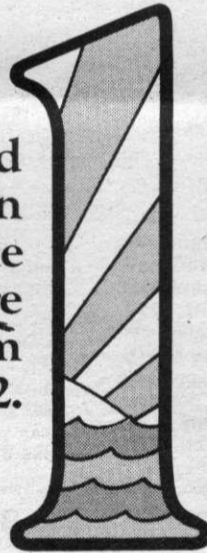

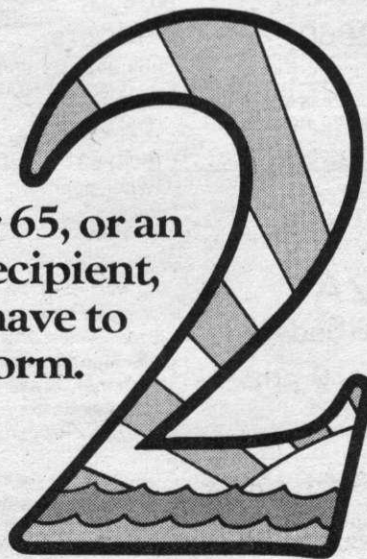
You can be reimbursed 80% of your prescription expenses over \$100 if you file a Universal Pharmacare Claim Form by March 31st, 1982.



All individuals or families registered with the Medical Services Plan of British Columbia are eligible to claim an 80% refund on expenses for insured benefits over \$100 spent between January 1st, 1981 and December 31st, 1981. Benefits of the Pharmacare plan include most drug prescriptions, ostomy supplies, designated permanent prosthetic appliances, and syringes for diabetics. Over-the-counter drugs cannot be included.

To claim for your reimbursement, total your official Pharmacare receipts for prescribed benefits as listed above: if they add up to over \$100 for you and your dependents, you should file a claim. Claim Forms are available at your pharmacy. Fill out a Claim Form, attach the receipts in the spaces provided, and mail.

If you are over 65, or an income assistance recipient, you do not have to submit a claim form.



You are already receiving fully-paid benefits. Tourists, transients and visitors to British Columbia are not eligible to claim; neither are people receiving fully-paid drug and medical benefits from a union or employer-sponsored plan, or from D.V.A., D.I.A., Workers' Compensation or Home Care.

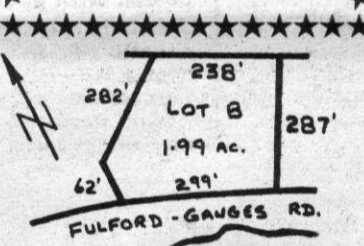

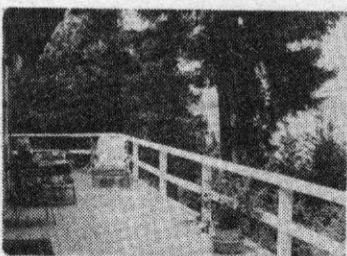

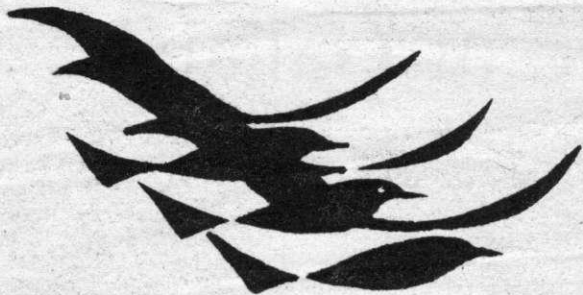

The night sky is particularly interesting just now. All nine planets will be on the same side of

the sun on March 10 and within an arc of 95 degrees, the narrowest to occur in the 20th century. Three of the brightest, Mars, Saturn and Jupiter, are contained within the boundaries of the constellation Virgo by 11 pm. Such an unusual occurrence may have accounted for the appearance of the Star of Bethlehem nearly 2,000 years ago.

NATURE NOTES

Many birds are claiming territory with their songs

The stuttering whistle of a bald eagle, the bubbling cadence of a wren, the "whip-three-beers!" of an olive-sided flycatcher and the carolling of a robin are some of the bird songs which are commonly heard on Salt Spring Island.

