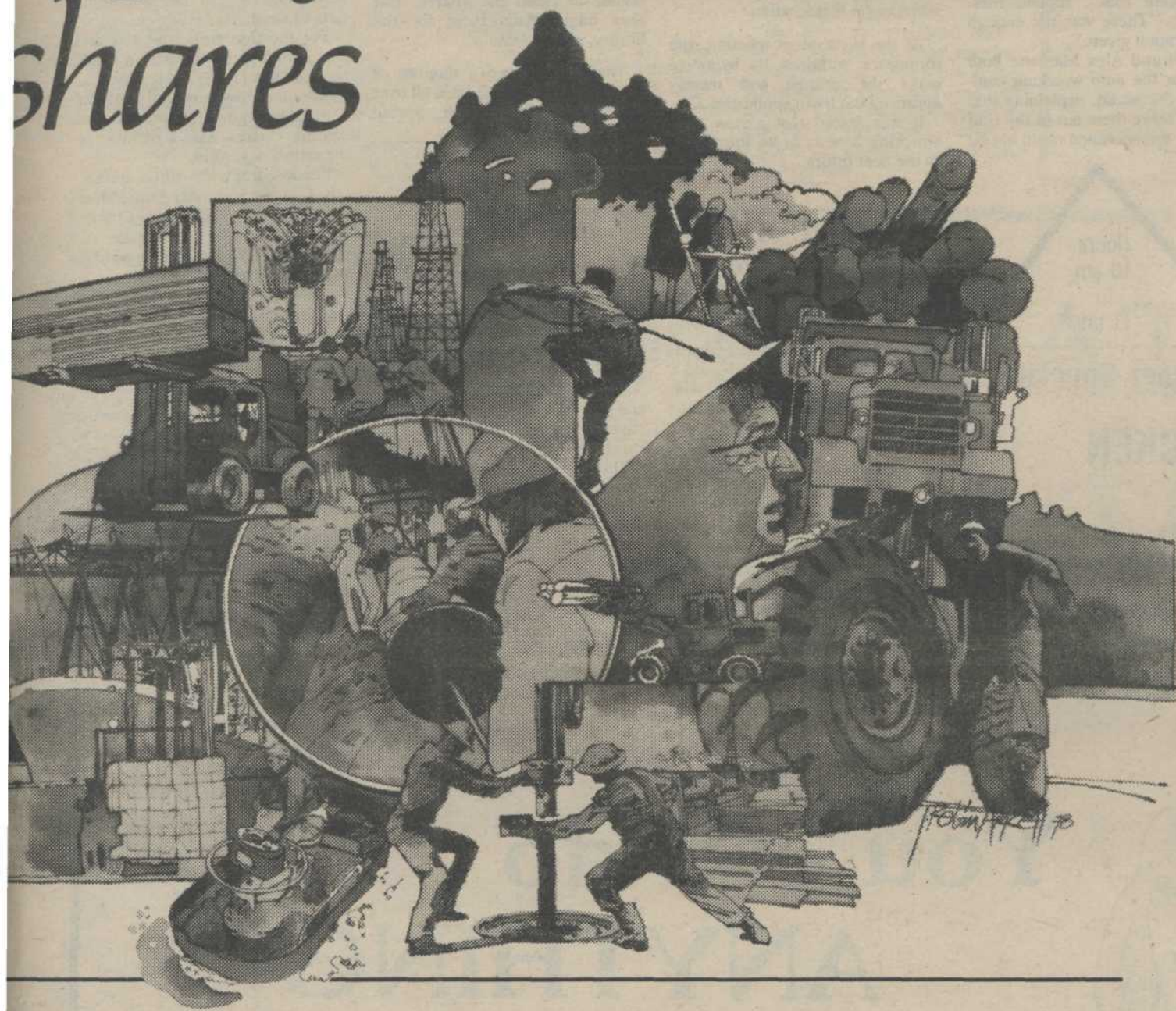

# New zone to be prepared for auto wrecking plants

Plans of the Islands Trust to restrict zoning for auto wrecking were abandoned on Tuesday evening after a number of protests had been sounded against the proposal. The Salt Spring Island Trust

Committee was proposing to move auto wrecking from Industrial 3 to 4. It was felt that this measure would prohibit the establishment of an undesirable activity in a residential zone.

First to criticize the proposal was Yvette Valcourt, who pointed out that it would leave Salt Spring Auto Wreckers as a non-conforming operation.

Was consideration given to persons affected, she asked. Chairman John Rich stated that it was.

"I resent this," replied Mrs. Valcourt. "There was not enough consideration given."

Gilbert and Alex Marcotte both spoke for the auto wrecking company on the island, explaining that it would leave them out in the cold and that the operation could not be

closed for more than 30 days without being shut down for good.

