

# Canada has one of highest levels of 'tied aid' in world

It may be salutary to see ourselves as others see us. According to the *New Internationalist* magazine, "Canadian Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau was resurrected from threatened retirement to win the last election." They see him as "trailblazing" and despite "hard-nosed skepticism" from the media, his travels have served to introduce the North/South concept to the Canadian people.

"Some observers" feel that Mr. Trudeau's "sudden belated entrance into the international limelight may be prompted by the need to pad his *curriculum vitae* for a future career as an international bureaucrat — perhaps with the United Nations."

We are characterized as tending to see ourselves as "benign boy scouts," bringing succour to the world's poor. The truth is not quite so cheery. We still have one of the highest levels of "tied aid" in the world about 80% of our bilateral assistance has to be spent on Canadian goods and services. (A desperate attempt to hang on to markets which we've almost priced ourselves out of?) And aid as a percentage of our G.N.P. has dropped from .54% in 1975 to .45% last year and a pathetic .37% in 1981.

### DRAGGED ITS FEET

"During the 13 years of Mr. Trudeau's leadership, Canada has dragged its feet consistently on most of the crucial economic questions raised by the Third World...."

"The Prime Minister himself says the top priority is to create the feeling that we have an obligation to act. There has to be a revision in international morality otherwise nothing will flow from it.... But so far Ottawa has refused to act on Canadian investments in Chile, Guatemala, Namibia, Argentina and a number of other Third World human rights offenders. In fact the government continues to support some of these investments through its own Export Development Corporation with big loans to South Africa and Argentina and \$6.1 million to the Chilean air force for aircraft and spare parts.

"Raising public consciousness... is a legitimate goal, but unless Mr. Trudeau and other Western leaders are willing to drop the rhetoric in favour of action the spectacle of two more global talkshops this summer will produce little but sore throats!"

(This is a reference to the June conference between Mexico and the Third World, along with some Western nations, to discuss the Brandt report.)

To close on a personal note, thanks for all the good wishes to Harry — he's doing well.

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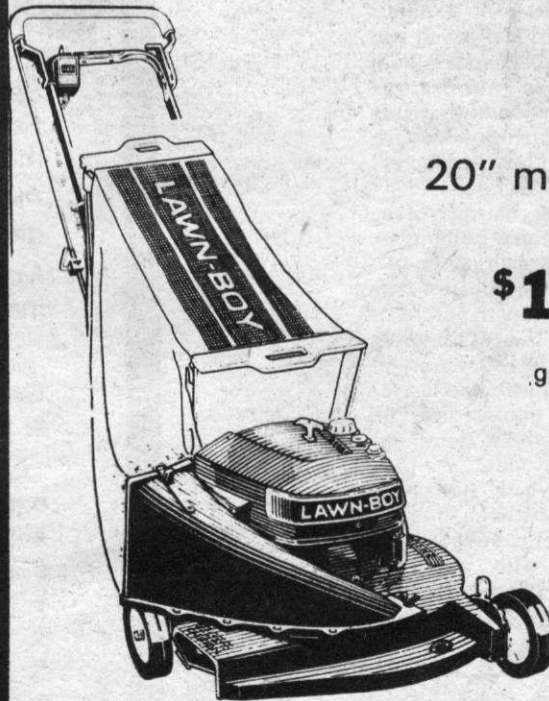
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# Ganges United Church scene of wedding ceremony Saturday

She also wore an opal bracelet, a gift from the groom, and a pearl and diamond necklace.

