Salmon closures announced

Sports fishermen, especially the professional ones found in the Gulf Islands, have been notified that certain areas around Vancouver Island have been closed to salmon fishing.

Finlayson Arm, south of the power line at Sawluctus Islands and all tidal and non-tidal waters of that part of the Saanich Inlet have been closed to chinook and coho fishing until November 15, 1981.

Victoria Harbour inside a line from the Ogden Light to McLoughlin Point, through the Inner and Upper harbours, Selkirk

Water, the Gorge and Portage Inlet, are waters with proscribed fishing until October 31, 1981.

Sportsmen there are limited to one single hook and may not "angle for, take, or kill, or have in his or her possession" any coho salmon.

The Victoria Harbour restriction is aimed at protecting the migrating fish on their way to the Colquitz and Craigflower Creeks.

The Finlayson Arm closure protects the salmon migrating to the Goldstream River.

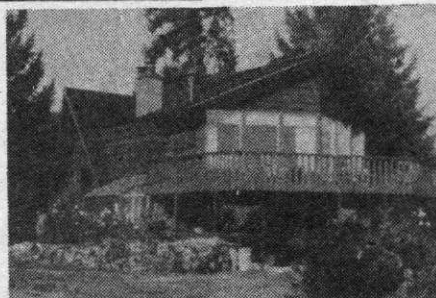

Some trees that will please everyone

Now then, I think everyone should have a catalpa or two, or three for that matter. Catalpas are beautiful, lovely to behold, and a lot of fun, especially for children or grandchildren.

A catalpa is not some kind of goat, as some of you might suspect. No, it is a tree.

It is a deciduous tree, and like all leaf-losing trees, will give you shade in summer and light in winter. It is truly hardy and will grow anywhere, from Manitoba to Mexico. It will grow in almost any kind of soil and is not the least bit fussy in that regard.

On top of that, this is what *The Western Garden Book* has to say about it: "One of the truly hardy trees that can compete in flower and leaf with the subtropicals of Southern California."

Flower clusters are large, from 12 to 18 inches, like a bunch of upside-down grapes, or similar to the "candles" of the chestnut tree. These consist of clusters of two-inch blossoms, which are pure white, striped lightly with yellow and soft brown.

HEART-SHAPED LEAVES

These are carried prominently above the leaves in late spring and early summer. The leaves are large, larger than a big man's hands, and are beautifully heart-shaped. In fall, the catalpa produces foot-long

or better bean-shaped seed pods, which dry beautifully, may be used as rattles, and are an unending source of delight for children.

Even I, in my 40th year, could not resist the charm of these seed pods and took some home to play with. They are also known as Indian stogies or Indian beans.

The catalpa is also a rather handsomely shaped tree. It is broadly umbrella shaped and reaches heights of between 40 and 70 feet with almost equal spread.

IDEAL SHADE TREE

So it makes an ideal shade tree and looks lovely either as a single specimen tree, or a lovely summer-shady grove, or else a beautiful shady lane.

For a shady grove, plant three trees in a triangle with 30 or 40 feet to a side, and for a shady lane plant 30 to 40 feet apart in a row. Another item in its favour is that its roots are not aggressive. They will not crack pavement, sidewalks

or heave up patios.

It is one of the few ideal trees which are beautiful, well behaved, undemanding and hardy. What more could one ask for.

So if you have a bit of land, treat yourself to a catalpa, or two, or three. And even if you don't have a bit of land, treat someone you love to a catalpa, especially, if they have small children.

Just don't plant one where it is exposed to constant strong winds, as its large leaves are subject to wind damage in exposed situations. Even then, the lee of a house or a few windward trees will give sufficient protection for the catalpa to show off its beauty.

A FAVOURITE

Another one of my very favourite deciduous trees is prunus subhirtella autumnalis. This is a flowering cherry with the charming habit of blooming in mild spells in fall, intermittently in December, January and February, and finally, in its full glory in March or April.

There is nothing more cheering than a blooming tree in the middle of winter. Last winter one of these made front-page news, complete with picture, in the *Victoria Colonist*, I believe, in January.

The off-season bloom is not as thick as its full spring blossoming,

however, it is quite noticeable. We planted our first by our front door, where we pass often, and it has delighted all of us, young as it is.

