

## Down Through The Years With Driftwood

### FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Dr. O.L. Stanton was elected chairman of SSI Centennial Library Board at a conclave of board members held immediately following the annual meeting of SSI Public Library Association, Jan. 13. John R. Sturdy was appointed secretary and Mrs. S.H. Hawkins will again serve as treasurer.

Other board members are Mrs. R.W. Bradley and Mrs. H.C. Giegerich.

In a progress report on the new library the chairman said that work is almost completed. Sat. Feb. 1 has been set as a tentative opening date for the new building.

Of interest to B.C. coastal gardeners is a new disease-resistant tomato, "Salt Spring Sunrise", developed by P.G. (Jack) James of Vesuvius Bay, a member of the pioneer firm of James Seeds which operated extensive seed farms on Salt Spring Island and at Cowichan for a quarter century from the end of World War I.

This exceptionally early, heavy-cropping tomato is the result of six years intensive work by Mr. James in breeding and developing a strain especially suited to B.C. coastal climate.

There will be a card party at Nan's Coffee Bar on Friday evening, 8 o'clock, Jan. 17th.

Bridge and 500 will be played. There will be prizes, refreshments and maybe surprises.

### TEN YEARS AGO

Islands are an integral part of the B.C. Ferries system with the appointment of R.R. Anderson as Gulf Islands terminal agent.

Mr. Anderson will assume his new duties on January 15. He will operate from a mobile office at Long Harbour.

Agent on Salt Spring Island has been Capt. George Maude since 1961. Capt. Maude was not concerned with outer islands problems.

Mr. Anderson has been latterly engaged in the traffic department office in Victoria. He was earlier assistant terminal agent at Swartz Bay.

Lady Minto Hospital is so busy that the advance in figures is beyond any ever thought of. Year-end statistics show that in two years the hospital has almost doubled its activities. In two categories it has gone more than double in those two years.

The unprecedented rise in the activities of the 55-year old hospital coincides with the start of a new 20-bed addition to the building.

Plans are already under way to construct the addition.

There was no school on Monday for a number of Salt

Spring students.

School buses did not leave on their schedules when the roads proved to be iced over.

According to a plan evolved recently, the drivers call the secretary-treasurer and then the first family whose children they pick up. Each family then rings the next on the run in order that all will be notified of the failure of the buses before the students are waiting on the road.

Roads were sheeted with ice almost everywhere on the island and the hazard of the steep hills dictated the decision of the drivers to await the daytime thaw.

Record cold weather for the month was chalked up on December 29, when the mercury fell to an official seven degrees above zero. It has never previously gone down that far.

The month also brought the heaviest December snow fall on record. Total snow amounted to 43 inches for the month.

### FIVE YEARS AGO

Salt Spring Island parents want a share in the decisions when the island schools are administered. And they are prepared to take any measures necessary to gain a hearing, even to the point of taking their children out of school.

The dissentient group of islanders protest that they have been denied a share in local decision-making and that the school is administered by civil servants whose decisions are dutifully rubber-stamped by trustees.

Building permits issued on the islands last year were valued at five and three quarter millions. They covered a total of 203 dwelling units, as well as other construction projects.

Figure is more than one and a half million dollars over the previous year's total.

Ancient history of the islands is being checked.

A team of archeologists was on Salt Spring Island last week and is working on Pender this week. The team of two men is engaged in listing sites on the islands.

Assistant provincial archeologist Gordon Hanson is running the project with the help of two archeologists, Brian Seymour and Stephen Cassidy. They all want help.

Mr. Hanson has appealed to islanders to let him know of any archeological sites on any of the islands. They are particularly interested in sites away from the water. The inland or upland sites are less common and more difficult to recognize.

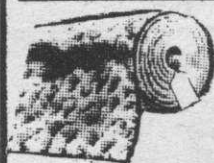

## HORSESHOE BAY: HOME OF SEVEN QUEENS

It was a humble royal family back in 1953 when the lone Langdale Queen inaugurated the ferry route from Horseshoe Bay on the Mainland to Departure Bay on Vancouver Island.

Today Horseshoe Bay is the home of seven beautiful and famous queens, monarchs who carry tens of thousands to Departure Bay in Nanaimo, the Sunshine Coast and Bowen Island.

