

# Lester Pearson students visit Gulf Islands

The Lester Pearson College of the Pacific draws students from all over the world and last week 35 scholars from that school visited the Gulf Islands.

The students from such diverse locations as Columbia in South America and Rwanda in Africa were observers at various Gulf Islands schools as part of their work in community studies programs.

The four-day exchange of students sees pupils from the Pearson College going to different schools in the province while children from those schools have a chance to see first-hand what goes on at the Pedder Bay school.

The Lester Pearson College was a dream of Canada's late prime minister and was built following his death. The school is located about 15 miles north of Victoria on the Sooke highway.

The seven college students who visited the Salt Spring schools were also taken on a tour of the island to visit local craftsmen. Their visit included a sailing expedition in the Gulf Island waters.

In return the visiting students entertained their hosts with a display of their own abilities.

The recent visit was the second year for the exchange program between the Gulf Islands and Pearson College.

## Six students visit Pender

Pearson College of the Pacific sent six students to Pender Island for a three-day visit last week.

The first day the students spent at the school, observing and talking with the local students.

The second day they spent the morning at the studio of Milly Colley, where she demonstrated weaving crafts. Milly has recently returned from a trip across Canada and just completed a very successful show in Vancouver.

She showed them that her work can be hung both ways. There is no back or front to it. Milly explained that she does not make drawings first. When she starts it's all firmly fixed in her mind; the beautiful sunset, for instance and all the coloured wool needed is ready first.

If she is weaving a piece for a client, sometimes she does a rough drawing if the client wishes it.

She emphasized the artist should look after his tools carefully and showed them the importance of texture in her weaving.

After lunch the students spent the afternoon with the Pender Islands pottery group and on Friday the day was spent at the home of Gordon and Muriel Wallace, working and learning about a hobby farm. They collected the eggs, washed and candled them, boxed them and helped with the delivery. The Wallaces entertained them at dinner in their home that evening.

The students come from both near and far. Magaye Diop comes from Dakar, Senegal, in West

Africa. The official language is French; he was taught English in school and as this is his second year at Pearson College is very fluent, but said it was difficult for him at the beginning of his first year. This past summer he went home to Senegal for three months.

Ricardo Gonzalez comes from Lima, Peru, a city of six million, where their language is Spanish, but he is also very fluent in English.

Laura Linnovaara's home is Porvoo, Finland, and she speaks six languages. She spoke English with no trace of an accent.

Suzanne Anselmo comes from Edmonton, Alberta, and has a high school average of 94%.

Xiao-di comes from Peking, China. This is his first year at the college but understands English very well. Another student, Sylvie

Lemieux, is from Arvida, Quebec.

Laura Linnovaara spent the latter part of Friday afternoon on Saturna Island as the guest of Taimi Hindmarch.

# Year-long journey brings George Griffiths home

More than a year, after first setting off from Plymouth, England, George Griffiths steered his 28-foot sloop, *Kairos*, into Montague Harbour just before noon on Sunday.

A lonely odyssey had taken George through a treacherous Bay of Biscay where he nearly lost his mast in a gale, to Gibraltar for repairs, across the Atlantic calling in at the Canaries and making landfall at Barbados where he was joined by his son, Mark, for the rest of the voyage.

After cruising in the Caribbean they passed through the Panama Canal and continued west to Hawaii before beating back with the gales of autumn to George's home on Galiano.

As the vessel drew alongside the dock a gathering of the Griffiths' friends broke into cheers of welcome, before becoming awestruck by the thought of such a small boat on vast oceans covering such great distances. One tried to imagine living in the tiny cabin for 40 days at a stretch.

**SIGNS OF BATTERING**

The sturdy hull showed signs of battering by the waves and the varnish was chipped and scorched by tropical suns. The sloop, *Kairos*, like her father-and-son crew, looked like a proud survivor.

George Griffiths made a day-to-day record of his voyage on tapes which, when opportunity arose, he sent to his wife Margaret on Galiano. His quiet, measured tones rarely varied, whether recounting nondescript details or giving an account of the perils of a howling gale, the noise of which could be heard on the tape as he spoke. Moving moments abound, in which the listener is privileged to share to a small degree.

*Kairos* is a Greek word for time; not the chronos of the drag of days such as George experienced in the doldrums, but critical time, the time of decision with one foot in the past and the other in the future, or in George's favourite definition, "The moment between dreaming and the ultimate action."

