

GALIANO *Harvest and Flower Show*

The Community Hall was the colourful scene of the annual Galiano Island Harvest and Flower Show sponsored by the Senior Citizens Association of B.C., Galiano Branch, No. 94, on Saturday, August 30.

A hard-working team had arranged the exhibits on the previous evening and these had been judged by Mrs. P. G. James and Mrs. H. Shopland, old friends from Salt Spring.

The emphasis was more on enjoyment than competition, although the ribbon winners were justly proud of their triumphs. A multiplicity of classes gave entrants many opportunities to win the coveted red ribbons for first place.

Winners in the Junior Division were Andrea Billingsley, Arwen Foster, Adrienne Gould, Robert Graham and Rosemary Kinahan. Competing and winning in adult categories were two grade eight students; Billy Ripley with a luscious chocolate cake and Tiffany Shelly with both cake and candy.

PERENNIAL WINNERS

Several perennial winners were represented by a variety of entries and collections of ribbons. In the flower classes Jessie Bellhouse had several winners as did the Hilliers, both Frank and Doreen.

Margaret Robson, Fern Stewart, E. M. Wishart and Joan Carolan were winners in the rose classes. Joan Carolan also had three outstanding entries in floral arrangement: dry, miniature and table. Pam Gould won her red ribbon for an interesting miniature garden.

In the fruit and vegetable section the men were more conspicuous with Ed Bambrick, Percy Selby-Hele and Ed Jones each having many successful entries. Newcomer Ann Graham won with her pumpkins, zucchinis and red cabbage.

Jean Lockwood, entering for the first time, with the encouragement and assistance of Audrey Simas, won prizes for her cucumbers and carrots. Other winners in this section were Sally Riddell, Betty Harris, Les Woodbridge, B. Kinahan and the Lintons.

HOME BAKING

The home baking and preserves section was dominated by the ladies, though, thanks to Billy Ripley, they did not have a complete monopoly.

Bread prizes went to Phyllis Linton, Betty Ree, Joan Callaghan and Irene Godfrey. Dora Darling

won for her marmalade and a mahonia jelly, Sally Riddell for crab-apple jelly and Dorothy Woodbridge for apricot jam. A blackberry pie won a first place for Mary Harding, scones for Theresa Kinahan and a coffee cake for Audrey Bow.

The many other entrants, prize winners or not, are to be commended and complimented, for without their participation the show would have been much less successful and enjoyable.

The judges, with their helpful comments, and discriminating choices encourage the development of higher standards of entries for future shows. From the early days of settlement over a century ago, gardens, orchards and the kitchen, where the housewife baked and preserved a bountiful harvest, have played a very important part in life on Galiano.

The Senior Citizens Association is to be commended for encouraging the continuation of this tradition.

Passenger pigeon reborn

The passenger pigeon, once numbered in the millions and a common item of food in the nineteenth century in the eastern United States, is now extinct. However, there is in the Gulf Islands a pigeon passenger.

This bird, one of the common domestic variety of pigeon, is a regular passenger on the Queen of Sidney. Boarding the ship at Village Bay on Mayne Island it perches in the mechanism that operates the bow doors, travelling in this fashion via Sturdies Bay to Tsawwassen. On the return voyage the bird disembarks on the vessel's arrival at Village Bay.

It might be thought that this hitch-hiker is getting a free ride. Not so. She, for it is indubitably a female, pays for her passage by depositing the occasional egg.

Should the Ferry Corporation wish to recover the expense of transporting this unusual bird it

should instruct the crew to collect the eggs and convey them to the ship's cafeteria where they could be served on toast. For such a rare delicacy an exorbitant charge could be made.

Big wheel

The Vancouver City Safety Council recently awarded to Galiano driver, Lorna Tweedale, the "Big Wheel" certificate and emblem for safe and courteous driving.

Those who have followed, or observed Lorna driving her white Mercedes on Galiano will agree that this is a well-deserved award.