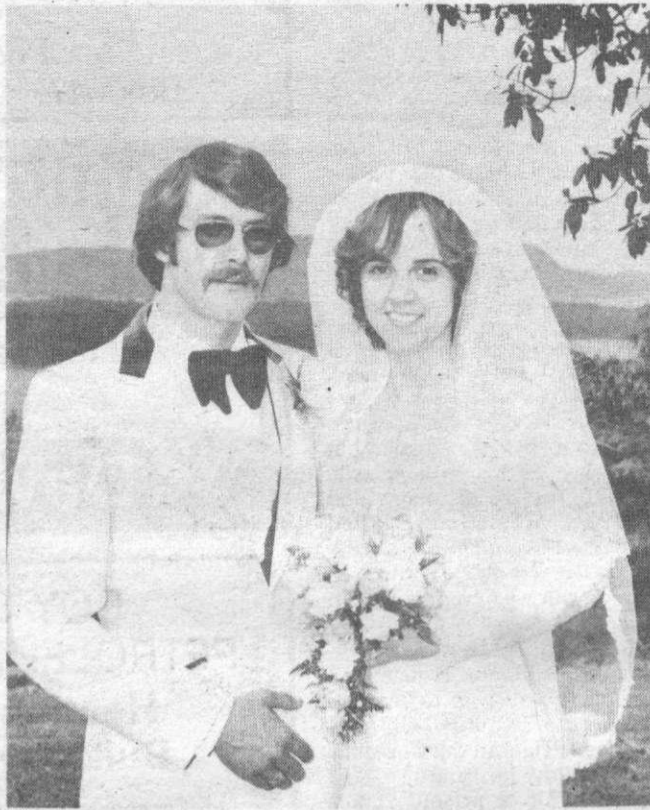

# Blowing tire not problem

A new Salt Spring Island resident was fined \$500 in provincial court last Wednesday after pleading guilty to having care and control of a motor vehicle while impaired and to exceeding the legal alcohol limit.

Gordon John Langston, formerly of White Rock, made his second mistake, however, when he attempted to blame his woes on a blown tire that he was attempting to repair when police happened along.

"Blowing the tire is not the problem, it's what you blew afterwards," replied Judge Denrosche.

The court learned that Langston had stopped his vehicle in the

middle of Vesuvius Bay Road on April 7 at about 12:35 am in order to replace a flat tire.

Glenn Hanna arrived while on routine patrol and that he took Langston back to the RCMP station for a breath analysis after observing signs of impairment.

Crown counsel Clint Kittle told the court that it was Langston's second impaired driving offence.

Judge Denrosche, in imposing the \$500 fine, stated that the crown had failed to serve proper notice of intent papers, which saved Langston from serving a mandatory 14-day jail sentence for a second conviction.

Langston also lost his driving privileges for six months.



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# School site negotiations authorized

Hot on the heels of a public meeting at Fulford Hall about two weeks ago, the Gulf Islands School Board gave its unanimous approval to a motion authorizing the district to begin negotiating for a site for its proposed south Salt Spring elementary school.

John Zacharias, chairman of the buildings and grounds committee, did not indicate which of the two sites under consideration the district would attempt to purchase.

The board had been considering a parcel of land in the vicinity of the junction of Stewart and Beaver Point Roads and another near the intersection of Isabella Point and Fulford-Ganges Roads.

The board, which had been looking for a site between four and six acres in size, has about \$80,000 at its disposal with which to purchase and develop a piece of property.

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# Biological agriculture topic of recent conference in Oregon

Usually around this time of year we can seed our bush beans and corn. But with all this rain the soil is still a bit cool and wet and a fair bit of seed will just rot in the ground. In raised beds this should be no problem whatsoever.

In level ground, as long as it does not swim, like mine, it is worth a try anyhow, and any spots which do not germinate can be reseeded a little later. This has the incidental benefit of providing a somewhat extended harvest period later on. My goodness, our main garden is too wet even to make raised beds! Geraniums and begonias may now be set out. We can also seed all our cole crops directly into the ground. Cool soil temperatures will not bother these at all.

All the tender annuals, such as marigolds, petunias, zinnias, nasturtiums, etc., may now be set out as well. But for our cucurbits, all the gourd types, we shall have to wait until the ground is warm, hopefully in the first half of June. **NOT BEEN IDLE**

In the meantime, we have not been idle. I attended a conference on permaculture in Portland over the May 10 weekend. About 250 people attended, including a strong contingent of country women. They came from B.C. and California and the places in between and from many adjacent states and from as far away as Ohio. They all had something in common, a feeling of greenness about them; I expected to see moss growing from their ears.

The program was varied and intense and I wished there were two or three of me to take in everything.

Permaculture is a new approach to agriculture, based on Mr. Fukuoka's pioneer work as described in his *One Straw Revolution*. It is also called biological agriculture, as opposed to chemical agriculture. A lot of pioneer work was presented by both scientists and farmers, all oriented towards permanent, self-renewing systems using the many resources of nature.

