In many cases, a new team being scored on that early in the game would sag, but instead the goal seemed to settle the Sting, and slowly but steadily, they took control of the play.

Salt Spring was enjoying some success going up the wing, as Juan de Fuca's defence were drawn out to cover, leaving a lot of open space in front of their net. On two or three occasions this lack of defence in front of their goal resulted in the Sting forwards enjoying excellent scoring opportunities.

As the first half wore on, Juan de Fuca's defence were less and less willing to come out and cover the wings, as it left their goal wide open.

TIED SCORE

With less than five minutes to go in the first half, Salt Spring's winger, Chris Koski, tied the score. Chris brought the ball up the wing but no one came to cover.

He continued in on goal and by the time the defence reacted to this new move it was too late, as Chris' chip shot caught the top right corner of the goal, tying the score at 1-1.

Salt Spring came out in the second half, totally confident in

their own ability, and obviously prepared to work for the win. Juan de Fuca had a few slick plays but Salt Spring had the hustle, and because of it, they literally penned Juan de Fuca in their own end.

Sweeper Charlie Hume had his defensive line of Curtis Bird and Mark Nordine up over centre, and every time Juan de Fuca tried to clear the ball, one of these three were there to hammer it back up-field.

BEGAN MAKING MISTAKES

With constant pressure on the defence, Juan de Fuca started to make mistakes. A hard shot resulted in a hand ball by a defender. The penalty shot by Andrew Aust resulted in his first goal of the season and put Salt Spring ahead 2-1.

With 15 minutes left in the game, every Sting player was a blur of activity, continuously beating Juan de Fuca to the ball, but by far the most active was the smallest player on the field, Robbie Wanless. An underage player brought in to try out for the team, Robbie's hustle and determination won him a permanent spot on the team, and in the hearts of every spectator.

The third and winning goal was the result of a hard shot taken by Chad Little. The shot from 20 yards out beat the keeper cleanly, but hit the goalpost. Izak Ondre rushed in from his half-back position to hammer the ball home before the defence could react, and the Sting had their first victory of the season.

Galiano Diving

A larger-than-life plywood silhouette of an underwater diver points the way to the office of Galiano Diving, the recently opened headquarters at Galiano

Lodge of Roy Treloar, professional diver.

If you open the door with a stained glass picture of a ship at sea, you will see the tools of Roy's trade, his diving equipment, and in an adjoining cabin a high pressure compressor which can pump up to 5,000 pounds per square centimetre.

Treloar, who learned to swim when he was four and was given a snorkel by his parents when he was eight, has been skin-diving ever since. He has taught swimming at various levels, spring-board diving and has been a scuba instructor for eight years.

He has sampled the fascinating world under the sea on the east and west coasts of North America, in the Caribbean and Bahamas and the waters off Central America. The phase of his life he describes as "pure pleasure" was when he lived in Yucatan between the jungle and the ocean, in a shelter built by himself from bamboo and driftwood.

DIVING EACH DAY

For food he depended on what he could obtain from his own efforts. Diving each day for an average of five hours, he feasted on abalone, lobster and conch and then refreshed himself with oranges and papaya.

Roy first visited Galiano eight years ago to dive off North Galiano. He came back two years

ago to dive commercially as a partner in Ocean Gold, a company which processed the roe of sea urchins for export to Japan.

Last year Roy ran a series of adult diving classes, and was also responsible for the annual summer swimming sessions for Galiano School children.

ALL LEVELS

He is presently offering all levels of instruction in diving, will rent diving equipment, fill tanks with air and undertake all kinds of commercial diving.

It is not surprising that Roy is interested in diving for treasure. At New Year's 1980 Roy was engaged to retrieve a lady's purse from the depths of Whaler Bay. He successfully located his target and returned the bag to its owner with contents intact — reportedly about \$14,000 in cash and jewellery.

He has recently recovered Wedgewood pottery in the vicinity of Gossip Island. His ambition is to discover a sunken ship and explore it for treasure and objects of archaeological value.

