

# Wranglers win against Gorge despite being a little rusty

On Saturday the Salt Spring Wranglers kicked off the first regulation game of the season with a 5 to 1 victory over the Gorge Canadians at Hyacinth Park in Victoria.

The team is made up of most of the boys who were on last year's roster, which saw the Wranglers bring home the District Cup for their division. This year the boys are playing in Division 5C. Only two boys dropped from the team, Jason Creed and John Thomas.

While the Wranglers were a little rusty they fell into form pretty fast and took command early in the game with keen ball control. The Wranglers out-hustled and just plain overpowered the opposition in both halves controlling the direction of play and the ball during the better portion of the game.

### OPENED SCORING

Forward Rayan Stewart was the first Wrangler to open up the scoring with a goal at the 11-minute mark of the first half. Our new player from Vancouver, Tim Owen Evens, who was playing left wing, was next in line to belt in a goal at the 24-minute mark. Just near the end of the first half Michael Brown made it three-zip with a powerful shot that got through in spite of the goalkeeper's apparent save.

During the second half the Wranglers appeared to be off to a slow start, possibly due to their lead. An early goal by the Gorge team, however, woke them up and the Wranglers took command once again and maintained it throughout the remainder of the game.

Tim Owen Evens struck again at the nine-minute mark of the second half after making a picture-perfect play on a pass from Rayan Stewart. It was Rayan again late in the half who struck the final blow in the match.

### LOPSIDED GAME

While it was a bit of a lopsided game, credit must be given to all the members on the team who played exceptionally well. This year the Wranglers will be utilizing four forwards, three halfbacks, with the centre half being a roving Striker when on the attack. On the fullback line we will play left and right wing positions with a centre fullback acting as a sweeper to adjust accordingly either on the attack, or when on defence.

This year's team consists of the following boys, and their usual positions.

Sharing the forward positions are Tim Owen Evens, Rayan Stewart, Michael Brown, Chad Davis, Jason Minvielle, Robert Calkins and David McWhirter. Halfback duties will be filled by

Renard Graham at centre and halfback/winger positions will be filled by Troy Logan, Mason Seown and Jason Bush.

Fullback positions will be filled by Allie and Robbie Sheppard, Anthony Archer and Paul Reynolds. Goal-tending duties will be shared by Robert Calkins and Sean Albhouse.

### NEW FACES IN GOAL

Robert and Sean were our regular goalkeepers last season. However, this year we will be introducing some new faces in goal. Among them will be our new member, Tim, and Michael Brown. While Sean Albhouse has been an excellent goalkeeper, it was discovered just this summer that Sean was also an excellent distance runner when he finished just behind the big boys in the Terry Fox run. With that and his agility with the ball Sean will be seeing more action on the field as a halfback.

This coming Saturday's Wrangler game will be against Lake Hill Victoria Book, on home turf at Portlock Park. Game time is 1 pm.

This should be a good match. Last year this team was known as the Panthers, and in both previous meetings with this team we fought them to 1-1 ties. Come to see this one — the Wranglers will be out to break the tie.

# Hockey strategy league being formed on island

A national hockey strategy league is being formed on Salt Spring Island.

Since its inception five years ago in Calgary, Alta., many such organizations have sprung up across the country. A strategy league consists of a group of hockey fans within a community, from which are formed up to 16 franchises.

Spokesman for the local group, Bob Wanless, explained how the system works.

A franchise consists of two or more people who put up their \$200 franchise fee for the hockey season. At the draft meeting, players in the National Hockey League are drafted by the respective franchises by dealing each franchise a playing card.

The franchise dealt an ace, for example, would have the first pick and would probably draft Wayne Gretzky as their first choice. The franchise drawing the "two" would

have second choice, and so on.

At the conclusion of each meeting each franchise will have a team of 15 forwards and or defencemen plus one goaltender of any team that plays in the NHL. The only difference between a forward and a defenceman is that a forward receives one point for a goal while a defenceman receives two points.

At the end of the season a presentation party is held where cash prizes for the top teams are awarded.

The organization is a non-profit one and all fees are distributed as prizes or used to meet expenses.

To date, said Wanless, Salt Spring has 13 committed franchises and could expand to a maximum of 16.

