farmers' Institute on Pender brought the chairmen of Islands Trust and the Capital Regional Board together on the platform on Saturday to review the past, present and future of the Islands Trust. Addressing islanders were Jim Campbell, chairman of the Capital Regional Board; John Rich, chairman of the Islands Trust and Ron Pither, from Pender Island, a member of the Capital Regional Board. About 30 people attended the session in the Pender School. Gerry Bass was in the chair. A summary of what the participants said is published

**CHICKEN BYLAW**

The first bylaw provided that on his farm at Saturna he could not have more than 100 chickens.

"I learned that I had to apply for a special provision for raising chickens, in which case part of my farm would be allocated to the raising of chickens and could, then, never be used for any other purpose."

The penalty for having more than 100 chickens without special provision was six months in prison.

He went to the regional district and tried to persuade them they had made a mistake, but they wouldn't be persuaded.

The board refused to consider community plans.

He ran for office on the policy that the zoning bylaw was wrong and that before the islands had zoning bylaws or subdivision bylaws they should have a community plan for each of the five islands.

A farmer could now have as many or as few chickens as he liked.

"Second phase was fantastic." It was to look into community plans.

It was accepted that each of the Gulf Islands should have its own community plan because there

were no two islands sufficiently alike that they would be going the same way.

The Islands Trust was established, with veto power over land-use decisions, in regional districts. Trust committees were appointed. **NO RESPONSIBILITY**

The measure relieved the regional districts of a decision in land-use matters and transferred the responsibility for island land-use to an unelected committee, protested Campbell. It left no line open for direct communication between the people and elected persons. And every decision of the regional district was open to veto by a trio of unelected persons.

There was considerable pressure on the government at the time and it resulted in a further measure, whereby the three appointed trustees were to be elected.

From that time the Trust became closer to being a local government entity, said the speaker. It still falls far short because it doesn't have any budgetary control.

"Let's strengthen the capacity of some form of local government to deal with issues: where islanders can see each other from time to time, to visit each other and get to know each other."

On the other side, of course, he added, "The government mustn't interfere with those local decisions.

Local decisions have to be made by local governments and this is important; regional, provincial and national questions have to be answered by regional, provincial and national governments.

"I should like to go into the history of the Islands Trust as I recall it, particularly those aspects affecting the Gulf Islands."

There was no local government at all in the islands except through the local member of the legislature up to the time of the creation of regional districts in this province. Except for some special functions such as fire districts and water districts under the water rights legislation.

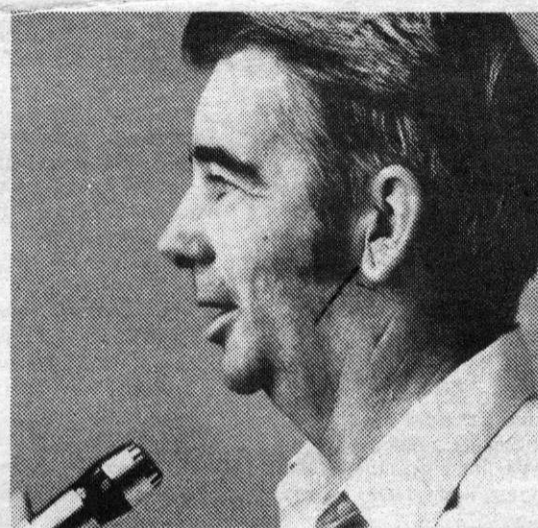
Land use administration was entirely through the highways department, under the local service act.

In 1969, as the direct result of what the general public saw to be errors in planning, the provincial government initiated the 10-acre freeze. This freeze was not restricted to the islands. It was also imposed on areas where the development pressures were high.

The 10-acre freeze was imposed by the minister of municipal affairs at the time, Dan Campbell, who cited subdivisions at Pender and Mayne Island as factors contributing to its imposition.

The regional district then got down to a zoning bylaw and a subdivision bylaw for the Outer Gulf Islands and another for Salt Spring Island. The philosophy of the regional board at that time was that a single policy was needed for planning on all the Outer Islands and on Salt Spring Island, as well.

It was a joyful occasion as, although Dr. McEachern is retiring from the ministry at the end of this month, they will not be leaving the Island. He has built a home here.

