

Coast Guard station offers free inspections

With the advent of a new pleasure boating season, the Ganges Coast Guard station is making a stepped-up effort to create greater public awareness about boating safety.

Though unknown to most boat owners, the Coast Guard offers a free courtesy inspection to Gulf Islands residents where personnel will run down a list of suggested and mandatory safety equipment that should be carried on board.

The owners of those boats that meet all of the requirements of the inspection will receive a Courtesy Inspection Sticker which remains in effect for a period of one year from the day it is issued.

Rick Tolonen, second coxswain, said that during the weekend before last, the Coast Guard inspected a total of 15 boats of which about 60% met all of the safety requirements.

Those that fail to pass the inspection are advised which requirements were not met and are given another opportunity to have

the inspection conducted.

Tolonen explained that the Coast Guard has various requirements for boats of varying size.

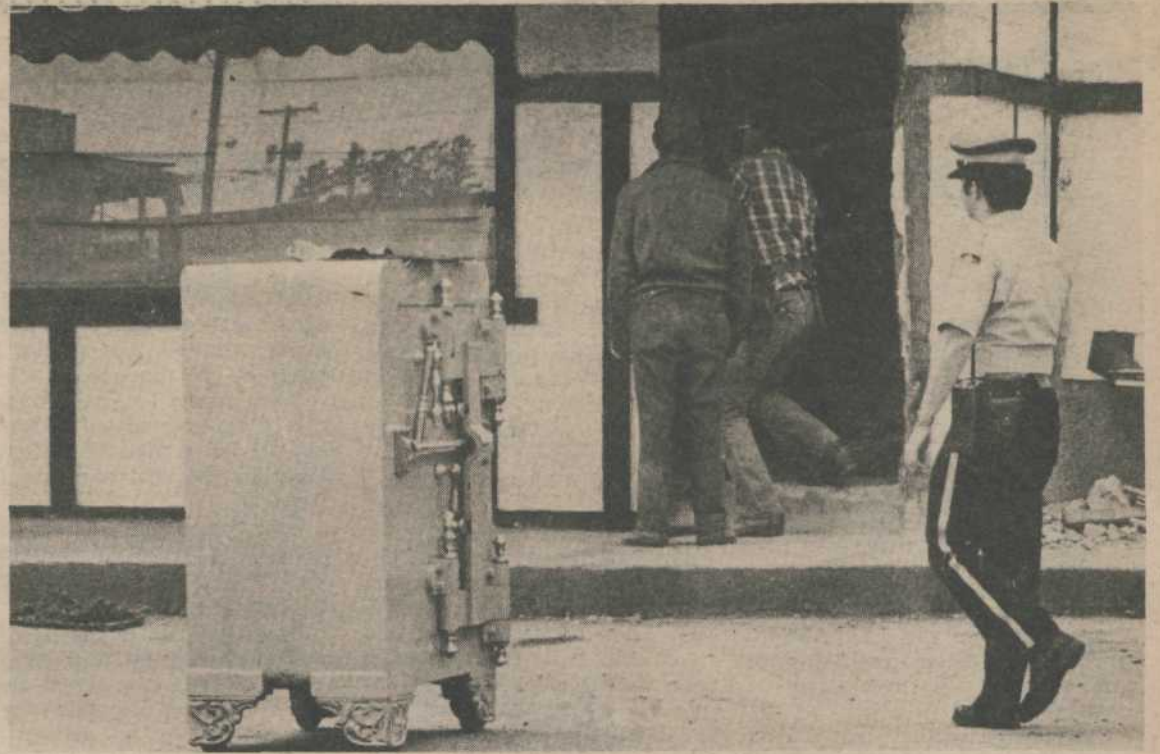
For example, boats more than 5.5 metres in length are required to carry a fire extinguisher on board.

He said that the most common omissions in proper safety equipment are fire extinguishers and life jackets of which there should be one for every person on board.

"We show them what is mandatory by law and what is required to make the boat a little safer," said Tolonen.

He suggested that boaters either call or drop by the Coast Guard station by Centennial Park in order to make an appointment to have their boats inspected.

Tolonen said that the Coast Guard will make arrangements to visit the Outer Islands on demand in order to conduct inspections there as well.

Proposal brings sharp exchange

Hospital meetings to remain closed

Meetings are closed. Hospital board at Lady Minto keep the doors shut.

