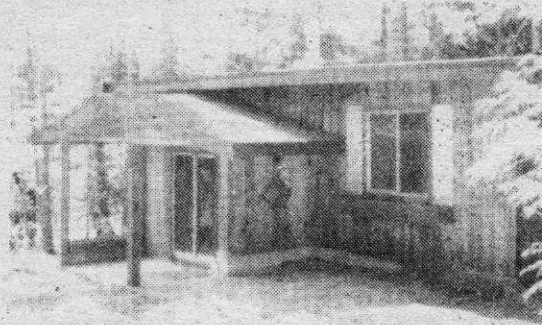

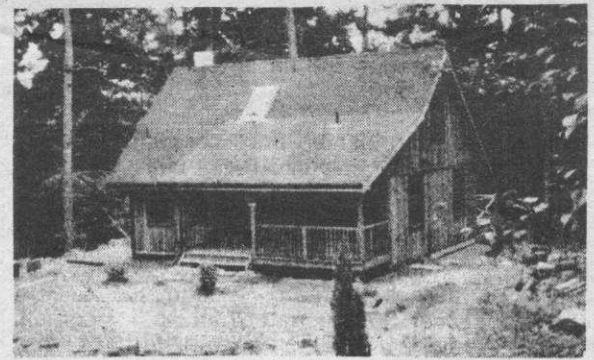

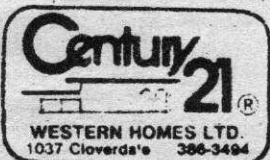

Burnaby man fined \$800 after dispute in Ganges Harbour

A Burnaby man was fined a total of \$800 in provincial court at Ganges Wednesday when he appeared to face three charges laid following an incident in Ganges July 1.

Edwin Salmon was charged with operating a vessel in Ganges Harbour while impaired, failing to comply with a breath test demand and theft of ignition keys which were the property of Cougar Air. Salmon pleaded guilty to all three.

Court was told that RCMP were called to investigate a disturbance near the log dump in Ganges Harbour July 1, at about 6 pm. The accused was found at the scene aboard a boat, and was asked by police to tie up to a nearby dock. He refused and tied up at another dock, but left when police ap-

proached him again.

POLICE BOAT

He was finally persuaded to tie up his boat after the police boat was brought in to assist.

Court learned that Salmon had tried to prevent a seaplane belonging to Cougar Air from taking off and had obstructed the plane several times with his boat. When the pilot left to call police, the accused had taken the ignition keys from the plane.

A struggle between police, the pilot and Salmon ensued, and he was finally handcuffed and taken to the police station. A breath demand was made but Salmon refused to comply, the court was told.

He became more co-operative later and was released.

Salmon told the court he'd had a "very trying weekend" and on the

day in question had been taking librium and had had two drinks. His girlfriend and his two children had been with him until they'd had a dispute, at which time his girlfriend took the children and boarded the plane for Vancouver.

"She had no right to take them," Salmon told the court.

He also said he hadn't realized a breathalyzer test was compulsory.

Judge D.K. McAdam told him it was necessary to solve "personal problems without involving the public".

"Your general behaviour (at the time the charge was laid) leaves a lot to be desired regardless of your reasons for it," he concluded.


Salmon was fined \$400 for the impaired charge, \$300 for refusing to blow and \$100 for theft. He was also ordered not to operate a vessel in Canadian waters for two months.

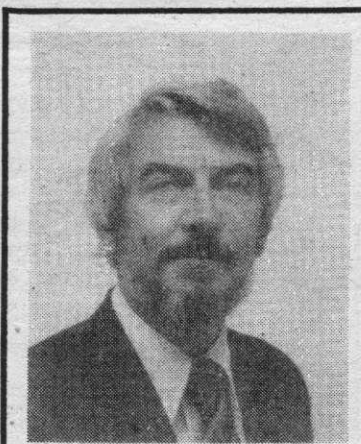

Probation and fine

Judge D.K. McAdam fined a Ganges man \$350 and put him on probation for six months in provincial court Wednesday. John Pinchin, 18, had been charged with impaired driving, refusing to provide a breath sample for analysis and failing to remain at the scene of an accident.