**WELL NAMED**

That the boat was well named there is no doubt, for the voyage was George's first retirement project. What drives a man to sail on his own through perils and

loneliness that few would dare is his own private *kairos*.

A different ordeal, separate in space and time but shared in spirit, was Margaret's, waiting anxiously for news. Her *kairos* was lonely too; accepting a quest but unable to share it. Their many friends on Galiano rejoice with George and Margaret on the successful completion of the voyage and hope to hear more details in the days ahead.

*Kairos*, built 18 years ago in Scotland, will now make Galiano her home port and the West Coast her cruising ground with George as skipper and Margaret as crew.

**The Only Jealousy of Emer**

On Sunday the 25th and Friday the 30th of October full-house audiences were treated to a memorable evening of theatre by the Galiano Island Players who presented *The Only Jealousy of Emer* by W.B. Yeats. Remembered more as a poet than a dramatist,

the Irishman was, nevertheless, associated for 20 years with the famous Abbey Theatre of Dublin.

*The Only Jealousy of Emer* is the fourth of a cycle of five plays based on Irish legend but written in the style of a classical Greek tragedy, modified to some extent by Yeats' interest in the No Theatre of Japan. The characters, who are masked or made up to give the impression of being masked, are also Jungian archetypes.

The chorus provides commentary, the eerie mood-setting music and the slow, graceful movement of solemn dance. The stark scenery and costumes devised by Christa Weiss and the masks created by Keith Holmes were essential to the atmosphere of mystery and terror which held the audience in its grip. **REASON TO BE PROUD**

Heather Martin, a student of Yeats' work for over 10 years, was the director and driving force of this enterprise. She has every reason to be proud of her achievement as the appreciation shown by the audiences indicated. She made sure that all her

players meticulously spoke the poet's verse and kept rigorously to the intention of the playwright. That the performance lacked a certain dramatic intensity was more the fault of Yeats than the actors.

A modern audience, accustomed to the close-ups of film and television, expects emotions to play upon the faces of the actors. Masks prohibit this expression; therefore the actors, as the Greeks and Japanese must have done,

should rely on voice and movement to convey horror, terror and desolation, the emotional climaxes of this play.

Everyone concerned with this production deserves commendation: actors Maxine Gadd, Joe Fleming, Debbie Holmes, Märtha Miller, Bob Gilson, Akasha Forest and Janice Prevedoros; behind the scenes, Christa Weiss, Keith Holmes and Ronald Norden; and finally the spectators, many of whom found aspects of the play incomprehensible, yet nevertheless enjoyed and appreciated the efforts of fellow-islanders.

**Hallowe'en**

Last weekend's heavy rain did not dampen the spirits of Galiano's youthful Hallowe'eners although it did prevent the home-bound oldsters from enjoying the visits of the jolly little spooks, goblins and assorted characters.

By six o'clock a long line of cars parked outside the Community Hall indicated a large assembly inside waiting to enjoy Galiano Club's traditional Hallowe'en Party. Within was a whirl of moving colour as masked faces and costume-concealed bodies paraded around the floor.

Events moved quickly. First an unsteady circle of costumed preschoolers, then a bigger parade as the five-to-10's strutted more confidently around the hall and finally a motley collection of over-10's displayed their showmanship before the judges and the audience.

The creators of this year's disguises are to be complimented on their originality and ingenuity. A bouquet must be awarded to the adults in costume who did not

## Community Centre

The Galiano Community Centre Society has distributed a questionnaire to residents of Galiano to ascertain opinion regarding the variations in proposed additions to the Galiano School.

Respondents are asked to choose from the minimum addition of a meeting room, storage room and kitchen at an estimated cost of \$50,000 with alternatives ranging up to a maximum of a gymnasium with 50 by 80 feet floor and 22-foot ceiling, plus meeting and storage rooms and kitchen at an estimated cost of \$500,000.

## CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT BY-LAW NO. 958

\*\*\*\*\*  
A BY-LAW TO PERMIT THE OPERATION OF CERTAIN RETAIL BUSINESS ON HOLIDAYS IN THE ELECTORAL AREA OF SALT SPRING ISLAND  
\*\*\*\*\*

WHEREAS the Holiday Shopping Regulation Act, SBC 1980 Chapter 17, provides that no person shall carry on retail business or admit the public to a retail establishment on a holiday except as provided therein;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3 of the said Act, a regional board may, with the assent of the electors in an electoral area of the regional district, adopt a by-law to permit a person to carry on a certain class of retail business, to sell or offer for sale a certain class of goods or service in a retail establishment or to admit the public to a retail establishment on a holiday.