Blossoms are double, white or light pink. Leaves are a pleasing reddish green and stay on the tree for a long time. Its shape is bushy with a round, flattened crown and it grows to be about 25 to 30 feet tall.

Its roots are not aggressive and it makes a lovely patio tree. It is hardy and ours survived last summer, its first in its new home, without watering.

PLANNING MORE

We planted it last fall, a year ago, and since it did so well and pleased all of us so much, we are planning on three or four more to line the walk from our gate to the house.

Another one which delights us and our little one, especially at Easter time, is the pussywillow. Many-stemmed and broadly spreading, it makes a lovely vase or fan-shaped shrubby tree with that special willow-slender effect.

Its main attractions of course are the furry silver-grey catkins without which Easter seems incomplete. Children of all ages love those little furry "pussies" and branches cut in late winter will produce them easily indoors, for a lovely arrangement.

The pussywillow will grow in almost any soil, leaf out early and keep its leaves almost till Christmas. The shrub will reach a height of 25 feet but can be kept to any size by pruning. A rapid grower, it can be cut or pruned severely and will respond to this with many vigorous new shoots.

It tolerates poorly drained soil well and its only requirement is a fair bit of water. Goats love pussywillows as much as children, albeit for eating.

Altogether, a nice bunch of trees, with something to please all of us, including children, adults and goats.

'Flu vaccine available

The 'flu season is here again and the community health department of the Capital Regional District is advising that 'flu vaccine is now available.

The vaccine is provided free to eligible persons through physicians or at the community health service offices.

Eligible persons are those over 65 years of age or persons of any age with conditions such as the following:

- Acquired or congenital heart disease associated with pulmonary congestion;
- Chronic pulmonary disease associated with compromised

respiratory function;

- Chronic renal disease with azotemia;
- Chronic metabolic diseases such as diabetes mellitus, immunodeficient or immunosuppressed conditions;
- Chronic severe anaemia.

Vaccine can be purchased at drug stores for those ineligible for the free vaccine.

'Flu vaccine, to be effective, should be administered as soon as possible, as it takes a week or two to build up immunity. Most adults require one shot only, young adults and children may require two shots a month apart.

Boat owner fined \$150 after his engine fails to start

The ferries coming and going from Sturdies Bay on Galiano Island have but a narrow channel in which to operate, with the consequence that the large boats have to nose in and back out.