The Nanaimo run now even has its superstars: the giant Queens of Coquitlam and Cowichan. The former was launched in 1976 and has a capacity of 1,100 passengers and 362 cars. Six escalators are needed within the majestic vessel to move passengers.

These superferries, with their 139-metre lengths, required special preparations for their introduction to the travelling public.

Double-decker ramps now speed loading and unloading procedures for the queens.

The Queens of Nanaimo and

Burnaby aid their sister ships in the important Horseshoe Bay to Nanaimo crossing.

Not that the Langdale Queen

has been forsaken in her old age. She runs from Horseshoe Bay to Langdale, the gateway to the Sunshine Coast, a peninsula just north of the Lower Mainland. Powell River can be reached from there.

The Langdale Queen is the oldest in British Columbia's ferry fleet. Launched in 1903 as "Ashbury Park", she was once a coal burner with two triple-expansion engines and nine boilers. Seventy-five years and many re-fittings and name changes later, the old Queen can still manage 16 knots with her modern diesel engines. She carries a maximum of 600 passengers and 80 cars.

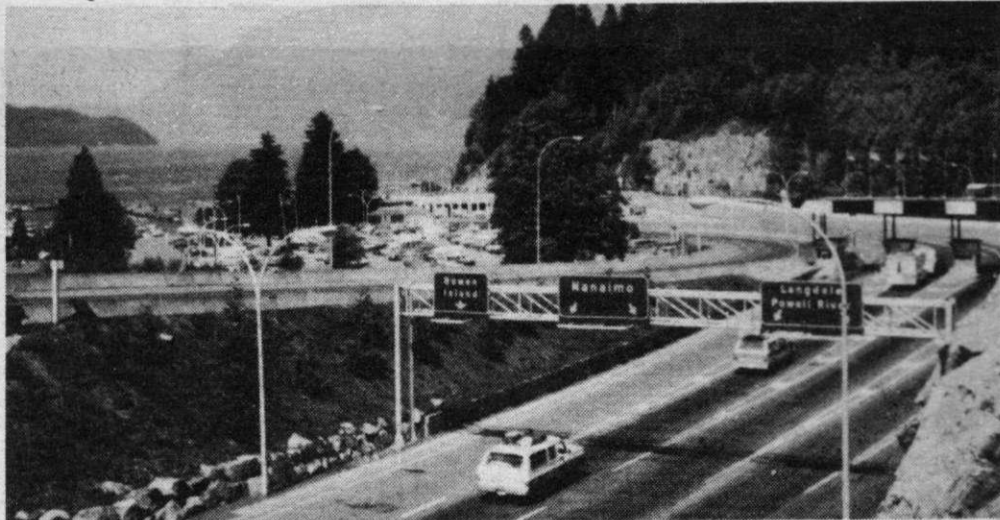
She is matched with the Queen of New Westminster on the Langdale run.

The smallest queen of the family is the Howe Sound Queen, an open deck ferry which bridges the short gap to Bowen Island, a rural hideaway within hailing distance of the populous Lower Mainland.

It was in 1953 that Black Ball Lines built its Departure Bay terminal, thus ushering in a modern direct route to the heart of Vancouver Island. The British Columbia government of that time bought the ferry service in 1961 and it was then that the Dogwood Fleet, as the B.C. Ferry System is known, was born.

It was in 1962 that Horseshoe Bay became the western continental terminal for the Trans-Canada Highway. Travellers taking the one-hour-and-fifty-minute trip to Nanaimo have only 111 kilometres to go to Mile Zero, the Pacific terminus of the Trans-Canada in Victoria.

Long live the queens!

## Board to name safety committee rep

The Gulf Islands School Board has agreed to appoint a representative to serve on the newly-formed Ganges Traffic Safety Committee.

The board agreed to the appointment Thursday following a presentation by committee chairman Kathy Hall and member Gwen Albhouse.

The pair outlined several concerns regarding pedestrian safety in the village, including safety hazards for children in the Salt Spring Elementary area.

Although a specific trustee was not named, chairman Tom Davidson agreed to appoint a board member to sit on the committee, which is already comprised of a variety of other community representatives.

Pre-registration for Continuing Education classes is scheduled for January 22-26. District co-ordinator Virginia Newman will be taking registrations and collecting fees in the School Board office from 11am-2pm daily. Pre-registration assures the student of a place in the class.

