Sunday sees the first performance of a most unusual production, not only for the Gulf Islands but for all of Canada. Students of English literature recognize the name W.B. Yeats as a poet, but it is not generally known that the Irishman spent 20 years of his life writing and directing plays for the famous Abbey Theatre in Dublin.

During this considerable period of time he studied different techniques and styles of playwriting and wrote at least 20 plays. The one to be presented at Galiano and later at UBC is one of a cycle of five which have engaged the interest of Heather Martin during her in-depth graduate research on Yeats over many years.

Many islanders have given their help to Heather to stage this production. Montague Harbour's noted nonagenarian, Stanley Jackson, has allowed rehearsals to take place in his spacious dining room. Ted Prior volunteered to build the stage sets. Ronaldo Norden designed and printed what we think may become collector-item programs with Runic lettering reminiscent of the Book of Kels.

Brad Prevedoros contributed valuable ideas on the choice of background music. Keith Holmes designed and made the masks which all the actors wear. Christa Weiss created and sewed the costumes, and together with Heather designed and stitched the stage curtains applied with their own original logo.

Hiring of aides is questioned

Despite the explanation that teacher aides fill a versatile role in classroom needs, John Zacharias, Pender Island trustee and Jim Ripley, Galiano trustee, question why so many are hired.

Aides help teachers prepare lessons and perform some of the menial work involved in teaching but do not have charge of a class. The Gulf Islands School District employs several aides to help various classes.

"We're five and diming this situation," said Ripley of a staff request to hire more aides.

"Why don't we know at budget time how many teachers and aides we need?" he asked.

Zacharias questions why the district hires so many aides when another teacher may do the job. His concern went beyond the hiring of aides when he asked about part-time teachers as well.

Bob Huestis, superintendent for the district, explained that

flexibility can be maintained with the hiring of six aides who could do more tasks than an additional teacher.

Aides are a recognized need in education and are in use on a province-wide basis, said Huestis. He also pointed out that the Gulf

Islands education system utilizes a number of non-paid and non-professional persons in the class.

Volunteer workers help with large classes or are used in classes where a need is perceived. They provide a much needed service, said Huestis.

Pot hole blamed for accident

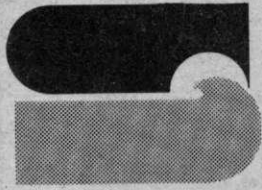

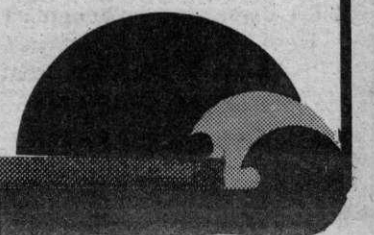

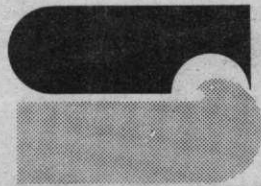

Taimi Hindmarch

She's retiring after 20 years of teaching at Saturna School

The lady drives the roads of Saturna and the people she passes wave a friendly greeting.

Not an unusual sight in the Gulf Islands but in this case the affection runs deep: Taimi Hindmarch probably taught the waver.

Hindmarch is retiring at the end of this school year after teaching at the Saturna school for 20 years. She and husband Bob came to Saturna in 1962 from Ladysmith.

"We were hesitant about becoming islanders," she said. "If you have a dream and it doesn't work out..."

Her teaching career has spanned the time since the middle 30's and has been centred on Vancouver Island. Such places as Christina Lake, Ladysmith and Saturna have been classrooms for her with time off to raise a family.

NOT MUCH OF A SHOCK

The change from a task of teaching special education to 13 children at Ladysmith to the 16 pupils at Saturna in 1962 was not too much of a teaching shock.

When she arrived, Glenn Woodley, current Fernwood principal, was the head man there. She taught all grades from one to seven until Michael Hayes arrived in 1973.