## GARDENING WITHOUT DIGGING

They talked about three story agriculture, herbal leys, shelter belts, edible landscapes, integrated crop and livestock raising, the value of broom and alder as nitrogen suppliers to the soil and a method of gardening without digging and cultivating for the elderly or the harried, fully employed householders. This last method, incidentally, would work on concrete.

Common and basic to all the above is the knowledge and

understanding that our life and well being depend entirely on the life and well being of all life. Foremost in all their undertakings is the healing of the planet and mankind.

An excellent indicator of the depth of their commitment to natural farming was the fee: \$35 (U.S.) covered everything including bed and board from Friday evening to Sunday afternoon. They did not do this for any desire for monetary profit.

One of the highlights of the conference was Larry Korn's talk with colour slides about his work and stay with Mr. Fukuoka. His informal evening talk was light and cheerful and every sentence seemed to have a smile on it. Larry is a soil specialist and works as a consultant for the government of California.

He also edited and translated *The One Straw Revolution* and how such a young man, who appears to be well under 30 years of age, can do all this, I do not know.

### TO GIVE A TALK

Several people and friends of mine have asked me to give a talk on these and related matters. I would be more than pleased to do this if sufficient interest is made known. Tom Gossett of Foxglove Farm would be willing to sponsor this talk and to take care of some of the expenses.

The library at the elementary school has been suggested for this talk and fees, if any, should be minimal. So I am willing, if you are. If considerable interest is evident I would hold two talks on different days of the week so that those who cannot make it to one can catch the other. This though depends on your "yes" vote.

Just drop off a piece of paper with your "yes" on it at Foxglove, *Driftwood* or my mailbox. So the sooner you get your vote in, the sooner it will happen.

And now to Maryanne

Caruthers-Akin's garden for the elderly or time-limited families. Evenly apply one pound of dry, feed type molasses over an area of ground four feet wide by 10 feet long. Evenly apply half a pound of kelp powder over the same area. Spread five or six layers of newspaper over this. Cover this with one bale of old damp straw. You can create this ribbon right over mowed weeds or grass; digging is not necessary.

Your ribbon garden is now ready to be planted or seeded as follows. Make flower pot-sized holes in the straw. Fill each hole with four cups of composted soil, one tablespoon of bonemeal and one crushed alfalfa tablet. Set plants or seeds into this soil mix and water with garden tea.

### GARDEN TEA

To make garden tea: one tablespoon liquid molasses (feed type), one tablespoon liquid fish fertilizer and two cups human urine mixed with one gallon of water.

Make compost like this: four parts kitchen scraps, fresh grass clippings, etc., one part sawdust and sprinkle with human urine. Put this mixture into a large, very heavy-duty plastic bag with many small holes punched in it for ventilation. Tie it tightly. Kick and roll bag around a few times every day. In temperatures over 45° you will have excellent compost in about two weeks.

Maryanne comes from a family of growers with "acres of greenhouses" and has been involved in growing things from a tender age. She perfected the above method about six years ago and has used it successfully since then in, and on behalf of, the city of Seattle, her own garden, community projects and for soil reclamation.

Maryanne is a busy, active fully employed woman, artist and mother and this is the only way she can provide fresh, organic produce for her family and still do all the other things.

This energetic, clear-eyed woman took total charge of her workshop under severe time limitations and never strayed from facts and methods. It was pure pleasure to listen to her.

## Police seize liquor on ferries

Pender Island RCMP had made a dozen liquor seizures over the holiday weekend as of Monday morning, most of which took place aboard Outer Island-bound ferries, according to Corp Harry Danyluk.

Nine of the seizures took place aboard the ferries, including two incidents alone in which police confiscated 120 bottles of beer.

Although no arrests were made, police confiscated about 30 cases of beer and a small quantity of wine and liquor in all.

Pender Island RCMP have stationed officers aboard the ferries on several occasions so far this summer in an effort to curtail rowdiness before problems get out

of hand, as has happened in the past.

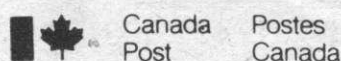

**Twelve take tests, all pass**

The Ganges Hill School has been the setting this year for three exam sessions of the G.E.D. high school equivalency tests. Twelve people in all have taken the tests and all have passed.

