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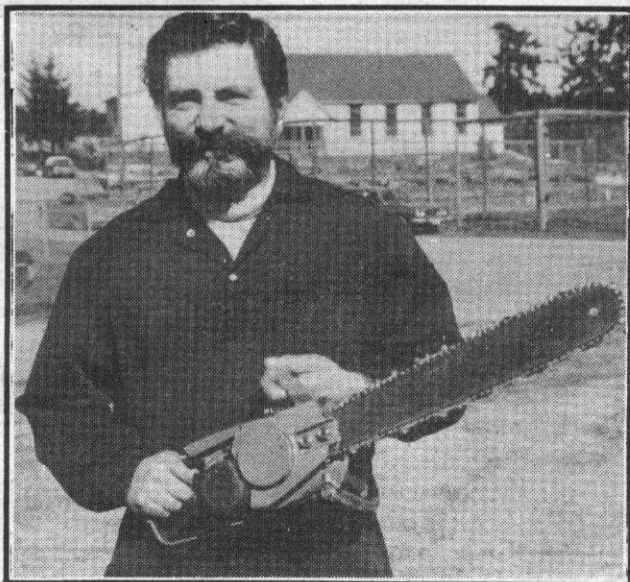
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EDUCATION... UNDER ATTACK

The British Columbia School Trustees Association is the organization of locally elected trustees who are responsible for education in all communities of this province. The BCSTA has issued the following statement in response to the Public Sector Restraint Programme.

"The B.C. School Trustees Association recognizes the difficult economic situation in the province.

"The government of British Columbia has attempted to deal with this situation by imposing an 'Economic Stabilization Program'.

"The discrepancy between the government's stated objectives and the implementation of the program creates many serious problems, including the following:

"(1) The most fundamental elements of our system of government are in jeopardy. The 75 budget by-laws, properly adopted by 75 elected school boards, are currently being violated without the authority of law.

"(2) The application of the 12 per cent guideline to budgets requires clear regulations which have not been written.

"(3) The absence of legislation has created an environment which permits bureaucratic and political patronage. Boards are not being treated equitably.

"(4) Boards have been informed that legislation will be introduced which will change the *revenue side of their budgets*. They have been asked to redraft budgets in the absence of, or without knowledge of, promised legislation.

"The BCSTA requests that the government of British Columbia:

"(a) immediately plan a restraint program which will achieve the desired tax savings without incurring the huge social and economic costs of the program currently proposed.

"(b) adhere to our system of government and support their stated policy with the appropriate laws. This would eliminate the unlawful requirements now being placed on school boards to amend their budget by-laws until such time as the appropriate provincial laws are in place."

Support your locally elected Trustees.

Help them defend their budget of February 15.

Help them protect the programs and priorities they have established to meet the diverse needs of the children of our community. Speak to your Trustee to find out what you can do to help.

Renewal deadline March 31

Old Age Security pensioners who also receive the guaranteed income supplement have until the end of March to renew their applications.

Pensioners had been sent the renewal forms in January but Health and Welfare Canada recently noted that more than 35,000 had not sent the forms back.

With the new payment year beginning in April, pensioners must register before that time in

order to have the supplement included in their cheques.

"In order to qualify, they are required to report their 1981 income even if it is nil," said an Old Age Security official.

"Pensioners who had bank or bond interest, investments, superannuation or other such income must report it on their applications and send in T4's, T5's and such if they have them," he said.

Watch for girdling of roots in potted plants

My mind has a mind of its own. Sometimes, usually when I need it most, it leaves for parts unknown without telling me. And there I am, none the wiser, until it comes back to me.

It happened again the other day at Foxglove. A lady came in with some twigs of a sick spruce. We talked about aphids and spider mites and what to do about them. And we also looked for signs of scale but none of the usual symptoms were obvious. Then we wondered if it could be lack of moisture in its container last summer.

This should have rung the alarm bells loud and clear, but alas, I had lost my mind somewhere in among the aphids, the spider mites and scale. Sometime later, after the lady had left, my mind returned and rang the alarm bells.