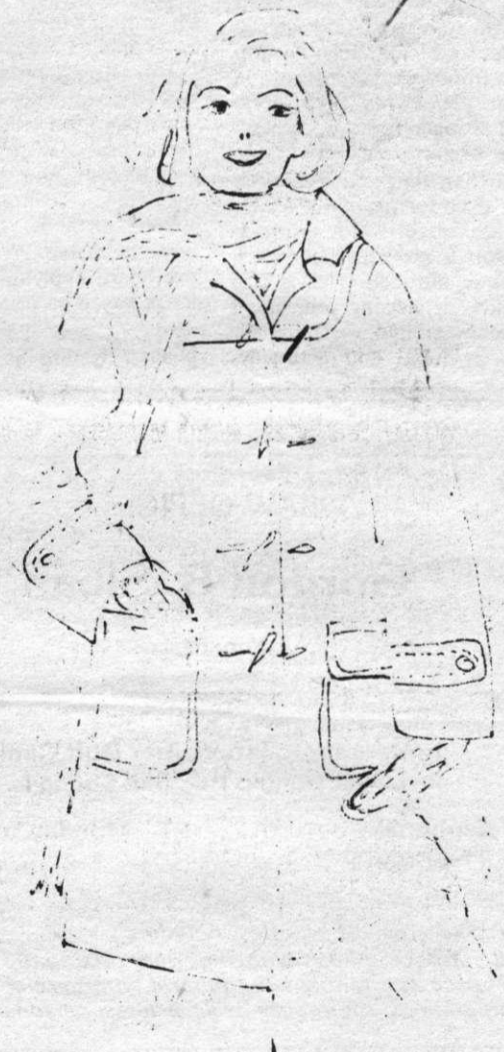

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# Billions of micro-organisms are found in good, healthy soil

Our soil, which gives and sustains life, is composed basically of four things. There are minerals, organic matter, water and air. Or, in other words, somewhat simplified, sand, humus, water and air.

Things do not grow well in sand only. Humus without water or air is also useless. In water and air only, some specialized plants grow which are not too palatable. What we do need is the combination of all these things, plus life.

You see, the earth feeds its life with its life. Good healthy soil is just teeming with life. Aside from the ones we can see, the earthworm for instance, the soil's constant tiller, there are billions of micro-organisms.

There are bacteria, fungi, and actinomycetes. It was thought that plants extract nutrients from the soil with their roots. This is only partially true. Actually, plant roots are almost entirely covered with micro-organisms which make the foods the plant can use.

### MANUFACTURE NITROGEN

The legumes, for instance, peas, beans and clovers among them, develop little nodules on their roots, which house the bacteria, which absorb and manufacture nitrogen from decaying humus and from the air. Hence their great value as nitrogen fixers in the soil.

These bacteria make far more nitrogen than they can use, with lots left over for anyone else. So cherish the clover which grows in your lawn, it provides your lawn with lots of nitrogen. This is also the reason for plowing your spent peas into the ground, roots and all.

## Farming and gardening

Micro-organisms, among others, which decompose what was once living tissue, into nutrients. They all have their place in the scheme of things; fungi and actinomycetes, for instance, decompose organic material which is too dry for bacteria.

The latter two also manufacture antibiotics (penicillin from bread-mould) which are an important link in the food growing chain. These antibiotics discourage and inhibit a great range of diseases and parasites.

### NEED TO ADD POISONS

We can grow green things in sterile soil with manufactured nutrients. Houseplants and hydroponics are examples. However, we have also found that we need to add poisons to this situation, to combat diseases and parasites which thrive in the absence of the fungi and actinomycetes.

This all originated over 100 years ago when professor Leibig burnt some plant material and analyzed the ashes. He found nitrogen, phosphorous and potash. Hence our NPK fertilizers. With his limited methods, limited results were inevitable. We have just gone overboard applying limited knowledge based on primitive research. And we are just finding out, pushed by dire necessity, about

the importance of the micro-organic life of the soil.

Fortunately for us, there is a lot we can do to restore and enhance the micro-organic life of the soil. We simply imitate nature's eternal cycle of life and decay. We just add organic material to the soil. We can compost organic wastes, mulch with organic material and grow organic manure crops, which provide both nutrients and organic material.

### A NET GAIN

You see, there is a net gain in the growing of manure crops. For once, eons ago, the earth was a barren rock and look at it now. This is not scientifically understood as yet. But here it is. All kinds of life, mobile or stationary, covers the earth. Even the deserts sustain life of some sort.

We can understand nitrogen from the air and energy from the sun, but that is about as far as we have come.

Green manure crops, then, add a great deal to the health and well being and sheer numbers of the micro-organisms, which in turn add to the health and well being of our fruits and vegies and last, but not least, to our well being and health.

In the fall, from about now to the end of October, your best green manure crop is winter rye, or fall rye.

### LARGE NUMBER OF ROOTS

Fall rye makes a rather surprising number of roots. Each little shoot of rye boasts a root system as large as your hand and as wide. A lot of organic material there. Fall rye is best plowed or tilled under in early spring while still green and about a foot high.

It does not provide nitrogen as the legumes do, but contributes a fair amount of phosphorous and a great deal of organic material. Clovers are your best bet for nitrogen and organic material.

