the hall the majority of wayfarers preferred to stroll on foot, savouring the sights, sounds and scents of a leafy, green road.

Harry and Devina Baines, the guests of honour, riding in a 1927 Model A Ford chauffeured and owned by Ken Allen, headed from the parade from Devina Drive to the Community Hall. There followed a flotilla of decorated bicycles, a cart pulled by Puppy Power and a strolling of adults and children costumed romantically or humorously in true carnival style.

The ceremonies began and continued out-of-doors, commencing with the dedication of the association's newly acquired Canadian flag and singing of the national anthem with the new official version thoughtfully supplied for the benefit of those who are used to repeatedly "standing on guard".

THREE DISPLAYS

Inside the hall were three well arranged displays. First a collection of historical photographs of the early days of the North Galiano community; this included the salteries at Salishan, the *Tillicum* (a dugout refitted by Captain Voss as a sailing vessel in which he circumnavigated the globe), homesteads and some of the first settlers. Galiano Artists Guild contributed pictures of local scenes and lastly Miriam Bings had mounted an exhibition of modern commercial fishing illustrated by diagrams of purse seining, trolling, otter trawling, gillnetting and long-lining.

On a dais again a back cloth showing the waters of Porlier Pass and Race Rocks, painted by A. Ross stood the model of the lighthouse at Race Point made by Harry Baines Sr. many years ago remind his wife Devina of the days when, as a young girl, she was entrusted with the care of the Race Rock light by her father, Sticks Allison.

LIST OF POSTMASTERS

There was a list of the North Galiano postmasters beginning with John Shaw in 1904 and ending with Devina Baines as postmistress from 1966 to 1970. Philatelists should value any covers they possess of the now withdrawn North Galiano postmark. Teachers at the North Galiano School, closed in 1952, and Retreat Cove School were listed with many a gap which the association would like to fill. The list of lighthouse keepers from the original Sticks Allison to the present is complete.

In the recently cleared parking lot sturdy local loggers displayed their skill and muscle, although in the greasy pole-sitting contest male supremacy was successfully challenged by Glenda Rasmussen. Elated no doubt by her victory, Glenda then went on to win the auction for the cord of wood to be sawn to her specification by the young men she had just overcome.

The raffle for a 26 lb. Galiano lamb donated by Ralph Brine was won by Ralph Brine, who generously re-donated it. On second drawing it was won by Bernice Burrows of Shaw's Landing. The salmon donated by Nancy Quist was won by Doris Russell. Although it was the cooks' first effort at large scale barbecuing the Cornish-hen meal served was praised by over 100 satisfied diners.

ALFRESCO CONCERT

The Jamboree was rounded off by an alfresco concert. Opening number was a selection of old-time favourites played by Pat Weaver on accordion, Francine Renaud on violin and Dan of the One-man Band on guitar. The Galiano School Ukelele Band and Chorus conducted by Elizabeth Brinson with soloist Heather Martyn provided a Japanese and two Spanish songs to remind us of the links of the community with those countries.

Keith and Debbie Holmes gave their first public performance of *Puff the Magic Dragon* using puppets beautifully made by Debbie with Keith providing the guitar accompaniment. We look forward to more puppet shows by this creative duo. Next, Laurie Ann Macleod from Ladysmith, with which the North End community has always been closely associated, entertained with Highland dancing.

The two-tier natural stage was pre-eminently fitting for the performance of *The most lamentable comedy, and most cruel death of Pyramus and Thisbe!* by the Galiano Artisans Guild.

AUTHOR'S INTENT

Taken from Act V of Shakespeare's *Midsummer Night's Dream* one might conjecture that the bard would not have been too disapproving of the amateur cast's hamming since surely that was the author's intent. The action commenced on a grassy sward at audience level, introduced by Akasha Forest as Prologue declaiming from an elevated position on a stump. Stephen Nemtim, alias Bottom the Weaver, alias Pyramus met the beautiful Thisbe, a disguised Joe Fleming, on either side of a suitably dense wall played by Audrey Thomas. The action then ascended to a small plateau separated from the main stage by a rock cliff. This enabled Pyramus to play his death scene at two levels punctuated by a spectacular fall down the cliff.

Not to be outdone, Thisbe tripped down the cliff to perform her gory end over Pyramus' lively corpse, unperturbed by the comments of Bob Gilson as Demetrius and Andrew Loveridge as the Duke, and the howls of the audience.