### HE WAS OUT

The purpose of the proposal had been to accommodate Don's Collision in Ganges. Don Irwin had discovered that he was operating a body shop in an Industrial 2 Zone. It is not permitted under the zoning bylaw. He had asked for Industrial 3.

Trustees wanted to ensure that a future operator could not start wrecking in that location.

At the subsequent meeting, the committee withdrew its bylaw to make the change and merely approved the Irwin application.

It was stated that a new auto wrecking zone is to be introduced in the near future.

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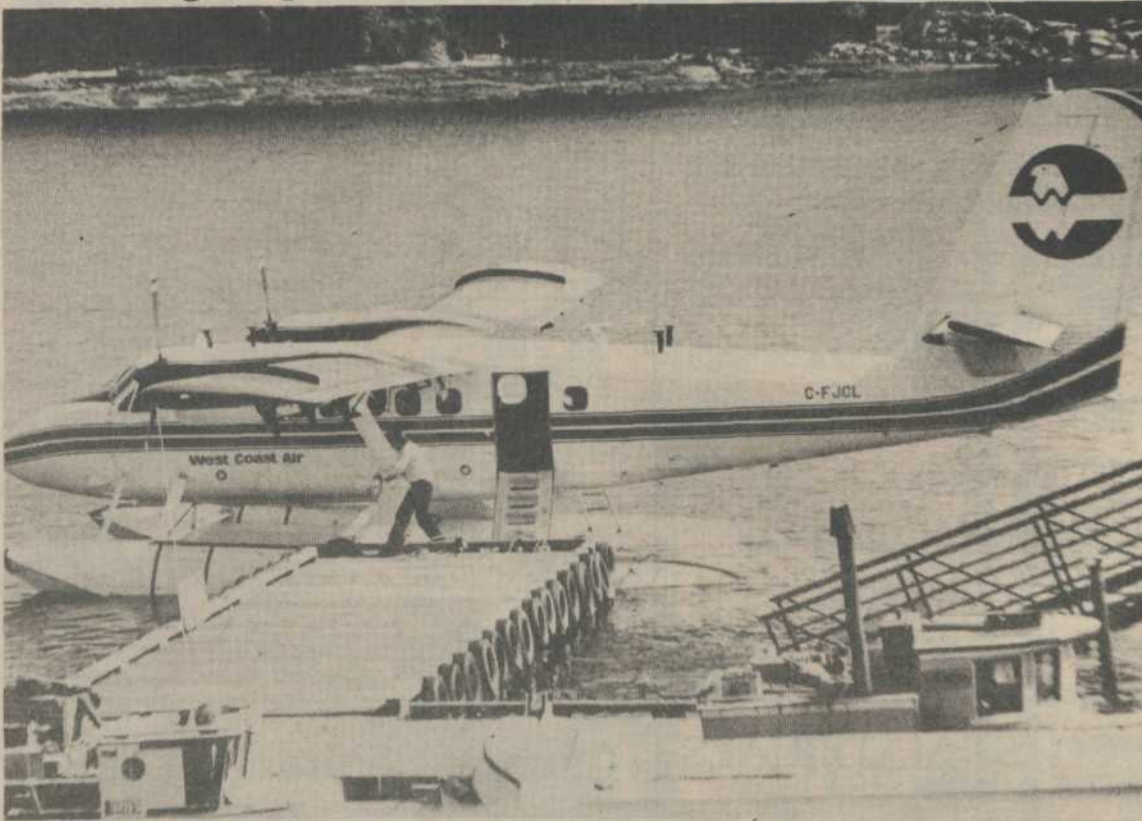
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## Big airplane ties up at Ganges Wharf

## Driver gets 60 days on two liquor counts

Fulford driver went to prison for 60 days last week when he pleaded guilty to two charges of impaired driving.

Court was told that Charles Brenton had been required to take a breathalyzer test on two occasions and had blown high on both occasions.

He pleaded guilty to driving while impaired in March and again in May. In both cases he blew a .23 and a .22.

Judge Fred Giles sentenced him to 60 days on each offence, to run concurrently.

"I am meting out a prison term in the hope that it may bring Brenton to his senses," said the judge.

