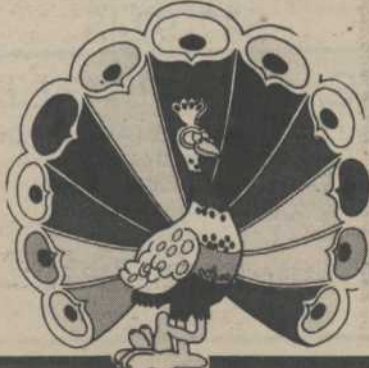

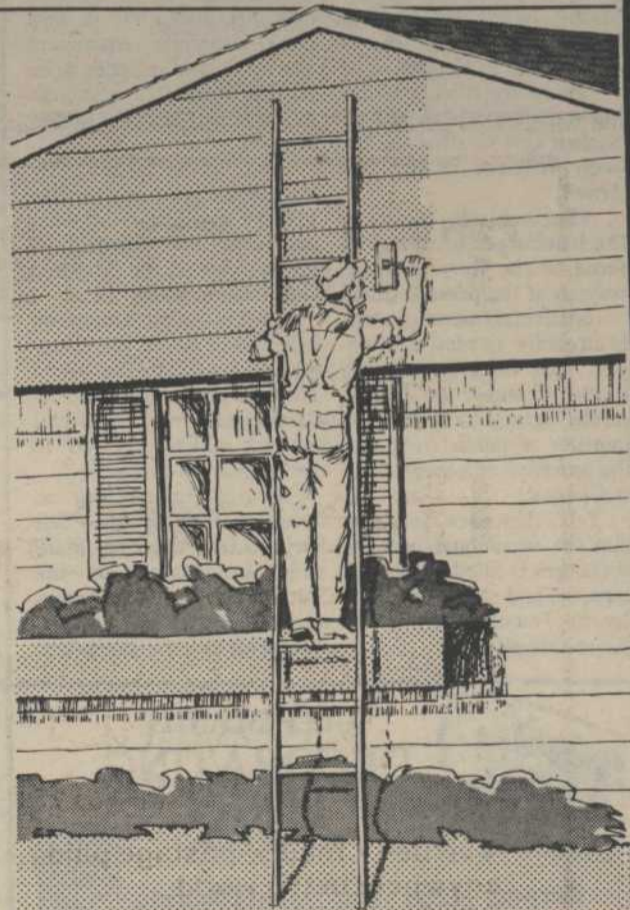

## Down Through The Years With Driftwood

### FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Lacking a quorum last Wednesday evening the Chamber of Commerce executive informally discussed possible strategy for achieving the park they have visualized at the Ganges Boat Basin.

The original sketch by Mr. Charles Mouat was shown at the 1960 general meeting. The sketch showed the whole boat basin design which has been followed in the work completed to date. A boat launching ramp has been an extra to the original sketch. The fill area showed a tree every 40 feet with benches and flower boxes alternating between; the whole was centred by the cenotaph. A proposed custom house was included in the original sketch.

Dr. William T. Lockhart of Scott Road was one of six pioneer physicians in British Columbia honoured at the annual meeting of the B.C. Medical Association on October 2 at the Empress Hotel, Victoria.

Dr. Lockhart retired to Salt Spring Island in 1951 at the age of 80.

### TEN YEARS AGO

Peter Arnell brought up the happiest of all rumors for island travellers last week when he addressed the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce meeting in the Legion Hall at Ganges.

There are rumors of dining room service aboard the Secheft Queen after she has been refitted, stated Mr. Arnell.

Chamber was critical of the hamburger breakfast offered on the ferry to Tsawwassen at the present time.

Small craft mooring space is urgently needed at Ganges. Last week Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce agreed to press the minister of public works for the provision of a breakwater at Ganges.

P.H. Knowles reported that the small boat harbour at Ganges is filled beyond its capacity and that there is a dearth of mooring facilities in the community.

The greased-piglet-catching contest is in the home stretch. All 13 piglets have been sold to organizations, businesses and resorts which in turn have sponsored the piglets to take an active part in the contest whether they like it or not.

Wide interest is being shown, not only by Salt Spring Islanders but also by visitors and off-Island land owners who have heard of the contest through the columns of Driftwood or from friends and have made donations or sponsored piglets.

Firemen spent nearly 1,400 hours of training and firefighting during the year 1967, the annual meeting of Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District was told on Tuesday evening last week.

In his annual report Fire Chief Fred Donaghy stated that the volunteer firemen of Salt Spring Island attended 26 fires during the year. These included three house fires, nine chimney fires, 11 grass, two boat and one car fire.

Thirteen members of the department also took a first aid course during that year.

### FIVE YEARS AGO

Fire protection referendum is to be presented this fall to property owners of Galiano Island.

Galiano Volunteer Fire Department staged a meeting in the Galiano Hall on Saturday evening, October 6 to outline future plans.

