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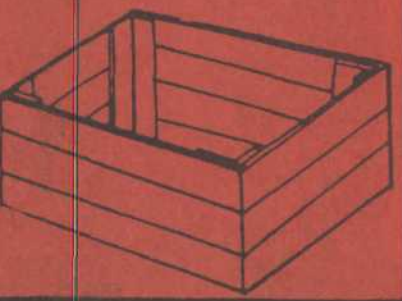
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Depression!

I had intended to write only about Nicaragua. But Sunday morning — Mother's Day — Iona Skinner talked at the United Church about "The greatest gift of all" — so I must write a little about love.

It's not hard to moralize, when you write, or even think about love. Iona talked about love being action. In the New Testament, it's used as a verb more often than as a noun. She said even skeptics and atheists appreciate and agree that love is the finest attribute of the human race.

A sign at the old X-Kalay house in Vesuvius said: "Work is Love in Action". I viewed that with some reservations. Would it were so! Many people feel badly about the way they earn their living. But perhaps the worse it is, the higher the degree of love it shows. You work for others as well as yourself, to prove your love for them?

Iona Skinner told us of the woman who hadn't read a newspaper for six months. She didn't want to know about the world's problems. She was OK. That clearly is not love. And that clearly is one of the problems we have faced ever since we came down from the trees or climbed up out of the sea. "I'm all right, Jack," was an English expression which became a hilarious movie. "I couldn't care less," was its North American counterpart. It's the other side of the coin to "Why should this happen to me?" — implying it would be OK if it happened to anyone else!

A MONUMENT

El Salvador is a monument to lack of love which we are building with our neglect and indifference. The news that some soldiers have finally been arrested for the murder of four American missionaries is good in that it acknowledges for the first time violence done by the establishment. If they deal thus with nationals of a powerful foreign power; with missionaries who are there for good, as opposed to subversive and wicked ends, it lends credence to the reports we have heard about their behaviour to their own peasants. These may not be wicked exaggerations of communist inspired journalists!

Anyone who fears I have communist tendencies must read this month's *MS* magazine. I could not survive a week in a system which stamps out dissent and starves you while so doing!

Did I ever tell you the story of the first Russian liner which visited London after the revolution? We who had just seen the removal of a whole class of railway carriages were astounded to find that the Russian vessel had no less than seven classes of accommodation! Of course they weren't catering to their own people, but it was a clear indication of how they perceived the rest of the world.

Renie House has lived on Saturna for 13 years now. She came to help start the Free School

and has stayed as a member of Payne Farm and Saturna's community.

I was born in Saskatchewan and grew up in a little elevator town, Altacane. It was an area of mixed farming. Later, I came to Vancouver where my mother's family was.

Tom Durrie, Bill and Kathy Sheffeld and I met at a free school in Vancouver. We started looking for a permanent site to start a school. Every time we found a place big enough, major remodeling would have had to be done to meet regulations. Tom saw the ad for the place on Saturna. We came to look at it in July and by fall we were here.

When I first came here it never occurred to me to make friends with the islanders and be part of the community; I was here for a purpose, I didn't come to be an islander. I was on duty 24 hours a day at the school which was its own community.

Yes, I do have some lasting impressions. Riding in Jim Campbell's boat, the *Ann Elizabeth*. I had never been in a boat, except a canoe on a lake, never been on an island before. Also, I remember the cliffs, and dealing with keeping warm in the winter. It took a year before I really noticed I was on an island, a year to feel at home.

DIDN'T CONSIDER LEAVING

No, I didn't consider leaving when the free school was shut down. The day we got our eviction notice my father gave Jo-Anne and I each a heifer. So, I was optimistic even though it was a dramatic, emotional time. We decided that since we had the 28 acres we would have a more agricultural thrust.

At the moment I couldn't imagine living anywhere else. But I could be put in any natural surroundings and if I stayed long enough I would come to love them. This particular island is special to me.

I value the friendliness of the people, I equate it with remoteness. And tolerance, people are understanding and don't hold anything against each other. People are sympathetic, they feel for each other. People look after their own; in the city you'd call up "somebody" who is in charge and they would "tend" to it.

