Misconceptions may be put to rest by cancer forum

Cancer.

The word engenders fear and anxiety in people but shouldn't, says Salt Spring physician Dr. Hugh Borsman.

To help shed light on the subject, the Lady Minto Hospital and the Canadian Cancer Society will jointly sponsor a public forum on cancer Saturday, Nov. 14. The meeting begins at 7:30 in the Activity Centre at the Salt Spring Elementary School.

The six panel members, led by Dr. David Boyes, director for the B.C. Cancer Institute, will answer questions on any aspect of the disease such as those related to diagnosis, treatment or research.

"Although frightening," said Borsman, "the word cancer shouldn't cloud a person's perceptions."

MOST CURABLE

"Cancer is probably the most curable of all the serious diseases known to mankind," he said.

Studies conducted by the National Cancer Institute in the United States show, for the year 1977, that diseases of the heart claimed almost twice the number of people as do all cancers combined.

Borsman points out that cancer, as popularly understood, covers a range of similarly related diseases. The definition: uncontrolled growth of cells, is a common factor but does not apply to all cancers.

Cancer can strike any part of the body and does not respect age.

CHILDREN AS PRONE

Children are as prone to cancer as adults. While the median age for contracting cancer is about 61

years, the death rate is low in almost each type. The U.S. study showed that only 168 out of 100,000 population died of one form of cancer or another.

Males are more prone to cancer of the lung although the statistics again show that with more women smoking, the number of lung cancer cases in females is increasing.

Until the age of 34, accidents rank as the major cause of death for both males and females. After that age, the diseases of the heart predominate.

ALMOST FIVE PER CENT

In children, cancer gets credit for almost five per cent of every 100,000 deaths. Homicide and suicide account for two per cent of the deaths. Children, it would appear, face almost as much threat from violence as from cancer.

The disease is world-wide in scope. Of 46 countries offering statistics to the U.S. group, Canada ranks 24th in cancer deaths among males and 18th in similar deaths among females.

Czechoslovakia has the highest instance of death from cancer for males while Ireland ranks first among female deaths.

No real pattern, warm climate, cold climate, developed or developing country can be found in the statistics.

Australia, for instance, ranks first and second in deaths from skin cancer for both males and females. Norway ranks third for both sexes in that disease.

England ranks ninth and sixth for male and female deaths but another industrialized nation, Japan, comes in 28th and 34th.

THE REASON

The statistics are as bewildering as the disease itself. And that, said Borsman, is the reason for the forum.

He hopes the talks will help put to rest some misconceptions about cancer. He views the evening as an opportunity to dispense education about the subject as well as to alert people to the real progress being made in the research and cure of the illness.

Contemporary treatment methods include radiation sessions and chemical applications. The out-moded radical surgery, which until recently meant the patient losing many parts of the body to stop the spread of the disease, is now hardly resorted to.

Some cancers act quickly, said Borsman, and the problem in diagnosis stems from the fact that the patient feels virtually no pain until the rapid growth of cells interferes with nerve pockets, blood vessels or other organs.

Education, regular check-ups and early diagnosis remain as the first line of defense against cancer. But even though as Borsman said, "We don't know the cause. We don't know the cure," cancer doesn't necessarily mean death.

They can drink more for less in Florida even if it's Canadian

It's cheaper to go on a jag across the line. Elna Cairns told me so.

Elna and Don Cairns are back from a trip to Florida and one of the souvenirs of her trip is a full-page advertisement from a Florida newspaper inviting the public to buy liquor. Unlike British Columbia, the sunny south permits open advertising of liquor.

The ABC Liquor Stores have it all ready for the customer. Not only can he drop in and pick up Canadian whisky for a lot less than he could in British Columbia, but he can have a drink while he buys.

There's a happy hour from 5 pm to 6 pm and the customer can have two drinks; two one-ounce drinks for the price of one.

A bottle of Canadian Club is available for \$9.99. The price in Canada, its home and native land, is \$15. The price is adjusted for quantity, but not for currency exchange. The difference in the two dollars would shrink the differential. The American price in Canadian dollars would be nearer \$12.

IT GREW UP HERE!

The difference is the same right down the line. A Black Velvet available in any liquor store bearing a British Columbia government imprint would be \$15. Go to Florida and get the same deal for \$6.29 US. And it grew up in Canada!

