Arthritis Society

Every home in the Gulf Islands will receive, within the next few days, a visit from Danny Matsuda in a special letter signed by Robert Foulis, local honorary campaign chairman for the Arthritis Society, B.C. Division.

The society is seeking \$2,100 through its mail campaign to help people like Danny, a five-year-old who has had juvenile rheumatoid arthritis for half his life.

The campaign, sponsored by the Salt Spring Lions Club, supports society physiotherapists and occupational therapists and also ensures the services of highly skilled medical arthritis specialists when needed. This area shares in the results of basic and clinical research, as well as public and professional education.

To support this once-a-year drive for funds, donations can be made in a return addressed envelope which will accompany the letter from Mr. Foulis. Receipts will be issued for all donations of \$5 and over.

Most people do not realize that arthritis is not just one disease. There are more than 80 different varieties. The word 'arthritis' means inflammation of a joint. It refers to a variety of rheumatic diseases, the most common being rheumatoid arthritis, osteoarthritis, ankylosing spondylitis and gout.

Funeral services are held for Galiano pioneer

Galiano Island lost a pioneer veteran of World War 1, when Tom John Head passed away in Lady Minto hospital on September 10. He was predeceased by his wife, Birdie, and one son and one daughter.

Mr. Head was born in Dorset, England, and came with his parents and brother to Galiano in 1905, spending his early life on the island. He left to join the 72nd Seaforth Highlanders in World War 1, and saw action on the front.

Coming home to Galiano, he lived and worked here for a while and then went to the Prairies. He came back later to marry and raise his family on Galiano. He built a large home on part of his parents' land on Porlier Pass Road, and there raised his family of one daughter and four sons.

Mr. Head was the first highways department truck driver on Gali-

ano, a position he held for many years.

FIVE YEARS AGO

Tales of energy exploits

The invisible hand

In order to ensure its inviolable world control, the Trilateral Commission would move to break down those features of democracy which give the citizens too much control over their own affairs.

A staff member of Zbigniew Brzezinski's, by the name of Huntington, wrote a report stating that the Trilateral Commission agrees that "there must be less democracy, not more". It seems that the natives have a penchant for sticking to their democratic guns, such as the rights to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness".

Apparently this wreaks havoc with Trilateral schemes. As Brzezinski so quaintly puts it, in his *Between Two Ages*, "the majority of humanity still neither shares nor is prepared to support this new global consciousness", and thus, according to author Craig Karpel, "must be decoyed by a presidential candidate who would present himself as a small-town peanut farmer".

Undaunted, however, by a vociferous and persistent outcry from the old-fashioned democracy lovers, an outcry which includes doctors, lawyers, academics, teachers, journalists, small businessmen, parents, trade-unionists and ecologists, the Trilateral Commission has tried various means to smash democracy's power base.

TO DESTROY ITS POWERS

One such move has been a push to destroy the powers of Congress. This was facilitated in the main by infiltrating the White House with Carter and his Trilateral Commission boys. This is described by Karpel as "the plan to tear down the White House". What the Trilateral Commission would do is abolish the National Security Council and replace it with an executive committee called "Ex.-Cab.", comprised of Trilateral members and whose highest member would be a spokesman for the international banks.

Being a committee, this organization would be outside the sphere of the cabinet (hence the acronym "Ex.-Cab."), and "would be a way of blurring the distinction between foreign and domestic affairs at the highest policy level, over the objections of Congress". The White House would be subsequently torn down and replaced by a single circular structure consisting of concentric rings. Perhaps Carter and the boys would be in the external rings, while Brzezinski, Rockefeller and Coca-Cola Austin, originator of this scheme, would be in the centre. This hasn't happened yet, but give it time.

HUMAN RIGHTS SCANDAL

Another Trilateral Commission ploy is best exemplified by the Badillo Affair, otherwise known as the great human rights scandal. Many people have heard Jimmy Carter make fine, uplifting, impassioned speeches in defense of human rights, for example: "Because we are free, we can never be indifferent to the fate of freedom elsewhere," but his administration's support of repressive regimes everywhere is puzzling.

In case these people have wondered if Carter is speaking out of both sides of his mouth, well he is. The fact is that the less-developed countries which torture and imprison their citizens without trial must have U.S. aid, or they won't be able to pay back the billions of dollars they've borrowed from American banks, particularly David Rockefeller's Chase Man-

hattan. Apparently most of the debts incurred are for the purchase of Arab oil.

New York City Congressman Herman Badillo introduced an amendment requiring that any country which denies essential human rights, such as freedom from torture and access to fair trial, be denied American support in its applications for loans, unless the loan went to provide basic human needs.

CARTER WON

In a series of tussles following, between Congress and Carter's Cabinet, in which Congress actually passed Badillo's amendment at one point, Carter personally lobbied against it and finally succeeded in beating it down by a seven vote majority. When asked for his opinion on the transpirings, Iowa Congressman Harkin said:

"I have the feeling that there's an invisible hand in this: the Trilateral Commission."

