About 800 people attended the event.

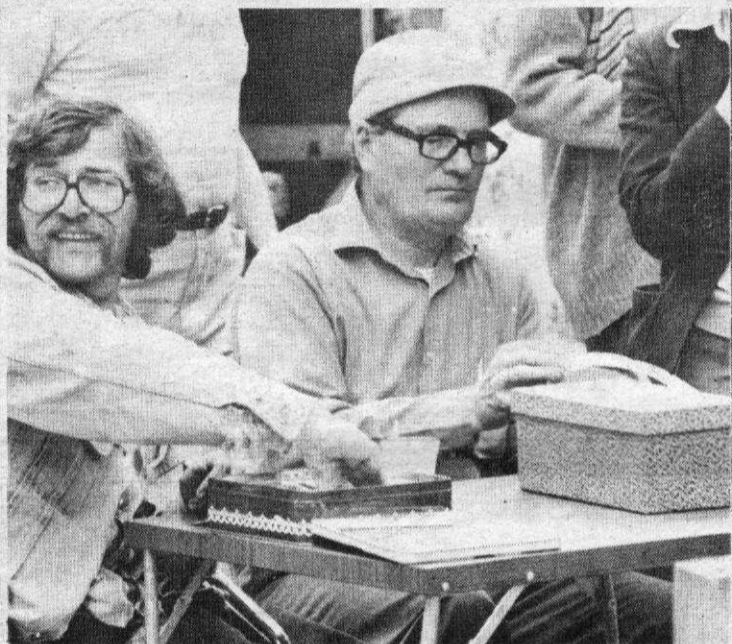
The floral exhibits this year were, by far, the best of the various divisions of the fair and the competition in this category was exceptionally keen.

The Fair is nothing new.

It is perhaps the longest running type of entertainment that we have. Fairs, of one type or another, date back to the early Middle Ages, and, in general, represent a concerted effort to bring before the public some special facet of our lives, or a type of production our mode of living brings forth.

Many of our oldest Fairs were founded to sell the horse, in those days a most important feature of life. The writer can remember the end of many of these horse fairs, as cheap gasoline, now rather expensive, replaced the oat as a motive power.

In course of time the country fair came into being and was well established by the late 1700's.

Even on this coast, so relatively new, the fair at our neighbour, Saanich, is well into its second century. It is five years since we passed our half century, although at that time 50 fairs had not been held, the fair being impracticable during the second war. Next year will see, we all hope, the fiftieth actual fair. Our first fair is still a living memory to a few, our oldest

inhabitants, whilst quite a number can recall all fairs since the war.

### GREATEST EFFORT

One must look on the Fall Fair as perhaps the island's greatest and most concerted effort. Any fair committee does a lot of work in the interval between successive Fairs, but committees can only put together the bare bones of a fair. The work of many of the entrants can also cover most of the time between fairs.

Flowers, fruit, vegetables do not grow overnight, and I am certain that many of the paintings, sewing and knitting entries must have been started about half an hour after our last fair ended, or they would still be incomplete. To all these people who give so much time and effort we give our thanks. But for their efforts the Fair would have languished years ago, and it is far easier to carry on than try to revive.