Another brand of Canadian whisky is offered at \$64.70, US, for three gallons; and that's \$21.50 a gallon. Mind you, it's an American gallon and it's not quite a gallon. And it's American dollars. But a man could get awful thirsty south of the line just

thinking about it. I'm north of the line and I'm getting thirsty just writing about it!

It isn't that they're selling good Canadian liquor cheap. At least, not only Canadian hooch: they're cosmopolitan.

Drop in ABC on US Highway 19 North, in Clearwater, and you can pick up a case of six Johnnie Walker Red Label, 1.75 litres each, or a "short half-gallon", for \$107.50. If you do a quick translation, that's \$35 a short gallon. And, again, it's in Yankee money, but it's still some cheap Scotch. Ask for it at the Ganges Bargain Booze Shop and you'll pay all of \$180 for the same burden.

Canadian Club will run you \$157.50 for the same deal and if you're a ginny, then six party-size Gordon's Dry will run you \$68.95 down there and \$149 up here.

ANOTHER DIFFERENCE

There's another difference. They sell it by the litre and we buy it by the litre.

But don't get it wrong. ABC doesn't press you to booze. They'll even sell you a gallon of milk for \$1.99, "pet".

If you prefer wine, you can pick up a Martini and Rossi vermouth for \$3.49, US, instead of \$5, BC. The saving is less on that one because of the exchange and the American price in northern bucks is \$4.19.

Blue Nun Liebfraumilch runs \$3.39, against \$6.95 CAN. Beaujolais compares \$4.10 to \$8.40 and Chateau Neuf du Pape is \$8.99: \$15.20. Cigarettes? 72¢ a pack.

Well, there's your Christmas ruined!

Old buildings form subjects for his paintings

Jack Avison is working to preserve part of Salt Spring Island's heritage. Jack's watercolour paintings capture the strength of form and the warmth of worn wood in the old buildings he chooses as his subjects.

He is particularly enthusiastic about the stretch of road between Fulford Harbour and Beaver Point.

"There are some marvellous old barns down there," he says. He enjoys talking to the owners of the barns and listening to their stories. When each painting is completed, he prints a brief history of his subject directly on to the back of the painting.

In Jack's watercolours, the fluid feeling of the sky, the subtle background of trees and earth and the spontaneity with which the brush captures the character of each building are the result of the many years Jack has painted.

LIVED IN ENGLAND

He lived in the north of England and, for 20 years, he travelled the Yorkshire countryside on business. Many of his paintings then were of the stone cottages and barns which dot the rolling moors.

There was a period when Jack worked in oils. His paintings were abstract, based on his life drawings.

"Now I am back to representational paintings," he says.

It was not until the spring of 1980 that Jack retired and he and his wife moved to Salt Spring to be close to their daughter and her family. Jack says he is enjoying his

retirement, and he has two aims: preserving the beauty and history of our old buildings "which may soon be lost", and passing on the knowledge he has gained through many years of work and experimentation.

SAVE SOME STEPS

"Maybe I can save a few steps for some of the less experienced painters," he says. As a member of the Painters Guild he has given many valuable demonstrations of technique and constructive critiques of others' work.

Jack Avison's paintings, and those of other guild members, will be hanging in the little "gallery", a new feature of the potters, weavers and painters guilds' pre-Christmas sale.

Another new feature will be demonstrations of painting techniques, as well as of spinning and weaving, and handbuilding of clay.

The annual sale will be held in Mahon Hall on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, November 13, 14 and 15 from 10 am to 5 pm daily.

Infant deaths low here

Statistics obtained by the Capital Regional District community health service show this area compares well with other areas in the province in terms of deaths in infants.

A comparison of figures from the three-year period 1978-80 showed that the Capital Region had the lowest rate of all 24 health units for deaths in babies in the first month of life.

The region had the second lowest rate for deaths in babies in the first week of life and in the first year of life.

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LOOK FOR THE ENERGUIDE LABEL

When you buy a major electrical appliance, you're picking up two price tags. One is the cost of the appliance. The other is the cost of the electricity to operate it over its lifetime.

Until recently the energy price tag was missing. You paid *now* — but had little idea of what you would go on paying. Now there's a second tag, in the form of an Energuide label.

WHAT IS ENERGUIDE?