On Monday evening a large hospital meeting showed no favour for a motion to have management meetings open.

Regional Director Yvette Valcourt had earlier announced that she would present a resolution to the two meetings in Ganges calling for open meetings of the Lady Minto Hospital board of management and Greenwoods.

The motion met with no agreement at the Lady Minto Hospital meeting and was not presented in the case of Greenwoods.

The initial motion read, "that all meetings of the board of management of Lady Minto Hospital be open to the public."

Chairman Wes Edwards declined to accept it on the grounds that it was unconstitutional, but he proposed an amended motion which would be acceptable. It called on the board of management to consider permitting members of the hospital society to attend management meetings.

HE WOULD BE AGHAST

Chief of the medical staff, Dr. Hugh Borsman was not warm towards the proposal. It is tried in some parts of the province and about 20% of hospitals maintain open management meetings, he told the gathering. It has been attempted to publicize deliberations by inviting the press. The reporters got bored with the lengthy meetings and gave up.

There would be many aspects of the meetings which would still be in camera, he warned. "I would be aghast at the thought of the public being allowed to attend all meetings," he announced.

She hadn't anticipated opposition commented Valcourt, but she appreciated the statement made by the chairman and Dr. Borsman.

Rita Cummings agreed that some things would be in camera, but that there is room for dialogue.

PATIENT CARE

Main function of the board is patient care, the meeting was told.

A.F. Humes saw closed meetings as throwing democracy out of the window by not letting the public know what is going on in the community.

He was supported by Hermann

Kirchmeir who told the meeting that no democratic process is possible without being informed.

Of the 139 persons voting, only 16 favoured the motion.

Otter Bay Logging Co. will be permitted to install a breakwater in Fulford Harbour, but it must be a floating breakwater in order to avoid damage to the shoreline.

Ministry of lands, parks and housing refused a permit to install a filled-rock breakwater for fear that the littoral drift be intercepted.

Both the Islands Trust and the ministry of fisheries expressed concern over a rock breakwater,

reported the ministry of lands last week to the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee.

The breakwater is planned down-harbour from Drummond Park.

The ministry explained that any kind of floating breakwater would meet its criteria and that if the Trust wished to express specifications or style the applicant must be advised directly.

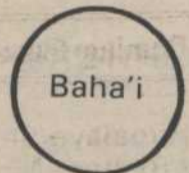

Dog vaccination urged by SPCA

The epidemic of parvo-viral enteritis, which occurred in the area about a year ago, caused many dog owners to have their dogs vaccinated against this disease.

The vaccine used at that time was a feline-distemper vaccine, which if followed by a booster at one month produced adequate immunity. Since the two viruses are closely related, the feline-distemper vaccine produced an immunity to canine parvo.

A specific vaccine is now available for canine parvo. With all these vaccinations, an annual booster shot is needed to maintain immunity, the local branch of the SPCA advises.

It is recommended that all dogs be re-vaccinated yearly against parvo, and also against distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis and parainfluenza. The latter group are covered by a combined vaccination which is abbreviated into DHLPP.

Rabies is not a problem in British Columbia now, unlike other Canadian provinces. It is wise, however, to have your dog immunized every three years, says the SPCA.

"Moreover, if you are taking the dog into the U.S., a current rabies certificate (within three years) is mandatory. The same, incidentally applies to cats," Driftwood was told.

Anyone in doubt is urged to consult a veterinarian.

What lies ahead for region?

Day-long conference on economy

When four speakers set the pace for an economic conference in Victoria on Friday it was the self-styled devil's advocate who offered the liveliest presentation.

David Anderson, teacher, traveller, politician and environmentalist, offered a series of reasons why expansion is undesirable and concluded with the assurance that government should not be involved in the finding of jobs for newcomers. More optimistic were Energy Minister Bob McClelland and Ray Williston. The solid statistics were offered by planner Brian Weekley.

The Capital Regional Economic Development Commission took a day's look at future economic options, with a workshop at the University of Victoria.

During a day of analyses, the most commonly cited problems were the multiplicity of municipalities in the Greater Victoria area and the cost and problems of transportation to the mainland.

Any project or development that extends beyond the boundary of one municipality requires that it conform with a variety of regulations and controls, the delegates generally agreed.

The conference was broken into three workshops and all three heard the same sad tale. Master of ceremonies was TV personality John Barton, who introduced the commission chairman Doug Webb.

