes a loss of 40% of her body weight. To recover this weight loss, the ducks form creches, whereby they pool their young so that one hen looks after several broods, allowing other hens to feed and return to their normal weight.

Over the summer six people from Paris have stayed at the Retreat Cove home of Andrew, Huguette and Nicolas Bengier.

First nine-year-old Simon Rougeul, who was Nicolas' special friend in Paris, flew alone from Paris to Vancouver to stay for six weeks with the Bengiers.

All the children from Paris have been entranced by fishing and spent many hours with rod or line producing their own-catch suppers.

## Supreme Court hearing into Ganges area sewer project

Judgment was reserved after a five-hour BC Supreme Court hearing last Thursday into a protest against the Ganges sewer project.

Court heard the petition from a Ganges resident to have a stop called to the sewer scheme and preliminary objections from the Capital Regional District and the Pollution Control Branch. The petitioner is Yvette Valcourt.

She has asked the court for an injunction calling a halt to the installation. She has also asked the court to declare invalid an order by the Pollution Control Board ordering the Capital Regional Board to install the sewer.

The petitioner has complained that the action of the PCB in ordering the installation was bypassing the ordinary democratic process.

The sewer project was launched with a petition taken up in the affected area. The petition covered all of Ganges from Lady Minto Hospital to the foot of Ganges Hill as Phase I and the area up Ganges Hill as Phase II.

Petitioner has charged that there were irregularities in the manner in which the petition was taken. She protested the irregularities to the regional board prior to the order to install sewers.

The order overruled the petition.

The petitioner is now asking the Supreme Court to consider the alleged irregularities and the procedure by which the project has reached its present stage of government approval.

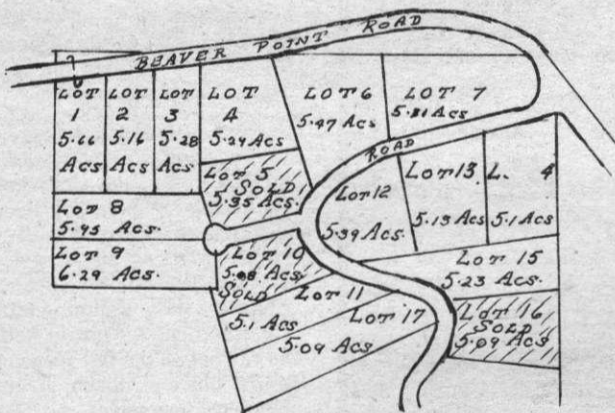

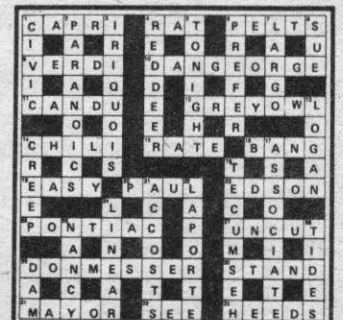

## His answer to eastern power

About 30 people attended the Friday evening meeting in Central Hall when Victoria lawyer, Douglas Christie, came to Salt Spring Island to speak on the Committee for Western Independence.

The Victoria lawyer outlined the plans of his organization while he offered a travelogue on the recent caravan he organized through the western provinces.

In a lively, fast-moving summary of his caravan to Manitoba, Christie covered a wide range of western problems and western beefs.

The cost of living is higher in the west by 30% to 50%, he reported and representation in Parliament from the west is woefully short of eastern representation.

British Columbia, with its 2.6 millions of people elects 26 members to Ottawa. Ontario, with six millions, elects 88 members.

"Power is not equal to population," he charged.

Two provinces control the legislative decision-making process, he continued. Of nine Supreme Court judges, three are named from Quebec, three from Ontario and three from the rest of Canada.

### CANADIAN COW

He displayed T-shirts bearing the Canadian cow, fed in the west, milked in Central Canada and defouling the Maritimes.

The western provinces produce the nation's harvest, mining, forestry and fishing. Greatest percentage of all four comes from the west. And the west has least say in matters relating to tariffs, transportation and resources.

It is a "simple position" he assured his audience. His organization wants to see these vital aspects of the Canadian economy in the west controlled in the west.

Christie had little room for any existent political party.

