

Island students prepare for visit to Montreal area school

The desire to learn will soon bridge the gap between two groups of secondary school students who geographically, at least, are worlds apart.

A group of 31 Gulf Islands School District French language students will participate in a cultural exchange program with a similar number of students from a Montreal area high school, beginning later this month.

English language students from Jacques Rousseau Composite High School in Longueuil will arrive in the Gulf Islands for an eight-day stay beginning April 27.

While here, the Quebec students will billet with Gulf Islands students and their families.

Secondary school students from this district, including 16 from Salt Spring Island and 15 from the Outer Islands are to return to Longueuil with their new-found friends on May 5, also for an eight-day stay.

The 31 students from this district will then be billeted at the homes of the Quebec students.

CULTURAL AWARENESS

Bob McWhirter, principal of Gulf Islands Secondary School, said that the purpose of the exchange program is the increase cultural awareness on the part of both groups of students.

Spending time in a culturally-distinct environment is the best way to accomplish this, he said.

While in the province of Quebec, the Gulf Islands students will visit cultural centres, go on field trips and call on Jacques Rousseau Composite High School. They

even plan on spending a weekend in Quebec City.

Total cost of flying the Gulf Islands students to Quebec is \$10,450, most of which is either coming out of their parents' pockets or they are raising themselves, according to McWhirter.

Organizing activities for the Quebec students during their stay and escorting the Gulf Islands students to that province will be three secondary school teachers. They are Susan Underwood, Glenda Kaiser and Pam Edge.

Curtis Bird, Malcolm Shoobraid, Adam Baines and the rest of the Rowdies defence were the workhorses in retaining the trophy at home.

HARRY NICHOLS TROPHY

The Wranglers met the Division 6C league champs and found out why they were on top as they fell 3-0 to Peninsula Warriors. An early goal by Peninsula set the tempo for the match as the Wranglers valiantly tried to fight back for the rest of the game.

BASIL CARTWRIGHT TROPHY

The Kanaka Cosmos met Oak Bay in the only girls match of the tourney and came up with their finest team effort of the season, even though they dropped a tough

1-0 decision. Strong performances from Christie Aust, Laura Hynes, Natalie Blomley and Jennifer Anderson stabilized the Cosmos' defence and with a little more offensive punch, they might have stolen victory.

STAN WAGG TROPHY

A classic Strikers-Sooke battle with the Strikers coming out 4-2 winners on penalty shots. Sooke grabbed the early lead and appeared to have victory sewn up with time running out. By half-time the Mothers started coming on and in the second half they rallied, even with appeals for foul on the officiating.

Two goals by Donna McWhirter and a single from Rose Caspar put the game into penalty shots. Donna and Carol Lane scored for the Mothers while Charlie Hume scored for the Allstars on penalty

shots, giving the Mothers the Cup.

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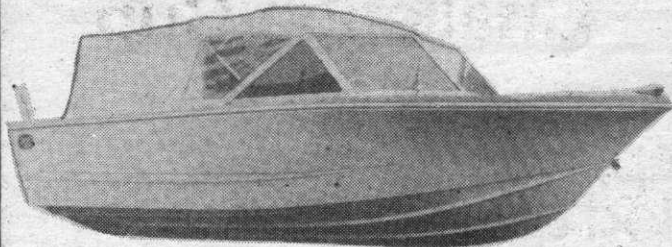
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Kicks go down to 5-2 count, lose Drummond trophy

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Two success stories for SPCA

The Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) has been kept busy for the past several weeks tending to animals found sick or injured on Galiano Island.

A young 40-pound beaver was recently released in the wilds by a conservation officer with the ministry of fish and wildlife after making a complete recovery from a bout of pneumonia.

Discovered on Galiano on March 28, the beaver was rushed to Salt Spring Island aboard the Queen of Sidney. It was then taken to the home of Christine Wooldridge, an inspector with the SPCA where it was treated with antibiotics and nursed back to good health.

Wooldridge said that the young male refused food for the first five days but eventually took to eating windfall apples and willow twigs.

COMPLETE RECOVERY

Having made a complete recovery, the beaver was released April 7 near a lake on Vancouver Island, where Wooldridge says that there should be plenty of room for him to establish a home for himself.

She also reports that a young bald eagle found shot on Galiano on March 14 is progressing well at the home of a Saanich woman who has nursed several other injured bald eagles back to health.

Shot through the wing, the bird had a nine-inch stainless steel pin

placed in its shattered ulna bone five months before it can be determined whether the eagle will fly again.

Minister to take close look at Cabinet orders for Ganges

Letter to Dr. N.P. Merkeley of Old Scott Road, Ganges from Bill

Vander Zalm, Minister of Municipal Affairs was given to the Capital Regional Board last week.

"As you are aware," wrote Vander Zalm, "Mr. Justice John Gould, recently set aside the 1978 order from the provincial director of pollution control to the Capital Regional District to install a sewerage system at Ganges."

