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GALIANO

Week of little news but not a quiet one

A week of little news: a fire at the dump, an ambulance call-out. But not a quiet week.

As W.H. Auden wrote, "August for the people for their favourite islands. Daily the steamers side up to meet/The effusive welcome of the pier."

Translating from English into Canadian by substituting ferry for steamer and wharf for pier, we have an accurate picture of this month on Galiano. The effusive welcome, however, is restricted to the invited visitor greeted by friends on the dock.

Many islanders consider it their responsibility, albeit at times a chore, to share their good fortune in living on Galiano by having a steady stream of visitors during the summer. But as August advances under blazing skies they begin to look forward to the post-Labour Day return of peace and privacy.

CLASSICAL GUITAR CONCERT

Paul Banks, classical guitarist and relative of one of the oldest Galiano families, the Scoones, returned to Galiano for a third time on Saturday to delight an attentive audience at the Community Hall.

The soloist's informal introduction of each item contributed to the audience's enjoyment of his reper-

toire. Not surprisingly, there was considerable emphasis on Spanish composers with examples of the work of several lesser known ones.

To some this music has an almost alien sound with its strong rhythms and gypsy or Arabic themes. It seems to come more naturally, with passion and flamboyance, from the guitar of a Segovia. The quieter passages showed the technique and tone of the guitarist to more advantage.

WATERCOLOUR COURSE

The Galiano Artists Guild is sponsoring a course in watercolour painting to be taught by teacher and artist Ken Hardy on Galiano, twice weekly throughout September on Friday afternoons and Monday mornings.

The course will begin on September 5 and end on the 27th. The instruction will be geared to the needs of the beginner as well as the more experienced painter. Interested islanders may sign up for the course on the notice board at the Corner Store or phone 9-2405 for further information.

FIRST AID COURSE

Peter Dunn, the ambulance service co-ordinator, announces that an industrial first aid course will be given on Galiano commencing September 13.

The course will run for five weekends and instruction will be given on Saturdays and Sundays from 9 am until 3 pm. Although this course is part of the continuing training of Galiano's ambulance drivers and attendants, it is open to the public and will consist of the standard course available throughout the province.

The cost to a non-sponsored student will be about \$130. Although the emphasis will be on treating accidents likely to be met with on the job, CPR (cardio-pulmonary resuscitation) will be dealt with in detail. Successful completion of the course will entitle the student to the B.C. industrial first aid certificate.

SATURDAY PROMENADE

The third Saturday of each month is a particularly good one for bargain hunters to take the air between 2 and 4 pm. This Saturday, Aug. 16, the Women's Auxiliary to the South Galiano Fire Department will open the Fire Hall for their monthly Book Sale.

Additional bargains may be secured by visiting the Church Thrift Shop on Burrill Road.

One's idea of bliss on a warm summer day may be a good book and a garden chair, but already the hours of daylight are too brief for all the tasks that need to be done in the garden.

This week the gardener's sense of urgency may be heightened not only by the picking, weeding and watering he has to do but also by the imminence of the Harvest and Flower Show. Catalogues for this popular event, to be held on Saturday, Aug. 30, may be obtained from the senior citizen's show committee, Jean Tully or Frank Greenhalgh.

NATURE NOTES

Flocks of Bonaparte's gulls have spent the last few weeks on the shore and in the adjacent bays and channels around Galiano. Most of the birds are immature as indicated by the black band across the tail. Even the adult birds are beginning to lose the black which changes to white in winter, although the black spot behind the eye is retained.

These birds are small and neat, little over a foot in length, float lightly on the water and fly lightly and easily. In many ways they resemble terns but have no forked tail, nor do they have the facility to dive into the water from flight.

The unusual name does have a connection with the French Emperor Napoleon. The gull is named after Charles Bonaparte, a noted American ornithologist and nephew of Napoleon Bonaparte.

ROAD RESURFACING

Last week over 6000 tonnes of 3/4 inch crushed gravel were delivered to the Department of Highways Yard on Galiano. The gravel was barged to Sturdies Bay, from where it was conveyed to the yard on Georgeson Bay Road by a herd of angry trucks making three trips an hour for ten hours. This week the gravel is due to be spread on oil to resurface about three kilometers of Porlier Pass Drive between Galiano Way and Hookstone Farm and also on a kilometer

of Georgeson Bay Road near its junction with Morgan and Bluff Road.