Living greenery provided a magical backdrop, flats, exits and entrances for Oberon played by

Ian Gould, Titania played by Carol Minette and a bevy of very young fairies and elves. Anami Nath's Moonshine shone from a stump and another charred stump surmounted by a living wreath represented Ninny's tomb.

ENCHANTING

An evening performance by floodlight would be enchanting in such a beautiful natural setting. Conflict of interest regulations prohibit comment on Puck and the Lion.

Greg Gammon sang and accompanied himself on the guitar, a professional performance. Finally, Norman Russell ably led community singing accompanied by the music of the Weaver trio. Mention must be made of the excellent audio system which enabled master of ceremonies Woody Coward to focus the audience's attention as he efficiently directed the program along.

Congratulations to the organizing committee of Alistair Ross, Gill Allen, Elspeth King and Ken Pattison for this most successful event which we hope will turn into an annual highlight of the Galiano summer season.

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Ads in Driftwood are incredible

His name was P. Saunders and he had been reading *Driftwood*.

He was another who learned that the place for a ski-doo was Rob's Welding and that Harmony House are agents for Kimball pianos. It was all in the business directory in *Driftwood*, published in Ignace, Ontario.

Mind you, that wasn't all that odd, because Saunders came to the island from Ontario.

The Ignace *Driftwood* is tossing on the waters of the Great Lakes. It is published by Dennis and Jackie Smyk and is distributed at \$15 for a local subscription and \$20 outside the local area.

The advertisements would kill a west coast reader. Like the cottage. Remote cottage on Phyllis Lake, accessible by boat and portage, snowmachine or air. Built in 1979 the cottage is 16 ft. by 24 ft., of plywood, partially insulated and equipped with a metal roof. Wood heater, cookstove, propane lights, Coleman stove, utensils etc., with a price tag of \$8,000. And the name of the vendor is, appropriately enough, Hunter. A remote cabin,

12 ft. by 48 ft. on Bernard Lake was up for bids by the bank. A residential lot in Dryden is 150 ft. by 427 ft. and \$15,000.

The only other feature of the Ontario *Driftwood* that really catches the saltwater eye is the price of prefabricated homes "on your foundation" and complete with plush carpet and cushion floor; solid oak kitchen cupboards; aluminum siding; drywall interiors; 38 and 20 insulation and an eight-inch chimney. Three-bedroom, 24x42, \$31,300; 24x32, \$27,755.

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Mayne Island figure

Walter Hunt-Sowrey is widely mourned

Man who became Mayne Island's spokesman in three distinct areas died on June 30 at the age of 85. Walter Hunt-Sowrey was identified on the island and off as the key figure in the Mayne Island Fall Fair for 30 years.

During those 30 years or so he was also the spokesman for the Royal Canadian Legion and wrote hundreds of reports of Legion activities.

Walter Hunt-Sowrey was a Roman Catholic who arranged regular services in his own home for lack of a church or a resident priest.

He was born in Lincolnshire, England in 1895.

During the First World War he served with the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders. In the Second War he was with the Royal Canadian Artillery. He sub-

sequently served as a reserve officer in the Canadian army.

After the second war he came to Mayne Island, with his wife, Kitty, to farm. He entered into the life of the islands and was active in everything that happened there.

He was a past-president, and for many years served as secretary-treasurer, of the Gulf Islands Branch No. 84, of the Royal Canadian Legion. He was awarded the Legion Meritorious Service Medal.

He was also past-president and, for many years, secretary of the Mayne Island Agricultural Society.

He had held office in most Mayne Island organizations.

REQUIEM MASS

Requiem mass was celebrated on Tuesday, July 7 in the church of Our Lady of Grace at Ganges, with the Rev. P.A. Bergin officiating. Arrangements were by the Goodman Funeral Home.

A memorial service was held on Wednesday afternoon, July 8, in the church of St. Mary Magdalene, Mayne Island.

Walter Hunt-Sowrey was predeceased by his wife and all his near-relatives. He is mourned by his many friends on the island.

In lieu of flowers, donations are invited to the Gulf Islands Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion towards a memorial to be placed in the Mayne Island Museum.

The late Walter Hunt-Sowrey

From the time Walter came to Mayne Island, shortly after being discharged at the end of World War II, he took a great interest in the annual Fall Fair.

For several years previously the Fair had been dying on its feet, but the great interest he took in it and the energy and unlimited time he gave to it, started the Fair on the road to the great success it has been now for many years.

When he took over as secretary-treasurer, in 1952, he did all the corresponding, made out entry forms and lists, solicited donations and arranged the catalogue for printing, selling all the advertising,

and the many other details in connection with the operation of the fair.