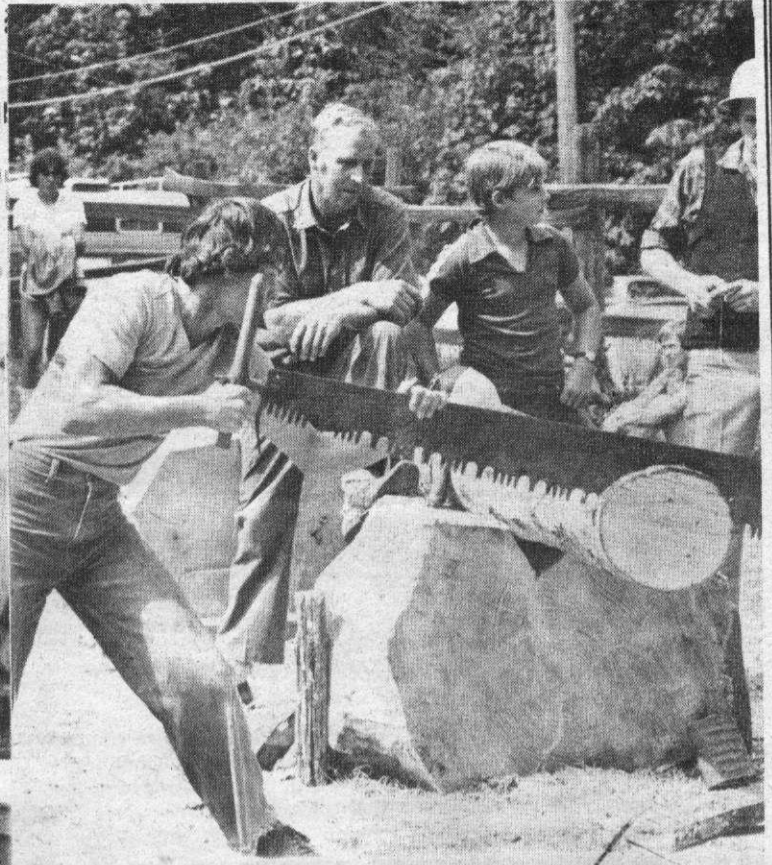

pleasing effect on the walls and tables of that old lady, our hall, now well into her eighties.

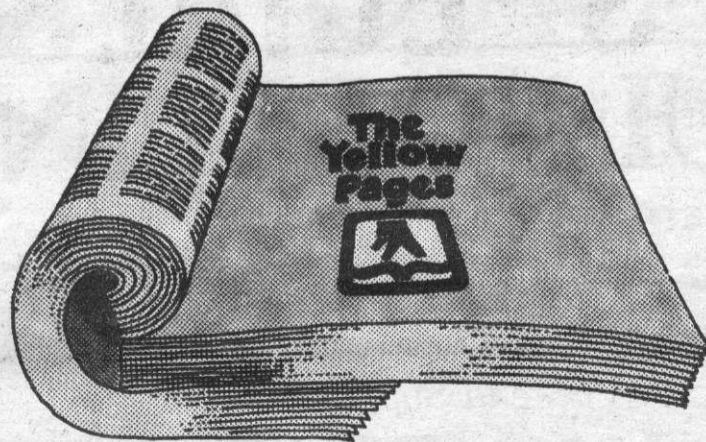

Reasons for veto

# Campbell's explanation of island differences

Capital Regional Board Chairman Jim Campbell returned for reconsideration the July 9 vote to exclude the islands from the transit service area of the Capital Regional District.

In his summary to the board, the chairman referred to the sequence which has seen islands in and out of the service area.

It was moved and seconded on January 23 that Salt Spring Island be excluded from the transit service area, he recalled.

This matter was tabled, lifted from the table and tabled again on February 13 and introduced as a new motion and withdrawn on April 23. At this time a motion to take no action was defeated on a tie vote.

The motion was dealt with by the board on June 11, when the directors voted to exclude the islands. Due to an error of interpre-

tation, explained the chairman, the vote was declared lost.

Six directors, carrying 21 votes, were in favour and eight directors, with 20 votes, were opposed.

At the July 9 meeting the motion was amended to add the Outer Gulf Islands and the amended vote passed, with eight directors carrying 31 votes in favour and 10 directors bearing 21 votes were opposed.

Remainder of Chairman Campbell's remarks were as follows:

When the original decision to include all the Capital Regional District in the transit function was taken, special attention was given to consideration of the merits of including the Outer Gulf Islands.

From my point of view as a Gulf Islander, it is highly desirable to provide a fast, convenient alternative to the automobile as a means of getting the Island resident into the business districts of Victoria and Sidney, and back home. The existing bus service is so inadequate that for many Islanders it does not even seem to exist.

As a consequence, over the last several years the possession of a private automobile has become almost a necessity for Islanders.

The ferry system is designed to carry cars and trucks and foot passengers. Its capacity for cars and trucks is frequently exceeded at busy times of the week and year, but there is surplus space for passengers.

**LEAVE THEIR CARS**

A good quality bus service would enable a significant fraction of Islanders to leave their cars on the island, and free space on the ferry for others. It is a certainty that with steady growth in the resident population, steady and severe increases in the cost of fuel, and the high economic and environmental cost of building more highways and ferry systems, an option such as proposed will become attractive.