Lorna's careful and considerate driving was noticed by a transit bus driver in Vancouver.

The letter she received from the Safety Council complimented her and asked Lorna to display the Big Wheel emblem in her car as an encouragement to others to emulate her driving. Congratulations, Lorna!

Piers Island left over for meeting with residents

Real estate agent from Victoria, Fraser Biscoe appeared before the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee last week and asked for further consideration of the planning of Piers Island.

Almost before he had completed his presentation he found the trustees agreeing with him and undertaking to postpone further action until the matter has been discussed with the residents of the island.

Biscoe recalled the sale of Piers Island in 1958 and the 10 acre freeze in 1969. He described the Piers Island project as a "sensitive and careful development".

When the island was developed it was planned and purchasers were tightly restricted by the planning voluntarily imposed and similarly accepted. But the 10 acre freeze, whereby no subdivision were allowed in the islands for

parcels less than 10 acres in area, locked them in for 11 years.

Now that the Trust is planning the smaller islands Piers has been tied in with the provincial rock outcrops and not recognized as a developed island with its own community.

Trust committee will meet with the islanders before any further planning is undertaken.

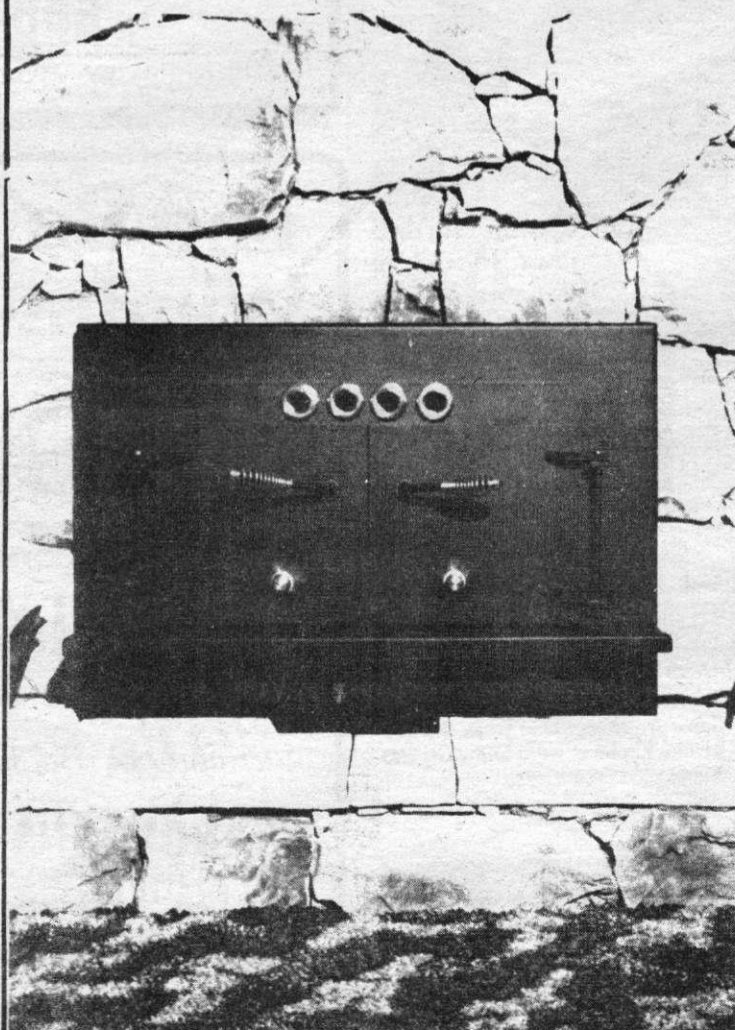

Hole in bylaw lets hotel through without hearing

Due to a loophole in Salt Spring Island zoning bylaw, the former Hastings property in Ganges is approved for use as hotel site without further debate, it was revealed on Tuesday afternoon last week. No zoning amendment or public hearing will be required.