Hookstone Farm was named by the Frasers because Ken's wife Muriel grew up on Hookstone Farm in Devonshire, England. Originally the farm was a 'Soldier's Settlement' developed by one of the Cook brothers, Nick. Since then it has been owned in turn by Steve Riddell, the Barners and Ken and Mo Fraser. Recently it was divided in two and the northern part with the old homestead sold to Fred and Isobel Stevens. The southern portions, now owned by Larry and Susan Frennd has been renamed 'Midway Farm'.

The third annual Galiano Tennis Tournament will take place on Saturday between 8.30 am and 6 pm.

Finals will be played on the court at Galiano Lodge.

Anyone interested in the work should apply directly to Susan Powell.

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
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He owned Sturdies Bay

Couple recall islands after 60 years

In July, 1920, an island veteran married his English bride in the church of St. Mary Magdalene on Mayne Island. The officiating clergyman was the late Canon Paddon.

Last week Mr. and Mrs. R.H. Cousens came back to the islands to take a new look at their old haunts.

The family have known three of the islands.

In 1912, Cousens was the owner of a large property on Galiano Island. Site of the present government wharf on Sturdies Bay was his before the First World War, recalled the 85-year-old last week. He owned the property round to Whalers Bay. At that time he was recently arrived from his native London.

But there wasn't much doing on Galiano for the young Englishman and he moved to Mayne Island where his uncle, Dalton Hill, operated a store.

OFF TO WAR

He was living on Mayne when the war broke out and off he went to enlist. In no time he was serving overseas. That was when he met Doris Mart. Doris was living in North Wales, although she was from England. They met during the war and when the war veteran returned to his new home in Canada, he was followed by Miss Mart, to be married on Mayne Island.

"Everybody knew Dalton Hill," he recalls. The store was forgotten when he took up land under the soldiers' settlement scheme. It is not forgotten now: it is the Mayne Island Trading.

In the early years of the business it was located on the corner, opposite Mrs. Naylor's. Cousens didn't recognize the name, Spring-water Lodge. It was Mrs. Naylor's, he explained. He remembers the new building being built by his uncle, further up the road. His home and property were in the



vicinity of the Mayne Island Gaol, opposite the Agricultural Hall.

Mr. and Mrs. R.H. Cousens are seen at the office of Driftwood last week on a return to the islands after many years' absence.

The couple took their two children to Cortez Island during the hard times and lived out the depression there, with lots to eat and very little more. They were hard times, they remember very clearly.

TO SALT SPRING

In the 1940's they came to Salt Spring Island and operated a farm which had previously been the property of a Japanese-Canadian family and was confiscated during the panic months early in the war.

They lived on Rainbow Road opposite the gravel pit, which is new, and built a house they named Park Haven. The elderly veteran also worked with Vic Bettiss in those days.

"Everybody knew Vic," he assured a reporter who hadn't been around to know him.

After 60 years of marriage, the couple had celebrated in their Courtenay home. Their proudest

memento was a message from Queen Elizabeth II, congratulating them.

Island life is memories today. Remembering the school as it was and still is; remembering Vic Bettiss as the man-of-all-work as well as a plumber; remembering names and remembering that a man named "Kain" built the Mayne Church there and remembering him as a highly skilled cabinet-maker.

Kain made a dining table, said the visitor and it was constructed of small diamonds of wood.

Every piece was perfectly cut, he remembers and so perfectly fitted that a man could not get his finger nail between any two pieces, despite the thousands of segments, shaped and fitted.

And it was journey to forgotten names and forgotten places. After all, 68 years is a long journey through the islands for a couple who have lived in so many different places.

Sewer uncertainty reflected in consideration of proposal

Proposal to change the zoning of a Ganges property was turned down by the Salt Spring Island Advisory Planning Commission last week.

Jonathan Yardley asked for the change on behalf of a client.

"If we had a clear understanding of what was happening to the sewer we would know what to do with it," said planner Dean Strong-itharm.

"If we could get the community plan up to date, it could go ahead," proposed Mary Williamson.

Warning of developing away from established water services was sounded by Bud Kreissl.

"We may have to spend a million dollars on a treatment plant," he told the commission. He was speaking as trustee of the

North Salt Spring Waterworks District. "We don't want to lay new lines."