Right now I'm studying botany and, specifically, seaweeds. The courses I've taken help me to know Saturna better. I'm in my third year at the University of Victoria. I go to school because I like learning, I like learning with people. I need someone to interact with on the subjects I'm studying. I'm moved to know more than just humans. I know all the families (of plants and animals) and what's significant about them, on Saturna.

I see that cow with a different eye now, I have more patience.

Learning has made me less critical. Right now I'm fascinated by art, seaweeds and plant genetics. No, I don't have a specific goal. I appreciate the world I live in; the individual and specific beauty of what's around me.

Something that my hometown and Saturna have in common is isolation, remoteness. I think that makes people very friendly and neighbours interdependent. People in the city say, "Aren't you isolated on an island with nobody around to talk to?"

It's the opposite — in the city you can talk but people often don't care. Here they know you and they do care.

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Firemen called when welding tanks ignite

The Salt Spring Island Fire Department was on the scene within a matter of minutes Monday morning after being alerted that a pair of welding tanks were burning out of control in a workshop at Gulf Coast Materials on Rainbow Road.

Two employees, Louis Renaud and Roger Cooper, were working in the shop at the time.

It's suspected that gas from a leaking acetylene tank was ignited by a stray metal shaving from a grinding machine that Cooper was operating. A nearby oxygen tank that had been left with an open valve also caught fire.

Firemen soon extinguished the flaming oxygen tank. Within a short time they had also removed the still ignited acetylene tank to an outside parking area where residual gas was allowed to burn itself off.

Fire chief Bob Leask said that there was no real danger once the tank had been removed from the building.

Welding tanks usually have two safety valves which quickly blow to allow expanding gas to escape. Once the valves have blown, however, there is no way to shut off the escaping gas and a few firemen were forced to remain at the scene for about half an hour dousing the burning gas with water.

Renaud, who placed the call to the fire station, said both he and Cooper fled the building once the tanks caught fire for fear that there might be an explosion.

Renaud had just finished calling the department and was running out the door towards the road when he heard the siren of the approaching fire truck.

He praised the department for its quick response.

An estimate of the damage has not been completed but it is not believed to be extensive. A charred ceiling joist, electrical damage and a broken release valve on the acetylene tank were the only obvious signs of damage.

Organization of coast watchers first step by Lifeboat Society

On Sunday evening 26 people gathered at the Pender Island School-Community Centre to learn about the newly formed British Columbia Lifeboat Society (BCLS).

The first speaker was Wynne Powell of Pender Island who said the BCLS will be a registered society and will cover the area from Victoria to Prince Rupert. The purpose of the society is to work towards safety on the water and there are no restrictions for membership. Time is critical in saving lives in the cold waters off our coast and it is here that coast watchers can be invaluable.

To be a coast watcher anyone with a view of the water can assist by filling out the application which Norton distributed to the audience. This applies to all the Gulf Islands. Those wishing an application can pick one up at the Otter Bay Marina office, or by contacting Norton by phone (629-3387) or by writing to the B.C. Lifeboat Society, Pender Island.

WORK WITH COAST GUARD

The society is not a boating club. It will work in conjunction with the Coast Guard and other organizations dedicated to safety at sea. It is an association of members of boating clubs and other groups with the common aim to make activities on the water safer. You do not need to own a boat to become a coast watcher.

Powell said that once the organization expands to other islands and coastal areas and is functioning efficiently it hopes to affiliate with the Royal National Institution of England. Similar organizations operate in many areas of the world.

The application consists of a map on which the applicant pin-

points his residence. All this information will be computerized and the only obligation the coast watcher has is to report in the proper manner any unusual incidents he observes at sea. When his application is filed in the computer the applicant will be mailed a coast watcher's guide. There is no membership fee.

At the present time the federal government is making a study of search and rescue operations on this coast. It seems apparent that volunteer rescue people are a necessary adjunct to the Coast Guard with the number of boats on coastal waters. If they were organized they could provide a priceless service to the professional search and rescue organization.

The second speaker was Barry Hastings, station manager at Vancouver Coast Guard Radio.

REDUCES RESCUE TIME

Hastings said that the great value of coast watching is in reducing the Coast Guard's rescue time. He noted that it is essential to give the correct information when a boat is in trouble. Very often this does not happen, and time and money are wasted in searching unnecessarily.

