other operational alternatives as well. Kertland has pointed out that the island has always been under pressure to join the Vancouver Island Regional Library system. Such an alliance would give Salt Spring a library operated wholly by paid staff directed from Nanaimo. Facilities would be rented, and minimum total annual cost to the island has been estimated at \$40,000.

NO DIRECT CONTROL

Although joining the system would give islanders access to all of the books within the region, Salt Spring Island residents wouldn't have direct control over the operation of their library.

What will the major benefits be if the association does achieve its goal through its fund-raising campaign?

Space, says Kertland. Even now more space is required for the aisles between the stacks, for a staff workroom, a separate reference section and a special area for children. And, of course, there's the added benefit of having more money than ever to spend on books.

Finally, Kertland says that there should be little fear of the library losing its autonomy should the expansion and acceptance of government guidelines go ahead. Although even now the local association is required to seek the approval of the minister before any important commitments can be made, the association is basically a self-governing organization, and it intends to remain that way.

Transport assistance to be allowed

The Gulf Islands School Board has ruled that parents of children living in the Fernwood area but attending the alternate class in Ganges may apply for transportation assistance.

The board was told at its business meeting December 21 that there are two or three youngsters in the Fernwood area who do not live within the walk limits of a bus serving Salt Spring Elementary.

Trustees looked at several possibilities to accommodate the youngsters, including alteration of the school bus routes and making the transportation of the children the responsibility of the parents.

At the suggestion of trustee Ivan Muat, however, the board agreed to consider applications for transportation assistance.

The maximum allowance per family is \$75 per month.

"That means we'd probably be looking at a total of about \$150 a month if the parents were able to provide the transportation," Muat noted.

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IN CALIFORNIA

Controversy surrounds huge Laguna mud slide

Dr. A.E. (Pat) Worthington, the son of Mrs. Ian Macdonald of Ganges, is a research scientist with the California Research Corporation.

A resident of California for the past 26 years, Dr. Worthington recounts the tale of the Laguna slide.

Dr. Worthington was educated in Vancouver where he earned a Bachelor of Science and his Master's degree at the University of British Columbia. He completed his doctorate at Northwestern University near Chicago, Illinois.

**

The biggest news in Laguna has

been the slide. I have saved a copy of a paper with excellent coverage and will send it by printed matter rate.

The geologists are still poking around and drilling holes down 50 or 60 feet that are large enough to send down a safety cage with a man inside to look for slide surfaces, etc.

Briefly, it appears that the area was an old slide that had not moved in historic time. There is a strong likelihood that the contact between the slide and the bedrock was lubricated with water, and that some minor final disturbance triggered the movement.

The important question is, where did the water come from?

If it came from last winter's rains, then the people who lost their homes presumably have no leg to stand on as far as collecting on insurance, which does not cover slides unless the direct result of an earthquake, and then only if one has earthquake coverage, which 95%, actual figure, do not.

However, if it was a leak from a water district main, or a city sewer, then they might have a case for making a claim against the district responsible.

25 HOMES GONE

So far, around 25 homes are definitely gone, and somewhere up to 25 more are in jeopardy. Last weekend Ginny and I joined a volunteer work party which was tearing apart the 25 doomed hous-

es.

The people were allowed to salvage all their personal belongings, and I suppose as much else as they chose.

Then the local community association, with the consent of the residents, organized a public effort to tear out everything that conceivably could be sold. Work crews took out plants and potted them up, removed doors and windows and other fixtures.

Ginny and I tore up a big deck and salvaged the 24 2x6 planks, and then helped bundle up hardwood flooring which had been stripped from the floor of one house.

None of the houses were pretentious, having cost about \$8,000 in the late '40's, and mostly having been sold to GI's. Now they would

have sold for \$100,000 and up.

The salvaged material is being hauled away to another site and then there will be a public sale. The proceeds will be divided equally between the participating homeowners. Then this coming Monday, they will bulldoze down the remaining houses and take the remains away, then go to work on the slide itself.

SEMICIRCULAR

This slide is quite typical. It has a semicircular shape, with a 30 to 40 foot almost vertical drop in a horseshoe shape at the head end. This upper part of the slide dropped down, but the surface on which the slide moved changes very rapidly from near vertical to almost horizontal, so at the toe of the slide the movement is horizontal, and even somewhat upward.

The surface on which the slide moved has about the configuration of a horseshoe-shaped section of a shallow teacup.

As the slide moved, the houses sitting astride the upper hanging wall were either left hanging out in the air, or collapsed and crashed down into the gap between the moving slide and the remaining wall.

