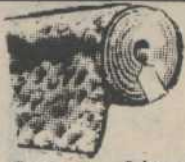
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Galiano

RCMP constable for summer is surprised by island tranquillity

Galiano's resident policeman for the summer of 1980 is Tom Bethune. Constable Bethune has been with Duncan RCMP detachment for the past year but has been temporarily posted to the Ganges detachment for the period of his four-month stint on Galiano.

Tom was born and grew up in Kingston, Ontario. Despite having a grandfather named Norman he does not know of a family relationship to Dr. Bethune of China fame.

On completing his training at Regina he asked to be posted to Vancouver Island as he had visited this area before and was attracted to it. He expects and hopes to remain in B.C. for some time.

A week before his posting to Galiano, Tom married his high school sweetheart, Mavis. As they have an apartment in Duncan and Mavis has a job as a dentist's receptionist, she has not accompanied him to Galiano but she will be able to visit at weekends. With two days off-island every week Tom will also be able to go home to Duncan so the separation so early in their marriage will not be too hard to bear.

Although he received orientation advice from colleagues and had previously visited the island, Constable Bethune was surprised by the quietness. For the first two nights he had difficulty sleeping because of the absence of noise.

He has enjoyed the welcome he has received from islanders and finds them easy to talk to as he is himself. He does not anticipate trouble but if it should happen he can call on Ganges detachment for reinforcements. He believes that it is most important that visitors to Galiano know that there is a police presence on the island so he makes a point of meeting every ferry he possibly can, especially at weekends.

To many older members of the community the summer policeman seems to get younger every year. This, or course, is an example of Murphy's Law of Relativity for it is we who get older and not they who get younger. But talk to the young constable and you will find a maturity of view and a sensible and responsible attitude to his duties that should encourage and reassure you despite the apprehension which arrives every year with the holiday period. JAZZ CONCERT

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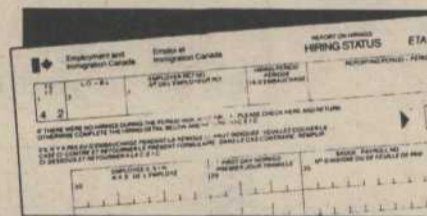

Next week, information on year end closing, the primary sports day and other assorted trivia. Until then keep your gumboots dry and think winter (anything is better than this!)



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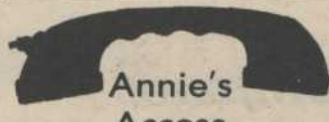

When we think of crabs, it's probably Alaska king crab or dungeness in the form of a crab cocktail. However, there are many other kinds of crab.

Some local spider crabs will decorate themselves with small bits of sponge or algae. They tear a piece off with their pincers and stick it on their legs or back with some mucus. Some of them get so covered with camouflage that they are very difficult to see in the seaweed.

Local hermit crabs will attach a sea anemone to the shell they are living in. When they change shells they transfer the anemone to the new shell. Another hermit crab lives inside a sponge. It started in an ordinary shell but a sponge grew on the shell and gradually dissolved it, and so the crab just keeps the sponge for a home.

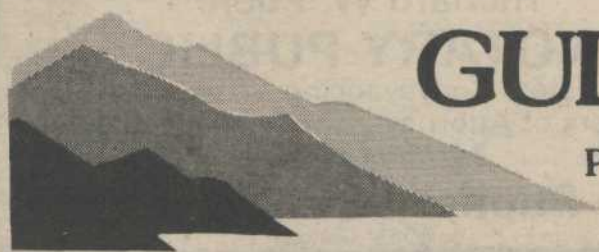

grows up to 10 feet across from the tip of one leg to another.

Some crabs live on land. They are mostly tropical crabs, and there is even one that climbs coconut trees and is so strong it can snip off coconuts.

Ghost crabs inhabit tropical beaches. They live in burrows just above high tide line, and sally forth at high tide to feed and scurry back to their burrows which they close up during the day with sand. They are very amusing to watch as they dig out their burrows. They carry a ball of sand in one pincer and toss it aside after having a look around to see that all is clear.

Male fiddler crabs have one very large claw and use it in elaborate mating rituals.

The pea crab is a very small crab that lives in the mantle cavity of some clams and oysters.

These are only a small number of the large variety of crabs that live in the world's oceans.