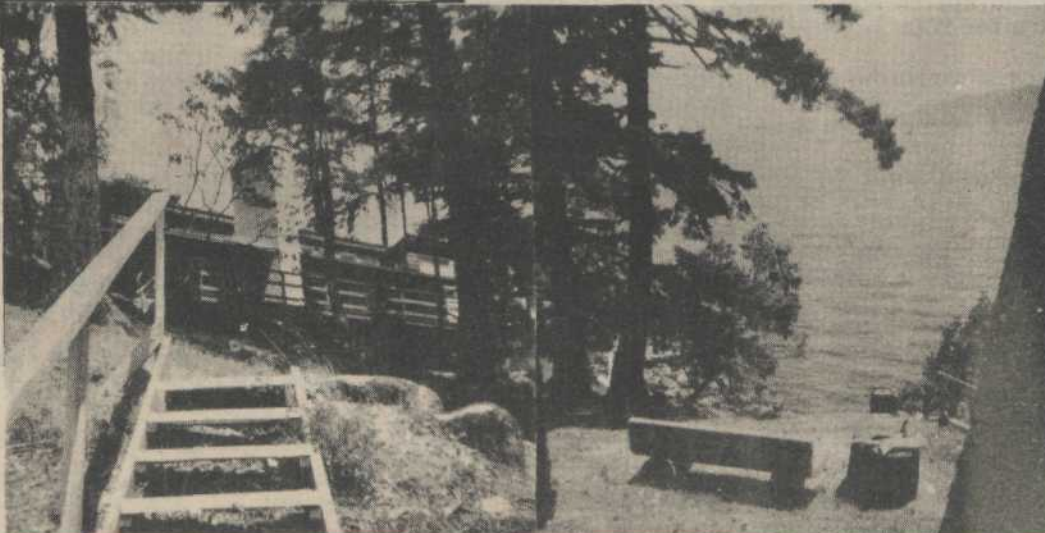
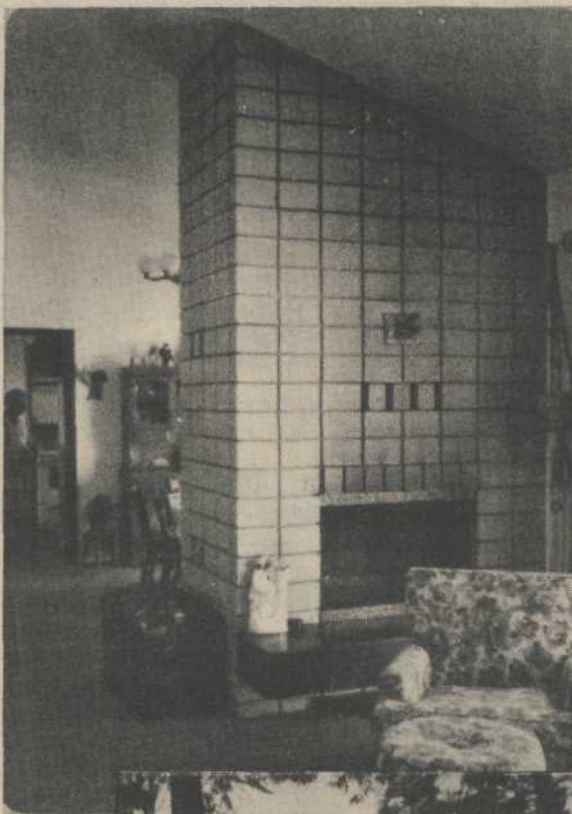

## Treasure house of marine life is examined by aquarium staff

The Vancouver aquarium is coming back for more.

When divers Horst and Sandre Klein of North Pender recently offered the aquarium four Puget Sound King crabs they'd found, they discovered it has a well-established program for receiving donations from sports divers.

Two of the aquarium's staff were sent out to reconnoitre the area where the crabs had been taken and to instruct the Kleins in the fine points of recognizing, collecting and transporting specimens.

Sure enough, the area, which the divers decline to locate exactly, turned out to be a treasure house of marine life. At the end of the day several large styrofoam tanks filled with fish, crabs, starfish, sea anemones and chitons were ready for the ferry trip 'home'. In a spirit of optimism, the aquarists left four empty containers for any future finds.

### SNEAK PREVIEW

A group of field-tripping city school children visiting Otter Bay for the afternoon didn't miss their opportunity for a sneak preview.

Crowding around the aquarium wan, they watched, touched and squealed with mixed horror and delight.

The most prized specimen was a fish called a decorated war bonnet. About eight inches long, brown with orange spots and wearing an unusual "bonnet" on its head, the war bonnet paced its plastic collecting bag, disgruntled.

Other finds included a moss war bonnet, various sculpins, a basket star, gumboot chitons and a number of heart and spider crabs.

Although these creatures are not considered rare, they are found at such a depth (about 60 feet) that most people will never see them outside an aquarium.

Sitting on board the Kleins' boat, *Queen of Storm*, after their dive, a magnificent lunch spread before them and hot buttered rums clasped in their hands, the divers compared notes.

### MOST ENJOYABLE

For her part, Sandra said, the dive had been the most enjoyable of any she'd made. "It's so much more interesting knowing what I'm looking at. I never noticed all those things before."

Her father had been fascinated by the process of "deflating" fish with a needle, before surfacing them.