A draft meeting of the island league will be held at the Rod and Gun Club on Sunday at 7:30 pm.

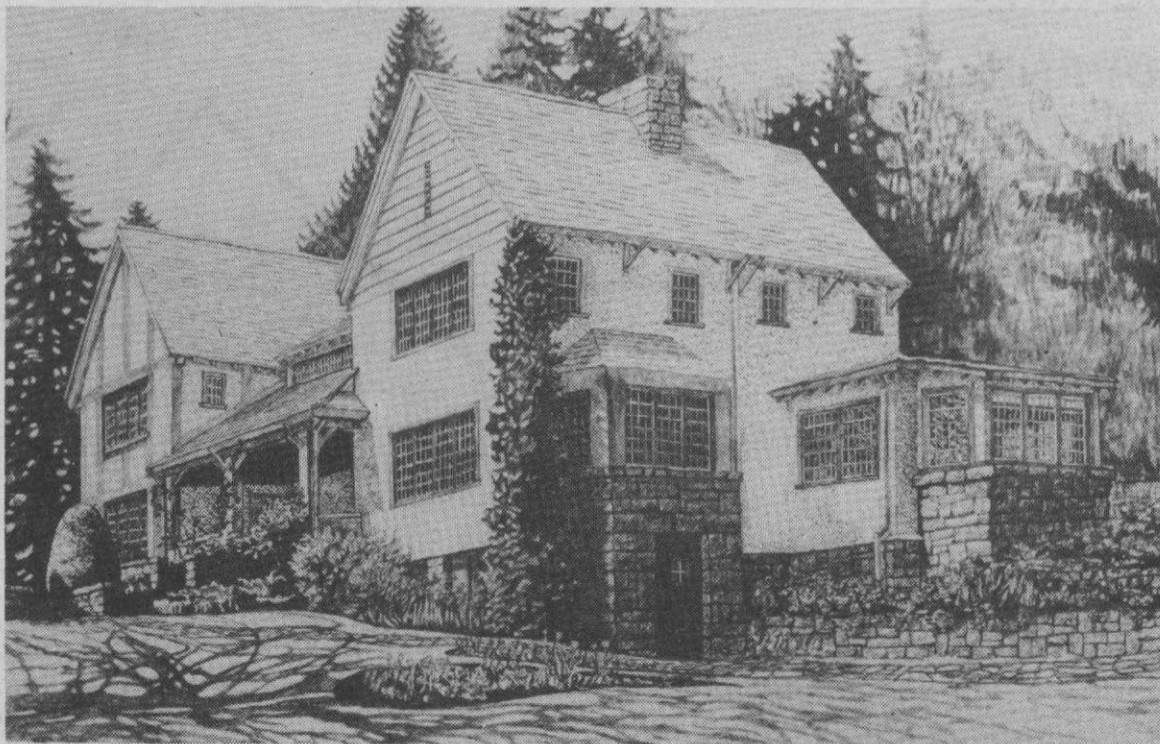
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# 'And the golfing was lovely'

The ball went into the Salt Spring net four times in the course of the game, but one of the goals was judged offside. Every one of the Duncan goals came from the same source — a striker who was skilled, powerful and probably the fastest man on the field.

The majority of the game was actually played in Duncan's end of the field. Salt Spring pressed the Duncan defense hard throughout the game. But the speed and ability of the Duncan striker were devastating on a breakaway.

The Salt Spring goals came from Andrew Hoeller (2) and Paul Cottrell (2). A newcomer to the team, Mark Wenzel, provided several himself once or twice.

#### VETERAN WINGER

The forward line was completed by veteran winger Mike Blomley who played a steady game despite not feeling 100% fit. Andrew and Paul were constantly threatening the Duncan goal and played extremely effectively together.

On Sunday Peter Coates played at centre half, Graham Lee at right

half and Jack Andrews (no longer in goal) shared the left half position with Jonathan Jenkins.

The line proved to be very effective and controlled the midfield well, except when they allowed themselves to be too far into the Duncan half and left an open area in the midfield to allow the Duncan team to make a breakaway.

