

# The original hospital on Ganges Hill cost \$4,000 when it was built in 1912

The cost of the original Lady Minto Hospital on Ganges Hill was paid for equally by island residents (whose share was \$1 each) and the provincial government. The cost was approximately \$4,000 and the land was given by Dr. Beach of the island.

The hospital was built in 1914, and many islanders worked on the hospital and worked well, until it was opened in the spring of that year.

Miss Cohoun (sic) was the first matron and later became Mrs. Frank Crofton. In 1915 she went overseas.

While she was serving in France at a hospital, a live bomb landed near the ward where she was working. She went out, picked it up, and threw it far away before it went off. She was awarded a high honour, three decorations.

At the hospital in Ganges she had one nurse only, Miss Cartwright, Mrs. Basil Cartwright's sister-in-law. Only sometimes there was help in the kitchen.

When the hospital was finished it was all paid for. Ten cents per month for children, \$2.50 per month for adults, and \$5 per year was all it cost. Each islander paid the fee which kept the hospital going.

Surplus vegetables and fruit were given to the hospital.

"Hospital Day" was an annual ceremony, and so much was donated.

Nurses had to care for patients, trim lamp wicks, sometimes chop wood, cook meals when no cook was in the kitchen, and scrub the floors. Many services were donated by islanders. The really fine community spirit applied to everything.

Never in debt - what a record!

Drs. Beach and Sutherland would go anywhere by launch wherever they were needed. Dr. Beach gave the land and his son, Dr. Allan Beach, was the first resident followed by Dr. Sutherland (lady) when Dr. Beach Jr., had gone overseas in 1915.

Dr. Lawson, Nancy Patterson's grandfather, came in 1920.

Mrs. Spalding, of South Pender, was a member of the hospital board.

The islanders decided to have the hospital, and Mrs. Arthur second year of their two-year terms.

Mrs. Marilyn Ryles was installed for a further term as president of the Ladies Auxiliary. Other Auxiliary officers who formally took office at the same time are first vice-president, Alice Coels; second vice-president, Lucy Moore; secretary, Sylvia Chew; treasurer, Vicki Griffin; Sergeant-at-arms, Edith Marcotte; executive, Margaret Campbell, Ann Funk, Helen White.

Mrs. Siggy Emerslund is past president.

Walter, Mrs. Wilson and others formed the Sunshine Guild, which supported the old hospital.

In those days islanders all helped with any community project - keen help and interest. Mrs. Barbara Hastings served for 16 years on the board and was a moving spirit towards the new hospital.

Miss Lassic Dodds was the mainstay of the first Lady Minto Hospital and the new one. She did everything that needed to be done.

One year at the old hospital, two young women became students in training, one of whom was Winifred Bellhouse.

## String Quartet masters of their instruments

The people of the Pender Islands had a rare musical treat when the Purcell String Quartet played an all-Beethoven program in the Community Centre recently.

Messrs. Humphreys and King, first and second violins, Etter, viola and Hampton, cello, are masters of their instruments. The group plays together without fireworks, dramatics or sentimentality but with a sensitivity and understanding that can be truly described as superb.

Beethoven's first group of quartets, written when he was 30, were the six string quartets which comprise Opus 18. The players chose No. 3 in D. major, a lovely, melodious work, a model of clarity and grace, still carrying something of the influence of Haydn and Mozart. Then came the Quartet in F minor, written 10 years later, and bearing the heading, Quartetto Serioso. It was written soon after Beethoven had been jilted by one of his lady loves. It is a powerful, passionate work, romantic and dynamic.

The whole of the second part of the program was taken up with Quartet in C sharp minor, Opus 131. This magnificent work was the highlight of the program. The five great quartets written when Beethoven was desperately ill, completely deaf and soon to die, were among his most colossal works and heralded the music of today.

Chamber music, though considered by its devotees the purest

form of music, is not the easiest to listen to. There are no familiar arias, few catchy little melodies to hum. The absorption with which the audience listened is testimony to the artistry of the performers.

