## Down Through The Years With Driftwood

### FIVE YEARS AGO

Clinton Leo Helfrich was the first island baby of the new year. He arrived at Lady Minto Hospital on January 3, 1975, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Helfrich and grandson of Juanita Kaye, Ganges and of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Helfrich, Santa Barbara, Calif.

Bernard Stallybrass was warmly commended last week by Gulf Islands School Board for his work at Galiano school, where he is custodian. His work had been carried out with a "scrupulous concern" reported Trustee Clare McAllister.

Police search for a streaker in the snow on Wednesday at Beaver Point revealed that the man seen naked on the road was intoxicated and not a victim of heart attack as had been feared. He was seen by Mrs. Lillian Horsdal and Mrs. George Lampier. Tracking dogs and helicopter were used in the search.

New trustees of Gulf Islands School District were sworn in at the first meeting of the year last week. They were Sheila Fraser and Ann Foerster, of Salt Spring Island; Clare McAllister, of Galiano and Don Fairweather, of Pender.

The annual bird count at Pender in December identified 65 species and about 4,500 individual birds. Land birds were numerous, but a total of some 200 robins were listed in comparison with 1,600 in 1970. Number of varied thrushes was down this year.

Waterfowl showing a low count this bird census were Western Grebes, Brandt's cormorants, Scaup Ducks and Glaucous-winged Gulls. The unusual Rhinoceros Auklets were seen off Thievs' Cove by Allan Brooks. No rare birds were reported. The highest bird count recorded in the annual Christmas bird count was marked up in 1970 with a figure of over 7,000. Taking part in the count this winter were Mary Roddick, Marjorie Baily, Daphne Stevens, Marjorie Russell, Gai and Bob Dill and Betty and Allan Brooks.

### TEN YEARS AGO

First islands baby of 1970 was Edward Glen Coutts, who arrived at Lady Minto Hospital on January 13. He is the son of Ron and Diane Coutts, of Crofton and grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Pat Kyler, of Ganges. His aunt, Denise Kyler, was first islands baby of 1960.

Final appeal against a permit to discharge treated sewage into Trincomali Channel has failed. The provincial cabinet has voted in favour of the permit already issued by the Pollution Control Board.

Gulf Islands Joint Council has called for a longer fire closing each summer than prevails on the mainland. Chairman Vern Roddick asked the council for its endorsement of the plea originated by the South Pender Community Club. It was agreed that the islands are drier than the mainland, on which the length of the fire season is based.

A new number has been added to Salt Spring Island telephones. Fulford subscribers will be called by the prefix, 653. New portable telephone exchange will be set up at St. Mary's Anglican Church ready to come into service in June.

Surplus of \$800 was reported from the 1964 budget of \$29,700.

