As you can see the presentations were plentiful as our teams had a very successful season, a reflection on the dedicated work all our coaches and managers did over the season.

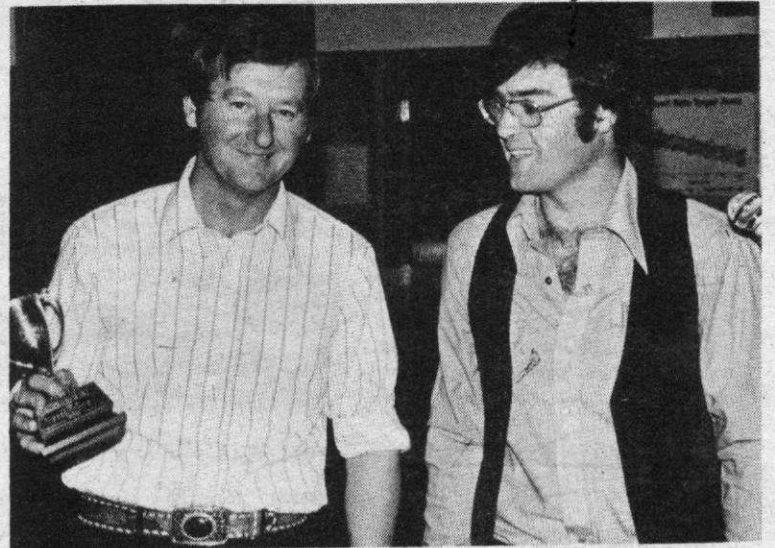
OFFICIALS RECOGNIZED

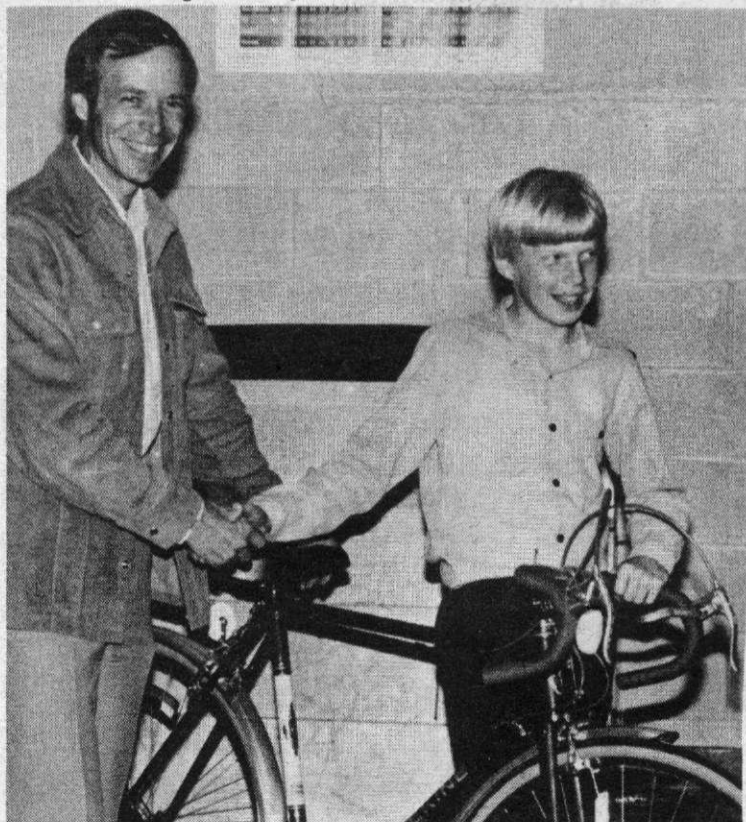

Busy month for Pender Farmers'

Pender Islands Farmers' Institute have had a busy month with two interesting events.

The first of these was a trip on April 12 to the South Pender Island greenhouses established just three years ago by Arthur Fulawka.

