

Time now to sow main crops of Golfing peas, beets, lettuce and carrots

Now that things are drying up a bit we can sow for our main crop of peas, beets, lettuce and carrots.

If wet soil prevented you from sowing onions, spinach, parsnips, chard and early potatoes, do so now without delay. Onion sets, lettuce and cabbage family plants (broccoli, cauliflower, brussels sprouts) may be set out as well.

If you find that your garden takes a long time to dry sufficiently to get things started you might consider improving the drainage. It is an investment well worthwhile, since it will extend your gardening season, and hence your supply of veggies, at both ends. Air in the root zone is as essential as nutrients.

Another means of extending or getting an early start are raised beds. Raised beds are used extensively by the French who are avid gardeners.

FINDING SUPPORT

The French method of gardening is currently finding a great deal of support among leading gardeners. It is also being talked about as "wide row" planting.

Essentially it consists of arranging your veggies in two foot or three foot-wide "beds" separated by walks, usually the width of a rake or rototiller. I find a three-foot-wide "bed" easy to work.

A three-foot bed would contain four rows of carrots, or four rows of onions, or three rows of parsley or beets, or two rows of peppers, or two rows of cabbages, or two rows of tomatoes in an offset pattern. By raising these beds from three to six inches above ground level both drainage and soil temperature are increased, allowing earlier starting and an extended season in the fall.

INTENSIVE

Basically, the French method is an intensive method of gardening allowing increased production on smaller space and greater concentration of soil improvement. In other words, it is space and energy-efficient.

Again, stick as much organic material into your soil as you can lay your hands on. Any compost, manure, hay, straw, rotten wood, fine barkmulch or seaweed will do. Don't worry about the salt in seaweed. Although the sea is salty, seaweed is not nearly so; there is no danger of making your soil too salty unless you use 90% seaweed to 10% soil. Aim for a minimum of five per cent organic matter in your soil. You will come to swear by it.

WILL NEED LIME

Peat moss is another excellent soil conditioner but since it is acid you will have to add some lime. Our climate tends to produce acid soils as our winter rains leach out the more water-soluble alkaline

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elements.

Unless your garden has "mid-den" soil you will have to watch your "Ph" for best results. "Ph" stands for the acid-alkaline soil balance and all vegetables, except strawberries, blueberries, cranberries or potatoes (Ph.5) prefer a Ph of six to seven with seven being neutral. Hydrated lime is fast acting and dolomite limestone acts more slowly but over a long period of time in reducing soil acidity. Five pounds of lime per 100 square feet will reduce acidity by three quarters of a point (i.e. 5 1/4 to 6 1/2).

Mulch your beds with seaweed, straw and pulled out weeds to discourage weeds, conserve moisture, increase soil temperature at night and hold it down during the day.

CONSERVE WATER

Use a "trickle" irrigation system

to conserve water. Trickle irrigation, a slow trickle over a long period of time (three to four hours depending on organic matter content of soil) once or twice a week, will result in deep water penetration, which results in deep roots, which provides drought resistance.

Trickle irrigation prevents water loss by run-off and evaporation.

The currant worm, which also likes gooseberries, starts life from an egg laid by the currant fruit fly on the bud of the fruit just after the petals have fallen. Methoxychlor spray just after blooming is effective.

I would be grateful for other less drastic methods which are known to work. Please let me know of any and we will share them through this column.

Savages, made up of senior men. The Salt Spring Kicks never lost a game in their 1979 season and the Sockeyes lost their final game in the playoffs. Club officials said the Sockeyes did remarkably well in the playoffs considering they were the last team in the league standings.

The juniors are the ones who have the shortest season, which usually lasts from September until the end of December. This section is generally an introduction to soccer and most coaching is concentrated on individual soccer skills.

SEPTEMBER TO MARCH

The senior section has a longer season which begins in September and ends in March. Individual soccer skill training is continued, but more emphasis is placed on working together as a team, and basic team strategy is taught.

The local season ends with the Salt Spring Island Invitational Trophy Meet. For this event each of the local teams invites a team from their own division to come to the island for a game. The winner of the game wins the Salt Spring Trophy for that division.

The annual budget to run the soccer program is approximately \$6,000. The players are encouraged to raise most of this money through registration fees and fund-raising events such as the "Kick-a-thon." The remainder was raised through sponsorships from S.S. Sea Products, Alpha Construction, Kanaka Place, S.S. Log Sorting, Lions Club, Rotary Club, Legg Landscaping, S.S.I. Recreation

Commission and Mr. and Mrs. MacDonald.