You see, many plants, especially the drought-resistant ones, send out great, long roots in search of moisture and nourishment. If they happen to be in a pot or container there is nowhere to go except round and round and around again.

CALLED 'GIRDLING'

This is called "girdling" and the plant eventually chokes itself. If there is a lack of moisture the plant will re-double its efforts and use up its substance to send its roots farther and farther for the life-

sustaining moisture. Even burlap bags in the ground can present the same problems.

For ease of shipping, handling and storing in garden centres, burlap bags are now treated to resist deterioration. This confines the roots as effectively as a pot or container.

So to avoid loss of plants, shrubs or trees we must check at least once a year for "girdling" in potted plants. If girdling is evident the encircling root must be unwound and cut off. If this proves impossible the root mass should be slashed on the outside and most of the encircling roots removed.

TEASE IT LOOSE

With a slender, pointed stick, the central root ball can then be gently teased loose. Moisten the root ball periodically during this operation to keep it moist. Roots can then be spread out gently and the plant repotted with fresh soil.

Balled and burlapped stock or potted stock should be treated in the same manner before planting. It is essential that the strings

holding the burlap together be cut and removed. It is best to remove all the burlap as well to inspect and tend to the roots as described, if necessary.

Another case of temporary absence of my cogitative faculties occurred when talking to a gentleman and his problem of planting a slope consisting of rubble and pitiful soil.

Five minutes after he left, my wits and the solution came to me. By far the best candidate for these conditions, and especially for sunny exposures, is the tough "smoke tree" (continus coggyria). The smoke tree belongs to the cashew family and generates its own nitrogen as do the peas and clovers.

GROWS AS LARGE SHRUB

It most often grows as a large shrub with many trunks, eventually reaching a maximum height of 25 feet and a similar spread in a V-shaped form. It is deciduous, with blue green leaves turning orange and yellow in fall.

The smoke tree gets its name from large, loose clusters of fading flowers creating the impression of smoke puffs. The green-leaved variety has lavender, purple blossom puffs and the purple-leaved variety has a richer, reddish-purple hue to its flower clusters.

Once established this tree actually resents feeding and

watering and it is at its best in poor, rocky soil. Help it through its first season with mulch and infrequent watering, after that leave it alone.

Be careful at planting time as the roots resent being disturbed. The tree can be maintained at less than maximum height by occasional pruning.

The evergreen santolina, or lavender cotton, likes similar

conditions and provides a striking combination as a ground cover. With its billowy mass of tiny grey leaves, it looks for all the world like a grey cloud draped over the ground.

It is a blessing that I have this column to correct some of the errors or omissions caused by my wayward mind. I would not know what to do without it.

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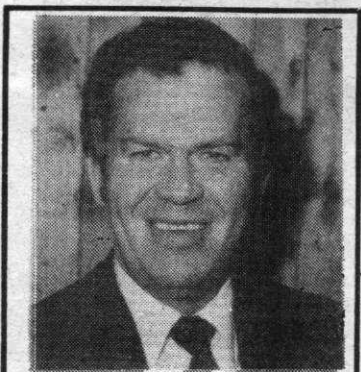
Trustees will use the bar

Local trustees, it was decided, would drink in the bar instead.



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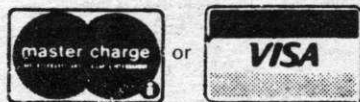
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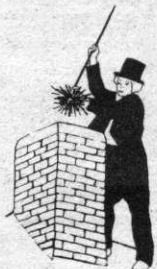

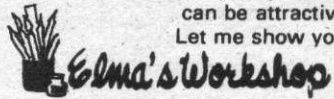

averaging would encourage retention of the large land holdings and would be consistent with rural zoning provisions in other island bylaws."

The bylaw will not change the 10-acre limit for development but would provide better control over residential development than the current regulations for Prevost as outlined in a Capital Regional District bylaw.

No more wrecks for SAM

SAM is slowly munching its last automobile and soon will have its appetite sated.