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. A word or expression used in this by-law has the same meaning as in the said Holiday Shopping Regulation Act except that in this by-law "retail business" shall not include "scheduled business" as that expression is defined in the said Holiday Shopping Regulation Act.
2. Any person shall be permitted to carry on any and all classes of retail business, to sell or offer for sale any and all classes of goods or service in a retail establishment and to admit the public to a retail establishment on any and all holidays within the Electoral Area of Salt Spring Island.
3. This By-law shall come into force on January 1, 1982.
4. This By-law may be cited as the "Holiday Shopping Regulation By-law for the Electoral Area of Salt Spring Island, No. 1, 1981".

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# 'Forgotten people of the world' are invited to sign petition

On All Saints Day, I salute two men who would be astonished to hear themselves referred to as saints!

I met John Semenov at the Provincial Disarmament Conference. He told us about a children's petition being prepared and moved some of us to tears with this statement:

"The children are the forgotten people of the world. They are the first to suffer in times of natural disasters, famine, plague and disease, and war or mass dislocations....They have no voice until they reach legal age.

"Though we refer to our children as 'our future', they have not been asked to contribute their opinions toward the shaping of the world and future which the world leaders are preparing for them.

"The children must have a voice, a chance to speak. We must hear the children. Out of the minds and hearts of children can come the wisdom which ought to save the world.

### OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK

"We hope to extend to all the children who may be reached, the opportunity to speak and make their voice heard through this petition."

The preamble to the petition is: "We demand the right to live. Let our future not be destroyed by a nuclear holocaust. Put all efforts possible into safeguarding the world before you leave, in order that we may have a world and a future too."

The petition is now ready and I have ordered copies. Please look out for it and make sure that only children, and all children, sign it.

I've never met John Nash, but I'd like to. He wrote an excellent letter to *The Vancouver Sun* (October 31). In part, he said:

### FAR MORE SAVINGS

"Those...concerned about waste of public money in the ministry of human resources could constructively turn their attention in other directions (than welfare cutbacks). An intelligently designed incentive scheme with an easement formula (a kind of negative income tax) as proposed by the Federated Anti-Poverty Groups could achieve far more substantial savings for the MHR than the minister's latest policy, which may well end up costing more than it saves by increasing other costs.

"The bureaucrats who are paid to come up with such cost-saving

methods have failed to do so, and it is incompetent bureaucrats who are the greatest drain on the taxpayer. The MHR has a complicated bureaucracy with many people in expensive managerial jobs who serve no useful function. An efficiency study...and elimination of unnecessary jobs could achieve big savings without robbing the needy and imposing hardship....

### A HERO IN REAGAN

"People who oppose welfare presumably find a hero in Ronald Reagan. Let them note his efforts to cut out deadwood from government offices. The major drain on the budget by government is not the comparatively small numbers of welfare recipients (few, if any of whom are such by choice), but the vast army of unproductive and overpaid bureaucrats living on the taxpayer. It is particularly inappropriate when those are in the MHR, and they are the real welfare bums who should be brought to account.

"The minister has failed to examine all options. An incentive scheme properly designed and an efficient bureaucracy could between them save tens of millions, not the trifling amounts involved in her proposal."

Infact Victoria seeks our help. Last May the World Health Organization adopted an international code governing the promotion and sale of infant formula. Our federal Health Minister Begin supported these measures.

### PROVINCIAL MATTER

However, health services in Canada are primarily a provincial matter, and we are asked to write Jim Neilsen, minister of health, Victoria (copy to Dave Barrett, leader of the opposition).

We should express our concern that the provincial government's action to implement the code has not been made public. We could ask how such action will be enforced; what actions have been taken or are contemplated, what can we do to expedite matters? We

could also express our opposition to the distribution of free sample packs being made through tax-supported hospitals and medical facilities.

We are up against the big bucks, but when the WHO has taken up the cudgels, at least we know we are on the right track.

Don't forget: every letter represents 200 votes, and always ask questions, so the recipient of the letter has to answer specifically, not just with a form letter.