That argument is the basis of the whole involvement of the provincial government and the Capital Regional District in the transit function.

I submit that nothing has changed to alter the force of that argument. In fact, it has become more compelling as time goes on for the Outer Gulf Islands as well as the rest of the region.

**DIFFERENCE**

What, if anything, makes the case for the Outer Gulf Islands different than for other parts of the region? If anything, the need for a good connection is greater.

Not one of the five major Islands I represent has a sufficient population to support much at all in the way of professional services, skill-

ed trades or special services.

There is no hospital, and medical services are sometimes limited.

There are no dentists or pharmacies.

Professional entertainment is non-existent.

Library services are extremely limited. There are therefore a considerable number of reasons that Islanders from the Outer Gulf Islands feel the need to visit Victoria, entirely aside from shopping expeditions. For many of those purposes a car is not essential and a good bus connection will meet the need.

**MAJOR PART**

During the recent election the inclusion of the Outer Gulf Islands in the transit service area was a major plank in my platform and a major ground for criticism by one of my opponents. In fact, the team which ran the candidate against me on that issue is still making it an issue, notwithstanding their loss at the polls.

Perhaps the most powerful argument for exclusion flows from the grievously inequitable aspect of the way in which the hydro surcharge has been applied. In the past few weeks my discussions with my constituents tell me that for the majority the residential surcharge of \$1 per month is tolerable, if not always welcome, but that the

impact of the current method of applying the commercial levy is totally unacceptable.

Many islanders are sceptical about the possibility of the kind of bus service I advocate being put in place, and many object to paying before the improved service arrives. Unfortunately these complaints are not peculiar to the islands, but apply to the whole region.

**CONFIDENT**

I am confident of two things. One is that legislation will be forthcoming to correct the inequitable impact of the commercial hydro surcharge, and the other is that a useful, effective transit link will be

in place for the Outer Gulf Islanders.

I request therefore that the board amend the motion by deleting therefrom reference to the Outer Gulf Islands.

Procedurally, if that is done, it will be necessary to vote on the amended motion which would then refer only to Salt Spring Island. I would not have asked the Board to reconsider had the Outer Gulf Islands not been dealt with in the same motion as Salt Spring Island, as I consider there to be significant differences between Salt Spring Island and the Outer Gulf Islands which are not obvious to those who do not live in either area.

## Disease causes concern

Public concern over the newly publicized disease of dogs, canine parvovirus enteritis, has prompted the issue of a summary of the disease by the B.C. Veterinary Medical Association.

The disease starts with vomiting and diarrhea, often with blood, weakness and sometimes fever. In young puppies there may be symptoms of heart failure.

It attacks all dogs of all ages.

The exact incidence of the disease in B.C. is not easy to ascertain. Laboratories report fewer cases than veterinarians suspect.

Parvovirus is not easy to identify or diagnose and tests may take up to two weeks when it is suspected. It can be readily identified when the animal is dead.

Any dog owner who wants more information can find it from a veterinarian. It is possible to inoculate against it, but a veterinarian might discourage such a measure.

Canine parvovirus enteritis attacks no other animals.

## Anti-nuclear rally at air force base

## Farming and gardening

With PETER WEIS  
Foxglove Nursery Consultant

Well, with the weather and all, here is the dill, as ready as can be, and no sign of the cucumbers yet. Mind you, there are all kinds of promising beginnings, and we have picked a few slicing types, but the expected cornucopia of cucumbers has not materialized yet.

For pickling cucumbers, dill is at its best just when the flowers are opening. And the best method of conservation is freezing. If dried, it loses a great deal of its flavour and when frozen it retains its flavour well. So until the cucumbers catch up our dill is being frozen as it starts to flower.

We are starting to harvest some cabbages. Unless you have a succession crop to go into the cabbage space, try the following. We cut the cabbage head above the bottom 6 to 8 leaves. Leave root and bottom leaves undisturbed. The cabbage plant will grow another four to eight, fist sized little cabbages.

They are really cute and just the perfect size for individual servings.

Later on in the year, after a touch of frost, they are even better. Some people give their regular cabbage heads away and wait for the little ones. We had little cabbages well into last January. It was very interesting to see how some plants survived rain and frosts. Also, you don't have to worry about cabbage worms as their season is over.

