

Pioneer Village is biggest project of club

Biggest project undertaken by the Salt Spring Island Lions Club, the Pioneer Village in Ganges, is still one of the biggest responsibilities of the club.

At the recent annual meeting of the Gulf Islands Pioneer Society, a summary of the year's operation was given by the chairman, Fred Brookbanks.

A surplus at the end of the year was awaiting works not yet completed. There will be work on driveways and paths costing some

\$2,000 and another \$2,000 for connections if and when a sewer system might be constructed. Another \$3,500 is earmarked for other work on the premises.

Book value of the Pioneer Village is \$237,879, stated the Brookbanks report. The actual value is much higher.

Financial position is very sound, he noted.

RENOVATION

In the past year the Pioneer Village has been renovated exten-

sively. There has been new roofing, insulation, roof sheeting and foundation insulation.

All glass has been changed to thermal windows and smoke detectors have been installed. New combination doors have been fitted and refrigerators have all been replaced. In addition, many of the stoves have been fitted with new elements.

It is hoped that the work carried out this summer will cut down on energy for heating in winter.

"We continue to have more applicants for apartments than we can accommodate," said Brookbanks.

The opening of Greenwoods has had an effect on the village. The tenants are younger and more active than previously, said the annual report.

APPRECIATED

Harry Coffey is keeping up the gardens well and his work is appreciated by the society, said Fred Brookbanks.

Miss Audrey Mackenzie is the secretary of the society. She has taken over from Em Moore, whose health brought about her resignation.

"I feel that this has been a constructive year for your society," concluded the chairman's report.

Three new members were elected to the board. They are Bob Nicholson, Jack Tomlinson and Jan Harkema. All three are members of the Lions Club.

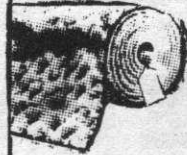

Salt Spring Strikers made their debut last year as a new entry to the lower island league, and they're back again this year, again as a new entry to the lower island league.

Confused? Just wait.

The original strikers of last year, due to a shortage of players of the correct age group, consisted of 11, 10 and nine-year-old players. Although the majority of these players were drastically outweighed on the field, the team achieved an enviable record and placed third in its division.

This year, because of a tremendous increase of participation in soccer on the island, a new team has been formed, the Salt Spring Selects. To this team went the under-aged players from the Salt Spring Kicks and the older boys from the original Salt Spring Strikers.

The new team is obviously a winner, as witnessed by the first game last Saturday. The Selects played Gordon Head, a team that last year we were never able to beat.

CONVINCING WIN

They not only won the game, but won it convincingly, 4-0. Congratulations to the new Selects from your old Striker team-mates.

Left behind in the shuffle were five of the original Strikers, Erin Fewings, Todd Chase, Jeff Moger, Peter Aust and Stuart Lyon, and around this five-man nucleus was formed a new Strikers team.

New players were recruited from the inter-island league and over night the team roster swelled from those five to a full complement of boys. With only two weeks to prepare for their first league game, the boys worked hard to mould old and new together into a workable team. The result of that hard work was seen on Saturday, and it was a lovely sight to behold.

They know what to do, and they went out and did it. But what of the new boys? They looked good at practice, but how would they react under pressure? The answer was quick in coming: they did fantastically.

UNBELIEVABLE

David Cates, our new goalie, was unbelievable, to say the least. During the first 10 minutes of the game, he made a dozen exceptional saves, any of which should easily have been a goal, and but for his fearless play during that first 10 rocky minutes while the Strikers were getting on track, the team could have easily been trying to come back from a four or five goal deficit.

An area of vital concern was our defence, as five of these six boys were new to the team, but the concern was needless. Although all these boys played very good games, one boy in this group was a stand-out.

There is a patron saint of soccer who all coaches pray to. What they pray for is a defenceman who stays calm under any pressure, can put the ball into orbit with the mere flick of his foot, never gets caught out of position and has such boundless energy and drive that you never have to put a sub in for him.

