Valdy to present concert for Sea Capers on June 9 evening

Big feature of Sea Capers this year will be the open-air concert by Valdy in Centennial Park at Ganges on Saturday evening, June 9.

There will be no charge and a large audience is expected to listen to the Salt Spring Island folksinger, who brings his music home when he comes back to the island.

Valdy Horsdal's family are centred on the island.

Concert will be at 8.30 pm.

As in 1978 the first event of the weekend program will be the teenage dance in the high school under the supervision of the Salt Spring Island Fire Department.

The general program will open on Saturday, June 9 with the float past of entries in boats and tubs. First bathtub event will be staged at 12 noon to coincide with the opening of the beer garden.

In the early afternoon there will be the inner tube race and the softball tournament.

The challenge rowboat race will be featured at 2 pm. Bingo will commence on the strip of road between the post office and Mouat's Store and the Sky Divers will give a display.

ESSENTIAL TUBS

Bathtubs are the essence of Sea Capers. The dead heats will get under way at 3 pm and at 4 pm will be the challenge trophy events.

Supper time will be 5.30 when the clam and oyster bake and the lamb and pork barbecues are all

served.

The evening will be empty from supper time until the Valdy concert and at 9 pm will be the community dance.

On Sunday the first call will be for the empty stomachs as a pancake breakfast will be served at 9 am. The Salt Spring Island Lions will prepare the breakfast in the lee of Mouat's Store.

Sabot race and ball tournament finals are scheduled for 10 am.

Walk on water contest, which was the highlight of last year's events, will be staged at 11 am. Last year's champion, Erl Jorgenson, will be the favorite.

End of the bathtub races will be at 12 noon.

TROPHY PRESENTATIONS

School band concert at 1 pm will precede the presentations at two o'clock.

First Sea Capers was launched last year by a committee established for that express purpose. It was so well received that the committee has undertaken the second.

In charge of the overall program is Charles Sutcliffe, commodore, his two right-hand men, the land and water supervisors, are Bob McWhirter, land and Dale Neilson, water.

Last week's meeting of the committee brought most arrangements to a head. McWhirter announced the addition of two events, the Valdy concert and the sky

divers.

He also noted that Jake Javorski had undertaken to accommodate the sky divers at his own expense. There will be six divers, each making two jumps.

WITH KATHY STACK

Valdy had offered to do a free concert, the same as his cross-country tour. He will perform with Kathy Stack and a band. It was suggested there may be a pop concession in the park.

Rod and Gun Club will look after the clam bake and the island riding club will serve chili, sandwiches and, possibly, hot dogs at the beer garden.

South Salt Spring Island Women's Institute will sell home baking in the downtown area and has undertaken to buy a support-sticker for the occasion.

The meeting, in Gulf Islands School Board office, agreed that the program was well into its final stages and that everything bodes well for the weekend of June 8-10.

Permits down in March

Ten building permits were issued by the Capital Regional District in the Gulf Islands during March. Last year, figures show that 14 permits were issued in the same month.

Three permits went to Salt Spring Island, four to Pender, two to Mayne and one to Wise Island. The construction was valued at \$207,914 on Salt Spring, \$178,801 on Pender, \$48,598 on Mayne and \$14,860 on Wise Island.

In 1978, Salt Spring had seven permits; Pender, 1; Galiano, 1; Mayne, four; and Saturna, one.

Two more building permits were issued during the first three months of this year than in the same period in 1978.

Salt Spring has had 16 this year and 13 last; Pender, nine in both years; Galiano, four this year and two last; Mayne, four and 10; Saturna, three and one.

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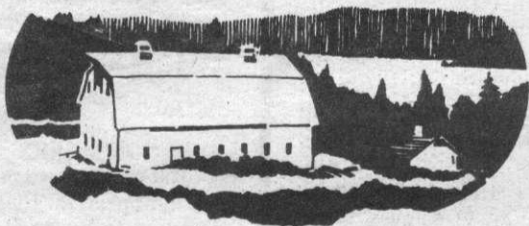

back for finally ridding themselves of one of the world's great statesmen.