The group met at 11 am at the junction of Canal and Boundary Pass Drive on a rainy cool morning, and walked through the woods for about three-quarters of a mile to the point near the ocean where the two large greenhouses suddenly appeared through the trees.

This was a large grassy meadow with a sheer rock wall on one side rising straight up for several hundred feet, affording protection from the east wind. In all, approximately 75 people appeared and spent a couple of hours asking questions and being shown around by Art Fulawka.

Fulawka moved to South Pender Island from the Coquitlam area where he had been in the same business. He and his wife do all the work with the assistance of his two children helping part time. It is a family business with only very occasional employed help.

WHOLESALE OPERATION

The greenhouses are a wholesale operation and 90% of the sales go to the lower Mainland area to garden centres. Fulawka also grows on contract for some firms.

At present he delivers his goods himself with his own truck. At the Farmers' Market which operates at the Driftwood Centre during the

summer months his daughter Karen sells plants on a retail basis. Karen said that this year she plans to have a variety of plants on display from which she will take orders from her customers for later delivery.

Fulawka said his greenhouses are basically unheated. This is a saving over operating in the Coquitlam area where heat is needed in winter. On South Pender he finds the earlier season, milder climate with more sunshine quite an advantage, plus his greenhouses are protected from the wind by the high cliff on one side and a barrier of trees on the other.

PARTIALLY FINISHED

Fulawka has built two greenhouses. The second one is only partially finished and partially in use. It is 24 feet by 200 feet, is strongly braced against winds and is covered with plastic.

The bottom is sawdust to a depth of four inches and he estimated the cost to be about \$3 per square foot. He works on it in the

latter part of the summer, when the busy season is finished for plant sales.

The crowd then filed into the first greenhouse Fulawka built, which is totally in use now. This one is 35 feet by 200 feet. The plastic polyethylene, four mil, has to be replaced every two years on the roof.

The crowd had an interesting time examining all the bedding plants, perennials, fushias, many types of ivy, green-leafed plants, evergreens and asking Fulawka many questions which he patiently answered.

As Farmers' Institute members are constantly looking for ways to augment their income on their land, the Fulawka family greenhouses are an example of imagination, hard work, venture capital, knowledge and experience which to this reporter is bound to pay off. **AT MAYNE ISLAND**

The second interesting event sponsored by the Institute in April was a dinner held at the Mayne Island Agricultural Hall in conjunction with the Mayne Island Agricultural Society.

On April 28 about 20 members of the Pender Institute caught the 5:15 pm ferry to Mayne.

After dinner the speaker was Thomas Ovanin, research officer for the Islands Trust, who had been invited by the Mayne Agricultural Society. He is presently engaged in a study relating to the impact of logging on the Gulf Islands.

This study relates to logging particularly on private land; other types of logging are already regulated. He mentioned that on Mayne there are 930 acres in the Agricultural Land Reserve, which is 16% of the land base. In the Gulf Islands as a whole there are 20,000 acres in ALR, which is 20% of the land base.

David Crossfield, regional agriculturist for southern Vancouver Island and all the southern Gulf Islands, was the second guest speaker. He told the audience one of his main responsibilities is adult education in the agricultural field. Because the area he covers is large, he suggested to the audience that a

number of people with the same problems get together and contact him and he will arrange a time to visit them and in this way they can all help each other.

SELL TO ISLANDERS

Crossfield's suggestion to the islanders was to try to grow produce that they can sell to other islanders. On the islands the soil is mostly acid on which most vegetables will grow. He suggested also that islanders approach the health food stores in Victoria, Duncan and Sidney with the idea of selling

to them organically grown vegetables.

Crossfield reminded the audience of the provincial government loans to farmers, who can borrow up to \$25,000 at one-half the prime rate, simple interest, for a 15-year term.

This was an informal get-together and many members asked questions and spoke. Frank Jones of Pender told about the Farmers' Market which is looking forward to its third year and hopes to expand after two successful summers.

They will purchase a blanket licence for \$37,50 per half year which covers all who sell at the market. For those selling at the farm gate the license is now \$10, according to the new regulations for this year.