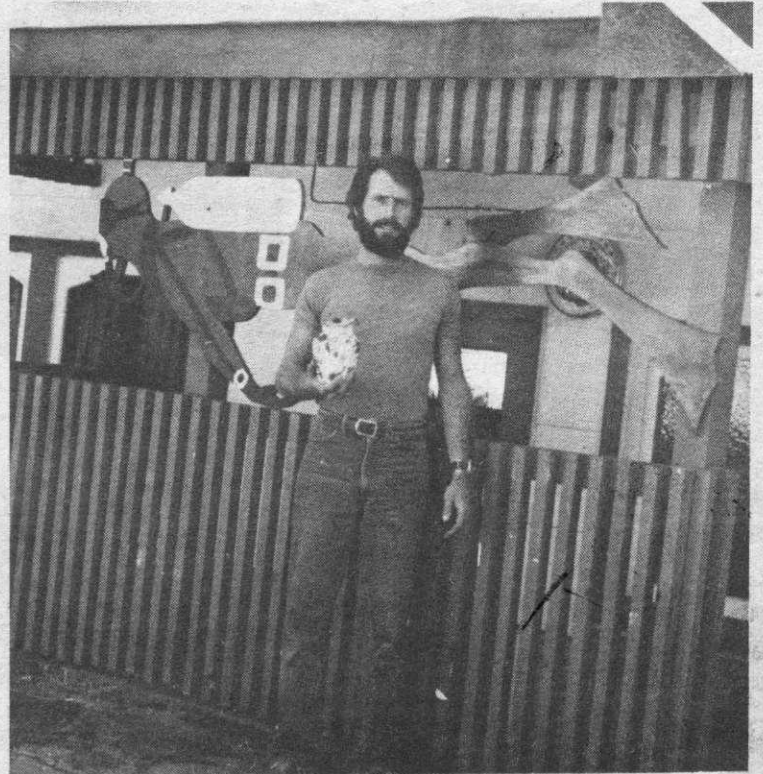

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Fishing moratorium seen as one way to save fish

The Pacific salmon are fighting an uphill battle for survival, says Tony Netboy, a noted authority on the fish.

Netboy, a resident of Salt Spring Island since his retirement has written five books on the salmon in its various habitats around the world.

After his latest book, *Salmon: The World's Most Harassed Fish*, was published by Collins Publishers in 1980, a reader wrote

to him and said, "Your books are fascinating, but they are all downbeat."

Downbeat they may be, said Netboy, but the books outline clearly the problems faced by the salmon. They are five species of salmon in the Pacific and one in the Atlantic. All species exist from the Arctic to about the 40th parallel.

The chum is native to Alaska and Russia, while the local species, the coho, chinook, sockeye and

pink, are to be found along the west coast of Canada and the United States north of Oregon.

KILLER OF SALMON

The Columbia River, once the breeding home of most of the species, has become the killer of salmon. The many dams, large hydro-power generators, stand in the way of the fish and keep many from reaching the spawning grounds.

Each dam, since the U.S. government began to supply fish

ladders around the installations, can be bypassed on the way up stream. But once the fish have been hatched and are ready to leave the fresh water for salt, they face a deadly obstruction, the turbines of the generators.

Even though many fish are helped around the dams and hatchery fish are introduced to the rivers below the dams, more are killed each year than return the next.

"I have to pat the B.C. government on the back," said Netboy, "because they've kept Hydro out of the Fraser."

That mighty river is home to the salmon and they flock each year by the many thousands to answer the urging of nature.

WONDROUS SAGA

The saga of the salmon is sad and wondrous. After the eggs have been laid and fertilized, the adults die. When the eggs hatch, the new generation of fish swim about the stream of their birth for a time from a few weeks up to two or three years, depending upon the species.

As one of the few fish to adapt to both fresh and salt water, the salmon swim downstream and in a river such as the Fraser, the

journey takes one month. In the Columbia, the downstream trek takes much longer.

At the estuary of the river, the fish swim about to get the feel of the river. Psychologists call the process imprinting for this is the time the fish learn which river is home.

Then it's off to the briny deep where the salmon will travel for up to four years. In the case of sockeye, the journey could take the fish up to 10,000 miles.

HEAD BACK

When the urge to mate overcomes the wanderlust, the salmon head back to the stream in which they were born. Hatchery salmon return to the stream into which, as fingerlings, they were dumped.

