Following the meeting, Lorraine Campbell introduced the guest speaker, Beth Hill of Salt Spring Island, who gave an interesting account of her research prior to the writing of her book, *The Remarkable World of Frances Barkley: 1769-1845*.

VIVID DESCRIPTION

With the aid of slides to illustrate her talk, Mrs. Hill charmed her attentive audience with a vivid description of her experiences, beginning at the provincial archives and ending in England where she delved into the historic background of Capt. Charles and Frances Barkley.

Mrs. Hill's first contact with Frances Barkley was at the archives, where she was gathering material for an article about petroglyph pictures of sailing ships. She received a notebook containing Frances Barkley's reminiscences, which contained hitherto unpublished information on his voyages and his wife, Frances' participation in them. Capt. Charles Barkley was well known on the Pacific coast as an explorer and fur trader.

More visits to the archives were made and not satisfied with the information available there, a decision was made to visit England and try to contact as many of Barkley's descendants as possible in order to write a more detailed historic record of Frances and Charles Barkley's voyages.

STOLE RECORDS

The reminiscences brought to light the fact that Capt. Meares

had stolen records and charts which rightfully belonged to Capt. Barkley. A diary written by Frances Barkley at the age of 66 was presumably burned in a fire at Westholme, Vancouver Island. Also missing were Capt. Barkley's journals.

Mrs. Hill was accompanied by her husband Ray, who went armed with a special camera for photographing documents, and with back-packing gear they set off on their journey through England's towns and villages in search of information about the Barkleys.

In one overnight stopover, an out of date magazine on the bedside table contained, of all things, an article about the Barkleys in Scotland who were descendants of Capt. Charles Barkley! This was very encouraging and an important inclusion in the notes for reference.

CONTACTS

Contacts had been obtained by way of newspaper ads and telephone numbers provided by friends.

Another important episode (of which there were many) happened at Whitminster House, Berkley, where the author and her husband were entertained by the owners. They were introduced to a Miss Violet Barlow who claimed to have read Frances Barkley's diary in 1934. This was astounding news since the diary was supposed to have been destroyed in the fire on Vancouver Island. The stories were different from those in the reminiscences and so the listeners could only conclude that the diary still existed.

Slides were shown of the church at Bridgwater where Frances was baptized, and the graveyard at Enfield where the Barkleys are buried.

The reconstruction of the Barkley family tree as well as that of Frances' forebearers has resulted in a beautifully bound and extensively researched book by Beth Hill.

Marjorie Ratzlaff thanked the speaker for her most informative talk. During the social hour which followed the members were given an opportunity to ask questions of the speaker and scan copies of charts and other documents.

Inshore Rescue program now has seven stations on west coast

The members of the Inshore Rescue Boat (IRB) program are back at their summer posts, doing their bit to promote boating safety in west coast waterways.

Back in 1972, the federally sponsored pilot project had only three boats. The 17-foot inflatable Zodiacs were stationed at long beach, Marine Island and Victoria. Since then, the program has expanded and attracts summer employees from many spheres of interest and from far afield. One of the regulars was a medical student from the University of Alberta.

This year there are seven stations; one each at Victoria, Salt Spring Island, Silva Bay, Pender Harbour, and Boundary Bay and two in the Parksville area.

Each station has one boat; in most cases, a 17-foot rubber Zodiac or, in high risk areas, a 23-foot Atlantic 21. For its special needs, the Victoria contingent utilizes an 18-foot, fiberglass Avon, *Searider*, which is trailerized for quick re-

location to trouble spots.

HOME BASE

As home base for the Gulf Islands, Ganges has been allotted an Atlantic 21, a highly specialized inflatable developed by the Royal National Lifeboat Institute and used extensively around the United Kingdom.

Like all the stations, 502, (Ganges) is staffed by two alternating crews of two student summer employees and one regular Coast Guard employee. Coxswain, Gary Miller and seaman, Clair Biglow of 502's "A" crew, spoke to a *Driftwood* reporter when they pulled into outer Bay recently. The third member of the crew, seaman Duane Prentice, remained at base to man the radios.