### CAULIFLOWER

We have harvested 14 heads of cauliflower. In those heads there was a total of three cabbage worms. Fred had picked one worm earlier in the season. So a confirmed total of four worms, altogether. And this, thanks to our wasps. They are fat and shiny with health. They have also stung only one visitor, although their nest is right at the spot where we hang up our laundry and our laundry line is in daily use.

I am sure that they recognise us by our smell and know us as fellow beings who share the same living room.

As far as the onions are concerned we can now bend the leaves over as some of the leaves are starting to dry. This helps ripening of the bulb before harvest. Try dragging a rake teeth up over the onions to bend the leaves. This is only

necessary if you have a lot of onions. For anything less than a 20 foot bed, bending by hand is still the best.

If you have the space, you can now set out leek, cabbage and broccoli plants for fall harvest. Also lettuce, spinach and radishes may be sown now for fall use.

### NO TOMATOES

Still no ripe tomatoes yet, although, again, things look very promising. The tomato plants we set out last April 15 are now as tall as I am, and they are bigger around. This is the first time that the tomato plants and I are on an eye to eye level. We used to stake them and although as tall, they were definitely a plant. Now, in their wire cages, they definitely are a tomato shrub: a 5 ft. 6 1/2 x 4 ft. 4 tomato shrub.

I have not given them any manure this year; just seaweed mulch once, since I did not want too much green growth, but good fruit production. I can hardly wait for my favourite concoction. One third chopped onions, two thirds chopped, ripe tomatoes, salt and pepper. It is at its best after sitting for 24 hours, but hardly ever lasts that long.

Starting now, and for the next two months, we can plant our spring flowering bulbs. This is the time to decide on and order the bulbs you would like to have. My favourite and one of the earliest, is the little winter aconite which unfolds its yellow, fragrant, buttercup-like blossoms in February.

Other early ones are glory of the snow (chionodoxa), snowdrop (galanthus) and the well-known and beloved crocus (crocus vernus).

Next to bloom are the hyacinths, narcissi, and daffodils and the squills.

After that, and overlapping to some extent, we have the early, medium and late tulips. Some early tulips, especially the species types kaufmanniana and griegii with 6 and 10 inches height respectively, look very good massed with bunches of daffodils and hyacinths. Stay within the yellow and red colour range with a touch of white perhaps, to enhance the colours. Finally there are the irises and lilies.

In planting, be sure to plant them at the proper depth. All the above bulbs can stay in the ground year after year, and need to be lifted only for division and replanting. Choose well drained locations, so they won't rot in wet winter soils. They all benefit greatly from a tablespoon of bonemeal placed below the bulb at planting time.

## Firemen compete for top speed between islands

It wasn't just fun and games when the Volunteer Fire Departments of Mayne and Galiano worked against time and the neighbour island's competition for the "Hook and Ladder" championship of the Outer Islands, on Saturday, Aug. 2, at their respective Halls.

Shaving seconds off the time it takes to get water onto a fire is serious business and it takes long practice. It's exciting and rewarding to compete with a neighbour to get a measure of your work and give a fillip to your interest.

The final event, placing the ladder on the building, taking the hose to the roof, and spraying the water on the imaginary fire, was "all Mayne" with a time of 36 seconds, against 65 for Galiano.