Gould said that the pollution control branch director did not have the statutory authority to issue the order and it is void.

"The authority of the supplementary letters patent issued, pursuant to the order, has been thrown into question. My staff is now studying this particular issue," said the minister.

The Supplementary Letters Patent authorizes maximum borrowing power. The board would have had to submit a loan authorization bylaw to the Inspector of Municipalities for his approval before the actual works could have started, added the letter.

Salt Spring Regional Director Yvette Valcourt presented a copy of the letter to her fellow directors, during a debate on the Ganges sewer project.

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

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Down Through the Years With Driftwood

Last week Papajohn wrote his last Saturna column for Driftwood. A correspondent for the past 10 years, John McMahon died on Monday in a Victoria hospital. Just last week Papajohn wrote in jest of a fall he had suffered in his kitchen. It was the fall that contributed to his death when minor injuries led to more serious ills. A former Vancouver druggist, Papajohn came to Saturna to retire and took to writing weekly columns that were filled with humour and that reminded us that nothing can be as serious as we would have it.

Saturday's recreation referendum on Salt Spring Island went down to defeat by a narrow eight-vote margin. The results of the poll saw 431 in favour of taking over the Lions recreation project at Central with 439 opposing the idea. The referendum asked for a one-year, single-shot levy of 2½ mills to acquire the 10-acre recreation property and to provide tennis, soccer and track facilities for immediate use. The Lions Club will consider continuing the project without assistance from ratepayers.

The Legion is thirsting for blood and is offering a trophy to the Salt Spring Island club or association that makes the largest proportionate contribution at the next blood donor clinic. The Canadian Red Cross is concerned that the cost of coming to the island for small quantities of blood is becoming prohibitive. The Royal Canadian Legion acts as a sponsor for the

Red Cross clinic. The next clinic will be in Ganges on May 10.

The Salt Spring Island recycling program will continue this year thus dispelling rumours that the program was threatened by budget cuts. Capital Regional District director George Heinekey explained that recycling will continue virtually as it did last year. The program has received wide support by a large section of the community. Recycling converts cans, paper glass and other waste products into useable commodities.

Salt Spring Island residents' contribution to the Capital Regional District will be down this year with a mill rate of 5.08 compared to 5.16 last year. The levy this year, or the actual amount of money sought by the district from ratepayers here is \$517 more than last year. Assessments have risen considerably during the past 12 months, however, thereby reducing the mill rate. The effect is to distribute the tax burden among a greater number of taxpayers.

TEN YEARS AGO
A Salt Spring Island resident lost a sizeable deposit he paid for a prefabricated building ordered from the mainland. When the building never arrived he launched an investigation that revealed that the supply company had changed hands meaning he had lost his down payment. The man suggests that islanders buying from the mainland would do well to make arrangements for payment through a lawyer or a third party.

The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce is still asking for recommendations for the citizen-of-the-year for 1971. Any islander may name a candidate. The candidate must be a resident here and the sponsor must summarize their reasons for making the nomination.

The equivalent of nearly half a year's rain fell at Ganges during the first three months of 1971, according to dominion weather observer Howard Carlin. Nearly 18 inches of precipitation fell during the year's first quarter which compares to an average annual precipitation of between 37 and 45 inches.

Retiring NDP leader Tommy Douglas told a group of Salt Spring Island residents that local citizens should press the federal government to take unilateral action to curb the threat of large oil spills. Making specific reference to the supertanker route from Alaska, Douglas said that the government should amend the Canada Shipping Act by declaring a 100-mile pollution control zone along the Pacific and Atlantic coasts. Ships carrying pollutants should not be allowed within these limits unless the ship has first passed navigational regulations, he said. Douglas commented upon the whole pollution issue during a testimonial dinner for him earlier this week at the Salt Spring Golf Club. He is retiring as member of parliament for Nanaimo and the Islands.

Racing against the clock, a

number of Salt Spring Island students are busy putting the finishing touches to their sabot sailing dinghies in preparation for the planned sailing regatta in Ganges Harbour later next month. At least 15 students are expected to participate in the event during the May 24 holiday weekend. They will be competing for prizes and the Warren Hastings Trophy. The boats are being built by the students during their school term.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO
A 90-year-old Salt Spring Island man was killed instantly when he was struck by an auto while out walking along Fulford-Ganges Road late Saturday night. It was reported that the man was walking down the centre lane of the roadway and that he was wearing dark clothing at the time. The vehicle that struck him was driven by a Fulford man.

A Nanaimo-based government tracker and his dogs will pay a visit to the north end of Galiano Island shortly, amid reports that a cougar is on the prowl. Well known cougar tracker Bob Akerman will not take part in the hunt due to the recent death of his hound Pearl.

A 35-year-old Richmond man is missing and presumed drowned while fishing from an eight-foot plywood boat off Welbury Point on Sunday night. The man and his wife were camping there at the time. His wife notified the authorities when her husband failed to return to the campsite. The RCMP police boat, *Sidney*, co-ordinated a search of the area

around Captain's Pass. The man's body has yet to be found and search operations are continuing. The boat was discovered on the Scott Point side of Welbury Bay on Monday.

