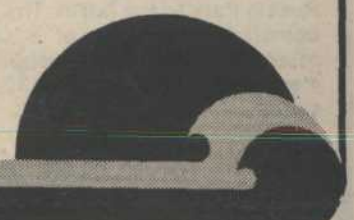

Island library prospers with help

Since the first day of its being the Salt Spring Island Library Association has never looked back. From a room in Mouat's Store to the present, augmented facility on its own land, the demands on the service have slowly expanded. Last week Finance Minister Hugh Curtis came to Salt Spring

Island to examine the facility he had helped to come about. As Islands MLA, Curtis had gained a number of grants for the institution. The Mary Hawkins Library on McPhillips Ave., is named in honour of the late Mary Hawkins, whose devotion to the cause of a

community library was in large part responsible for the beginning of the Salt Spring Island Library. The property on McPhillips Ave. proved too small when the province laid down certain basic requirements for community libraries. The Ganges structure failed to come up to that standard. It was faced with the threat of losing its grants unless it was augmented. The association acquired the property next door from Accountant Spencer Marr and moved the existing building against the library structure. An extension was then built on to the back of the building. Contractor was Walter Huser and Sons, Ltd..

DOUBLED IN SIZE

Almost twice its original size, the present building will serve the community for the next many years. In addition to government help the library association has raised funds from interest-free loans and donations. Many local organizations have sponsored fund-raising projects to help the library. The fund is within \$10,000 of the total cost, reports Don Kertland. Trustees are still working on the last \$10,000 and any help or suggestions from the community will be eagerly accepted, *Driftwood* was told.

Beth Hill to offer anthropology course

A 10 week class beginning with the origins of man and ending with an optional overnight trip to the Ozette dig on the Washington coast will be offered this fall through the continuing education department of Gulf Islands School District.

Local writer and anthropologist Beth Hill has arranged co-sponsorship through the heritage conservation branch of the provincial government to use more than 20

films and slides never shown locally in what will be an outstanding night school course.

A tour of the provincial museum with Hill as guide will be an interesting finale to the study of the geologic evolution of the high Arctic, the first Americans (as evidenced from the Duwamish dig and others), stone-age life (including a film on the Ozette dig), many aspects of northwest coast Indians, excavations at La Venta and other Central American origins of life and many more.

Additional details will appear in *Driftwood* as the fall slate of adult classes is made ready for publication, but telephone calls expressing interest are always welcome. Arranging the trip to Ozette will require much advance planning, so response is crucial. The film list is tentatively reserved, but actual booking will depend on response to this film/talk series.

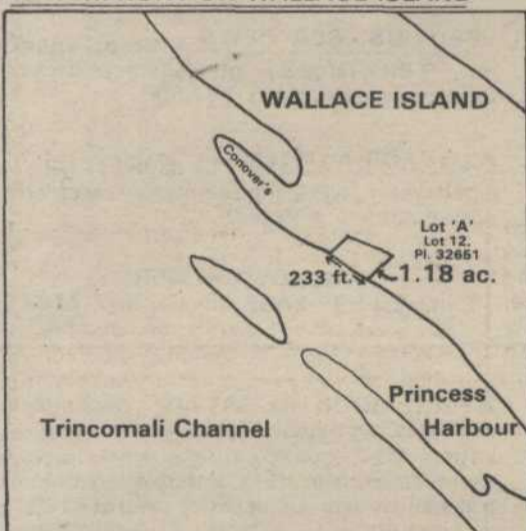

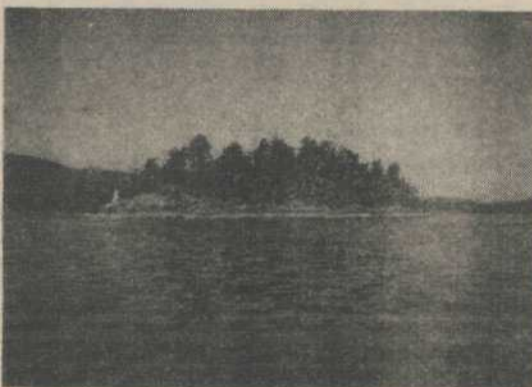

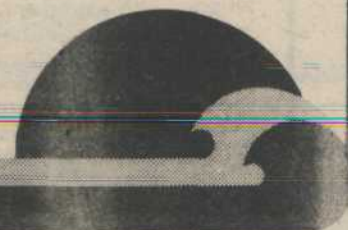

Power was sold down river; now to be sent down tube

Ottawa Report by JIM MANLY

At 12.28 am Wednesday, July 23, the House of Commons adjourned until October 15 - providing that Prime Minister Trudeau does not call it back earlier to deal with an oil pricing crisis.

The Liberals and Conservatives had wanted to adjourn the previous Friday but New Democrats had insisted on having a debate on the government's decision to go ahead with the "pre-build" section of the Alaska Natural Gas Pipeline.