The conference opened with an address by Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources Minister Bob McClelland.

IT WON'T WORK

Zero growth is out, stated the minister. It is not a workable option. The conference was looking at the opportunity for economic development in the Capital Region.

"The issue is not whether or not there will be growth," he explained, "but what kind of growth, when and where it will be and how it will be controlled?"

Impact of energy is seen in every facet of living, said the minister of energy. Concern for wise use of energy has been growing since 1973, he observed, and many activities hinge on the cost and availability of energy.

Brian Weekley, senior planner of the Capital Regional District, looked back over the years of growth. Population of the region in 1968 was 173,000. At that time the economic commission forecast the future development, to come up with a figure of 238,000 for the region's population by 1981. The figure was 232,800. It was accurate within 3%, he explained.

"A planner likes to say this!"

He reviewed the growth to the present time and he compared the choices. He referred to the balance which must be established between the use of area resources.

WHERE TO GO?

The future development brings together the work force and the employer and the facilities. In the Capital Region there is a dearth of service land for new development to go. The workshop subsequently examined the loss of industrial sites to residential development.

The future requires that an assessment be made of what growth is acceptable and to what extent "trade-offs" are acceptable on "precious" land resources.

Weekley spoke of the division of the region into seven municipalities. These are in addition to extensive areas of unincorporated communities. He looked at the possible amalgamation of the municipalities.

"Personally, I saw it as desirable," he told the meeting, "although the implications are not simple."

ENVIRONMENTALIST

David Anderson, introduced as a UVic professor, described his appearance on the list of speakers as "a token environmentalist". Victoria, he told the conference, is not improving in recent years: it is going down.

"The quality of life in Victoria has already suffered adversely as the effect of growth."

He looked at instances.

Theatres: better.

Restaurants: better if you can afford them!

Cinemas: better if you can accept the grim things they have on.

"On balance, growth has been destructive of the environment."

The Victoria area was once identified by good fishing, boating, gardens, easy traffic, low crime, he suggested.

Anderson drew a grey picture of sports fishing of the future. And he admitted he was taking a pessimistic view. That, he asserted, was his role.

"I would be unhappy to see salmon fishing down to two months a year and one fish a day," he announced. "But inevitably the period of few restrictions is over."

And how grim for golfers? **\$10,000 INTO GOLF**
In 10 to 15 years, said the former B.C. Liberal leader, entry fee into a regional golf club will cost about \$10,000 with an annual fee of \$2,000.

And you may wait 10 years to get in.

And you may die in the meantime.

Check on Japan and Hong Kong, suggested the speaker.

Gardens will be famous, but "we'll soon be into window box gardens."

He recalled that his aunt's home has been converted into four condominium apartments. Spacious homes spell spacious gardens. Apartment blocks mean no gardens.

And of boating:

It was once a pleasant event to find another boat in an anchorage. The skippers would meet and exchange hospitality. He recalled anchoring recently in Desolation

Sound. There was no room to tie up: it was misnamed and packed. Small boaters were out in the outboards screaming around the bay, while their parents were oblivious to the noise above the sound of their generators.

TRY TORONTO

"If you want big city services the best city for you is Toronto," he assured the workshop.

His views are not a drawbridge mentality, nor a sink the ferries mentality, he assured his listeners.

Again he looked to Hong Kong. Based on the population density of that oriental city, the population of the Capital Region could be contained in an area of 150 miles radius.

Anderson could accept the fact that expansion does not improve the environment, but he called for a freedom of movement.

But he still had a caution. "I object to the principle that if people are born here or move here we are bound to find jobs for them."

FREE ENTERPRISE

He had a word for the minister of energy.

"McClelland believes in government intervention. I don't. I'm a free enterpriser. He isn't!"

Government aid in an area of deteriorating economy is justified, he admitted, but in an area like the Capital Region it is not.

Further growth will take place in the region, he agreed, but that growth will reduce the amenities of the region. Trying to make jobs is costly and ineffective.

"If something needs doing, look to the private sector!"

Anderson concluded with a series of cautions against artificial growth.

"The biggest fraud in the world is so-called job creation," he warned.

Get rid of the concept that we have an obligation to produce jobs!

He wasn't saying, "Do nothing!" He was urging the conference to avoid hasty decisions.

If people want to move here: fine! But there is no obligation on the part of anybody to find them jobs.