Money should be spent on water lines and not on a sewer, said Williamson.

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Cuban, Vietnamese refugees get publicity: Africans face death

Cardinal Newman, in a lecture on Anglican difficulties, said:

"She (the Catholic Church) holds that it were better for sun and moon to drop from heaven, for the earth to fail, and for all the many millions who are upon it to die of starvation in extremest agony, as far as temporal affliction goes, than that one soul, I will not say, should be lost, but should commit one wilful untruth...or steal one poor farthing without excuse."

I find this a hard saying, especially when reading about the starving millions in African. I can't understand the media uproar about the boat people and so little publicity about the refugees from Ethiopia, Uganda and Eritrea. We had a daily tally of Cuban refugees entering the affluent United States, but what of the 1 1/2 million who have flooded into poor Somalia? Conservative estimates say a million people face famine in Ethiopia, and another million refugees have reached the Sudan from northern Uganda.

NO RESPONSE

Brian Jeffries says in *Maclean's*: "So far there has been no internationally co-ordinated response to Africa's pleas for help, such as that which greeted the tragedy of the Vietnamese Boat People and Cambodia's refugees."

The chief UN official in Kenya estimates the region needs another 1.2 million tons of grain, but Jeffries concludes: Even if African nations are able to rapidly and dramatically overhaul their agricul-

tural systems. millions will die because they will be unable to find enough to eat before the impact is felt."

The church does its part by burying or burning the dead, and a nun in Northern Uganda says transport and medical facilities could have saved the local population. more people died in two months than in the previous 20 years!

It was with amazement that I read Dr. Walter Block, senior economist of the prestigious Fraser Institute. As an admirer of the early trade union movement in England, I have great difficulty coming to terms with modern unionism, and for a Christian socialist that's an embarrassing confession. Dr. Block has no such problem:

FOOLED PUBLIC

"Unions have long been perceived as a force for the general good. But this is all wrong. Actually, unions are a government-supported cartel, organized to suit their own personal selfish ends. They ought to be seen clearly for what they really are - a special-interest group that has managed to fool the public into thinking that they serve all workers."

In granting unions their monopoly over jobs, "We're asking that they act responsibly. I would say let them act irresponsibly, but take away their stranglehold over the job market. Why should they act nice? It's human nature to protect your turf."

"What we've got to do is what Adam Smith said, funnel and channel people's natural inclinations towards greed and self-seeking (which is a very healthy human endeavour) but channel it correctly. Say, toward consumer satisfaction."

He maintains you have a right to divorce your boss and quit in unison if you're unsatisfied, but you have no right to prevent other people taking the wages and work conditions you have rejected.

HERESY

Mike Tytherleigh concludes his *Province* report by saying: This is heresy in terms of today's society.. After all, this is democracy. Everyone is allowed to have his say, isn't he?"

Unfortunately many people believe democracy means rule by the majority. They forget the important role played by the opposition in any democratic government. If it were not so, we would be ruled by referendum.

Adam Smith also said:

"To found a great empire for the sole purpose of raising up a people of customers, may at first sight appear a project fit only for a nation of shopkeepers. It is, however, a project altogether unfit for a nation of shopkeepers; but extremely fit for a nation that is governed by shopkeepers."

NOT ONLY A NATION

Two hundred years later, Adam Smith would see not only a nation, but a world, governed by shopkeepers. And much of the merchandise being sold would fill him with horror as it does all right-thinking people.

Professor of religion Martin E. Marty quotes Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German theologian and paci-

fist, "To be simple is to fix one's eye solely on the simple truth of God at a time when all concepts are being confused, distorted and turned upside down. It is to be single-hearted." **

We should keep this in mind when we read about "Right to Work", "Law and Order", "Free Enterprise" and "Right to Life". We have to make sure that words mean what they say, not what we want them to mean, in this Alice in Wonderland world, where the faster you run, the more you stay in the same place!

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Resort on farmland will be taxed as commercial

Islands Trust had left the question of alternative use of farmland to the Agricultural Land Commission, the Advisory Planning Commission was reminded last week. Under question was the former Hastings property at the head of Ganges Harbour.

The commission was asked to approve a liquor application for the resort planned on the property.

The Land Commission approved the use of the land for a resort, provided that the productive soil

remained so.

The application was accepted, but the commission looked at other features.