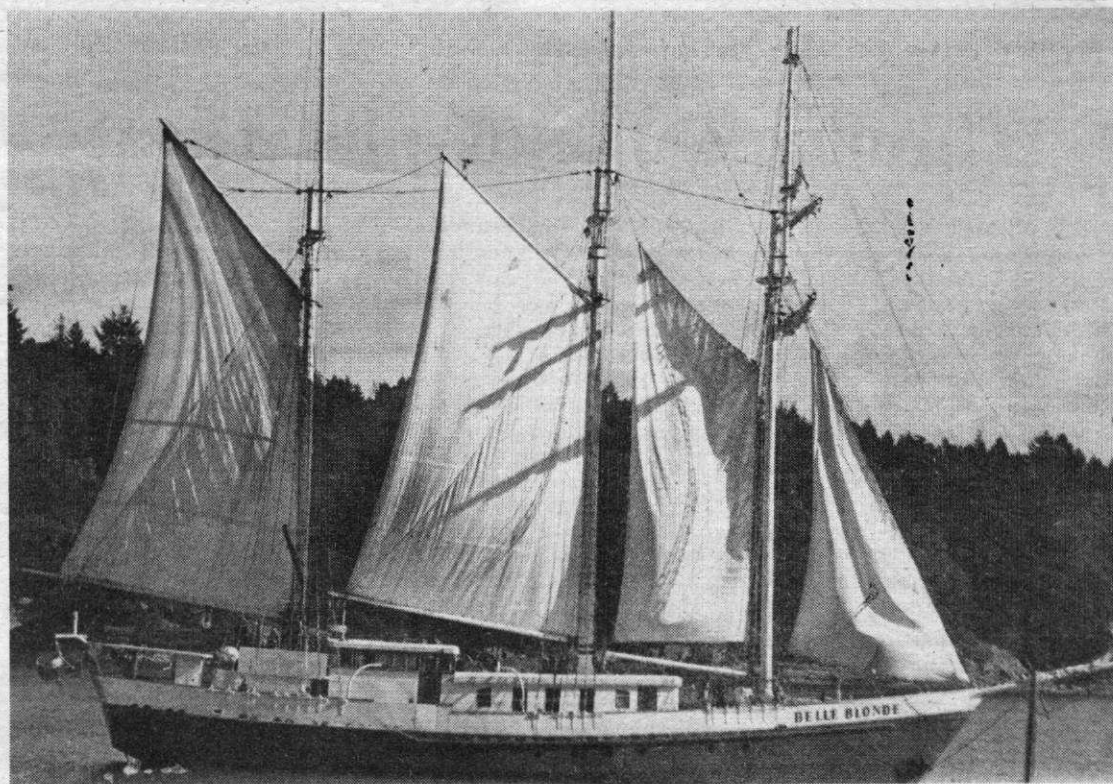

Breeding and showing well worth time, effort

Dedicated to Nortspews Slimy, the Thomas Edison of slug husbandry.

For those of a sporting bend, breeding and showing slugs is an expensive, frustrating, time-consuming hobby, yet well worth the money and effort.

Breeding slugs is still a somewhat inexact science which involves taking top-line, thoroughbred animals and cross-breeding for the purpose of developing outstanding individual characteristics.

For example, the world-famous racing slug Genuine Slime's dam was the equally renowned Slimy and Slick, well known for her tenacious viscosity; while his sire, Grey Gus, a quarter-slug, was legendary for his tremendous speed and stamina. The result — a powerful slug that could go anywhere, anytime.

Two points support position on mining

Sir,

I have read the report by Acres Consulting Services Ltd. dated April, 1981, for 20th Century Energy Corp. titled *Gambier Mine - A Preliminary Project Assessment*. This was the "leaked report" referred to by Moira Farrow "Dams needed for Gambier" (The *Vancouver Sun*, July 15, 1981).

From our standpoint, two particularly significant points are made in this report which clearly support the position we have taken for almost three years now: firstly, "Recreation is the most significant land-use occurring on the island."

"The value of Gambier Island as a recreational resource is based on two key factors, it is strategically located for use by Lower Mainland residents whose needs for recreational space are increasing; and, the island has not been developed to any great degree and provides boaters and campers with the perception of a wilderness type of environment relative to certain other locations in Howe Sound."

Also, "Viewing opportunities are an important aspect of recreation in Howe Sound."

However, the report goes on to say that "Mine development would result in a substantial curtailment of those hiking and camping activities concentrated in the vicinity of Gambier Lake." "Lost Lake would cease to exist." "Some trails and trail destinations will be lost to mine tailings."

A U.R.E.P. (Use and Recreation for the Enjoyment of the Public) reserve, established in 1949, is located within the proposed tailings impoundment area. "The potential visual impact of the mine from a hiker's perspective is substantial." "The extent of physical alteration of the landscape is high, and the pit will be visible after the reclamation period. Revegetation will not mitigate the major visual change to the landscape form."

Secondly, the report recognizes the conflict between the Islands Trust and mining. "Development of an open-pit mine would also

conflict with the Gambier Island Zoning Bylaw of 1979 in that it proposes an industrial land-use for rurally designated lands. The resolution of this issue is a legal and jurisdictional matter..."

The support from the public to keep the crown land on Gambier for recreational use is very widespread and growing. To date, eight Lower Mainland municipalities have given their official support, along with various wildlife, outdoor, environmental, community and ratepayers organizations, and several thousand members of the Gambier Island Preservation Society.

How much more information and public support does the government need to make a decision on Gambier?

Many reasons for giving thanks

Sir,

Your readers may be interested in the following article from the Christian Science Publishing Society:

There are times when it seems hard to be grateful, when it's hard to find reasons to give thanks.

Yet many of us innately feel there is a benefit to counting our blessings. It helps us overcome feeling depressed. It's a defense against self-pity.

At times like this, you've probably heard such statements as, "I'm grateful things aren't as bad as they could be." Or, "I'm grateful I'm not that woman. She really has it rough." Or, "I'm grateful the ordeal was no worse than it was."

With such comments, people try their best to find something to be grateful for. Or they may genuinely feel "lucky" that they're better off than they expected to be or than others are.