For many months the nation's pundits and great thinkers will be continuing to explain the phenomenon of an election. The election will be carefully dissected as the political pathologists carry out the post mortem.

Bet you they never do find out what was the cause of death of the Liberal government!

SOME OF IT

Some of it was that Pierre Elliot Trudeau was French. That is a serious sin in the eyes of many westerners.

Some of it was that the unfortunate private life of the prime minister incensed the righteous who kept their women in their proper places and were disgusted at the sight of a man who couldn't.

It is this word righteous that keeps cropping up when you start to think about the election.

Trudeau had some very powerful, very wealthy, very bitter enemies.

There were pamphlets circulated from the Ontario hate presses

all about Trudeau. Some of these had an effect. Very proper and dignified Canadians would read them and become indignant that the nation could harbour an emissary of Satan. When the Ontario Jew-haters get into high gear they put out a lot of filth, and some of it sticks. And they have a wide range of targets.

All of these things contributed to the election results last week.

And the Liberals had been in long enough.

Canadians like to feel the goad at irregular intervals. They elect Liberals to guide the country and Conservatives to inflict penance on them. They're machosists....and that's a jet-age masochist.

UNFAIRLY OF COURSE!

It is nearly 50 years since the

Bennett government, but the name of R.B. Bennett is still linked with the Bennett-buggy. Unfairly, of course. But the only accomplishment of that great Canadian which has stayed with the Canadian people was the use of the horse in the day of absolute poverty.

In due course the nation decided that its penance was at an end and re-elected a Liberal government.

It comes in cycles.

John Diefenbaker cycled up Parliament Hill in 1958 to bring a new era to Canada. In a short time he was to write history with his unprecedented majority.

There was no opposition to any great new program the Conservatives could accomplish. We all waited in great eagerness and anxiety.

It was an era: an era of crumbling government. The Cabinet fell apart like Vesuvius in full eruption.

And after a reasonable and proper penance, the Canadian people re-elected a Liberal government.

SUFFER FOR EVER

There are those who feel that Canadians should suffer forever and that there should never be another Liberal government. And they are in the minor majority today.

The people have spoken. Half said one thing and half said another.

The only one who said very little was the new prime minister, who said what was wrong but has not yet said what he will do to right it. And we Canadians hung on every word. We're still hanging. Must we hang?

Will Petrocan go? That's the \$64 billion question. Joe Clark says yes. The opposition says no. The next instalment will come direct to us from the House of Commons.

And of Quebec? Nobody said very much at all. Not even Rene Levesque. The more you look at Quebec, the more vague becomes Canada's history. Despite Charlottetown, Upper Canada and Lower Canada are still very eloquent in their own legacy.

QUESTION MARKS

The great question marks have not disappeared. There are a few decisions to be made by the new government that will affect every Canadian for years to come. They remind us of the wisdom shown by Canadians in retaining a minority government. There will be no sweeping measures in the near future.

The future appears to hold an election. It also holds so many uncertainties. Will Prime Minister Clark be able to control his ministers? And will the Conservative government call a further election in strength and unity and harmony? Or will they fall apart in strife and dispute? We have seen both.

The future certainly holds a vigorous Conservative machine bracing up the government and watching for sagging foundations. It certainly contains a new era of aggressiveness for the Liberals, particularly in the west where Joe is happily paraphrasing Liberal who?

And the future holds the same tight structure and solid work force for the New Democrats that has

Some recipes from the teacher

I recently had the honour of doing a demonstration of Greek cooking for a gourmet club on Salt Spring Island. It was a marvellous opportunity for me to meet some very lovely and friendly people who made me feel right at home, especially my hostess Virginia Newman.