John Hall tutors the candidates and Kathy Hall administers the exams, both under the auspices of the ministry of education in Victoria and continuing education here in Ganges.

The G.E.D. test series consists of five tests taken together — two in English and one each in socials, science and math. Both the form and content are different from those in ordinary high school, and are geared more to the candidates' experience at work or in everyday circumstances. If someone fails one or more of the tests, those alone can be taken again until the five have been passed.

The ministry has announced a change in grading that will take effect on September 1. The minimum pass score will then become 45 in each test, rather than the present average of 45 with a minimum score of 40 permitted.

There will probably be a test session here some time before September, John Hall said this week, so all those who want to take advantage of the present grading system should begin preparation soon. Further information can be obtained from the Halls.

**Charged following accident**

A 17-year-old Ganges youth walked out of provincial court none the poorer last Wednesday despite having pleaded guilty to two traffic charges that were brought about as a result of a single-car accident March 15.

The court was told that the individual, who was 16 at the time, was the driver of a vehicle that crossed Lower Ganges Road and struck a pole near the Ganges Harbour Grocery.

He told police that a fellow passenger had turned up the volume of the radio and that he had lost control of the vehicle while attempting to turn it down.

He was charged with driving without due care and attention and with failing to fasten his seatbelt. It was learned that another passenger had sustained minor injuries as a result of the accident.

"I just hope that things work out better for you in the future," said Judge Denrosche.

Neil Crofton, 24, of Ganges has received official word that he has been accepted into the faculty of medicine at the University of British Columbia beginning in September.

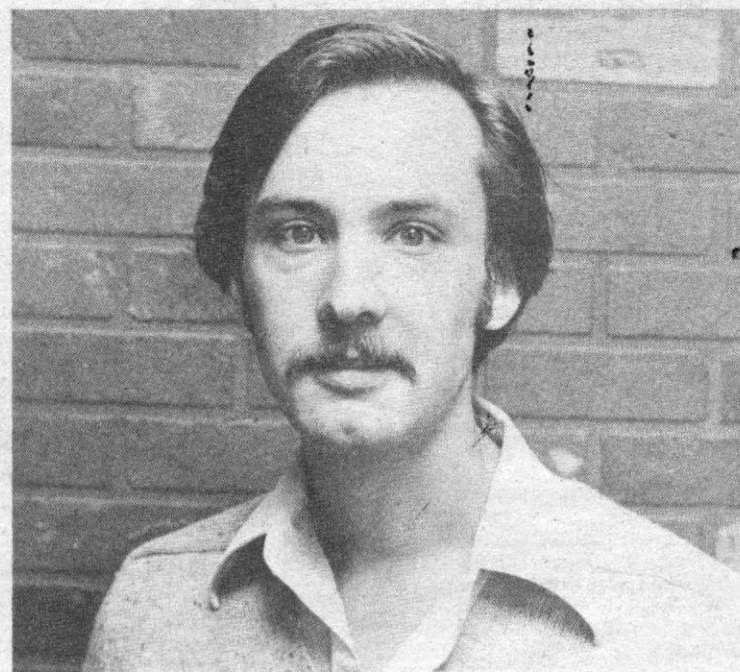
Accepted a year earlier than is customary, Crofton was one of about 120 students who were selected out of a field of more than 600 applicants.

## Mahon Hall lease extended

The Gulf Islands School Board unanimously approved last Tuesday a request from the Salt Spring Parks and Recreation Commission for a 10-year extension to the commission's lease of Mahon Hall.