My prayers have been answered: His name is Todd Tamboline. I could fill this whole page if I started listing all the things he did right last Saturday, but suffice it to

say that my lawyers are in the process of drawing up an iron-clad, life-time contract that will ensure that Todd will always play for the Strikers.

CALM DELIBERATE

The forward line consists mostly of original Striker players and their team play was excellent. Gone are the panic rushes on goal by individual players, to be replaced

by calm, deliberate team sorties up the field, employing accurate passing, well placed crosses and generally heads-up thinking.

Our lone goal was scored with this type of play, and once again, a "new" boy, Brad Davies, was a prominent figure in the play. The ball was thrown up to Brad on the wing. He took two or three steps forward and placed a beautiful cross right in front of the goal, where Jeff Moger, anticipating the cross, was already steaming in. He directed the ball easily into the net for our lone goal.

In all honesty, the strikers cannot be considered a powerhouse team, and none of our opponents can be taken lightly. But with the determination and hard work being displayed by the boys, and the raw talent that exists within their ranks, their future holds the promise of a successful and fun-filled season.

KICK-OFF

News from Salt Spring Youth Soccer Association

Association needs volunteers

Salt Spring's soccer finest certainly made their mark in the first weekend of games. Victories by the Kicks and the newcomers Selects, a tie for the Strikers and a fine performance from the Savages have made Victoria teams realize that once again Salt Spring's teams are to be reckoned with.

These games are only a reflection of what is happening with soccer on Salt Spring as "soccer fever" seems to have taken hold.

Aside from the teams mentioned above our association also has a fine girls' team, the Sockeyes, giving our island five representative sides playing in Victoria, including some 80 players.

The biggest boon of players has occurred in the intra-island level with a total of nine teams, and by the time the final registrations are in, over 100 players.

WHITECAPS

The reasons for this boom are hard to pin-point but certainly the exposure to the Vancouver Whitecaps has helped. Another reason is probably that our association offers an excellent program for children to participate in.

Our program enables children to play at a competitive level without losing sight of the fun aspects of the game and ensuring every child has the opportunity to participate.

This season we are also making sure every child playing has a shirt and a pair of shorts. At the intra-island level this has entailed the wholesale purchase of new outfits (many a child has spent his first night sleeping in his soccer

jersey). Also, the inexpensiveness of the sport, the lack of injuries, full insurance coverage and ease of learning are all factors that have created this sudden boom.

This year the intra-island is in two divisions; senior (eight years old and up) and junior (seven years old and under). The senior level has five teams (one at Fernwood, one girls' team and three boys teams in Ganges) while the junior level has four teams (one at Fernwood, three in Ganges).

FORMAT SIMPLE

The league games will be played after school every Tuesday and Thursday. Due to the new school at Fernwood some juggling had to be done to accommodate them, but actually the format is quite simple.

Every Tuesday Fernwood will play two of the Ganges teams with the games rotating every second week from Fernwood school grounds to Ganges school grounds. The other Ganges teams will play every Tuesday and Thursday in Ganges. Eventually we hope to incorporate Portlock Park for some of the games. Every last Saturday of the month (not September) will

be for jamborees, small tournaments involving all our teams.

League play will commence this Thursday, September 27 at 3.15 pm in Ganges, with the Fernwood teams seeing their first action the

following Tuesday at Fernwood (October 2). Schedules will be issued as soon as possible.

COACHES

Our big problem is lack of coaches. We have coaches for the two Fernwood teams but only two for Ganges teams. We are in desperate need of some volunteers to help. We would like to have two coaches per team so that if one cannot be there the other will cover up and the load can be shared.

Experience in soccer is not necessary, just an enjoyment of children and a willingness to help. We can teach you the game. Without the coaches our teams cannot play so why not come out and see the players enthusiasm and before you know it "soccer fever" will have grabbed you.