Houses in the middle were tipped, but in many cases only slightly damaged, while houses near the toe suffered from the soil welling up beneath them as they were carried along, smashing slabs and tearing walls apart. By some miracle there were no casualties.

STABILIZATION

The next process is to try to stabilize the slide before the winter rains.

We have had about 1.5" since the slide, in two installments, and the last one was touch-and-go.

The slide is located on the Temple Hills side of Bluebird Canyon, just above the Bluebird Park near the corner of Cress, Mountain, Temple Terrace and Bluebird Canyon Road.

The slide blocked the drainage down Bluebird Canyon, which has a watershed of about 400 acres.

They installed pumps, but during the last rain the pumps failed as the water rose 6" every few minutes. However the rain stopped before the impounded water topped the slide.

If it had it would have rapidly cut down through the toe, sending enormous amounts of mud-laden water downstream, with the possibility of washouts and serious damage between there and the ocean.

If the toe had been washed away that could have destabilized the slide further and resulted in more movement. So they will now cut through the toe, and bury a 5' diameter drain line right through the toe, then backfill and carry the toe securely across the canyon and up against the other side. This will mean the people on Bluebird Canyon Road, who had the slide come across the canyon into their back yards, will end up losing their steep back yards and gain almost level yards as the dirt is moved around with hope to stabilize the almost 500,000 cubic yards of soil involved.

SHAVE WALL

They will also shave back the almost vertical hanging wall to a hopefully stable configuration, which sadly enough means that some people whose houses are totally undamaged but just above the slide will lose their gardens and possibly even their houses.

On Thursday, December 28 a wonderful party was held at Bob and Helen Allison's farm when 26 Pender children attended with their parents. The party started about 2 pm and lasted 'til dusk. The children fed apples to the goats and were shown how the sheep were fed. A huge bonfire roared away and there were logs for everyone to sit on. the land and the people who own it remains to be determined.

The mortgages must still be paid on the destroyed houses, and Carter just vetoed a bill which would have allowed 2 to 3% loans for new houses, so the best they can do with disaster relief at present is around 8%.

However, a new bill is promised in Congress, in January, which will reestablish the low-interest loans without including some objectionable riders or other features which prompted Carter's veto. There seems to have been a very effective outpouring of community support, so the people are managing, although for some it is a worse ordeal than for others.

A brief history of 1978

Many islanders will probably look back on 1978 without being able to remember anything in particular except that it was another year in the continuing controversy over issues such as sewers and planning.

In order to jog their memories and remind readers that there were other happenings worth remembering, here are some of the highlights of the year, taken from the Driftwood files.

January

Some were joyful, some were horrified and others didn't really give a damn when, as of January 1, the Islands Trust took over land-use control from the Capital Regional District.

Saturna Island school trustee Tom Davidson was named chairman of Gulf Islands School Board. In other school district news, tenders were called for the construction of Fernwood School. At that time, it was hoped to open the school by September.

The Capital Regional Board decided to proceed with installing sewers in Ganges to service the phase one area. Meanwhile, it was charged that the sewer petition had

Centre to see 15 acts: four of them were gonged.

Members of the Salt Spring Island Farmers' Institute were wondering what to do with their money this month. There was little response to Dave Phillips' suggestion that they have a party. At the same meeting, the institute decided to look into purchasing land. The land would be used for the annual fall fair, among other activities.

The Gulf Islands branch of the Royal Canadian Legion celebrated its 50th anniversary at a gathering at Mayne Island.

March

Over 200 fishboats arrived in local waters for the opening of the herring fishing.

Two B.C. Hydro employees were injured when a power pole fell over near Ganges. Hydro crews were installing transformers on the new pole on Blain Road when it fell.

Two 27-foot boats were launched at Pender Island. Both the Marie Rose and the Wanderleer were built on the island, the former by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Pardee and the latter by Conrad Burns.

Education minister Pat McGeer

The 38-foot sailboat Nobby of Victoria was launched at Ganges. Owners are Doug and Jackie Truscott, who purchased a fibre-glass hull and added cabin and decks themselves.

Readers learned that Salt Spring Island is one of the worst places in the Capital Regional District for lack of animal control. A Victoria woman estimated that there were 500 stray cats on the island.

The fire rate on Salt Spring was to come down one mill it was announced this month. The budget for the island fire protection district was \$115,000 in 1977. Figure is down to about \$90,000 for 1978.

School taxes jumped more than 20% in Gulf Islands School District. The mill rate was set at 47.04, up from last year's figure of 39.02.

A zoning infraction charge laid against a Mayne Island business was dismissed in Ganges Provincial Court. DAR Building Supplies was charged with storing lumber on property not zoned for the purpose.