These are not the only sounds these particular birds utter, but in establishing or declaring territory, these songs are significant.

Many birds have developed a vocal signal which says, "this is my turf" or "this territory is claimed". Such signalling is done by the male and part of its message may be to assure the female that a range or territory has been claimed and nesting may be successful.

Those of us who enjoy the song of birds are tempted to consider the bird to be "happy" because it is making such pleasant sounds. Birds may be "happy" and may create noises which reflect their joy, but the declaration songs are very serious indeed.

HEARD IN SPRING

Songs which declare territory are heard in the spring before nesting and are often continued until the last nestlings of the year are about to leave the nest. Many song birds in mild climates raise two or more broods in a season. Thus, the "I declare" songs are heard throughout the summer.

Other birds, bald eagles, for example, restrict their nuptial displays to spring.

Woodpeckers and the ruffed grouse employ mechanical sounds to announce their claim to nesting areas. The woodpeckers beat on a resonant limb or tree trunk in a particular rhythm. Ruffed grouse create a deep accelerating drumming with their wings. Noises to say, "This space is mine!"

The songs of birds are generally specific to the species. One can recognize the carolling of a robin because it sounds very much like the carolling of every other robin. This similarity applies to the cry of the pileated woodpecker or the bell-like calling of the saw-whet owl.

Sailboat hit twice by fire

A commercial troller that caught fire off Isabella Point Sunday caught fire again two days later in Fulford Harbour.

The *Lady Cottonwood*, registered in Victoria, was reported on fire Sunday afternoon. The ferry *Queen of the Islands* went to her assistance, dousing the flames with fire hoses.

No injuries were reported and the sole occupant apparently jumped overboard and swam to shore. RCMP are continuing the search for that person.

The vessel, a fishing boat with a sailboat hull, was towed into Fulford Harbour by the Coast Guard and tied up at the wharf. On Tuesday morning fire again broke out.

The second fire was suspected to have begun from a hot spot on the transom and causes of both blazes are under investigation. Firefighters had to pump the burned hulk to keep it afloat.

No estimate of damage had been made by Tuesday afternoon.

INDIVIDUAL QUALITY

Birds do, however, have a very individual quality to their songs. Young males seem to practise for some weeks until they learn the appropriate pitch and cadence.

Some birds have a decided geographic accent to their songs. The white-crowned sparrow always sounds like a white-crowned, but those in some regions may add a note or two or change the inflection or even drawl a bit.

Such accents are not apparent unless one listens to the songs of the same kind of bird in a variety of geographic regions. There is a difference between the song of a white-crowned on Salt Spring and that of the white-crowned sparrows that sing near Banff.

Learning to identify bird songs can add a great deal to the fun of birding. Such learning is aided by listening to any of the excellent recordings of bird songs presently available. Taking time to locate the

singing bird and to positively relate the particular sound to that bird in the field is the best way to learn who is singing what.

TAKES TIME

This procedure takes time because of the large number of singing birds we are blessed with. It is also difficult to remember the sounds after only one or two sessions.

It helps to develop your own little song to help fix a memory of the sounds. A lisping "chick-a-dee-zuk" for the chestnut-backed chickadee or "whip-three-beers!" clearly whistled by the olive-sided flycatcher.

There are also sound comparisons to help us remember certain bird songs. The "yank yank yank" of the red-breasted nuthatch resembles the tooting of a child's tin horn. There is a strange bell-like quality to the raven's "klo-klonk klo-klonk".

The ringing monotone trill of

the junco has its counterpart in the buzzy insect-like trill of the chipping sparrow. The Steller's Jay is often seen after we hear its mechanical "shack shack shack".

And in the evening, sometimes

as a background to the nighthawk's nasal "peent peent", may be heard the lovely song of Swainson's thrush spiralling up the scale in a beautiful flute-like benediction.

The Log of the Ark by Kenneth Walker and Geoffrey Boumphrey. Penguin Books Canada Ltd., 1979.