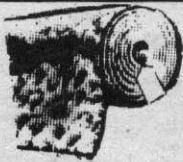

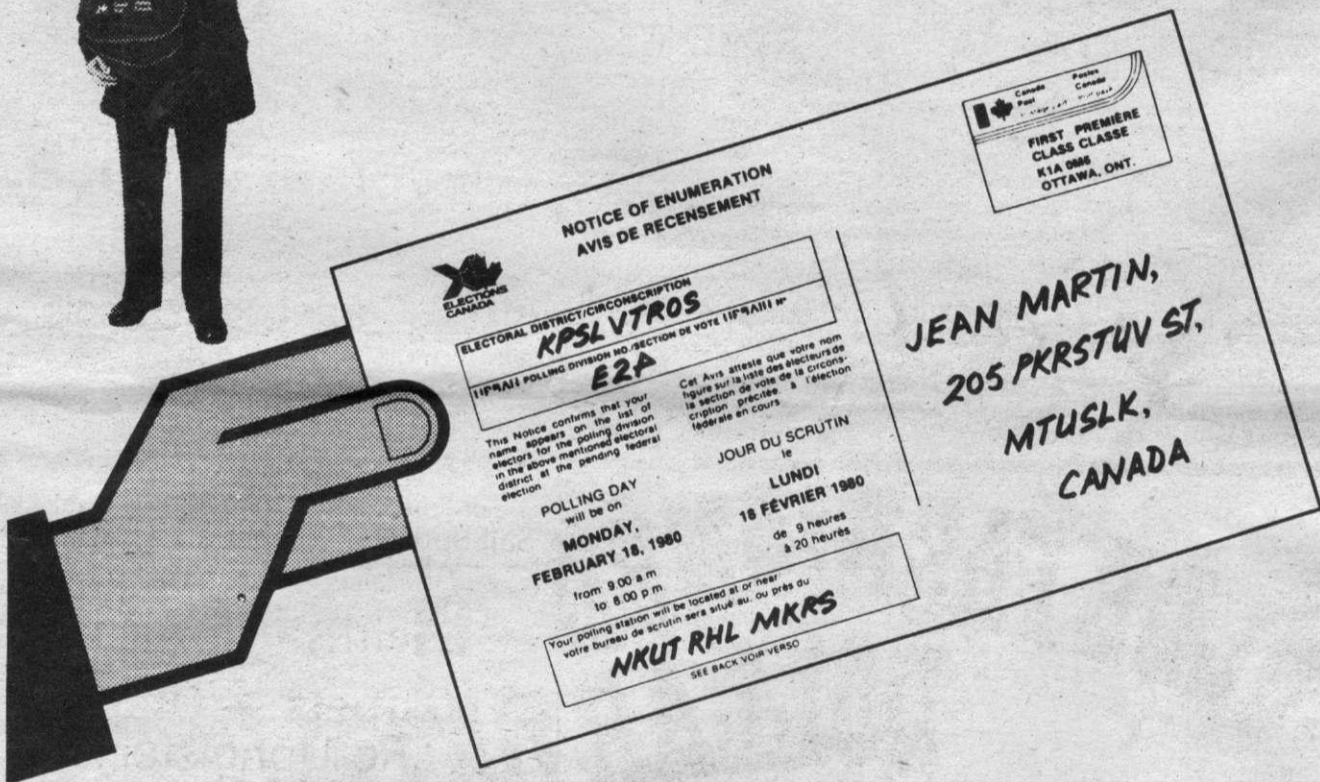

# His cartoons appear in five dailies and 20 weeklies across Canada and the U.S.

His name is known by thousands of people across Canada who follow his comments each week. His work appears in newspapers and magazines across Canada and the United States, including five dailies and 20 weekly papers.

Adrian Raeside is perhaps the youngest of Canada's political cartoonists and has already, at the age of 22, sold thousands of his cartoons.

Last week the reclusive cartoonist took time off from his drawing board to give an interview for his

home-town newspaper.

Although he spent a good part of his life growing up in New Zealand for the last seven years he has lived on Salt Spring Island.

I spoke to him very briefly on the phone before setting out for Wildwood Crescent, where the Raeside

family dwells in a modest-sized house.

### TO THE STUDIO

His brother Nick greeted me at the door and then led me around the back of the house to the studio.

I was thinking that it was odd that he was walking barefoot, especially in the snow, but suddenly a subject of even greater wonder appeared: the studio.

It was no larger than an outdoor john. I had expected something out

of the ordinary but not nearly so small.

There were also signs, bearing forbidding messages, nailed to the alder trees alongside the path-way which led to his john-sized shelter.

Feeling a bit unnatural I went up to the door, knocked, waited for an answer, then entered. By this time my safety devices had kicked in: pulse rate slowing down, breathing more evenly; I was prepared.

### DRAWING A STRIP

Inside I was greeted by Raeside who was drawing a *Captain Starship* comic strip for the *Toronto Star*. He told me that the editorial department had just phoned him and asked for the strip as soon as possible.

That meant any one of a number of planes leaving Vancouver that day would be carrying *Captain Starship* on his way to the kiddies' page in the *Star*.

*Captain Starship* is one of two syndicated adventure cartoons. The other, entitled *Benedict and Arnold*, will soon be syndicated in the U.S.

The next question was whether he had many visitors. Smiling broadly, he pushed a tall stool forward as I attempted to close the door without injuring myself.

"Only one or two a year," he replied. I nodded.

By this time I was seated and was able to check out the surroundings.

### COVERED THE WALLS

There were the expected cartoon cut-outs, or PMT's, covering every inch of the door and the walls; a 3X3 drawing desk, shelves, filing cabinet and a small electric heater on the floor.

Raeside, looking relaxed and as if he was enjoying every moment of the interview, watched and waited for another question.

"Uh, where do you get your ideas from?" I asked.