The zoning bylaw provides that agricultural land may be used for agricultural purposes and "any uses permitted by the Agricultural

Land Reserve".

BC Land Commission has approved the use of ALR land for a hotel-resort.

Property has been designated a development permit area and such a permit must be agreed before the project may go ahead. The development permit will also cover the area to the west, occupied by Harbour's End Marina.

What to look for in eggs

The Salt Spring Island Fall Fair is coming up fast and it is time to start collecting your best dozen eggs.

The judge is looking for 12 eggs that conform as much as possible in size, shape and colour with smooth shells. Incidentally, if you have a hen that lays eggs with shells that have small bumps or ridges this may mean she had lung troubles at some point in her life. Even sickness for one day as a chick can produce these changes.

The eggs should be clean but do not wash them as this removes the natural protective coating and makes the egg go stale sooner. Provide your hens with plenty of clean straw or hay in their nesting boxes and the eggs will be clean.

The judge will be candling the eggs to look for air pockets, to see whether the yolk is centred and

how porous the shell is. All these things indicate freshness. He will also be weighing the eggs to make sure that they are in the right category.

This is very important and you may take your eggs to Foxglove Farm and Garden Supply, who have kindly offered their scales so you can check their weight.

Last year several beautiful dozen eggs were disqualified because they were in the wrong category.

The category of a dozen extra large eggs has been withdrawn this year on the judge's advice, as it is almost impossible to get a Grade A egg this large. The "fun" category of largest egg is still in, however, so listen for the loudest cackling from the hen house!

We hope to have recipes and other information for you on fair day and you may even find out finally which came first, the chicken or the egg!

Lake needs chlorine flushing

St. Mary Lake needs flushing out with chlorine, the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee was told on Tuesday afternoon last week.

W. E. Delmonico asked the committee for help in combatting the condition of the lake water.

"Can you help?" he asked trustees. "Will you?"

There was no immediate response.

He holds a certificate in water filtration from the University of British Columbia, explained Delmonico. He has lived on St. Mary Lake since 1968 and he has studied the lake water since that time.

The trouble with the lake dates back two years, said Delmonico. Until the lake was used as a water supply for North Salt Spring Waterworks District the run-off was greater. There is no run-off at all today, which suggests that the draw on the lake is now consuming all the water that once overflowed, he told the Trust.

SUSPENDED SOLIDS

The lake is full of suspended solids and when there was a steady flow from the lake these solids were partially washed away.

A dose of powdered chlorine would knock the suspended solids to the bottom of the lake, suggested the lake-dweller.

Delmonico also pleaded for the return of power boats. Banning boats from the lake was a grave error he assured trustees. When he first came to the island the use of power boats was permitted and their operation resulted in aeration of the lake water.

Gordon Wallace declined to take

part in such a debate.

"I have no knowledge of this," he told his colleagues.

"We are very sympathetic, but there is nothing we could do on your recommendation," explained Chairman John Rich. "All we can do is take it up with the Water Rights Branch."

The Trust must appreciate his concern, urged the speaker.

"What I heard here this afternoon was nothing but developments and talk about a sewer. That sewer could kill the lake!" said Delmonico.

AUTHORITIES

Bud Kreissl suggested that the two authorities on water and water treatment on the island are Ken Patrick, former Vancouver water commissioner and Mike Larmour, superintendent of the North Salt Spring Waterworks District.

He added that the water rights

branch is a government office established to issue licences. That branch is not concerned with quality or other features. The Water Investigations Branch has already launched a study of St. Mary Lake and a report is hoped for in the next few months.

"We should here, as in all things, get the experts," urged Kreissl.

No action was taken.