Volume discounts are in effect again this term for those pre-registering or completing registration by the end of the first week of classes (February 2) Volume discounts are based on the number of enrollments per household. Two enrollments allow a 10 percent discount on the total, three allow 15 percent and four allow 10 percent.

## Manly to appear at RCMP probe

Jim Manly, MP candidate for Cowichan-Malahat and the Islands announced Sunday to a campaign committee meeting that he will appear before the McDonald Royal Commission inquiry into the activities of the RCMP.

Manly, speaking at the Brae Road NDP office in Duncan, expressed concern that "it is the duty of the police to maintain the law, not to subvert it. Democratic institutions," he said, "cannot be maintained by subversive police activity but only by an informed and vigilant public."

For this reason, Manly said, he found it distressing that there was so little advance public participation in the commission as to enable the Victoria hearings to be cancelled. Manly will appear instead at the Vancouver hearings on January 31.

## DON'T CALL HOMEMAKERS

### Looking for a babysitter?

If there's one thing that should be clear in the minds of islanders, says the Salt Spring Island Homemaker Service, homemakers are not babysitters, janitors or cleaning ladies.

The service is an organized community project provided through a non-profit organization. And despite the fact that they don't perform the aforementioned services, they are qualified persons under the supervision of professionals, explains Mrs. M. Kaufman, co-ordinator of the service.

Salt Spring homemakers are assigned to help chronically ill or convalescent adults and to give assistance to elderly members of the community who are still capable of some self-management. The service helps to protect and restore family functioning and

serves to prevent the placement of children and adults away from their own homes.

Homemakers are required to have the capacity to work with many different people in different situations and to respect the confidence of the family served.

Work in the home provided by the service includes a variety of practical tasks required to improve the quality of life in the home, and thereby, in the community.

The cost of the work is expected to total about \$1,500.

## Info-Health

Seeing a patient at home is undoubtedly an inefficient way of practicing medicine, but sometimes house calls have interesting twists.

I remember one winter evening when I was able to quickly diagnose and treat a child's infected ear. As I was leaving I mentioned how cold the house was and was informed that the furnace was not working. An expert on furnaces (having once boarded with an oil-furnace manufacturer), I could not resist the challenge. Two hours later the furnace was going but it took me a week to get my hands clean again.

A colleague spent a half-hour breaking into a house, trying to make a house call. It was late at night, and when he could not rouse anyone he thought his patient was unconscious or had died.

The doctor finally got a basement window open and climbed through. A search of the house failed to reveal his patient, but an envelope on the kitchen table told the worried doctor that he was at 1822 Jones Street instead of 1922, where he was expected. He quickly turned off the lights and crawled out the window again - this time in much less than half an hour.

Once I was greeted by a

voluptuous young thing in the altogether. "Hi Doc, I'm all ready for you to examine me," she said as she stood in the doorway. I left quickly, shaking my head and repeating the Hippocratic Oath over and over.

Sometimes solo house calls are unwise. In earlier years, when I was called to a questionable address I would sometimes ask a police officer to come along. A few

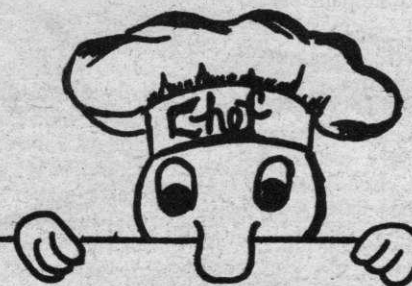
times I was glad I had. Uncooperative drunks and their friends, and drug addicts desperate for the contents of a doctor's bag usually become docile when they see the men in blue.

# How to make use of old film

BY CEDRIC BARKER

Recently, while visiting one of my customers, the topic of conversation rolled around to the picture-taking of yesteryear. A camera was immediately produced for my appraisal. Obviously it had not seen the light of day for quite a few years.

"Oh, you are still taking pictures with this!" I said.

My hosts were surprised to learn that the camera had been loaded with a roll of black and white film 20 years ago.

### SALVAGE BLACK AND WHITE FILM

The 20-year-old images on this film could still be salvaged provided that the film was custom-processed with a special anti-fogging agent added to the developer.