During the various discussions, Ovanin told the audience that the high priority areas relating to agricultural land are being re-mapped, as when the Islands Trust was first established the mapping was done rather hurriedly, and is now being examined in more detail.

Mrs. Marjorie Haggart is president of the Mayne society and the evening was convened by one of its directors, Ron Pither.

GALIANO NEWS

Bluff Park recommendations endorsed

A general meeting of the Galiano Club was held in the Community Hall on April 28. President Bill Duncan announced that donations towards the maintenance of the dump had reached \$1,900, and that this would cover a considerable part of the operating costs anticipated for 1981. Membership had increased to over 180 of whom more than a third were present at the meeting. A quorum was questioned but since by bylaw this is 10%, the required number was exceeded by a wide margin.

Another attempt to postpone the meeting was made on the grounds that weekenders who are members of the club are unable to attend mid-week meetings. The president pointed out that less than 10% of club members are known to be in this category, and that at least two full weeks notice of the meeting had been given, and that two detailed reports and the executive's recommendations had been mailed out in plenty of time for objections to be raised. A majority then endorsed the president's stand and the meeting proceeded.

MOVED ADOPTION

With the marathon meeting of Friday the 24th in mind, Charles Gardner moved that the directors' recommendations regarding Bluff Park be adopted. This did not please the protagonists of the majority and minority reports on the administration of Bluff Park, who wanted a more lengthy consideration of their work. However, there was considerable antipathy to the prospect of another interminable meeting and debate proceeded on the motion.

Ken Hardy produced charts and arguments to buttress his contention that his arithmetic was impeccable and that 72% of the respondents to the questionnaire were content to have the administration of the park remain with the Galiano Club.

Discussion meandered over old ground but the motion to endorse the following recommendations was carried by a substantial majority.

1. That the annually elected directors of the Galiano Club be responsible for the administration of the Bluffs Trust Park Agreement.

2. That the bylaws of the club be altered so that it will never be necessary to elect a complete slate of officers in one year. Overlapping terms would ensure continuity.

3. That the 14 acres of Section 2 and 80 acres of Section 4, commonly known as the Bluffs, will not be considered as revenue producing areas.

4. That from time to time, if the need arises for revenue to pay for the care and maintenance of the park, only the northerly 237 acres of Section 4 may be used for logging.

5. That with the aid of volunteers, fire roads and nature walks be maintained and dangerous trees removed.

6. That horse trails be limited to the 237 acres of Section 4.

7. That no campsites or motorized vehicles be permitted within the park.

8. That the park be regularly patrolled during the summer months.

9. That the club president appoint two directors to head up a group of interested parties to carry out the club policy with respect to the park.

It now remains for the executive of the Galiano Club to take steps to ensure implementation of the foregoing recommendations. It is to be hoped that islanders having endorsed the club's stewardship of Bluff Park by majority vote are now willing to let the controversy die and give their full support to the club.

Bridge

At what will probably be the last duplicate tournament of the season, winners were Bill Paterson partnered by Kitty Weaver. Runners-up were Lorna Tweedale and Pat Weaver.

This will do nothing to enhance Kitty's contention that husband Pat is the better bridge player.

colourful backdrop painted by Christine Connelly and friends, with farm props organized by stage manager cum band-leader Elizabeth Brinson.

Ursula Medley wishes to thank the musicians, actors, kitchen helpers and the audience who all contributed to the success of the evening — and incidentally for raising money for a most deserving cause, to supply much needed equipment for the Galiano preschool.

Nature Notes

Orchids and mushrooms have very little in common except that their exact location should only be revealed to those who can be trusted. No, dear reader, this does not refer to you but only to those other readers who would steal our mushrooms or pick our orchids.

Wild orchids cannot be transplanted for a variety of reasons. Spotted coral-root, now in bloom, is a case in point. A true saprophyte, it has no chlorophyll and lives on decaying organic matter in equilibrium with several fungi, so there is no green colour or true leaves. Flowers are small but typical orchid shape with white or translucent petals liberally spotted with purple. If transplanted it is deprived of its symbiotic fungi and dies.

