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Ganges

New filter should last 50 years

New filter on Highland Water System's intake pipe in St. Mary Lake shouldn't have to be replaced for about 50 years, said Bevis Walters last week.

The operator of the waterworks said a heavy-gauge stainless steel

mesh has been imported from the eastern United States to make up the new filter. It has been fabricated by Peninsula Sheet Metal Ltd., of Saanich, and will be installed by Don Irwin of Ganges. It was designed by the engineering firm of Willis, Cunliffe & Tait Ltd. of Victoria.

Walters explained that the filter the system has been using is made of galvanized steel mesh and only lasts about 3 1/2 years.

The intake line runs from the pumping station on North End Road to a point about 180 feet out into the lake, to a depth of 28 feet.

Walters also noted that the

intake is situated over one of the springs that feeds St. Mary Lake.

Sgt. Mitch Hanks, of Ganges RCMP detachment, warns that it is illegal to deface road signs and that the culprit may face court action if he is traced.

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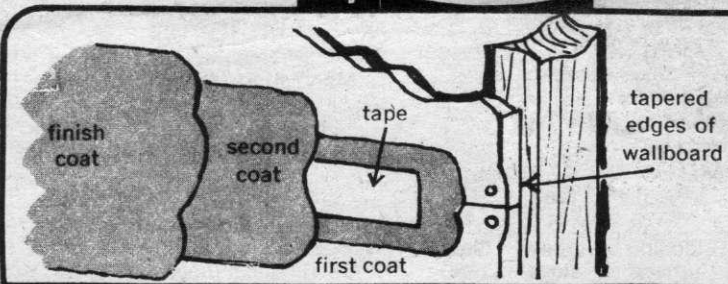

in a centre where a pensioner may find companionship, cards, billiards and shuffleboard. Project officer is Finlay Sterling of Port Washington.

Adult day care service to be introduced at Greenwood's

New service has been added at Greenwood's.

The Gulf Islands intermediate and personal care facility is extending into a new adult day care program.

A limited number of non-residents will be invited to share the life of residents of Greenwood's. They will spend the day following the same program as the residents. Recreation, meals and other facilities will all be shared.

Idea behind the new project is to enable older residents who are well able to fend for themselves to enjoy the companionship of Greenwood's residents. It also enables people living alone to enjoy the beneficial exercises and other activities of Greenwood's.

Where a day visitor is in need of help to take a bath this service might also be offered.

The service is planned for all of the islands and any resident of the Outer Islands who can reach Ganges will be invited to take part.

The program explains that it offers social, recreational and diversional activities already in the Greenwood's program for the benefit of day visitors. Lunch, snacks and light additional care are also provided.

EXTENT OF DAY

The day extends from 10 am until 4.30 pm, with coffee at 11 am; lunch, the main meal of the day, at 12.30 and tea time at 3 pm.

The cost is \$7.50 per person. There is also the possibility that

part-day attendance may be offered at a reduced rate.

Initially, the program will be offered to two day-care guests per day.

Reason for the limitation, explains Greenwood's administrator Malcolm Pinteau, is the availability of staff. Limited service can be offered without augmenting the staff. There is no provision, however, for increasing staff to provide such a service on a wider scale.

Any islander who is interested in taking advantage of the new service is invited to call the co-ordinator, Jonna Mattiesing, at Greenwood's.

Day care service was approved by the board on August 7 and will be brought into operation at the beginning of September.

Building activity up in islands this year

According to building permit figures issued by the Capital Regional District, there has been an increase in building activity this year in the Gulf Islands.

There were 23 permits issued in the islands during June, up from June of last year by five. During the calendar year to the end of June, 1979, 92 permits have been sold. In the same period last year, 88 permits were issued.

Here is a breakdown of the permits sold to each island in June, 1978 and 1979.

Salt Spring: eight this year and last; Penders: two this year, six last; Galiano: six, two; Mayne: five, two; and Saturna: two, none.

For the calendar year, Salt Spring: 40 this year, 29 last; Penders: 16 this year, 22 last; Galiano: 12, 11; Mayne: 17, 21; Saturna: five, three; Vise and Piers Islands: one each this year, none last.

Value of the building in June was, for Salt Spring, \$454,805; Penders, \$70,632; Galiano, \$254,013; Mayne, \$148,774; and Saturna, \$52,322.

For the calendar year to the end of June, values are as follows: Salt Spring, \$1,637,121; Penders, \$947,798; Galiano, \$560,053; Mayne, \$652,614; Saturna, \$124,787; Vise, \$14,860; and Piers, \$31,700.

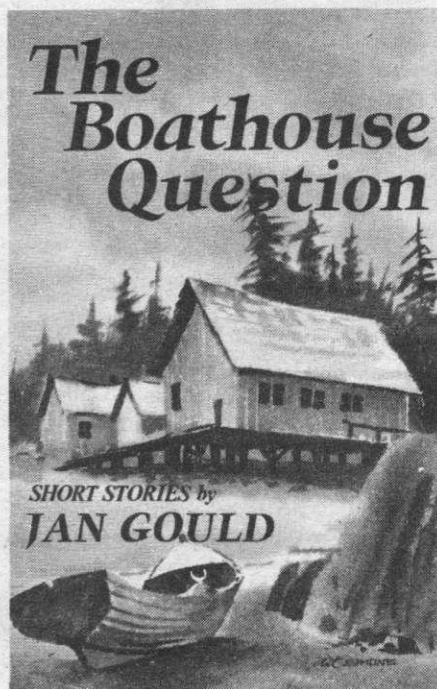