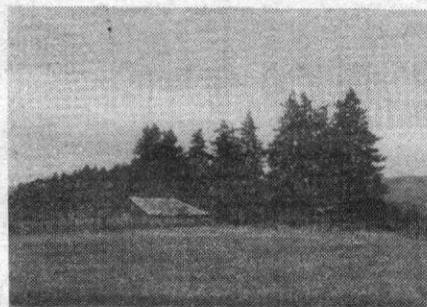

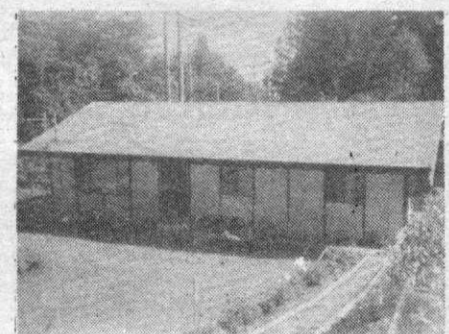

First seven months

Building forges ahead in the islands as figures compare two years' work

Home construction on Salt Spring Island has exceeded the level of a year ago. In the Outer Islands the year's total is marginally down from 1979.

In both areas, building activity is brisk, with new houses under construction everywhere.

Total value of new construction undertaken during the first seven months of 1980 amounts to \$5,828,894 in all the islands. This compares with a total of \$4,859,365 during the first seven months of 1979.

This year's figure is derived from the issue of 127 building permits. In 1979 the total number of permits issued was 117.

During the first months of this year there were 61 permits for single-family dwellings and five mobile homes issued on Salt Spring Island, totalling \$3,054,238. On Pender, there were 19 permits for single-family dwellings and one issued for a mobile home, all valued at \$1,002,829; Galiano nine and one, worth \$507,214; Mayne 21 and one, totalling \$857,112. Saturna trailed with five single-family dwellings, one multiple-family dwelling and five mobile homes, worth \$367,684.

Other, unspecified islands, accounted for one single-family dwelling and one mobile home, valued at \$39,817.

The equivalent period of 1979 brought 42 permits to Salt Spring Island for single-family dwellings and seven for mobile homes with an estimated value of \$2,077,860. Pender had 19 homes and three mobile homes, for \$1,132,367; Galiano, 15, at \$641,981; Mayne, 22 and one, \$801,870; Saturna, six at \$158,727; Piers Island, one home at \$31,700 and a "miscellaneous island", one home at \$14,860.

In the two years two permits were issued for demolition of homes, both in respect of James Island, and both in 1979.

Total permits issued from January to July 31 this year on the Outer Islands numbered 60, with a value of \$2,774,656. Last year's equivalent totals were 71 permits, worth \$2,781,505.

MONTH OF JULY

The month of July, this year, saw the issue of 12 permits on Salt Spring for a value of \$594,606, as compared with nine in July, 1979, valued at \$40,739.

On Pender three permits were worth \$138,210 compared with the 1979 figures of five permits for \$184,569; Galiano, 1980, two at \$69,817; 1979, three for \$81,928; Mayne, 1980, two, for \$48,454 and 1979, seven for \$249,256 and Saturna, in 1980, issued two permits worth \$180,677 as compared with the 1979 figure of one permit for \$33,940.

Month's totals this year for the Outer Islands were nine permits valued at \$437,158. Last July's

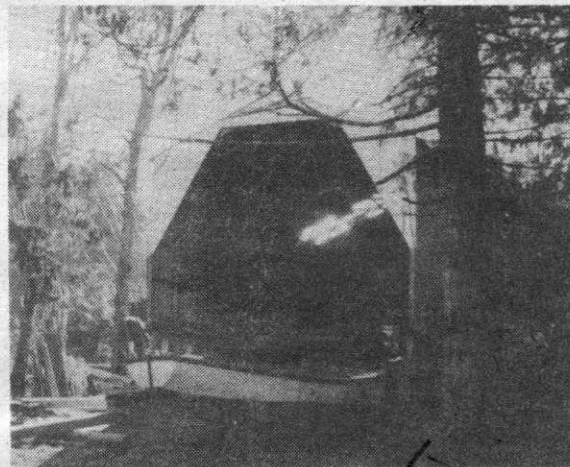

FIVE YEARS AGO

Salt Spring Island Subdivision bylaw has been given third reading by the Capital Regional District. Approval of the bylaw by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council will spell the end of the 10-acre freeze on Salt Spring Island. It must, however, gain the approval of the Islands Trust and the municipal affairs minister, James Lorimer. New bylaw centres on an averaging principle which is an entirely new concept of community planning.