The morels are now finished and the postmaster has gathered his annual crop from his secret site and generously donated them to fungophiles. Now the false-morel or brain mushroom can be found with its chocolate-brown convoluted cap, quite easily distinguished from the light-brown pitted, conical cap of the true morel. This distinction is fortunate

as the brain mushroom is considered unsafe to eat.

Definitely poisonous is the light-tan, wart-spotted panther agaric which is very common at present. It has been the cause of many cases of mushroom poisoning, especially among children.

Up to date 129 man/woman hours of work have been given by volunteers for the improvement of the North End Community Hall and its surroundings. The ample parking space provided for patrons of last Saturday's Plant, Book and Bake Sale is a direct result of that labour.

The fourth work bee is to be held on Saturday. Volunteers with clippers and other cutting instruments are needed to clear trails. They are also reminded to write their names on the master-worklist just inside the hall door, for the great event of the North End year.

The regular monthly meeting of the Ladies Service Club will be held in Page Drive Lounge on Monday, May 11 at 2 pm.

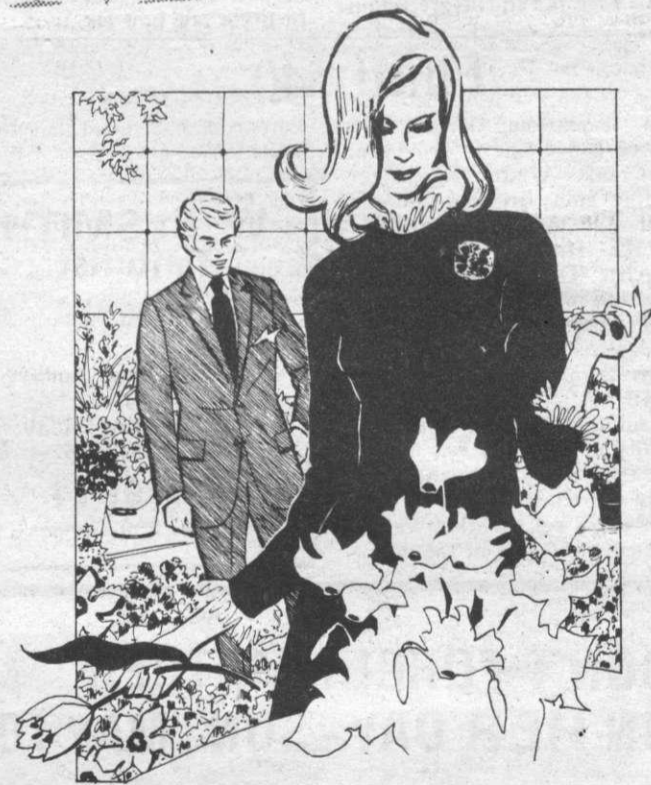

Down Through the Years With Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

The Canadian Red Cross and the Ganges branch of the Royal Canadian Legion have made final preparations for this Monday's blood donor clinic at the Legion Hall. The Legion is asking for the full support of Gulf Islands residents. There are concerns that the Red Cross may discontinue the clinics here unless there is a marked increase in the amount of blood donated. The cost of collecting blood is disproportionately higher in the islands due to transportation costs.

Transport Minister Jack Davis announced last week a staggering rate hike of nearly 400% in B.C. Ferry fares for Gulf Islands residents travelling to Vancouver Island. Effective June 1, a Salt Spring Island couple driving to Victoria will pay \$9 for the return trip compared to the present rate of \$2.50. It will cost an Outer Island couple travelling to Vancouver Island \$12.80 as opposed to \$3.70 now. While rates are going up throughout the province, Gulf Islanders will be hardest hit by the rate increases since the provincial government has also done away with commuter tickets. The government also announced that there will be a further increase within the next two years.