He replied, "I subscribe to every newspaper and magazine I can get my hands on. Besides that, I file ideas in the back of my head and hope they come out when I need them. Many of my ideas occur while doing routine things or by observing other people. Actually, the ideas come from everywhere."

### WORKING ON A BOOK

As well as sending off nearly 40 political, adventure and gag cartoons each week, Raeside is working on an illustrated book entitled *1,001 Things To Do With A Coathanger*.

"Besides the obvious use that we can't mention," he added.

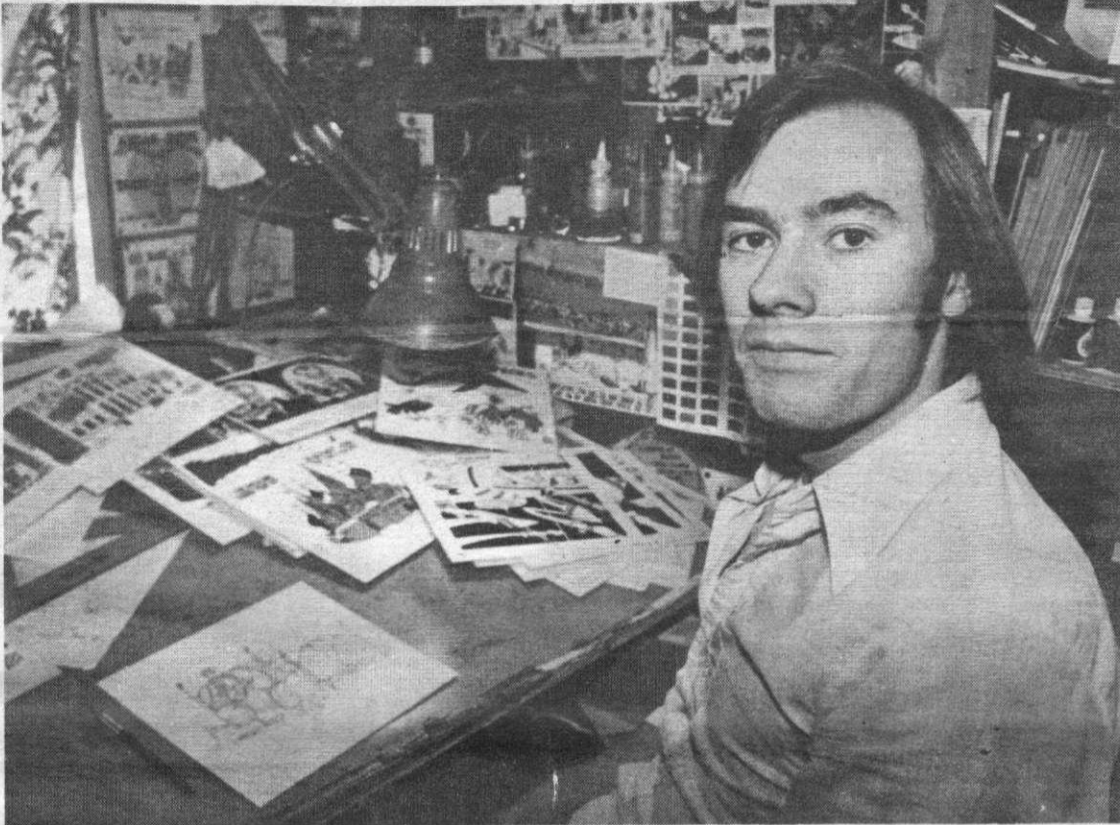
Also, there are the animal characters for the animated film that he must finish. "I usually work 12-14 hours a day all week and sometimes I get up at 6 am and work through until 6 am the next day," he remarked.

The pressure comes from dealing with newspapers. He said that he often receives urgent telephone calls from the daily papers in Montreal, Toronto, Calgary and Victoria requesting a cartoon on a specific subject. These orders, he explained, cannot be set aside otherwise the subject of the cartoon will be out-of-date.

### AROUND THE CLOCK

"So I'll work around the clock, if necessary, to get them out."

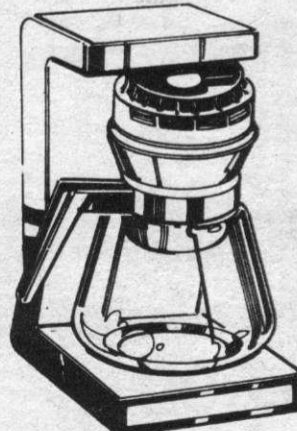
Raeside's drawing talents first began to surface seven or eight years ago when he was riding school buses and writing on the backs of the seats.