Gulf Islands School Board has approved a special grant of \$1,500 towards the cost of airlifting students between Saturna and Ganges. The subsidy is in addition to the daily allowance for transportation of \$3.75 per pupil. When the grant was approved by a vote of 4-3, Finance Committee Chairman Ann Foerster insisted that it could not be done. Chairman of the board, Charles Baltzer refused to present the vote again.

Miss Agnes Whillans enjoyed the arts and crafts show in Galiano Hall on Saturday and Sunday. She was exhibiting needlework, but she got precious little needlework finished during the show. She was too busy chatting with visitors. Miss Whillans is 94 years of age. Living in Vancouver, she came to Galiano for a visit with her nephew and niece, Dr. and Mrs. M.G. Whillans.

High school graduate from Saturna, Diana Scroggs has been awarded the BCTF Scholarship as well as the BC Government Scholarship. Both scholarships will help to finance her university education.

You could say the Bau Xi Gallery in Vancouver discovered her, but Elisabeth Hopkins would be indignant, because she was never discovered. She'd been there all the time. Miss Hopkins left Galiano to live on Salt Spring Island but she is planning to return to Galiano. FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Former Mayne Island student, Michael David Garrick was fatally injured on Monday in Vancouver when he was struck on the neck by part of some fishing gear he was attempting to untangle. He released part of the equipment when it swung around and struck him. Garrick had attended school on Salt Spring Island and was a student at UBC at the time of his death.

Small store at Blue Gables Resort was the target of thieves during the past week. Fifty chocolate bars and about \$15 in silver was taken. Vandals also struck at the Salt Spring Island Rod and Gun Club last week. Nothing was taken but some damage was caused by

spraying detergent around the club rooms.

Leslie E. Barber, who retired several years ago to Salt Spring Island died on Monday at the Vancouver General Hospital. He was in his 51st year. He was living at Vesuvius and had been there since his retirement as publisher of the Chilliwack Progress. He was past-president and an honorary life member of the Canadian Weekly Newspaper Association.

Highways ministry stands firm on 80 ft. highways

Development of Salt Spring Island is such that 80 ft. highways will be needed in the future, avers the ministry of highways.

Letter was received by Salt Spring Island Trust Committee last week from the ministry, listing the official view of wide highways. It was in reply to an enquiry recently from the Trust, expressing regret that the ministry was imposing transcontinental highway standards on the small islands.

Dedication of 80 feet is required when a subdivision plan is registered.

It is required, says the ministry, for future road improvements, which are inevitable, due to the new subdivisions, proposed subdivisions and the steady population increase.

Existing main roads on the islands are narrow, with many very sharp curves and only just cope with the existent traffic.

LEFT TURN SLOTS

Some sections of the road need left-turn slots, which would require the minimum of 12 ft. extra.

Sidewalks and bicycle paths, suggested by residents and the Islands Trust, would also require a greater highway width.

On side hills, extra right-of-way is required to fit the road in, to contain the cut-and-fill slopes within the right-of-way, emphasized the ministry.

The space has to be available for utilities, such as hydro, water, telephone and sewer stated the report.

"It is not the intention of this ministry to rush in and clear the trees and build the roads," the Trust was assured, "but we must plan and protect the right-of-way for improvements affecting alignment and safety as and when conditions warrant it."

The "Highway Board" considered the requirement for an 80 ft. dedication in 1979, the Trust was told, and saw no reason to change the policy.