The concert was made possible by financial assistance from the B.C. Cultural Fund, the Canada Council, Simon Fraser University where the Purcell Quartet is in residence and by donations from the Musical Arts Club of Pender Island and several other local institutions.

Purpose of the By-law is to permit the construction of a single family dwelling and cottage on the same lot but which has been split by a public road prior to January 1, 1980, providing that the lot is greater than 6,000 sq. metres, and that the minimum size of either portion of the split lot is in excess of 2,000 sq. metres. This By-law Amendment does not permit the split lot to be subdivided into two lots.

# Charlie Hunt came to Fulford for hall opening in 1937 says report

When Joan Lott found an old copy of the *Saanich Peninsula and Gulf Islands Review*, she was delighted to learn that the new Fulford Hall was to be opened the following week.

A brief story in the *Sidney Review* reports that:

*Fulford, Nov. 3. - Everything is shaping up well for the grand opening of the new Fulford Community Hall with a dance Wednesday evening next, Nov. 10th.*

*The building committee is working hard to make the event outstanding. Hunt's Orchestra, of Victoria has been engaged and dancing will commence at nine in the evening and continue until two in the morning. Transportation is being arranged.*

The story doesn't say that the orchestra was Charlie Hunt's and that Charlie was still making music long after the Second World War.

The newspaper was published Wednesday, Nov. 3, 1937.

#### AT HOPE BAY

A very successful concert had been held at Hope Bay Hall in aid of the Pender School Piano Fund. Sponsoring the concert were Mrs. Reddyhoff, Mrs. Sones and Mrs. Scott. Two short plays, *Tamlane* and *The Magician* were produced.

The Princess was played by Miss Elizabeth Mollison and Miss Peggy Smith was *Tamlane*. Fairies, witches, etc., were played by some of the smaller pupils.

Arthur Ralph played some accor-dian music during the intervals.

There had been a jolly party at Galiano and the Galiano golf course was proving popular.

The B.C. Telephone Company got into the act with an announcement that you could have an extension phone for as little as 50c a month. Installation charge was steep. It cost \$1 to put the extension in.

#### HOSPITAL WARNING

The caution from Rest Haven Hospital sounded like an insurance advertisement. "Any complaint that fails to get better, must be getting worse. Neglect is dangerous."

Classified advertisements cost one cent a word with a minimum charge of 25c.

Some of the advertisers are still in business. The Dominion Hotel is

still in Victoria and the Canadian Pacific is still around. The Bank of Montreal is around, but offers no H-I-P Loan, whatever that might have been.

The B.C. Telephone Company and the Grosvenor Hotel are still in evidence, although Hodgson's Red and White Store at Bedwell Harbour, might be more difficult to discover.

The Dominion of Canada is also still in high gear even though the emphasis is on Canada, rather than Dominion.

The newspaper is an interesting memento of another era in a peace-torn, impoverished horse-ridden land of Canada. And it cost five cents.

## Sunday shopping act is close to local option

One of the most controversial issues in local government is likely to be handed over to municipalities of the province.

Under the proposed Holiday Shopping Act, local governments would have the authority to decide what store might open on Sundays and where they would be permitted to be open.

The bill would allow municipalities and regional boards outside municipalities, to regulate retail businesses on Sundays and holidays.

The bill defines a holiday as a Sunday or New Year's Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day (May 24 or

thereabouts), Dominion Day, British Columbia Day (in August), Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day, Remembrance Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day (December 26).

Under the bill, each municipality will be permitted to regulate what may or may not be sold, where and when.

#### MUST NOT CLASH

No municipal council may pass a bylaw which clashes with the Lord's Day Act or with the Liquor Control and Licensing Act.

Once a Holiday Shopping Bylaw has been enacted it may not be changed except by a public hearing and subsequent affirmation by two-thirds of the council members present.

The information was received last week by the Capital Regional District.

## Three diseases concern

Medical Officer of Health for the Capital Regional District, Dr. A.S. Arneil is busy warning the public of three hazardous diseases. Two of the complaints may be relieved by inoculation. The third requires treatment when the symptoms show up.