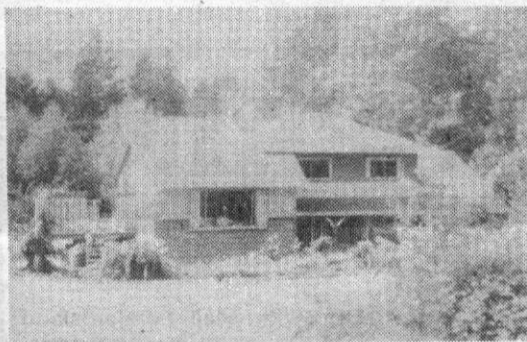

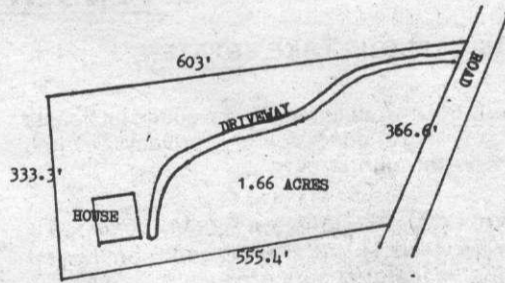

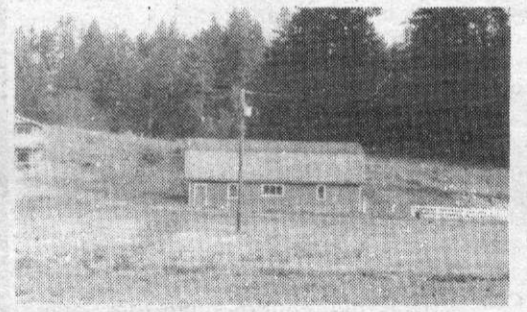

# Alternate director cannot vote, planning commission decides

While the regional director has a seat on the Advisory Planning Commission on Salt Spring Island, the alternate director may not vote on any matter before the commission in place of the elected representative.

When the commission sat in the United Church Hall last week trustee Bud Kreissl challenged the participation by alternate director Sabara Humes.

It would be illogical to permit the director to name an alternate when the remainder of the commissioners have no such privilege, he alleged.

Furthermore, said the local trustee, the alternate director is not a named member of the planning commission and is not required to file a declaration of interests.

The alternate director insisted that she is the duly nominated alternate and that she is entitled to take the place of the director in all functions.

Chairman Nick Gilbert ruled that the alternate director could not contribute to a decision.

"She may sit here," said Gilbert, "but she may not vote."

Under discussion was an application for the rezoning to commercial of five lots on McPhillips Ave. in Ganges.

Bud O'Connor, for the applicants, Valhalla Research

Institute of Vancouver, explained that the property operated as Carol's Antiques is not commercially zoned and was opened as a business in error. The application would bring this into line, while rezoning the block of parcels in readiness for any future commercial use.

Director Valcourt had stated that the application was premature and should be tabled, reported Sabara Humes. With the position regarding a sewer the way it is, pursued Humes, the commission

should not approve the application.

The dispute over the sewer is not relevant, insisted Kreissl. "We are going to have a sewer," he told his colleagues, "this one or one costing millions of dollars more."

The company owns six lots. One is already commercially zoned.

The application was approved as submitted on the motion of Kreissl and Gerry Bourdin.

Planning commission approval still requires the endorsement of the Trust Committee.

## Drinker on the roof fined \$75

A short-lived stage appearance on the roof of a downtown Ganges business cost a Salt Spring Island man \$75 in provincial court last Wednesday.

Steven Robert Anderson, 19, of Drake Road had been charged with drinking beer on the roof of the Salt Spring Lands office on Fulford-Ganges Road while still under age.

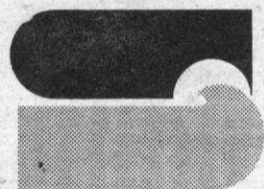
The incident occurred February 20 at about 8:10 pm.

**Minister of transportation Jack Davis** says that the government will continue offering commuter tickets to Gulf Islands residents, meaning that the recently announced ferry rate hikes have been scaled down to just double the old rate. It was also disclosed that Outer Islanders will pay the same fare as Salt Spring Islanders. In the past it has cost Outer Island residents slightly more. Inter-island travel will, in the future, be free of charge.

**The Saturna Island Senior Citizens Club** has been given a \$1,500 grant under the federal New Horizons program. The money will enable the group to finish equipping the senior citizens centre in order to expand its social and recreational activities. The seniors also plan to gather and preserve old photographs and artifacts for the start of a museum collection.

**Despite forecasts to the contrary,** ICBC rate hikes have not discouraged people from taking out insurance coverage, according to Municipal Affairs Minister Hugh Curtis, who addressed a meeting in Ganges Friday night. In addition, claims are appreciably down this year in comparison with last year's figures. If the trend continues there will be a rebate next year for those whose premiums went up, stated Curtis.