Another dangerous attack on democracy has come from the commission's attempt to restrict freedom of the press. In its 1975 report, *The Crisis of Democracy*, the commission proposed action to "restore a more equitable relationship between governmental authority and popular control".

One such act would be "prior restraint" of what newspapers may publish in "unusual circumstances" and giving government the right and ability to withhold information at the source, as well as expansion of the terms of libel. The Carter administration supported a bill known as "Son of S.1" which endorses the Trilateral proposal. Furthermore, it would make infractions a criminal offense punished by imprisonment. Up until now, for instance, libel cases have always been a civil offence. You could be sued, but not jailed.

COULD GO TO JAIL

Under section 1356 of Son of S.1., a reporter could go to jail for writing or speaking a "true statement" which causes economic loss to a public official, or his family and business associates. If Son. of S.1. had been in effect during the Nixon years, the Watergate scandal could not have been exposed, and if so, the reporters responsible would have been jailed for causing Richard Nixon to lose his job.

Apparently the rationale behind this particular provision is to allow government officials to take unpopular stands without having to be subjected to "improper" criticism, whatever that is. One can easily speculate on any number of such situations, such as government officials declaring that nuclear energy will happen whether the people like it or not, with any subsequent newspaper critic being thrown in the slammer for daring to protest.

What it amounts to, according to Jack Landau of the Reporters' Committee for Freedom of the Press, is an attack on free speech and the basic right to liberty.

"Words!" he exploded. "They were going to make it a crime to use words!"

NOT ONLY IN U.S.

Canadians need not think this threat to freedom pertains only to the U.S. Anyone lobbying for a "freedom of information" act can attest to the immense resistance to such a proposal. There is a "news blackout" on certain kinds of information, for instance, that relating to the nuclear arms industry and military build-up, as well as to the health hazards of low-level

radiation. There is hardly any examination given to the giant cartels attempting to dominate our lives.

When CBC radio broadcaster Ben Metcalfe attempted to present coverage of the Trilateral Commission, he was quietly bumped from his job. His employers never denied firing him for this reason. Presently in B.C. we receive many reports of Hydro's statements about B.C.'s energy needs forecast, but there is very little press activity examining the validity of these forecasts.

How much documentation has there been of the B.C. Energy Commission report on actual energy supplies and exports in the province? (45% natural gas, 35% electricity, 98% coal are exported). How much is said about the Salem Agreement and what this portends for B.C.? (B.C. agrees to develop its dam sites and export a dominant amount of electricity to Washington, Oregon, Montana and Idaho).

Certainly these are facts which have a most significant bearing upon the B.C. energy situation and upon Hydro's forecast claims. The fact that so little is known and so little is said indicates that Hydro is playing with very loaded dice.

One can't help but wonder if here too, as elsewhere, there is an invisible hand at work: the Trilateral Commission.

CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

Pursuant to Section 766AA of the Municipal Act, the following text of By-law No. 622, cited as "Lyll Harbour/Boot Cove Water Parcel Tax By-law No. 1, 1979" is hereby published as at third reading and prior to submission to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs.

A by-law to impose a parcel tax on all properties within the Lyll Harbour/Boot Cove Water Service Specified Area pursuant to the provision of Section 415A of the Municipal Act.

WHEREAS the Board of the Capital Regional District hereinafter referred to as the Regional District, is empowered by the Municipal Act to impose and levy a parcel tax to meet the cost of works and services that benefit the land within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS certain costs might have been incurred by the Regional District in providing water services to land within the Lyll Harbour/Boot Cove Water Service Specified Area within electoral area "G" of the Capital Regional District;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable and expedient to impose and levy a parcel tax on land benefiting from such service to meet such costs;

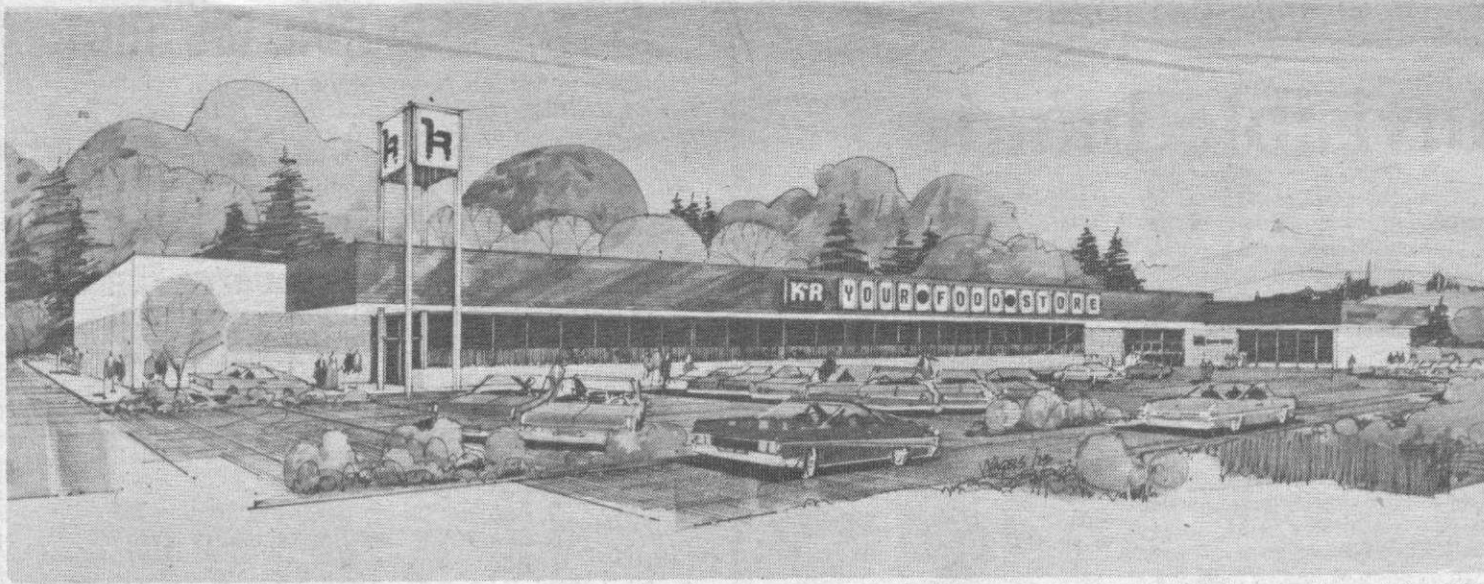
NOW THEREFORE, the Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

1. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "Parcel" means any parcel of land individually appearing on the assessment role for the specified area;
2. A tax shall be and is hereby imposed on the owners of land within the Lyll Harbour/Boot Cove Water Service Specified area which is capable of being connected with any water main, whether or not the parcel of land is connected with such water main; the aforesaid tax to be hereinafter referred to as the "Parcel Tax".
3. (a) The parcel tax shall be levied in each year on each parcel of land aforementioned and the amount thereof, will be \$115.43 (One Hundred Fifteen Dollars and Forty Three Cents).
4. The parcel tax shall be in force and be effective until the complete discharge and satisfaction by the Capital Regional District of all obligations presently incurred, and to be incurred, in respect of the aforesaid service.

Lists of electors to be posted

The Capital Regional District has made special arrangements to ensure that people in electoral areas have an opportunity to see whether their names are on this year's voters lists.

The Municipal Act requires the district to post its lists of electors at its offices in Victoria, where they remain until a Court of Revision is held there on October 1.

The CRD, in addition to posting the lists at the Victoria offices, will post them in the communities as well, so people don't have to go to Victoria to find out if their names are on the lists.

To be eligible to vote in the November 17 civic elections for

regional board directors and school trustees, a person must be 19 years of age, a Canadian citizen or other British subject, and have resided in Canada for the past year, in British Columbia for the past six months and in his electoral area for three full months prior to registration.

The lists of electors for the Gulf Islands will be found at the following locations: on Salt Spring Island, the school board office, the government building, the Fulford

post office and Mouat's Store.

In the Outer Gulf Islands, the school board office at Ganges, the post office and store on Galiano Island, the post office on Mayne Island, the post office and the community hall on Saturna Island, and on the Pender Islands, the post offices at Port Washington and at Hope Bay.

Tourist booth register indicates big increase

The number of visitors to Salt Spring Island who registered at the tourist information booth at Ganges during the summer is an indication of the substantial increase in tourism this year.

The guest register shows a total of 5,791 visitors this year, up from 4,009 in 1978. That figure, however, is probably very low because, according to the tourist booth staff, many people left the booth before signing and others registered as families, not as individuals.

In summing up the season, Mabel MacPherson, co-ordinator of the information centre, said many favourable comments were recorded about the island's beauty, the hospitality and the friendliness of the residents.

Some of the suggestions made by tourists for improving local facilities included the development of marked hiking trails, more boat ramps, more camping grounds, more boats for hire, installation of running water at the government dock and more swimming beaches.

While most of the visitors at the booth were Canadian, 19 countries were represented by those who registered. Second largest number of visitors were American, with 548

signing the register, followed by English visitors, at 106.

The information booth is run by volunteers, under the auspices of the Chamber of Commerce.

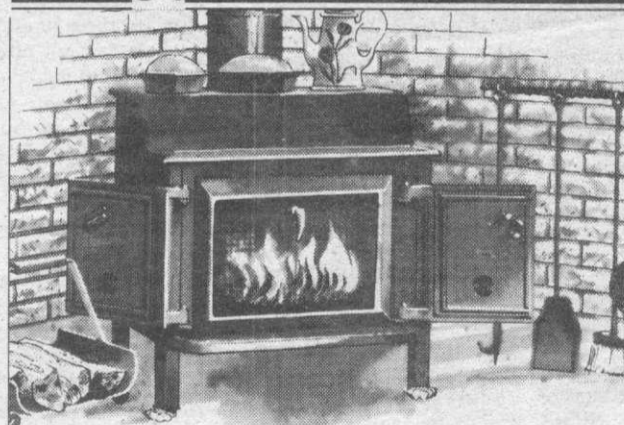