Two North Salt Spring Waterworks District trustees were re-elected by acclamation last week at the utility's annual meeting. Stan Sage and J.J. Fairlie are to serve additional three-year terms. Norman Mouat assumed duties as chairman of the district. He replaces Sage who relinquished his chair during the election. Also named by the meeting was auditor L.W. Linnitt.

Members of the Salt Spring Island Planning Association expressed concern earlier this week at a public hearing over the possible effect that recent zoning applications would have, if approved, on the Ganges area. It is feared that an amendment to zoning bylaw 66 will lead to ribbon development of Ganges. Chairman Henry Elder presented a brief on behalf of the committee for the planning of the community of Ganges requesting that the application be held in abeyance until the Ganges plan is complete and a decision has been reached on installation of a sewer system.

Members of the Salt Spring Island Fire Department fought a spectacular blaze in downtown Ganges one night last week but it turned out that they were only practicing for the real thing. The department had been waiting for a calm evening to complete the destruction of a vacant and condemned house on McPhillips Avenue. The house was beyond repair and its owner had offered it to the firemen for practice. Fire chief Kelly Hanke said that the practice session gave most of the volunteers their first taste of fighting a downtown fire and the special problems involved.

TEN YEARS AGO

Tommy Douglas, retiring leader of the federal New Democratic Party, will be the guest speaker at the annual dinner meeting of the

Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce later this week. As MP for Nanaimo, Cowichan and the Islands, Douglas will discuss the future of the Canadian economy and prospects for the islands in particular. The meeting will be held at the Golf and Country Club.

The medical officer for Greater Victoria has warned residents dependent upon the Money Brothers and Pendersen Water System at Saturna Island to boil their water due to excessive levels of contamination. Dr. J.L.M. Whitbread said that residents should be aware that the system does not meet the requirements of the provincial department of health or the Greater Victoria Metropolitan Board of Health. He assured residents that they will be notified when arrangements have been completed to treat the water supply.

Once the facts were known, members of the Gulf Islands School Board made up their minds that the district had little to gain from amalgamation with the Saanich School District. Trustees from the two districts met at a second joint meeting last weekend to discuss the pros and cons of amalgamation. Representatives from the department of education were there to fill in the details of how amalgamation would affect both districts. It was determined that Gulf Islands residents would experience an immediate property tax increase with an eight-point leap in the mill rate while any educational advantages would be somewhere down the road.

An outline of the proposed interim zoning bylaw for the Outer Islands will be presented this week at a public meeting that has been called by the Capital Regional District's planning division. The meeting will be held at Galiano Hall. It's expected that the meeting will draw a large turnout since the future planning of Galiano Island will be determined.

Cusheon Lake is not suited to use as a landing base for float planes, the Salt Spring Island Planning Association was told Monday night. Spencer Marr, who advised that a plane had landed on the lake during the weekend, cautioned that the size and nature of the lake prohibits its use for sea planes.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO
Beaver Point School is to receive a face-lifting from members of the Salt Spring Island Lions Club in preparation for the nation's centennial celebrations next year. The Beaver Point Hall Committee will supply the materials and the Lions Club will donate the labour. The historic building will receive a new roof, paint job and a general cleanup.

The B.C. Forest Service has announced that measures for the protection of forests went into effect April 30 and will run through to the end of October at which time the dry season ends. No outdoor fire may be lit without a permit for any purpose within a half mile of any forest or woodland. The regulations also require that burning permits be acquired from a forest ranger office for the burning off of cleared land.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

It was quite a caper. Playing three evenings to a full house, the Salt Spring Island Lions Club production of Island Capers was viewed as a smash success. The musical comedy, based on a Hawaiian theme, was written and directed by Ted Jansch and Ed Richardson. The story told of a group of Salt Spring Islanders who travelled to a Lions Club convention in Hawaii and who disrupted the proceedings by promoting the island as the Hawaii of Canada.