Michael Gray, an aquarium employee for five years, told the Kleins that many specimens are acquired through volunteers. He cited the Vanquatics Dive Club annual collection which is usually very fruitful. Other specimens, he said, are "inherited" from private tanks. Guppies, like puppies, it seems, may grow beyond their owner's expectations.

Some are bought or traded with other aquariums. Recently, a six-foot alligator gar, or needle fish, was received from Texas.

What is happening to the first four king crabs? They're happily ensconced in their new home. Two of the four were females with eggs which, Michael Gray says, will be raised and bred.

In recognition of their contribution, the Kleins received a gift from the aquarium. It is a handsome book entitled *Sea Life of the Pacific Northwest* and is written (and autographed) by aquarists, Gilbey and Stefanie Hewlitt. Stefanie is known to many CBC listeners for her Friday afternoon spot on *Three's Company*.

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# Record water consumption marks early summer on Salt Spring

Water consumption in the North Salt Spring Waterworks District has reached record levels as a result of near drought conditions and continued population growth, reports Mike Larmour of the waterworks district.

A much lower than average rainfall during the past winter and spring has reduced available supplies.

The total consumption from Maxwell and St. Mary Lakes for the week of June 5-11 was approxi-

mately 2,350,000 gallons. This amount is very close to the capacity of the existing St. Mary pump-house and Cranberry main to deliver water.

In addition to the high general consumption, periods of peak demand are experienced, causing reductions in pressure or dropping water levels in storage tanks. The peak daily consumption during the summer is triple that of the average daily winter use, and mains, tanks and pumps must be sized accordingly, says Larmour.

The North Salt Spring Waterworks District is in the process of upgrading the system, a costly and time-consuming undertaking due to the high incidence of bedrock, hilly terrain, and the spread out nature of development, remarked the district manager.

The question of the capacity of St. Mary and Maxwell Lakes is being investigated by both the North Salt Spring Waterworks District and the Islands Trust. At present, both lakes are adequate for the demand. However, long-term planning for the future requires that a thorough assessment of available water supplies be made, supported by accurate data, gathered over many years.

### EVAPORATION

Of the total amount of water reaching Maxwell Lake from precipitation in the watershed, approximately two feet is lost by evaporation from the lake surface on an annual basis, and an amount equivalent to 1.75 feet is used by the water district. The balance is runoff down the creek, and is measured in a Parshall Flume.

Water consumption at St. Mary Lake, by the North Salt Spring Water District, is equivalent to 3½ inches per year. His records indicate that both St. Mary and Maxwell Lakes reached their highest levels in 1978 in January, falling 2.3 feet to the lowest levels in September and October.

For the near future at least, water restrictions will continue to

be necessary to reduce and even out periods of peak demand, warns Larmour.

In this regard, water consumers could assist the district through a difficult period by adopting water conservation measures where possible, and this help would be greatly appreciated, he added.

# Region steps in to halt Bennett Bay dock

Despite Islands Trust inability to come up with funds to cover legal fees, the Capital Regional District is taking action to halt construction of the dock at Bennett Bay, Mayne Island.

"We don't have funds for this either," CRD executive director Dennis Young told *Driftwood* Monday. "But we have a bylaw that must be upheld."

The CRD changed its position on the matter when it was learned that the Trust classed the dock as a commercial amenity. As such, it would come under CRD jurisdiction and require a building permit to proceed.

A permit will not be forthcoming, however, as long as construction of a commercial dock contravenes Islands Trust zoning bylaws.

A cease and desist notice to this effect was delivered to Mayne Inn owner Weldon Pinchin last Thursday. Should construction continue the CRD would be required to verify the fact before applying for a stop work injunction.

The half-finished dock is now silent and deserted, however, Mrs. Anne Pinchin told *Driftwood* she thinks the crew had other work to finish. Pinchin himself has no comment on the CRD notice.

# Application made to take two acres from reserve

The Pender Island medical centre land acquisition committee has received unanimous support from the Lions Club for its recommended site and application is now being made for deletion of the two-acre piece of land from the agricultural Land Reserve (ALR). The application must be approved first by the Islands Trust and then by the provincial Land Commission.

There is some opposition to this move, chiefly on the part of the Farmers' Institute. The institute feels that other sites are available and has indicated willingness to assist in fund-raising should a purchase be necessary. The selected site is being donated.

Land acquisition committee chairman Stan Carey emphatically denies that there are any other options and invites the Farmers' Institute to go over his list with him. Negotiating with the Land

Commission, he says, could take a couple of months and "time is of the essence".


"For that reason," he says, "we would gladly look at any alternative."

But any other place is going to cost \$20,000 plus and the Land Acquisition committee is certainly not going to recommend that to the people of Pender".

Meanwhile, should both the Islands Trust and the Land Commission consent, rezoning of the land can take place without recourse to public hearing.