Instead of starting to build the pipeline in Alaska and working down through Canada to the lower 48 states, we are now going to start the Alberta and British Columbia sections of the pipeline first. We will be using this pipeline to export Alberta gas from Canada rather than to transport Alaskan gas through Canada. New Democrats fear that this southern section

might be the only part that gets built.

For me it was a great privilege to be one of five NDP speakers in the debate. Following are some of my comments.

NO CONTRADICTION

"Some of the members opposite have raised the question of the NDP's position in British Columbia. They see a contradiction between our federal policy opposing increased sales of natural gas and the concern of New Democrat Party members in British Columbia that the pipeline will lock in the B.C. natural gas supply. There is no contradiction.

"We face the same situation with regard to our forest industry. We in the New Democratic Party believe that British Columbia must adopt a policy of more intensive processing of our forest resources. In the meantime, though, the forest industry depends upon the export market. When that market takes a downturn, our people

suffer. What we need is a phased-in policy of more intensive processing while we are phasing out export of raw or semi-processed products. It is the same with natural gas.

"We have to move away from dependence on the export of raw resources. But we have no intention of doing this in an arbitrary or unplanned manner. Our position is clear. Increased exports of natural gas from Canada - from Alberta - confirm Canada's position as a hinterland to the United States. We become more dependent upon the export of our non-renewable resources, but at the same time this places the economy of British Columbia in jeopardy by threatening to cut off our exports when the government has become so dependent upon them.

BETRAY THEIR INTERESTS

"Indian people of Alberta discover that proposals for the pre-build betray their interests. It provides no meaningful jobs for them, no training for skilled jobs as machinists or in heavy equipment.

At best, some Indians will get a couple of minor contracts, jobs clearing a few miles of right-of-way.

"Today we hear the government talking about the jobs involved in the pre-build. We want those jobs too, but we want all of the jobs in the total pipeline. We do not want the pre-build jobs at the expense of our children's future. We do not want them at the expense of future energy requirements, nor at the expense of future jobs that will depend upon those gas reserves. The lack of planning exhibited by the government poses a continual threat to the natural resources of Canada.

"Back in the sixties members of the New Democratic Party opposed the terms of the Columbia River Treaty with the United States. At that time we were shouted down by cries of cheap energy.

DOWN THE TUBE

"Today the people of British Columbia are paying through the nose for that sellout by Liberal,

Conservative and Social Credit governments. In the sixties we sold our power down the river; in the eighties we are sending it down the tube."

At the close of the debate the House held a recorded vote on the New Democrats' motion that the government not proceed with the "pre-build" until it had received financial guarantees for the whole pipeline and had arranged to receive future Alaskan gas in swap for present exports of Alberta gas.

Both the Liberals and Conservatives voted against this motion although many Conservatives, especially some from B.C., didn't show up for the vote. Rumour has it that some of them agreed with us but didn't want to break party ranks.

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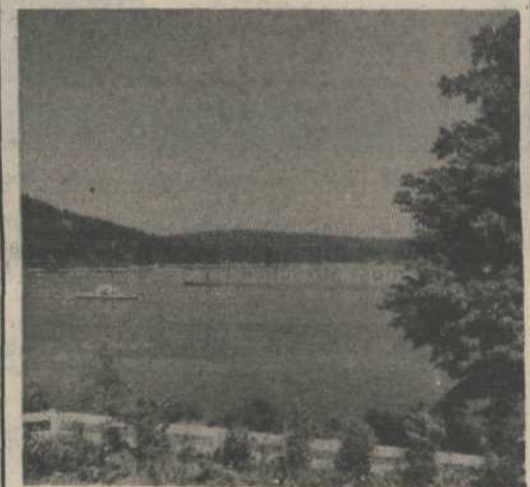