Tetanus, or lockjaw, has been around for a long time. It was a killer in the First World War for soldiers who were infected through their wounds, sustained in the trenches.

A trivial wound, such as a thorn prick, stepping on a rusty nail or the scratch from an animal's claws, can cause tetanus.

Immunization gives good results, says Arneil, but it should be followed by booster shots every 10 years.

Second complaint which is yet in evidence, although not the killer it used to be, is whooping cough. It is still around and the medical officer urges all parents to ensure that their children are immunized. Inoculation is available from the family doctor or from the health clinics.

The medical officer of health warns against malaria. Not a disease of great significance in Canada, its symptoms could be difficult to recognize if the doctor treating a patient is not aware that he has been out of the country. Patient suffering fever, chills and sweating should tell the physician he's been away.



# A new way to detect Unemployment Insurance abuse.

Most people getting unemployment insurance play by the rules. But some people don't seem to know that they can't take a job and collect benefits without telling us they're working. That's why employers are being asked to send us the starting date and Social Insurance Number or extracts from computer payroll tapes for each employee they hire or rehire. This information is cross-checked with the Social Insurance Numbers of people receiving unemployment insurance benefits. Only cases of potential abuse will ever surface. After investigation, anyone found receiving benefits to which they are not entitled will have to repay them.

It may be an honest mistake. Some people forget or don't understand they must tell Unemployment Insurance and report their total earnings when they start a new job. In that case, repayment is all that's required. But, a penalty or prosecution may follow when the new system detects people wrongly collecting benefits.


If you are collecting unemployment insurance benefits, and start a new job, please say so on your UI claimant report card.



Social Insurance Numbers of newly-hired employees are now being cross-checked with those of people receiving unemployment insurance benefits. Only cases of potential abuse will ever surface.

**Three incumbents re-elected at Galiano**

The Galiano Advisory Planning Commission held its annual meeting in the Community Hall at 2 pm on Saturday, July 5.

A large audience came to question the members of the committee on their work and to exercise the privilege of electing three members to the Commission. From the questions and discussion it appeared that many members of the public are unsure of the purpose and powers of the Commission.

The Advisory Planning Commission was set up when the Galiano Community Plan was accepted by the community. It was brought into being under a bylaw of the Capital Regional District.

When the planning function of the Regional District was transferred to the Island Trust, a new Advisory Planning Commission was established.

The two local Island Trustees became members of the Commission, together with five local members elected at an annual public meeting.

The local election is a nomination and the Island Trust Committee has to confirm the appointments.

The duties of the Commission are purely advisory and the Commission has no administrative function. It makes recommendations to the Island Trust regarding applications for rezoning and subdivision. The Trust is not required to follow the recommendations of the Commission, although it usually does.

Rezoning involves a public hearing on Galiano when those who deem themselves affected can make presentations.

It is the policy of the Galiano Advisory Planning Commission to consider subdivision applications in camera.

The five local Commissioners serve two-year terms and are named at an annual public meeting by electors on the current voting list of the Capital Regional District.

After each annual meeting the Commissioners elect a chairman from among themselves.

During the discussion at last Saturday's meeting it became apparent that members of the public have certain concerns about the operation of the Commission. The fact that the Commission does not prepare an annual report or make public the minutes of its meetings gives rise to a feeling that too much takes place behind closed doors. Although it is true that there is

no obligation under the bylaw that created it to compel the Commission to be more open, there is nothing in it to prevent the Commission doing so if it chooses.

After the meeting the *Driftwood* reporter was informed by past chairman Phyllis Stafford that the committee met on an average once a month during 1979 and the first half of 1980. Their meetings usually last between one and two hours. Mrs. Stafford also pointed out that each Commissioner spends many extra hours inspecting property under discussion for zone change or subdivision.

A motion to restrict members of the Commission to two consecutive terms in order to reduce 'old-guardism' was ruled out of order but the local Trustees agreed to take this idea to the General Islands Trust. Such amendments can only be passed by the Islands Trust but it might well be advisable for the public, at a general meeting, to be permitted to make and

vote on motions of recommendations for the consideration of the Trust.