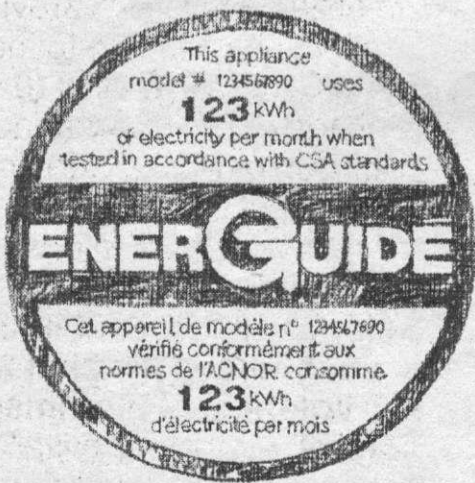
Energuide is an appliance labeling program under which energy consumption "stickers" are attached to new refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, clothes washers, and kitchen ranges offered for sale in Canada. The program was initiated by the Government of Canada and is operated in co-operation with consumer groups, appliance manufacturers and retailers, electrical utilities and provincial governments.

COMPARISON SHOPPING

The whole idea behind Energuide is to help you, the consumer, to compare the energy cost tags of appliances and determine which is the best buy. Comparison shopping and wise decisions can save you a great deal of energy and money over the long run.

HOW DOES ENERGUIDE WORK?

The label on each new appliance shows the number of kilowatt hours of electricity (kWh) consumed by that appliance in one month of normal operation. This rating is determined by a test developed by the Canadian Standards Association for all appliances labelled. The number is representative of the energy that the appliance will consume under normal operation in your home. It's not exact; the test could never duplicate precisely all the conditions in your home. But it is correct as a *comparative rating*, to indicate the difference between models.



To convert the Energuide rating in kWh to dollars, multiply by the cost of a kWh in your area. (The current national average is 4¢ per kWh.) This will give you the operating cost for one month.

$$\text{kWh per month} \times \text{cents per kWh} = \text{cost per month.}$$

WORK OUT THE LIFETIME COST

To really appreciate the importance of Energuide ratings, figure out the lifetime energy cost of the appliance. The average major appliance lasts 15 years, or 180 months.

Multiply the cost per month by 180 and the number you get will be impressive. And it will be an underestimate, because it assumes a constant electricity price over 15 years.

TWO REFRIGERATOR EXAMPLES

Consumer and Corporate Affairs Canada publishes each year the Energuide ratings for new appliances. From the 1981 Refrigerator listing come the following examples:

Type and Defrost System	Total cu. ft.	kWh month
Model A—Two-door, top mounted freezer, frost free	18.2	117
Model B—Two-door, top mounted freezer, frost free	17.1	190

Over a 15-year lifetime Model A, although slightly larger, would cost you \$842.40 for energy (at a constant 4¢/kWh). Model B's energy cost would be \$1,368.00. That's a difference of \$525.60!

WHEN MORE IS LESS

The appliance with the lower Energuide ratings may cost a little more to buy — they usually have more insulation, better motors, more sophisticated controls. But as the above example shows, the value of the energy they save over their life cycle will pay for the extra investment many times over.

So when you're shopping for major appliances look at both tags, do a little figuring and buy the model that will be cheapest over its life cycle — not just the cheapest on its purchase price.

AN ENERGUIDE BONUS FOR ALL

Besides providing consumers with information for comparison shopping, the Energuide program is having another effect. Appliance manufacturers are improving the energy efficiency of their models. Already there have been some notable improvements and experts predict that within a few years major appliances will be consuming about 40% less electricity — while providing the same services. That's a powerful example of how consumer power and industrial innovation go hand in hand.

Analysis of virgin soil shows ways of nature

The most interesting soil analysis is that of fallow soil, such as an old untended pasture, neglected orchards and the like. These form the book of nature, laid open for anyone to see, to understand, to learn from and to use.

Cultivated fields and pastures show the evidence of our husbandry, of crops grown and nutrients applied. These are mainly records of man's use of the earth, and an indication of his management of the resources of the soil.

They are valuable indicators of the level of nutrients available for further cultivation, which deficiencies to correct, or what crops to grow.

But the most exciting soil analysis is that of a natural meadow or virgin soil, for it shows us the ways of nature. There is so much to learn, so much to understand, so much to know.

The most exciting experiment I can imagine would be to let a piece of land go fallow and to record and observe what happens below and above the soil, year after year.

LOW IN NITROGEN

Soil sample analysis of neglected pastures generally shows very low levels of nitrogen, adequate or good levels of phosphorous and potassium, high levels of trace elements and barely adequate levels of organic content.