Coast watchers in the area may

be contacted when distressed boaters call for help and time, money and sometimes lives can be saved. The correct information can be passed on to the Rescue Co-ordination Centre, Victoria. They are in direct contact with fire departments, ambulances, hospitals, R.C.M.P. and so forth.

A 15-minute documentary was shown which explained the many different types of shipping in B.C. coastal waters and the radio and telecommunications equipment used to handle it throughout the area. In 1980 the recorded incidents were three times those recorded in 1972.

Hastings said the Vancouver radio centre covers an area from the Arctic waters to the Manitoba border. It is logistically impossible to operate without volunteer assistance and financially impossible for governments to provide the only support. The coast watcher organization has worked well in other parts of the world and its initiation here will be the first project of the B.C.L.S.



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Easter weekend vandalism spree

One youth blamed for 49 signs

An unconfirmed report indicates that an Ontario youth may have been responsible, at least in part, for knocking over nearly 50 road signs during the Easter holiday weekend.

A Ganges woman says that during a brief conversation with the youth on Saturday, Apr. 18, he boasted of having knocked down numerous road signs and mailboxes with his automobile during a drunken vandalism spree the previous night.

Jamie Armstrong, who operates a hamburger concession at Centennial Park, says that both she and her husband reported what they knew to Ganges RCMP on three different occasions that weekend and that to their knowledge the detachment has yet to act upon the information.

NOT AWARE OF REPORT

Sgt. Mitch Hanks of the RCMP, who was on vacation at the time, said that he was not aware that the Armstrongs had filed any report with his detachment.

Hanks said that it was the first he had heard of their account of the incident but promised to look into the matter.

Armstrong said that she first noticed a badly damaged automobile parked at Centennial Park at about 6:30 am that Saturday while preparing to open for business.

She explained that the youth and his girl friend appeared a short time later and divulged how he had used the auto as a battering ram in knocking over numerous signs and mailboxes the previous night.

The youth, who Armstrong describes as being about 17 years of age, stated that he had been quite intoxicated at the time.

ON VACATION

During the conversation the youth also revealed that he was a resident of Ontario and was in the midst of a brief vacation on Salt Spring Island.

The youth explained how he had abandoned the vehicle the previous night after running out of gas.

Armstrong described the youth as appearing quite nervous about the automobile during the course of their conversation. He mentioned to her that he was anxious to have it refueled and kept out of sight for a few days.

She said that to her surprise the vehicle remained parked there all that day and that it was not until about 9 am Sunday that the pair returned with gasoline and left.

Armstrong describes the car as being tan in colour with a black vinyl top and bearing Ontario licence plates. She is uncertain about its year and make but did make a note of the licence plate number.

GREEN PAINT

The car also exhibited large patches of dark green paint which Armstrong assumes were picked up while knocking over mailboxes. The front end was badly

damaged and the vehicle's passenger side also bore several dents.

Armstrong said that she first phoned the RCMP detachment at about 8 am Saturday with an account of her conversation with the youth and also a description of the auto and its whereabouts.

When officers failed to appear she again phoned the detachment early that afternoon.

Police officers drove through the parking lot at least twice that day while on apparent routine patrols, according to Armstrong, but she notes that they drove by without stopping to examine the vehicle.

Her husband, Ed, spoke to an officer shortly before noon on Sunday at which time he also reported the incident.

Armstrong said that the youth was still in the area as late as last week and that she has seen both him and his girl friend playing frisbee at Centennial Park on at least two different occasions.

REPLACED 49 SIGNS

Ken Stevens, road foreman with the department of highways, said that all told, his men replaced 49 road signs that had been knocked over that weekend.

The total cost of repairing the signs came to \$524, which was more than one-fifth of what it cost to repair vandalized road signs during the previous 11 months. During that period it cost \$2,443 to repair or replace signs that were damaged on Salt Spring Island at the hands of vandals.

During that 11-month period beginning last May a total of 273 road signs were vandalized on the island.

Of the 49 signs vandalized Easter weekend, eight posts had to be completely replaced at a cost of \$116 or about \$14.50 apiece.

The remaining \$408 went towards paying for labour, equipment and fuel costs.