Such is the fury of survival which drives the salmon, they allow no obstacle to keep them from their appointed task. Anyone who has visited Hell's Gate on the Fraser can understand the determination which drives the salmon home.

Netboy became interested in salmon after he was hired by the Bonneville Power Corporation to write a report on the effects dams have on the migration of fish.

His fascination with salmon has taken him to almost every country in the world which has salmon spawning grounds. The information he has gathered has filled five volumes on the fish.

When his 650-page book, *Salmon: The Fight for Survival*, was published, experts and laymen alike learned new information about the salmon. Since its publication, the book has become the definitive handbook on salmon in the world.

DEATH STRUGGLE

Netboy sees the salmon in a death struggle as governments try vainly to replenish the stock. But the hatchery method of breeding, says Netboy, is a "race against the loss of natural stock" and the salmon are losing.

One answer, in his opinion, is to place a moratorium on commercial and sports fishing of the species. He said if the salmon had a few years to build up their numbers, survival may be possible.

The B.C. government spends many dollars each year to alleviate the plight of the salmon. Oregon has ordered a halt to fishing derbies.

But it may all be too little, too late....

Heavy oil washed up on beach

It must have been a freighter

Heavy oil washed up on the beach on South Pender Island at the week end is attributed to a passing freighter.

Environmental and fisheries agencies explained that it is very

difficult to trace the vessel responsible when the discharge is small.

A resident of South Pender reported to *Driftwood* that the oil

was deposited among the pebbles on the beach and in the seaweed.

A spokesman for the environmental protection service in Vancouver said that bunker oil is black and heavy and forms "gobs" of oil on the beaches. It is injurious to animal and plant life and in quantity is disastrous.

Neither the environmental service nor the fisheries had been notified of a spill and told *Driftwood* that the South Pender reader's complaint is the only report they had heard. Had the oil been the result of an extensive oil slick other reports would have been received.

There is an emergency warning system, *Driftwood* was told and all readers are urged to report the incidence of oil washing up on the beaches.

Residents may call the environmental service at 666-6100 or the Coast Guard at 666-6011. The emergency warning service operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week and the operators are eager to hear reports as soon as a spill is seen.

Pleasure craft empty tanks on their way out of harbour

Over the weekend at least two pleasure craft came into Ganges to enjoy local hospitality and left behind a most unwelcome deposit.

The two boats dumped their holding tanks into Ganges Harbour near Mouat's Point on the way out of the bay.

The conservation protection branch of the federal department of fisheries wants people to know it is against the law to dump deleterious substances, such as oil, into waters which are fished

or where the dumped material may wash ashore.

While the official admitted the law is difficult to enforce, he did say many judges take a dim view of those brought before the courts after being caught fouling harbours or bays.

Jim Stewart, harbour manager at Ganges, urges anyone seeing such incidents to obtain the registration number and description of the offending boat and report the information to him.

Expensive smoke

Those who watch the smoke rise from the end of a cigarette will have noticed that the pleasure is more expensive lately.

An increase in the provincial tax on cigarettes and tobacco has filtered through to retail outlets and pushed up the price of a pack of ready-made or roll-your-owns.

Cigarettes, by the carton of 200, had an increase of eight cents in tax added on. The per carton tax now stands at \$2.80, up from the previous \$2.72.

The half-ounce pack of tobacco brought the government eight cents per pack, up from 7½ cents. When measured in metric that translates into 14½ cents per 25 grams for the coffers instead of 14 cents.

The provincial tax is adjusted by a semi-annual indexing formula which ties the tax rate to the cigarette component of the Vancouver consumer price index.

The twice-yearly review means changes in the tax structure on September 1 and March 1. This latest hike in tax was laid on as of September 1.

Sawmill accident

An accident at Salt Spring Island recently left a local mill sawmill operator with 120 stitches in his backside.

Bob Burns was operating his mill near the Flexcrete Industries plant on Fulford-Ganges Road when he got too close to a revolving blade. The blade caught his shirt and pulled him backwards into it.

The accident took place Labour Day and despite Burns' injury, he was back at work the next day.

At Community Centre

Playground moved for new field

The children's playfield at the Salt Spring Community Centre fell victim to a sewage disposal problem when a septic field was installed in its place.