IN FOUR DAYS

When Ray Williston's grandfather moved from Winnipeg to Victoria he wrote back to his wife, still on the prairies. She received the letter in four days and that was before the days of electronic sorting and jet planes, recalled Williston, president of the B.C. Cellulose Corporation and former cabinet

People need jobs. Jobs need people. Forecasters warn of a need for 34,000 more jobs in the Capital Region by 1991 and then another 30,000 by 2001. The influx of people and the accompanying economic growth must not be allowed to threaten the amenities of the region. This was the background to the second economic conference in the region in 13 years.

Number one employer in the region, the conference learned, is the tourist trade. Visitors spent \$108 million here in 1978. Jobs in the industry are low-paying and seasonal, delegates were warned. Transportation and poor communications could be a threat to the government employment in the Victoria area. Many government functions have moved to other regions. The unknown factor is the seashore. The region boasts an extensive coastline. How can it be used to advantage?

This was the stage when the regional economic conference opened on Friday at the University of Victoria.

minister.

He brought a message of confidence in the future and growth to meet the confidence.

This is the most fortunate country on earth, he told his audience.

Despite stories to the contrary, there is lots of wood left in the province, he asserted.

Of the region he was equally confident, although he referred to the businesses which have left the Victoria area for the mainland and outlined some of the contributing factors.

Following the various presentations delegates took part in the discussion groups.

There were three groups. They considered the kind of jobs desirable in the region; the number of jobs needed in the area and the impact on amenities resulting from increased employment.

While the three workshops overlapped in many of their considerations, a number of features of the region were debated in all three discussions.

Notable among those was the duplication of administrations, the problems of travel and transport and the difficulty of finding suitable property for businesses.

The final session, late on Friday afternoon, was the wrap-up, when the chairman of the discussions, TV personality John Barton invited workshop chairmen to summarize their experience.

The final phase was a light review of the activities and a final report will be published when all the debates have been analyzed.

There was almost universal agreement that the economy of the region should be debated again in less than the 13 years which have passed since the first conference.

BOOK REVIEW

Deja vu a la Salt Spring

The Town That Fought To Save Itself, by Orville Schell and Ilka Hartmann. Pantheon Books, 1976. Reviewed by David Skinner.

"The law locks up the man
or woman

Who steals the goose from off
the common,

But lets the greater villain loose
Who steals the common from
the goose."

The formula: Take a small town in Northern California. Isolate it on a beautiful peninsula accessible only after an arduous drive over tortuous roads. Give it a coastal Mediterranean climate, thin rocky soil, and make it the home of modest tradespeople, small farmers and urban refugees, and give it a waste disposal problem. Then have it discovered by developers and throw in a regional board with plans to build a massive sewer. Like magic we have a recipe for *deja vu a la Salt Spring*. Like its characters, *Town* is a beautiful book. Beautiful to hold and look at, it conveys the inner strengths, foibles and humanity of the residents of Briones with an all too rare literary touch. Author Schell is sophisticated but his total lack of urbanity is the secret which makes readers take on the townspeople as their friends.

But back to the business at hand. For all of you who feel Salt Spring is about to be overrun by aliens in bulldozers towing bricks, mortar and sewer pipe, *Town* is a book of hope. The people rally...they take over the Public Utilities District. The big sewer plan dies, giving birth to a smaller one. In the meantime a building moratorium is declared because of a pollution emergency (genuine in this case). During the period, local tradespeople find an abundance of work available that normally

would go to large contractors in San Rafael or Petaluma. Merchants, tired of serving fickle tourists, gradually eliminate souvenirs from their shelves in favour of locally needed durables.

Someone constantly removes the sign pointing to Briones on the main highway. A sheriff's deputy whose sole occupation seems to be arresting nudists and dogs is himself arrested for speeding, by an irate local lady. A master plan evolves, calling for a one per cent annual growth limit. Commission real estate brokers are discouraged; non-commission cooperative finding services replace them. Highway widening by the state is dropped. An experimental farming community is approved for operation without having to adhere to all outdated building and health codes. Increased bus service from San Francisco for tourists is stopped.

In the author's words, "A town which is a community is a delicate organism. As yet, it has virtually no legal means at its disposal by which to protect itself from those who choose to search it out. Unlike an individual it cannot sue for invasion of privacy. It cannot effectively determine how many people can live in it...If the people who call that town home find the influx of people, cars and money unsettling, they have little recourse."

