Heritage advisor to attend conference

Salt Spring resident Beth Hill will represent the island during a two-day, province-wide regional advisor conference on heritage conservation scheduled for Victoria on March 1 and 2.

Hill is one of 30 heritage conservation branch volunteers who serve as a public-government liaison in matters which relate to heritage conservation in the province.

She holds a certificate in prehistoric archaeology from Cambridge University and is particularly interested in petroglyphs and rock carvings, and has conducted a series of site surveys along coastal waters.

Provincial Secretary and Minister of Government Services Evan Wolfe said regional advisors play an important role in preserving the province's heritage by monitoring and recording prehistoric and historic sites in British Columbia.

He said advisors also serve the province by ensuring their community plays an active role in heritage preservation and by reporting vandalism or situations where heritage sites are threatened by land excavation or development.

The two-day conference, sponsored by the ministry of provincial secretary and government services, is designed to update advisors on branch activities and to provide them with information which will assist them when serving their communities.

"The seminar is an excellent opportunity for volunteers to exchange information and devise policies vital to the preservation of heritage in our province," Wolfe said.

Fish plant plans are activated

Plans are going ahead with the fish plant in Ganges.

Salt Spring Island Trust Committee last week undertook to re-activate the application from last year for a development permit for S.S.I. Sea Foods Ltd.

The processing plant had applied for a permit to expand, but the herring closure in local waters resulted in a sharp slow-down. The application was left in abeyance.

The expansion program will provide for a number of new jobs in the plant.

INDOOR PLANTS

And now for this week we will just take a brief look at indoor plants.

As the days start to lengthen you will see some improvement in your

indoor plants.

December's daylight hours combined with low air humidity are tough conditions for all plants. All those which do not bloom during this period need to be kept barely moist since they are not growing and cannot use fertilizers either.

Increase air humidity by frequent misting (except those with hairy stems or leaves.) Plants can safely be moved to a southern exposure. Avoid exposure to direct heat or cold windows.

Blooming plants need to be kept evenly moist, lightly fertilized at quarter strength with high potassium fertilizer every week.

Critical of support for question

When regional director Yvette Valcourt called for the exclusion of Salt Spring Island from the transit function two weeks ago, she cited the 1979 straw vote taken up by the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce in *Driftwood*. There had been 760 replies opposing the vote and three in favour.

What did the vote ask, enquired chairman Jim Campbell.

It asked whether the signer was in favour of paying three cents per gallon of gasoline to maintain a bus service on Vancouver Island.

Anyone who voted for that was an idiot, commented the chairman.

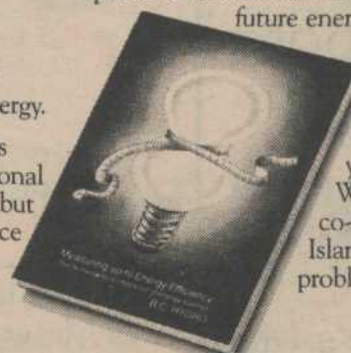

Children on Salt Spring

Slide-show entertaining despite lack of interest in special project

Children on Salt Spring was the theme of a slide-show presented in the Ganges elementary school Activity Centre last Wednesday evening.

The show, produced by Tim and Reid Collins, featured six island youngsters, each narrating a sequence of slides they had chosen from a large collection taken by photographer Tim Collins.

The show portrayed different aspects of a young person's life on Salt Spring, not including the time the child spends at school.

The taped narrative which accompanied the slides contained first-hand explanations by each child, explanations of what they saw in the pictures and what the pictures meant to them.

Children were chosen for the project from different lifestyles and different age groups in order that a cross-section of the community could be represented. **UNIQUE**

The hobbies, creative outlets, neighbourhoods and families, as described by each one of the six children, shows that Salt Spring provides a unique environment for kids. And their comments, some of which were priceless, illustrate each child's awareness of the different life he leads here.

The show began with Graham Kaye, aged three, featuring pictures of things that are a part of his life. "That's my house. That's me again!"

As there were no scripts the children were asked to look at their pictures and then tell their impressions of each image. The result was the opportunity for local children to speak candidly about their lives on the island.