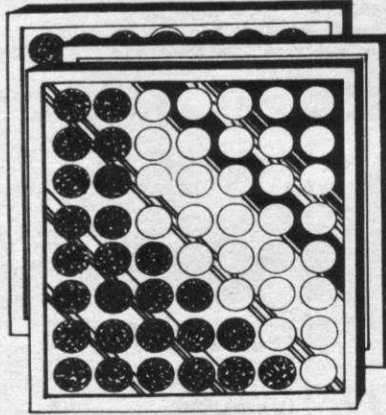

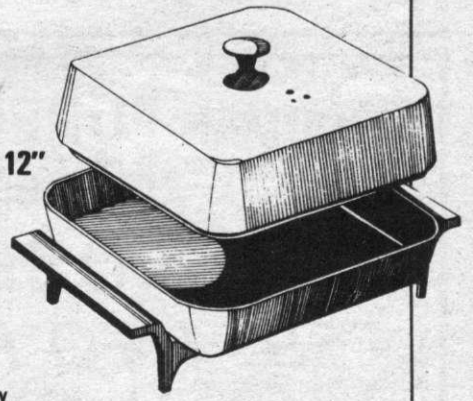

### CHILDREN'S BOOKS

Besides working for the newspapers Raeside has also illustrated a series of children's books, *The Good Knight* series, which was written by his mother, Joan Raeside.

I was preparing to launch another attack from my arsenal of questions when suddenly an irritating beeping sound came out of the wall behind me.

Before I could turn my head, Raeside's hand darted out and pushed the button on an intercom which I hadn't noticed.

It was his mother. Lunch was ready if he wanted it, she said.

What about the interview, I asked myself. Raeside leaned over to the intercom, "I'll skip it today, I had a big breakfast."

### FILM TECHNOLOGY

He continued. "I graduated from high school in Ganges and then studied film technology at Confederation College in Thunder Bay."

He smiled, evidently a joke was bubbling to the surface. "Constipation College," he said, twisting the word confederation.

That gave me another idea. How do you come by the captions for your political cartoons, I asked.

"That's the most difficult part. Drawing a sketch takes only a few minutes. It takes longer to put together the right caption. The shorter the captions are, the better. The best cartoon is the one that doesn't need a caption: the drawing says it all, and it's understandable to everyone."

### SEVEN STAGES

Each cartoon that he produces goes through seven stages before it is complete. The first stage is a rough sketch, which he said can be drawn on just about anything. The next step is the same rough sketch on a proper drawing board, followed by a defined sketch showing the details.

Everything is still being done in pencil, so he inks in the details then adds shading or colour. The sixth stage is the copy of the original which is made with a special process camera. The final step, the easiest, is drying the print and sending it off to its destination.

## Ramp for disabled is planned

### BUSIEST DAY

Sunday, he said, is his busiest day of the week. All the cartoons must be delivered to the proper places. Not content to rely on the vagaries of the postal system, he sends his creations around the country by special delivery.

"Everything east of B.C. is handled by a syndicate in Toronto, but there are 20 or more weeklies in this province which I handle

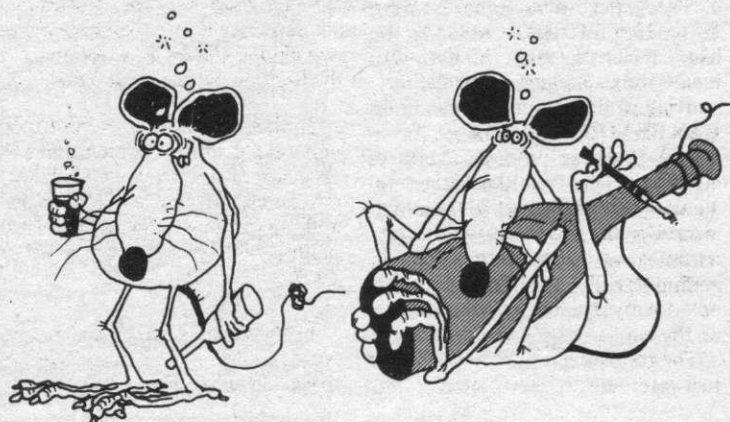
myself."