At Ladysmith, Hindmarch had taught a class of 40 or more students. She sees a change in education with learning assistants and teacher's aides working classes today.

"The teacher today can do a more professional job," she said, "because she's not hurried."

The friendly greetings from

passers-by proves another point she has to make about her teaching. The teacher must establish a rapport with children to be successful. Hard work is required to reach children, she said.

NOT ALWAYS EASY

"It's not always easy," she said, "creating that rapport with children."

She has enjoyed the work at Saturna, teaching multi-grade classes. The advantage for the teacher in such situations lies in being able to really know and understand the children.

"Happy children will learn," is another of Hindmarch's wisdoms.

The Hindmarch home sits on a bluff with a spectacular view of the Gulf Islands but such was not always the case. When they came to Saturna, there was no hydro on the island and each house needed its own power plant.

Changes to island life and teaching methods have been met with charm and good humour by this descendant of Finland. Taimi

means seedling in Finnish and the sprout has grown to be a pillar of the Saturna community.

SHOULD ENJOY IT

I think if you do something well, you should enjoy it," she said. "I enjoy the human contact."

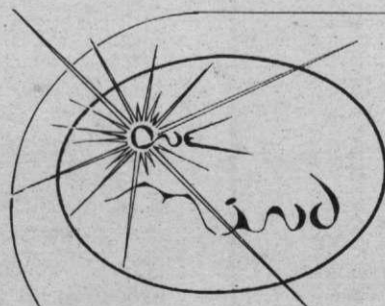
But teaching isn't the hardest task she has tackled. Raising three daughters ranks as the toughest.

"The mother of pre-schoolers has the hardest but most important job," she said.

All the years and all the pupils become, truly, part of the past for Hindmarch next June. When she began to teach on Saturna in 1962, the classroom staff of the Gulf Islands schools numbered 19 teachers.

"I've seen it grow," she said.

BYLAWS DISCUSSED

It is important to not get bogged down in the minutiae and to keep in mind the large effects that zoning has on the housing and life styles of the people who make up the community.



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

Don't drop rail link—Manly

The CNR wants to drop rail service between Youbou and the Cowichan Valley but Jim Manly says no.

Manly, MP for Cowichan, Malahat and the Islands, brought his opposition to CN's plans to a meeting of the Canadian Transport Commission in Duncan this week.

The rail giant has dropped spur lines in other parts of the country claiming they are uneconomical. The Youbou link is needed, Manly said, to ensure the financial health of the region.

A study of the softwood industry ordered by the federal cabinet has concluded that the business will grow by 20 to 25% through to the year 2000. **NEEDS COMPETITIVE STRENGTH**

Canada would maintain a share

of that market expansion only if the forest industry had competitive strength. The situation depends upon "a stable work force, advanced technology, efficient transportation and distribution, low energy cost as well as a reputation for quality products," the report stated.

Manly pointed out that Canada's reputation for quality goods depends upon a transportation system which is able to deliver the end product to the customer in an undamaged condition.

Freight cars, he said, are the way to ensure minimal damage is inflicted upon the products. The repeated handling of the wood which occurs with a trucking operation translates to more damage.

MORE EFFICIENT

With gasoline prices expected to triple by 1986, Manly told the commission that rail transportation will become more energy efficient in comparison with trucks than is currently the case.

Various studies have shown that rail transport uses much less fuel than trucks to deliver the goods.

"With dwindling supplies and the growth of petroleum demand in Canada, we must use the most energy efficient methods of transport," Manly said.

In addition to the energy saving, mills need rail service to remain competitive, he said.

Safety is also an issue, Manly reminded the meeting. Most trucks are becoming longer in length and tandems are a common sight. Alberta has recently experimented with triple-length trucks.

INCREASE IN ACCIDENTS

A United States safety study has shown that the combination of smaller automobiles and larger trucks has resulted in a rapid increase in accidents. Where the traffic of longer trucks and smaller cars increased, road fatalities increased two times.

