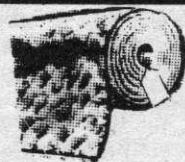


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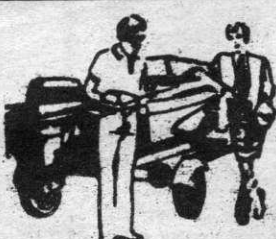
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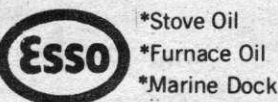
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DRIFTWOOD ASKED THEM: Are impaired driving penalties appropriate?

College student

"I don't think the penalty for drinking and driving is too harsh. People would not learn their lesson if they got off lightly. In Ontario, where I come from, the number of people who drink and drive and then get involved in accidents is fantastic.

"Anyone convicted of impaired driving should lose his licence temporarily the first time and permanently the second time. Some people are more susceptible to alcohol than other people. If they are intelligent they'll wait awhile before driving their car.

"In Ontario you would lose your licence for six months if you were caught driving while impaired; a year if you were caught again."

"I think the penalties for impaired driving should be stiffer. I think that the law in Sweden says you automatically go to jail if caught. It should be that way.

"I've seen some of the results first-hand, and it's not a very pretty thing. Something I don't agree with, though, is the way young people are treated by the law. People who are older should know better, but kids under age should be treated differently.

"They should be made to do volunteer work in some place like the casualty ward in a large hospital. They could then see the results of drinking and driving."



HERMAN BANTEL
Retired

"Most of the guys who get caught drinking and driving are alcoholics. The government should look more at trying to help them. In Germany they put the alcoholic on a bed and dump whiskey over his head and face; it's a very hard treatment.

"We have to do something because there are too many accidents. If the drunk is killed I don't feel sorry for him, but I do feel sorry for the victim who wasn't drinking.

"I've been in Canada since '51 and I see the drinking here is very bad. In Europe you can stand on a street corner and nobody bothers you. If you walk crooked the police will stop and check you and if you cause trouble, then you go to jail."

Plea for permanent residence is denied

Resorts, motels and auto courts zoned for such use are intended for transients and not for permanent residents, Salt Spring Island Trust Committee ruled last week.

Committee was invited to approve the construction of long-term rental units at Rainbow Beach Resort.

Making the application was Jonathan Yardley, island architect.

Commercial 4 is for accommodation of transients and the definition of transient accommodation is for less than one month, trustees were told.

General trustee Gordon Wallace saw it as "another way of getting

around the bylaw".
ON FIVE ACRES

The area is zoned to permit one home and one cottage on each five acres, said planner Chris Foord.

Chairman John Rich compared the proposal with the local zoning. If the provision of short-term and longer-term occupancy were permitted at a resort the 39 units would be acceptable. If the appropriate local zoning obtains, then only six units could be accommodated on the property of 29 acres.

It was decided to write to Yardley explaining the limitations imposed under Commercial 4 zoning.

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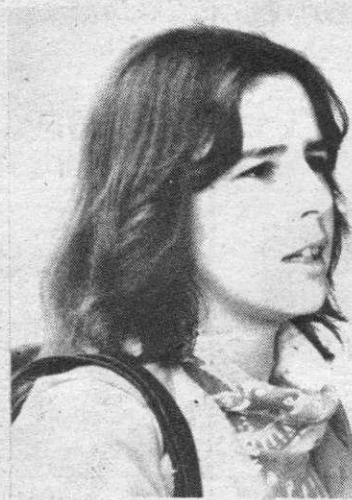


SUSAN BRADFORD

"I don't think people should drink and drive because too many children are getting killed. I definitely think impaired driving should remain as a criminal offence.

"Going to jail for impaired driving would not be a good solution to the problem. The taxpayer has to support the person in jail and his family also, because it's usually a man.

"Maybe the government should get the pubs to run a free taxi service home. That would be a more practical approach. A \$400 fine is not enough for someone who makes \$200 per day. A fine is also needed to cover court costs."

"I think the penalty is too harsh. As far as I can see, no matter how high they put the charge it still won't stop people from drinking. The fine for impaired driving should be \$100 plus some points on your licence.

"I also think that breathalyzers are a waste of the taxpayers' money. From what I've heard they are not all that accurate and shouldn't be used.

"But they've got to stop impaired driving one way or another. Maybe the best thing to do would be handing out jail terms to offenders. Paying money won't stop people so maybe jail will."

"I think the penalties are fair enough. They've been publicized enough, people should know what they're up against. But I don't think there should be a jail sentence, unless the person is a third-time offender.

"I believe young people need a break. They are not as experienced. Maybe they are having a tough time getting started in life and don't need a record to contend with for the rest of their lives.

"The criminal record is the worst thing about the penalties. Money is easy-come, easy-go, but a record is something a young person shouldn't have. There should also be a stricter penalty for someone who has really over-indulged."

Next concert: Sunday, March 16, B.C. Telephone Choir.

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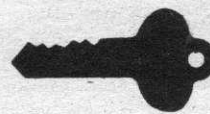

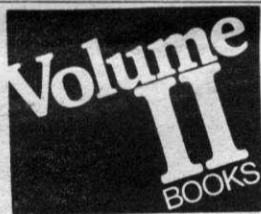

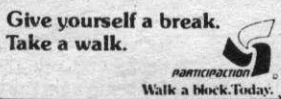

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

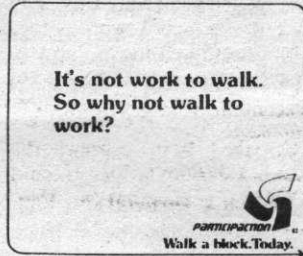

Institute looks back on 83 years of community work

Salt Spring Island Women's Institute met at Fulford Inn on Tuesday, February 19, for lunch to celebrate Founder's Day.