He joined me on the way up to the house.

"How about coming along for a beer some evening," I suggested.

It was a pleasant surprise when he eagerly accepted the offer.

# No more permits to be issued by regional district until February 6

"It is a fact, Mr. Chairman, that director Valcourt is a principal of companies owning a very significant percentage of the total commercial and industrial space in the Ganges plan area. It is also a fact that the Valcourt buildings are suffering a serious vacancy problem and that at least two of their present tenants are in the process of moving to the McPhillips Avenue building located in the core area and mentioned earlier in this letter."

Saanich alderman John Mika said that it was no secret that Toynbee and Valcourt were principals in competing commercial establishments.

"Toynbee's accusations against Valcourt," he said, "were simply a case of the pot calling the kettle black."

## NO CONFLICT

Saanich mayor Mel Couvelier said that as a mayor he had heard many conflict of interest cases and it was his opinion there was no conflict of interest in Valcourt's motion.

Valcourt told *Driftwood* that the reason the Valcourt Centre was on a holding tank was that a health inspector advised against a septic field which, Valcourt said, was already designed and awaiting installation.

She added that it wasn't until after the holding tank had been installed that she read the regional health officer's report on the health hazards of holding tanks.

Meanwhile, Valcourt has arranged a meeting with Municipal Affairs Minister Bill Vander Zalm to discuss the sewer petition circulated in Ganges in 1978.

A second Valcourt motion, calling for a halt to further expenditures on the proposed sewer system for Ganges, was also approved.

CRD engineers had been on Salt Spring during the first week in January. It was reported that they were inspecting properties in Ganges that would be served by the sewer system.

Valcourt said that until a decision is made to go ahead with the sewer, no further monies should be spent on the proposal.

on revising the preliminary lists for this election, according to the chief electoral officer, Jean-Marc Hamel.

"Although the preliminary lists we are using are only six months old, we expect to make revisions to 12 to 13% of the names on the lists," Hamel said. "This will result from changes of residence, marriages, deaths and so on."

## CAN BE VOUCHERED FOR

The revising process in rural areas will run from January 7 to January 30, inclusive. However, in a rural polling division, if a voter's name is not on the voters' list on polling day, he can still be "vouched" for by a voter whose name is on the list.

The returning officer will explain to a voter how to have a name of an

eligible elector added to the voters' list, or have a name deleted or corrected.

Revision will be done by an appointee of the returning officer.

At the time an elector completes his application to be placed on the revised list, he will be informed of the location of his polling place.

To be eligible to vote in the general election, a person must be 18 years of age or over by polling day, must be a Canadian citizen and an ordinary resident of the polling division on December 31, 1979.

In the last federal election there were 15,156,252 names on the official list of voters.

## Policy requested

The confidentiality of a student's records was discussed at last Thursday's school board meeting at Ganges.

District superintendent Bob Huestis was asked by the board to draft a policy that would determine what information a school principal may give to inquiring prospective employers.

The trustees were told that employers frequently call on school principals to supply information regarding a student's performance, achievement, attitude and behavior.

Huestis said he favoured a policy whereby a student's record would not be divulged without written permission from the student.

The trustees decided that they wanted to look at all the various types of records used in the school: psychological, medical and otherwise.

# Recyclables: where do they go?

need to be washed but all others should be clean). And please do not dump straight garbage at the shed (light bulbs, aerosol cans, any plastic and junk).

Derrick King pointed out that the cost to the authorities is \$24 per ton for recycling wastes, in comparison with a cost in excess of \$50 per ton to take garbage to the dump.

You would think, therefore, that the authorities would order people to recycle. The reason that they do not is that the householder must do more work (separating tins, bottles, newspaper, magazines; washing and flattening tins; composting vegetable garbage) and the old habit of dumping everything sloppily into a garbage can is deeply ingrained. However, the number of enlightened recyclers grows larger every year.

### GAINING SUPPORT

A recent *Vancouver Sun* article points out that the lack of new garbage dump sites, the rising cost of raw materials and climbing energy prices are leading governments to support the recycling movement.

T. Jones, information officer with the provincial government's waste management branch, said recycling will be a major thrust of the ministry in the years to come.

The sentence has the vagueness of a government promise, and in the meantime the Salt Spring Island Recycle Depot can use your help. We need at least 12 volunteers each month (at the present time the volunteers rarely serve more than once each year).