May

Tom Toynbee, of Mouat's Trading Co., outlined a proposal for

Lions Crippled Children's Society.

The first game of the Beer League Softball Series was played at Ganges. Standings, however, are not clear as no one kept track of the score.

The Salt Spring Island Sea Capers was so successful that contestants were making plans for next year before the two-day affair was over. The island was packed with visitors and the school grounds and waterfront were crowded with spectators and contestants.

Residents of South Salt Spring Island showed their support for a neighbourhood pub at Fulford by voting 96 in favour and 39 against the proposal at a meeting in Fulford Hall.

An explosion on the troller Colleen while it was gassing up at Porlier Pass left Angus Crocker in hospital with burns to the arms, chest and head. Quick action by Mark Matthews saved both the boat and gas float from serious fire damage.

Sylvia Tyson was on Salt Spring to record some local musicians for her CBC show, Touch the Earth. The show, which was to be aired in September, featured Valdy, Kathy Stack and Marianne Grittani.

Men's League Playoff Championship.

Value of building permits for Salt Spring rose sharply in July with the construction of various major projects on the island. The new Intermediate and Personal Care Unit at Ganges and the Fernwood School are two big projects. The Lady Minto Hospital renovation is now in progress and Valcourt's supermarket is under way.

Result is that building on the island has risen almost a million dollars over the first seven months of 1977.

The 1978 Mayne Island Fall Fair was a rousing success, with a record number of people attending and an extremely high quality of entries in the various categories.

Cost of transportation and the difficulties of travelling might prohibit some Saturna Island children from attending school in the fall. Gulf Islands School Board heard representations from islanders who were alarmed at the cost of sending students to the Mayne Island middle school.

Sam Bawlf, minister in charge of the ferries, was awarded first prize for the worst cup of coffee in Canada. Known as the "Black Cup" award, it was presented by

been forged: a Ganges man denied having signed the petition, despite the fact that it bore his signature.

Plans were laid for the first annual Ganges Rat Derby at this time, but the derby never materialized.

Sewers were in the news again towards the end of January when the Pollution Control Branch issued an order requiring that sewers be installed at Ganges without further delay.

Plans were revealed for a neighbourhood pub at Vesuvius. Capacity of the pub is to be 45 persons and its sponsors are proposing it as a meeting place for the Vesuvius community.

February

Health minister Bob McLelland was at Ganges to turn the first sod on the site of the intermediate and personal care unit near Lady Minto Hospital. The minister shovelled more snow than dirt.

Donald New was named chairman of the Galiano Chamber of Commerce at its annual meeting February 4. He takes over from Mervin Ferguson.

The Fernwood School project was cancelled when school trustees voted against accepting a tender for the job. The vote was tied at 4-4. The Fernwood Parents Group has urged the board to consider alternatives to building the half million dollar school. Later in the month, the board reversed its decision and decided to go ahead with the construction of the school.

Operating budget of the school district has been established at \$2,615,530, highest in the islands district's history.

Vocalist Sonia Hill took the top place at the Gong Show held at Ganges. Show was held to raise funds for Central Hall. About 200 people gathered at the Activity

was on Salt Spring Island for a Social Credit meeting at Ganges. He promised to investigate the rate of tax collected under the equalization legislation. Islands school trustee Spencer Marr protested the amount of taxes collected in the Gulf Islands under the legislation.

Construction began at Ganges on the expansion of Ganges Auto Marine premises. Jack Reynolds, of the Gulf station, and Steve Nelson, of Nelson Marine Service, have merged. Nelson will be moving from his present location in the old forestry building.

Bernie Reynolds caught the biggest salmon at the Salt Spring Island Rod and Gun Club's derby this month. His fish weighed in at 10 lbs. 6 oz. Reynolds also caught the biggest cod, a 21-pounder. Two Salt Spring Island boys who entered the same derby came home with an eagle instead of fish. They found the bird on the beach while they were fishing in Sansum Narrows. It was suffering from a broken wing, the result of a gun shot. The eagle was later given to a Vancouver zoo.

April

Salt Spring Island was given a \$1,000 grant to assist with Captain Cook Bicentennial celebrations.

A car rally held at Salt Spring drew 20 entries and was won by the island's fire department. The course was 50.7 miles.

New fire chief at Ganges is Robert Leask. He was chosen from 30 applications for the post, which was vacated when former chief Kelly Hanke left the island.

The Easter week end saw a large number of visitors attend the eighth annual Art Show at Mayne Island. Over 100 paintings were displayed at the show, which is sponsored by the Paint and Sketch group on the island.

A motorcyclist was killed after colliding with a motor home on Salt Spring. William Boyce, of Vancouver, was driving a Harley-Davidson 1200 when the accident occurred on Lee's Hill.