Canada needs to be firm to avoid environmental damage

Last week, I again raised in the House of Commons the issue of oil tanker traffic along the B.C. coast. Unfortunately, the response was not heartening. The American hearings into the oil port issue continue with no official Canadian input. The Liberals are losing an important chance to make Canadian concerns heard.

Canada is in grave danger of having her environmental concerns over the issue ignored. Such was the report from two NDP colleagues, Jim Fulton, M.P. for Skeena, and Bob Rae, M.P. for Broadview-Greenwood, who in May met with counterparts from the U.S. Congress in San Diego, California.

In their report they warned of growing difficulty on several bilateral issues between the two nations. Fulton and Rae pointed out that there has not been carry-over from the good feelings and gratitude to Canada following the Canadian embassy rescue of American diplomats in Iran.

DETERMINED

Of specific concern to our riding is the threat of increased tanker traffic transporting Alaskan oil to a new terminal in Washington State. Jim Fulton claimed that in spite of clear dangers to the environment, and the detrimental effects on Canadian fisheries and tourism, a

majority of American legislators seem determined to push this through Congress.

Even the money available for clean-up in the event of an oil spill is woefully inadequate. Already the clean-up costs for the Gulf of Mexico blow-out have risen to \$580 million. For our coast the Americans only set a figure of \$100 million when they approved the Alaska pipeline.

Recent Coast Guard studies have indicated that the incremental effect of small spills, leaks and seepage will be as destructive in the long run as major disasters. Ironically, Frank Howard and Tommy Douglas both pushed for a West Coast Marine Pollution Act back in 1968 which would have given us some protection. Neither Liberal nor Conservative governments, however, acted on this proposal.

If British Columbians wish to avoid the destruction of our coastline, we must redouble our efforts to make the Liberal government

stand up against American oil interests.

OTHER AREAS

In addition, Fulton and Rae pointed to four other areas where American interests are riding rough shod over Canadian needs: the fisheries and boundaries dispute, acid rain, the Autopact and the Alaska Highway pipeline.

In the east coast fisheries, Canada had made many concessions to Americans and negotiators had reached a basic agreement on the proposed treaty. Now the American senate is stalling and wants more concessions. So far, our fishermen have been honouring the treaty provisions but the Americans have been exceeding their quotas.

It is time for the Liberal government in Ottawa to be more forceful in making our case known to the Americans. We must be firm so that future generations will not be saddled with needless environmental damage simply because we allowed the Americans to ignore their part of the agreement reached.

I would be interested in your comments.

Artcraft details announced

Driver convicted despite lack of tests by police

A man found asleep at the wheel of his car with a glass of wine in his hand was convicted on an impaired driving charge last week.

Helmut E. Bentzin lost his case in provincial court in Ganges and was fined \$400.

Defense lawyer T. E. Liberty of Vancouver argued that the evidence of the crown could not prove beyond any reasonable doubt that his client was guilty.

Neither breathalyzer readings nor the results of sobriety tests had been included as evidence by the crown.

However, Const. Bernice Hopp of the Ganges RCMP testified that Bentzin's breath smelled of alcohol, his eyes were bloodshot and he swayed on his feet.

"His words were mumbled and it sounded like he was speaking in a foreign language," Hopp told the court.

Liberty declared that Bentzin had a distinct German accent and was mumbling because he had just been woken from a deep sleep.

Liberty said, "I don't believe the law has gotten to the state where circumstantial evidence alone is enough to convict a person."

He also submitted that the breathalyzer tests were not made because Hopp knew the readings would not substantiate the charge.

But Judge D. K. McAdam did not agree. He told Liberty that the absence of all tests was not conclusive of Bentzin's innocence. "If the behaviour of the accused convinced an experienced police officer that he was intoxicated then I must agree with her convictions," McAdam said.