If you want to give a few hours, please phone the Community Centre (537-9212). The volume of recycling continues to mount and we badly need a larger shed, which means fund-raising.

## About 350 subscriptions are due this month

It's time again for *Driftwood's* annual plea to subscribers whose subscriptions become due in January.

Circulation manager Catherine McFadyen says there are about 350 bills to be mailed out this month. That figure could be reduced considerably, she says, if readers would remit the payment for their subscription within the next week.

Underneath the name and address on a subscriber's paper is the name of a month followed by a series of numbers. If the name of the month reads Jan. and the last number is a zero, it means that either the reader's subscription is due or the chemical eradicator which was supposed to have deleted the zero didn't work.

"So if your paper reads Jan. 2-1-0 and you paid your subscription dues recently, ignore this plea," says Mrs. McFadyen.

However, if it seems like it's been a year since you paid, then it's probably due now, she added.

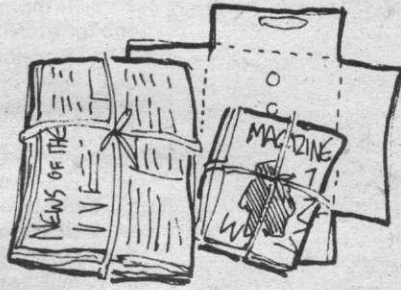

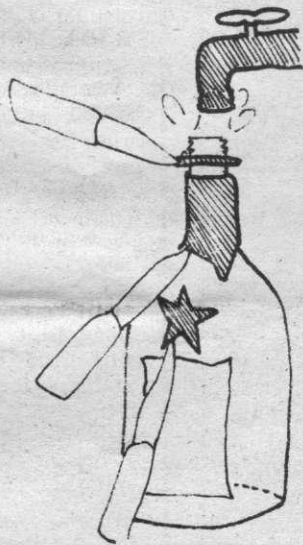

# Charges dropped due to insufficient evidence

Two of four charges, including impaired driving, were dropped in provincial court last week.

Crown counsel Rich Law blamed the police for providing insufficient evidence as reason for dismissing the charges against Dal Seymour of Ganges.

A third charge, driving without insurance, was dismissed by Judge D.K. McAdam. Defense attorney Nick Lott requested the judge to do so because of the wording of the charge.

Crown counsel said later that the wording will likely be changed and Seymour may once again face the court on the charge of driving without insurance.

However, Seymour was found guilty on a fourth charge of driving a motor vehicle while his license was suspended. He was fined \$75 on the charge.

All four charges arose from an incident on the night of August 31 when police checked a 1959 Prefect on Kanaka Road in Ganges.

The vehicle had no license plates and the temporary, 9 am to 9 pm permit had expired.

Seymour, who was behind the wheel of the car, was taken to the RCMP office.

Constable Mike Thompson told the court he had smelled liquor on the breath of the accused.

**NATURE NOTES**

Oli Garner reports finding a considerable number of golf balls and even a few tennis balls on property he is developing between Bluff Road and Active Pass. This is over two miles, as the crow flies, from the golf course.

Oli has observed that the area is frequented by ravens, and his hypothesis is that these birds might be mistaking the balls for eggs which are a favourite item of their diet. Another possibility is that these birds are kleptomaniacs like their close relations, the jack-daws, are in Europe. Just possibly, the ravens are dropping hints, for this area would make a spectacular golf course.

Further to the confirmed sighting of the cattle egret reported last month, John Rodgers in *Shore Birds and Predators* notes that the first sighting of the bird in this area was at Sooke in November 1973.

It is remarkable that this is an Old World species which first crossed the South Atlantic to South America. In the 1940's it was observed in Florida and since that time has managed to spread across the continent, although its sightings west of the Cascades are still rare.

# How to get a new community hall

As so often happens in a small community there were, at the time of the incident to be recounted, too few willing workers to fill all the leadership positions in the various clubs and societies on the island. The result was that several people were required to wear more than one hat.

It so happened that the principal of the school was both president of the Community Club and chairman of the board of directors of the volunteer fire department. This formidable spinster was a feminist, firm in her convictions and forceful in her language with a vocabulary appropriate to her profession.