The school board passed a resolution at last week's special meeting to censure the minister of education for the government's decision to reduce its contribution from about 42%, the amount that it paid last year, to about 26% this year. It's expected that the reduction will cost property owners here about \$36,000 and will result in an increased mill rate of about three mills. The board claims that the ministry is manipulating the tax structure by placing more of a burden on rural areas while reducing taxes in more highly developed areas.

At Fulford

Delegation seeks kindergarten

A delegation of 10 parents and four of their children approached the Gulf Islands School Board during last Tuesday's meeting to press for kindergarten classes in the Fulford area beginning in September.

Carole Eyles, speaking on behalf of the group, told the board that it is expected that about 21 children will be of kindergarten age in September at the south end of the island.

She said that the board would be faced with the prospect of transporting a full class of children the nine miles or more to Salt Spring Elementary School if facilities aren't made available at Fulford.

"In view of the overcrowding situation at Salt Spring Elementary School, the long bus ride with older children, and the need for parents to transport kindergarten children one way, we find the continuation of the present system most undesirable," Eyles read from a prepared statement.

THREE SITES

The parents suggested three possible sites, including Beaver Point Hall, Fulford Hall and the unused Burgoyne Bay United Church, in which to hold temporary classes until construction of an elementary school can be completed.

The delegation also requested that the board immediately undertake construction of an elementary school in Fulford. They mentioned, as a possible site, a spot near the intersection of Isabella Point Road and Fulford-

Ganges Road.

They were informed that the board has already received final approval of its 1981 capital expenditure program, in excess of \$760,000, from the provincial government.

INCLUDED \$80,000

Included in this amount was \$80,000 for the purchase and development of approximately five acres for future construction of a four-room school in the Fulford area.

The board had been investigating a site for its South Salt Spring elementary school in the vicinity of Beaver Point and Stewart Roads.

It is not expected, however, that a new school will open until at least September 1983.

Bob Huestis, district superintendent, said that while there may be justification for commencing kindergarten classes at Fulford, there are other considerations involved. He recommended that the board take a long hard look at the situation before committing itself to a kindergarten.

TRANSPORTATION

Eyles also questioned whether the board would continue to provide school bus transportation

for children should it choose to go ahead with a kindergarten there in the fall.

She suggested that as the district is already busing children all the way to Ganges and that it should continue bus service in Fulford.

Jim Ripley, Galiano trustee, questioned whether providing kindergarten transportation service in Fulford would require the addition of another bus to the district's fleet. He also wanted to know what distances would be involved in busing children from the surrounding area to a centralized kindergarten.

Chairman Strick Aust said that most children would likely be located within a short distance of the three proposed sites and that those who weren't could likely be transported by alternative means.

At Aust's suggestion the matter was turned over to two committees which are to look into the situation and report back to the board.

The buildings and grounds committee will investigate available locations in Fulford and the finance committee will determine whether to purchase furniture and equipment for a kindergarten.

They'll take own lunches for parents group benefit

With a little enticement from trustee Vivian Pinteau, members of the Gulf Islands School Board have agreed to brown bag it for lunch day one day next week.

The money the trustees save by not dining out will be used to meet the operating expenses of the Salt Spring Elementary Parent Advisory Committee.

The parent advisory committee approached the board about one

month ago and requested approximately \$100, most of which will go towards paying for advertising.

The board had earlier agreed to assist parent advisory groups in the district.

The dessert suggestion won out, however, and Davidson voted along with the rest.

The board members generally adjourn to a local restaurant between their in-committee and public meetings.

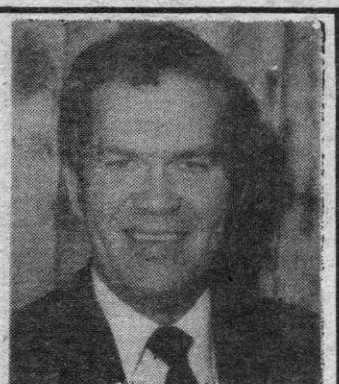