"I urge this committee to consider the serious negative effects of abandonment as well as the positive need to maintain the rail link in order to ensure the long-term stability of Youbou and other communities in the Cowichan Valley," Manly concluded.

In answer to a question from Forrest Hume, CN representative, Manly stated that questions about CN's service to customers have been raised in other parts of Canada. Quite apart from the fact CN is not seeking new customers, current customers often experience difficulties in obtaining freight cars. Some firms have just given up and switched to trucks, he said.

If, however, you know the qualities required of the top-notch race slug, you can sometimes purchase an excellent prospect at one of the lesser known breeding farms.

KNOW YOUR STOCK

We caution you, though, that you must know your stock; this type of buying can be very risky.

After thoughtful and careful evaluation, which should have included reading about, viewing and being with the various breeds, it is now time to decide which one is right for you.

Tips for Selecting a Quality Race Slug:

- Biggest is not always best or fastest;

- The highest price does not necessarily mean the highest quality;

- The high-spirited, healthy slug has a glossy sheen, instantly recognizable;

- Look for intelligence, evidenced by bright eyes and quick curiosity;

- Speed checks you might try to include:

Hold up your favourite plant and time the slug you are considering as it dashes by.

Although denounced by some as

cruel and possibly even dangerous, many slug fanciers creep up behind the prospective animal and shout, "Quack, Quack" or "Sodium Chloride."

We do not recommend this for two reasons: there is always the outside possibility of a stampede endangering both you and the animal, and many slugs become very insecure and hard to manage when threatened in this manner.

FIVE YEARS AGO

The Gulf Islands School Board announced an \$875,000 capital building program. The major cost would be more than \$700,000 for a new school at the corner of Fernwood and North End Roads on Salt Spring Island. The school board office would be expanded at a price tag of \$16,000. The remainder of the money would be spent on various improvements to buildings as well as for the purchase of equipment.

The continuing education program on Salt Spring attracted 426 persons to various courses. Virginia Newman, program co-ordinator, expressed satisfaction that Outer Islanders were also attending classes in Ganges.

The English oak tree near the Salt Spring Elementary School was declared an official heritage tree. The giant oak had been grown from an acorn from Windsor Park, England, to commemorate the coronation of George VI.

The Capital Regional District building report for the first eight months of the year indicated the issuance of 257 building permits worth \$7,055,180 on various of the Gulf Islands.

Galiano parents seemed satisfied with a compromise solution for the problems of safety for their children going by water taxi to school on Mayne Island. The children would leave Salt Spring on Friday after school and not get home until 10 pm.

TEN YEARS AGO

The committee dealing with house numbering on Salt Spring Island decided to engage in a do-it-yourself project rather than hire experts at house numbers. Armed with a complete set of island maps and charts, courtesy of the Capital Regional District, the committee was eager to get on with the job. The numbers would aid emergency services such as fire, police and ambulance crews as well as visitors trying to find a particular house.

As contract negotiations began between Gulf Islands teachers and the school board, the union indicated that it would attempt to talk about learning conditions with the board. The teachers wanted to talk about such things as class size, aides, classroom conditions and teacher involvement in budget setting.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

The Gulf Islands School Board approved plans to purchase the dormitory building on Ganges Hill for \$35,000 and to spend a further \$65,000 to fix the place up.

The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce had decided to send a letter to B.C. Ferries condemning the service between Swartz Bay and Fulford.

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Immunization urged by health ministry

Pity the child facing school for the first time for such an individual also must be immunized against various diseases.

Health Minister Jim Nielsen urges parents of children starting school for the first time to ensure the child has received booster shots to reinforce their previous protection.

Those children who have never been immunized, or whose immunization is incomplete, said the minister, should be brought up to date as soon as possible.

"Immunizing children against communicable diseases is particularly important at the start of the school year," said Nielsen.

Free immunization against polio, diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, measles, rubella and mumps is available. New vaccines


reduce the number of shots needed for complete immunization.