HALF-HOUR JOB

It's about a half-hour job just to place a downed road sign back into the ground, assuming it hasn't been snapped in half. With two

men working to a crew, each of whom is paid about \$11 per hour, it's an expensive proposition repairing signs and one which is hitting taxpayers where it hurts.

While more recent figures are not available, a study conducted in late 1979 revealed that it cost British Columbia ratepayers approximately \$300,000 that year to repair vandalized road signs.

Ray Baines, senior information officer with the department of transportation and highways, estimates that that figure has grown by about 30% as a result of inflation alone.

He suggested that the amount would have grown to at least \$390,000 by today's standards.

AT \$90,000

In district six, which includes all of Vancouver Island plus the Gulf Islands, the amount in 1979 stood at roughly \$90,000, or about \$117,000 today.

With a total of six highways districts throughout the province, the amount of money spent on repairing vandalized road signs in district six represents approximately 30% of the total amount spent in the province.

"It certainly was a higher proportion than in the other five districts," said Baines.

He terms this wanton destruction a "major problem" but was unable to suggest any reasons why this particular type of vandalism is so disproportionately higher in this area.

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'Hopeless spring' necessitates raised beds in wet garden

Well, I have gone and done it. In our main garden the water table is about an inch over ground level. A bit hopeless, this spring.

So I picked another spot, rototilled it and raised some beds and companion planted it, on Thursday, with the first quarter of the waxing moon in Cancer.

Raising beds was simple. I just dug out walks, about six inches deep, between three-foot-wide beds and tossed the soil on to the beds, raked the beds level, and, voila, les raised beds.

It is working well already. The beds lie east to west and the whole little garden is on a slight diagonal slope and is draining like a charm in today's downpour.

I have also stuck out my neck again and planted eight early tomato plants, two each of four different varieties. It is a gamble, but last year's tomato gamble paid off in the biggest and most abundant shrubs I have ever been eye to eye with.

TOPPLED THE CAGES

The weight of the fruit finally toppled the tomato cages. I tell you, it is quite an experience to stand eye to eye with a six-foot tomato shrub. Hope it works as well this year.

A further note on the raised beds. Since I did not enclose the beds with any kind of border, as this would provide hiding spaces for snails and slugs, I intend to let weeds, grass and clover grow on the shoulders of the beds to stabilize them and to retain moisture. An occasional shearing and removal of the odd pernicious weed should be all that will be required.

I am now the new owner of Llewellyn's 1981 Moon Sign Book which my wife picked up at Banyan Books in Vancouver for \$4.75. Our et cetera store usually carried them, but is out of stock temporarily, and Volume II carries it as well. There is a bewildering wealth of information in this little book which will take me some time to sort out. In the meantime, from their list of "important gardening dates," here follow a few dates and suggestions.

May 13, 10:25 pm to May 16, 10:38 am: plant annuals for fragrance and beauty; trim to increase growth. (Moon in Libra, second quarter).

May 16, 10:38 am to May 18, 7:04 pm: plant leafy annuals and grains (Scorpio, second quarter).

May 18, 7:04 pm to May 18, 11:15 pm: plant biennials, perennials, bulbs and roots. Fertilize (organic) and prune (Scorpio, third quarter).

May 18, 11:15 pm to May 21, 11:21 am: plant onions, cultivate, destroy weeds and pests, harvest fruit and root crops (Sagittarius, third quarter).

May 21, 11:21 am to May 23, 10:01 pm: plant potatoes and tubers, trim to retard growth (Capricorn, third quarter).

May 23, 10:01 pm to May 26,

6:06 am: cultivate, weed, destroy pests (Aquarius third quarter).

May 28, 10:44 am to May 30, 12:11 am: cultivate, weed, do in pests. Harvest fruit and root crops. Trim to retard growth. (Aries, fourth quarter).

May 30, 12:11 am to June 1, 11:49 am: Plant potatoes and tubers. Trim to retard growth (Taurus, fourth quarter).

POTATO PLANTING

Now, for something entirely different. A neat method for planting potatoes, which works only on, or in, well drained ground. Dig a ditch about one foot wide and deep. Chuck in your seed potatoes and cover with three inches of soil. When and as plants emerge, keep adding soil to leave only the tops exposed.