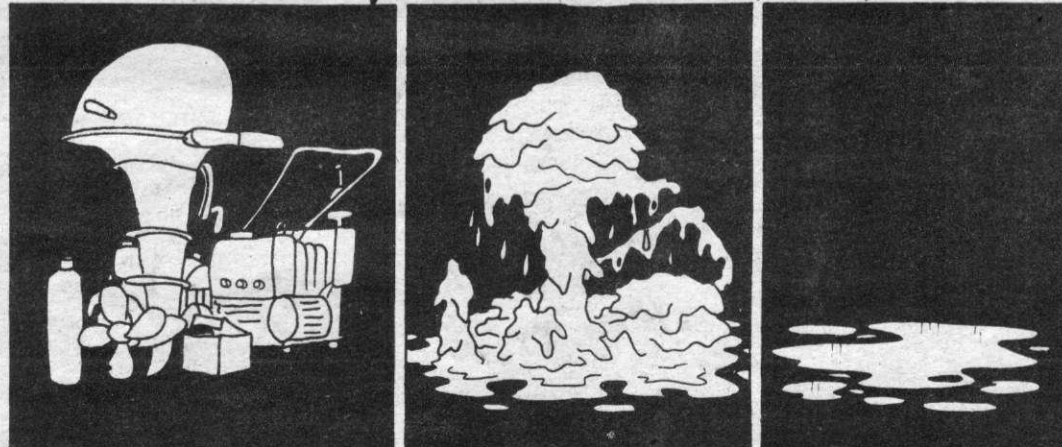
### Two boys impaired on bikes

# Lack of vigorous action by government found disappointing

Now that parliament has recessed for the summer I would like to share impressions of my first session as an M.P.

After two years of constant election fever, followed by two elections in less than a year, parliament had a great deal of housekeeping to do. Not even the spending estimates for the previous year had been approved, although all of the money had been spent.

Several bills, such as the Employment Tax Credit Act and the Fisheries Improvement Loans Act, extended existing programs which were due to expire and also increased the monies involved to

take account of inflation. Opposition members generally used the debates on such bills to discuss the government's failure to

deal with wider problems of unemployment, high interest rates or the decline of our fishing resource.

While housekeeping legislation

is important, the crisis we face in such areas as unemployment, housing and energy demand major new initiatives from the government. I was disappointed that the government did not act vigorously in any of these areas.

### BANK ACT

One important piece of housekeeping legislation was the Bank Act which has to be revised every 10 years. As I reported earlier, the NDP opposed the new Bank Act for failing to control interest rate spreads, for permitting foreign banks easier access to Canada and for the continuing scandal of interlocking company directorates. By our opposition we hope to gain some concessions before the act is finally passed in the fall.

In the early part of the session, parliament turned much of its attention towards the Quebec referendum. The optimism and good feeling after the victory of federalism on May 20 has now disappeared as the federal government is locked in a bitter struggle with western provinces over energy policy.

We even hear talk of separatism in British Columbia. In May, Bill Bennett visited Quebec to urge the people there to remain in Canada. Perhaps we can now expect a return visit from Rene Levesque!

On a more serious note, it has become obvious that Canada faces major problems in trying to stay together as a nation. I believe that talk about western separatism foolishly plays into the hands of large interests that want control of our resources for their own purposes. Our future lies with a united Canada.

### TOOK CENTRE-STAGE

In the last two weeks of the session, the NDP's opposition to the pre-build part of the Alaska Natural Gas Pipeline took centre-stage. Although New Democrats were not able to force the government to get adequate financial guarantees, we did help to alert the Canadian people to the pre-build issue. Obviously this and related energy matters will continue to dominate future meetings of parliament.

On a personal level, I had some success in raising local questions about tanker traffic and the Cowichan estuary as well as questions on Indian affairs.

In the fall, the Liberal government must bring in a budget to let the country know its financial plans. In addition, parliament will face major legislation turning the Post Office into a crown corporation, and also the long awaited Freedom of Information Bill.

I have enjoyed this first experience of representing you in the House of Commons, but I regret that parliament is so slow in dealing with the nation's urgent business. Is this slowness part of the price we pay for democracy? Or is it only a sign of our refusal to give up old and unnecessary traditions which no longer serve the needs of the people?

### Lost working days

Industrial action such as strikes and lockouts resulted in 9.3 million work days lost in England in 1978. During the same period, accidents, disease and alcohol consumption at work resulted in 419.4 million lost working days, according to the British secretary of state for social services.

## Classical guitarist at Galiano

Galiano Island residents enjoyed a magical musical tour of two continents Saturday night at a concert given by Vancouver guitarist Paul Bankes.

Bankes, who is rapidly becoming one of the most popular performers in the Gulf Islands, played favorite classical works from Spain, Brazil, Paraguay and Venezuela.

Though his concert began rather

shakily with the *Theme and Variations on the Magic Flute* by Spanish composer Fernando Sor, Bankes quickly regained his balance with an exciting performance of the *Fandangullo* by Joquim Turina, which drew enthusiastic, sustained applause.

The *Fandangullo* is one of the trickiest works in the classical guitar repertoire, requiring powerful musical concentration throughout sections of widely differing mood and technique. Dreamy impressionism gives way to sections of wild flamenco exuberance.