**Ganges RCMP report** that thieves removed about \$2,600 worth of jewellery when a Ganges business was hit for the second time late last week. The proprietor of Mod'n Lavender, located in the Valcourt Centre, informed police that thieves walked off with stolen rings, valued up to \$100, charm bracelets and lockets, and a quantity of Mexican jewellery after breaking into the business.

**The worst earth tremor** in about 20 years was recorded in the Gulf Islands early Sunday morning. Measuring 5.5 on the Richter scale, the quake was centred near South Pender Island, about 60 kilometres below the surface. Residents were awakened at about 1:30 am by the violent shaking which lasted about six seconds. There were no reports of damage.

## TEN YEARS AGO

**Five persons drowned** in two separate incidents in the waters off Salt Spring Island last week, including the four members of a Duncan family who had spent all of Sunday digging for clams at Booth Bay. An island woman discovered the bodies of a woman and two children early Monday morning on the beach at Vesuvius Bay. The body of the husband has yet to be found. It's believed the family was lost after encountering severe weather while returning to Duncan by boat Sunday night. An unidentified 50-year old man drowned after falling from a gangplank

while disembarking from the ferry at Fulford Harbour.

**Outer Island residents** have turned down proposals for daily water transportation of students to schools on Salt Spring Island. The plans, which were only in the exploratory stage, have been dropped, said a spokesman for the Gulf Islands School Board. Trustees have also abandoned the idea of transporting elementary school students to one central school.

**Three major building projects** in downtown Ganges are well on the way to completion. Workmen have already finished putting the roof on the new post office building and an extension to the Salt Spring Lands building is half completed. The floor for the new Ben's Lucky Dollar store has also been poured.

**Two Salt Spring Island students** and a West Vancouver youth were brutally beaten by a gang of youths last week at the Crofton wharf while waiting for the last ferry to Salt Spring Island. It's reported that the passengers of eight cars which were lined up for the island ferry remained in their vehicles while the assaults took place. The incident was reported to the Chemainus detachment of the RCMP and an investigation has been launched.

**The royal yacht Britannia** attracted a great deal of attention early Monday morning when she sailed through Active Pass. Accompanied by the RCMP vessel *Sidney* and a large sleek naval craft, the *Britannia* sailed up Trincome Channel and was saluted by the *Mayne Queen*. There were reports of people having gathered all along the way, including a group of about 50 individuals who viewed the vessel from Bellhouse Point on Galiano Island. Two women even camped out all night waiting to catch a glimpse of the royal yacht.

## FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

**Approximately 200 delegates** from all over the province showed up for the B.C. Historical Association's annual conference held over a three-day period last week in the Gulf Islands. With the already inadequate facilities stretched to the limit, the community was called upon to help house and feed the delegates. They were given tours of Mayne Island on Friday and of Saturna Island on Sunday where they were also treated to a traditional lamb barbecue.

**A small crowd** turned out one night last week to hear the details for renovations to the entrance to Fulford Hall. Jack Roland outlined the need for more spacious facilities due to increased use. Plans call for a 32-foot extension to the front of the building in order to enlarge the floor area, and addition of a skate rental room and a refreshment concession booth. New and improved washroom facilities are also part of the renovation program. The work is estimated to cost about \$4,800.

**A standing-room-only crowd** turned out to the Leisure Lanes Bowling Alley last week to cheer their favourite league teams on to victory. Fulford defeated the RCMP and the Ups and Downs bested the Legion Bandits. Fulford will take on the Posties in tonight's action.

## TWENTY YEARS AGO

**A spokesman for the department of highways** said at a recent dinner that an asphalt mixing plant will be established at Fulford within the next few weeks in preparation for extensive blacktopping of Salt Spring Island roads this summer. J.W. Morris, district engineer, made the statement during a Chamber of Commerce dinner held last weekend in the United Church Hall.

**The summer ferry schedule** takes effect today, with the *Motor Princess* being switched to the Outer Islands in addition to making runs between Swartz Bay and Fulford Harbour. The *Delta Princess* will also see service on the Swartz Bay-Fulford Harbour run while the *Cy Peck* is given a rest.