With all the rain we've been having lately, perhaps you've been wondering what it would be like to live on an ark. Well, this week's book, *The Log of the Ark*, is an exercise in imagining just that.

Difficult as it was to build the Ark, Noah's problems were just beginning when the long line of animals wound its way on board. First of all the large animals were lodged at one end which meant that the other end pointed to the sky and the Ark wouldn't float; then when the Hippopotamus and his wife got into the bath together they swamped the Water Rat; the Elephant kept losing her head and trampling on things; and the light from the Luminous Puffins kept all the other birds awake at night.

But these problems and others were quickly sorted out with the help of Japhet and his natural history books. Not so easily dismissed was the discord sown by that most evil of all beasts, the Scub. With his sly smile and too-

polite manner, he introduces fear and distrust among the animals.

The Tigers and Lions, Wolves and Foxes hold themselves apart and the shy smaller animals become uncomfortably aware of being watched.

Each animal takes on a distinctive character from the wise old Marabou Stork, to the taciturn Black Bear, the timid Elephant, the complaining Camel, and the not-very-bright Kangaroo. Bumptious or shy, large or small, we come to understand each animal through its natural interaction with the others.

In this small enclosed animal community we can see many parallels with human communities. Unfortunately good does not triumph in this unique little book and, despite the success of the voyage and the delightful humour of the dialogue, the ending is not altogether a happy one.

The book has action, suspense, and variety enough for any reader, and for children who enjoy stories about jungle animals it is a must. *The Log of the Ark* came to be written when a small girl asked

Kenneth Walker to persuade Kenneth Grahame to write a book about jungle animals.

The author of *Wind in the Willows* responded, "I've never been inside a jungle, you have, so why not write it yourself."

Kenneth Walker, with the help of Geoffrey Boumphrey, did just that and did it very well. He has a precise command of the English language and is never condescending. This is something which cannot be said of all writers of adult books who turn their hand to writing for children.

The chapters are not too long and the book lends itself to being read aloud. It can be a rewarding experience for parents and children alike to spend a rainy afternoon sharing *The Log of the Ark*.

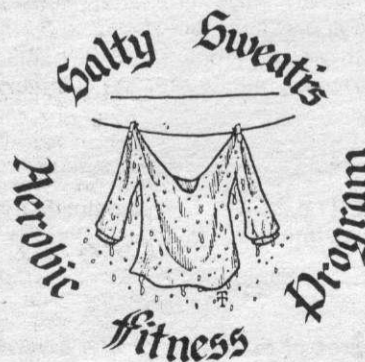

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

TWENTY YEARS AGO

Driftwood reported the after-effects of a snowfall estimated at 21 inches. The snow played havoc with traffic on Salt Spring Island with a number of cars reported in the ditches.

The Gulf Islands Commuter Association complained to the provincial government about ferry service from the mainland to the Gulf Islands. The group, composed of commuters who work on the lower mainland but live in the islands, was concerned about the five-hour trip to get home. They were forced to go from Tsawwassen to Swartz Bay then transfer to a local ferry. A ferry which left Tsawwassen bound for the islands had been taken out of service.

The Grand Order of Salt Spring Island Pythonesses unanimously endorsed a resolution calling on the Gulf Islands School district to ensure the complete education of children. The group was concerned that parents weren't spending sufficient time on social activities and wanted the school board to teach such courses as home economics for boys to ensure that they do not suffer the fate of having to eat canned beans while their wives attend club meetings. Sex education and liquor drinking were also urged on the school board. As one member observed, "If they can't handle their liquor, what's the use?"

Bishop Robert Seaborn, Bishop of Newfoundland, visited Salt Spring Island to renew acquaintances made when he was war-time padre of the Canadian Scottish.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Gulf Islanders were preparing to fight a proposal which would link them in a regional district centred in Duncan. The protesters, including the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce and the Gulf Islands hospital trustees, wanted either a separate Gulf Islands district or a set-up with the Saanich Peninsula.

A case of infectious hepatitis was reported in Ganges. Health officials declined comment on the case, quoting from department policy of not releasing information on communicable diseases. The officials did confirm that hepatitis can occur in areas where inadequate sewage disposal is prevalent.