I stayed overnight in her lovely home atop a high hill overlooking Long Harbour. What a view, it's so woody as to make one feel all alone with the hustle and bustle of the outside world shut out completely. Salt Spring is indeed a lovely island, and it has no less than three ferries that come and go daily to Victoria, Vancouver and Crofton.

Since the days were filled with brilliant sunshine the drive down island was superbly beautiful. I never tire of the breathtaking scenery of these lovely West Coast Islands.

Since I have had requests from this island and Salt Spring Island readers for more make at home mixes, especially of herbs and spices, I have decided that there is no time like the present.

SHAKE AND BAKE

4 cups bread crumbs (all brown or 1/2 brown and 1/2 white)
1 cup flour (white or whole wheat)
1/2 cup yellow corn meal
2 teaspoons fine herbs
1 tablespoon paprika (more if you wish)
1/8 teaspoon pepper
1/2 teaspoon celery salt
1/2 teaspoon onion salt

METHOD: Process crumbs till fine in a food processor or blender. Mix

in all other ingredients. Store in an airtight container. This mix keeps for months and months. It is good for coating croquettes, fish, poultry, pork and patties. For coating veal cutlets or pork steaks; just add a bit of finely shredded cheese.

SEASONALL

4 tablespoons salt (I use sea salt)
4 tablespoons paprika
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
1 tablespoon onion powder
1 tablespoon celery salt
1 teaspoon fine herbs, crushed

METHOD:

Mix all ingredients, store in an airtight space. Use in salads, sandwiches, casseroles, stews, soups, on meats of all kinds and on vegetables. This mix is much better than the store variety because it does not have monosodium glutamate in it, monosodium glutamate being very bad for one's stomach.

CHINESE HOT SPICE

1 teaspoon cayenne
1 tablespoon ground cloves
1 tablespoon ground fennel
1 teaspoon cinnamon

METHOD: Mix well. Store in airtight spice jar. Use to season chinese sauces and marinades.

PARIS SPICE

1/4 cup lemon pepper
1/4 cup ground cloves
2 tablespoons nutmeg

METHOD: Mix altogether. Store in airtight jar. Use to season meats, such as Pates, sausages and stews.

ONION SPICE

1/4 cup minced dried instant onion flakes

1 teaspoon ground cumin
1 tablespoon garlic powder
1 tablespoon lemon pepper
1 tablespoon basil

METHOD:

Mix well. Store in an airtight jar. Use to season roasts, chops and stews.

Alternate class teachers at Ganges are interviewed

BY TOM HALL

As this school year comes to an end the Alternate Class of Salt Spring Elementary School is preparing for next year. Now that Fernwood School is finally moving to their new home, the class is

planning its move from Mahon Hall to two classrooms in the new building.

Applications are being accepted to fill the few vacancies. Any child, grade one to seven, may apply to principal Tom Watson at the school. Also, the program for next year is being prepared.

As a parent of a child in the class who has enjoyed two years of an alternative education, I interviewed the two teachers about their ideas. Mrs. Debbie Magnessen will continue with the class and Scott Lawrance will be replacing Tom Perry. Mr. Lawrance previously taught grade two at Salt Spring Elementary.

Q. What are the educational goals of the class?

A. Individual and group projects with intellectual exchange; providing a space in which the possibility of a true meeting is maximized; to provide a quantity of resource materials and persons to enable a follow through of individual interests; a concern for the whole child's development, affective, cognitive, etc., that each child be satisfied she/he is progressing in self-determined areas; stress on students for their own determination of goals for evaluation of success, rather than always adult-directed and evaluated; development of own values within a varied range of possibilities; development of thinking skills.

Q. How is the program an alternative to any other class?

A. Most obvious is age grouping which provides an experience rarely if ever met in regular structure of day-to-day contact; no comparative evaluation, only individual, written, highly detailed reports and self-evaluation; opportunity to pursue elements of prescribed curriculum when interest is there, rather than dependency on what year/grade you're in; greater opportunity to follow through on individual projects; emphasis on the creative and useful arts as a vehicle for learning; focus on particular curriculum areas such as native studies, alternate energy, gardening, third world.

