Local students do well in assessment of math skills

Students of Gulf Islands schools rate favourably in mathematics with pupils in the whole of British Columbia and in some cases show achievement above the mark of the rest.

The ministry of education recently measured the math abilities of B.C. students through the efforts of a University of British Columbia research team.

Children in Grades 4, 8 and 12 were tested in five areas of math ability and teachers of mathematics were surveyed for attitudes towards the subjects.

Gulf Island students in Grade 4 were found to be above the provincial mark in each area except computer literacy.

The Grade 8 students met the provincial norms but showed better than average ability in computer literacy. By Grade 12, the local pupils were consistently above the provincial standard.

WEAKNESS IN METRIC

The one area where all students, both local and provincial, showed weakness was in their abilities to "think metric."

The seven-man committee studying the results of the Gulf Island testing, under the chairmanship of supervisor of education Larry Holbrook, offered recommendations for improvement of math skills.

The local committee felt that the curriculum as set by the ministry of education was being followed with reasonable closeness but should be paced throughout the grade years more evenly.

The local students would, with a more even curriculum, be able to acquire better understanding and dexterity with the math functions if such were the case, the committee felt.

SOME FALL BEHIND

Another related area involved the teaching of theory before the teaching of mechanical application. The committee concluded that some children fall behind when faced with the theory of math.

Such children do well with the "how to do it" part of the course but become bogged down when faced with having to explain the

methods.

The committee would like to see a happy medium struck between the emphasis on both aspects of math teaching.

The third area which could cause problems in teaching math to Gulf Islands students was the textbooks. While the basic curriculum is set by the ministry, three texts are available to teachers.

The committee suggests a closer correlation of the basic program with the books available as teaching aids. Cross referencing of the texts available as well as supplementary materials for backup would help the teachers follow the ministry guidelines more closely and in a better manner.

HAVEN'T THE TRAINING

Findings from the province-wide study showed that a number of teachers of mathematics have not the academic or professional training to do an adequate job.

The UBC team recommends that math teachers be specialists and that only those persons so

qualified be hired to teach the subject.

The team also concluded "that the major goal of mathematics education in B.C. should be to prepare students to function as enlightened consumers in a technological society."

The study also revealed that teachers agree secondary school students should be permitted to use calculators in school.

The report recommended that the ministry set up a committee to study the advisability of calculator and computer use by students with the possibility of allowing them for elementary students as well.

DISPARITY BETWEEN SEXES

A worry of the researchers was the seeming disparity between male and female students in math achievement. As with the study conducted in 1977, this study revealed the gap is minimal in Grade 4 but widens to a substantial degree by Grade 12.

Comparisons between the 1977 study and the more recent one prompted the researchers to conclude, "These results are

encouraging, indicating as they do that gains in achievement are being made."

Holbrook indicated a similar conclusion could be drawn for Gulf Islands students. "One thing we have learned is that students of this district do pretty well in math."

The information gathered from this assessment will be used to review the basic curriculum beginning in September, 1982. The next provincial assessment of math skills is scheduled for 1985.

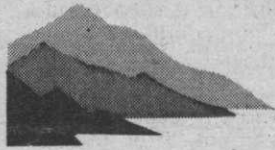

Downed power lines a hazard

The hazard created by power lines downed in windstorms is greatly increased when people try to move the lines themselves instead of allowing B.C. Hydro linemen to handle the problem.

During recent storms, B.C. Hydro crews appreciated information from the public about downed or damaged power lines but were concerned when some people attempted to free branches from the lines or move downed wires. In one incident a man actually coiled a fallen wire.

"The public can't tell if the wire is a high-voltage line or not and electrocution can occur even if a branch hanging on a power line is touched," says Art Deptford, B.C. Hydro's manager of safety engineering.

Anyone seeing a downed line should warn others to stay clear and call B.C. Hydro immediately.

In addition to the problems caused by storms, amateur woodsmen in B.C. are creating a

serious hazard when they fall trees near power lines, Hydro says.

Recently, one "Sunday logger" in the Quesnel area risked electrocution when he felled a tree over a power line and tried to cut it free with a chain saw. He received an electric shock but was not injured.

In past incidents, tree fallers have been injured and power outages have affected large numbers of customers.

Sunday loggers are usually taking down unwanted trees on their own property, and either fail to consider the proximity of power lines or feel competent to do the job safely.

B.C. Hydro will provide professional assistance to anyone wishing to fall a tree near a power line — normally at no charge.

"For their own safety, we ask people not to take down trees around power lines by themselves," advised Deptford.

If an owner wishes to take down a healthy tree near a power line, B.C. Hydro will provide a lineman to stand by if reasonable notice is given. There will be no charge during normal working hours, but a charge will be made if this service is required outside regular hours.