What provision exists for sewage disposal, asked regional director Yvette Valcourt. A septic tank system will handle it, she was told.

And what taxes would be levelled, she enquired. It is farmland being used for commercial purposes. The assessor had reported that it will be taxed as commercial property, she was assured.

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Down Through the Years With Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

Ganges sewer committee last week recommended further investigation into the Coulthard plan for high-temperature sewage treatment in conjunction with a coal filter for effluent. A number of committee members explained that they were planning to continue their studies into alternative treatment systems. Members of the committee are Donna Watt, Maureen Bendick, Henry Elder, Norman Mouat, Spencer Marr, Mike Larmour, Lou Yellowless, Charles Baltzer, George Heinekey, Tom Toynbee, Frank Richards, Charles Horel, Lionel Coulthard, Ted Baker, Beth Hill, James Raeside and Bob Makaroff.

Mayne Fair will mark its 50th birthday this year. The history of the fair was written by Walter Hunt-Sowrey, who served for 20 years as secretary of the annual function. There will be 529 classes in the fair this year.

Maliview Drive on Salt Spring Island is spelt in that manner, reports Ellen Byron. It was named by Mrs. Byron in token of the last two syllables of the name, Trincomali.

There was beer in Ganges on Friday. Street was crowded with traffic and a steady flow of pedestrians each carrying two cases. It was, however, a flash in the pan. By Monday the liquor store was decorated with signs, "No beer". Breweries are on strike.

Jim Clarke was searching for his lost boat at North Galiano on Sunday when he found a baby seal which had been abandoned by its mother. He returned home and called the Vancouver Aquarium. He was warned not to give the animal any milk. Clarke took the seal to the aquarium, where the staff reported that it had not eaten for four days. The 16 lb. baby has been named Splash and will be on display this year.

St. Mary Lake water has been under attack these past two weeks as the result of deteriorating colour and taste. North Salt Spring Waterworks District reports that the condition is due to excessive algae in the water and that every effort is being made to correct it.

TEN YEARS AGO

First fatal accident sustained by B.C. Ferries in its 10-year history took the lives of three passengers on Sunday when the *Queen of Victoria* was cut almost through by Russian freighter, *Sergey Yesenin*, in the southern entrance to Active Pass. The collision cut a deep gash half-way through the ferry vessel, smashing deck facilities, plates and cars. Islanders set out in every type of craft to stand by in case of further damage. They were not needed. For two hours the two vessels were locked together and drifted out of the pass. Last serious accident to a ferry, causing serious loss of life, occurred in 1911 when the *Iroquois* went down after capsizing off Sidney.

See in Driftwood, reports Papa-john, that our regional board is going to have a law whereby we will have to have a permit for any type of gathering in our hall. Was just wonderin' if our Padre is going to have a permit to hold his Sunday morning services in Saturna's St. Christopher's Church. Or seein' as St. Christopher is not an "official" saint any more, we might just be lawed into calling it plain "Christopher's" now!

Minister of municipal affairs, Dan Dampbell, has announced the handing over of responsibility for planning in the islands to the

Capital Regional District. The minister is still interested in the islands. *Driftwood* was told this week, but all control now lies with the regional district. Question of planning the islands is to be discussed by the regional board later this month, reports regional director Marc Holmes. MLA for the islands, John Tisdalle, was blunt in his summary of planning the islands. There's enough land to keep the subdividers busy for years, he told *Driftwood*.

Mary Backlund of Galiano, president of the Vancouver Island Chapter of the Canadian Women's Press Club, has been given special mention for her story in *Driftwood* last year of the laying of the submarine cable by the vessel, *Marcel Bayard*. First prize went to Margaret Weiers for her story in the *Toronto Star* of women who break the law. Contest is nationwide and is open to all women who are engaged in writing.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Lieutenant-Governor of British Columbia, George Pearkes, VC, opened the Salt Spring Island Anglican Parish Fete at Harbour House on Wednesday. Convener of the fete was Mrs. George Laundry. Corsages were presented to Mrs. G.H. Holmes, Mrs. G.B. Young, Mrs. P. Beech, Mrs. J. Byron and Mrs. H.A. Robinson in token of their many years of working for the parish.

The family of the late Vic Bettis requested no flowers at the funeral. Harold Hoffman reports that a memorial fund has been set up as a result of the number of donations already received in his name.