This generally depends on the length of fallow time, surrounding vegetation and other factors, such as grazing by deer or livestock. But nevertheless, here is a whole story for us to read and to learn from.

The low level of nitrogen has been caused by years of green growth. Some is returned to the soil by the decay of this green growth, and by rain.

Yes, rain does contain some nitrogen which it precipitates from the air. More nitrogen is contributed by nitrogen-generating plants such as clovers, vetches, broom and alder.

But it seems that all the available nitrogen is taken up in the yearly green growth and thus presents a limiting factor to the total vegetation.

High levels of phosphorous are created by deeply rooted weeds such as thistles and others. This phosphorous comes from deep levels in the subsoil, is stored in the plant, and upon its decay, is incorporated into the top soil.

LEAST UNDERSTOOD

High levels of potassium, or potash, result from the decay of the straw portion of the vegetation. Of all the major nutrients, this is the least understood. We don't even know what it does, we just know that it is necessary.

It is thought that it gives strength to the plant, perhaps assists in disease and frost resistance. We also know that it moves around in the plant and seems to travel from old to younger growth. We also know that it leaches readily and that high levels of phosphorous are often found in soil under layers of old, decomposing straw.

There is a whole chapter in the book of nature awaiting discovery here.

Limited as our knowledge is, we have come to know that the organic content of the soil is the storehouse and factory of plant nutrients.

This is the domain of earthworms, bacteria, fungi and a whole host of decay organism, such as actobacter, forms of life totally concerned with the breakdown of tissue into re-useable nutrients for new life. It is also the medium which stores air and water, essential to all living things.

CONTRIBUTE MORE

And although plants re-use elements of the organic content of the soil, they contribute more than they use. For despite re-use by new plant life, erosion by wind and water, and permanent loss to the sea, nature has built the level of organic content from none in the beginning to that which we have now.

All life depends on this organic content, from actobacter to myself; and when I am gone, actobacter will take care of what is left, to recycle it into new life. Marvellous, isn't it?

So even with the little we do

know, we can do a lot. We can correct nitrogen deficiencies by growing legume plants, such as alfalfa, clovers, peas and beans and others. Even if we use the top growth for our purposes, the roots with their nitrogen nodules will enrich the soil with both nitrogen and organic material in significant amounts.

Phosphorous deficiencies can be corrected by growing buckwheat, our best deep-rooted phosphorous forager. Content with poor soil, it will penetrate deeply into subsoil and add its organic matter to transform subsoil into top soil.

FOR POTASH

And winter rye is our best bet to correct potash deficiencies, to retain nutrients in the soil during our wet winters and to add its

organic substance as well.

So we have the complete array of nature's fertilizers to correct any soil deficiencies, to help maintain the intricate balance of trace elements and to add to the organic content of the soil. There is a plant for every purpose and any soil condition, and we have not even scratched the surface.

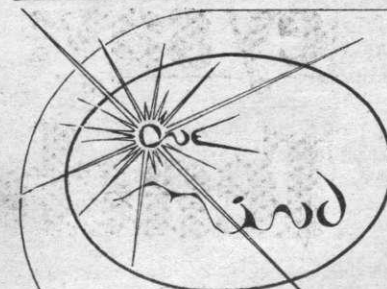
And, further, all these nourish us, in one way or another, with their leaf and seed and they nourish the soil and its life with their substance.

The beauty of this whole thing just blows my mind and I feel like going up to a plant, any plant, shaking its leaf and saying, "thank you".

Many ignoring 'very real peril'

The only worthwhile way to commemorate the dead of two world wars is to ensure we never repeat the mistakes which caused their deaths.

It's dangerous to glamorize war. It's foolhardy to glamorize sacrifice. Martyrdom is one thing. Wholesale slaughter is another.

The series of tragic errors which led to the outbreak of war in 1914 was uncannily paralleled 20 years later. And we see the danger of them being repeated now.

As the economy slumps, the risk of war rises. From the days of ancient Rome, when the people muttered rebelliously, the solution was to find another enemy; mobilize the unemployed, and give those left behind something different to worry about.

The last four recessions in the USA have been "cured" by wars.

NO RECOVERY

What has worked so well in the last 150 years should work again — except that this time there will be no recovery. This time there will be no looking back: no second chance. This time, we risk the end of humanity, even the end of the world as we know it.