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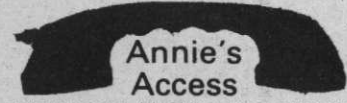

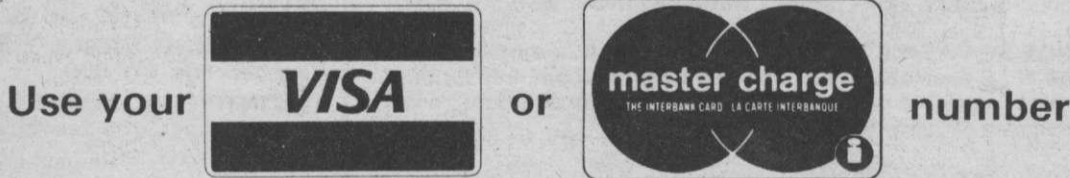

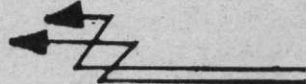

Bill Windsor's repair shop at Lakeview Crescent in Ganges will be restricted to the original one lot. Last Tuesday afternoon the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee rejected an application for rezoning from residential to industrial the adjacent two lots.

The property on which the business is located is residentially zoned. Automotive repair is a legally non-conforming use, the committee was told, because the business was located there before zoning was introduced.

Windsor has asked for rezoning of the original lot on several occasions on the grounds that it was a business operating before zoning came into effect on the island and therefore should have been properly zoned when the original plan was prepared. His earlier applications were unsuccessful.

The advisory planning commission had already rejected the proposal and recommended that it be denied. Regional director Yvette Valcourt spoke in support of the application and was the only dissident when it was turned down.

The committee decided that it would be unacceptable to mix residential and industrial uses. Adjacent property is zoned for residential use and is either occupied by homes or stands vacant, it was reported.

# Plant turns sludge into fertilizer

The Capital Regional District is missing a bet when it disposes of sewage sludge, was the message brought to a recent meeting of the Salt Spring Sewer Alternatives Committee.

Derrick Mallard, of the Committee for a Safe Environment (CASE) in Victoria, talked with the meeting of about 17 people. He explained a concept, in use in England and various European countries, which turns garbage mulch and sewer sludge into fertilizer.

A plant combines a mechanical garbage sorter and sewage treatment facilities to allow for the recycling of almost all of the material.

The plant, represented by a model which Mallard had constructed, was able to cope with the garbage and sewage of approximately 250,000 people — which is roughly the population of the CRD.

Mallard said he has seen such plants small and feasible enough to serve about 8,000 people.

While sale of the product of the

plants does not cover the cost of operation, he said, the money required from taxes would be put to better use than is now the case.

The sewage enters the plant, strained through a screen to take out the large effluent, allowed to sit in several settling tanks before the sludge is extracted for mixture with the garbage for fertilizer.

The liquid effluent of the plant upon which the model was patterned is pumped into an English river, said Mallard. He added that the liquid could also be used for irrigation.

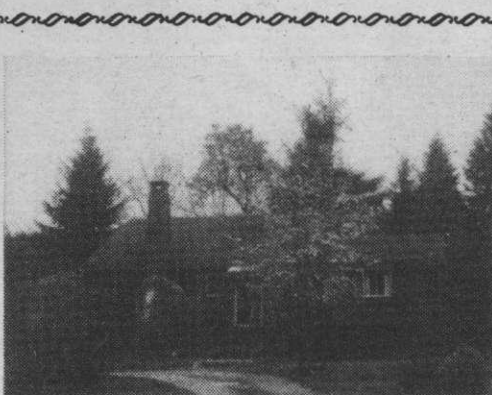

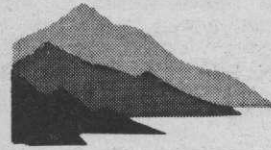
## Annual harvest service

# Down Through the Years with Driftwood

### FIVE YEARS AGO

Unfortunately, the file copy for this week of five years ago is missing. *Driftwood* would appreciate hearing from any reader with a copy of either the September 8, 15 or 22 of 1976 who wishes to donate same to the cause of keeping the files complete.