Pleasure yacht operated by Richard Nelson of New Westminster struck a rock near Mayne Island on Friday. Nelson and Irving Miller, of Vancouver, were rescued by the tug, *Swiftsure VI*. The boat was towed to a harbour and beached. Search and rescue operations on the coast, including Salt Spring Island's search and rescue squad under the direction of Capt. V.C. Best, were kept busy last week. Jim Hedgecock, in the *Bluestreak II*, towed in a boat stranded at the entrance to Ganges Harbour, suffering engine trouble.

Car ran off the Golf Course Road on Galiano on Saturday. The car sustained damage estimated at \$100, but driver Charles Johnson escaped unhurt.

Meeting has been called at the Legion Hall in Ganges on Friday evening for a discussion of the sewer question. Residents of the area from the school dormitory to Murakami's on Rainbow Road and out to the Humphreys subdivision and the Lady Minto Hospital are urged to attend to receive the feasibility report carried out by the department of health.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

Petition for bankruptcy by the Alsam Manufacturing Co. Ltd. has been granted. Company owns the shale plant at Welbury Bay on Salt Spring Island.

In 1950 the net value of land and improvements in the Gulf Islands School District was \$2,781,870 and the mill rate for the school district was 9.64. In 1960 the net taxable value of land and improvements in the school district is \$8,550,524 and the mill rate is 15.15. In other words, the value of land and improvements has increased by something over 300% and the mill rate has risen by 63% to represent a 450% increase in school district revenues in 10 years. Money collected to run the schools 10 years ago was \$26,817 for one year. This year it is \$129,540, an increase of about 450%.

Salt Spring Island Sailing Club is losing out to fast traffic.

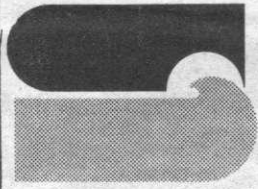

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Hardy strains of African violet rewarding for inexperienced

There is this little African violet sitting on our windowsill with about 30 blossoms which it started to produce about three months ago, and it is still growing strong.

A friend gave it to us because of its name, "Dianne", the same as my wife's. Well, it dropped its flowers, the original ones it came with from the grower, and refused to make new ones. It then made the rounds of the usual places for flowers around our house, without any change in its blossomless condition.

Since it is a namesake of my wife, I was determined to make it bloom. First of all to check the rootball. Healthy roots should be white with lots of soil between them.

Since these were brown and there rather a lot of them, a slightly larger pot was called for. No more than one inch in diameter larger, otherwise the little Saintpaulia will make lots of root growth at the expense of buds and flowers.

Then new soil as well, since we were going to repot anyway. African violets like a light, airy, moist soil. So one third peatmoss for water retention, one third vermiculite for aeration and one third potting soil for the soil component with its minerals and drainage factors.

PROPER LIGHTING NEEDED

Next, but really the most important factor for growing violets after all the others have been provided, is proper lighting. By far the best is an east-facing windowsill. It will get strong direct morning light and bright indirect light for the remainder of the day.

A west-facing window would be second best with due care that the plant will not be exposed to the heat that can be generated behind the glass, especially during these hot summer days.

A lightly curtained south-facing window providing bright indirect light would be acceptable as well. Ours now sits in an east-facing window and just loves it there. In the winter the African violet should go into a south-facing window due to the shorter days and lower light intensity during that time. Also the extra heat behind the uncurtained south window in winter will benefit the plant.

And that brings us to watering. Saintpaulias need to be kept evenly moist. Water lightly and often and avoid water on their leaves, as this will cause brown spots. I poke the spout of the watering can between the leaves and wet the soil only.

Pots set in a pebble tray with water will do well, especially with the increase in humidity provided by the pebble tray.

WAIT A MONTH

And now to fertilizing. First of all, do not fertilize a freshly transplanted plant. Any fertilizer is useless to a plant until its roots are established in the soil. So wait a month and then use a fertilizer with a high phosphorus content.

Saintpaulias have been bred to flower almost continuously, which requires high phosphorus fertilizer. The special African violet fertilizer is 9-44-14.

But I just remembered that I have not fertilized our African violet since I replanted it! And it is doing well, very well indeed. Well, so much for fertilizing.

The native habitat of the Saintpaulia of the African forest. That's why it likes moist, porous soil, temperatures of 60-70° F. (16-21° C. indirect light with a humidity of around 50 per cent, relative that is.