The Gulf Islands were to be part of the phase-in area for a new provincial law aimed at curbing drinking drivers. Police could suspend a driver's licence at roadside if they thought such action necessary.

A scholarship available to a student entering the first year of university was created by the Saanich Peninsula Credit Union.

The student must be a member or be part of a family with membership in the credit union. The prize of \$250 would help cover tuition costs for the first year of higher education.

The Salt Spring Ambulance Society offered a lure for membership with a \$2 fee for the remainder of the fiscal year. Memberships would expire at the end of June and the current fee of \$4 would be raised to \$5. The reduced rate was hoped to attract more people to join the service.

Herb Capozzi, a mainland MLA, complained that he had not enjoyed apple pie in British Columbia. He was challenged by the Salt Spring Lions Club to come to the island and taste the pie sold by a local restaurant.

TEN YEARS AGO

The summer ferry schedule was announced and islanders could look forward to three sailings per day on Fridays and Sundays. The two sailings a day during the week were unchanged.

The power failures on Galiano were finally repaired and seven Hydro trucks lined up for the ferry at Montague Harbour. The ferry could only carry five of the trucks and a second trip was needed to take care of all.

The Galiano Chamber of Commerce was still named that after the annual general meeting decided to leave the renaming of the group to the incoming executive. A year of activity on the island was outlined in various reports but lack of nominations for president or vice-president slowed things down.

The Salt Spring Island Planning Association planned a public meeting to discuss planning options for the island. The Capital Regional District board of directors were to discuss various proposals for planning on the island at an upcoming meeting.

FIVE YEARS AGO

Fire destroyed a landmark on Galiano when a house on Baines Bay burned. The structure had been built 60 years previously and fire consumed the shake house so quickly volunteer firefighters couldn't save anything. No one was hurt in the incident.

A stray dog killed at least four sheep on a Salt Spring farm and four lambs are missing. The sheep were in a fenced field and the dog got to them. The dog was shot by the farmer.

The Gulf Islands could be paying twice for planning. The Capital Regional District charged islanders two mills for planning and with the change to having planning come under the Islands Trust, local taxpayers could also be paying 1½ mills for Trust planning.

The Fulford petroglyph was to be returned to the Fulford Harbour location at which it was found. Petroglyphs, rock carvings by native people, are protected by the Archaeological Sites Protection Act which states that the carvings must be left where they are found.

The Ganges Plan was ready for approval but the department of highways would not disclose which route a proposed bypass would take.

Herring ran in the waters of the Gulf Islands and fishermen took an estimated 300 tons. The fleet had moved on by week's end looking for other grounds to catch more of the little fish.