### TEN YEARS AGO

A school building project with a \$1 million price tag was revealed at a chamber of commerce meeting. The voters of the Gulf Islands would be asked in referendum to approve the scheme to expand the secondary school and add an activity room to the Salt Spring Elementary School. The expansion of the high school would mean the addition of an industrial education and home economics wing as well as a library for the use of both schools. The elementary activity room was needed because of the high numbers of students using the secondary school gym.

**Centennial Note:** There has never been a streetcar service on Mayne Island.

The Gulf Islands School District officials were looking for a suitable person to supervise a dormitory at Ganges. Such a person would begin duties in January of 1977, otherwise the dormitory would remain closed.

### FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Parents were asked to bear with the problems of the school at a parent-teacher meeting on Salt Spring Island. The meeting was told that class sizes would soon be cut to 30 pupils per class or less.

Police investigated a series of complaints about hunters seeking game on private property. Hunters were reminded that trespassing on properly posted private property was in infraction of the Wildlife Act.

The Centennial Commission was seeking Canadians who were born in 1867 or earlier. The centenarians were to be honoured as part of the celebrations of Canada's 100th birthday. Statistics Canada said 684 citizens of Canada were at least 100 years old as of 1966.

August recorded a high temperature of 92 degrees and a low of 50. Precipitation averaged .26 inches for the month. The previous year the high was 92 and the low 44, with .236 inches of wet.

Members of the Salt Spring Island Rod and Gun Club were

urged to affiliate their organization with the B.C. Wildlife Federation. President of the federation, Jim Murray, told a meeting of the local gun club that wildlife in B.C. was endangered by lack of intelligent planning and conservation measures.

The first load of top soil was delivered to the site of Centennial Park and the area was being prepared to accommodate the cenotaph.

The Royal Canadian Legion Branch 92 were to hold a bingo with a turkey as prize for each game in order to raise money to defray the cost of moving the cenotaph to Centennial Park.

### TWENTY YEARS AGO

A forest fire raged up the side of Mount Tuam destroying more than 800 acres of prime timber. The blaze, apparently started by careless hunters, began at Cape Keppel and attacked the trees on the side of the mountain. A favourable wind aided efforts of firefighters and the destruction was confined. The fire brought back memories of 30 years previously when a forest fire consumed almost all of the woods on Tuam and threatened the settlement at Fulford.

The Wagon Wheels Square Dance Club decided to hold the first meeting of the winter season at Central Hall on Salt Spring Island. Beginners and experienced dancers were invited to participate and were reminded that the regular dances would be held at Mahon Hall on the first and third Saturday of each month.

The Lady Minto Hospital Auxiliary held a bargain sale at Mahon Hall and raised more than \$1,400 for use at the hospital.

The Salt Spring Parent-Teacher Association meeting attracted 100 people to hear plans for the school year from school board chairman George Heinekey.

## Health Care Society meets at Pender

The Pender Islands Health Care Society, which operates the Bishop Coleman Health Care Clinic, held the first meeting after the summer holidays on September 10 in the school-community centre.

President Gordon Wallace was in the chair and 20 members were present.

A motion was passed that associate members who represent island organizations will be notified that if they miss more than three consecutive meetings, the association will be asked to assign a replacement. Latterly the attendance at the meetings has been poor.

In response to a request by the ambulance attendants, the meeting decided to put in a ramp for easier access.

Dr. Don Sutherland is to be assisted by Dr. Ellen Anderson, who will share the practice with him from now on. He introduced Dr. Anderson to the meeting. Dr. Sutherland suggested that the society look into obtaining transportation for disabled and

sick persons.

He advised the meeting that the clinic had obtained the means now for culture testing and blood sugar measurements. He said he had made arrangements for a Saanich Hospital technician to come to the Pender clinic once a month.

Vern Roddick suggested that a special standing committee be struck to handle and act on exceptional situations. Roddick stated that a transportation roster should be made up and kept up to date. Stan Carey is to be the chairman of this committee.

Roddick reported that the septic field had been repaired and work on making the offices more soundproof was progressing.

Jim Peters offered to organize a party to clean up the grounds.

**Research report released**

# Price tag of \$1.3 million to use play field for sewage disposal

The infamous report on alternative solutions to the sewage disposal problem at the Ganges school complex is now available to the public.

The situation at the complex is such that raw sewage is currently being allowed to enter Ganges Harbour. The B.C. Research Group was called in to seek alternatives to that means of sewage disposal.