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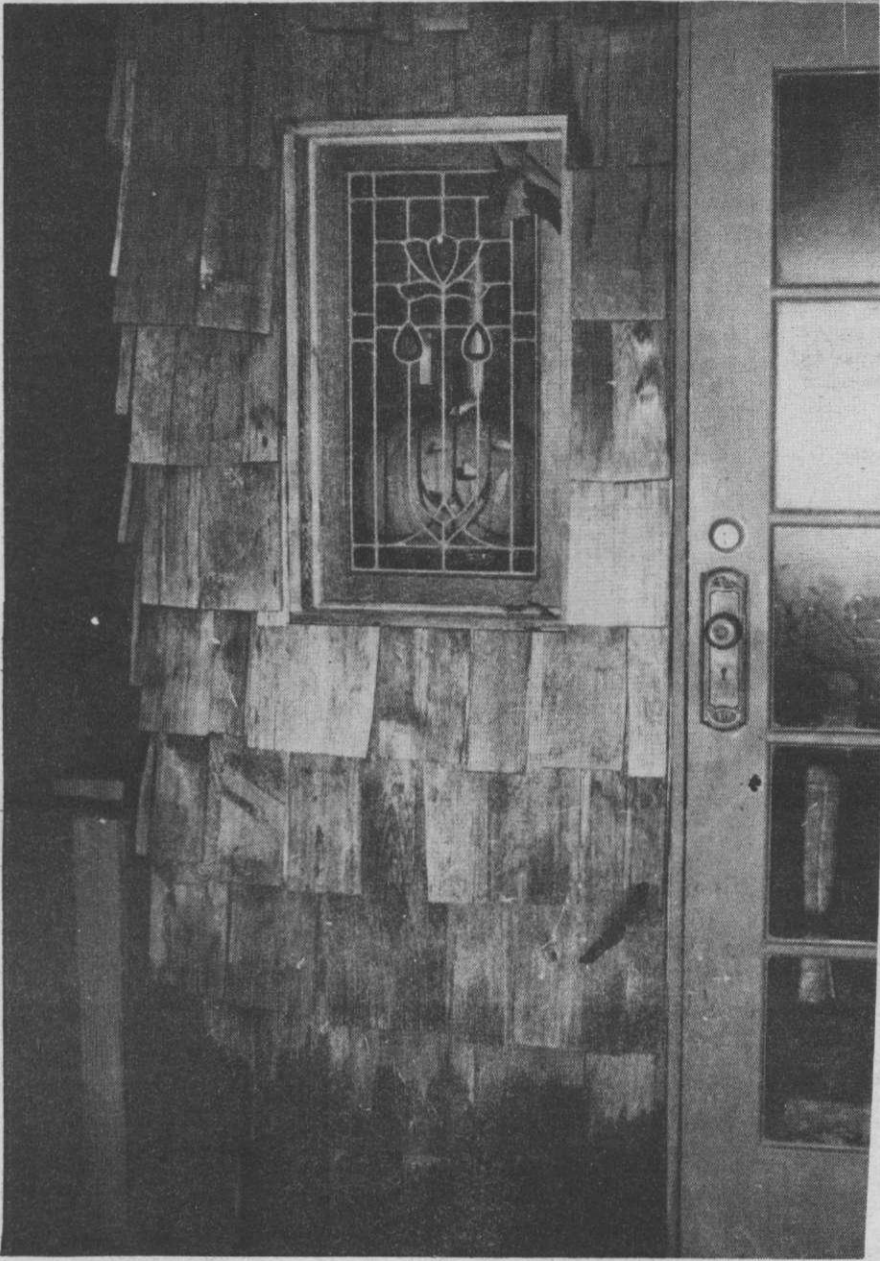

**Noise bylaw to be discussed**

I fully realize that the need for a noise bylaw for Salt Spring Island should be discussed and implemented. However, the needs of this community do not correspond with other electoral areas.

In the very near future this subject will come up and before any bylaws are implemented, the majority of the island residents will decide.

It will be widely discussed within different areas on the island and

area, by area will be dealt with.

For example, a more populated area on Salt Spring Island may want certain restrictions that would not be necessary in a less populated area, and in fairness to all residents, they must decide what noise restriction applies to their area.

The reason for excluding Salt Spring Island from the recent electoral area proposed noise bylaw was that it was too restrictive for our island way of life.

For instance: next-door

neighbour and his chickens; trucks or machinery would not have been allowed to run between the hours of 7 pm to 7 am, many of our machine operators and trucks have to be on the road much earlier to catch ferries, etc; no running of saws or hammering or construction noise between 7-7, etc.

We do need something to prevent the problems which so often occur, such as wild parties and extremely loud music from stereos keeping a whole neighbourhood awake and frustrated and also noisy car racing in certain areas on the island, etc.