The septic field was needed, said centre director Marg Simons, to cope with the increased use of the centre. Tourists and visitors added to the use of facilities at the centre this year.

After the problem became acute recently, the health inspector was called in. He ran a dye test which proved positive and ordered corrective measures to be taken.

When the work crew moved in to install the septic field, they

treated the nursery school play equipment with less than gentle hands.

Most of the apparatus in the playground was donated and built by parents involved with the nursery school and as one parent said, they are "more than a little upset."

"If someone had notified us, given at least one day's warning, we could have moved it (the playfield)," she said.

The Community Society is having a meeting Thursday and the nursery people will ask questions concerning the handling of the situation.

Other problems plague the community group: the newly installed septic field isn't working properly, the oil storage tank sprang a leak and they recently had to ask the Capital Regional District for a supplementary grant to repair the recycling depot at the Valcourt Centre.

Despite the set-back, the nursery school folks are eager to recreate the playfield. They ask Salt Springers to help by donating any odd piece of log or lumber to set up the apparatus.

BOOK REVIEW

Energy, fresh inspiration delivered by *Born Indian*

BY ARDEN HENLEY
Born Indian by W.P. Kinsella. Oberon, Canada, 1981.

Reading a book takes time and energy. Mostly what the reader receives in return is entertainment. But some books transcend entertainment and deliver energy and fresh inspiration for living.

Such a book is *Born Indian* by W.P. Kinsella and it achieves its effect not through the traditional methods of literature but by the artifice of the story-teller.

Born Indian is the third collection of stories by Kinsella which feature the same cast of characters. The characters for the most part live on an Indian reserve near the town of Hobbema in southern Alberta. Silas Ermineskin, Frank Fencepost, Connie Bigcharles, Sadie One-Eye, Louis Coyote, Mad Etta, the medicine lady soon populate the reader's internal landscape.

YOUNG STORY-TELLER

Kinsella's voice, his point of view in these tales is Silas Ermineskin, plaintive, ironical, compassionate, yet stinging too. Silas is a young native living on the reserve. His proclivities as a story-teller have been noticed by an instructor, Mr. Nichols, at the local technical school where Silas and a number of his comrades attend, of course, at the behest of the department of Indian affairs.

Through Mr. Nichols' encouragement and tutelage Silas' tales is an apprentice to Mad Etta, the medicine lady. This gives him access to some of the more intimate and poignant moments in his people's life cycle: moments of bewilderment, sickness and death.

Born Indian is no litany of native people, close to nature, resisting the onslaught of civilization. The ground of these tales is the local bar, the Blue Quills Hall, the technical school at Wetaskawin. Silas' sister's

suburban home in Edmonton.

TRAGIC FIGURES

As much as boundaries between cultures are smudged by bulldozers, distinctions in view dissolved by Lethbridge Pale Ale, Silas' people are, nevertheless, a people apart, a people caught in the middle ground of confusion and anarchy. Silas' people are tragic figures, but therein lies the magic: these tales can be outrageously funny.

On a run to Edmonton in Louis Coyote's truck to pick up an order of fresh fish for Ben Stonebreaker's general store, Silas and friends stop by Silas' sister, Illiana's new house. Unfortunately, Illiana and her "white" husband, Bob, are away; fortunately, the house has a freezer in which to store the fish while a two-day party goes on. To compensate Illiana and Brother Bob for ransacking their home Silas and company leaves a brand-new fibreglass boat which they have borrowed from a dealer in downtown Edmonton.

NOT ALL COMEDY

Of course, *Born Indian* is not all comedy. There is social and political commentary, mystery and flashes of the shaman's way. Silas' description and narrative style is crisp and uncluttered. Even though Kinsella, a former Victoria cabbie turned university writing instructor, is no native, Silas conveys a deep sense of the humour and oppression of contemporary native life.

When I read Kinsella's first two collections, *Dance Me Outside* and *Scars*, I wondered if there was such a place as Hobbema. During this time I worked at a teen drop-in centre in Vancouver.

One of our clients was a wiry and intense native girl from Alberta who came one day and was gone the next. She did leave behind a long-distance telephone bill for Hobbema.

This was Saturna Island 50 years ago

Reference to the Simson family and their farm on Saturna Island in *Driftwood*, recently, reminded Harry Simson of some pictures he has of early life on Saturna.