**The school board** decided at last week's meeting to extend the school day by one hour for the secondary grades. These students will now finish classes at about 4 pm. It was also disclosed that the government health department will put \$3,750 towards construction of a new school district office which will include space for a health office. A kindergarten class is also under consideration for next fall.

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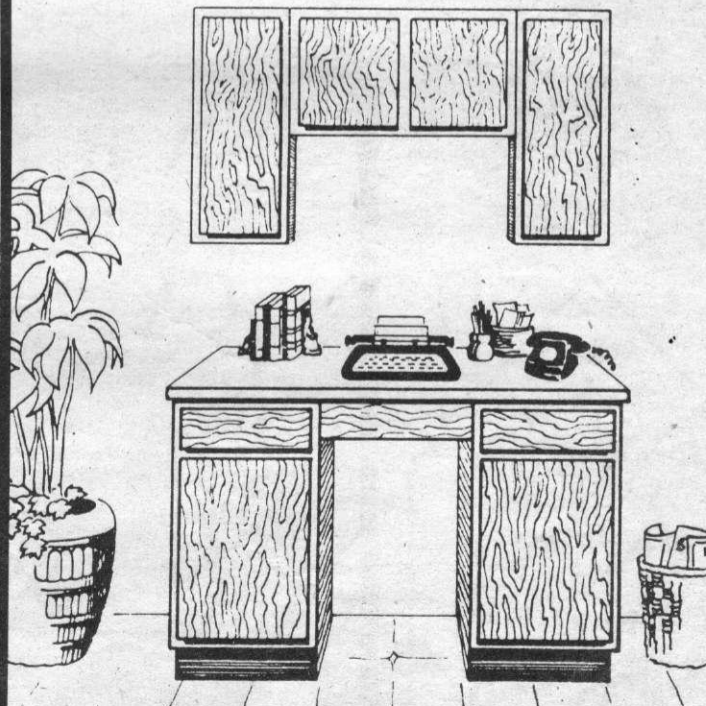
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**'Sewer project dead'**

**District urged to construct its own sewage treatment system**

Receipt of a letter from a representative of the Salt Spring Sewer Alternatives Committee has prompted the Gulf Islands School Board to look into the current status of the controversial Ganges sewer system.

In a letter dated April 28, David Skinner wrote that the committee hoped that the district had already proceeded with plans for a separate system of its own for treating and disposing sewage from its Ganges facilities.

"As taxpayers, concerned about galloping inflation, we hope the board is pressing ahead with its design and construction plans for a separate treatment system," the

letter read.

"If not, we urge you to consider this a priority project this year, thus playing your part in achieving the restoration of harmony in our community."

**PROJECT DEAD**

Skinner also stated that the proposed sewer project is, for all intents and purposes, dead.

"It is only a matter of time before the CRD is forced to cancel work on the project and the federal government withdraws its \$2 million grant," the letter said.

The board decided last Tuesday to write a letter to the pollution control board to determine whether the sewer project has

ground to a halt or if there are still plans to install a sewer system. The board also hoped to learn what course of action it should be taking regarding treatment of its own sewage at this point.

The trustees were concerned about responding in a manner that could be interpreted as a show of support, either in favour or in opposition to the highly controversial sewage system.

Chairman Strick Aust and Salt Spring Island trustee Charles Baltzer both expressed concern that the district continues to dump raw sewage into Ganges Harbour while the issue remains unresolved.

For example, a custodian, of which there are 10 here, is paid \$7.35 per hour. In Saanich, a custodian starts off at just \$6.94 per hour but can make upwards of \$10.05 per hour. Sooke School District custodians start at an hourly rate of \$7.14 which escalates to \$8.48.

**NEGOTIATED BY IWA**

In the Cowichan School District, where outside workers' contracts are negotiated by the International Woodworkers of America, custodians have just won \$9.81 per hour.

For the four school bus drivers, who each make \$8.08 per hour, it's a similar situation. Their counterparts in Saanich make \$8.75 per hour, while the figure in Sooke is \$9.00 and in Cowichan, where bus drivers also belong to the IWA, the figure is \$10.95 per hour.