# Region's finances are handled in 'sloppy manner', says Roddick

Vern Roddick was guest speaker at a meeting on Mayne Island on Saturday at which about 25 people were present.

He was introduced by Bill Norton of Pender Island as a candidate in the Capital Regional District election to be held on November 21, to represent Saturna, Mayne, Galiano and the Penders for the next two years.

Roddick began his talk by saying that when he put in his nomination as a candidate he asked for information and was given a copy of the budget, but was told that no details could be given out. This is one of two main reasons for his running for office, he said: to try to get information that he can relay to the people of the Outer Gulf Islands. In the past residents have not been told by their representative what is going on, he said.

With respect to finances, Roddick feels the Capital Regional District has been operating in a very "sloppy manner." In the department handling building permits, the year ended with a surplus which was transferred elsewhere, but he couldn't find out where.

For regional parks \$890,000 was budgeted, \$15,000 not used was transferred elsewhere, but it was not possible to find out where the

funds were used.

## ADDITIONAL BURDEN

One-quarter mill, which raises \$752,000 in taxes from the Outer Gulf Islands for regional parks, has placed an additional tax burden on the residents, yet the previous year's funding was not all used up. The regional parks are all on Vancouver Island. There are 12 of them, varying in size, and not something Outer Islands residents are likely to make much use of, "since we already live in a park," said Roddick.

If elected, he said, should an issue come up on Mayne Island, he would hold meetings and find out the problems and take them back to the CRD himself.

Several residents of Mayne Island were upset about their water situation. In an area roughly from the school down to Miner's Bay the residents have been told to boil their water, but have not been able to find out the reason. In this area they are all on wells.

Roddick explained this is a CRD matter through the health office and said he would find out for them if elected. One resident suggested there are six different water districts on Mayne Island and they can't get together to make an approach as an island. It was explained that the Islands Trust is responsible for the watershed but once the water hits a pipe

anywhere it becomes the business of the CRD.

## WOULD RELAY PROBLEMS

The question of policing was brought up and Roddick suggested that all incidents should be reported to the RCMP as the police come under the attorney-general's department. The same applies to roads, they come under the department of highways, but Roddick, as the CRD representative, would listen to Mayne Island's problems and relay them to the appropriate authorities, he added.

One member of the audience said he objected to contributing taxes to the Royal Theatre in Victoria, when there is no way to attend it without considerable expense. A member of the audience suggested that our representative could work to have the islands opted out of taxation where the services were not available to them, but still remain in the CRD.

Roddick finished by saying that if elected he intends to find out and publish in detail in *Driftwood* and the other island papers where the tax money goes.

To summarize, he said he would like a fresh look for the Outer Gulf Islands.

"Many of the members on the CRD have been on it too long."

hopes all those who tried out will participate in either the chorus or dancing ensemble and share in the 21 minor roles and the eight non-speaking parts.

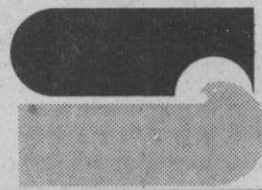
Cast for the leading roles includes Arlene Dashwood as Eliza, Andy Orkin as Professor Higgins, John Beardsell as Alfred

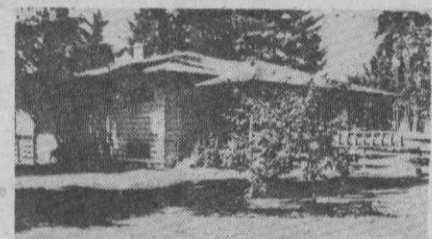

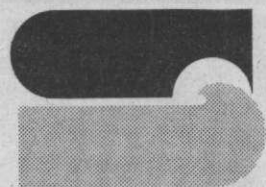

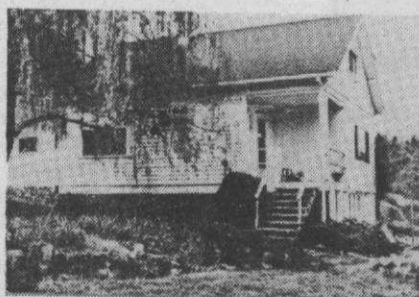

## Institute meets at Pender .

# Farmers begin season with talk by Peter Weis

Pender Islands Farmers' Institute was fortunate in having Peter Weis of Salt Spring Island start the fall season with an informative talk, which was attended by 45 members. The meeting was held at the Legion on Tuesday evening, Oct. 27.

