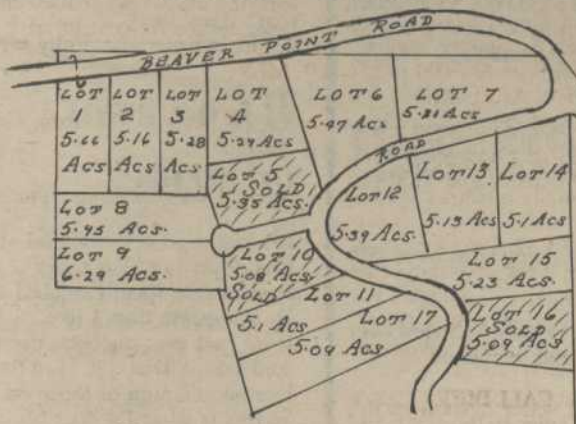

Residents are angry over ministry's delay tactics

Residents and property owners on Saturna are concerned about the future of their water supply as a result of the refusal by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs to approve a referendum proposal which was to have gone to the people on September 16.

The referendum proposed the expenditure of \$600,000 to construct an entirely new water system to serve the Lyall Harbour-Boot Cove area of the island. This area is currently served by a system owned and operated by Jim Money.

Under an order from Howard De Beck, comptroller of water rights, Mr. Money will be in a position to cease operation of the existing system on September 29.

The Capital Regional District has indicated that it will not take over the existing water system and that the referendum must be approved before it will initiate any action.

"With the referendum effectively sidelined, by the ministry of municipal affairs, it is not clear what will happen when the De Beck deadline passes," said Mike Hayes, chairman of the local water committee.

PROVINCIAL HELP

The Capital Regional District has been working with representatives of the affected area for over a year and the proposal worked out called for provincial involvement under the Water Facilities Assistance Program.

Hayes told Driftwood that the people of Saturna are angry and disappointed in the light of this latest roadblock.

He said that representations to Mr. Curtis's office had been ineffective so far, "despite earlier assurances from Mr. Curtis that he would provide assistance wherever possible."

On Tuesday Driftwood was assured that the engineers of the Community Water Supply Division are in close touch with the Capital Regional District and the ministry of municipal affairs.

They are trying to work out an alternative proposal that will be acceptable.

The Comptroller of Water Rights has the authority to extend the deadline of his own order regarding the relinquishment of the certificate of convenience in the possession of Money Bros. and Pederson and which is due to expire at the end of this month.

The division would offer no suggestion as to whether this might be done on the grounds that it is under active discussion at the present time and the plans of the division or of the ministry are not yet formulated.