This has two advantages over hilling potatoes. Number one, hilling is back-breaking work and shovelling loose dirt into the trench is a lark by comparison. Secondly, you end up with a full trench at ground level.

There are several advantages to this. Rows can be spaced as little as one foot apart, soil permitting, as compared to three feet apart for the hill method.

To adequately cover a potato plant, hills need a wide base. With a three-foot-wide spacing you have a foot and one half to hoe-up

against the potato plant with only a six-inch width at best at the top of the plant. Further, the required excavation for the hills lowers soil level and water table. This exposes three-quarters of the hill to moisture evaporation by air and wind.

Since potatoes require a good deal of water, frequent soakings are necessary. All this is avoided by the trench method. It saves space, labour and watering, but it only works in well drained soil.

On wet soil the hill method is the answer, unless you have raised beds. Then one can adapt the trench method to the raised bed with similar advantages.

The trench method also lends itself to companion planting, as there is undisturbed ground between the rows for growing beans, corn, cabbages, horse-radish, marigolds and eggplant. It is just a matter of laying it out and storing the soil.

With the trench method, straw and similar mulch materials can be substituted for one half of the soil with excellent results and this will improve the organic content of your soil at the same time.

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Salt Spring squadron never had a failure

Salt Spring Island Power Squadron, safety organization for small boats, is unique in Canada. Among all the squadrons from coast to coast, the Salt Spring Island squadron has never had a failure.

In eight years, members were told last week, there have been 230 candidates for the annual qualifying examinations and 230 have passed, reported Senior Commander John Wood of Oak Bay.

Safety is the keynote of the power squadron function, members were reminded.

The annual banquet drew a hundred or so guests to the Rod and Gun Club rooms in Ganges on Wednesday evening last week. They took part in the graduation ceremonies and then stood while the new bridge of offices was installed.

Retiring Commander Jim Napper, who has served for two terms, handed over the squadron to incoming Commander Ted Coombes.

TRAINING COURSES

Each year, the squadrons stage training courses in seamanship and the handling of small craft. The course is demanding and candidates are required to devote many hours of study to the training program. At its conclusion, the successful candidate is required to know what to do in the day-to-day problems of travelling in a small boat as well as the procedures in an emergency.

The power squadron flag is a proud symbol of competence afloat, said John Wood, speaking as District Lieutenant-Commander.

The program followed dinner prepared by the Order of the Eastern Star.

It fell on the district officer, John Wood, to speak of the squadron's functions as he addressed various individuals and groups.

The power squadron consists of volunteer undertaking training to exercise good judgment on the

water, he explained. He outlined the procedures and the system of training. Power squadron officers are named to administer the squadron, he noted.

"They have responsibilities, but no authority."

This year there were 24 graduates of the 1980 course. There were 24 students undertaking it.

PROCEDURES

Wood explained the procedures after a successful course. Those who pass the course are more competent to handle a vessel on the water. The graduates who wish to continue their association with the squadron are invited to join. Those who do not wish to join are encouraged to keep up with training on the water.

"They have the distinction of passing the course."

The need for training in the use of small vessels is indicated by the problems facing the co-ordination centre over the Easter weekend, said Wood.

He recalled the instance of a 100-year-old, 22-ft. cruiser which went missing. It was one of many distress calls which jammed the channel during that weekend.

MISSING 18 HOURS

The vessel had been missing for 18 hours, with five persons aboard, when helicopters, hovercraft and surface vessels were engaged in the search.

The vessel was found at Sidney Spit. There was nothing wrong with the vessel. The skipper had simply decided to stop without telling anyone.

Last year there were 4,000 calls in these waters. Poor maintenance, poor seamanship, lack of fuel were the most prominent causes, said the speaker.

John Wood has spent many years training others in the handling of their vessels. He is well-versed in what could happen and the best methods of avoiding what might happen.

Many skippers of small vessels

reporting distress were unable to describe their own boats and could not offer information on the size or type of vessel they were sailing.

There have been drownings that would never have happened if the mates on those boats concerned had undertaken a power squadron

course in seamanship. The skipper falls overboard and his wife is helpless to save him because she can't handle the vessel.

Canadian Power Squadron training has avoided such incidents, said the speaker.