Weis, *Driftwood's* gardening columnist, started his talk by saying "everything we need has been given in total abundance for us to use as we see fit." Gardening starts with soil: it's 90% of the success. If one has good soil and follows instructions on the seed package, success will follow.

Organic gardening is ages old, and only recently have we moved into chemical gardening, which

had its roots in primitive investigations about 100 years ago. At that time it was deduced that plants required nitrogen, phosphorous and potash. Additions produced impressive results till it became wholeheartedly endorsed as standard practice.

### QUANTITY UP, QUALITY DOWN

Recently we have come to realize this intensive growth leaves a lot to be desired: the impressive results are on a short-term basis. The profit motive entered the picture and produced great quantities at little cost. Quality deteriorated.

In early days the organic materials were provided by

returning manure and straw to the soil. By not doing this the soil becomes seriously eroded and requires more and more fertilizer.

The organic content of the soil acts as a sponge that holds the moisture and nutrients. It's cheap, whereas chemical fertilizers are expensive and will become more so in the future. Many are derived from oil products.

How do we improve our garden soil?

Composting is one method. Return everything that was once a living substance to the soil.

Green manure's value in improving soil conditions is being realized today. Weeds are valuable to bring up the nutrients, break them down and return them to the soil.

For a nitrogen deficient soil alfalfa is the best crop to plant, followed by clover. Pea and bean crops also fix nitrogen in the soil. The crops should be rotated each year and the roots turned under for maximum benefit.

To add phosphorus, plant buckwheat. It penetrates deeply into the sub-soil and will grow on the poorest soil.

### WINTER RYE

Soils lacking in potassium should have winter rye grown on them. Many nutrients are leached away by winter rains, but a rye crop will store the nutrients as it produces a massive root system. Turn it under in the spring.

Weeds are rich in nutrients and produce top soil for plants and animals and people's use.

Mulch increases the organic content and holds moisture. Don't do it till the ground is nearly warmed in the spring and before the soil cools down in the fall. Six inches is a good thickness.

Plastic mulch is good. Black plastic is excellent for heat-loving plants such as tomatoes.

Permaculture, which is growing different plants together, can be used to our benefit. For example, clover is sowed in the tomato bed area, then the required area cleared and tomatoes planted. Instead of clover, weeds can be utilized.

Weis found this excellent for peas and beans. He let the weeds grow, then cut them down to two inches in height then planted peas and beans. Less watering is required — a further advantage. Dill can be planted among the cabbages — a good combination.

### IN JAPAN

The One Straw Revolution was started by a microbiologist 30 to 40 years ago in Japan. Weis told the audience that it developed from the Japanese Buddhist concept of letting nature do its own thing in its own way.

The soil is not tilled or cultivated, and there is a permanent ground cover of weeds and clover. The yields equal or surpass the best agricultural areas in Japan. Crops can be grown on a large scale with a great reduction of labour.

The summer crop is rice, grown dry like any green crop, and sown into the weeds and clover. The winter crop is barley (here it could be winter rye), sown into the rice crop three weeks before harvesting, and the rice is threshed and the hulls returned to the field as living mulch.

One abandoned hill in Japan was eroded to bare clay. Holes were dug in the hill and filled with good soil and planted with citrus trees. Buckwheat and clover was planted on the bare hills. The buckwheat started immediately to hold the moisture.

### 4NEW TOP SOIL.

In 10 years, four inches of top soil was created and the citrus trees bore abundant fruit. A thin sprinkle of chicken manure is added to aid in the breaking down of the straw to return the nutrients to the soil. Thus it is called the One Straw Revolution.

A minimum of time, labour and money is expended. Four inches of top soil in 10 years is a fantastic increase. The method has been widely studied in the US and in Canada. Statistics say we lose six tons of top soil per acre per year. There will come a time when there won't be any left.

The organic content of the soil is our life and needs to be replaced. Even if you garden with chemical fertilizer the organic content needs to be retained.

"After the energy crisis comes the water crisis," Weis continued. A permanent cover crop holds

moisture — that is one of its main advantages. If permaculture methods were followed we would see an abundant increase in the water retained in the soil by vegetables, he explained.

### WASTEFUL

The bare ground method of gardening is wasteful of water. Every time a row of carrots is weeded it experiences a set-back equivalent to four days' growth. Five weedings in a season is 20 days' growth lost, even if the garden is watered plentifully.

"Cherish your spiders and wasps," said Weis. Wasps eat cabbage worms and termites. Spiders of all types eat garden insects. Mass planting makes ideal conditions for insects to eat in the garden and makes ideal conditions for disease to destroy the plant.