Without control, the piece collapses into a fragmented pastiche of musical bits and pieces. Bankes fused the work together and the sections flowed into each other with flawless, logical and emotional continuity.

The remainder of the pieces during the evening were performed with the same intuitive authority, with the exception of two pieces by Augustin Barrios, a Paraguayan composer. Although the piece was unmarred by technical errors, Bankes' concentration seemed to lapse and the performance lacked conviction.

Other pieces in the concert included works by Torroba, Tarrega, Ascencio, Lauro and Guimares.

Bankes had given a number of concerts throughout the Gulf Islands prior to Saturday's performance at the Community Hall on Galiano. He recently played in Seattle and Toronto to enthusiastic critical acclaim.

He is scheduled to perform Friday, August 22 on Salt Spring Island at 8:30 p.m. at St. George's Church. Tickets are \$3 each (children under 12 admitted free) and are available at the door.

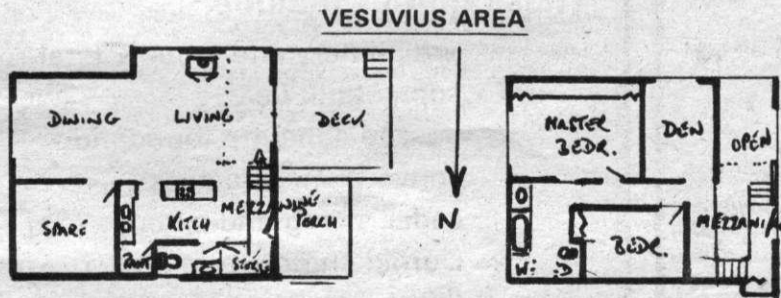

should be. We should all love each other and be Friends and Neighbours, Growing Strong and Free together.

Who else (with the possible exception of Gilbert and/or Sullivan) could take a line like "So I vaporized the droppings of my father's favourite hen" and turn it into a catchy song and dance number?

Well, that's Madness, and while we watch and laugh and cheer our neighbours showing us how the good life was and could and should be lived, we are drawn into the orbit of Madness Incorporated, and, with luck, we'll never escape its clutches.

### CORE REMAINS

This year's Midsummer Madness is different, although the core remains. There is more attempt at "production numbers" and for the most part they come off well.

But this is not a review - our

esteemed Editor reviewed the show last week, although he is not as susceptible to nostalgia and magic as us older folk! But this Madness has been touched by last year's Jesus Christ, Superstar: David Fitchew and Art Lucs showed us then how to dominate the absurd Acitivity Centre, and we have learned our lesson. Madness deserved bigger audiences, but those of you who were there, were privileged to share in this singularly Salt Spring Island enchantment. It deserves a wider audience, yet might not translate, for instance, even to the Outer Islands. But it would be fun to try!

When wisdom fails, give me Madness!

"Hero at Large" starred John Ritter, a TV actor of whom I had no great hopes. How lovely to be wrong! It's a silly story and could easily have been a silly movie. But it's redeemed from mawkishness by its direction and acting.

It lifts us, for a brief spell, from our mundane anxieties and pettinesses, to show us how the most ordinary people can be taken up out of themselves by the inspiration of an idea.

### WE KNEW IT

We knew this, of course, especially those of us who were brought up on stories of the Christian martyrs.

But this is a visual, graphic description of one such "little

man" who, in the face of great odds, rises above himself and his circumstances to assist others in need. It also shows how such a little man can be "conned" by the forces of evil, in this case a corrupt politician and a cynical, unscrupulous P.R. man, and virtually destroyed in the eyes of the watching world.

He runs away to hide and lick his wounds, but in his flight he is once again lifted out of himself by the great need of another. Again he is worthy of the occasion, but, more important, other people are fired by his example and prove themselves capable of heroism.

I recently read a detailed account of the killing of Kitty Genovese, the New Yorker who was assaulted, raped and killed while a couple of dozen of her neighbours watched, listened, and did nothing.

That's one side of the coin: play it safe; don't get involved; leave it to somebody else; it's not our affair; that's what 'they' are paid for - 'they' being the professionals, whether they are police, firemen, teachers or actors!