There's nothing to choose be-

tween the Social Credit and the NDP, he suggested. Neither speaks for the west.

He described Premier Bill Bennett as going to Ottawa to beg for favours.

"It hasn't changed and it won't change, because whoever he is, he is in favour of confederation," said Christie.

Tariffs put up the price of commodities in western Canada and transportation makes it higher. **INSUFFICIENCY**

He cited the wheat port at Vancouver. It is inefficient, he told the meeting and the western farmer must meet the cost.

It is a conspiracy, he assured his listeners. The port is maintained at an inefficient level in order to ensure that grain is shipped east to the port of Montreal.

Many of his comments were made during the travelogue through the west.

He saw Prime Minister Trudeau as the author of a new French-speaking, socialist republic, from coast to coast.

The farmer is unhappy, he reported.

The wheat marketing board milks the farmer. If the world price is \$6, the farmer gets \$3. It is fixed at \$3 a bushel, irrespective of what the world is paying, up or down.

But the farmer must pay for transportation of the grain after the board has purchased it. If it costs \$1 a bushel to ship to Vancouver, the farmer gets only \$2. If the port is particularly slow and demurrage on ships tied up in the harbour costs another \$1, the farmer gets nothing at all for his wheat, he explained.

### ALBERTAN OIL

Albertans are hostile towards the federal government over its attitude to Alberta oil.

All this would be changed if western Canada were independent, said the lawyer.

These were some of the problems he listed.

A strong west would go to Ottawa and make its demands for control over its destiny or secede from Canada, says the founder of the independence movement.

## Chickens and Canadian welfare

One-woman campaign for support of a family by the divorced father was on Salt Spring Island last week. And she came armed with clippings and reports from various newspapers over the past several years.

Gabriella Centenary, divorced wife of a Vancouver barber, has gained fame by her determination to keep chickens at her Vancouver home when the city council has legislated that chickens may not be kept there.

She needs the eggs to survive, asserts Gabriella. Chickens cannot be, asserts the city council.

But the dispute goes further back than the keeping of chickens, says the former Mrs. Salvatore Alfieri.

During their marriage the couple had two daughters. Both girls are living with their mother and Alfieri pays them \$200 a month in alimony payments.

The family also receives \$500 from welfare and she protests that with a total income of \$700 she needs alternative sources of food, such as eggs from her poultry.

### NATIONAL ATTENTION

She is also drawing national attention to the circumstances, duplicated in about every third home across the nation, where a broken family is supported by the state and not by the father of the children involved.

### SAME AGAIN

Readers may wonder where the story will lead to. They may look around them and find the same story repeated in every community, perhaps in every family. A Canadian male is privileged.

He can dump his progeny in an empty nest and look to new pastures without a care in the world.

Many years ago the federal government justified its introduction of identity cards on the grounds that disappearing papas could be traced and ordered to pay for the support of their offspring when an identity card system was in force.

The ID card is used to ensure long the nation can afford to that a man pays his taxes and assume the financial responsibility of rearing its deserted children. nothing else. There's more than chickens in wonder, with Ms. Centenary how the Centenary story.

## No assessment of program but principle is to be retained

It was noted that the personnel engaged in the project are not all qualified teachers and therefore will not be engaged by any school-sponsored program.

## Jury looks at Bedwell plane crash

Monday's inquest into the death of five persons aboard a 1975 Cessna plane which crashed at Bedwell Harbour on August 22 found the death non-accidental.

Two planes took off from Bedwell Harbour that morning. One crashed immediately afterwards and all occupants died. The second plane took off and flew to Port Hardy. The pilot was the only key witness to the crash. He crashed en route from Port Hardy and also lost his life.

The coroner's jury suggested possible overweight and possible

adverse wind conditions as contributory factors. They also considered a possible miscalculation in the judgment and execution of a manoeuvre of the plane immediately preceding the crash.

There were no findings and no recommendations.

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## Shutterbugs

Introduction to professional photography

Everyone admires the spectacular photos in magazines, yet most people consider that these sharp, clear images will never be made by such snapshooters as themselves.

Actually, the only difference between the photo journalist and yourself is that he has learned the basics about cameras and elemental picture composition. This may seem too simplistic an explanation but the point is that anyone can take good pictures if they have a good camera and the desire to learn how to use it.