If a tree is felled through a power line with no lineman standing by, full cost of repairs will be charged.

Disposal of felled trees is the responsibility of owners.

The policies apply to trees near the wires between B.C. Hydro's poles and a customer's house as well as to the lines on roads, streets and lanes.

First Free Press reported loss of San Juans

It was November, 1872 and the new *Manitoba Free Press* made its first appearance on the streets. The west had arrived and here was a western voice to prove it. And that western voice was destined to become a highly respected organ of opinion for a century and more. It was also destined to enjoy the guidance of one of Canada's great newspapermen, John W. Dufoc, after the turn of the century, and under its later name of the *Winnipeg Free Press*.

The initial issue of the new *Free Press* announced its proud slogan to a village in Manitoba, "Freedom in Trade — Liberty in Religion — Equality in Civil Rights".

In November, 1872, the *Winnipeg Free Press* marked its 100th birthday with a special anniversary edition, looking down the century of history. The original No. 1 was included as an eight-page section among the 56 pages of the issue.

A reader on Salt Spring Island has sent us a copy of the historic edition.

First *Free Press* to hit the Manitoba streets devoted its entire front page to a presentation of the Dominion Lands Act, explaining the manner in which Manitoba lands might be subdivided and acquired.

TWO TONS A MILLION

The first issue of the *Free Press* offered information which is far from true today. "A million dollars in gold weighs two tons". Two tons of gold is worth rather more on today's market.

It was not a newsy publication. The front page carried the act of parliament and Page Three was devoted to a fictional story about some unfortunate youngish woman crossed in love and there were fillers from everywhere.

Very intellectual women, announced the brave publisher, are seldom beautiful. He admitted that there were exceptions and proceeded to list a number of them.

Miss Landon was beautiful and she was smart. Her forehead was not masculine, it was exceedingly feminine and pretty, stated the analysis.

Mrs. Stanton was, likewise, a handsome woman, but Miss Anthony and Mrs. Livermore were both plain.

The most interesting news report comes from Boston, via New York. There was a fire in the upper storey of a granite building. The building was high and the fire was inaccessible. The fire engines were extensively delayed because of the "horse sickness" and they had to be drawn by the firemen.

A wind arose and the fire

Hope, on the Fraser River and diamond fields had been discovered in south-western Colorado and Arizona.

The *Free Press* was in there, pitching and didn't the Women's Libbers know it! The column, "Woman's Rights" included its slogan, "Virtue, Wit and Beauty still their charms bestow".

In London, you needed both rank and money to succeed in society. This was part of Women's Rights. It also announced that the habit of breakfasts was growing. A breakfast was an "al fresco" afternoon party.

Three hundred young Russian women were claiming admittance to the medical school at St. Petersburg, it was reported, although there was room for only 70 of them.

Of world news there were clippings.

The French National Assembly had elected President M. Creevy by a vote of 462 to 43. Germany had issued a ministerial decree forbidding railways to offer assisted passage to the seaports for would-be emigrants. If anyone wanted out he would have to find the money to get to a ship. Mexico had written of its plans to put an end to cattle stealing and the Russian foreign office was about to conclude treaties with Khokan, Bokara and Kashgar in respect of commerce.

After two years of unnecessary delay the question of the North-West Council had come up for discussion by Ottawa.

Mr. Richardson, geological surveyor, had pronounced Vancouver Island the "England of the Pacific" so far as coal measures were concerned. A dreadful famine was reported among the people of Korea.

SAN JUANS LOST

The decision of the Emperor William in the matter of the San Juan boundary question has been received with the greatest dissatisfaction by both the British and Canadian press and people. In the case of the former, the annoyance is caused from the conviction that Britain is becoming incompetent under the

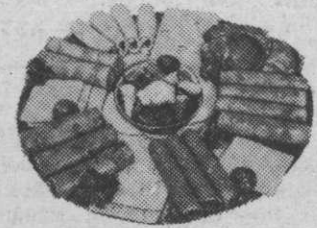

John Crawford tells farmers about bees

John Crawford, known affectionately on the Pender Islands as Pooh-Bear, gave a talk illustrated with slides on his bee-keeping operation at the Farmers' Institute meeting December 8. Forty members were present.

Crawford gave up a job in the field of high technology in 1976 to become a farmer. He bought a quarter section of land in the Peace River country just over the B.C. border into Alberta.

This area is one of the most productive in the world for honey, so he decided to go into bee-keeping. Since he already had a home established on Pender he decided to combine living in the two areas with his bee-keeping operation.

Around the beginning of May each year he packs up and with his dog takes off for his land in the north country, after spending the winter on Pender. With him in his truck is the nuclei for new bee production which has wintered on Pender.

His slides showed the audience a cycle of one year of his bee-keeping operation.