Farming and gardening

Present breeding efforts are directed towards a true red flowering Saintpaulia, also towards very hardy strains of which the "Optima", "Ballet" and "Rhapsodie" series are good examples. Others are trailing and miniature African violets, the latter fitting comfortably into a teacup, and of course, ever new combinations of colours in the fantasy series.

NAMED AFTER STATES

The "Optima" series have been named after most of the states of the U.S. ("Alabama", "Colorado", etc.) with broad ruffled flowers and large, plain green

leaves. Then there are the "Optima" compact series named after American cities like Boston and San Francisco. These have leaves with a lighter green centre and scalloped edges. A new low temperature tolerant "Optima" strain is being named after Canadian provinces like Alberta and Ontario.

The "Ballet" and "Rhapsodie" series all feature the above words in their names, e.g. "Rhapsodie Mars" or "Ballet Dolly"

All these are very hardy African violets, which will be easier to take care of, and more rewarding for the inexperienced owner.

In some ways flowers are almost like children. They respond well to love and care. One feeds them, shelters them and buys larger pots as they outgrow them. One nurses them through sickness and accidents, and is proud of a healthy, blooming, well-grown plant.

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons who deem their interest in property affected by the following proposed By-laws will be afforded an opportunity to be heard on the matters contained therein at a Public Hearing to be held in the Agricultural Hall, Mayne Island on SATURDAY, August 23, 1980, commencing at 9:00 am.

1. Proposed By-law No. 15 for Mayne Island is a By-law to amend the "Official Community Plan (Mayne Island) By-law, 1978", by deleting the Mayne Island Community Plan Map as described in Part 1, Section 1.1 and replacing therewith a new Map identified as, "The Mayne Island Official Community Plan Map, 1980"; and which is attached to the proposed By-law.

2. Proposed Zoning By-law No. 14 for Mayne Island is a By-law to regulate the use of land, buildings and structures and regulate the height and siting of buildings and structures on Mayne Island. The regulatory provisions of this By-law have been drawn up to conform as closely as possible with the policies contained in the Official Community Plan for Mayne Island, adopted by Mayne Island Trust Committee By-law No. 2 in 1978. The By-law establishes both provisions of general applicability and provisions and regulations for each of the seventeen (17) zones established by the By-law.

In response to an application and in conformity with the Official Community Plan for Mayne Island, a portion of Lot 4, Plan 15263, Section 8, Mayne Island is proposed to be zoned Settlement Commercial (Limited) - C2L.

The 'General Provisions' section of the proposed By-law includes regulations and requirements for such items as the issuance of Development Permits; building setbacks from lakes, swamps, ponds and the sea; home occupations and off-street parking.

The zones may be summarized as follows:

SETTLEMENT RESIDENTIAL (SR) ZONE

Allows for land uses such as residential, Public Service, Parks, Agricultural, Home Occupations, and Residential guest accommodation of a parcel of land in this zone. One single family dwelling unit per .6 hectare is permitted in this zone.

RURAL (R) ZONE

Allows for land uses such as residential, Agricultural, Horticultural, Boarding and breeding of animals, Veterinarian hospitals, Riding stables, Ecological Reserves, Parks and Home Occupation on a parcel of land in this zone. In addition processing and sale of agricultural products and Residential guest accommodation use of a parcel is permitted. One single family dwelling unit per 4 hectares is permitted in this zone.

UPLAND (UP) ZONE

Allows for land uses such as residential, Agricultural, Riding stables, Ecological Reserves, Public Park, Public utility, Home Occupation, Residential guest accommodation, processing and sale of agricultural products on a parcel of land in this zone. One single family dwelling unit per ten hectares is permitted in this zone.

AGRICULTURAL (AG) ZONE

Recognizes Agricultural Land Reserve lands and allows for land uses such as those permitted in the Agricultural Land Commission Act. Except as otherwise permitted by the Provincial Agricultural Land Commission, one single dwelling unit per parcel is permitted.

COMMERCIAL ZONES (C-1, C-2, C2L, C-3, C-4, C-5)

Allows for a range of commercial services and retail uses of land in these zones. Except for the C-2L Zone, each zone permits a single family residential unit in conjunction with the commercial use, under specified conditions.