Five nominations were forthcoming for the three vacancies on the Commission. Three retiring members, Bob Knowles, Phyllis Stafford and Pat Weaver were nominated and in addition Oliver Garner and Sandy Riley all from the floor.

Each candidate was invited to make a five-minute presentation of their position regarding the duties of the Commission. The three retiring members were then re-elected by the meeting.

The meeting was concluded by Trustee Ron Thompson pointing out to the audience that the members of the Commission require courage to make difficult decisions, were rarely commended and frequently criticized, and are unpaid.

On behalf of the community he thanked them for their service over the past year.

## Down Through The Years With Driftwood

### FIVE YEARS AGO

When Mr. and Mrs. W.D. Patterson of Fulford celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary they were congratulated by a direct call from Buckingham Palace to mark the occasion.

It was early on Sunday morning last week when Mrs. Patterson was called to the telephone. "This is Buckingham Palace," said an English voice. The Queen didn't speak to the island couple. One of her staff conveyed greetings on her behalf.

There will be a letter to follow confirming the call they were told. The Fulford couple also received a letter of congratulation from Premier Dave Barrett and from the Lieutenant-Governor.

New Ganges sewer committee is proposing an entirely new concept for sewage disposal in Ganges. The community planning association supported a move to construct a Coulthard treatment plant in Ganges. Dr. Lionel Coulthard is a Ganges resident who is engaged in agricultural engineering research at U.B.C. His revolutionary new sewage treatment process was devised some years ago in Holland and has been recently revamped by a research team at U.B.C.

The sewage is collected and run through a settling tank where the solids are separated from the liquid. The sludge is then processed through a high temperature fermentation process.

The sewage is encouraged to ferment and unprecedented temperatures are reached. After complete treatment by this process all contaminants are destroyed. The remains are then fed to animals as protein. The protein derived from the process has been fed to day-old chicks.

Day-old chicks are extremely vulnerable to disease and they were used in order to ensure that no harmful constituent remained.

While the solids are treated in this manner, the liquid is run through a coal filter from which it comes back almost clean.

### TEN YEARS AGO

One-man army is defending Saturna against the encroachment of Victoria or Salt Spring Island. Jim Money, merchant, landowner and farmer of Saturna has gained approval of the municipal affairs minister for a petition against membership of the Capital Regional District. "If we can get 60% of islanders to sign a petition for secession," he told *Driftwood*. "Then the government will look closer at Saturna and the regional district." Saturna can run its own affairs without intrusion from Victoria, said Mr. Money. And if Salt Spring wants planning, let them have it, but don't foist it on Saturna, he warned.

Planning committee on Salt Spring Island has been boosted. A plea for donations was made recently by the committee. Donations have flowed in, reports Mrs. A.M. Brown, secretary. Her committee has expressed gratitude to donors for the contributions.

### FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Premier W.A.C. Bennett was taken for a ride last Saturday afternoon. Mr. Bennett enjoyed a drive with Mrs. Warren Hastings in her horse and buggy making an old fashioned but pleasant picture as they drove down the wooded road along the Ganges Road. Mrs. Hastings reported the Premier had enjoyed his drive and that he was even more convinced of the importance of keeping our island charm

as much as possible as it is at present.

W.Allan Ker and Associates, Consultant Engineers retained for the sewerage study in the Ganges area have presented their report to the committee and their general consensus is that the project is entirely feasible. The study took in the immediate village vicinity, the properties up as far as the hospital and the new provincial building. The total capital cost for the areas studied is \$167,990 with an annual cost, including upkeep of \$14,625.

### TWENTY YEARS AGO

The highlight of Premier W.A.C. Bennett's address to the people of the Gulf Islands was the announcement that Mr. Gavin C. Mouat had donated 50 acres of land to government for development of a park site. The land, extending from the stores in Ganges to the government gravel pit behind the "Buzz" Brown property, was partly the old McAfee sub-division. In connection with announcement, it was indicated to the S.S.I. Chamber of Commerce that development of this property and the development of the bay between the barber shop and Salt Spring Motors would begin in the near future.