The success of the club can be seen by the number of children who have recently joined. Two years ago the membership totalled 100 players; this year there were 200 in the club. Future emphasis, the club's organizers say, will be on up-grading the coaching staff, which is expected to improve the playing ability of the teams.

Next September a coaches' clinic will be held on Salt Spring, and an invitation is being extended to all interested parties who might want to attend. Also, the association will set up a coaches' resource centre. Both personal and coaching aids will be available to all coaches throughout the soccer season.

On Tuesday, April 8, as the day was overcast and on the cool side, there were quite a few cancellations phoned in and this altered the tee-off times for those in the later draws. However, it is much better to phone in than to play and risk catching a cold or worse, and then have to miss playing on good days because you are ill.

Those who did show up enjoyed themselves, and in the nine-hole ladies' section it was Joan Millner who produced the longest drive on #6, and Lou Glascock the finesse around the greens and won for the lowest number of putts.

In the ladies' 18-hole division on the same day there were 30 players in medal play and Lil Rayner was the big winner with a net 69. Anne Monro and Bev Menzies tied for runner-up spot with net 70's. Bev also picked up the putting pot with a smooth 26 putts.

The men have started their evening golf, which consists of nine holes of golf followed by card games in the clubhouse. Anyone interested should make enquiries as to what evenings they play.

Some effort must be made this year to get the Number One competitions going again. They were popular a couple of seasons ago but faded last year.

The tea was arranged by the Readers' Club who have been reviewing Carr's writing during the past winter. Several of them had already read this biography and brought their books to be autographed by Maria. Those who ordered new books may have them autographed later at a time to be arranged.

Hostesses for the afternoon were Pat Patterson, Faye Miles, Margaret Billsten and this writer. Edith Griffiths introduced the guest of honour who then spoke for a few minutes. She gave information about the six years of research that was necessary to study the writings and journals of Emily Carr, the journeys to far and near places where she had studied and worked, and the many art galleries that have hung her paintings.

She told of interviews and correspondence with individuals who had personal contacts, then gave a brief account of a difficult mission in England where she and her husband literally "ferreted" out information regarding Emily's long illness and confinement in a sanatorium.

PUT THE PIECES TOGETHER

Then came the story of Maria's stay in her cabin on Mayne Island, where she diligently worked the

pieces of the puzzle together into a most refined and tender account of a life that was beset by many difficulties.

In introducing Maria, Mrs. Griffiths drew attention to the fact that it was a great honour that the book has been nominated for the governor-general's award for non-fiction books published in English during 1979. It is one of the finalists and the winner will be announced on April 21.

It was also one of the nominees for the Eaton Award for books written by British Columbians in 1979. A previous book which was co-authored by her husband, Dr. Douglas Cole, history professor at Simon Fraser University, was *From Desolation to Splendour*.

It was declared Book of the Year in 1977 and received the Eaton Award. For this Eaton's purchased \$1,500 worth of the books and presented them to school libraries throughout the province.

Mrs. Griffiths also mentioned that the new book will be appearing as a Book-of-the-Month selection and is also chosen for Readers' Club of Canada.