The following is an introduction to the non-automatic camera, the type most often used by accomplished photographers.

An image is created on film by the accumulation of focused light rays. This accumulation is a product of the duration of the exposure combined with the intensity of the exposure.

The duration is measured in fractions of a second in the following series progressing from the greatest to smallest amount of light: 1, 1/2, 1/4, 1/8, 1/15, 1/30, 1/60, 1/125, 1/500, 1/1000 second. These are the shutter speeds and the interval between each successive number halves the exposure and is called "one stop".

Similarly the intensity of light is measured in the following series progressing from the greatest to smallest amount of light: f 1.4, f 2, f 2.8, f 4, f 5.6, f 8, f 11, f 16. These are the aperture values of the lens and set the opening of the diaphragm. Again, the f numbers are in increments of 1 stop: going from left to right, you are said to "stop down" as you change the diaphragm to the next smaller opening, thereby allowing only 1/2 the amount of light to strike the film. Going right to left would double the amount of light.

Either a hand held light meter or one built into the camera will tell

you the combination of f stop to shutter speed possible at a particular film speed (ASA value).

Proposed Zoning By-law No. 5 for North Pender Island is a By-law to regulate the use of land, buildings and structures, regulate the density of use, and regulate the height and siting of buildings and structures on North Pender Island. The regulatory provisions of this By-law have been drawn up so as to conform as closely as possible with the policies contained in the Official Community Plan (North Pender Island) adopted by By-law No. 218 of the Capital Regional District in 1975. The By-law establishes both provisions of general applicability and provisions and regulations for each of the thirteen (13) zones established by the By-law.

The general provisions of each of the zones may be summarized as follows:

#### Settlement 1 and Settlement 2 Zones (S1, S2)

Allow for residential use, public service uses, and limited non-commercial farming. In the Settlement 1 Zone, the site density is one (1) one-family dwelling per parcel. In the Settlement 2 Zone, the maximum site density is one (1) one-family dwelling per .6 hectares (1½ acres).

#### Rural 1 Zone (R1)

Allows for residential, public service, recreational, commercial agricultural, sawmilling and horticultural uses. The maximum site density is one (1) one-family dwelling per (4) hectares (10 acres).

#### Rural 2 Zone (R2)

Allows for residential, intensive agricultural, horticultural and silvicultural uses. In addition the zone allows for sawmilling, pet boarding kennels, and rod and gun clubs. The maximum site density is one (1) one-family dwelling per four (4) hectares (10 acres).

#### Agricultural Zone (AG)

Recognizes Agricultural Land Reserve Lands. The zone allows for farm uses, residential uses as well as accessory buildings, silvicultural practices, fish farms, golf courses and institutional outdoor camps. The maximum site density is one (1) one-family dwelling per four (4) hectares (10 acres) subject to specified conditions.

#### Commercial Zones (C1, C2)

Provide for a range of commercial uses. The C1 Zone permits stores, restaurants, bakeries, printers, places of indoor recreation, service stations, and vehicle and machinery sales. The C2 Zone permits uses such as hotels, motels, and lodges, marinas, boat ramp and boat rentals. Accessory residential use is permitted in both zones.

#### Industrial Zone (M)

Allows for basic industrial uses as warehousing, works yards, contractor's workshops, building supplies sales, bulk fuel storage tanks, sawmills and processing of gravel. Accessory residential use is permitted.

#### Watershed Zone (W)

Allows for residential and parks and public open space use. The maximum site density is one (1) one-family dwelling per parcel.

#### Public and Recreation Zone (PR)

Establishes a zone to provide for recreational use on public land.

#### Water Zones (W-A, W-B, W-C)

Regulate the use of water and foreshore areas. The W-A Zone permits private docking facilities. The W-B Zone provides for foreshore oriented commercial facilities. The W-C Zone provides for boat building, repairs, or sales, and freight handling facilities.

This By-law will not supercede the provisions of the Agricultural Land Commission Act and where land is classified as Agricultural Land Reserve, the provisions of the Agricultural Land Commission Act shall take precedence over the By-law.