Member without a paper

Speaker recalls pitfalls of legislature

When the province of British Columbia entertained a number of weekly newspaper publishers to luncheon in Richmond last week, the spokesman for the government offered a light-hearted summary of the ills that beset the newly elected.

The legislature is divided into four echelons, explained Stephen Rogers, member for Vancouver South. There is the government, which is the cabinet, and there is the opposition, which is now the New Democratic Party. The backbenchers are the government members who are not in the cabinet and there is the speaker, with his deputy.

Function of the backbencher is to keep warm and alive and to keep his mouth shut. And the members of the cabinet keep on governing.

The opposition opposes.

The speaker must have an answer and he must not have an opinion. Speaker must be neutral.

It is a denial of terms, he suggested.

A politician, by his very nature, is unlikely to be neutral in any-

thing. He would have been anything but a politician had he been neutral in his convictions.

Nevertheless, he must maintain a completely objective approach to his decisions.

SAME BALL GAME

There is one consolation, he admitted. The speaker is still in the same ball game as the baseball umpire. However wrong his decision may appear to be, it is always right.

Rogers looked at the private member's bill.

There is provision for a bill from an individual member. The only real problem is getting it introduced. The next real problem is getting it acted on.

Stephen Rogers, MLA, has tried a couple of times.

He represents a community in which there are few mobile homes, but a fair number of floating homes. When the government established legislation for the recognition and protection of mobile homes, he worked on a private member's bill providing for the recognition of a floating home as a home for taxation and allowance purposes.

To get it right he based it on another province's law on mobile homes. Wherever appropriate, he changed the term from mobile to floating.

THEY WERE IMPRESSED

The legislative staff was impressed. Here he was, a newcomer to the House, producing a bill of more than 20 sheets of type-script, all technically presented.

It never reached the floor of the House, but he made his point.

A few months later the provis-

ions for floating homes were introduced into the minister's recommendations.

He had a similar experience with smoke alarms. His new bill called for the compulsory equipping of certain buildings with alarm systems. The bill gathered dust, but the provision was formally made in a subsequent omnibus bill.

But the member was not in despair. He explained that the biggest problem facing every newcomer to the legislature is ascertaining what he can do and what he can't do and what he should do and what he shouldn't.

A member has the same problems of finding his way around and meeting with frustration. But they work together.

One of his very satisfying accomplishments recently was to tell a member the way to the men's room, he recalled. He was a member of the opposition, but Stephen Rogers, from the government side of the House, still directed him.

The seeker after relief had been a member for four weeks, he reflected.

But there was more to his remarks than a humorous review of political patterns. He had been invited to address the gathering of community newspapers, explained the member, perhaps because he was elected from a constituency that does not have a community newspaper.

In Vancouver South there are various media which circulate over a wider area, but no newspaper serving his constituency alone.

The member from almost any rural community makes a comment in or out of the legislature and it is duly reported in his local community paper. Not so in the case of Vancouver South. He makes a comment and nobody reports it. "You have to be a cabinet minister to be reported in the city."

He spoke to the luncheon meeting and was happy to do so. But he also knew that there would be no newspaper to report what he said back home to his constituents.

He expressed some envy of the fortunate member who could go home and speak to the local paper and pass on his opinions.

How many trees to give cord of firewood a year?

A Summerland reader, Ms. Lyn Morrow asks the following question:

How large an area would I have to plant in alder to obtain a cord of firewood each year?

To provide you with a realistic answer to this question, I would need to first gather information on the soil, topography, climate, light conditions and other factors in the area you propose to plant. Otherwise, I am rather in the position of a doctor asked to prescribe for a rash, sight unseen and without examining the patient. However, within the limitations, I will try to give you a rough idea of what is involved and I think you will understand why I cannot come up with anything more than a very theoretical and rough guess.