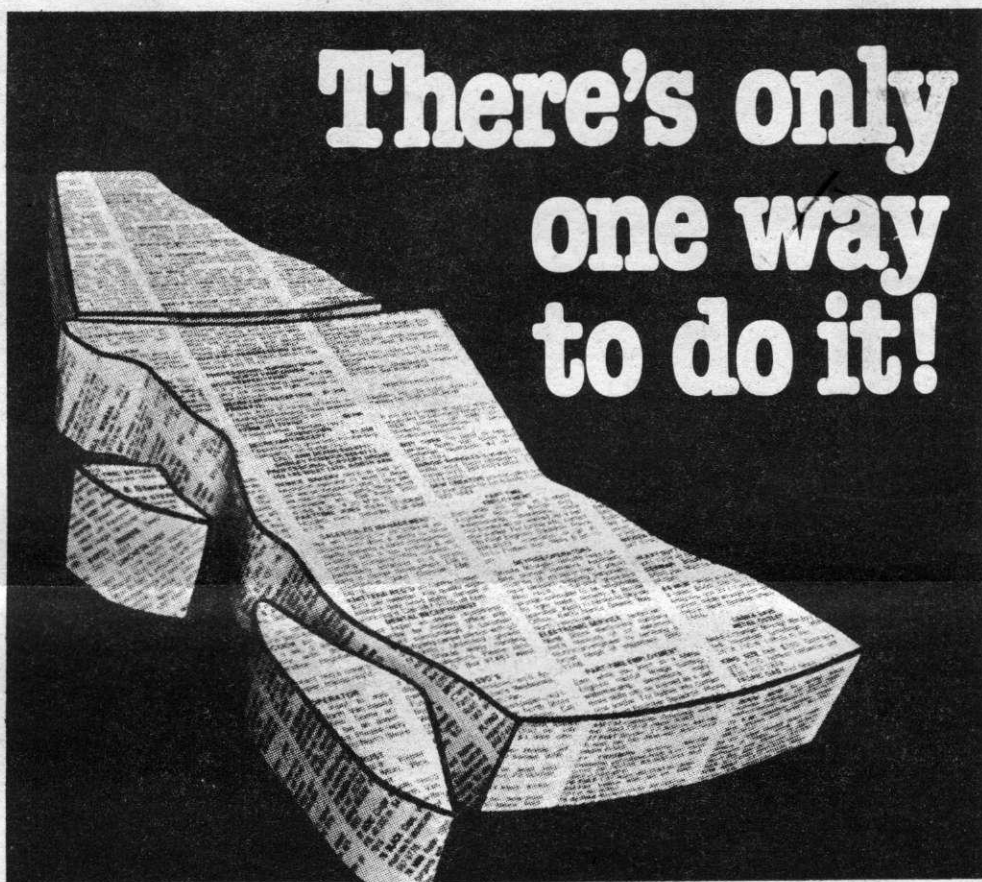

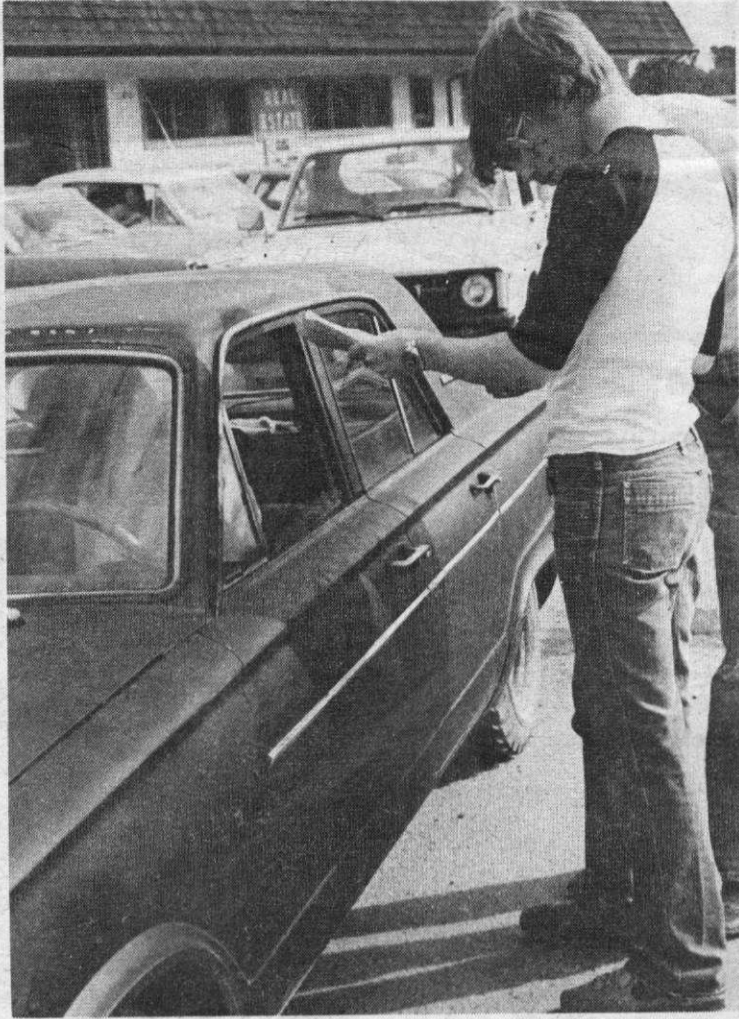

To rerun rally Friday

Centennial Park last Friday resembled a crowd scene at the best of the tourist season as cars parked where there was space and people milled about.