There is some evidence that rhubarb, the leaves of which contain oxalic acid, will check club root.

"The best control for slugs in the garden is to keep some ducks," said Weis, in answer to a question from the audience.

Soils on the islands are nearly all slightly acid. Wood ashes can be used instead of buying lime to correct this.

Our methods of planting a field of one vegetable, or rows of one vegetable and painstakingly removing all the weeds to expose the bare ground can be changed by organic gardening methods which will save our precious soil and water.

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# Three Fijian visitors come to say "thank you!"

It was the middle of the day in Suva, Fiji's capital, and the young and very enthusiastic minister was eager to take up a challenge.

The Rev. Eloni Goneyali was in the final months of his seminary training and he had been presented with an assignment. On the street was a noisy gathering of small boys. They worked on the street. It was their life.

The young minister was facing a challenge. He had to go out on the street and win their confidence and then take it from there.

It was easy. He called them together, shoeshine boys, pedlars and shrewd talkers of tourists out of dollar bills.

"Come on in!" he invited them from the door of the small cafe. And in they came. The refreshments were on him, said Eloni Goneyali, as the motley gathering seated itself at the tables with cakes and goodies galore.

### CALLED A BLESSING

The boys sat and the minister spoke briefly before inviting them to join him in grace. He bowed his head and closed his eyes and called blessing on the simple repast.

When he opened his eyes he found an empty restaurant and not a crumb left on the tables. The boys had stolen out while he prayed.

He promptly went outside and asked the first boy he saw why they had absconded with the supplies.

It was business hours, replied the boy, solemnly.

The tourists were aboard and the boys depended on them for their precarious living.

Eloni never forgot the lesson and he was to need it sorely before he was through.

The encounter with the ultimate poor of Suva brought the young Methodist minister into the orbit of the YMCA.

He saw their work on the city streets and he was among those who gathered to welcome a delegation from the New Zealand YMCA when members came to Fiji and proposed setting up clubs in the nation of islands.

### TO HELP OTHERS

Later the young minister explained to his church that his vocation was in helping others. He was released from his ministerial duties and became a rural worker with the YMCA in Fiji. He still is.

Last week Goneyali was the guest of Cec Wakely and Mrs. Wakely at their Creekside Drive home on Salt Spring Island. And accompanying the senior rural worker was another YMCA staffer, Sairusi Qaranibalu, whose home is on Koro Island. Third visitor here was Mikaele Koli, YMCA chairman on that same island of Koro.

The three offered a brief outline of the social problems facing Fiji.

The Fijians have been independent for 10 years and they are already listing the progress

they have made.

The YMCA is working for the people of the Fijian villages who have so much and yet so little.

Starvation is not a threat to the Fijian people. There is a plentiful supply of food. Few of the villages, however, have money. And Fijians have easy access to the stores. They need money.

Go to the city, they said, that's where the money is!

But, no, urged the rural workers, cultivate your wild land and that's where the money is!

### THEY WERE RIGHT

They have been proved right. The villagers are engaged in clearing land and planting crops, mostly readily salable commercial crops: manioc, copra, coconuts and a myriad of others. They sell the crops and the village is as wealthy as the townsman and able to continue the rural life.

The story, thus told, sounds simple, but nothing is simple. It is a new way of life and people are always resistant to change. Some cannot imagine a crop in the wilderness producing spending money. And agriculture always has its problems.

But it has worked to a remarkable degree. And the people are more eager to follow the scheme when they see others making it pay.

Fiji is experiencing a population explosion like no other and the country is desperately in need of new jobs. This development of the land is providing new jobs, away from the teeming cities with their growing unemployment.

### NOT LIMITED

The development program does not confine itself to growing field crops. There are fish canneries and one small farm is growing exotic blooms for the United States markets.

Tuna canning is steadily growing and new opportunities are appearing all the time.

When the British first settled on Fiji they brought indentured servants from Madras, in India. These employees elected to remain in the country even after their engagements were completed. Today their descendants form a large segment of the population.

The Indians are engaged in commerce and the Fijians own the land. They live in harmony, I was assured, but when an Indian family's lease of land expires they may well find that the land is no longer theirs. The government



prohibits the sale of Fijian land to non-Fijians.

To an increasing extent the Indians are losing their land and moving into the commercial centres, where the government permits them to hold land, explained the Fijian visitor.

The Fijians are not only looking at crops and fish. They are looking for the tourist trade that overflows from the overgrown Hawaiian Islands.