Harry is one of the four sons of David and Margaret Gowan Simson who farmed the Payne farm on Winter Cove Road in the years following the First World War.

Mrs. Simson was in poor health and they saw an advertisement for the farm in a Vancouver newspaper, recalled Harry Simson. They went to Saturna for three months and lived there for 4½ years, from June, 1923 until early 1927.

Saturna is still the least populous of the Gulf group. In the early 1920's it was still less developed.

The family consisted of Mr. and Mrs. Simson and the four boys. Alastair and Kenneth worked the farm when the father was later in poor health and David and Harry were employed in other work.

Winter Cove was a camping ground for the Indian people collecting seaweed, recalled the old-timer from Saturna. It was not kelp, but a green seaweed which was collected, dried and shipped to China.

NURSING NEIGHBOURS

During their life on Saturna there was an outbreak of sickness among the Indians in the camp and Harry remembers his mother associating herself with a doctor and nursing the victims back to health.

Margaret Simson was a well-known figure in the islands, he told *Driftwood* and on her death there was a memorial service at the Catholic mission on Kuper Island as well as a service in an Anglican church on Salt Spring Island. The family had a close link with Salt Spring Island at that time, because they were shipping cream to the creamery at the foot of Ganges Hill. The creamery now serves as the Embe Bakery.

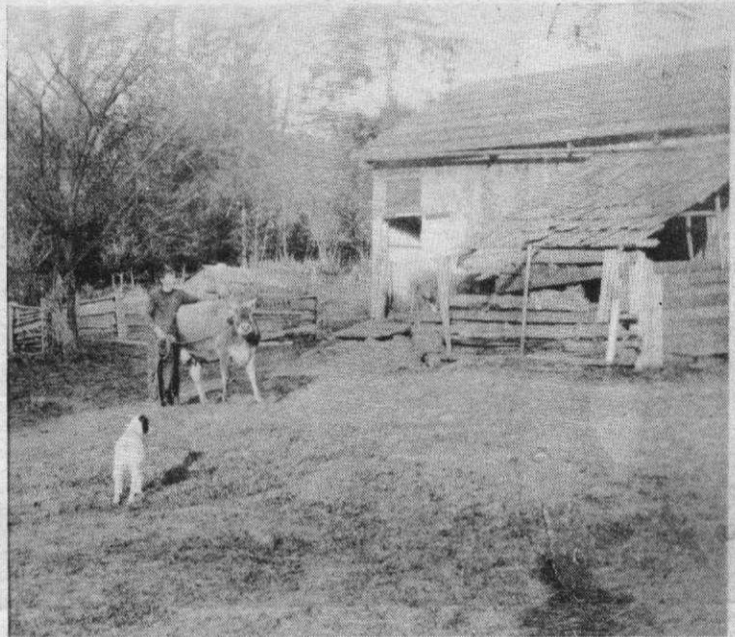
Dairy products were not the basic product of the Simson farming project. The farm was combatting tuberculosis in cattle, explained Harry Simson.

In the Fraser Valley, he remembers, there was a high incidence of tuberculosis, which he attributes to the very damp conditions of stabling and grazing.

As the animals fell victim to this complaint, the farmers needed new, disease-free stock and the farm on Saturna was the provider.

The Simson family had it both ways. They had farmed in the Fraser Valley and they had battled with the disease which was quite common a half-century ago. Now they were on the other side of the cattle fence and breeding stock to replenish the valley. In due course, the disease was virtually wiped out

and the system of stock replacement was outmoded.

The Simsons left Saturna and came to Salt Spring Island, where three of them, Harry, David and Alastair, are still living. The old Payne Farm home is now the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ken Gillespie.

Artcraft drew record number of visitors

More than 15,000 people visited Artcraft '81 at Ganges during its two months of operation this summer, resulting in a 12% increase in the gross sales, a spokesman for the sponsoring Community Arts Council stated.

It was the largest number of visitors the show has had in its 14 years of operation and is seen as a clear indication of the growing recognition for the works of the

artisans of the Gulf Islands. This year 157 artists displayed their works, which included many types of pottery, spinning and weaving, knitting, handcraft jewellery, woodwork, painting and stained glass.