Approximately 300 people gathered on the Harbour House lawn to partake of the open air dinner in honour of the first Cabinet Meeting to be held in the Gulf Islands. Over 150 people were at the Fulford Harbour dock to welcome the premier and eight of his cabinet ministers. It was the perfect sun-lit day for the cabinet to come to Salt Spring to hold the first cabinet meeting ever held in the Gulf Islands. With flags flying and music playing the cabinet was greeted by members of the Islands' organizations.

# Second vote on Pender school

A decision by the Gulf Islands School Board which quelled any chance for a publicly funded alternate school for Pender Island may be changed at the board's next meeting.

Trustee Mary Williamson, who had her motion for an alternate school defeated last month, told *Driftwood* that she plans to introduce a motion to rescind the board's earlier decision.

Williamson said she believed the board merely reacted to the letters of protest from Pender Islanders who opposed a tax hike which they thought would occur if another teacher was hired. Approximately 40 letters from concerned taxpayers reached school trustees before

they voted on the alternate school issue.

She also claimed that some of the people who wrote to the board recently told trustees that they wouldn't have sent their letters if they had been better informed.

Williamson said that the letters the board received did not represent 40 Pender Island families. "Some husbands and wives wrote separately, others sent in more than one copy of their letter, but all

the letters were counted," Williamson charged.

She added that the board made a "very unwise" decision, and shouldn't have been influenced by the protesters. "If the trustees consider the factual administrative information concerning Pender School which is presently in their possession then the alternate school may have a chance of winning a vote at the next meeting."

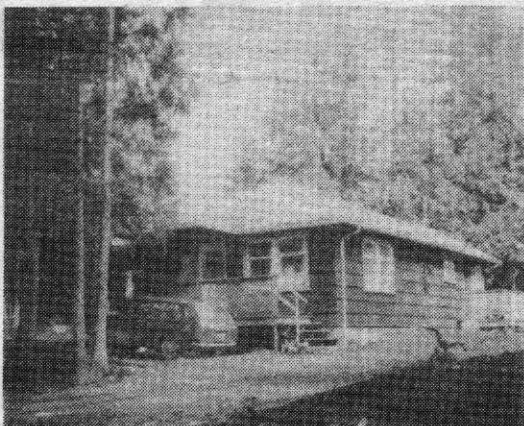

The accountant is also the information officer for the Salt Spring Island Business Information Centre. He is prepared for anything and everybody. Although the service has been operating for several months, everybody didn't show up.

The centre has been established by Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce, under the sponsorship of the British Columbia Chamber of Commerce and the ministry of tourism and small business development.

It is intended for small business operators.

Every owner of a business and every person considering the establishment of a small business can gain information from the centre. There is a vast network of services available to the small businessman. These services range from advice on markets, through special loans from provincial and national sources and into courses on book-keeping and other matters of vital concern to the small operator.

**FUNNELLED**

The information service is the funnel through which information on all these services is available.