STRAW HIVES

Crawford explained that up to 100 years ago bees were simply kept in straw beehives, but at that time a big break-through occurred with the idea of putting them in boxes.

Crawford explained that the space between the shelves inside the box has to be exactly one-quarter of an inch; if more or less the bees won't fill it up. Today, bee-keeping is an exacting operation.

Most bee-keepers, especially those just starting an operation, order their queens from California through the mail. The advantage of Crawford's operation is that he brings the new, young queens from the north country to spend the winters on Pender.

During the mild winter weather here they can fly in and out of the hives gathering food and storing it for colder days.

There are not enough flowering bushes, trees, and plants on Pender for a bee-keeping operation of any size. In the Peace River country the months from May to September are ideal for the bees. There are long sunny days plus a large amount of food.

Much clover and rapeseed is grown on the land, there are a lot of wild flowers and the area abounds with fireweed which is wonderful food for bees.

TWO-QUEEN METHOD

Crawford uses a two-queen system, which is intensive. It was developed in the 1940's, so it is not new, but it's only recently come into vogue. He had 14 hives last season and with the two-queen system produced 23,000 lbs. of honey.

Each queen has a particular odour, so to introduce the new queens brought from Pender to the bees who winterized in the north, each queen is sprayed with a sugar syrup and terimycin mixture. The terimycin combats disease. After a couple of days the bee colony accepts the new queen.

It's 865 miles from Pender to Crawford's Peace River property, on which he grows mainly clover seed, partly to improve the soil and because the bees love clover. A river flows through his property and it is banked with willow trees, another good source of pollen.

When he arrives in early May with his young queens he finds his hives waiting for him just as he left them. They are wrapped with R-4 insulation and tarpaper. Thus the bees inside survive the winter.

He unwraps the hives and feeds them and gently introduces the new queens to them. In the two-queen method the queens are separated by a screen. In the bottom of the stack of boxes is the old queen.

By the end of May the weather gets very warm, the bees fly around gathering nectar and pollen from the willows and soon, the dandelions, flowering currant, skunk cabbage and other plants quickly burst into bloom.

BUSY SEEDING

Crawford is also busy at this time seeding his 160 acres with red clover and barley, alsac clover and sweet clover, which is all food for his bees. A lot of rape, "the Cinderella crop of the Prairies", is grown around his farm and the bees can use it too. Bears are around but Crawford's dog alerts him if they come near the property.

As the days are now very long and there is lots of vegetation the

bees work and produce much more honey than they need themselves.

Each box, weighing 40-50 lbs., is piled on top of each other to a height of 12 boxes. The storage starts at the top box and works downward. An incredible number of pounds per day is accumulated from July 1 to August 1.

When bees swarm it is because a new queen is taking off with a group of workers to start a new colony. Crawford cuts a little bit off one wing on his queens so they can't get away.

Drones are male bees and workers are female bees with undeveloped reproductive organs. The queen bee lays all the eggs in the hive. The queen has one stinger and it's only used on another queen. Only one queen lives in a hive and the old one must be removed before the new one is introduced.

After Labour Day the new queens are taken to Pender to winter, while the balance of the colonies are packed up and insulated against the winter cold to await the arrival of spring and Crawford's return.

TOOK A COURSE

Seven years ago Crawford took a night school course on bee-keeping and from that decided to change his lifestyle.

The bees develop their own queens by feeding a female bee royal jelly, which they secrete. If

the temperature goes below 50 degrees F. the bees won't go out of the hive.

Bee strains vary in disposition from very aggressive to mild tempered. The African gene has worked its way into the North

American genetic stock, and consequently there is a lot of interest in B.C. in raising our own queens instead of importing them from California.

The Pender Island climate produces extremely gentle bees.

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Winter Driving Warning

Snow Area Spot Checks

At this time of year and in areas subject to heavy snow conditions, you will see special signs requiring that **your vehicle have good winter-tread tires or carry chains** or, in some case, that **chains be mounted**. For your safety and that of other motorists, these signs are authorized by law.

During the next few weeks, random checks will be carried out by the RCMP in problem driving areas, more particularly the Hope-Princeton, the Squamish Highway to Whistler, the Fraser Canyon, but including other sections of road on Vancouver Island and the rest of the province subject to snow conditions. The operation will be in conjunction with the Attorney General's "CounterAttack" programme and other police traffic checks. **Drivers of vehicles not properly equipped may be turned back or charged.**

The Ministry of Transportation and Highways is doing its best to clear snow and maintain our roads in winter to make them safe. Before driving into snow areas, make sure you have good winter tires and are carrying chains to make your vehicle safe.