The visitors came from 24 different countries including such faraway places as Tibet and Bangladesh. There were a good many from the United Kingdom,

from 29 of the United States and from every province, and the Yukon, in Canada.

At the closing of the show on September 7 a spokesman for the CAC had a special word of praise for the more than 60 volunteers who spent many hours in preparatory work and during the show which was open seven days a week in Mahon Hall. In addition to the many volunteers there were

four people who received honorary awards. They included two cashiers, a bookkeeper and a show co-ordinator.

It was pointed out that the show makes a valuable contribution to the Salt Spring community as an outlet for the many talented artisans of the islands. In addition, the money which the CAC receives from an 18% commission on all sales is funnelled back into the

community through grants to many of the arts groups and through various other channels.

At the conclusion of the show a draw resulted in first prize of a wall hanging going to Iain Turner of Glasgow, Scotland, while Michael Doherty of Mansell Road won a hand-woven shawl as second prize.



Down Through the Years with Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

The new members of the Island Trust were announced and Marc Holmes of Salt Spring Island was named chairman. John Gaines of Saturna and George Boulton of Gabriola were also appointed to the Trust. Holmes, an original member of the Capital Regional District board of directors, had also been an original member of the Island Trust which had been formed two years earlier.

The Ganges recycling depot ran into problems over the weekend when the volunteer worker didn't show up. The depot, at the parking lot for Mouat's store, was used to store recycleable items such as paper, tin cans and bottles for shipment to Victoria.

The Driftwood editorials commented upon three subjects. The lead editorial concerned itself with the appointment of Marc Holmes as chairman of the Island Trust with comments on the functions of the Trust. A second editorial took a look at one reason for inflation by commenting on the demand-for-more from Canadians. The third editorial had words about the policy of B.C. Ferries which allowed free passage between the Gulf Islands.

Enrolment in the various Gulf Island schools totalled 1,029 students, with the Salt Spring elementary school accounting for 458 pupils. At the secondary school, 345 students were enrolled.

The regional health officer, Dr. A.S. Arneil, expressing concern about facilities on Salt Spring Island to handle a disaster or epidemic, urged the school board to arrange emergency plans for use of school facilities. "I am particularly concerned with planning for outbreaks of contagious disease," the health officer told the board.

TEN YEARS AGO

Saturna Island residents objected to the proposed interim bylaws for zoning in the Gulf Islands. The group had asked the minister of Municipal Affairs for permission to secede from the Capital Regional District. Saturna bylaws should be prepared by Saturna residents, claimed the group. They did not want to be forced to accept zoning regulations from outsiders. The protest came during a series of public meetings to discuss the proposals.

The Lady Minto Hospital Auxiliary raised \$2,000 during a two-day bargain sale at Mahon Hall on Salt Spring Island.

The Driftwood editorials commented upon two subjects. The lead editorial took both the Capital Regional District board and the Saturna residents to task for acting "rather like school children" in the zoning bylaw

dispute. The second editorial congratulated X-Kalay for bringing about 50 city children to Salt Spring Island for a two-week summer vacation away from the large cities.

Centennial memo — Arthur E. Kennedy, the third governor of Vancouver Island once said there were but two classes of people here "...convicts and those who ought to be convicts."

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

The results of the provincial election showed the Social Credit party returned to power but with no gains in seats. Three seats had been added through redistribution and the NDP took two while the Liberals picked up the other.

The Lady Minto Hospital Auxiliary raised more than \$1,300 at a bargain sale held at Mahon Hall on Salt Spring Island.

The Driftwood editorials commented upon the provincial election. The lead editorial took issue with W.A.C. Bennett's call, during the campaign, for voters not to vote for any candidates but those of the Social Credit party. The second editorial was mostly candid comments on the success or failure of notable candidates around the province.

The voters of the Gulf Islands were to be asked to support school board plans to add an industrial education wing and three classrooms to the secondary school as well as a teacherage for Pender Island. Each item would be a separate decision for the voters. While the costs of the classrooms was not determined, the other additions would come to approximately \$67,500.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

Mouat Park in Ganges, Salt Spring Island was officially opened by the Hon. Earle C. Westwood, minister of Recreation and Conservation. The park site, which with the opening became part of the network of parks run by the province, was donated by Gavin Mouat.