Town is the story of the good people of Briones who grabbed destiny by the neck, wrestled it to the ground and changed it by making it their own.

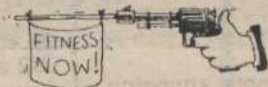

Planners to inspect

No decision reached on proposal to expand Burgoyne Bay logging

Decision on the expansion of logging activities at Burgoyne Bay has been postponed for a month. Salt Spring Island Trust Committee heard an application last week from Texada Logging for expansion of log booming, sorting and storage facilities in Burgoyne.

Two foreshore leases were under consideration, one to the north of the bay and one to the south.

The bay is largely given over to the industry and although there is an oyster lease, the lease is held by the same company and there is a restriction on shellfish because of the government wharf, trustees learned.

North side lease would extend the industrial area of water by roughly 20 acres, or 9.5 hectares.

ON BOTH SIDES

There are foreshore leases on both sides of the proposed extension and the upland property is owned by Texada. The water is deep with virtually no intertidal zone, reported planner Dean Strongitharm. Impact of the use would be minor, added the planner.

It was also noted that when the company asked for extension of its oyster lease in 1979, the Trust rejected the application on the grounds that the area is better used for logging.

The application to the south of the bay calls for expansion of the present area by five times, the meeting was told. Pat Corneille

spoke on behalf of Salt Spring Log Sorting Company.

The application is for log storage and handling and the facilities will also handle commercial logs. At a previous consideration of the proposal, the Advisory Planning Commission had expressed the mild concern that the industry might be moving from Cowichan to Burgoyne. Local reaction to use of the bay for log sorting and dumping has eased out some of the logging activities on the Vancouver Island side of Sansum Narrows. Much of this activity has been in the Cowichan Estuary, where there is a strong feeling against such use of a

seafloor property, trustees learned.

COMMUNITY DUMP

One of the current leases is held by the company on the understanding that it be used as a community dump for Salt Spring Island operators.

The south side is more sensitive to industrial use than the north side, reported Strongitharm, with its greater intertidal zone and clam beds. It is not, however, anywhere near as vulnerable as the Cowichan Estuary, he added.

The committee held it over for decision until the Advisory Planning Commission reports on its inspection of the site.

Down Through the Years With Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

Gerry Bourdin, president of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce, is urging islanders to write to Premier Bill Bennett expressing their opposition to recently announced ferry rate hikes. The chamber dealt primarily with the topic of rising transportation costs at Tuesday night's meeting. Ken Arnott predicted serious traffic problems on the mainland over the July 1 weekend as tourists and other travellers avoid sailing to the islands on account of the rate increases. It was suggested, and the chamber agreed, that minister of transport and communications Jack Davis be invited to Ganges to address the subject of ferry fares.

The 2½ year old son of a Vancouver couple was found drowned in the swimming pool of a Salt Spring Island residence last weekend. Artificial respiration was attempted but was of no avail in saving the youngster's life.

The Capital Regional District is having considerable misgivings over the installation of an experimental sewage treatment plant in Ganges, the Ganges Sewer Committee was told one night last week. The committee has informed the CRD that it is willing to agree to the scheme so long as it is not at local expense and that a conventional treatment plant be provided as a backup to the experimental installation. Three provincial government departments have made overtures to the committee concerning the construction of an experimental facility. CRD chief engineer Norman Howard was not enthusiastic over a proposal advocating the Coulthard system. Regional director George Heinekey agreed on the basis that the Coulthard system is so far unproven.

Permits for 22 new homes were issued for the Gulf Islands during the month of May, according to figures released this week by the Capital Regional District. Last month's figures bring the year's total to date to 125 permits which represent about \$4,331,854 in new construction. The permits issued in May represent construction valued at \$626,106.

A report was made available at last week's Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce meeting which indicated that work is progressing at a satisfactory rate on Ruckle Park and that an opening date of July 1 is anticipated. "Ruckle Park is going to be really something," Pat Baines told his fellow members. Work crews have already put in a road extending about a quarter-mile into the park. Ending in a loop, the road gives access to parking area and 20 walk-in pads. An overflow area is now under preparation with accommodation for up to 40 tents.