Chairman Fred Robson said that his was a meeting to give islanders information on the coming referendum to borrow moneys to build a new fire hall, buy a new truck, upgrade equipment and lease land in order to be in line with the standards required by Canadian underwriters.

Salt Spring Island Planning Association has written to Municipal Affairs Minister James Lorimer offering its initial views on the proposed Gulf Islands Trust.

Two planning groups on Salt Spring Island are pressing for a voice in the Island Trust envisaged by the Select Committee on Municipal Matters which reported to the legislature last week.

At a joint meeting on Tuesday evening the Salt Spring Island Advisory Planning Commission and the Salt Spring Planning Association approved two motions calling for local participation.

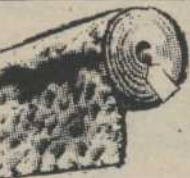

Bilingualism in Victoria? Never!

But it was right there in the capital. A bilingual newspaper in 1858.

The reproduction of *Le Courrier de la Nouvelle Calédonie* was sent to Driftwood by a former Salt Spring Islander, Archdeacon Ray Horsefield.

There were two editions. Volume 1, No. 1 appeared in the capital city on September 11, 1858. It was to be published Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

The second edition appeared on September 18. It was a weekly intended for distribution in the mines, the United States and Europe.

No. 9 was published on October 8 of the same year. Beyond that the reproductions reveal nothing.

The political and literary journal was the organ of the French populations in the English possessions.

#### GOVERNOR DOUGLAS

Nothing is known for sure of the comings and goings of His Excellency the Governor J. Douglas. He is already, according to the latest news, at Fort Yale. It is to be hoped that this journey will have happy results in the mining districts.

Transporters of letters, packages, gold dust and other commodities, Kent and Smith were the only express company with connections to the interior of California.

At 11.30 am on Saturday, Sept. 11, 1858, P.M. Backus sold by auction the burned out steamer, Sea Bird. He had his morning filled. At 10 am he started out by selling the furniture and contents

of the house known as Waterloo House. Having sold furniture and ship, he went on to selling lots in Victoria, during the same afternoon.

The significance of *Le Courrier* is the fact that there was sufficient French in evidence to merit the launching of a French newspaper, despite the fact that it did not survive. But the interest of the paper is simply that of another record of the early days of the province.

The comments and the news reports bring back something of the daily debate in the Cosmopolitan Saloon and other such centres of wisdom.

The question of common law

was obviously under some challenge. The *Courrier* wrote that it is constantly being commented that the Colonies and England have little law in common. It was also noted, not without some bitterness, that the British system of handing over law and legislation to large mercantile corporations was not to the benefit of the people subject to those laws.

Politics have changed very little in the intervening century-and-a-quarter.

## Supreme Court ruling on sewers

[From Page One]

a resolution requesting the Director of Pollution Control to pass an order to the Capital Regional District directing that a sanitary sewer system be installed in Ganges without delay.

That order was issued January 11, of this year.

W.A. Pearce, appearing at the hearing for the Pollution Control Board, suggested that, although the petition set out the nature of the relief sought, it was "sadly deficient when it failed to set out the ground on which the relief is sought".

In reply, Ian Waddell, for the petitioners, suggested that the paragraphs in the petition clearly indicated the nature of relief sought:

"12. The Director of Pollution Control ordered the sewer construction without accurate or sufficient knowledge of the issues involved, relying only on the Executive Director of the Capital Regional District."

A second paragraph cited was that which states that the petitioners do question, 15(d) "The autocratic, arbitrary, undemocratic and apparent illegal methods adopted to authorize the project." and (c) "The validity of the authorization."

**NOT GROUNDS**  
The allegations in the aforesaid paragraphs, stated the Judge, "in my view, are not grounds at all."

The findings explain that the Pollution Control Act gives him all the powers necessary for carrying out the intent of the act.

"The Director had the power to act in the manner he did and, whether he had 'accurate or sufficient knowledge of the issues in-

olved', is immaterial in law to challenge the validity of his actions.

"The allegations in 15(d) and (e) are not grounds at all and, if anything, are bald statements or assertions."

The judge added that, in his view, the petition should have set out a ground or grounds on which relief is sought.

In summary, the judge ruled that the petition failed to comply with section 14 of the Judicial Review Procedure Act in failing to set out a substantive ground; that the petitioners failed to show that the District or its servants or agents acted in excess of their authority and the petitioners failed to show the judge that the balance of convenience lay with them.

## Fisher quits Trust

Jack Fisher, Salt Spring Island local trustee has announced that he will not be seeking a further term on the Islands Trust.

He told Driftwood that the past two years have been rewarding, but that he feels two years is a sufficient term for a retired man.

"It is an interesting job and I have found it very rewarding," he said.

Looking back on the two-year term, he recalled that the pressure has been unrelenting and that the Ganges Plan and the new zoning by-law, in addition to the routine business of the Trust, have placed a heavy load on trustees.