The dangerous thinking of "it won't happen here" or "it can't happen to us" is leading many of us to ignore the very real peril we face. With Russia and the USA flexing their muscles and taunting each other with their superiority in one

Dysentery cases up in region

The number of cases of dysentery in the Capital Regional District was higher than usual during last summer. There were 23 cases reported between June and September and they were scattered throughout the region.

Young children were the age group affected most.

Seven of the 11 adult cases had been travelling shortly before being affected.

The best prevention, says regional health officer Dr. Alan Arneil, is good hygiene.

"Those who would travel, especially abroad, would do well to remember that the standards of hygiene elsewhere are not necessarily as high as in the Capital Regional District area," Arneil said.

"Travellers who still have diarrhoea on return to this area should be checked to ensure they are not infected, and a danger to fellow residents."

Dysentery is an acute intestinal disease causing diarrhoea, prostration and fever.

A Hindu stated the Golden Rule. A Protestant quoted the New and Old Testament in hailing the total abolition of all weapons of mass destruction. And a minister from the Traditional Religions of Africa called for a movement of all God's people "to put these high ideals into action for disarmament."

BOOK REVIEW

Poetry is more than creation of similes

effective lobbying, Murray Kennedy, press softly, Powell River, B.C., 1981.

Poetry casts light on life and the strength of the words permits personal insight. At least it should.

Murray Kennedy, of Powell River, has published his third book of words. He has strung together sufficient words to fill most of 64 pages of what he calls "pomes" under the title, *effective lobbying*.

An intriguing idea: to explain the motivations of protest through poetry. Kennedy has been part of several protests along the B.C. coast. He has first-hand knowledge of the gut feeling of staring at the approaching blades of a bulldozer and wondering if the monster will stop.

But he hasn't been able to convey that impression. Perhaps

someone should break the information to him, gently, that poetry consists of more than the creation of similes. Perhaps he should be told that after the third time of being told that something or other leaves him in one state or another, the reader sinks into boredom.

One could dwell on the affectations of this volume, such as leaving the "e" from the, pomes for poems, or the lack of capital letters but such artifice is to be expected of someone more interested in form than content.

Kennedy ends this particular collection of words with: "there is so much more than solitary fungus in the forest", which demands the reply: "there is so much more than asinine similes in poetry."

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

A move to protect the watershed at Maxwell Lake was initiated by Islands Trustee Mike Larmour. He made a proposal to the Capital Regional District which, if accepted, would limit the minimum lot size in the area of the lake to 50 acres. The water of the lake may be needed in future, said Larmour, and he urged islanders to write in support of the proposal.

Two shop teachers at the Gulf Islands Secondary School on Salt Spring Island filed grievances with the Gulf Islands School Board. The two teachers were concerned about their hearing because of the high noise levels in the classrooms. A report from the Workmen's Compensation Board issued two years previously and warning of unsafe noise levels had not been acted upon.

The local weatherman noted that more days of sun occurred in the fall months than during the summer. The high for October was a balmy 65 degrees (F) with a low of 37 degrees. The month was soaked to a depth of 2.48 inches of rain, far below the 9.7 inches of 1975.

The candidates for school trustee for Salt Spring Island, all five of them, showed up at a meeting. They discussed the issues and counted empty chairs as only 30 people attended.

The Salt Spring Lions Club sponsored a fund-raising drive for the Canadian Arthritis and Rheumatism Society and gathered \$2,149 to help aid the group.

The Galiano Senior Citizens' Association donated \$50 to the housing society on that island, bringing the total given by then to \$200.

TEN YEARS AGO

The Capital Regional District board of directors approved a planning act draft for islanders to study. The draft outlined four options to planning and growth in the Gulf Islands. The options for consideration ranged from bridges joining Galiano, Salt Spring and Vancouver Islands, through a continuing of the development patterns as established over the previous decades. Another option

entailed having the federal government declare the islands as a national park while the final option offered residents a do-it-themselves planning kit to suit whatever direction the residents thought best.

While final approval had not been received from the ministry of education, the Gulf Islands School Board had decided to put the question to Salt Spring residents in an effort to construct a new school in Ganges. The old school had been condemned by the fire marshal and criticized by various groups and individuals.