SAM, otherwise known as Salvage, Assembly and Manufacture, has been a program run by the provincial ministry of environment. The idea was to collect the rusting auto hulks littering B.C.'s landscape.

For 10 years the program collected the abandoned vehicles at a rate of up to 16,000 cars per year. The wrecks were crushed and transported to a firm on the lower mainland where the salvaged metal was used to make reinforcing steel

for concrete.

Recent years have seen a reduction in the number of vehicles abandoned because of the high price of steel, which has made recycling the cars more profitable for the owners.

The program has not cleaned up the entire province and wrecks remain to litter remote areas.

"However, ministry staff in these remote areas will work with regional officials to find remedies for such problems," said Stephen Rogers, minister of the environment, "bearing in mind that private industry now has the

necessary facilities for crushing, transporting and shredding used auto bodies."

Workers in the program will be employed elsewhere within the government, said Rogers.

Subdivision on hold as dye tests are carried out

The new subdivision near Maxwell Lake is still on hold pending results of dye tests.

The rezoning plans for the six residential buildings had been given approval in principle by the Islands Trust and a draft bylaw had been prepared. The bylaw, however, was tabled in order to explore options for protecting the area of the property which is in the Maxwell Lake watershed.

The options available included granting acquisition of the watershed portion to the North Salt Spring Waterworks District or leasing that part to the district. A covenant was also considered limiting the use of the watershed.

Only a portion of the property is in the watershed area and the waterworks district began a series of dye tests to determine the exact dividing line. When the line is found, the waterworks district could buy the land outright for preservation.

Information gathered from the dye testing will be used when further discussions between the property owners and the

waterworks district officials resume. The owner could at that time convey the land involved to either the district or a non-profit society.

No injuries

The road was rough, the car was travelling fast and the combination proved troublesome.

John Delafrancie was driving on Isle View Road, Salt Spring Island, on March 7. He hit a patch of rough road and the car bounced on to the shoulder of the road and into a tree.

The vehicle was damaged on the left rear fender but the driver was not injured. He was, however, charged with travelling too fast for road conditions.

Damage was estimated at \$1,000.

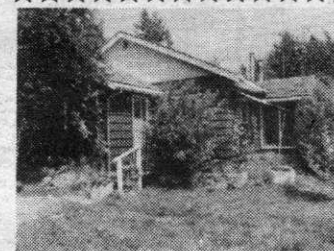

Trollers see lack of clear goals in interim report

There is a storm brewing on the Pacific coast and it could boil over any day.

The federal ministry of fisheries and oceans commissioned Dr. Peter Pearse to study west coast fishing and present recommendations on how to improve the industry.

Following the release of an interim report by Pearse, the minister of fisheries and oceans, Romeo LeBlanc, decided to act on several of the ideas.

The interim report met with less than favourable response from fishermen, particularly the Pacific Trollers Association.

That group expressed concern over the apparent lack of clear policy goals or stated aims of the interim report.

In a letter to LeBlanc, John Sanderson, a director of the association, said, "We believe that rather than a plan for the future, Pearse is proposing continuation of the past."

LANDING CHARGES

LeBlanc decided earlier this month to act on the interim report. He began efforts to introduce a system of landing charges on Pacific salmon catches. The royalties collected are to be directed at offsetting the cost of the salmonid enhancement program.

The trollers agree with conservation of the salmon but so far the rules laid down by Ottawa have forced them to fish chinooks and coho, two species in short supply.

Tight restrictions have been placed on catches of sockeye and pinks although the two fish are more abundant than the other species.

The ministry will announce the level of charges and the date of coming into force later in the year.

Enabling legislation will come before parliament shortly.

The trollers say they favour a royalty on catches of salmon to support the enhancement program but not at the levels suggested by Pearse. He proposed a level which, the trollers claim, would amount to 20 to 40% of their net income after taxes.

QUOTA SYSTEM

LeBlanc indicated a willingness to introduce a quota system for halibut and herring. He said a committee will be set up to iron out the technical problems of implementing the quotas.