The last of the children to be seen and heard was 15-year-old Dan Miller. With a rare degree of artistic and photographic talent, Miller showed the beauty he sees in the unlimited sky and landscape around him. The approximately five-minute segment which featured him was the most distinctive feature of *Children on Salt Spring*.

GRANT

The slide-show was the result of a Year of the Child grant applied for by Reid Collins last summer. His comments about the grant and working with the children show that grants don't always work out the way they are originally planned.

According to Collins, almost three months went by after initially applying for the grant before he heard from the government. And then it wasn't really a reply he got, just a telephone call from the Community Society to say that \$2,400 had arrived for the project.

Collins, in the meantime, had committed himself to a trip back east so the money had to remain where it was until he returned. This could have meant a very late start or no start at all if it hadn't been for Collins' brother Tim, who agreed to come out from Toronto to initiate the project.

The first meeting was held in the latter part of October. Children who had read the advertisement in the paper and were interested in producing a slide-show, and art show and their own magazine, attended that first meeting and subsequent meetings held in November.

SPOKE TO CLASSES

In the meantime, the two brothers went to each of the schools and spoke to individual classes about what they hoped to

achieve with the money.

Children then signed up for what interested them the most. The fact that two-thirds of the objective of the grant - the art show and the magazine - did not materialize means, Collins said, that nothing was forced on the kids that they weren't interested in themselves.

"I felt it was necessary when applying for the grant to give the project more than just one goal," Collins said, "and to make the project more interesting for the children."

What occurred later reflected a

lack of interest on the part of 50% of the children involved, Collins admitted.

DROPPED OUT

"Half the kids dropped out for lack of interest and others became disillusioned with the art show, or thought that to produce a magazine all they had to do was write a poem.

"As co-ordinators we could have forced them to do what I had told the government we would do," Collins said, "although it would have meant producing an art show and a magazine for no other reason."

As it turned out, six children stayed to the end of the grant and finished the slide-show, for themselves and for the community where they live.

Collins said that if enough people are interested he will show the slides again. "Also," he added, "I would be happy to show it to adult groups on the island such as the Rotary and Lions Clubs. The show is the property of the community."

Because it's the property of the community and the only independent effort made here for the Year of the Child, it should not be ignored. Also, the content of the show makes it a worthwhile evening's entertainment for young and old.

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

The Singular Life of Albert Nobbs

Nobbs latest Players production

Although not the sort of thing one reads about in the newspapers every day, the happenstance of a woman taking on the guise of a man, living and working as a man, and successfully playing the male role until death, is not exactly an unknown happening. Historically the facade seems most often to be economically inspired in the sense that through it a woman might be able to break the traditional "unequal pay for equal work" pattern that has existed for women since time immemorial. Such is the theme of the Salt Spring Players production of *The Singular Life of Albert Nobbs*, a one-act drama to be presented at Mahon Hall on the evenings of March 28, 29 and 30.

Set in Dublin in the 1860's the play depicts, in a series of sequential tableaux, various high and low points in the life of a hotel waiter, one Albert Nobbs who, in fact, might more appropriately be named Alberta. Born a bastard, raised in a convent school, Albert entered the work-a-day world as a chambermaid.

In perhaps the one stroke of good luck in her whole life she dresses in men's clothes, applies for a waiter's job, and is accepted. Some

seven years pass, by which time she has become the second-floor, and best waiter in a fine, big, old Dublin hotel. Such is the situation when the play opens and Albert is about to meet another like herself.

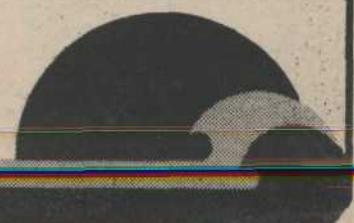

Bylaws upheld

Trustees at the time protested that the ministry of lands was ignoring local ordinances and permitting subdivision registrations that failed to comply with local bylaws.

The ministry and the courts have upheld the validity of local Trust bylaws and overruled the approving officer's decision, the council learned.

Exercise sees islands enclosed in oil

The islands were surrounded by a slick of oil as far north as Ladysmith when a tanker went aground on Tumbo Island on December 22.

