Info-Health

BY DR. BOB YOUNG

Doctors and drivers. A recent article of mine concerning the physician's role in determining the fitness of older people to drive has reminded me of other areas where the doctor is asked to assess a persons' suitability for this activity.

Younger men and women who drive specialized equipment are required to have a physical at fairly frequent intervals. Bus drivers, heavy equipment operators, and individuals in charge of vehicles with air brakes are among those affected. The reasoning is, of course, that the truck or bus, because of its size and weight, or because passengers are carried, should be operated by a healthy driver.

The guidelines for the physician are more stringent in these cases than they are for automobile drivers. The road test is also more exacting for the professional driver. Decisions must be carefully made when a man's or woman's livelihood is at stake.

Patients recovering from illnesses often ask their physician when they can start driving again. Many factors may influence the doctor in providing his professional opinion. At times local driving is allowed before permission is given to take a trip.

If a patient has been told by a doctor that he must not drive (for reasons of ill health), and the doctor becomes aware that the patient continues to drive, the law requires that the doctor inform the Motor Vehicle Branch. They, in turn, usually send the patient a form requesting a physical examination be done.

Special consideration has to be given to people who are handicapped. Those with epilepsy, amputations, vision problems, or psychiatric illness require special attention. The assessing physician is helped by guidelines provided by the Motor Vehicle Branch, but these are not sufficient to cover every case and often common sense is the key to the decision.

The final, and probably most frequent contact between doctor and driver occurs in the emergency department of the local hospital. In spite of 'preventive maintenance' of drivers, care of accident victims continues to be all too frequently required.

Volunteers to help with tax returns

Some people hate the thought of having to do their own income tax return. But in communities across Canada there are others who volunteer to do five, 10, 20 or more returns. These are the people who participate in Revenue Canada Taxation's Volunteer Tax Program, and they are trained by the local public relations officer.

These volunteers are willing to help senior citizens with limited income, handicapped and low income people who need help with the annual income tax returns.

This year there is also the new child tax credit program to consider. This program could mean up to \$200 for each eligible child, depending on the family income. The monies will not be sent automatically. They must be applied for by completing a schedule 10 and a 1978 income tax return, and they may only be claimed by the person entitled to the December family allowance. In many cases this will mean women who have not filed for years, or who may have never before completed an income tax return will now have to file in order to receive the child tax credit.

The volunteer tax counsellor for the Gulf Islands is Jim Verner of Port Washington, and his phone number is 629-6683. He will be pleased to hear from anyone in the islands who requires assistance

Selected to perform with the dancing group were Arlene Dashwood, Caroline Andress, Annie Shuttleworth, Lois Phillips, Jane Rooke, Robin Archibald, Dawn Luker, Lisa Fennell and Amy Newman.

Fitchew says all sectors of the community have responded to the call for singers and dancers, and the general reaction to the mammoth job has been "good".

"It's a big challenge," says the director. "And it's going to take a lot of work."

No vote for alternates on committees

Capital Region Board chairman Murray Glazier has announced that alternate directors will no longer be permitted to vote at committee meetings. They will be allowed to attend and speak at those meetings, but only as observers.

The announcement was made last week by the board chairman, who also said that alternates will still be permitted a vote at board meetings.

A number of board directors have been critical of the change, which has been described by some as "bloody stupid".

An electoral area could be left without any effective representation, said Colwood director Howard Drummond.

"The idea of having alternates is to ensure that communities will be represented at all times," he said.

Sooke director Charles Perkins disagrees with the system of alternate directors but he felt that while "the Municipal Act allows alternates, they should take over the director's duties as necessary."

Directors are appointed to committees for their individual talents, Glazier said last week, and the alternates might not have those same talents.

He also said that they attend few meetings and rarely understand the business of the regional board and therefore should not be allowed to vote on critical matters.

a) that the land identified as Lot 3, Section 12, Mayne Island, Cowichan District, Plan 715, and all buildings and structures constructed, placed or moved thereon shall be used only for the purposes of a restaurant or dining facility, a single family residential use associated with a restaurant or dining facility, and uses accessory to dining facilities and single family residential uses;

b) that the total gross floor area to be used for the purposes of a dining facility or restaurant shall not exceed one hundred and eighty five (185) square metres (1991.32 sq. ft.).