The Driftwood did not offer an editorial.

The school board offered regrets

and said the Centennial Museum site could not be used for anything other than educational endeavors. The site was the centre of a discussion concerning the best possible location for a new fire hall.

A feature in the Brandon Sun extolled the virtues of living on Salt Spring Island but the glowing account, written by a reporter who had visited here, did not produce a mass exodus of seekers of the good life.

The leaders of the Chamber of Commerce issued an invitation to any and all members who wished to attend executive meetings.

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U.S. Coast Guard visits Ganges

The United States Coast Guard were in Ganges last week.

The *Point Richmond*, a cutter stationed at Anacortes, Washington, came steaming up the harbour to tie up at the government wharf.

The crew were in Canadian waters to familiarize themselves with the intricacies of navigating through the Gulf Islands, said the cutter commander, Chief Bo'sun's mate Loren Robb.

The *Point Richmond*, almost 83 feet long, contains an impressive array of gear. Powered by two 900 horsepower engines, the craft can cruise at 20 knots and has a range of 600 miles.

With a crew of nine, the *Point Richmond* patrols the U.S. waters from the border south to Puget Sound. Her trips on patrol generally involve law enforcement as well as search and rescue.

For the law enforcement end of things, the crew are armed where the Canadian Coast Guard is not. The *Point Richmond* has two 50-calibre machine guns stowed away in the crew's quarters and each man carries a side arm.

The bridge is a bewildering array of electronic gear from three radios of 36-channel capacity to sounding devices as well as radar.

Built in Tacoma, Washington, and commissioned in 1967, the *Point Richmond* forms part of the 13th Coast Guard District but in time of war would operate as a unit in the navy.

On the bulkhead (wall) of the bridge, a touch of humour brightens the area: "Lindsay's Law: When your draft exceeds the water's depth, you are most assuredly aground."

United Church goes on air

Television, as a medium of education, possesses great scope and influence and the United Church of Canada will take to the airwaves this Sunday to show Canadians how church members tick.

Hosted by David MacDonald and his wife Sandra, the special can be seen on BCTV at 1:30 pm, September 20.

MacDonald, an ordained United Church minister, was a cabinet minister in the short-lived Clark government. His wife is a former teacher and their three daughters, aged 12, 10 and 7, also appear on the special.

The United Church has filmed ordinary members of various congregations from across Canada who explain their faith in terms of their own lives.

TAPED IN TORONTO

The special, with a price tag of \$300,000, weaves songs and music to tie the narrative passages together. The show was taped in Toronto in front of a live audience.

When in the process of deciding on the format of the program, United Church officials sent a questionnaire to church members and 6,363 replied.

Rev. Keith Woolard, secretary of the Project Advisory Group, said, "The consensus from (the) replies was to let ordinary church members do the talking."

And that is what the program is about. Ordinary Canadians expressing their faith. A Canadian native minister from Northern Manitoba tells how he keeps in

touch with his scattered flock by radio.

EACH TELLS HIS STORY

A young man in Alberta, confined to a wheelchair; a family from rural Saskatchewan; a physics teacher from the rugged coast of Newfoundland; each tells his story as part of the special. In all, 10 stories from various regions of Canada are woven together to form the bulk of the program.

The title, *These Things We Share*, explains the commitment, searching, understanding and sharing of the participants and others of the United Church as they pursue their daily lives.

In a poignant episode, Maggie Vancise of Stayner, Ontario, at 99 years of age, explained her own views on what the church and her faith meant in her life.

"It's just the main thing in life," she said. "It guides your life. It grows in you as you go along."

Maggie Vancise died shortly

after the interview was filmed.

Also included are interviews with youth delegates to the 1980 United Church General Council held in Halifax as well as an interview with UC Moderator Lois Wilson, the first woman to hold that post.

Honourable mention

A Salt Spring Island author was given an honourable mention for his entry in the Canadian One-Act Playwriting Competition.

For John Healey, author of the recently-published *Pepper Island*, it was his second honourable mention in two years.

Healey's plays will be published in a collection of Canadian one-act plays.

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Regional and school vote on Saturday, November 21

Regional and school board elections in the islands will be staged on November 21.

new trustee for Galiano on the Islands Trust.