He carried on this job for 15 years. He was thus elected Honorary President and subsequently made a Life Member.

From the time he came to the island Walter was at all the fairs and without his enthusiasm the Mayne Island Fall Fair would not have reached the heights it has today. He will be sorely missed at our fair next month.

During the past few years Walter became more interested than ever in the Royal Canadian Legion and at every opportunity

he travelled to Legion meetings in many areas of the lower mainland and Vancouver Island.

He was a long time secretary-treasurer of Branch #84, Gulf Islands. He was also a past-president. One of the highlights of

his association with the legion was the presentation to Walter of the Queen's 25th Anniversary Medal on the occasion of the 50th Birthday of the Gulf Islands Branch.

For many years Walter has been the Notary Public for the island; and for over 20 years has been the official government weather recorder and reporter.

In his spare time he farmed.

For well over a quarter of a century Walter gave of himself and his time for the benefit of the island, and the Memorial proposed by the Canadian Legion to be put in the Museum will serve to remind all of us of his many accomplishments and the legacy of service he has left to benefit the island for many years to come.

After 30 years of meeting

In the early 1950's a hatless man with a small backpack would steam into the office of the Sidney Review leaving a vapour trail from a curved and blackened pipe.

On a bad day he would come in without a trail and promptly light his pipe as soon as he came into shelter.

Walter Hunt-Sowrey would then remove the khaki canvas haversack from his back and delve into its untidy spaces.

While he was sifting through papers he would be carrying on a running commentary on affairs on Mayne Island.

Out of the slightly crumpled collection of papers would come his report on the Gulf Islands Branch of the Canadian Legion. No "Royal" in those days. He would plunk it down in triumph and discuss its contents while he dug again.

Out would come the blurb on the Fall Fair. A final search would reveal a report on the weather.

KEEP IT OUT!

"Keep my name out of it!" he would direct us.

When I came to *Driftwood*, so

did Walter: often.

He never forgot a meeting; he never missed a weather report and he preached fall fair wherever he went.

Every Legion report carried a reference to the "ladies and the rations." Every obituary carried his final prayer, "May he rest in Peace", because Hunt-Sowrey had three concerns in life, his church, his military service and his fall fair.

Sometimes he would drive to Sidney in his pickup. These were probably the days when he was not travelling on to Victoria.

In the 30 years I knew him I never heard him blow his top and I never heard him offensively angry or hostile with somebody else.

AFTER 30 YEARS

After 30 years, I have cleaned up his last copy. I have heard his last reminiscence of "the first war trenches; his war. I have smelled that pipe for the last time.

I enjoyed him during those years and nobody will ever fill his place.

And there is only one possible conclusion to a reminiscence of Walter Hunt-Sowrey, for he wrote it so often: "Grant him eternal peace, O Lord."

Shellfish may open soon

Shellfish closure imposed by the federal fisheries department recently should be lifted fairly soon, according to a department biologist.

Rick Harbo at the biological station in Nanaimo told *Driftwood* Monday that the next set of test results may allow opening of the area.

The ban closed all shellfish harvesting between Nanoose Bay and Sidney and has been blamed on heavy rainfall.

Harbo said that increased discharge from the Fraser River and local septic tank overflows were probably the major problem-causing areas.

A sampling program is under way on a weekly basis of little-

necks, butter clams and some oysters. Testing sites include Long Harbour, the Chain Islets in Ganges Harbour, Prevost Island and Tent, Thetis and Kuper Islands.

The closure was made, Harbo explained, on the recommendation of fisheries inspectors who had detected an increase in the coliform levels in clams harvested commercially. Some failed to pass inspection because of the high levels.

Some oyster leases were also affected by the closure.

Minor accidents make it quiet week

The Ganges RCMP detachment reported a quiet week on Salt Spring Island with only minor traffic accidents occurring.

The unit received several calls concerning dinghies being lost in the high winds of last week.

A Victoria woman faces charges of failing to yield the right of way following a two-car collision at the intersection of Lower Ganges and Vesuvius Bay Roads.

Patricia Hutchison of Victoria had stopped for the sign at the intersection, police said, but proceeded to run into the passenger-side of a car driven by Patricia St. Denis, also of Victoria.

No one was injured in the accident and the Hutchison vehicle suffered approximately \$1,800 in damages while the other car was dented to the tune of \$1,500.

A local juvenile could be facing charges of driving without due care and attention after the car he was driving went out of control on Rainbow Road, ran through a fence and rolled on to its roof early in the morning on July 5.