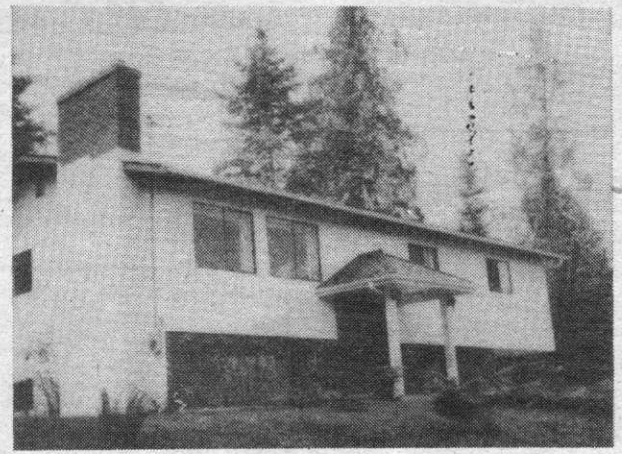

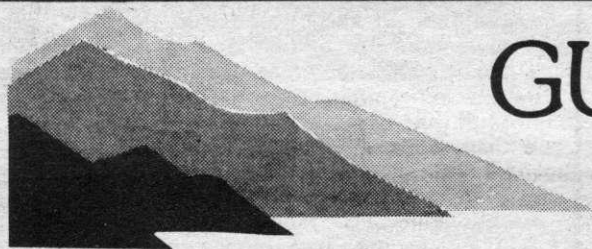

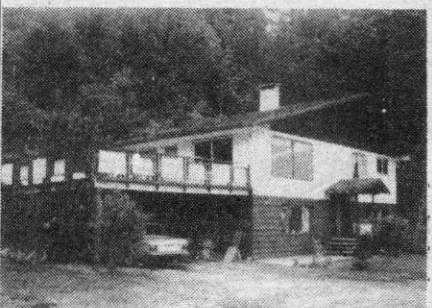

# Penders support Islands Trust proposals at series of meetings

On Saturday, July 5, a series of meetings were held in the Community School Centre, relating to Island Trust business on Pender Islands.

At 10 am a public hearing was held by the South Pender Island Trust Committee to review bylaw #4, which is the proposed South Pender Island Zoning Bylaw.

This was passed with amendments and is being forwarded to the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

The Subdivision Bylaw, number 5, was passed with amendments to be forwarded to the minister.

After the hearing the South Pender Island Trust Committee met to give second and third readings to the bylaws.

At the conclusion of the hearing, some discussion took place regard-

ing the Bedwell Harbour development, with regard to the new parking area which is above and behind the hotel, allowing minimal vehicle traffic down the 20 foot access road to the water front, it was felt.

**TO NORTH PENDER**

At 12 noon, in the same place, a public hearing was held by the North Pender Island Trust Committee to receive input into the re-zoning application for Thieves Bay.

Magic Lake Property Owners' Association is applying for an extension of approximately one acre of water lot from the Department of Lands, and re-zoning of the leased area to provide about 35 to 40 more boat moorages.

There was one dissenting vote. At 2 pm an open public meeting

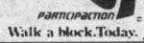
was held, which followed the two earlier meetings in the same place to receive input and discuss the Regional Plan for all the Islands in the Trust area.

At this meeting two written submissions were read; one from the Farmers' Institute by President Mrs. Helena Turner and one from Mrs. Eve Smith of South Pender.

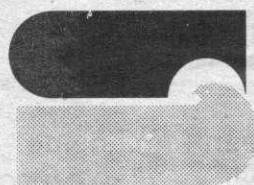

Whichever died first may be the cause of her water troubles

Waiting for the result of an X-ray is like waiting for the other shoe to drop. A time for taking stock. For deciding what is really important; for evaluating past failures or present successes.

The question of which came first, the chicken or the egg, is doubtless of interest only to biologists, anthropologists and some theologians, but its modern implications are staggering.

As you line up at the supermarket, await the bank teller's attentions, or "take a number" at the department store, do you feel they are there to serve you?

When the doctor (or lawyer or plumber) keeps you waiting long past the time of your appointment, do you reflect that you pay their fees or wages?

When your M.L.A. doesn't answer your letter, or responds rudely to your enquiries, do you remember that he represents your constituency?

When your local bureaucrat confounds you with bylaws and regulations, and tells you you're being impossible or irrational, do you wonder what happened to the concept of the Civil Service?

WHY SO FAR

When I travel to Victoria and sit among a dozen others waiting to undergo a diagnostic procedure, I catch myself thinking how lucky I am to have this service available. But why do I have to travel so far? Because the population of Salt Spring Island is too small to make such a service economically viable. So it's really a matter of money. It takes so many thousand people to allow an expensive laboratory to show a profit. Do they exist for our benefit, or do we pay their way?