The event was the start of a mystery-route car rally staged by the graduation class at Gulf Islands Secondary School. Entrants were to follow a 25-mile course around Salt Spring and receive mystery clues at various

check points.

But things didn't work out that way and organizers, wanting to be fair to all entrants, decided to restage the rally this week.

Interest has picked up, said student organizer David Dahlgren, and the original 30 entrants will be joined by others seeking a chance to win the Ganges RCMP rally trophy. Other prizes have been, or will be, donated by local businesses.

Validity of elections called into question

The election of directors for the Salt Spring Island Planning Association has been called into question.

Ray Hill, elected to a two-year term at the recent annual meeting, sent a letter to the group outlining several concerns he has about the validity of the meeting and the elections.

Geoff Gay, who acted as chairman for the meeting, said, "As far as I'm concerned the elections stand."

Hill said "the meeting was invalid because there was no quorum, and a quorum would certainly be necessary to appoint new directors."

At the meeting, Mike Clement explained the situation to those in attendance and said the required number of directors had been present but that one had left. The people agreed, as did the directors present, that appointing two interim directors would satisfy the spirit of the rules.

HELD TOO LATE

Hill continued in the letter, "Secondly, the annual general meeting, according to the constitution, should have been held in February, so in a sense the association had already expired."

The meeting was held on March 1.

Gay said the conduct of the meeting and the election of directors met the spirit of the constitution and that seemed to be the way in which most unofficial associations are run.

The letter from Hill pointed out, "However, the circumstances surrounding Monday's meeting were anything but normal — so abnormal, in fact, that Sue Ramsey registered a protest against the proceedings..."

Ramsey protested against the fact that the meeting did not start until at least a half-hour after the 8 pm advertised beginning. She said

she was not protesting the elections, just the late start.

Hill outlined several courses of action which could be taken.

DECLARE IT INVALID

"You should declare the March 1st meeting and election invalid and should make one more well advertised attempt to call an annual general meeting, because a quorum of last year's members is quite possible.

"Failing to get a quorum, you should declare the Planning Association dissolved, form a new Planning Association on the spot and elect 14 new directors."

The proposals will be presented to a meeting of the directors by either Gay or Hill. The meeting takes place in the library of the Salt Spring Elementary School on March 10 at 8 pm.

Landmark is gone

A Ganges landmark — er, watermark — disappeared last week.

Driftwood Lake, which had become so well known as to be charted on the map of Ganges published in the Lions Club telephone directory, has been filled in.

The large body of water adjacent to Rainbow Road in front of the Driftwood office was filled with gravel by highways crews.

Budget faces bigger cut

For 1983, school budgets will be held to a 12% increase for instructional units costs and a further 12% increase in the amount needed locally in excess of the basic education program allotted by the ministry.

Instructional unit value is defined as the cost of one teacher, wages and necessary supplies for a class. The number of instructional units is multiplied by the unit value to arrive at the basic educational program costs.

CONTROLS WAGES

A second part of the government restraint guidelines involves wages for all public employees. The wages are controlled for the next two years.

For school board employees, teachers and support staff, the wage restraints come into effect at the end of the current contract period.

Any increase will be limited to 10% with a plus or minus two per cent margin dependent upon past

compensation, experience or historical relations. A further two percent will be allowed for productivity increases and skill shortages.

For the second year of the program, any wage increases will be held to the rate of inflation as determined by cost of living increases.

The government also promised policies which would limit any tax increases for homeowners.

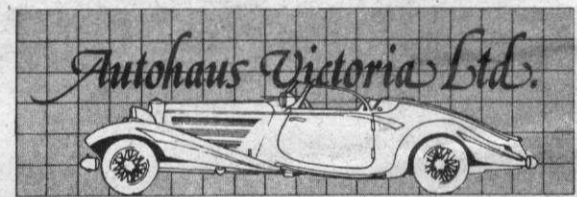