Be on the lookout for snow clearing and sanding equipment sometimes operating in conditions of limited visibility. **Their flashing amber lights are warning you to use extreme caution and slow down.** Make sure also that you observe special signing and directions of flagpersons if you should encounter them, **and please drive carefully.**

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

FIVE YEARS AGO

The government float, previously located at the wharf behind Mouat's Store, was moved to a new location inside the breakwater at Centennial Park. The relocation would help increase the amount of berthing space, said government officials. Bunk, was the literal translation of several Ganges residents.

The toll of dead sheep stood at six with a further six badly injured as a result of dogs running at large on Salt Spring and Pender Islands. A German shepherd attacked a flock on a Tripp Road farm and killed five while maiming five others. A prize Suffolk ram was included in the dead. The dog was shot when it returned to renew its attack on the flock. On Pender, a ewe was killed and a ram injured by a pack of several dogs. The strays were caught and taken to Sidney where they were destroyed.

A winter storm buffeted the islands disrupting ferry service, downing hydro and telephone lines as well as littering roads with tree branches and other debris. The high winds, 87 mph at Scott Point, forced the *Salt Spring Queen* to seek shelter in Ganges Harbour when she was unable to return to either Swartz Bay or Otter Bay. Various repair crews were called to the emergency and by the weekend had fixed most of the damage.

Santa Claus paused in his busy schedule to enjoy breakfast with a happy crowd of 100 youngsters of all ages. The event, at Harbour House, was highlighted by 54 choruses of *Jingle Bells*, the magic of a Vancouver magician, presents for the children and sausages and pancakes for all.

Modesty, perhaps, explained the absence of news concerning the Salt Spring Slugs. Not a jot, not a tittle about the local ice warriors.

TEN YEARS AGO

Voters voted and in the process elected four school trustees and two directors for the Capital Regional District but turned down three referenda. On Salt Spring Island, Dr. E.R. Dixon, Ione Guthrie and Charles Baltzer were chosen from a field of nine for the school board while Marc Holmes was re-elected to the CRD. Tom Davidson was successful in his bid for trustee from Saturna. Jim Campbell, after a recount, was declared elected to the CRD by a five-vote margin. The money votes for a new school in Ganges as well as classroom space for home economics and industrial arts, despite a majority, failed to receive the required 60% support.

A Red Cross blood donor clinic held in Ganges attracted 157 donors who pumped out 143 pints of blood.

Centennial Memo: France, The Sandwich Islands (Hawaii) and the United States all maintained consuls in Victoria in 1866.

Scrooge humbugged his way into the hearts of Gulf Islanders, courtesy of Alf Howell, as the main course in a feast called *Christmas Madness*, a potpourri of skits and music. The Salt Spring Players entertained theatre-goers with three performances fit for the season.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Electors in the Gulf Islands turned down three referenda asking for improvements in local schools. Donald New was selected as the school trustee for Galiano Island.

At the behest of the department of highways, the Gulf Islands School Board decided to part with a 15-foot strip of property along

Rainbow Road on Salt Spring to facilitate the widening of Rainbow Road.

While the matter did not become one of "Yankee go home", the joint meeting of Gulf Islands Chambers of Commerce decided to send a letter to Ottawa protesting the disparity in rules between visiting American sports fishermen who could wet as many lines as they chose and the restrictions on Canadians visiting American waters.

The Centennial project on Saturna Island which would have seen school children journey to Ottawa was jolted by a letter from the provincial minister of education. The minister pointed out that the school district would be liable for the well-being and safety of the children. The school on Saturna would have to remain open if some parents decided not to send their children on the excursion.

TWENTY YEARS AGO

The B.C. Toll Authority decided that trucks and other vehicles weighing less than 6,000 lbs. G.V.W. should pay the same ferry fare as passenger cars. The trucks had been scheduled to pay \$1.80 for vehicle and driver but a protest from the Farmers' Institute and the Chamber of Commerce was successful in lowering the tariff to \$1 if commuter tickets were to be purchased.

Sheep in the Scott Point area of Salt Spring were being harassed by dogs running loose. Dog owners

were reminded that the animals could be shot for such activity especially since several sheep had been killed by stray dogs.

The debate on the use of Long Harbour for a ferry terminal continued on Salt Spring Island.

Slugs? None had heard of or from them two decades ago.

The Board of School Trustees of School District No. 64 (Gulf Islands) proposes borrowing money at any time or from time to time within two (2) years from December 31, 1980, by the issue and sale of debentures bearing interest at a rate or rates per annum as may be specified by the British Columbia School Districts Capital Financing Authority at the time of the borrowing and payable over a period or periods not exceeding twenty-five years from the date or respective dates thereof, in such principal amounts as the Board may from time to time deem necessary to raise net sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$214,340.00, after payment of discount, commission, brokerage, exchange, and other expenses with respect to such issue or sale, for acquiring and developing school sites and purchasing, constructing, reconstructing, furnishing, and equipping buildings for school purposes or use in connection therewith and other capital expenditures for school purposes.