A bank, a store, a professional office, a utility company, all these are in the business of serving people. But the exigencies of the modern economic system have shifted the emphasis, perverted the purpose.

People line up at a bank like devotees before an altar, waiting to make their offerings. And if those offerings fall short, the priest/bank manager not only chides them in a form letter, but he charges them for the chiding! So it's easy to forget that banks exist to serve you, as you rush anxiously to the counter to proffer your overdue contribution!

OTHER CONDITIONS

It's not just population which is necessary to draw professional services. Other conditions must be right too.

Otherwise why would there be whole countries short of doctors, for instance? India and parts of Africa would be swarming with medical men and women if it were just a question of "huddled masses".

Unfortunately these huddled masses don't have any money, and where there is no medical plan, the services they so badly need are not forthcoming.

One of the services they need is water, and we residents of North Salt Spring Island are beginning to have some appreciation of what it's like to live without clean or potable water.

I mentioned some weeks ago the expensive filter we had bought for our kitchen tap. Now we have to find a supplier of refill cartridges, hopefully nearer than Victoria.

STILL UNDRINKABLE

The water is still undrinkable, unfortunately, so now we've bought some plastic carriers, and

we fill them downtown or at friends who are lucky enough to enjoy Maxwell water. It's worth it! The bliss of being able to enjoy our tea and coffee once more! Of being able to clean our teeth in water that doesn't smell as though it was recycled out of the septic tank!

We plan to give up washing for

the duration, and when we become unbearable to ourselves and each other, we're going to camp out on the doorsteps of the directors of our local water board.

After all, we keep telling ourselves, they are in business to supply us with decent water, aren't they? Or are they just charging us for a commodity we cannot use, in order to pay their current expenses, whatever they may be? Do we exist for them, or they for us?

She saw big rat but no other resident complained

Four-year-old Mira Burden had an unexpected playmate last week. While she was enjoying herself on the swings at the Community Centre in Ganges a large rat appeared frolicking in the grass nearby.

Mira called her father who soon arrived and dispelled the rodent. Later he told his wife Wendy that he had seen two "cat-sized" rats lying dead beside the road as he drove from the village to the Community Centre.

She said that she had previously seen rats running across the road in front of the RCMP station. The incident at the playground upset her so she contacted the Community Health Office in Ganges.

THE ONLY ONE

According to the health officer Tom Houston, Mrs. Burden has been the only resident on Salt Spring to complain about rats.

Although many people have mentioned that they have rats on their property, he said, no one has ever filled out a complaint form.

The policy of the Capital Regional District is that they cannot do anything but investigate complaints and offer advice to persons with rat problems.

Don Wakelyn, the director of public health inspection for the regional district, said that he is not aware of a rat problem on Salt Spring Island. He added that the district has no funds available to

control rats.

CALL FOR ACTION

But, according to Wakelyn, if enough people in the community voiced their complaints the regional district would assist in controlling rat population.

Wakelyn suggested that people who are concerned about rats could phone the local health office and leave their name and telephone number or personally fill out a complaint form which is available in the local office.

# Gambier Island mine

## Seen as challenge to principle of island protection

Many supporters of the Islands Trust and the philosophy behind its inception have banded together with conservationists from other parts of the province to express concern at the prospect of mining on Gambier Island.

The very expensive survey of Gambier by a mining company has aroused fears near to hand, and on many other islands, that industry may be permitted to override the principle of preserving and protecting the islands.

When he addressed a Vancouver meeting a few weeks ago, Dr. Andrew Thompson recalled the history of the proposed open-pit mine on the Howe Sound island. He also urged that the Islands Trust should be consulted before any development is contemplated in the islands.

The Trust still holds this view. The government is still waiting for detailed reports of the project.

The mining company is steadily pursuing its investigations in accordance with its license.

More than a year ago the Gambier Island Trust Committee approved a resolution calling on the then-environment minister Rafe Mair to act under the appropriate statutes to prevent the development of an open-pit mine on Gambier Island.

### MINISTER NOT AWARE

Two months later Mair replied, stating he was unaware of any plans to develop such a mine.