"Hero at Large" and "Madness" show us the other, shining side of the coin. We are all capable of heroism: we're all capable of brotherly and sisterly love. All we need is motivation, the courage and the will to dare. To stand up and be counted, even in the face of strenuous and well-organized opposition.

# Down Through the Years With Driftwood

## FIVE YEARS AGO

**Guidelines for a community plan** for Ganges were considered on Monday evening when representatives of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce met the two local trustees at the Ganges Crest.

**Minister of education** has given the green light to two expenditures in the islands. The Gulf Islands School District has been allocated the sum of \$363,500 for new facilities at Mayne Island school. Salt Spring Island schools get \$143,000 and another \$21,400 goes for equipment at Pender and Salt Spring Islands. Fees and contingencies account for the remaining \$34,100.

**Ganges is a driver's nightmare.** Traffic gets snarled up over the weird traffic pattern in the community. Department of highways has frankly admitted that it has more important things to do than survey traffic here and solve islanders' silly little problems.

**Condition of St. Mary Lake** water is attributed to an excess of algae which render the water unpleasant in taste and discoloured. Superintendent of the North Salt Spring Waterworks District, Peter Cartwright, reports that it is an aesthetic failing. The water is good, from a bacteriological point of view, confirmed Health Inspector Don Ife, this week. He blamed low water level and hot summer days for the profusion of algae.

**Seven nations were represented** in a gathering last week at the Galiano home of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Maier. Visitors were from Germany, Czechoslovakia, Austria, Scotland, Pakistan and Belgium. They chatted freely in Esperanto.

## TEN YEARS AGO

**Reluctantly, the Capital Regional Board** will inform Miss E.W. Hoffman and Arthur Freeman, of Hooson Road, on Pender Island, that it is helpless to offer them aid. The two neighbours protested the cacophony of acid rock music emanating from a group practising with drums, cymbals, electric guitars, banjo and amplifiers. Mayor Art Young, of Esquimalt, urged the board to try no noise abatement bylaw on the grounds that his

municipality had been unable to enforce such a regulation.

**The Cliff Bracketts'** 53rd anniversary was July 21. In Patchwork Capt. J.T. Hamilton writes of the Brackett family, of Upper and Lower Canada; of J.A. Brackett marrying Margaret Thatcher in Dresden, Kent County, Ontario and of their coming to the coast. Using the wrap-around stage already employed in *Midsummer Madness*, the players went through the *Midsummer Night's Dream* as companies all over the world have been doing for 300 years.

It would be unfair to pick out players, but I can't help being unfair, because the play is dominated by the two characters enjoying the foolishness of these mortals.

Puck was played by Dawn Luker. A dancing, springing, very Puckish Puck is Dawn. If the playgoer wants to freak out over a distaff Puck, let him! He would be alone.

King Oberon, eager to laugh at humanity, eager to toy with the fate of fools, is David Fitchew.

Between them, Puck and Oberon steal the show. They rarely walk the stage; they dance. They move with the devilish delight of flitting through the lives of their fellow players.

### OVERTIME

The rest of the cast are unexceptionable. And they adequately keep up the good work.

Several are working overtime. Fitchew is both Oberon and Theseus. Luker plays Egeus as well as Puck. And if Puck as a cavorting female worries you, how about Lady Egeus? Don't bother! You don't notice it.

Titania, the fairy queen, is bored with her husband and delights in an ass's head. Hippolyta, Queen of the Amazons, is eager to abandon her role of Women's Militant Lib, and settle down to domestic bliss with Theseus. These two conflicting roles of housewife in exotic hearths are both played by Marilyn Taylor, with her usual command of performance.

The lovers, who face some pretty stiff laws in Athens when it comes to marriage, are the chief ingredients of the plot. One is familiar to island player buffs. Three are new to the stage.

Liduin Currell has been seen in various roles on Salt Spring stages for the past few years. She plays the part of Helena, enamoured of Demetrius, rejected and sulky. Demetrius is Michael Bruynse. He runs neck and neck with Michael Armstrong, in the role of Lysander. They are both good in the roles. Armstrong is a student and is enjoying an entirely new experience. Bruynse is older and is more readily able to speak up and throw himself into the part.

The fourth character in the lovers' group is Michelle Minvielle, who is also a student at Gulf Islands Secondary.