TWENTY YEARS AGO
Two young Salt Spring Island brothers are in the process of converting an old Fulford farm into a rainbow trout farm that will eventually produce an estimated one million fish per year. With the recent hatching of about 100,000 eggs, the farm, located on Fulford Creek, has already produced about 8,000 trout measuring from 6 to 13 inches in length. Stan and Joe Moulton expect that their major market will be the hotels, cafes and butcher shops on Vancouver Island and the lower mainland.

More than 30 boats of various descriptions set out from Scott Point Marina, the starting point of the Predicted Log Race to Vancouver last Saturday. Boats from the Vancouver, New Westminster and Burrard Yacht Clubs participated in the race with entries ranging from a 21-foot outboard to a 70-foot converted sub-chaser. The slower boats began leaving shortly after midnight, with the faster vessels on their way by early Sunday morning. Heavy seas with eight-foot waves in the gulf forced five boats to turn around and head back to Nanaimo. First prize was again taken by *Janra* of the Burrard Yacht Club which also won last year's race. She was skippered by Ralph Madison.

Water problems

Fulford water users still warned to treat water

A recommendation from the Capital Regional District's health services office that Fulford residents treat their water is still in effect nearly two months after they were informed that the bacteria count had reached unacceptable standards.

The department has cautioned

residents that they should either boil or add bleach to their water before drinking it.

This latest recommendation follows a similar three-week warning in December, when householders in that area were originally advised to treat their water.

They were most recently advised in the form of a letter, received by most residents on February 18, from Tom Houston, the public health inspector at the department's Sidney office.

Weston Lake is the primary source of domestic water for residents in the Fulford area and service is provided by the Fulford Water District.

ABOUT 70 HOMES

Quentin Wilson, chairman of the board of trustees for the Fulford Water District, said that about 70 households in the village of Fulford are affected by the recommendation.

Another spokesman for the water district said that there is no prospect in sight of the end of the warning period.

Wilson explained that effluent, from sources yet to be determined, has been draining into the lake, causing bacteria to turn up in water samples taken from households in the area.

Dave Wakelyn, director of the CRD's public health inspection division, was unable to provide Driftwood with results of the tests that have been conducted but he did indicate that there was some cause for concern.

INCONSISTENT

He said that his office has obtained inconsistent results from water samples taken during the past four months from the water distribution system in that area.

"The bacteriological limit counts have been inconsistent and that's why we have cause for concern," said Wakelyn.

He said that any indication of contamination is unacceptable from a bacteriological or safety point of view.

"The only satisfactory testing would be if the results proved to be negative," said Wakelyn.

He explained that public health inspectors have been conducting a regular series of tests in the area since December when bacteria first began showing up in their samples.

At that time the CRD also issued a warning that residents should treat their water. The warning remained in effect for approximately three weeks, until which

time coliform tests once again proved negative.

VISUAL CHECKS

The inspectors have also been making visual checks of Weston Lake trying to determine whether houses along its shore are responsible for the contamination or whether effluent is draining into the lake from septic fields in the watershed area.

Wilson said that this is the first time that the Fulford Water District has been warned that bacteria counts are high.

He thinks that there may be a connection between the problem and an unseasonably high amount of rain that has fallen this past winter and early spring.

MORE RAIN, MORE TROUBLE

The months during which there has been the greatest amount of rainfall are also the months when the district has received unsatisfactory test results from the health services office, according to Wilson.

He said that the Fulford Water District has made arrangements for consulting engineers to conduct a study of the lake in order to trace where effluent is draining into it. They will also make a recommendation on how to control the contamination.

board in jeopardy, he pursued, and that would be improper.

If Municipal Affairs Minister Vander Zalm should decide that the Cabinet was in error in making the order, then any corrective measures would have to be taken by him and not by the board, said the former board chairman.

"The Capital Regional Board is responsible to the people of Ganges," continued the director. "Even if I felt as Director Valcourt, I would have to acknowledge that failure to proceed would put a significant number of people in jeopardy."

Campbell also warned that the board might well be liable to the people for the loss of the \$2 million if they destroyed the project.

"And if I wanted to destroy the project and I were not responsible I would do my best to delay it!"

Director Valcourt alone supported the motion.

Plane scare picnic for two

The Canadian Coast Guard station at Ganges was given a scare Thursday morning when it received a report that a plane was down near Third Sister Island in Ganges Harbour.

A quick run over in the Coast Guard cutter 122 however, revealed that two Victoria area men had literally dropped in for a quiet beach picnic at Clam Bay at the island's north end.

After making a water landing, the single engine pusher-type amphibious aircraft pulled up on the beach where the two men lit a fire in preparation for their lunch.

Frank Wilkins, coxswain, said that he cautioned the pair to make their plans known should they plan similar landings in the future.
