FIVE YEARS AGO

Missing noon ferry at Vesuvius Bay is under fire. Users are protesting the lunch-hour closure of the links between Vesuvius, on Salt Spring, and Crofton, between Duncan and Nanaimo, on Vancouver Island.

Strike at the Saturna pozzolan plant is over. The plant was closed 10 days ago for good. It has now re-opened.

Fishboats and ferryboats are again a big problem in Active Pass. A couple of years ago, reports Mary Backlund, she wrote a controversial story about the very serious problem. RCMP boats have been patrolling the pass for the past several weeks but they have not been getting too much cooperation from the little boats that think they have some kind of right to plug up the pass.

Hugh Curtis, as member of the Legislature's agricultural committee, wants all the information he can get on marauding cougars. He is seeking data on the losses to the predators over the years. The islands member explained that although the loss and damage caused by dogs is more severe, the attacks by cougars appear to be on the increase in the Vancouver Island-Gulf Islands area.

Keith Begg of Richmond spent an expensive holiday on Mayne Island last weekend. On Friday evening he drove his car off the road and caused damage amounting to \$700. He was subsequently charged with driving without due care and attention.

Heart Fund donations from the islands have risen so sharply over last year that the increase is a record. In 1973 the campaign realized \$915. This year's total, under the chairmanship of Dick Toynbee, has reached \$2,718.

Newly renovated fire hall in Ganges will take the wraps off on Saturday when the community is invited to take part in the opening ceremonies. Contractor responsible for the job is Lyle Brown. Architect is Henry Schubart.

Islands favoured for gas pipeline route

only significant market in western Canada in which natural gas is not available as a fuel. It has been available on the lower mainland for almost a quarter-century.

IN FAVOUR

In support of the project are the opportunity of making a fuller utilization of the province's natural gas reserves and a corresponding reduction in the demand for foreign oil. The project would make natural gas available to approximately 80% of Vancouver Island people, offering them savings in fuel costs.

The construction would provide 2,300 man-years of employment; it would have less environmental impact than alternative energy sources, suggests the report, and its operation would provide permanent employment for about 125 people.

There is sufficient gas in the province, according to the Hydro report, to keep going for 30 years. After that period, it is stated, the demand would switch to new discoveries of gas. Eventually it would depend on Arctic discoveries and coal-produced gas.

The pipeline would start at Huntingdon Gate on the mainland. In a 24-inch line it would feed gas to a compressor station in Delta and thence under the sea to the islands and on to Vancouver Island.

TWO PARALLEL

The submarine pipeline would be of two parallel lines, each of 16 inches diameter. On Vancouver Island the gas would be conducted through 6 in. and 12 in. lines.

Exact route to be followed will be determined by various considerations. These are, mainly, underwater topography; location of existing mainland gas lines; environmental considerations of the foreshore; location of underground electrical cables and the

international border. The pipeline would be subject to vegetation control by both mechanical and chemical means, states the report. This work would "conform to established government regulations and BC Hydro policy".

The environmental and social impact has already been studied by BC Hydro, the reader learns. Preliminary environmental and socio-economic impacts of such a project have been examined. This was followed by a "preliminary impact assessment in the potentially sensitive areas of Roberts Bank, rivers and streams on Vancouver Island, Galiano and Salt Spring Islands and the affected intertidal and foreshore areas."

SPECIAL CONSIDERATION

BC Hydro has also conducted a preliminary assessment of the effects on economic conditions and social organization resulting from the construction of the system. Demands for materials, equipment and labour can be readily met. Special consideration will be needed for Salt Spring and Galiano Islands, should the pipeline pass this way.

Report also warns that the two specific islands would suffer noticeable adverse socio-economic effects from the pipeline construction.

When the BC Energy Commission has established the desirable route and the details of the path to be followed by the pipeline, a further report will be published.

Hydro is very conscious of the need to inform the public of what is planned, concludes the report and, in turn, will welcome input from the general public.

The entire project is a slow one. Even at the fastest progress in planning, natural gas could not be available on Vancouver Island in less than four years.

Commission also heard that using a toilet on the island can be costly. A group of campers had been looking for a place to pitch their tent and the information booth directed them to one of the island's resorts. Shortly after, the campers returned to the booth with the information that they were charged \$1 each to use toilet facilities at the resort.

Chairman Glenn Woodley observed that both the toilets and the new garbage cans in Ganges are inadequate during the summer.

Bev Unger suggested that the commission get in touch with the provincial Tourism Ministry in order to obtain funding. The commission will also arrange for increased pick-ups of garbage from the new containers.