# Apple juicers get green light on federal grant

It's signed, sealed and delivered. The Young Canada Works grant for an apple-juice processing scheme on Salt Spring Island has been approved by Ottawa and the scheme is already into the initial stages.

Government has approved the \$30,968 grant to employ seven people between September 4 and March 16.

The sponsors of the scheme, Lillian Horsdal and Beverley Unger have launched it in an effort to use the apples on the island and to encourage the initiation of a program which could be permanent and find employment each year for a number of island people.

The operation will employ four persons picking apples and pressing them. In addition, it will have two assistant managers and one project manager. The last position

has already been filled. Jeff Savin has been appointed manager.

The sponsors hope to teach the project staff how to go about the job as well as provide work.

"We hope to teach them how to go about the job and about marketing the product," said Mrs. Unger.

**ON SALE**

Apple juice will be offered on sale at the Farmers' Market and other outlets. It will meet all requirements of the health department.

At present the project is looking for two items. Sponsors need a home. They are asking for the use of a large room or building where the walls and floor may be hosed down. It would preferably be easy to get to.

The rent available is limited by the nature of the program.

Second item in need is personnel.

Any person who is unemployed and a Canadian is eligible. All applicants will be vetted by Canada Manpower. Candidates may call Mrs. Unger at Beaver Point for information.

Donors of apples are also sought.

**ASKING FOR APPLES**

The operators cannot afford to buy apples in this initial year of the project. Recompense is offered in the form of 10 % of the juice produced from a donated crop. An additional reward will be the pruning of the orchard from which the apples come, at no cost to the owner.

In addition to the juice, there is a second product and that is the mash left after pressing. It is available for feed or for fertilizer.

No foreign national may be employed in the scheme, which is financed by the federal government.

Still working closely with the project are two islanders long acquainted with the world of agriculture and orchards.

They are Jack James, of Vesuvius, former provincial agriculturist and Andy Stevens, of Beaver Point, who has farmed the island most of his life. Both have offered their advice for the project.

## No memory but driver is fined

A man who couldn't remember what happened when his car ran off the road to total destruction was fined \$450 by Provincial Judge D.K. McAdam, when he appeared in Ganges Provincial Court on Wednesday, on an impaired driving charge.

Lewis E. Blakeway, Ganges, told the court that he was hospitalized as a result of the accident and has no recollection of drinking.

**DOLLARS AND CENTS**

Problem facing Saturna parents is simply dollars and cents. This year they have three students attending and next year the figure will have risen to four. Afterwards, it was noted, the problem will resolve itself, with increased attendance at Mayne. There will then be enough to meet the costs involved, in all probability, out of the \$91 allowance.

One Saturna islander queried the power of the board to raise taxes in order to meet the costs involved.

The board has the power to raise all the money it needs from the taxpayers, once a policy is established, Peck remarked.

At the present time the payments are made to parents to assist with transportation, observed Chairman Davidson.

"If we, ourselves, contract the hauling of students, where would we be?"

The secretary-treasurer wore a worried look.

It is a matter of responsibility. If the parents undertake transportation it is their responsibility and their liability. If the board does it, then the liability becomes that of the board and the very stringent government regulations on type and specifications of vessels used would be applicable.

"What do you want to do?" asked the chairman.

"What can we do?" enquired a trustee.

"My child is going to do what in September?" asked a parent, "What am I to do with her?"

If she is required to board her child on Mayne Island, what assistance does she get, asked a member of the audience.

The board would pay \$80 a month and the parents, \$40 a month, she was told.

**FEARFUL**

One speaker was fearful of signing a form asking for boarding allowance. Once that is signed she would have no alternative.

"That's what happened to me before," she told trustees.

Correspondence is no dice. Only successful students on correspondence are academically-inclined, board was assured.

Ivan Mouat noted that no parent would be held to his application for boarding allowance if he decided to go another way.

"I want you to take the responsibility of getting a boat and taking our kids to school," stated Bernice Crooks.

The board will continue to assess the costs involved and to negotiate for assistance from the provincial government.

Reference was made to the practice of collecting taxes from the islands to finance schools on the mainland.


Some of the money raised should be devoted to transportation, it was suggested.

No matter what the cost of transportation might be, it cannot be deducted from the mainland share of island taxes, explained the secretary-treasurer.