It is Miller's second season with the IRB program; last year he was stationed at 504 in Parksville.

Biglow, a third-year marine biology student at UVic, had applied to join last summer, but was not enlisted until this year. Holder of a sailing ticket and St. John's Ambulance first aid certifi-

cate, Biglow has also worked as a guide in the Campbell River area.

EXPECTS INCREASE

So far, according to Miller, things have been "slow" on the rescue front, but he expects calls to increase considerably once schools are out.

Victoria Rescue Co-ordination Centre estimates that there are over 200,000 pleasure boats on the coast at this time and the figure is growing by approximately five percent per annum.

By comparison, marine "incidents", which means everything from towing in a fuel-less boat to drownings and sinkings, are increasing at the rate of 18.2% per year. Last summer the IRB was involved in 85 incidents.

With these figures in mind, the IRB personnel are looking at boating safety from both "prevention and cure" angles. They are conducting an education campaign which includes "courtesy" safety inspections of boats at marinas.

On the water, they attend to small (but important) and routine jobs, searches, etc., in order to free the larger rescue vessels for the heavier tasks.

They flipped a coin for it and loser pays fine

Man who lost the toss was fined \$100 in Ganges provincial court last week.

When four men flipped a coin to see who should take the rap, Bruce Knowles of Galiano lost and admitted possession of marijuana, court was told.

He pleaded not guilty in Ganges on Wednesday, before Judge D.K. McAdam.

Court was told that four men were in a van near Galiano Hall while a community function was taking place. Police officers making a patrol saw the interior light and stopped to find two bags of marijuana, papers, a pipe and matches.

Police told the occupants of the van that all four would be charged with possession of the drug unless the owner identified himself.

Witness Dale Lyon stated that when they withdrew to debate the matter among themselves they flipped a coin to decide who would claim ownership.

Defence counsel F. Rueben challenged the written statement made by Knowles at the time of the offense. The accused had sat in the patrol car with Const. Darrell Sim-

monds and had asked for the advice of witness Lyon, he asserted, but it had been denied.

SEEKS REJECTION

On the grounds that the accused had been invited to sign the statement in order to avoid charges being laid against his companions, Rueben asked that the statement be not admitted.

Judge McAdam ruled that the statement was voluntarily given and that there was no coercion.

At the close of the trial, defence counsel asked for dismissal on the grounds that the Crown had failed to prove possession.

Lyon had protested that the manner of choosing a candidate for arrest had shocked him.

"But he still gained the benefit," commented Judge McAdam in his summing up.

Crown counsel A. McDonald told the court that sentences of \$150 were being handed down by a "brother judge". He had many brother judges, countered McAdam.

He fined Knowles \$100 and rejected defence plea for a conditional discharge.

Summer recreation for teens examined by centre

The Community Centre would like to know how many teens on Salt Spring are starved for summer recreation. Spokesmen for the centre have indicated that they are prepared to co-ordinate off-island trips for teens in the 13 to 16 age group.

The activities would be largely determined by the participants, and funded by them. Possible destinations include the Saanich Recreation Centre (swimming), the Sidney Teen Activity Group's

Centre (S.T.A.G.) movies, logging sports at Sooke, etc. S.T.A.G. offers a variety of organized activities for teens, including several camping trips. Their summer calendar is available at the Community Centre.

"We would like to hear from parents and other adults who would like to help with transportation, arranging a program, or simply sharing ideas about interesting places to visit," *Driftwood* was told.

"We anticipate these trips would take place about once a week, perhaps on a Friday afternoon and evening. Travelling in small groups with volunteer drivers should allow maximum flexibility as to who goes where, and for how long.

"We at the centre can help co-ordinate and keep everyone informed. We are located on Ganges Hill across from the RCMP. If you can't drop in, all us. Teens and volunteers will meet soon to discuss plans, so we would like to hear from you right away."