Telephones out at Galiano

Most of Galiano Island was left without telephone service early last week and it was nearly 24 hours before B.C. Tel crews had even begun to sort the problem out.

Repairmen were called in immediately and it was determined that a break in an underwater cable between the island and Mayne Island was responsible for the disruption.

The company requested additional assistance from Victoria and repairmen worked right through the night of May 5 switching over to a microwave receiving system.

It is believed that telephone service has been restored to most of the island.

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Down Through the Years With Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

The minister of municipal affairs and housing, Hugh Curtis, said that he sympathizes with Gulf Islands residents' opposition to the staggering ferry rate hikes recently announced by the provincial government and he intends to ask the cabinet to relax the heavy boost. Curtis said that he has already appealed to the cabinet to reconsider the nearly 400% increase for islanders and would do so again within a few days. Earlier this week Curtis agreed that residents are justified in their indignation to the fare increases but urged them to restrain their protests.

The Salt Spring Island Planning Association agreed at a recent meeting that zoning bylaw 66 must be updated and that land use contracts should be employed in Ganges to direct development along guidelines established by the community plan. The agreement that these measures are urgently required arose from discussion about a recent rezoning application to change the zoning of property on Lower Ganges Road from Industrial 3 to Commercial 1. The planners were told that the applicant had specified only that he intended to construct a feed store and to use the property for retail sales. No specific information about the nature of the business or about the design of the site and buildings had been given.

In a departure from previous year's trends, the Canadian Red Cross Blood Clinic was swamped by donors when it set up shop last week in the Legion Hall. In recent clinics, the Red Cross had met with such a poor response from Salt Spring Islanders that it had considered dropping the island from its scheduled list of stops. To the surprise of organizers, however, a total of 174 pints of blood were donated which surpassed their goal of 150. Another 13 pints were rejected.

An explosion of six runs during the fourth inning of last Saturday's little league game helped the Cardinals to a 9-7 win behind the ace pitching of Carl Legg. Sunday afternoon play saw Brett Carter pitch his way to a 7-4 victory over Saltair. Excellent fielding and solid hitting helped make it two wins in a row for the Cardinals.

The skipper and crew of an 81-foot fishing boat escaped aboard a lifeboat after their vessel sank off the south end of South Pender Island last weekend. Erling Moe of Seattle reported that fire broke out in the vessel's starboard engine causing sufficient damage for the boat to sink. He assessed his loss at about \$125,000 but said that it would likely cost double that amount to replace the 10-year-old boat. There were no injuries reported.

The president of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce outlined the details of its recently launched Youth '71 program at the

organization's annual dinner meeting last week. While the program is sponsored by the chamber, it will be run by the students taking part in it. Some of the students will conduct an analysis of water pollution on and around the island.

After giving the matter some consideration, the Salt Spring Island Planning Association has decided that conducting a second opinion survey on island development would serve no useful purpose. The association announced last week that it had given some thought to undertaking a new survey. The original survey was taken two years ago and members of the association agreed to take another look at the matter should the need arise in the future.

A representative of the federal department of transport has passed along a message to the Galiano Chamber of Commerce advising that political action would be the most effective method of improving wharfage facilities there. This was the report that Steve Riddell, president of the chamber, carried back to his colleagues at their regular meeting after conferring with Mr. Brooks. Galiano Island fishermen have claimed that wharves on the island are inadequate. Brooks said that the department has received orders from Ottawa to begin collecting wharfage fees and to lay charges against those who refuse to pay. Up until now, fishermen have not had to pay for wharfage privileges.

Federal MP Tommy Douglas condemned Ottawa's policy of encouraging oil exploration as a threat to the environment that Canadians can do without during a dinner hosted by the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce last Friday night. The constant search for oil is not even necessary, asserted the NDP leader. Yet the Canadian policy is to permit oil exploration in areas that are jeopardized by the search for "oil we don't really need." Douglas also warned that U.S. plans to transport oil from Alaska to Puget Sound by oil tanker poses a threat to the entire Pacific coast. He and other NDP members have asked the federal government to take similar oil pollution control measures to the ones it introduced last year for the Arctic.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

A three-year-old Saturna Island girl is listed in satisfactory condition in a Victoria hospital after being badly lacerated about the head during a single-car accident one afternoon last week. The girl's mother lost control of the vehicle and ran off the road hitting a log. There were two other children in the back seat at the time but no

other reports of injuries.