And if you have very poor soil, with lots of clay, buckwheat is the stuff to grow. Buckwheat, high in nitrogen, will penetrate deeply into tough soils and clays.

Eventually, the combined action of the living roots and the decay of dead roots will loosen and enrich the toughest soil; and provide a hospitable environment for earthworms and micro-organisms.

It is also excellent for bees when in bloom, as well as for my favorite, the little tricho-gramma wasp, which goes after the codling moth larvae. Clovers are best sown in spring and buckwheat in middle to late summer.



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# Teacher of Yoga for seven years

Mrs. Gay Dill, an experienced Yoga teacher, gives the classes every other Sunday from 10:30 am to 1:30 pm.

The first one and a half hours is devoted to beginners and the second space from 12 noon, on, is given over to the more advanced students. As far as weather permits the classes will be held outside on the grass, otherwise in the gym at the School-Community Centre. There are 10 classes in all; five before Christmas and five in the New Year.

Mrs. Dill, who is assisted by her husband, Rob, comes from Victoria, where she is a Yoga teacher at the Y.W.C.A. and at the C.N.I.B. as well as teaching classes in her home.

# He wants no big motors

Use of motors bigger than five horse-power is being protested at Cusheon Lake.

Last week the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee was asked to take the necessary steps to prohibit larger motors.

M. J. Whitaker offered his five-point summary of the use and abuse of small boats on the lake.

The lake is used by canoes, sailboats or small fishing boats, he explained and he felt that larger boats used for jolly-riding or skiing are not compatible.

The lake also provides a domestic water supply for residents and a further subdivision.

The algae content of the lake is high for the greater part of the year


and residents have been concerned at the possibility of the algae being churned up by the larger boats.

### CONTAMINATION

High activity of such boats will lead to the contamination of the lake by oil and gasoline.

In conclusion, the lakeside property owner explained that the lake is long and narrow, with three arms and vulnerable to noise and pollution.

Previous attempts to have a restriction on island lakes have been rejected by the government, reported Planner Dean Strong-itharm. Ford, Maxwell and Cusheon Lakes were all turned down, he reported.



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## Mayors voted for plan

Dispute between the governments of Canada and British Columbia over the constitution is not shared by the junior levels of government.

Capital Regional Board Chairman Jim Campbell recalled on Saturday that when he attended the Prince George convention of the British Columbia municipalities recently, mayors and aldermen favoured patriation of the constitution with minor amendments.

Premier Bill Bennett is campaigning against the Trudeau plan to bring the British North America Act home to Ottawa.

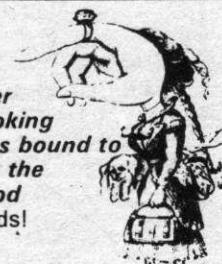

## Chimney fires can be avoided

What's it like to have a chimney fire? Most people who have had one in their home will likely agree that it's not very pleasant.

If it doesn't burn your house down, it could wreck your chimney and scare you half to death.

Start with one dirty chimney: a fireplace, for instance, which has not been cleaned for a couple of years. The soot lining the chimney is saturated with flammable creosote, which is easily ignited: a newspaper fire sending flames up to the damper is enough.

Once kindled, creosote burns well. In a matter of seconds the fire spreads up through the flue creating a draft that only helps things along. At this point, the average chimney fire begins to roar and howl, sending the occupants of the house running for cover.

As the creosote fire builds up and intensifies, the heat melts the mortar between the bricks. The red-hot mortar drips into the flue, only to be caught up in the tremendous updraft. Those little fireballs shoot out the chimney and on to the roof.

If the chimney doesn't fall apart, destroying one end of the building, this miniature volcano can bring the whole house down.

But a chimney fire can be controlled. After the fire in the fireplace is put out with an extinguisher or sand, the opening should be covered with a wet blanket and the fire department called.

The best remedy, however, is in the way of prevention.

Chimney fires can be avoided by having the chimney cleaned regularly.

The story which was circulating on the island last week was that the lease on the building had expired and the distribution branch had not renewed it.

A branch spokesman told *Driftwood* that the lease doesn't expire until 1984.

# Wallace is critical of ministry refusal of plea

Ministry of the environment is not taking a sufficiently serious look at the Gulf Islands, it was charged by the Islands Trust last week.

P. M. Brady, director of the ministry's inventory and engineering branch had replied to a Trust plea, declining to investigate a moratorium on land use changes in water supply watershed on Salt Spring Island.

The Salt Spring Island Trust Committee has expressed concern for many months that excessive industrial activity in the watershed areas is jeopardizing the water supplies. It had been proposed that a moratorium be imposed as a protective measure until a study could be made.