Insurance lapse is expensive

Harry Spence paid a fine of \$250 in Ganges provincial court last week when he pleaded guilty to driving without insurance. A temporary permit for the vehicle he was driving had expired at 9 pm, several hours before he was stopped by RCMP.

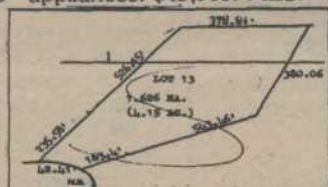

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Denman Island trustees to bury community plan

End of orderly planning on Denman Island is to be formally marked in Victoria on Thursday afternoon, June 28.

Island trustees for Denman Island, Harlene Holm and Glen Snook, will formally bury the island community plan in the front lawn of the Provincial Legislature. Interred with the plan will be the island bylaws.

Ceremony is planned for 1.30 pm on Thursday. A formal invitation tells the guest: "The community of Denman Island cordially invites you to attend a solemn ceremony marking the overthrow of our bylaws to accommodate land developers."

The Denman Island Trust Committee has protested the action of the Minister of Highways in approving a subdivision plan which fails to meet with local zoning or health requirements. They protest that the proposal is based on mysterious documents which have been lost in the passage of time, but which the ministry avers once existed.

The Denman Island Bylaw Support Group has prepared a statement for public distribution, summarizing residents' objections to the provincial government over-riding local planners: **WE PROTEST!**

The Ministry of Highways is about to approve a subdivision on Denman Island contrary to all standard procedures:

Which permits the developer to create 53 lots where only 22 are permitted by the local bylaw and community plan. This will provide the developer with a potential additional gain of \$3 1/4 million.

According to Highways Minister Alex Fraser, "The procedure of submitting a preliminary layout approval was inadvertently overlooked" in 1974.

According to Senior Approving Officer Don South, an undocumented verbal approval was "probably" given by an unknown "field worker" in the District Office five years ago.

The original proposal for the development was rejected by the health officer, the regional district, the local Department of Highways and the Islands Trust. It is now less acceptable due to the intervening bylaw changes.

The water supply for the development is contingent upon granting of a water license for an additional 20,000 gallons per day to be drawn from a small lake, an application twice as large as the Islands Trust and 85% of the island population opposed in 1975.

The documentation for this unusual decision is not available to the public, but is contained in a "secret file" in the highways ministry.

On Thursday, June 28 at 1 pm, Denman Islanders will demonstrate against conferring especially favourable status on a developer over both the law and the public interest!

Continued drought has imposed a heavy risk on forests and the restrictions apply to all machinery.

Logging, roadmaking equipment and BC Hydro machines must be out of the woods by one o'clock. Aerial patrol is being maintained to enforce the order.

Spokesman for the B.C. Forest Service on Tuesday did not expect a total ban. That is not common, he reminded the *Driftwood* reporter.

In Fulford Harbour

Lease application for log dumping rejected

An application for log dumping, booming and storage lease in Fulford Harbour has been disallowed, *Driftwood* learned this week.

Executive assistant to islands MLA and provincial secretary Hugh Curtis, Jim Guthrie, said Tuesday that Curtis had been advised by regional land manager J.H. Perry of Nanaimo that the lease had not been approved for three reasons.

The federal fisheries department had objected on the grounds that the area was heavily utilized by spawning herring and the booming operation could destroy the eel grass. Secondly, the Islands Trust had objected for various reasons. Lastly, the Ministry of Lands was opposed to log dumping and booming adjacent to a public beach area.

Guthrie said that Curtis had received many letters from Salt Spring residents concerned about

the lease and had "made strong representation to the Ministry of Lands, Parks and Housing to have the lease disallowed".

Curtis, said Guthrie, had indicated that rejection of the lease was "good news" to him because he had "been on record for some time as being opposed to any such log dumping or storage operation in Fulford Harbour".