The provincial health ministry has introduced a three-in-one shot for protection against measles, mumps and rubella. Another shot covers diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus while an oral vaccine is available for polio.

The school immunization program includes rubella shots for girls in grade five as well as vaccination against diphtheria, tetanus and polio for all grade nine students.

"Immunization rates in B.C. schools have been improving over the past few years," said Nielsen.

"With the co-operation of all parents, we can do even better and extend the protection of immunization to as many children as possible."



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Regional board settles expense claims issue

guide available to directors to establish what is a legitimate claim and what is outside the scope of their office within the terms of the Municipal Act.

Bob Wright saw the report as an end to the main problem.

Valcourt told her colleagues that the outstanding amount had been paid in two amounts. She had personally paid the region \$269.30, in respect of errors on her part and on the part of the region staff. Some amounts had been duplicated by the staff and paid twice.

"The \$647.07 was a grey area," she told the board. "\$356.15 was spent on typing and material to prepare a report from 4½ years of documents on the Ganges sewer at the request of my constituents. The report had to be prepared and I do not acknowledge that it was improperly claimed."

She also declined to acknowledge that telephone calls for information in the same area were not justifiable expenses.

The sum of \$604.07 was paid from a special fund by people on Salt Spring Island to enable her to seek a further term, she explained.

The money is repaid and the matter is cleared up, suggested Wright.

UNDER THE CARPET

Charging that he was sweeping things under the carpet, Valcourt declined to accept Wright's assumption. She challenged statements made by staff members and she challenged payments made

to Saturna Island's Jim Campbell.

No attack should be permitted on members of the staff, warned W.J. McElroy. They are not elected and may not reply. Any complaint against a staff member should be made in writing and pursued by the board.

The report included a suggestion that other charges should be paid improperly under the act to other directors, noted Mel Couvelier. Should these not also be investigated by the board?

That was part of his motion to refer the report to the finance committee, explained Wright. Couvelier's proposal that the paragraph suggesting other

directors may also have claimed expenses beyond the range of the Municipal Act be considered by the board was rejected. The report and all its aspects will be considered by the finance committee.

But the island director left the meeting free to seek a further term.

"Some people from Salt Spring Island have not realized that I have filed my papers," said Valcourt.

The debate ran for some two hours.

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Board hears analysis of expense claims under act

Two reports furnished to the Capital Regional Board last week cleared up the challenge to expenses claimed by director Yvette Valcourt.

The auditor's report, submitted by B. Adams of Thorne Riddell, reduced the amount under question from about \$2,400 to \$912.37.

The accompanying solicitor's report explained that the claims had been due in part to inadvertence, in part to staff error and in part to a misunderstanding of the meaning of the relevant sections of the municipal act.

Auditors Thorne Riddell reported that they had called in legal assistance in interpreting the act and that R.J. Orr, of Bull, Housser and Tupper, of Vancouver, had also submitted a report.

The lawyer stated that he had no doubt that all expenses claimed by Mrs. Valcourt were made by her in good faith.

He noted that a total of approximately \$100 in telephone calls had been claimed in error. They had been made by Valcourt but not in respect of CRD business.

Orr stated that four areas of expenses were properly claimed.

These included:

- The cost of answering calls left by anyone within the Capital Regional District who telephoned her in regard to problems they had with the CRD or its staff;

- All telephone calls to the regional district office;

- Telephone calls to the ministry of municipal affairs, health department and other provincial bodies in order to gain information allowing her to intelligently participate in discussion of committees to which she had been appointed if the information was not available from the region staff;

- Postage in respect of letters to other directors in time for meetings of the board or committees.

On the other side of the ledger he cited a number of costs which could not be properly claimed.

These included the cost of preparation of materials to support her political stance on any issue; telephone calls to anyone to gain information, advice or evidence to support her political stance or costs of legal advice to support that political stance.

"There was some evidence," noted Orr's letter, "which would indicate that other directors may, too, have claimed expenses under Section 788 'improperly'".