The exercise was carried out by provincial environmental agencies to test the response of all concerned.

There were no punches pulled. Each organization was required to go into high gear and do exactly what should be done under those conditions.

The location was Tumbo Island; the date was December 22 and the disaster was imagined. And each functionary fulfilled his own role.

Islands Trust chairman John Rich was there to fulfill his role of observer.

The tanker was carrying 30,000 tons and the massive oil slick was caused by the 10,000 tons which leaked out.

SLICK NORTH

Within hours the slick was around Tumbo and within days the southeast winds had carried it throughout the Gulf Islands. A week later the slick extended as far north as Lasqueti.

In the opinion of the authorities engaged in the exercise it was possible to protect some of the islands, but with notable limitations.

There is no way of containing oil in a current exceeding 1½ knots, said the chairman. The participants had been warned that there was no equipment available to handle a flow in excess of two miles per hour. Oil cannot be contained in rough weather, he was warned.

The participants in the exercise were not permitted to call for

equipment that is not at hand. The exercise had 50,000 feet of boom at its disposal, which could cut off a small area.

TO GABRIOLA

The prediction of oceanographers taking part was that oil smeared every inch of coastline up to Gabriola.

John Rich's tale was taken up by John Burton, provincial emergency program co-ordinator.

There are about 600 incidents on the coast each year involving oil spills, or two to three a day, said Burton.

Although the federal government is the lead agency in matters of aircraft, ship or industrial spills, each government has its own responsibilities. The federal agency is also responsible for spills in areas under the direction of the Harbours Board and for spills of unknown origin.

When oil gets into the sea, there are two governments to know why, and to meet the challenge it presents, explained Burton.

Irrespective of the cause of the

spill, the responsibility is basic, he noted. Whoever spills pays.

REPRESENTATION

The problem facing the ministry was not that of payment for clean-up when the Islands Trust considered the protection of island waters. It was lack of representation among the islands.

John Burton wanted the names of people who could be contacted in an emergency to initiate local participation.

"Basically we want a co-ordinator. We can call him and he sets up the emergency system. Oil Spill, earthquake, whatever!"

The Trust will furnish the emergency program department with a list of names in the islands.

Jim Tyhurst looked closely at disasters.

He saw two kinds. One leaves the social fabric of the community intact, such as an oil spill. The other shatters the ordinary routine of the community, as an earthquake.

They are all the responsibility of the emergency program.

Environmental impact

Assessment required

Environmental impact assessments will be required in all feasibility studies carried out in the islands. The cost of the study will be borne by the developer.

Decision was reached on Saturday regarding the details of the program when the Islands Trust council debated the proposal.

The Trust agreed last December that environmental impact assessment should be made as an integral part of the planning and conduct of all feasibility studies.

The Trust will direct its concern to the social impact of a proposal as well as to the physical effect.

Under the new proposal a development in the islands must be assessed in terms of how it might affect people in the community, their social relationships, values and mode of life, attitudes and preferences.

The program calls for a public hearing at the time of initiating the study, in order that the community may be aware of the project and able to express an opinion. Second public hearing will be staged at the conclusion of the studies.

JOINT CHOICE

The consultants engaged in carrying out the studies would be selected by the developer and the Trust, jointly.

Laurence Fisher of Lasqueti

cited the B.C. Hydro procedure as the antithesis of the Trust proposal. Hydro selected its own consultants and laid down the guidelines before the public even knew a study was being made, he recalled.

Complete set of guidelines was presented by Jim Tyhurst and debated at length by the Trust council.

The final approval of the program took a long debate.

The main points at issue were the responsibility for the study. It was not acceptable to trustees if the consultants were to be chosen by the applicants.

In presenting the findings of his committee, Jim Tyhurst urged that the guidelines were the essence of the proposal and that they were prepared to protect the interests of the islands communities.

FROM START

The environmental impact assessment will be made in terms of short-term effects and long-term. The studies will be carried out from the moment of planning or feasibility studies are initiated.

The public will be kept informed. When the consultants are named by the Trust and the applicant, the public will be informed promptly.

The definition of a public hearing will be offered by the ultimate bylaw to ensure that its conduct will be clear and distinct.