Which is what the trollers had asked for. They quote Pearse as saying that trollers have a historic right to 10% of the halibut catch but are careful not to commit themselves because of perceived ambiguities in the recommendations.

The minister stands convinced that a quota system is needed and that it may be beneficial to the halibut fishery. He said a new approach is required and that the quota system might alleviate the current situation and lead to a reduction of costs of fishing.

A point of potential friction arises in the area of licences. LeBlanc will depend upon various committees to determine the method of licences and

transferability of licenses.

The trollers point out that when a fisherman sells a boat, the regulations require that the next boat he buys must be limited to 80% of capacity.

CANT GO WITH BOAT

The licence can not go with the boat because it is worth only 80%. The fisherman must find someone else to buy the licence. The transaction then involves four people.

The regulation had been imposed to attempt to limit the fishing fleet as a way of improving the value of catches for the fishermen.

Pearse is expected to present his final report later this year and LeBlanc indicated that the decision to move selectively on recommendations from the interim report was carefully considered "to ensure that these decisions will not compromise options for the future."

The trollers claim that Pearse misunderstood the industry in two important areas. He has not recognized the importance of the troller to the economy of small coastal communities.

He has not understood the nature and economics of the troll fishery itself, they claim.

WILL WAIT

But LeBlanc will wait until the

final report before initiating more comprehensive changes for fisheries resource management, development and use.

"It is within the framework of this long-term strategy that I foresee the many pieces of the fish management puzzle falling into place," said LeBlanc, "so that our fisheries will begin to realize their full potential contribution to the economic and social well-being of Canadians."

The trollers, on the other hand, see things in a different light. They

say that Ottawa just does not understand nor listen to the fishermen.

In a reply to the interim Pearse Report the trollers end by saying, "We further believe that since the report gives no indication of its goals and of the conditions it hopes to create, future fisheries managers will be in no better position than they are today."

"If this report is adopted the fishery of the future will be run on the same ad hoc basis as it is today."

Spoor was wearing ear protectors which took most of the force of the blow. He suffered fractures to bones in the side of his face and was rushed to hospital.

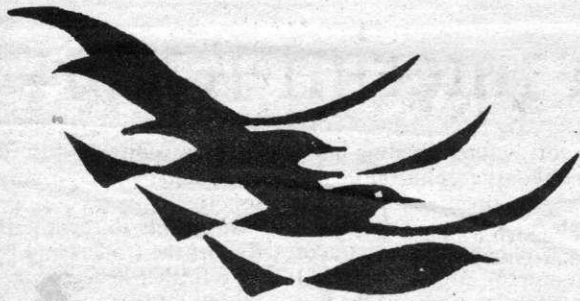
The accident occurred last Thursday. Spoor teaches business education and commerce at the secondary school. He also has a home at St. Mary Lake on Salt Spring.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

TWENTY YEARS AGO

Driftwood began its third year of publication with the issue of March 22, 1962.

The bicyclist avoided a stretch of the main road into Ganges because of a dog which took keen delight in biting the person. News came that all was fine, the dog had graduated dog-obedience school. The bicyclist rode past the house assuming the dog had learned. It hadn't. The bicyclist was bitten again.

The bridge players were beginners who had taken lessons and in the first round of a tournament, they won their games. The man who had taught them the fine points of the game lost his first-round efforts.

The pianists from Salt Spring and Prevost Islands brought awards and trophies back with them from a competition in the Duncan Music Festival. The 11 girls were competing with up to 55 other young piano players and placed high in each class of competition.

Representatives of the Salt Spring Lions Club journeyed to Nanaimo for the Spring Conference of District 19-A (B.C. and Northern Washington).

Gil Humphreys, of Salt Spring Lands Ltd., announced his candidacy for the nomination for the Liberal party to contest the local federal riding. He joined two others seeking the nod. Humphreys was a school trustee for the Gulf Islands School Board and sat as chairman for that group.

Salt Spring Island residents were curious about an army survey crew who were busy at Beaver Point.

Driftwood Poetry: The saddest word of tongue and pen/ We sold the baby buggy and then....