### BEACHES AND SEAS

Fiji has beautiful sands, sunburned beaches and rolling seas. As yet, the number of hotels is limited, but they're coming.

The easiest way to build a hotel is to go into partnership with a Fijian who owns the property.

Fiji wants help from wealthier nations for developing a prosperous agriculture.

That is what brought the three men to British Columbia.

Over the past five years they have received help from British Columbia as well as the YMCA and the federal government's matching aid program.

They've done it again. Who has done it again? The B.C. Ferry Corporation, of course, who else?

The first part of our recent trip down from the north was very pleasant. The road from Whitehorse to Skagway is an ongoing tribute to the engineers who forced it through those high mountains. It is a scenic route to the sea from high, high up.

Skagway is still a quaint little place with many false fronts on the buildings. Some of the names are reminiscent of those historically glamorous days.

The Sweet Tooth Saloon, for instance, is a funny little cafe where you may have almost anything but an alcoholic beverage. Many of the businesses were already closed including one small shop where the sign still offered to buy and sell gold and also, that any customer who had some of the glittering metal could have it weighed within the shop on the gold scales.

### DELIGHTFUL TIME

Our time on the Alaska State ferry was delightful. True, there is no longer a dining saloon but the cafeteria is well planned, well stocked and those behind the food counter were concerned and helpful. There were movies and also a ball game was shown. The warm sunshine made brisk walks about the decks invigorating while enhancing the spectacular scenery.

The wait to board the B.C. ferry, *Queen of the North*, seemed interminable. I watched a house fly going through its ablutions on the car window. I had no idea flies were so particular about themselves. At any rate that fly helped to ease the frustration of waiting.

Once on board, a young man motioned me up the incline but stopped me part way. With a standard this wasn't easy,

especially with another car so close behind. If the young man had not put a block behind the back wheel we might be there still.

### NO CABIN

We had reserved a promenade cabin nearly three weeks prior to the sailing date. On reaching the purser's office for the keys we learned, to our horror, there was no cabin. Why were we not warned that we would be wait-listed? We could have driven down. Why should the clerk in the reservations office keep the scarcity of cabins such a secret?

Upon investigation a pleasant female member of the crew showed me where we would sleep. The so-called reclining chairs couldn't recline much and there were too many other passengers all having to share the space.

Once we had left the shore of Prince Rupert we heard lists of names being called to the purser's office. We'd almost given up all hope of a cabin when, suddenly, our name was called.

### IN BOWELS OF FERRY

I didn't know I could move so quickly. I reached the office on a lower deck almost before the purser could catch his breath. True, the cabin was way down in the very bowels of the ferry and close to the engines but it was, at least, a place where we could stretch out on the berths. There was neither toilet nor shower in the cabin but down the hall were a number of each.

Anyone intending to travel overnight on a B.C. ferry would be well advised to get a reservation in writing.

Earlier I swore I'd never again try the B.C. ferry to or from Prince Rupert. Compared to the excellent accommodation on the Alaska State ferry I must say the B.C. offering is very dim and quite grim.

attendants and thus missing the departure.

Tom Davidson, Saturna Island trustee said, "I intend to tell the ferry corporation there is no reason why they (the students) can't go from one ferry to the other. The crews know these students.

"If it's a matter of knowing how many passengers are on board, all someone has to do is pick up a phone and call in that two or three students are there," he said.

At the end of the week, students leave Salt Spring on Friday afternoon and often find themselves arriving home in the late evening.

### TO THE TOP

The time has come, agreed the school board, to go directly to the top. Peck pointed out that talks with the attendants at Swartz Bay have proven fruitless. Past efforts to deal through the ferry corporation's head office have not been successful.

"Previously, we were dealing with the man under Mr. Gallagher. We talked to the second in line and we had no success," he said.

The school board is optimistic that the telephone call to Hodgson will accomplish something.

The animal control officer, Bill Leach had reported that the claims were in order and the losses had been confirmed.

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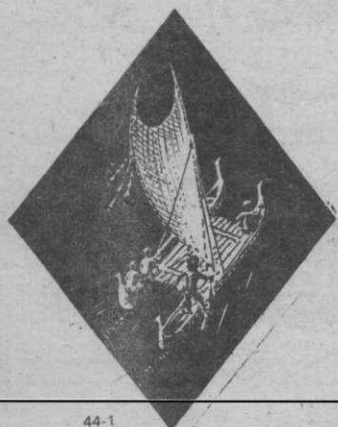
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