Q. What child might do well in this program?

A. Self-motivated, co-operative, risk taking. Someone who likes making things, creative, respectful of property, etc. All the motherhood qualities.

Q. What kind of parent involvement is there with the class?

A. Commitment to class participation, construction and supplies, work with teachers to follow through on both academic and behavioural progress at home.

Q. How is each child's development evaluated?

A. Directed self-evaluation, progression through skills (sequential) written evaluation by staff.

Q. What kind of academic freedom and responsibilities do the children have?

A. A multiple of learning situations - some teacher directed and some student chosen. Record keeping at each area - eg. journals, time sheets kept by each child.

Q. Why is an alternate way of education necessary?

A. "Let each become all. Because it's there. Man's reach must exceed his grasp" - but seriously, folks - You get to go on camping trips.

Islanders are 'parochial'

— Esler

The provincial Ministry of Lands does not have to take into consideration accountability to the voting public when planning for the province's recreational needs, said a ministry spokesman last week.

Assistant regional land manager for Vancouver Island, John Esler of Nanaimo, made the statement with regard to a proposal to subdivide 25 acres of Crown land on Quadra Island, near Campbell River. He was quoted in a story which appeared in the *Campbell River Courier* May 25.

The ministry had proposed to open up the land, on Main Lake on Quadra, for recreational subdivision use but withdrew the plan because of opposition from the regional district, the ratepayers' association and an environmental group.

'QUITE PAROCHIAL'

"The people on the islands have been quite parochial on these types of things," said Esler, and added that the definition of a conservationist is someone who bought his land last year and doesn't want to see any more development.

He explained that the branch had provincial interests in mind and was trying to develop more recreational sites in B.C. due to the increased demand for leisure land.

"It is a very common problem on all the islands that there is a very local attitude taken towards any recreational development and it is a conflict I just can't quite understand."

"We control the foreshore and we make sure that we issue permits only with upland owners consent and before making the proposals we refer all our land applications to six or eight resource agencies and then the technical decision is made on whether it would be suitable or not. The decisions are technical ones, not emotional."

Camera impressive because of size

The most impressive thing about the Rollei 35B is its size. The average 126 instamatic as well as several 110 cameras are bigger than this little marvel. It is truly shirt-pocket size.

The lens is 40mm with a semi-wide angle of view the same as most amateur snapshot cameras. The difference is that this lens is sharp! You will get far better quality enlargements from this camera than from any 110 or 126 instamatic.

Both the aperture and shutter must be set by the user. This is no chore because the selenium meter dial on the camera's top tells you exactly what to use at a glance.

Apertures range from f3.5 to f22 and shutter speeds go from 1/30 to 1/500 second. This offers commendable versatility for a

snapshot camera which is matched by few others in its category. **NOT PERFECT**

My main concern is that a camera fulfills the function it is designed to serve. The Rollei does this with flags flying. However, it is not quite perfect.

A major fault is the construction of the rewind lever on the camera's base. It is first necessary to align the free-turning rewind lever pin in the exposed flange of the internal claw. This is easier to do than to say. Unfortunately, it is neither explained in the instruction manual nor is there a cautionary note on the camera base.

The result is that the user, after taking all the exposures on the film, cranks away on the rewind lever to no avail. He does not realize that he has accomplished nothing until he has removed the camera back, whereupon he is

confronted by his now ruined film. Provided that you have a long memory or you stick a large note down there to remind yourself, you will not fall victim to this idiosyncrasy.

POORLY WRITTEN

My second most vehement criticism is that the instruction manual is poorly written. I found that the example given to illustrate the use of depth of field scale on the camera lens was quite confusing. The writer was apparently not fluent enough in English.

There are two cautionary notes: the lens requires the user to estimate the distance to the subject and set the front focus ring accordingly. Although I found this easy, having done it for many years with manual flash units, some people may require a little time to acquire this skill.