TEN YEARS AGO

A provincial spokesman has

described a proposal by federal conservation minister Jack Davis for a national marine park for the Georgia Strait as utter nonsense. Lloyd Brooks, deputy minister of recreation and conservation in Victoria, assured a panel of planners that the federal program would not work. Sponsored by the Capital Region branch of the Community Planning Association of Canada, the panel discussion, held at the University of Victoria, was attended by ecologists, planners and engineers. Spokesmen from the B.C. and Washington state governments also attended. The community planners agreed that the waters are deteriorating and that correction is becoming a matter of some urgency.

A Walker Hook Road man has offered a \$300 reward for the safe return of his pet collie Skipper which failed to return home one day several weeks ago. "He was the only family I ever had," said George Tuckwell of the sand-coloured pooch that he raised from a pup. Neighbours report that another dog from the area returned home one day recently bearing a shotgun wound but it's yet to be determined who was responsible for taking aim at that particular animal.

The body of a New Westminster man missing since early January has been found floating in Bennett Bay off Mayne Island. The body was discovered by fire chief Jim Ross and was recovered by the RCMP boat. The individual was reported missing to New Westminster police on January 6.

The conviction of an individual who had been sentenced to a prison term for trafficking LSD on Salt Spring Island in the spring of 1970 has been overturned. Convicted in Victoria county court, the man appealed the sentence and the B.C. appeal court quashed the conviction late last week.

Zone chairman Mike Sealey, a familiar visitor to the Salt Spring Island Lions Club, officiated at installation for incoming officers one night last week at Fulford Hall. Taking office for the coming year were president Jim Merston, first vice-president Bob Lawson, second vice-president Ed Williams, third vice-president Aage Villadsen, secretary Philip Sawford and treasurer Norman Hind-Smith.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

The exact proposed boundaries of the projected Ganges Village are

to be discussed and perhaps set at the initial meeting of the village organizing committee when it meets later this week. The committee is to investigate the feasibility of a village municipality and prepare the initial petition asking the minister of municipal affairs to hold a plebiscite on the issue. C.R. Horel, a member of the committee, has been busy preparing a map on which the proposed boundaries are marked.

Aware that a sighting has been reported in the vicinity of East Point Lighthouse on Saturna Island, Bill Lawson brought down a six-foot female cougar over the weekend while out for a drive with his wife. Lawson, the shale plant foreman, had packed his rifle that night after learning that Gordie McFadden had spotted a cougar the previous day.

A Victoria man was seriously injured earlier this week when the vehicle he was driving left Vesuvius Bay Road while rounding a curve, skidded sideways and struck a tree. The man is reported to have suffered head lacerations and is resting at Lady Minto Hospital. He is also facing a charge of dangerous driving as a result of the accident in which a passenger received minor injuries. The car was totally destroyed.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

The community's campaign for funds to purchase the Salt Spring Island Golf Course property has been quietly gathering momentum in recent weeks and already half of the \$20,000 needed by the end of July has been collected. More than 100 community-spirited people have already subscribed to buy shares for the project but organizers stress that more subscribers are necessary to make it a true community undertaking.

A party of 65 veterans of World War I and of the South African War will visit Ganges aboard the *Motor Princess* next week on a cruise arranged by the Gulf Islands Ferry Company. The veterans, all members of the Royal Canadian Legion from the Victoria district, will be met on arrival by a colour party from the local Legion.

Absolute discharge given

A long-time Salt Spring Island resident was given an absolute discharge in provincial court last Wednesday in connection with a shoplifting charge laid when he attempted to steal a small quantity of food from a Salt Spring Island grocery.

Martinas Kristiansen of Park Drive had contested charges that it had been his intention to commit a theft when he walked out of the Gulf Islands Trading Company on May 19 with a case of condensed milk, two loaves of bread and a small quantity of butter.

Grant Carignan, proprietor of the store, testified that he had observed Kristiansen concealing the food items in a bag in his own shopping cart after which he left the store through an entrance door, thereby bypassing two cashiers.

Stopping him on the sidewalk in front of the grocery, the elderly man claimed to have paid for the

articles, Carignan stated.

When questioned as to whom he had paid, Kristiansen was unable to provide an answer, the grocer explained.

In testifying on his own behalf, Kristiansen stated that he had decided to leave the store and head for home when he experienced a sharp pain in his hip. Kristiansen said that he would have returned later in order to pay for the goods.

The articles had a total value of no more than \$33, Carignan told the court.

Though representing a verdict of guilt, the unconditional discharge carries with it no recorded conviction and saves the accused from having a sentence imposed.