The 12 secretaries and clerks in the Gulf Islands School District start at \$6.70 per hour, a figure which climbs to \$7.16 after two years. In Saanich clerical employees are paid \$6.21 per hour to start and can go as high as \$8.10. Sooke clerical employees start at \$7.97 per hour with a maximum hourly rate of \$8.72.

**OTHER FACTORS**

It is important to note, however,

that job descriptions, working conditions, actual work time and other factors may vary from district to district.

With the ball back in the district's court it's difficult to say what the next step will be.

It had been expected that the board would make some sort of announcement during last week's meeting but the subject of the negotiations never came up even though it was listed on the agenda.

At this point the union has the option of either scaling down its wage demands and presenting a counter proposal or calling for a strike vote.

Neither side has mentioned the possibility of a strike, at least not publicly, but with negotiations having broken down altogether, it has to be considered as a possibility.

CUPE is waiting to hear back from its chief negotiator, Alec Makides, who negotiates on behalf

of various CUPE locals out of the union's Victoria area office.

**TO GET BACK THIS WEEK**

He is expected to get back to the local branch this week, at which time the union will decide on a course of action.

Makides will also advise the local whether provincial mediation officer R.J. Phillips is to return for another round of talks.

Phillips was called in at the union's request in late February and has since sat down at the bargaining table during three different sessions in an effort to bring the two sides to agreement.

He was last here earlier this month.

CUPE contracts are also up for negotiation in a number of other school districts including Sooke, Saanich, Cowichan and Victoria.

In Victoria, however, non-teaching employees are negotiating a new contract along with municipal workers whose contracts are also up for renewal.

**Ginger Tea is winner**

The Salt Spring Island Sailing Club's annual race around the island was finished in record time this year as the 30 boats which entered were accompanied by brisk winds for most of the course.

The Marshall Sharp Trophy, awarded to the first island boat in, was won by Jack Langdon on *Ginger Tea*, who completed the race in eight hours, 50 minutes.

In the overall class, Mike Howard's *Sandalwood* from Tsawwassen was the winner for the second year in a row, second was *Ginger Tea* and third, John Rainsford's *Sabre II* from Mayne Island.

Of the local boats, *Sabre II* was second and Peter McMillan's *Erin* was third.

Sailing Club commodore Charles Sutcliffe told *Driftwood* on Tuesday that all the boats were in before midnight Saturday. In past years many boats have not returned until late Sunday afternoon.

Sutcliffe's own boat, *Yeoman of Cestria*, set an all-time record for a club boat, with a time of eight hours, 40 minutes.

Last year's winner of the Marshall Sharp Trophy was Dick Moore's *Marimba*.

On Sunday the Sailing Club staged the official opening of its clubhouse on Douglas Road, with Mary K. Thomas turning the key in the door to mark the event. Over 100 people took part in the ceremony.

An unusual feature of this year's Round Salt Spring Race was the hooking of a salmon by one of the participating boats. The fish was caught from John Korrison's *Far Horizon* during a lull in the wind in Sansum Narrows. The crew successfully landed the fish, but not until after the wind had picked up and set the salmon spinning at the end of the line.

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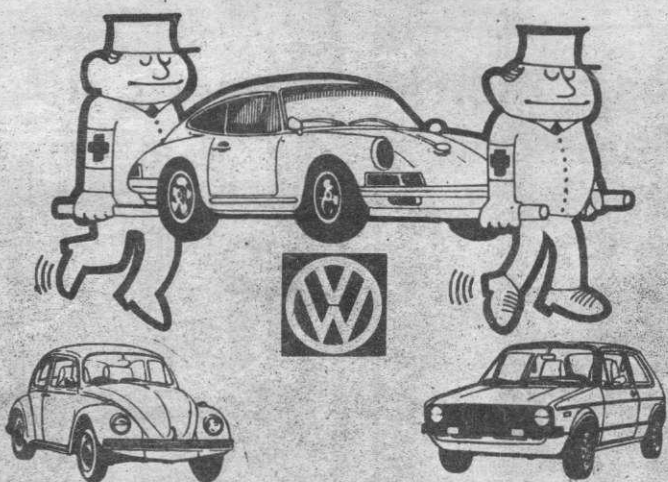
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