Roads affected by the ministry's ruling are Fulford-Ganges Road, from Fulford Harbour to Lower Ganges Road; Upper Ganges Road to Robinson Road; Lower Ganges Road to Upper Ganges and North End Roads and Vesuvius Bay Road from Central to Vesuvius Bay docks.

THAT OR 66

All other roads are required to conform to the standard 66 ft. width.

"We regret to advise that this ministry does not concur with your wish to adopt a policy to place a maximum width on all island highways," stated the writer, District Highways Manager G.W. Harper. "Consideration is always given by this office on subdivisions, permits for public utilities and access, to protect and minimize the removal of trees and maintain the natural setting and beauty of the islands."

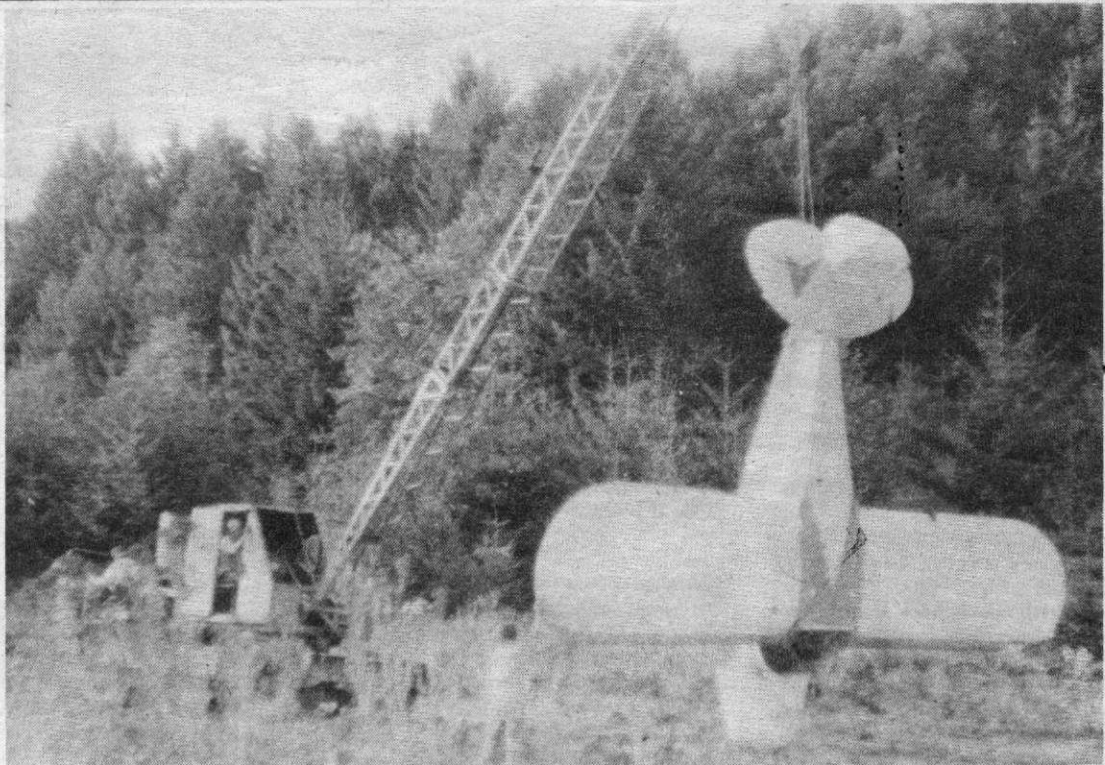
Salt Spring Island trustees will meet the manager in the next "couple of weeks" to discuss his views and to consider the need for cycle paths and other matters.

Permit area bylaw gets first reading

Public hearing has not yet been scheduled for the development permit area bylaw of Salt Spring Island Trust Committee.

Given first reading on Tuesday afternoon last week, the new bylaw provides that all commercial areas on the island shall be development permit areas.

Such areas require a detailed agreement between the owner and the Trust outlining details of the commercial development.