"We are not in a position to consider an investigation of the need for a moratorium," wrote Brady.

### NOT SERIOUSLY

"Brady is not taking the problems of the Gulf Islands as seriously as they should be taken," stated Gordon Wallace, "The island problems should be brought up from the back burner and put on the front burner."

The ministry was far from agreeing with the Trust.

"It is generally accepted," continued the ministry letter, "that activities such as logging, soil removal and urbanization can be tolerated in small watersheds used for a community water supply

without jeopardizing the basic function of the watershed which is to provide an adequate amount of clean water."

"These activities must be conducted under severe constraints dictated by the size, topography and ecology of the watershed."

The ministry's experience indicates that each watershed has to be assessed individually.

### APPRECIATE PROBLEM

"We can appreciate the concern of the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee," concluded the letter, "but unfortunately we cannot consider its request for assistance because of our heavy work load and limited resources."

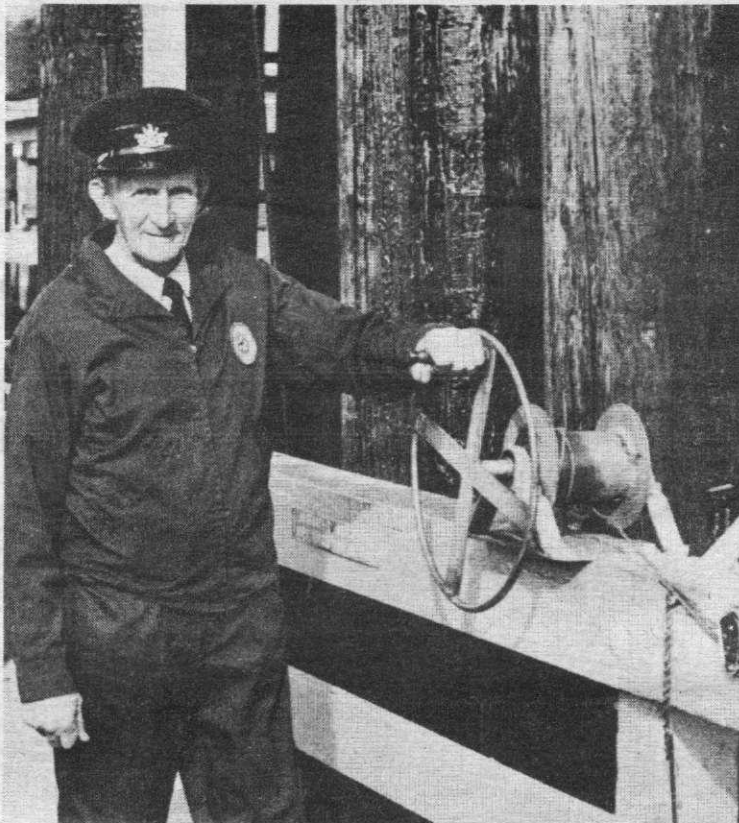
He was not satisfied, stated Wallace.

"The conditions of the island are such that something has to be done immediately: unless we know the facts, we cannot make a judgment."

Something still has to be done for the protection of island lakes, stated Bud Kreissl. He suggested that protection of water should be discussed at the cabinet level.

"We have the support of every stratum," he told the committee, "from the dyed-in-the-wool conservatives to the real estate agents."

Trust will press for more details on the biological study for which there is no ministerial time available.

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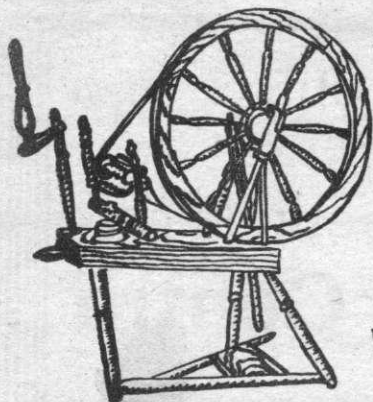

Trustee David Lott changed his mind last week about requiring a development permit for all projects in a commercially zoned area of Salt Spring Island. But he didn't hold out against his colleagues.

The island trust committee had previously called for the provision. Already in a development permit area is the Ganges core. The committee has directed the preparation of a bylaw to extend this requirement to commercial property all over Salt Spring Island.

When the bylaw was introduced last week Lott explained that he has changed his mind and now feels that the provision is discriminatory.

The new provision allows the committee some input into new commercial developments, replied Bud Kreissl.

"We would like some input into the aesthetics."

Lott did not approve of the principle of "telling anyone putting up a property how to put it up". There are enough hassles on the island without getting into a bigger one, he suggested.

If everyone was happy with the bylaw, he was not getting his teeth into it, said Lott.

The bylaw will go to public hearing on October 21.

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