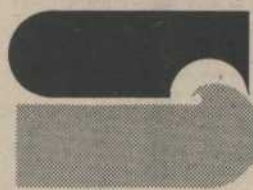

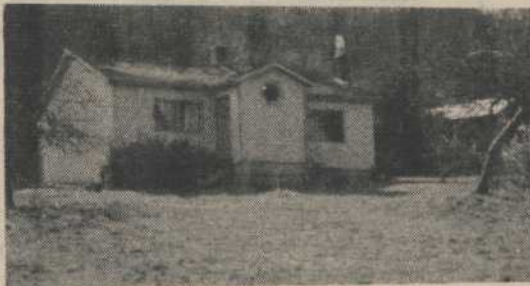

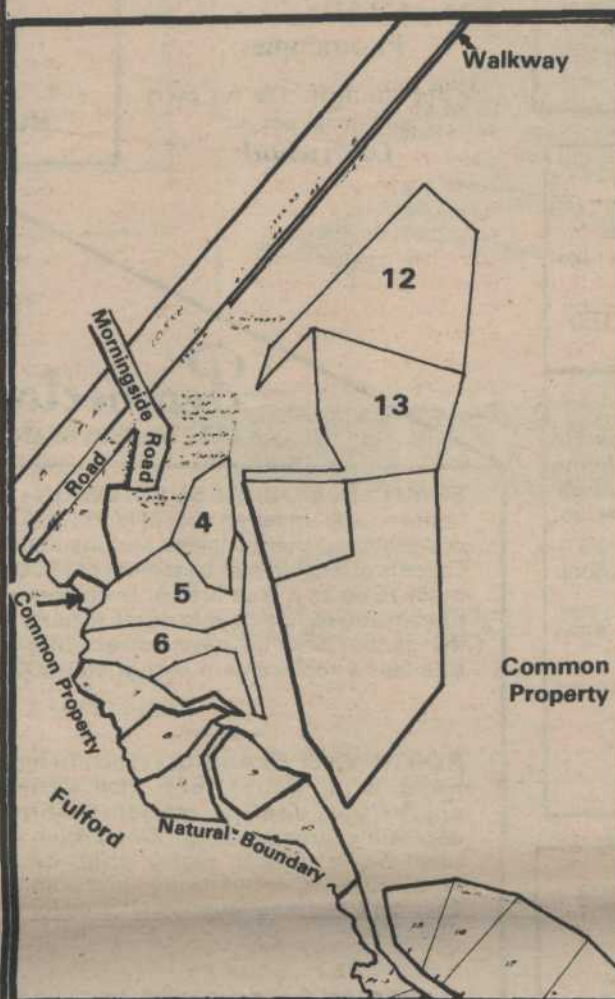

Down Through the Years With Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

Rash of petty crime in Ganges took on an ugly aspect on Monday night when safecrackers opened the safe in Mouat's Store while armed with loaded guns. Robbery netted about \$2,000. The burglar apparently provided himself with shells from the hardware department and fired a .22 aimlessly in the big Ganges store. Spent shells were scattered on the floor. On Tuesday RCMP investigators came from Victoria to check out evidence in the store. The store was entered overnight and on Tuesday morning staff found doors broken, the safe opened and ransacked and a loaded weapon abandoned by the safe. The gun had apparently been carried for use in case of interruption. The thieves had not been interrupted.

TEN YEARS AGO

Heavy trucks and heavy paving equipment have spent the past week paving Scott Road out to the Long Harbour ferry terminal and into Ganges. On Monday the equipment laid the first "lift" through the commercial centre. On Monday an official of the Dawson contracting company explained that a total of 800 tons had been laid in Ganges during the day. Project still calls for the paving of the road from Ganges to Fulford. Trucks haul the hot mix from Isabella Point Road, where a portable mixing plant has been set up. The asphalt is still too hot to touch with the bare hands, when it is laid 20 miles from the plant. While the trucks are hauling a steady flow of asphalt to the north end of the island the large tank truck fills up with hot liquid asphalt at the Ganges wharf and maintains a regular run to Fulford to feed the plant.

Salt Spring Island dogs have been busy this spring. Sheep farmers on the island, and particularly in the Beaver Point area, report extensive losses of stock to roaming dogs.

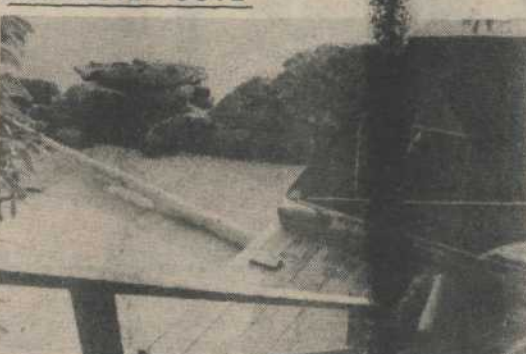

Board to continue talks with first delegation of Pender parents

Gulf Islands school trustees responded negatively to the demands of Pender School's parents' delegation number two at last week's regular board meeting.

The group was refused permission to take part in future discussions between district education administration, Pender School staff and members of delegation one: the parents who seem change in their school's curriculum.

After a short debate, the board unanimously passed a motion calling for the discussions and then refused a request from Pender trustee John Zacharias, made on behalf of delegation two, the group opposing change in the school.

"I do not want the content of these discussions to be kept confidential," Zacharias told the board. "Is delegation number two going to be kept informed of these discussions or have a representative at these meetings?"

Mayne Island trustee Jeanine Dodds, who presented the motion, suggested that Zacharias himself might want to be present at the meetings, but neither Zacharias nor the board agreed. "I do not want to be involved in the discussions because my role as a politician is getting mixed up with my role as a professional," said Zacharias, a former school principal.

NOTHING TO FEAR

Dodds went on to say that the members of group two should have nothing to fear about group one meeting privately with district officials to discuss education. "Everyone now is familiar with what the board's policy is regarding education so no one should have anything to fear," Dodds said.

During the discussion on the motion board members Charles Baltzer and Tom Davidson both said they thought the board had done enough for delegation one by holding a public meeting which was attended by both groups, Pender school staff members and the school board. During that meeting delegation one refused to discuss their points of contention with the other group present. "I think they rejected our efforts then," said Davidson.