Firstly, I will assume you are thinking of planting red alder (Alnus rubre) and not sitka alder (Alnus sinuata), which latter tends to be shrubby and does not grow as a single straight stemmed tree. (Alternate firewood species you might consider are aspen and cottonwood, which will grow faster, although they are a lighter wood, consequently burn faster and produce less heat.)

Now for some calculations: To get a cord of wood, using only the trunk of the tree, it takes approximately 15 trees with an eight-inch diameter at the base, a four-inch diameter at the top and a length of from 30 to 40 feet. In a good growing area where soil, moisture, sunlight and other conditions are favourable and if your trees are

well spaced (300 - 400 trees per acre), red alder might reach this size in 30 to 50 years. (Aspen or cottonwood would take 25 to 45 years.) Of course, if you were to bring the branches or tops into your calculation, the number of years would be reduced, depending on how much could be included as firewood.

On the basis of 15 trees per cord and 300 trees per acre, once your trees had reached the required diameter size, one acre would provide about 20 years of harvesting one cord per year or 40 years of harvesting a half a cord per year. Supposing that it takes 40 years for your trees to reach a harvestable size, then you would require two acres to produce one cord per year in perpetuity, assuming harvested trees were replaced immediately.

I must repeat that the above is nothing more than a guesswork, a thumbnail sketch that can do little more than give you an idea of the approach. I have had to make too many assumptions to provide anything but a very general estimate which could be considerably off base.

Down Through the Years With Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

Mike Byron was named Citizen of the Year on Friday evening at the annual dinner of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce. Mike Byron, whose real name is not Mike at all, has spent the past dozen years teaching at the island high school and farming at Beaver Point. Presentation was made by Frank Richards on behalf of the Chamber.

Ganges sewer scheme has been set back one month. The Pollution Control Board has postponed for one month the issue of a permit to discharge treated sewage into Ganges Harbour.

Fourteen island seats must be filled when the municipal elections come up on November 16. There will be four seats to be filled on the school board. Mrs. Sheila Fraser of Ganges and Mrs. Clare McAllister of Galiano have not yet revealed their plans. Vacant seat at Pender is left by the resignation of Mrs. Betty Vasilev, and on Salt Spring Island the seat now held by Bob Marshall will fall vacant. There will be 10 local trustees elected to the Islands Trust, two from each of five islands. Two candidates have already announced themselves for the Trust on Salt Spring Island. They are Charles Longueay and Jim Wilkinson. Gordon Wallace has also indicated his intention of running on North Pender Island.

International park plan for the islands has been shelved by the International Joint Commission. When the commission suggested an international park to take in the Canadian Gulf Islands and the American San Juan Islands, with headquarters at Point Roberts, there was no roar of approval from the islands. When *Driftwood* invited islanders to express their views on the plan, only two ballots of more than 700 cast were in favour. Results of the ballot were passed on to Ottawa and Washington.

Salt Spring Island realtor for many years, G. Campbell Bastedo, died suddenly at home on Sunday, October 6. He was 70 years of age.

Appointment follows the criticism expressed at the council meeting last week that the naming of a chairman for each meeting leaves no continuity between meetings. Mrs. Mary Backlund of Galiano will continue to serve as secretary.

More than 30 years of service to the Canadian Red Cross was

recognized on Saturday. Mrs. Nan New of Galiano was presented with a medal to mark her long service with the organization. She has already received a number of awards and recognitions from the Red Cross.

On Saturday the Gulf Islands Joint Council authorized a telegram to Prime Minister Trudeau asking him to use the influence of his government in pressing the United States to cancel the detonation of the undersea atomic bomb on Thursday. The motion was carried, with T.E. Harcus and Gavin Reynolds voting in the negative. Neither could visualize any action by the Canadian government which might conceivably influence Washington.

On Saturday representatives of four Gulf Islands authorized a letter to Premier Bennett asking for an end to oil drilling anywhere in the Strait of Georgia. Resolution was introduced by Ralph Sketch of Pender. It was warmly supported by H.G. Glyde, also of Pender.