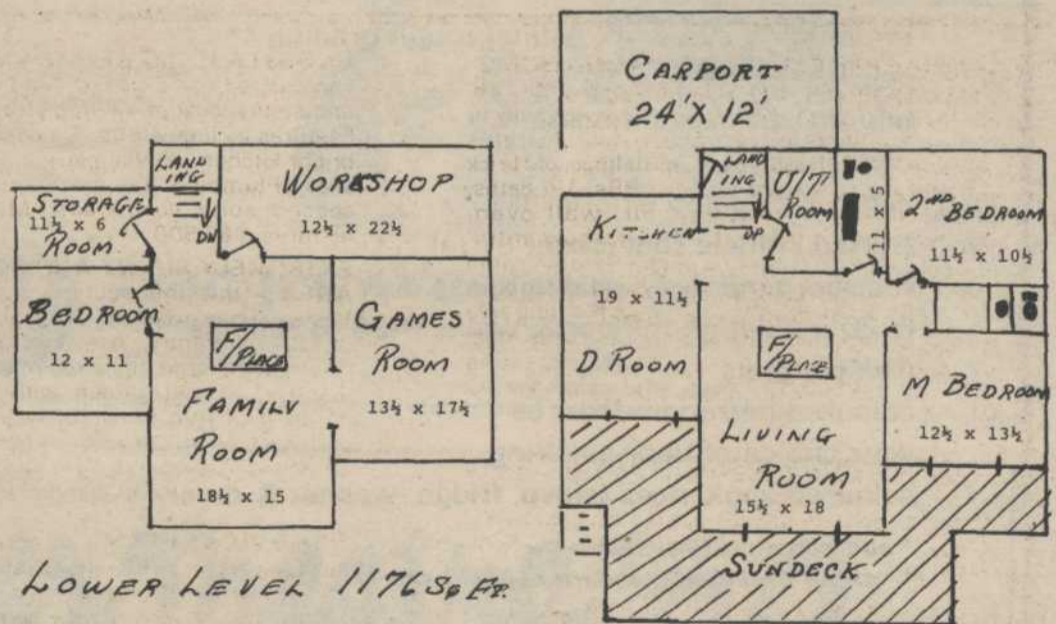

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Horrendous picture painted by current television serial

We've been watching the fascinating Channel 9 serial, *Lillie*.

However, it seemed natural for me to browse through the thick volume of *Letters Of Oscar Wilde* in our local library. I happened upon two from the Wilberforce collection in which Wilde paid tribute to one Elizabeth Robins, and stated his intention of contributing to a gift for the American actress.

Suddenly I was caught up in the continuum of history - all these years and thousands of miles away. Because I once saw Elizabeth Robins, and I knew her friend and companion, Dr. Octavia Wilberforce.

REST HOME

Many years ago Miss Robins endowed a small rest home in Sussex. "Backsettown" was for professional women who needed medical attention, provided by Dr. Wilberforce; country surroundings, provided by the Sussex Downs, and good food and care, provided by a devoted staff.

It accommodated only nine guests, and as I was very poor, I was charged only a nominal fee.

More Food for Thought

Dr. Wilberforce gave evidence on my behalf when I later divorced my first husband, and it was when I visited her in Brighton that I caught a glimpse of the little old lady who had many years before introduced Ibsen to the London stage; who had followed and found her ailing brother in the Klondike when he was lost in the Gold Rush of 1898, and who had written several shocking novels about the White Slave Trade!

So although Oscar Wilde lived in another century and another world, I knew someone who knew someone whom he admired! This is what makes history live, and ideally how it should be taught - through letters and the life experience of those who went before us.

TO BE BROKEN?

What of those who are to follow? Is the continuum about to be broken?

My Expatriate American Friend tells me she's changed her mind about Ronald Reagan. When he first emerged as a contender for the presidency, she was aghast. Nobody could take *him* seriously... could they? Then she began to get worried, and a few months ago she was in despair.

"You do know it's the end of everything if he gets in?" she told me. Now, while we were discussing the inhumanity of large corporations, and the general state of lunacy prevailing in high and not-so-high places, she declared she believes Reagan is meant to be the next and last president of the United States, as we don't deserve to continue to pollute the earth. And he epitomizes the craziness of those who may well precipitate the end of the world.

The only hope she can see, my American friend, is that the multi-nationals won't let him! But can they stop him? Can anyone stop the U. S. president from giving the fatal signal?

Another friend was catching up on local political news in *Driftwood*. "It's just like Washington," she said, "Or the U.N." On a smaller scale, but when something vitally affects our daily lives, it's hardly a consolation to call it small scale!

We were treated to the Central Saturday Night Circus again, in spite of the fact there was no midnight movie. Two cars and a truck disgorged their occupants outside Central Hall just before midnight, and the screaming, yelling and obscene language had us all poised to call the cops!

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New provincial party Mayne Island prepares for Fall Fair

Two Salt Spring Island residents are the founding members of a new political party in B.C., *Driftwood* learned this week.

Weather report

No records set in July

July finally brought us out of the weather doldrums, when a relatively high ridge of high pressure built up on Vancouver Island. Prior to that time we had been governed by a low pressure area out to sea. Although there was not very much rain, it at least averaged almost every third day, and gave a higher than usual July total.

Despite the rainfall and cloudy skies in much of the month, there was a considerable amount of sunshine, sufficient to get in most of the hay in quite good condition, and to bring out the garden flowers.

No record temperatures were set. The highest recorded at this station was 29° c. with the low reading of 10° c. As I have mentioned before, being in a narrow valley does give a rather higher high.

The averages for the month were: mean maximum, 23° c.; mean minimum, 12.6° c.; mean for the month, 17.8° c. As a result of clear and sunny days for the last 12 days of the month there was a considerable drying out of the land.

Throughout the month the humidity was relatively high, while the barometer remained low, even after the high pressure ridge built up.