The writers of the report note: "During school sessions a significant aesthetic and odiferous contamination of the beach occurs

at low tide. A public health problem may exist."

The firm examined the existing facilities and grounds of the school complex and presented several alternatives: the proposed community sewer; ground disposal under the elementary school sports field without further treatment; ground disposal under the sports field with additional aeration treatment; and disposal into a controlled environment sports field.

**THREE TANKS**

The sewage comes from the high school, vocational building, elementary school, Mahon Hall and the school board office. The system uses gravity feed and effluent is contained in three septic tanks.

The complex could generate a maximum of 13,325 gallons of sewage per day although the average is approximately 3,000 gallons per day.

The report indicated the community sewer would provide complete sewage treatment, disinfection and discharge into the harbour. Doubts about the completion date of the sewer were expressed.

The report examined the three remaining alternatives but noted: "Where possible these facilities should be considered to be of a temporary nature such that capital expenditure (and possible loss) is minimized and the community plan be rapidly implemented."

When the grounds of the complex were examined, several locations for ground disposal were looked at.

**NOT SUITABLE**

An area behind the high school adjacent to Park Drive was not suitable because of the bedrock being too close to the surface.

A wooded area behind the play field on the far side of Kanaka Road proved to be equally unsuitable because of the possible contamination to private property on the west and north sides. A second factor against the use of the wooded area was the relative size being not large enough.

The Kanaka play field itself was not suitable because it is a major play area and the researchers felt it "undesirable to lose the facility even for a short term."

The play field between the elementary school and Rainbow Road met the requirement of size, but the report noted the field is of a clay composition which requires a drainage system to keep it dry

enough for the children to play.

**WOULD USE ENTIRE FIELD**  
Use of the field for a sewage disposal facility would prove feasible if it were built up from three to four feet. Regardless of the method of ground disposal, the entire field would have to be used.

The costs of fill would be approximately \$35,000 but the composition of the field was such that no guarantees could be offered as to effectiveness.

With drain pipe spaced six feet apart, the field would not be able to handle the maximum amount of septic effluent which could be generated by the complex.

The field would be able to handle 9,300 gallons of septic effluent or 26,700 gallons of aerobic treated effluent.

The aerobic treatment would be accomplished by use of aerated lagoons, an oxidation ditch, biofilters, rotating discs, a physical chemical treatment facility as well as contact stabilization.

"Final assessment of acceptability must include costs which are unavailable at this time," the report noted about the aerobic treatment.

The use of the play field for sewage disposal as well as an all-weather sports field, based on the costs of similar projects elsewhere, would entail expenditures of at least \$1.3 million.

The school board decided because of the costs involved, in temporary solutions to wait until the community sewer was built to solve the problems of disposal from the complex.

## Document available

Copies of the school board document from the B.C. Research group are available to the public, but at 50 cents per page.

The Gulf Islands School Board admitted it had erred in withholding the document. At the same meeting, the board decided to place a price of 50 cents per copied page on all requests for material.

Board chairman Strick Aust said in a statement, "As the B.C. Research document had been tabled at the public meeting of August 21, 1980, and as trustees were made aware that copies were available to them on request, I must declare that the document has been dealt with by the full board and therefore is a public document."

**WRONG INFORMATION**

Aust indicated that the board had received the wrong information from staff on the matter and that the original decision to withhold the document was correctly taken, given that members of the board assumed that the document had been dealt with only in committee.

The building and grounds committee of the board had dealt with the study but had decided not

to go further with the recommendations because of the costs involved.

The board at that time had the oral reassurance of the waste management branch that action on the sewage problem at the Ganges school complex could await the construction of the community sewer.

The board later agreed to a request from the secretary-treasurer, Wilf Peck, to decide upon publication of material from the board office.

**GIVEN FREE**

Up to now, documents and such from the board have been given free, even though copies were made on the copy machine at the board office.

"It costs this board money and takes up staff time," said Peck in reference to the requests for material.

"And I caution you if you charge, it's a nuisance unless you charge a reasonable price."

Several board members questioned whether the cost would be per page or per document.

"It'll cost 50 cents every time the machine goes kerplunk," said Aust.