That's negative gratitude — being thankful for what isn't, instead of for what is. It's also "in-spite-of" gratitude — feeling a situation is pretty bad but being grateful in spite of it.

It's better than wallowing in self-pity. But don't we yearn for a more uplifting feeling of gratitude? One that fosters genuine joy, not just relief? One that is stable because it is based on what is eternally good and true?

Psalms 100, in speaking of God, encourages us, "Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise; be thankful unto him, and bless his name." And it gives the following reason: "For the Lord is good; his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth to all generations."

Is that good advice? For everyone? Even for someone whose circumstances don't seem to warrant such thanksgiving?

Yes. Especially for someone needing encouragement and healing. Such advice does not ignore untoward circumstances; it leads one out of them.

God is unchanging good. Throughout the ages — as recorded in both the Old and New Testaments of the Bible, for example — inspired individuals have experienced the good that comes from God. They have felt God's guidance, known His protection, experienced His care. And increasingly, we are learning that God, good — because of His ever-presence — is the only governing force in our lives.

This is something to be grateful for — something that is. But there's more.

Our very being is the result of God's good. That is, each one of us — as created by an all-loving God — is free from subjection to discomfort, limitation, unhappiness. We are created to have dominion over anything that is unlike God, unlike good.

We can rise above mortal concepts of ourselves because God knows us as spiritual. We can follow the instruction of Mary Baker Eddy, who discovered and founded Christian Science and

who, like the biblical prophets, overcame enormous challenges through turning to God: "Let us rejoice that we are subject to the divine 'powers that be.'"

Hers is the voice of experience when she writes: "Love is impartial and universal in its adaptation and bestowals. It is the open fount which cries, 'Ho, every one that thirsteth, come ye to the waters.'"

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Down Through the Years with Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

Plans for the intermediate and personal care lodge near Lady Minto Hospital continued with the completion of the topographic survey of the property. The structure, financed by CMHC, would be built on land made available by the Capital Regional District. Furnishings for the lodge were to be obtained through volunteer effort and although it had not been named at that time, it is known today as Greenwoods.

A Gulf Islander became upset when, not being able to produce an ID card, he was asked to pay full fare to return from Crofton. Police investigated the incident particularly in light of the claim that the fare collector was the target of clenched fists.

Canadians were disturbed at the Anti-Inflation Board and many unions planned a one-day, nationwide work stoppage in protest. The work stoppage did not meet approval by Gulf Islands teachers but no one was sure of the actions of ferry workers.

Driftwood publisher Frank Richards was named president of the British Columbia and Yukon Community Newspapers Association at that group's annual meeting held in Richmond. Richards had taken over Driftwood in 1966 from Jim Ward. The community press was the last outpost of independent journalism in Canada, Richards said in his acceptance speech. He also urged a close concern for journalism and reporting standards.

The Galiano Club, at a special general meeting, approved an executive recommendation to spend \$5,000 for a new roof on the Galiano Island community hall. The roof was a priority item and excess money would be used to pay for other renovations to the building.

Clearing operations began at the site of a new shopping centre on Lower Ganges Road. Project developer Phil Valcourt, owner and operator of the nearby Valcourt Business Centre, said the new development would be two years in constructing.

The Centennial Series of Canada Savings Bonds were advertised for sale. If held until maturity on November 1, 1979, the bonds would pay 5.48% interest per year which worked out to a total of \$72.25 in interest for each \$100 bond. If the interest remained uncollected until the maturity date, an extra \$27.75 would be added to a total \$100 interest for every \$100 bond.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

The crew of the Delta Princess faced a cold, damp Thanksgiving plying the ferry from the Fulford dock. At noon, the crew were greeted at Fulford by Eric and Mrs. Faure as well as Bessie Dane and treated to a turkey dinner with the trimmings.

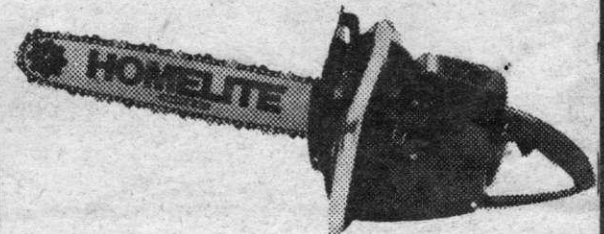
