

Kitchen Korner

Pies originated in ancient Greece, according to legend. Later, the Romans conquered the Greeks, and learned from them the art of making pastry. The Romans filled their pastries with beautiful fruits from near and far.

The flaky tender pastry we know today was developed about 1790 and each country soon perfected its own national specialty: the flans from England, the Napoleons and other puff paste delicacies from France, the fruit-filled strudels from Germany.

DEVONSHIRE MINCEMEAT PIE

1 unbaked pie shell
2 cups mincemeat
2 beaten eggs
2 cups sour cream
2 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
...Line a 9 inch pie plate with the pie shell of your choice.
...Fill with the mincemeat. Bake in a 425 pre-heated oven for 20 minutes.
...Mix together the eggs, sour cream, sugar and vanilla. Pour over the mincemeat after the 20 minutes of baking. Bake another 8 minutes. Cool.
...Refrigerate the pie for 1 hour and serve.

COFFEE CREAM PIE

Baked pie shell
1 1/2 cups strong coffee, freshly made
2 squares unsweetened chocolate
1/2 cup cream
3/4 cup sugar
1/2 cup flour
1/4 teaspoon salt
3 egg yolks
1/2 tsp. vanilla
1/8 tsp. cinnamon
Sweetened whipped cream
...Bake pie shell. Set aside to cool.
...Put coffee in top of double boiler. Add chocolate. Cook until chocolate is melted.
...Mix cream with sugar, flour and salt. Blend. Add to mixture in double boiler. Stir until thick. Cook 20 minutes.
...Add beaten egg yolks. Stir well. Continue cooking for 5 minutes and then remove from stove. Blend in vanilla and cinnamon.
...When almost cold, pour into pie shell. Chill. Top with sweetened whipped cream at serving time.

FROZEN STRAWBERRY PIE

Baked pie shell
2 boxes frozen strawberries
2 tablespoons cornstarch
2 tablespoons cold water
3 egg whites
6 tablespoons sugar
...Line a 9-inch pie plate with pastry of your choice, bake and cool on a cake rack.

...Empty the two boxes of frozen strawberries into a saucepan and bring to a boil, over low heat. Blend the cornstarch with the cold water. Add to the strawberries and cook, while stirring, until slightly thickened. Remove from heat. When cool, pour into the shell.
...Beat the egg whites until firm, then add the sugar gradually, while beating. Spread over the strawberries. Bake in a 325 oven just long enough to brown the meringue slightly.

FAVOURITE COCONUT TARTS

Make 10 Baked Tart Shells
1 cup sugar
2 tbsp. cornstarch
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 cup butter
1 tsp. vanilla
2 tsp. lemon juice
1 cup water
3 egg yolks, slightly beaten
1/4 cup butter
1 tsp. vanilla
1 cup moist shredded coconut
1/4 cup chopped filberts
1/4 cup toasted coconut
...Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt in saucepan. Stir water in gradually. cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture boils. Boil 1 min.
...Remove from heat. Stir at least half of hot mixture into egg yolks. Then beat into hot mixture in saucepan.
...Boil 1 min. longer, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Continue beating until smooth.
...Stir in butter, vanilla, lemon juice, 1 cup coconut and filberts.
...Pour into cooled baked tart shells. Sprinkle 1/4 cup coconut over top.

BANBURY TARTS

Make pastry for one-crust pie. Roll into large square 12 x 12". Cut into nine 4" squares.
1/2 cup raisins, chopped
1/2 cup sugar
1 1/2 tbsp. fine cracker crumbs
1 egg yolk
1/2 tsp. soft butter
Dash of salt
1 tbsp. lemon juice
1 tbsp. grated lemon rind
2 tbsp. chopped walnuts
...Mix all ingredients. Spread filling over half of each square.
...Moisten edges, fold into triangles and press edges together with tines of fork. Prick tops.
...Bake at 450 for 12 to 15 minutes or until delicately browned.

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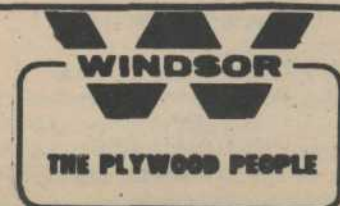

When Woody Fisher made his predictions before visit

It is 18 years since the British Columbia Premier, W.A.C. Bennett, with his Cabinet, visited Salt Spring Island. The event is recalled by the visit of the Cabinet of Premier W.R. Bennett to Saanich and the Islands last week.

It is 18 years since the publisher of Driftwood, Woody Fisher made a forecast of events for the historic meeting.

He had a 12-point program and here is it:

Being brave and bold, Driftwood, makes the following predictions concerning Premier W.A.C. Bennett on his day in the Gulf Islands:
