The Pender Islanders baseball team came in second in the Sidney Little League Play-off Games.

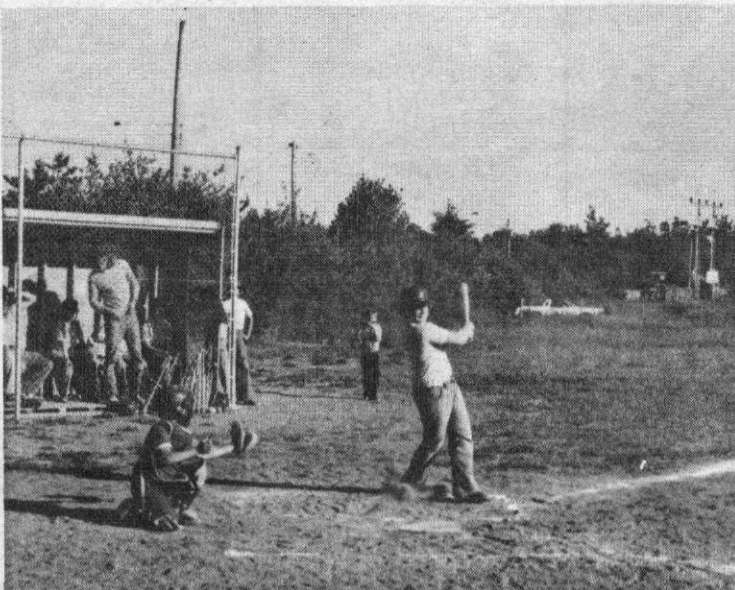

The marina at Thieves Bay is full beyond its capacity and minor renovations are in order, the meeting was told. The society has applied for a foreshore lease in Shingle Bay from the Ministry of Lands.



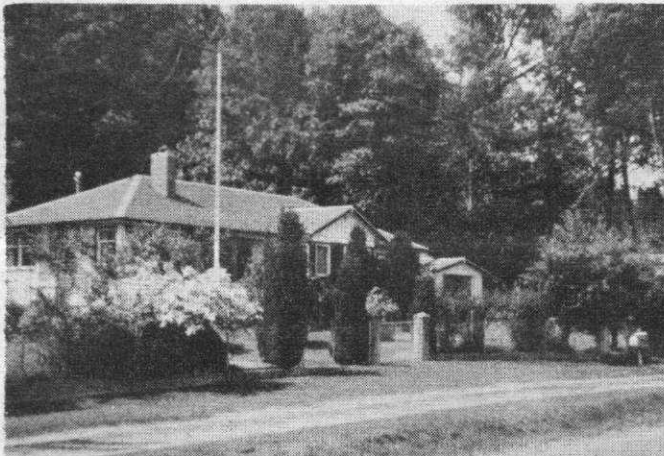

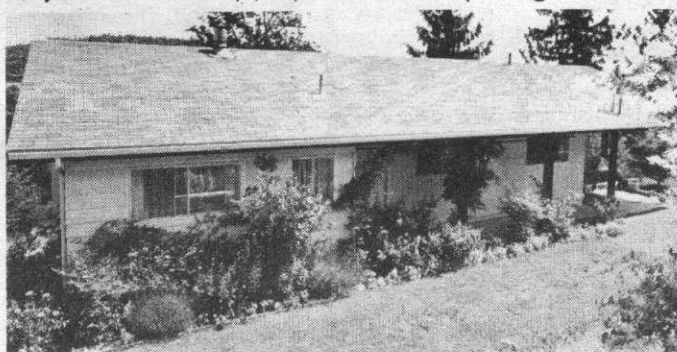

I eat twice. Chapatis and potatoes in morning; chapatis and cereal at night. We get water from tap. There is queue every morning. We have to wait one hour. We get one pitcher of water. We carry it home and we bathe. When I finish working at night there is only water left for hands and face. So we stay dirty from rubbish at night... Life will be better when I am older... I would like to have a house and two sets of clothes."

Fourteen-year-old Vinton Faulkner, shoeless and hungry, wanders the streets of Kingston, Jamaica:

"In Jamaica now only certain man pick up money. That's a man at work. So I try to do all jobs for them I can... I want to go back to school and get myself a trade, I learn welding, woodwork...to fix electrics. You have some boys and they get trade, but they follow their friends. They go robbin' and the police kill them. Them idiots. If I get a trade, I cool. My mother and grannie and brothers and sisters live in my yard with me. My mother make feel happy... My mother love me and I love my mother... When you old and you don't have children to help you, you reach poor house and sufferation... I feel better must come one day... I must look forward... You know that Africa people suffer more than Jamaicans. Don't have pants to wear, clothes to wear. Children in Africa have worse time... Me not a politician. Me a revolutionist. I fight for my rights. Politicians fight for money."

A GROWING PROBLEM

Violence by children is a growing problem in rich countries. An English girl who grew up with the stigma of a father in prison and a mother on Social Security, Jane got into fights:

"Those of us who were no good at anything else had to be good at beating people up." She started drinking when she was 12, and was sent to a home:

"I didn't want the staff at the home to try to be a father and mother. There's enough problem in having real ones!"

She attempted suicide and was sentenced to one year in a remand home. Later she went to a community school; found she was not as stupid as she had been told, and a new sense of self-worth enabled her to make progress. Now 16, she has been back home for seven months, six of them working:

"Things at home are much better now...my Mum is also able to work instead of being on Social Security. Being on Social Security has been one of the worst things in our lives. I remember one of my school teachers when I asked her for some paper. She told me to wait. I said, 'Why should I?' She said, 'Your family don't pay for anything, not for your dinners or your uniform, and you're on Social Security.'"

PROSTITUTION

According to the Paris-based "S.O.S. Enfants", 8,000 French children are involved in organized prostitution: 5,000 boys and 3,000 girls. Workers coping with this problem believe that societies which place an over-riding value on money, in which children see people selling themselves in so many different ways, are partly to blame for the rise in child prostitution.

Here are 10 questions you might ask your children. Next week I'll give you some answers from children around the world.

1. Should parents discuss family problems with their children?
2. How old should children be when their parents talk to them about sex?
3. Are children given enough responsibility?
4. Will you treat your children differently from the way you have been treated?
5. Do you think girls should be treated the same as boys?
6. Do you want to live a different kind of life from that of your parents?
7. Do adults always treat children fairly?
8. Do adults frighten you?
9. Do you think children should be allowed to take more decisions?
10. Do you think adults know how to behave with children?

Lack of funds

Rescue operations are suspended by Kleins

Horst, Joyce and Sandra Klein, the "first family" of Gulf Islands marine Rescue, have temporarily suspended all search and rescue operations for lack of funds.

The Kleins began offering their volunteer services officially in 1975. Four years, \$80,000 of their own money and 374 incidents later, they have decided to pack it in at least until their finances are squared away. During their four years' association with various government agencies, including the Coast Guard, Rescue Co-ordination Centre and Provincial Emergency Program (PEP) the Kleins have battled continuously for what they feel is a fair compensation to volunteers for expenses incurred in rescue work.

PEP, with whom they joined forces last fall, pays insurance during incidents and an operating allowance of \$7.50 per hour for the 16-foot Boston whaler which they use for most rescue work. Operating costs for the whaler total about \$35 per hour, says Klein. He offered an example of the kind of expenses he voluntarily incurs.

RECEIVED \$22.50

"Last weekend I was involved in a search in which I used \$70 worth

of gas and \$17.50 of oil. I got back \$22.50. Who else on this island would give \$65 to do the government's work?"

In the last two months, Klein says, he has been too busy with rescues to spend a single day at his electrical contracting business. Last Sunday, with bills mounting and no relief in sight, he finally, reluctantly, turned off the marine radio he has been monitoring non-stop for the past four years.

Is Klein thinking of resuming his services some time?

"Most certainly, if the money is there. I am willing to work toward the betterment of the situation," he says. He is looking into the possibility of private funding from large organizations and corporations such as the fishermen's union and Canada Packers, who have an interest in the safety of life at sea.

The success or failure of an application for capital funding submitted by the newly-formed Gulf Islands Marine Rescue to MLA Hugh Curtis may also determine the future of the Klein's involvement in volunteer rescue.

Ten students who visited the Gulf Islands recently were participants in a Rotary Club exchange program. They spent three days on the islands, stopping first at Galiano where racoons got into their food supply. Following that, they were caught in the rain without any cover. Upon arriving at Ganges, they were greeted by local Rotarians who lent a hand by drying out their clothes and sleeping gear.

The students, who have been staying in both the Seattle area and Alaska for the past year, come from seven different countries: Finland, Germany, Holland, Australia, New Zealand, Argentina and Brazil. They left for Victoria on Wednesday last week.

Standard sound signals afloat are: one short blast: I am altering course to starboard (right); two short blasts: I am altering course to port (left); three short blasts: my engines are going astern (reverse); three short and one long blast: I require assistance in docking; five (or more) short blasts: (danger signal) I think I see trouble ahead, and you are part of it.

Denman Island

Ministry to obtain legal opinion on subdivision

A second legal opinion is to be obtained by the provincial government with respect to a proposed subdivision on Denman Island. Transportation Minister Alex Fraser told a delegation of Denman residents last week that a lawyer with the attorney-general's department will examine the issue. The lawyer's report should be ready by the end of August.

The delegates were representing the Denman Island Bylaw Support Group, which is protesting the Ministry of Highways' intention to approve the 200-acre subdivision.

Opponents to the development claim the proposal does not conform with the island's community plan and bylaws.

Concern has been expressed over the density of the subdivision and water supply.

The original proposal for the development, made about five years ago, is said to have been given verbal approval by an unknown field worker in the highways ministry. It was, however, rejected by the Islands Trust, the health officer, the regional district and the local highways ministry office.

The Salt Spring Island Farmers' Institute will re-introduce an old custom July 28 when sheep dog trials are held at Ganges.

The trials will be held at the institute's property on Rainbow Road and will be followed by a lamb barbecue and beer garden. The farmers' group is preparing to serve 500 people at the barbecue, which is expected to begin around 3.30 pm.

The sheep dog trials will commence at 1.30 pm. and the judge will be Michael Williams.