June

Ivan Larson, of Salt Spring Island, presented the Lions Club with a copy of his will, in which he leaves his lakeside home to the

July

Between 150 and 250 persons took part in a massive search at Fulford Harbour for a six-year-old boy. Search was called off after the body of Heath Johnston Miller was found by divers in the harbour.

Nearly 2,500 people were at Saturna for the annual lamb barbecue, at which 1,400 dinner tickets were sold.

H.A. Simons (International) Ltd. was awarded a \$97,000 contract for an oceanographic, biological and environmental study of Ganges Harbour.

Tides, temperatures, currents and every aspect of the harbour relative to the dumping of effluent will be considered before the Ganges sewer project gains formal and final approval.

Five men died at Bedwell Harbour when a Cessna 185 crashed immediately after taking off. The pilot and four passengers were killed.

Thirty-three boats entered the fifth annual Round Salt Spring Race sponsored by the island's sailing club. The Marshall Sharp trophy was won by Doug Foerster in his Catalina 27, Wind Warrior.

Three Duncan teams, two Sidney teams and two local teams provided solid softball action for hundreds of fans when the Fulford Salties hosted their first Invitational Men's Softball Tournament.

August

Plans to build a 30,000 square foot supermarket in Ganges were revealed by K & R Your Food Store. Application has been made to release about six acres of land behind the liquor store from the agricultural land reserve.

The Fulford Salties defeated Speed Brothers-Cablevision 2-1 in Super Softball Series '78 in the

Terry Warbey, of Salt Spring Island.

September

Elaborate fire protection system on South Pender Island would not be practical or feasible at the present time. Report of the provincial fire marshal's office has been made to the Capital Regional Board and will be considered at a ratepayers' meeting at Pender.

Plans for extensive changes at Mouat's property in Ganges were revealed at an Islands Trust meeting in Ganges. First phase of the project would be construction of an 8,000 square foot food store, and a new building of 3,000 square feet next to the fire hall.

Power went out on two islands when a tug ran aground in Active Pass, breaking the submarine cable running between Mayne and Galiano.

Tourist bureau at Ganges was a popular spot in the summer with 35 volunteer workers manning it. They were entertained with a dinner at Harbour House Hotel. A total of 4,009 visitors were registered at the tourist bureau between June 8 and Labour Day.

It was the biggest and the best yet when a sunny Saturday greeted the Salt Spring Island Fall Fair. Fair was opened by Mike Byron, an active force behind the fair since it was first proposed.

October

Challenge to the Ganges sewer project failed to gain the support of the British Columbia Supreme Court and the installation may proceed as originally planned. An injunction which would call a halt to the project was refused.

A number of islanders are concerned that ferry service from Fulford will not be sufficient while the Bowen Queen is off the run for about four months. Both the Bowen

Driftwood took first place in the Tabloid, circulation over 3,000 class, of the British Columbia and Yukon Newspapers competition.

Islands MLA Hugh Curtis announced a \$63,666.67 grant for Salt Spring Island. It represents one-third of the cost of the development of Portlock Park at Central.

Two Gulf Islands ferries will be stretched under a \$60 million ferry construction program. The Bowen Queen and the Mayne Queen will be stretched to increase their capacity from 50 to 70 cars.

Angry words and insults were hurled at the Islands Trust during a public hearing called to deal with the Salt Spring Community Plan and revisions to rezoning and subdivision bylaws. A large portion of the meeting was devoted to

discussion of a proposal for a core area development in Ganges. Objectors to the idea claimed that the Trust was being discriminatory in concentrating expansion of businesses in the current downtown waterfront area.

November

A total of 34 Gulf Islands residents filed nomination papers in the race for school board, Capital Regional District and Islands Trust seats.

Gulf Islands School board agreed to comply with a recommendation from Charles Baltzer that a letter be sent to the Islands Trust regarding closure of Kanaka Road.

Islands Trust and three members of the Salt Spring Trust Committee were served with a Supreme Court writ calling for the invalidation of the Salt Spring Community Plan. Writ was initiated by Yvette Valcourt.

New recreation centre with theatre, library and other facilities, the abandonment of Mahon Hall, the postponement of hopes for a community swimming pool and provision of additional facilities at Portlock Park were among the initial recommendations suggested by the Recreation Plan for Salt Spring.

December

New chairman of the Islands Trust was named by acclamation when 25 local trustees named three general trustees. Bowen Island trustee John Rich takes over as chairman from Marc Holmes.

Darrell Georgeson's Sophia was almost destroyed by fire while tied up at Ganges Marina. The cabin was destroyed before the fire could be controlled.