Furthermore, the remainder of the roll of film could be used provided that additional exposure was given to each frame.

Often film that is very much out of date is found in homes and stores. If it is colour and not more than one year out of date, it would be a good risk if marked off by half price. Black and white film will be a good deal if purchased five years out of date.

Regardless of any film purchase you may make, always check the expiry date of every roll of film.

### BEWARE HEAT AND SUNLIGHT

Should you suspect that any roll of film has been stored in sunlight do not buy it, even if it is in date.

For instance, if a roll of colour film is stored in the glove compartment of a car that was parked for four hours in sunlight, the resulting temperature could age the film the equivalent of one year in good storage conditions.

Therefore, film merchandised from a store window display could be severely damaged after several weeks of sunshine.

### EXPOSURE ADJUSTMENTS

All film should be stored in its unopened moisture-proof package at a temperature below 65° F (18° C).

The following recommendations are based on personal experience:

For black and white film, add one stop exposure for each ten years of age.

For colour negative film, add one

stop exposure to Fuji brand, and a half stop to Ekatacolor Professional S or Kodacolor X for each five years of age.

Colour transparency film approximately five years old requires an additional half stop of exposure and usually additional yellow filtration. Wratten filters 81 A,B, and C should be used in this case. However, a Wratten number eight intended for black and white film may be used for older films. Additional exposure is required when using a filter.

### BE SURE

The only way to be sure of the exact adjustment required is to shoot the first of several rolls as an experiment, then the remainder will be done correctly, based on your results.

Examine your first experimental roll of film paying particular attention to the amount of detail shown in the shadows of a sunlit subject. Compare this film against one you know was correctly exposed and developed.

Those photographers with non-adjustable cameras will be at a disadvantage where old films are concerned. Extended development of your old film is a second rate cure. This, combined with the added cost of the professional processing should be a deterrent to

you. However if the film is not too old, simply restrict your shooting to fully sunlit scenes only.

If your camera is adjustable, you may make the exposure adjustment by dividing the ASA number (film speed) by two for one stop more exposure or take two thirds of the ASA to give one-half stop more exposure. Set this adjusted number on your camera as the proper film speed.

## Zacharias objects to 'out-of-hand' field trips

Pender Island school trustee John Zacharias made it clear on Thursday that he has little use for the inclusion of some field trips in the school curriculum.

Zacharias spoke out against field trips at the regular board meeting last week following a lengthy discussion and final approval of two excursions planned for Gulf Islands Secondary School students. One outing involves a three-day ski trip to Forbidden Plateau for Community Recreation 12 students and the other is a week-long visit to the Okanagan for 58 grade 10 Social Studies students.

The youngsters taking in the ski trip were required to pay \$70 each to help cover costs, while the grade 10 trip will cost each student \$50.

Zacharias voiced objections to the field trip concept on the grounds that "some of them are getting out of hand."

"I have a feeling that we have a

pretty hazy idea when it comes to the situation of what's following the curriculum," Zacharias said. "And I really feel that some of these trips are getting out of hand. We have too many and they're becoming more a recreation thing than anything else. And they're far too expensive in terms of what happens."

## Parking ticket a first for Salt Spring

A landmark of sorts for Salt Spring Island was set January 11 when Ganges RCMP issued the very first parking ticket on the island.

The ticket was issued to Joanne Logan after she parked a van in front of the Ganges Crest restaurant at about noon that day. RCMP say the vehicle was blocking almost half of the entire roadway, protruding out into the main thoroughfare to the point where it was approximately two feet from the centre line of the road.

In addition to paying the \$15 fine that went with the ticket, the driver was required to pay a hauling fee after police called a tow truck to have the van taken away.

At present, however, it is in the experimental stages and has only been set up in Vancouver and Victoria. Residents of the islands must pay for the cost of the phone call to use the service, although if it is successful, a Zenith number may be introduced in the future.

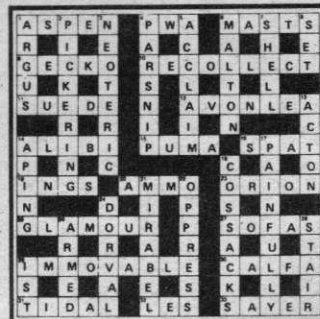
## Delays continue to hamper Fernwood