The minister did note that a permit had been issued to undertake limited drilling at an old copper mine on the island.

In September, last year, the Islands Trust unanimously supported the Gambier Island committee in its opposition to the project. The resolution was sent to Premier Bill Bennett.

A public meeting on the subject drew an attendance of 300 people last October.

In November the environment and land use committee of the Cabinet reviewed the potential mine development and referred the matter for discussion by its own secretariat in co-operation with the ministry of energy, mines and petroleum resources.

Chairman of the Islands Trust wrote to the various ministers in December, January and February.

He argued that a mine would be a violation of the Islands Trust and therefore there was no call for investigation. He also called for a moratorium on further mining activities.

### GAINING SUPPORT

Local Trustees on Gambier, Elspeth Armstrong and Beverly Baxter were engaged in drumming up support from outside the island area.

Environment minister, Stephen Rogers, in April, informed the Islands Trust that there was sufficient information available on the mining development to make an objective assessment.

Report was made by Dr. Thompson to a public meeting in Vancouver on May 26, when he spoke on the public's commitment to the Islands Trust. Dr. Thompson outlined the long debate on mining.

Islands residents stood by the Islands Trust legislation. It was established to preserve and protect...the Trust area and its unique amenities and environment.

Gambier Island has been seen by many in the islands, and beyond the islands, as a test case for the Islands Trust. It has been debated in the cold light of law and in the heat of emotional protest. Both factions see the development as a test of the strength of Islands Trust legislation.

## Fined for failure to report

Colliding with a fence at Fernwood school and failing to report the accident cost a local logger \$111.

Daniel O'Donnell pleaded guilty to the charge in provincial court last week and was fined \$25. O'Donnell was also obliged to pay the school district for the necessary repairs.



## Fisheries to study catch of salmon for next 12 months

A 12-month study to determine the catch of coho and chinook salmon by sports fishermen in the Gulf of Georgia will be getting under way this summer.

The survey will be conducted by approximately 60 student surveyors, stationed at over 100 landing sites in the Gulf region. The nation-wide firm, DPA Consulting Limited, has been contracted by the ministry of fisheries and oceans to conduct the survey.

The results of the survey will determine catch per fishing boat, the proportion of boats fishing, and a measure of the proportion of fishing effort throughout the day, month and year.

The student surveyors are hired in the region where they are working and are paid with summer youth employment funds.

Surveyors will not be stationed in the Gulf Islands. Landing sites in Saanich Inlet, Sidney, Duncan and Victoria, as well as the Lower Mainland, will be monitored.

Fishermen will be asked and are expected to co-operate in the landing site interviews. Anglers will not be interrupted at sea.

Typical questions in the interviews are: What type of gear? Catch anything? Release anything?

Also noted are vessel characteristics, number of anglers per boat, species of fish caught. No personal

or vessel identification will be made.

### AIR SURVEY

Additionally, counts of craft actively fishing will be conducted using aircraft overflights.

This information will be combined with the catch per boat data and particular knowledge of the distribution of fishing effort occurring throughout the day.

The survey is expected to produce estimates of total fishing effort and total number of fish caught for a particular management area for a particular reference time period.

## Sewage doesn't cross road, agrees committee

Acting on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, Dr. A.S. Arneil, the Capital Regional District Community Health committee has rejected a proposal to allow sewage to cross a road.

The region allows the use of an adjacent lot for sewage disposal. A request had been received to allow the use of a lot across the street.

The problems of engineering were considered by Dr. Arneil to be a major stumbling block and he urged that the proposal be rejected.

It would require a perpetual easement and the depth of the line beneath the road would have to be such that the effluent would have to be pumped up to the disposal field. It could well lead to further applications, suggested the medical officer.

The present provision for discharging sewage onto an adjacent

lot is already a concession and an additional concession is not desirable, added the doctor.

## Charge may be levied

Charge may be made in the future for the rental of health units in the islands. The local representative of the health office will set the amount payable at his own discretion.