The youth was not injured but repairs to the car will cost about \$1,000.

Police are continuing the investigation of the accident.

William McCracken, 32, suffered injuries to his leg when he fell from a bicycle on loose gravel on Upper Ganges Road.

McCracken was treated in hospital and released.

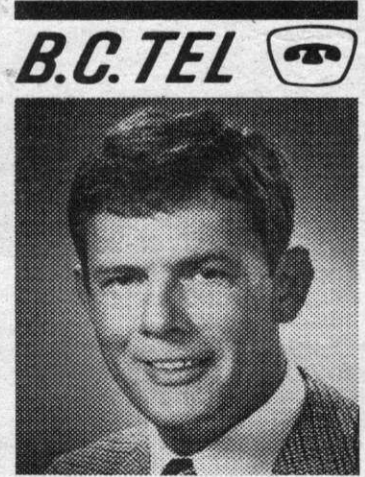
TWENTY YEARS AGO

Island swimming is clear

Most Salt Spring Island swimming areas monitored by the Capital Regional District are almost devoid of offensive character.

The health service of the region carries out regular tests, some monthly and some weekly.

St. Mary Lake and Cusheon Lake have shown a faecal coliform count of three. At Vesuvius the count was greater, with a reading of 11.

The lake indicator shows a 1.5% contamination in proportion to the maximum allowable pollution. When the coliform count reaches 200, swimming is cut off.

Only one beach tested this year shows a 200 level and that is in Victoria, at Ross Bay.

Three is the lowest level recorded at any point tested.



Coast Guard launch CG 122

Coast Guard busy

Summer's here, living's less than easy

Summer time and the living becomes less than easy for the Coast Guard crews in Ganges.

Between June 30 and July 4, the search and rescue teams were kept busy answering at least 15 distress calls as well as a number of false alarms.

Rick Tolonen, second coxswain of the CCG 122, summed up the situation, "Summer's here."

The Coast Guard unit based in Ganges Harbour serves the area from Nanaimo in the north to Victoria in the south with occasional forays into the San Juan Islands at the request of the United States Coast Guard.

The calls last week ranged from pulling a fishing boat off the rocks to searching for a lost boat which wasn't lost at all.

COMMON PROBLEM

The un-lost vessel points out a problem which the teams face regularly, said seaman John Wilcox.

When people set out for a destination, they should inform someone of the expected time of passage as well as any expected stops on the way.

The un-lost boat left Delta on the mainland but broke down and had to be towed back to port. No one informed the people at the destination of the delay and they called the coast guard to search for

the vessel.

The hovercraft, based in Vancouver, found the boat and passengers safe in Delta. The situation could have been much more serious, said Wilcox.

Many of the problems facing would-be boaters could be avoided with pre-planning.

MAY BE RUSTY

At the beginning of the summer season, both the boats and the people may be rusty. Fuel left in tanks tends to age poorly and could cause stalling or explosions.

"It's better to prevent accidents than to try to deal with them after the fact," said Wilcox.

The Coast Guard will run a courtesy check of a boat to ensure it is in proper running order and they advise the summer mariners to obtain a set of clear charts for the islands.

Wilcox related a story of a boat running aground on a rock which, although not marked with a bouy, was marked as a hazard on charts. The first boat was followed very closely by a second vessel and the rock which could have been avoided claimed two more victims.

The well-equipped vessel should have sufficient life jackets for all on board, a compass as well as charts and an anchor, among other items of equipment.

Wilcox said a vessel which breaks down near shore could drift on to the rocks but an anchor would hold it secure in deep water until help arrived.

Even with precautions, Wilcox said, "On the first couple of runs something is apt to go wrong."

Permits cancelled as weather warms

Sunshine may be great for tans but each day of warm weather increases the danger of forest fire.

The past few days of sun have dried the islands and Salt Spring Fire Chief Bob Leask has posted a high fire danger warning and cancelled all fire permits until further notice.

"It's getting to the point where there may be some wet spots but a lot of spots on the island are very dry," he said.

The fire warning situation could ease if the rains fall for a couple of days, but said the chief, "If we get a week of warm weather, we could have real trouble."

He advises residents and visitors to exercise caution until the danger is past.

The fire department on Mayne Island has cancelled fire permits except for incinerator use. The forest fire hazard on that and other Gulf Islands remains normal.

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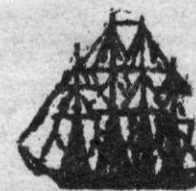
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