Also, the "hot shoe" for flash units is on the camera bottom. This may cause strange shadow patterns when making portraits. An accessory will be required to convert the hot shoe to a "PC" terminal. Then a PC extension cord will enable the flash unit to be located off the camera for better modelling.

GOOD CONSTRUCTION

The construction and quality of finish of this camera are very good.

This makes the price of \$80 to \$100 a remarkable buy when compared with the new, higher-priced instamatics that range from \$60 to \$240. I hardly need to repeat that the Rollei 35B will exceed all of these in quality of enlargements, the true criterion of lens and camera performance. As an added bonus, the 35 mm camera owner has a choice of more than 18 types of 35mm film, whereas 110 and 126 camera users are restricted to five and six types respectively.

The Rollei 35B is one of a series of almost identical cameras made by Rollei. The 35 S, 35 T, 35 LED, and 35 models offer a variety of other features including faster lenses and semi-automatic exposure control.

The camera tested was loaned by Mrs. Brenda Cornwall, whose photographs frequently grace *Driftwood's* pages.

Early start is planned on changes at Ganges

Business in Ganges is growing. Mouat's Trading Co. has announced plans to start this summer on the developments in the shopping centre at the Ganges core area.

The company revealed its plans last year, but gave no indication of when a start would be made.

First project calls for two buildings. They will be joined together on part of one wall. First building, across Manson Road from the Bank of Montreal, will cover about 3,000 square feet.

SECOND UNIT

First move, said Tom Toynbee last week, will be to carry out soil tests. He expressed optimism that the work on construction will commence this summer.

The spokesman for the company explained that the shopping centre is occupied 100% and that he has people waiting for the new accommodation.

Future plans for the shopping centre provide for a new restaurant overlooking the harbour, a new large retail store unit and office accommodation.

Membership up three per cent

Salt Spring library fund up to \$50,000

Salt Spring library treasurer Biz Stratton reports that a very generous donation of \$500 from the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 92 upped the building fund to \$50,300 last weekend. The Legion Ladies have supported the library for many years in a very tangible way by providing helpers for the front desk on a regular weekly basis, *Driftwood* was told.

Although the fund was recently assisted by a \$37,000 grant from the provincial lottery fund, it is interesting to note that the difference of \$13,300 includes donations from some 180 members and friends of the library, says library spokesman Don Kertland.

He also reports an increase in the membership since the beginning of the current year. It now stands at 877 members, reflecting an increase of some three percent over the 851 members at the end of 1978.

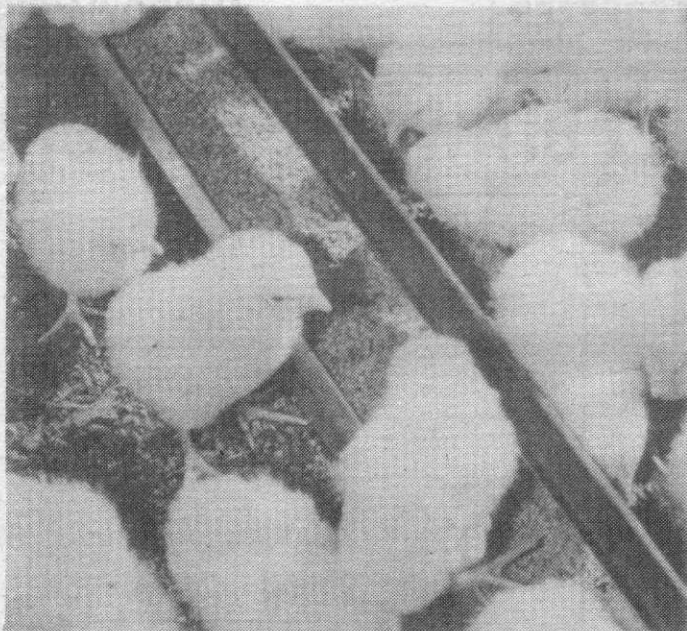