NOT HAPPY

Salt Spring board member Mary Williamson told trustees that group one members were not happy with a statement made at the public

meeting by secretary-treasurer Wilf Peck. Peck was quoted as saying that the school board could do nothing to help the delegations solve their dispute.

Williamson argued for the motion saying that, although public and committee meetings had been held where the objects of group one had been discussed, the board had not formally responded to the delegation's original brief, which had requested the board's help in meeting certain educational goals.

In a subsequent interview with *Driftwood*, group one member Helena Turner insisted that some people misinterpreted the goals of her group in thinking they wanted a more permissive school.

"That is not the case, we don't seek changes in the school itself. We recognize that the school is in accordance with the philosophy of a lot of parents on Pender Island. We feel there is room in our society to accommodate different opinions," she said.

NO DEMANDS

"People have been needlessly anxious," she continued. "Our group has made no demands; instead we have been exploring different options. The most serious transition that a young person has to make is from being a dependent child to an independent young adult. We are looking for ways in which the educational environment

of our children will help them learn to discipline themselves and will help them learn to be responsible by making their own decisions and learning from the consequences of those decisions."

With regard to the controversy which arose from her group's actions, Turner said she thought it good to see so much interest and concern over different philosophies.

"I expect that the other group is going through a similar process of studying education and learning more about it as we have been doing," she concluded.

University unaware of sewer debate here

It is not the policy of the University of British Columbia to "intrude in a local matter" such as sewers, the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce has learned.

The chamber wrote last month to the chancellor of the university expressing concern that UBC would "enter into a community debate as delicate as that which surrounds the establishment of a sanitary sewer in Ganges".

The letter was referring to the participation in the debate by sewer opponent John Davies. Chamber members were under the impression that Davies was on the university's faculty, because in a number of letters to the editor of *Gulf Islands Driftwood* he had signed his name "John Davies, UBC".

The letter to the chancellor continued by saying that the chamber "found it strange that the university would engage Mr. John Davies as its spokesman in this matter. It is our understanding that he is in the faculty of business administration.

"In conclusion, we feel that the university would have better appointed a medical faculty spokesman to challenge the findings of

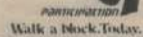
the medical officer of health regarding a health hazard (in Ganges)."

The letter was signed by chamber president Jake Javorski.

In his reply, C. J. Conaghan, vice-president of administrative services, said the university administration was not aware of the events the chamber had described.

He also said that the name John Davies could not be found listed in the teaching faculty of commerce and business administration. He said it was possible that Davies was a student.

McGeer took his fixed-link proposal to cabinet to seek "policy guidance and feasibility study funds." Feasibility studies for the proposal, including environmental and population impact studies, would cost between \$500,000 and \$1 million, and could take up to a year to complete.

McGeer said he saw no clash between his push for feasibility funding and the suggestion from Curtis that before any major steps are taken a province-wide vote be held. Curtis, according to the *Colonist*, said he feels that a project of such magnitude costing \$2 billion-plus requires the approval of all taxpayers.

"The ideal would be to press for payment of the IOU that existed since the time of confederation," McGeer said. "The federal government (which promised permanent links between the mainland and the island) should pick up 100% of the costs but maybe that's being overly ambitious. Let's say less than 100%."

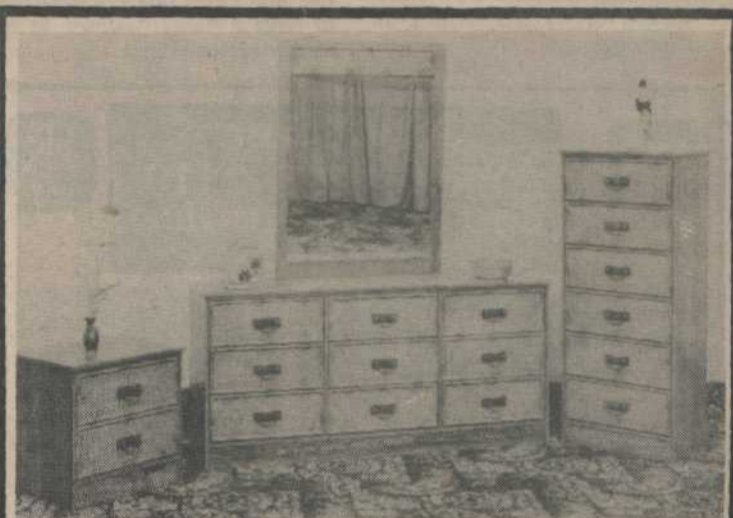