He had previously entered no guilty pleas but they were withdrawn on the last two counts and the Crown entered a stay of proceedings on count one.

Charge arose from an incident May 25 when RCMP were called by a local resident whose car had been hit in the K&R parking lot. Later, police talked to Pinchin, who denied striking the other vehicle. A

demand for a breath sample was made but the accused refused to comply.

Some two weeks later, the court learned, an RCMP officer spoke with Pinchin again. The latter agreed then that he should have talked to the owner of the vehicle he struck and also should have taken the breath test.

The court was told that he had since provided \$120 to a local garage to carry out the necessary repairs on the damaged vehicle.

He was fined \$200 for refusing to blow and \$150 for failing to remain at the accident scene. A condition of the probation order was that he do 75 hours of community work service.

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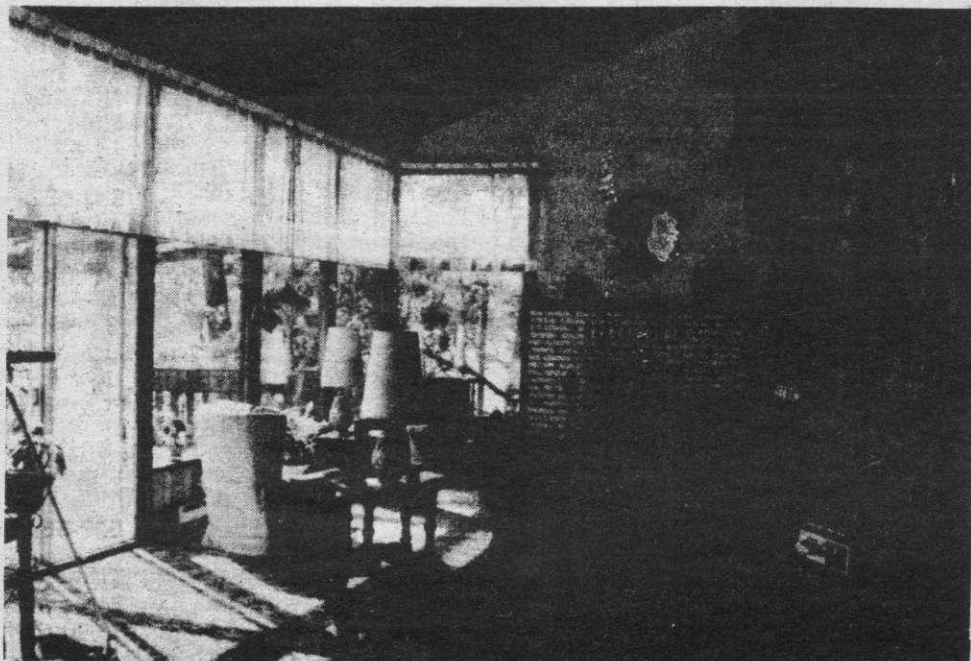

Mrs. Roe recalled that she had been taught to ride, side-saddle, by Henry Bullock. Her niece, Mrs. John Inglin, took her to see her brother, Lionel, in Duncan. The visitor also recalled travelling to Port Washington for a dance at the

beginning of the century. They would row the five miles, using a boat with one pair of oars and a rower to each. They would then walk two miles to Hope Bay for the dance. Mrs. Samuel John Beddis and her two daughters rowed to Port Washington for Nellie Grimmer's marriage to Cyril Hamilton in 1911. When Mrs. Roe was married in 1912, the ceremony was the first to be performed at the Anglican Church on Ganges Hill. Rev. Mr. Bastine officiated. George Roe, with his parents, Robert and Margaret Roe, came over from Otter Bay in thick fog. In 1917 she and her husband moved to Thetis Island and to the mainland in 1924. When Mrs. Roe stayed with the Neptune Navy Grimmer family at Port Washington recently, it was her first visit to Pender in 52 years.