The planning director for the CRD was surprised when looking at the size of the islands in connection with the proposed development plans. He discovered that the area of Salt Spring Island was greater than all seven of the municipalities of the CRD put together.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

B.C. Tel raised its rates. The telephone for individual line residential use went to \$4.10 from \$3.85 while a two-party line jumped to \$3.20 from \$3. The largest hike came for business service which went to \$7.60 from \$6.75.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

Driftwood noted the passing of pioneer resident Lona Garner at

the age of 77 years. She died in Vancouver on November 4 and was survived by husband Olan, nine of her 10 children as well as more than 50 grandchildren and several great-grandchildren.

The Islands Farmers Institute met to discuss the changes in ferry fares. The group decided to send a letter to the B.C. Toll Authority asking for a reduction in the G.V.W. to 6,000 pounds and a resulting decrease in fares for such vehicles of 60 cents per trip.

A prankster on Hallowe'en turned off the water in a local bakery but the joke became a good deed. The next morning while the baker was seeking the cause of lack of water, a storm knocked out the electrical power. Had he not stopped to seek water, at least 500 loaves of bread would have been in the electric oven and probably would have been ruined.

The Lions Club talent night drew a large crowd to Mahon Hall on Salt Spring. The audience came to cheer their favourite acts which were judged by an applause meter. The acts ranged from a trio of dancing scarecrows through a one-man band to four local yokels doing a hillbilly skit.

The Cy Peck and the Motor Princess plied the route between Swartz Bay and Fulford while the regular vessel, the Delta Princess was in Tsawwassen for refurbishing.

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Good news for beer drinkers

Inflation often defies the maxim "What goes up must come down" but for beer drinkers, good news: the price is coming down.

Carling O'Keefe Breweries announced a reduction of 50 cents per dozen in the price of two of the company's regular lines of brew.

The sad side of the good news is that the price reduction doesn't come into effect until early December.

Consumer and Corporate Affairs Minister Peter Hyndman

said the lowering of price comes about because of the deregulation policy of the Victoria government.

That policy allows breweries to set their own prices based on the competition with other breweries on a monthly basis.

To keep consumers posted to the price, the ministry will place posters noting the price changes in each retail liquor store. "The Beer Watch" will give buyers of beer up-to-the-minute information on the prices, said Hyndman.

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Smith expresses surprise over use of letter in advertisement

In an advertisement last week the Sewer Alternatives Committee used excerpts from a letter from Social Credit Party president Bernie Smith.

He was contacted by *Driftwood* and expressed surprise that what he considered private correspondence with Betty Delmonico would be used in such a manner.

Smith said Delmonico had tried to get in touch with him before the ad appeared but was unable to do so. The full text of the letter follows:

Mrs. Betty Delmonico,
Ganges, B.C.
Dear Mrs. Delmonico,

Once again, thank you for the wealth of information you have sent me. We

are building a rather large file on the issue.

I was much interested in the copy of a *CJVI* editorial, dated October 2, 1981 and signed by Mayor Mel Couvelier. He put some areas of my thoughts in a most clear position.

Also, the article "Salt Spring simmers in Sewer Stew" was most informative. It will be most interesting to see how Frank Richards does against Mrs. Valcourt. The results of that election will be a vote of confidence for, or against the issue.

Mrs. Delmonico, as I sit here some miles away from the issue, I can clearly see both sides of the issue, and I can muster support for both sides. I can also see the position a local or Provincial government can find itself in with such an issue.

I feel that those who are opposing the sewer are against growth, while those for are supporting growth of the community. I can see both sides of the coin and have sympathy for both sides. If I lived in the area, I may share the philosophies of those who approve the sewer, I don't really know.

With a situation such as we have on Ganges, your provincial government made a decision, be it right or wrong. Right or wrong, depending upon which side of the issue you support. In short,

either side would be the wrong side.

Your provincial government did use the areas at their disposal, legal areas within the framework of our laws. You cannot, in my opinion, fault them for that. You must, on the other hand, be honest and say, they did make a decision, even if it does not share your philosophies.

While I recognize you believe your MLA is wrong, his position will be up to you and the people of B.C. in the next election. He has taken a stand in a very controversial issue and for that he must gain some support.

Other politicians, with other philosophies, would no doubt have procrastinated over the entire issue. I would hope that the people of the area are not electing their local and provincial government on a one-issue stand.

I have tried to phone you several times but to no avail. I know that I have not given you that which you so strongly desire, but I have tried. I trust that you will understand my humble position.

Board to call for bids