The first Women's Institute in Canada was founded in 1897 by Mrs. Adelaide Hoodless of Stoney Creek, Ont. The Farmers' Institute had already been started, in 1884, at Wentworth, Ontario.

It took a few years to break down the apathy of women and the prejudice of men. In 1909, Miss Laura Rose, who was an instructor in dairying at the Ontario Agricultural College, travelled throughout B.C. and as a result, 15 Women's Institutes were formed. Today there are well over 200.

It was at her suggestion that the motto, *For Home and Country*, was adopted in 1902. In 1903 she designed the Women's Institute crest from her signet ring.

The early Women's Institutes concentrated on education for women on problems closest to their hearts: namely, health and welfare of their loved ones.

Guest speakers advised them on such matters as impure food, flies, filth and their effects on family health.

Homecrafts such as quilting,

weaving, knitting and sewing were most popular.

Their interest in community work spread to schools long before the P.T.A.'s were started. Hospitals received practical help such as furnishing wards and supplying needs. Burnt-out families, the lonely elderly, wherever a need in the community appeared, so did the Women's Institute.

During two world wars, they sent parcels of food, blankets, quilts and knitted articles overseas, yet still kept their commitments at home.

WIDER SCOPE

With the fast-changing world of today, their scope has widened. Although home economics and agriculture still play a major part of their interest, it is also interesting to note that many of the laws in effect today, regarding rights of women and children, stem from resolutions brought to the attention of the government by the Women's Institute.

In 1920, South Salt Spring Island Women's Institute was started. At the first meeting there were more men than women present. The men did not come again, they worked on a Community Hall while the ladies raised the money.

Terrifying flood in California

Roma Sturdy was on holiday in California recently. The experience of unrelenting floods was terrifying, she told *Driftwood*.

One recent Sunday, she recalled, she was sitting at lunch in a golf club, while it rained outside.

When she glanced out of the window, No. 1 tee had completely disappeared.

"It was terrifying," she told *Driftwood*.

The hall was finished in 1920 but burned down in 1925.

A new hall was built, but it also burned down, in 1926.

The institute undertook furnishing of the men's ward in the Lady Minto Hospital.

Until recent years, the Women's Institute held a local May Day. The group gives a scholarship every year for a graduating student of Gulf Islands Secondary School in home economics or agriculture.

With other Women's Institutes in B.C., they help support the Children's Solarium in Victoria and the Children's Hospital in Vancouver.

Different functions

The confusion makes process more difficult

When a resident of the province is told by one arm of the government that he may do as he wishes, can he do as he wishes?

Only if another commission agrees,

Another Salt Spring Island resident was mystified recently by receiving permission to subdivide her land. Permission was not granted by the Islands Trust.

Mrs. R. Dammell appeared before the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee on Thursday last week to seek information.

She and her husband own something less than 100 acres. And they farm it. The property is included in the agricultural land reserve and they want it that way.

But there is one piece of the property less than useful for agriculture. About a year ago they applied to have it subdivided. They asked for the separation of two five-acre parcels from that poorer quality land.

The Islands Trust expressed hostility to the subdivision of good farmland and the B.C. Land Commission ruled that the separation would not be permitted.

NO ARGUMENT

There was no argument. The owners accepted the ruling and enjoyed their property and the purpose to which they put it.

There passed nearly a year and

the owners received notification from the Land Commission that the application had been reconsidered and that it had been approved. The owners would be able to divide the two five-acre lots from the rest of the property.

There was some small print referring to local regulations, but it was not by any means clear to the owners that the Land Commission, in fact, did not have authority to approve a small-lot subdivision, the trustees learned.

The Land Commission allows the owners to take off two lots. The Trust bylaw calls for a 20-acre minimum lot size.

SETTLES IT

Chairman of the Trust settled that.

"It is clear that the Trust is empowered to write bylaws," he explained, "and its ruling applies."

The Land Commission's job is to regulate agricultural land, he explained, and the Trust's function is to regulate land use.

The owners should apply for rezoning of the low-grade farmland as rural and ask for its exclusion from the land reserve, suggested Gordon Wallace.

The confusion between different ministries and functions makes the process more difficult for the property owner and tougher for the Islands Trust, it was agreed.

Changes in employment program

Applications are now available for businesses, farms and non-profit organizations to apply for funds under the 1980 provincial Youth Employment Program.

The Youth Employment co-ordinator for the Gulf Islands this year is Pam Campbell.

The program provides funds to employers who wish to hire a youth or student who meets the program's eligibility requirements. Farms and businesses which have been in existence for one year or non-profit organizations registered with the provincial government can apply for reimbursement.

The provincial Youth Employ-

ment Program will reimburse businesses and farms up to \$2.50 per hour per employee, while non-profit organizations can receive up to \$3.40 per hour per employee reimbursement. The deadline date for non-profit organizations is March 3, 1980. Project expenses are also available.

YEAR-ROUND

"We have two exciting new areas in the program," says Camp-

bell. "First of all, funding in the private sector is now available to employers on a year-round basis. This means that an employer is not restricted to the May through August time period and can provide employment opportunities to young people from April 1, 1980 through March 31, 1981."

"In 1980," Campbell reports, "there is an increased emphasis on training. This emphasis is addressed to the problem of high unemployment among youth. The training will provide young people with a greater opportunity at learning a skill which will assist them in finding employment in the future."

Through an allocation of \$957,760, 250 jobs were created in the Capital Regional District during 1979.

The end of the long haul to success is in sight, meeting was told. The cost of extension and renovations stands at \$75,000 and the board has raised \$70,000 of this total.