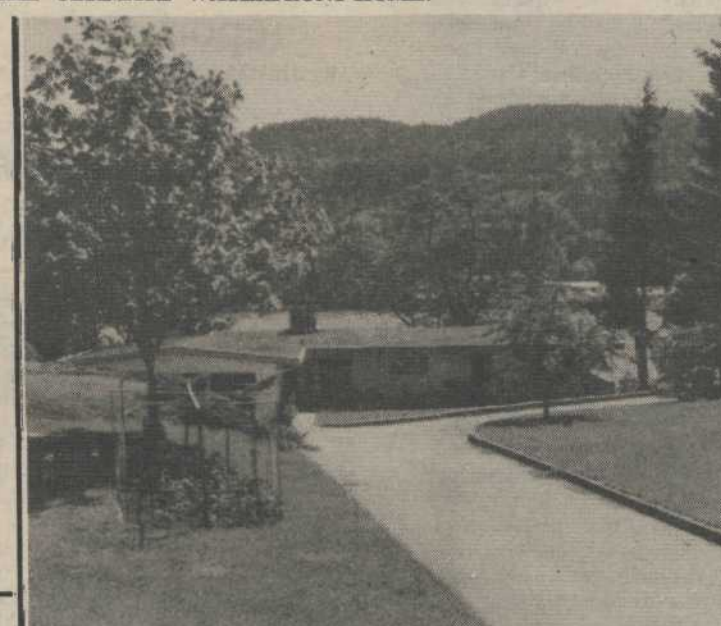
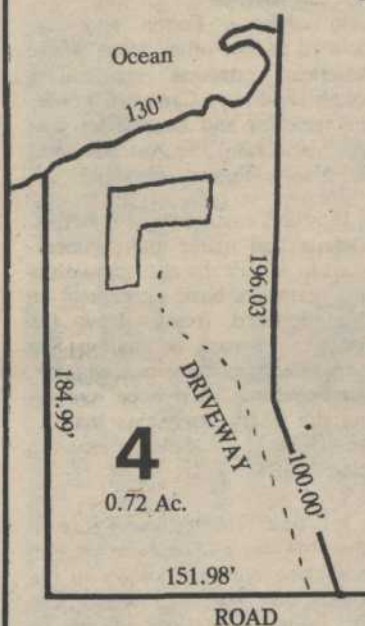

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Truck destroyed after brakes fail on hill

Cranberry Bright District which surrounds Boat Harbour. Dr. Keith Hammond, secretary of the Citizens Steering Committee, told *Driftwood* that his group is trying to persuade the Nanaimo Regional Board not to rezone the upland property. He said Mayo Holdings will soon be applying for a change in zoning from residential to industrial.

He added that Premier Bill Bennett responded to a letter of protest from the steering committee, stating that he was concerned about the environment of the area but that he was also concerned about the economy of the province.

Hammond said that the coal dust coming off the conveyor belts that would load the ships would blacken the coastline of Stuart Channel for miles.

WATER SHORTAGE

A shortage of fresh water in the district, Hammond added, will make it impossible to control the dust with water jets.

The committee is also objecting to the size of the vessels which will use the port. The ships will have a capacity of 100,000 tons with a draft of 45 feet and a length of approximately 2,000 feet.

Mayo Holdings has also applied to the provincial government for mineral exploration rights in the Cedar area and for rights to mine coal. There is no mining in the district at present although coal was mined in the past.

It is estimated that the coal handling facility in Boat Harbour would cost Mayo Holdings \$50 million to build and would employ about 200 people when in full operation.

Hammond said that British Petroleum, Netherlands of the Pacific and Imperial Oil are also seeking coal rights in the Cedar district.

He noted that Boat Harbour is relatively undeveloped now but has potential for a marina and recreational facilities.

Hammond said that Mayo Holdings made its plans public on May 23. Since then the steering committee held a public meeting which was attended by 250 of the approximately 1,200 residents of the area. The meeting, he said, voiced unanimous support for the steering committee and a petition sponsored by the group has already been signed by 600 residents.

Hammond said he hopes to convince the regional board to exclude any industrial development from the official community plan now being drawn up for the Cedar, Cranberry Bright District.

However, the power of the regional district to prevent such a development is only marginal.

Hammond said that if the federal and provincial governments decided to go ahead then the regional board would be sandwiched between them and the people of the area.

Packer aground on shoals

A Vancouver packer received little damage after it went aground Friday on Gossip Shoals, at the eastern end of Active Pass. The *Dawn Raider* went up on the rocks at about 7 pm and was pulled off again later that evening.

Before Coast Guard vessels arrived on the scene, the Canadian Pacific truck ferry *Carrier Princess* stood by while a sports fisherman

attempted to get a line to it from the stranded vessel. Before he was able to do so the *Mallard*, stationed at Ganges, arrived, followed shortly after by the hovercraft.

The two vessels were unable to free the packer for about an hour, when the tide began to flood. No damage or injuries were reported.