One of this lady's idee fixes was that the Community Hall was decrepit, inadequate for its function and that it should be replaced. In pressing this point of view to a community, many of whose members had helped to put up, the structure over 50 years ago and who regarded it as a heritage building, she was often heard to remark that the best thing that could happen to the hall would be that it would burn down.

**'BIG MAC'**

The Fire Chief at that time was a retired professional fire-fighter who also doubled as island plumber. In deference to his physique he was known as "Big Mac".

He was definitely not a feminist and was often heard to declare that he was thinking of trading in his wife for a newer model as she was getting old and cranky. This was really the last thing he would have done as a more devoted couple, despite their banter, you could not hope to find.

One winter Sunday morning, a day scheduled for practise for the volunteer firemen, the lady chairman decided to provide a surprise for the Fire Chief and his crew. She had acquired some war-surplus fire bombs from a friend at the naval base at Esquimalt. A cursory reading of the instructions informed her how to set off the activator.

Using her key to let herself into the Community Hall she placed the bombs in strategic places. Phoning one of the fire captains she took him into her confidence and revealed her plan.

**TO ALLAY SUSPICION**

He was to phone in the alarm to add authenticity and to ally the suspicion the chief might have felt if the fire had been reported by a well-known female voice. The plan was put into operation, the canisters began to emit smoke and the conspiring captain raised the alarm.

When the call came into the Fire Hall at 1009 hours the chief was barely into his stride expounding the virtues of fog or broken stream

nozzle work, and had yet to reveal the details of the exercise the volunteers were to perform at that practice.

The chief was immediately suspicious of a call timed to interrupt his fortnightly dissertation. However, he knew his duty so the crew was ordered to man the pumper and proceed immediately to the Community Hall as if this had been the planned objective of the exercise.

**LESS THAN THREE MINUTES**

In less than three minutes from receiving the call, emergency vehicles drew up in the parking lot of the hall.

Smoke was pouring from suspiciously-open windows and standing there with a stop-watch in her hand was the lady chairman. Even the most naive of firemen were able to deduce that this was not a real fire nor even an ordinary practice.

"Run out your booster lines," commanded the chief, and then to the panel-man, "Don't start pumping until I give the order."

The chief strode over to confront the chairman. His broad, six-foot frame in yellow fire-jacket surmounted by the white helmet of authority, towered over the chubby five-foot lady. She was not at all intimidated but both attempt to observe the proprieties and began their conversation in whispers.

**TURNED UP VOLUME**

Big Mac was not used to this sotto voce style of address so, without knowing, he turned the volume up to 50 decibels. The lady was soon responding in her play-

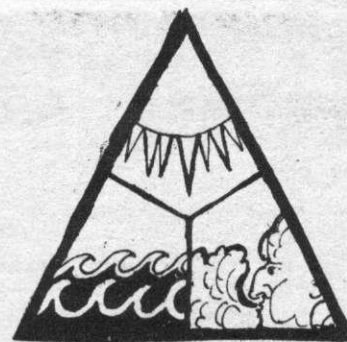
ground voice. The waiting firemen had nothing to do but enjoy the performance. They were entertained by the chief's opinion of the lady's personality and what he thought of her actions. The lady analyzed the chief's character and commented on his male chauvinism. As the exchanges proceeded more heat was generated, voices grew louder and the lady's vocabulary became less suitable for the ears of children.

**SMOKE INCREASED**

In the meantime, smoke pouring from the building increased in volume and some on-lookers thought it was tinged with flickers of red and orange. It transpired later that the lady had not read the fine print on the instructions on the canisters. She had not set them in buckets of wet sand but put them directly on the wooden floor.

At length the chief was so exasperated that he turned to his men and said, "Reel in the hoses. Return to the Fire Hall. She set the place on fire. Let it burn!"

And it did.

Now the refugee family from

Vietnam lives in a rented home on North End Road, Salt Spring Island, and Ysa has found employment at Harbour's End Marina in Ganges.

Coincidentally, the Mach family

came to Canada on the same plane as Salt Spring's other refugee family, the Lams.

Ysa was hired by Chuck Hankins of Harbour's End Marina after Hankins received a phone call from Victoria. Hankins said he was contacted by Dr. J. B. Warren of Victoria.