George Heinekey announces that on September 30 the Vesuvius Dairy will be closed and on October 1 he will become agent for Northwestern Creamery of Victoria.

Vancouver Island last week. He shot a bull elk near Victoria Peak. He flew in with friends from Campbell River by helicopter.

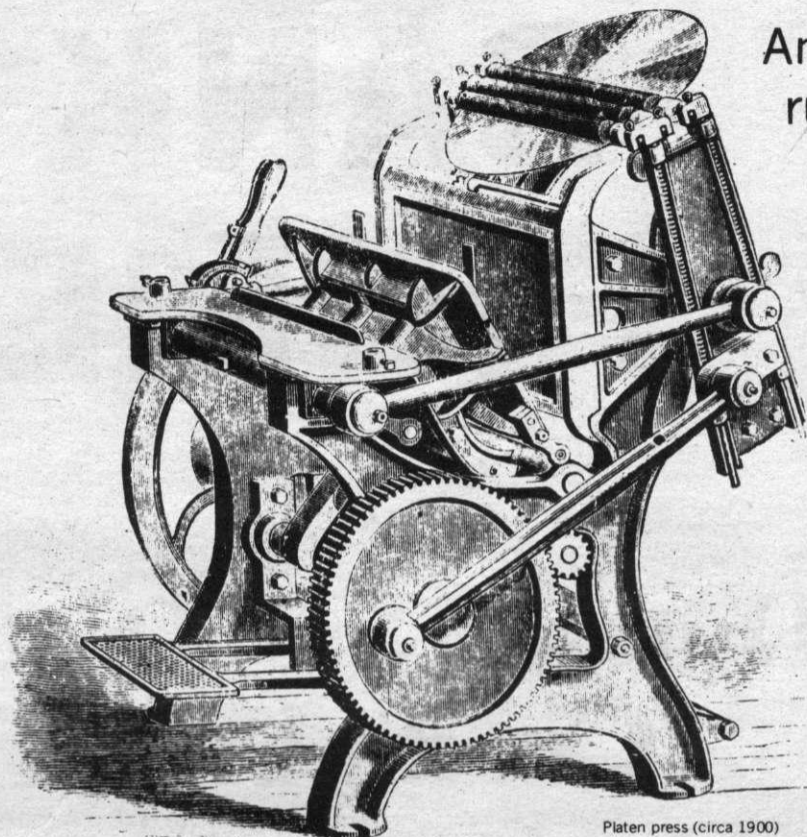

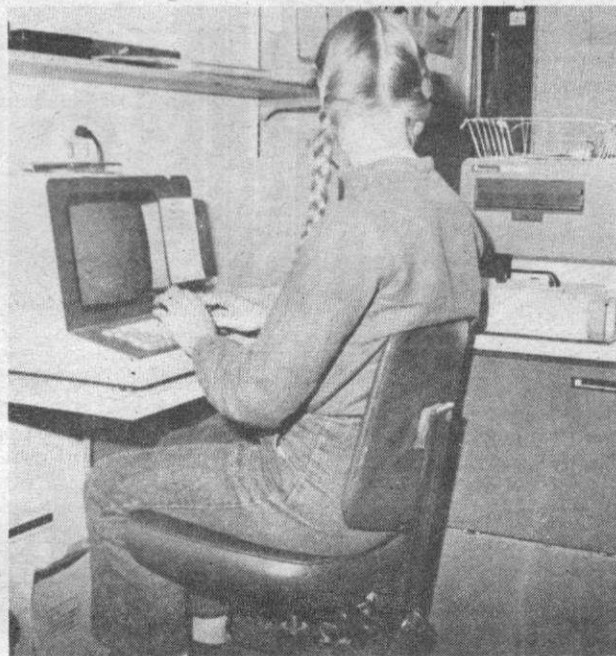