A spokesman for the Bank of Montreal has announced plans for construction of a modern new bank building which is to replace the structure at its present location. It is scheduled for completion less than a year from now. The present building is to be demolished once the first stage of the new building is completed. The two-stage construction plan will allow the bank to continue operations while the change is being made.

A Quarter Guard and Regimental Band in full dress uniform, part of the Canadian Scottish Regiment, is scheduled to visit Salt Spring Island later this month to honour those who served in that regiment in two world wars. Plans call for a special parade to the cenotaph prior to the unveiling of a commemorative centennial plaque at the Royal Canadian Legion Hall in Ganges.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

The hunt for a marauding cougar has finally come to an end on Prevost Island nearly two months after its tracks were first discovered on Salt Spring Island's Mount Bruce. Government hunter Skate Hames, and a pair of tracking dogs, treed and shot the 130 lb. animal last Sunday after being alerted by the owner of Prevost Island as to its whereabouts. Discovery of a freshly killed lamb near his house led Hubert DeBurgh to realize that the cougar had completed the swim over from Salt Spring Island. When his search failed to turn up any trace of the animal, Hames had begun to suspect that it may have swum back to Vancouver Island.

About 35 ratepayers from the Fulford area have decided to write a letter to the minister of education to determine whether the board has the authority to amalgamate the south Salt Spring Island voting district with the rest of the island. The meeting was held at Nan's Coffee Bar late last week. South island trustee Doug Dane, who was absent during the meeting in which the board approved amalgamation, said that the decision was morally wrong even though the board may have the power to take such action. Much of the discussion centred around the fear that Ganges voters would dictate future policy because of their greater numerical representation.

The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce has introduced plans to install roughly 240 feet of flower boxes along the beach side of the causeway as soon as the highways department has completed the causeway widening project. The chamber is dedicated to making the island a more attractive place for both residents and visitors.

The purchase of pipe for the Ganges sewer outfall was approved last week despite a charge by the Salt Spring Island regional director that the Capital Region was provided with garbage by executive director Dennis Young.

The region's sewer committee voted 4-1 last week to spend \$122,000 on 4,800 metres of plastic pipe. Contract for the pipe was awarded to DuPont Canada Inc.

Director Yvette Valcourt objected to the contract being awarded and criticized Young, who has advised the region that the recent court finding against the CRD does not prohibit continuation with the project.

"You've been hearing the same garbage from Mr. Young that you've been hearing from Mr. (Jim) Campbell for three years," Valcourt said.

"I take strong objection to such a derogatory term," replied Young. "I do not provide you with garbage. I provide you with accurate information."

New post office is bigger, brighter, better equipped

Ganges Post Office has moved. For a decade the post office has been located between the Bank of Montreal and Mouat's Store. On Saturday it moved into the new Ganges Centre Building in Mouat's complex.

On Friday evening the old wicket closed at 5:30 pm and there was no more mail service until Monday morning.

The staff kept busy all day Saturday moving furniture and equipment and keeping tabs on the mail. Postal employees were working at tables which had not arrived and sorting the mail in the midst of carpenters and cleaners. On Monday the new post office, bigger, brighter and far better equipped was all set to greet the morning's mail.

The new counter is black, with the post office colours on the facing of the counter. Two clerks stood ready to meet the patrons and each wore a new purple blazer, the uniform of the Canada Post Office. The two were Ruth Archer and David Parsons.

Everything looked bigger. There are more boxes in a bigger lobby

and even an office, for the postmistress, Joyce Bradford. The new assistant postmistress, Judy Woodcock, was sharing the office on Saturday, but it was bare of furniture. She is here from Whitehorse and enjoying the pleasant weather.

The post office has lived in the Mouat complex for decades. Before it moved into its former location it was in the Mouat building where the hardware section is now accommodated.

The story of its moving is the

story of growth.

The Ganges Post Office now serves 1,646 patrons on the rural routes, as well as about 1,300 lock boxes in the lobby. The distribution of patrons is RR 1, 777; RR 2, 435; RR 3, 434.