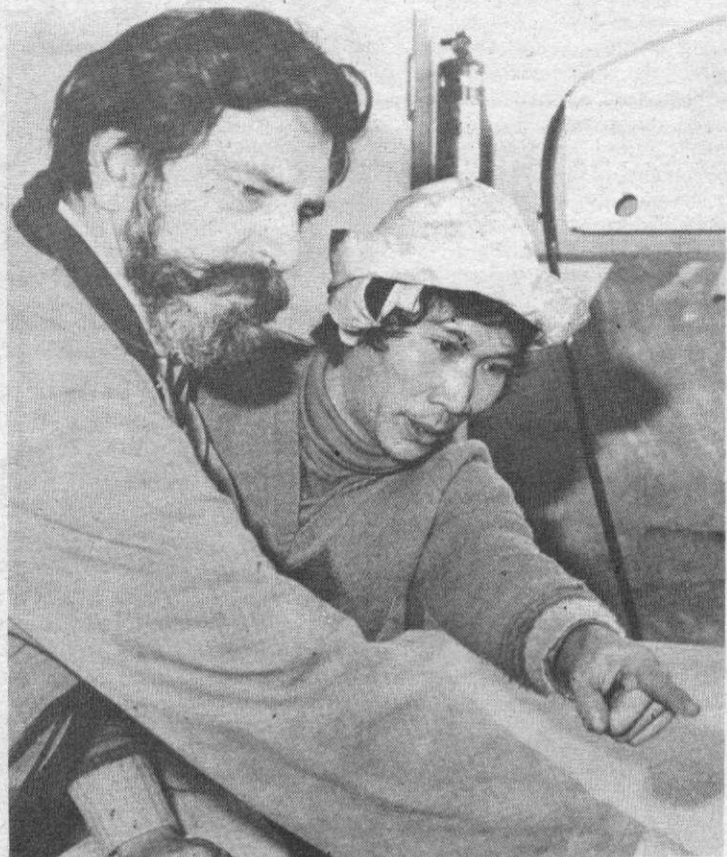
Warren was telephoning all the marinas in the greater Victoria area in an effort to find Ysa a job. In Vietnam the 28-year-old Cambodian had trained and worked as a marine mechanic.

Hankins seemed pleased with his new employee who, Hankins said, was able to do carpentry work as well as engine repairs.

Although Ysa had not spoken English before coming to Canada he has already learned enough to get by and had no trouble understanding and answering all the questions that were put to him.

He studied English four days a week for two months at Camosun College in Victoria, he said, and in Vietnam he had learned to speak French as well as the Malaysian language. At work he has a Khmer-English dictionary which is usually close at hand.

He said his parents are living in Cambodia, where he grew up. Vietnam had been his home for only five years before coming to Canada.

# Credit Union 'flooded' with calls about low-interest money

Salt Spring Credit Union manager Ray Bush said Monday he was "flooded" with inquiries following Premier Bennett's announcement of low-interest mortgage money.

Bush said that he hadn't heard the announcement and was taken by surprise the next morning when the phones began to ring.

So far, he said, his office has a list of 40 names, all of whom are hoping to obtain money for new home construction.

However, Bush said, the chances are slim that his bank will receive

enough money to serve more than 10 of the applicants.

He pointed out that one doesn't need to be a member of the Credit Union to qualify for the loan.

### FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE

He said the money will be handed out on a first-come, first-serve basis to those on the list who meet the usual requirements for a mortgage.

If a name on the list doesn't qualify then the next name will be considered, he added.

"Don't be discouraged by the

length of the list," he said. "It's possible that a lot of the people on it don't qualify."

Under the plan, B.C. lumber must be used in normal frame or modular construction. Bush said he did not know if this ruling included lumber milled by the owner of the house.

Here are the main elements of the program:

- Money will be made available for houses begun after January 15. To qualify, substantial construction must have begun by June 30, 1980, and the home occupied by December 31, 1980.

- Those eligible must have been residents of B.C. for two years or if they have returned to the province, must have lived in B.C. for a total of at least five years.

- The credit unions will provide closed mortgages for three years in the case of owner-occupied homes at 9% , compared with current one-year open mortgages at 14% . In the case of rental dwellings, rates would be 9% the first year, 10% the second year and 11% in the third year.

- The mortgage rates prevailing in the market would go into effect at expiry of the program in 3 1/2 years.

- The program deadline will not be extended and money will be paid out on a first-come, first-serve basis.

- A three-month penalty clause is built in to discourage premature payment in full.