INDUSTRIAL (I) ZONE

Allows for land uses such as Light processing, manufacturing, assembly and repair, warehousing and storage on a parcel of land in this zone. One dwelling unit for the owner, manager, operator or employees is permitted.

PUBLIC SERVICE (PS) ZONE

Establishes a zone to provide for the development of public service facilities, public parks and public recreational facilities.

PRIVATE RECREATION (PR) ZONE

Establishes a zone to provide for the development of private recreational facilities.

WATER ZONES (W-1, W-2, W-3, W-4)

Regulate the use of water and foreshore areas. W-1 provides for the preservation of certain foreshore and water areas. W-2 permits non-commercial and non-industrial boat moorage. W-3 provides for foreshore oriented commercial facilities. W-4 provides for foreshore oriented industrial uses.

This By-law will not supersede the provisions of the Agricultural Land Commission Act and where land is classified as Agricultural Land Reserve, the provisions of the Agricultural Land Commission Act shall take precedence over the By-law.

Copies of the proposed By-law may be reviewed at the Post Office, Mayne Island, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday to Saturday inclusive. The proposed By-law may also be reviewed at the Islands Trust Office, 848 Courtney Street, Victoria, B.C., during normal working hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive.

that the definition is a legal one. The local trustee expressed concern at the challenge to the community plan.

"The purpose of a community plan is defined by the laws of the province," he reminded his colleagues, "We can't change the plan ad hoc: the law doesn't allow it."

When Kreissl urged that the same laws apply to everybody, he was challenged by Williamson. The ministry of highways is not subject to the same laws, she charged.

Gerry Bourdin sided with Williamson. There were ways of getting around regulation, he agreed.

David Lott suggested it is arguable whether the Stacey proposal comes within the plan. Commercial 4 zoning provides for up to 60 people per acre, replied Valcourt. The comparison represented a fallacious argument, said Lott.

COMPARISON

Comparison between C4 zoning and a high-density development was employed by Stacey in his analysis.

If all the salt water commercial 4 operations were converted to such residential development there would be available 106 acres, he stated. Omitting Maracaibo, which is dedicated to a plan of its own, there would be a potential of 213 new units, if all those operations

were switched. If all those whose geography or other limitations would prohibit development were omitted, it would leave 50 acres, or 100 units, continued the applicant. The Rainbow Beach plan allows for 60 of those units, so that only 40 more could be introduced.

Why should a commercial property be permitted such a measure and not an ordinary residential property, asked Lott.

It is zoning the property down, replied the Stacey, from higher to a lower category in terms of density of population.

Members looked warmly on the proposal.

It was a good proposal and a good location and did not add to downtown traffic, suggested Mary Williamson.

An ideal spot; supplying its own water and sewage disposal, added David Lott.

OMIT REFERENCE

If the reference to transient use were taken out of the definition of Commercial 4 zoning he could go ahead, submitted Stacey.

Planner Dean Strongtharm warned that the expressed views of chairman John Rich were that scattered developments represented a departure from the philosophy of the Islands Trust. They would also represent a departure from the community plan, he added.

On the motion of Yvette Valcourt and Mary Williamson, the commission resolved to recommend changes in the community plan to permit the Stacey Pacific development at Rainbow Beach on Booth Canal.

Commission then looked at the proposal for rezoning the Scott farm on Lower Ganges Road at Atkins Road for a similar senior citizens' development. Property is across Atkins from Foxglove, the

commission was told.

"If you allow a half-acre development there you will have to allow it all through the area," warned Kreissl.

Multiple family dwellings were not to be considered in the area until a sewer was installed, said the planner.

Chairman Gilbert proposed that the 350 units allowed for in Ganges under the community plan be "floated" and then the decision made as to where to allocate them.

David Lott's motion that the applicants be advised that the commission is not in favour of the proposal was adopted.

"If you are 75 and looked for somewhere to stay on the island, would you want to live in the core area or on the Scott farm?" asked chairman Gilbert, of Kreissl.

If people want to stay on the island, they want a rural surrounding and not to be surrounded by concrete, submitted the regional director.

People want to stay with people and they want to be close to stores and services, said Bud Kreissl. They want friends more than anything.

"When we are planning, we are planning for people," he warned.

Broken main

A broken main in the North Salt Spring Water District has been blamed for water shortages this week in the Southey Point area.

It was originally thought that demand was exceeding supply in the area, until the break was discovered Monday.