St. Patrick's Day was noted in fine style by the ladies of the Mizpah unit of the Ganges United Church. The women gathered to hold their tea with the theme being the patron saint of Ireland.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce called a public meeting to protest the inclusion of the Gulf Islands into the Capital Regional District for hospital purposes. Guest speaker was to be an official from the ministry of municipal affairs.

Opposition to the move to have the Gulf Islands included in the CRD was voiced at a meeting of residents and John Tisdalle, member of the legislative assembly for Saanich and the Islands. Tisdalle outlined the benefits of the plan but islanders did not see the merger as one which would help the Gulf Islands in very many ways.

The medical health officer Dr. J.L. Whitbread, warned of the potential danger of an outbreak of infectious hepatitis in Ganges. Tests carried out in the village area showed that surface water and water in low-lying areas was being

polluted by effluent from septic systems. He urged that the situation be corrected.

The Pender Island Farmers' Institute heard a call for conservation in the Gulf Islands. The guest speaker at the meeting pointed out the balance which had been struck by pioneers between cleared and forested land. He said the cleared land should not be allowed to return to forest but should be maintained. The benefits to wildlife of the pastures was great, he said.

Galiano Island centennial project received promised funding from the provincial and federal governments. The project was to construct a carved relief map of Galiano at a cost of \$1,200, half of which came from public donations.

The Bank of Montreal announced plans for the construction of a new branch in Ganges. The new building would replace the premises which the bank had occupied since 1946.

TEN YEARS AGO

The summer program for Salt Spring Island youth was cut back by Ottawa. The organizers of the project had asked for more than \$60,000 to help 75 young people earn money over the summer. The Salt Spring project was granted \$17,135 for 15 persons.

Four dogs, which were harassing sheep, were shot on the spot. Two dogs were destroyed by a Beddis Road farmer and two other dogs were shot by RCMP officers on Canal Road.

Galiano school students were commended for good behaviour by the staff at the Dominion Observatory in Saanich following a visit by the students to the site.

Teachers at Gulf Islands schools raised the question of insurance coverage for their automobiles when they drive students to various events. Such insurance should be a matter of concern to all school boards in the province, said a Salt Spring insurance company.

The Galiano Club met and discussed the problems involved with moving the garbage dump on the island. The dump, located on Bluff Road, was to be moved to another location and the club decided to spend money on construction of a road to as well as preliminary work on the site.

The salt springs on Salt Spring attracted students from UBC who came to the island to observe the springs and examine the interesting geological character of the island.

Juvenile soccer teams from Salt Spring played three games against opposition from Vancouver Island and won two while tying the other.

The Gulf Islands branch of the B.C. Historical Association met on Saturna Island. The 50 people in attendance heard a presentation on two historic forts in the interior.

The school dormitory on

Ganges Hill could become a national youth hostel if plans for the transfer could be successfully worked out. The school board was checking the possibility of turning the building over to Canadian Youth Hostel.

FIVE YEARS AGO

The herring spawn was estimated at 3,500 tons, which was at least 1,000 tons more than the previous year but down dramatically from the 20,000 tons recorded three years before. The herring spawn best when vegetation is present and fisheries officials speculate the herring had moved north to more fertile spawning grounds.

A hovercraft was put through its paces in Ganges Harbour. The craft, a Hurricane Windcraft built in Ohio, was capable of speeds up to 25 mph on water, 35 mph on land and 45 mph on ice. Constructed of fibreglass, the 12-foot hovercraft weighed 350 pounds and could carry two people.

The provincial government remained in control of dog control as far as the Capital Regional Board was concerned. The department of agriculture had been attempting to shift responsibility to the CRD but was unwilling to commit money to the venture.

A ship from the federal department of the environment visited Ganges Harbour to run a series of checks on the harbour bottom.

A meeting in Ganges to discuss planning heard several versions of the ultimate population of Salt Spring. Figures varied from a low of 15,000 to a high of 50,000. The top figure would best be accommodated by a bridge link with Vancouver Island, but participants at the meeting were less than enthusiastic about either a large population or a bridge.

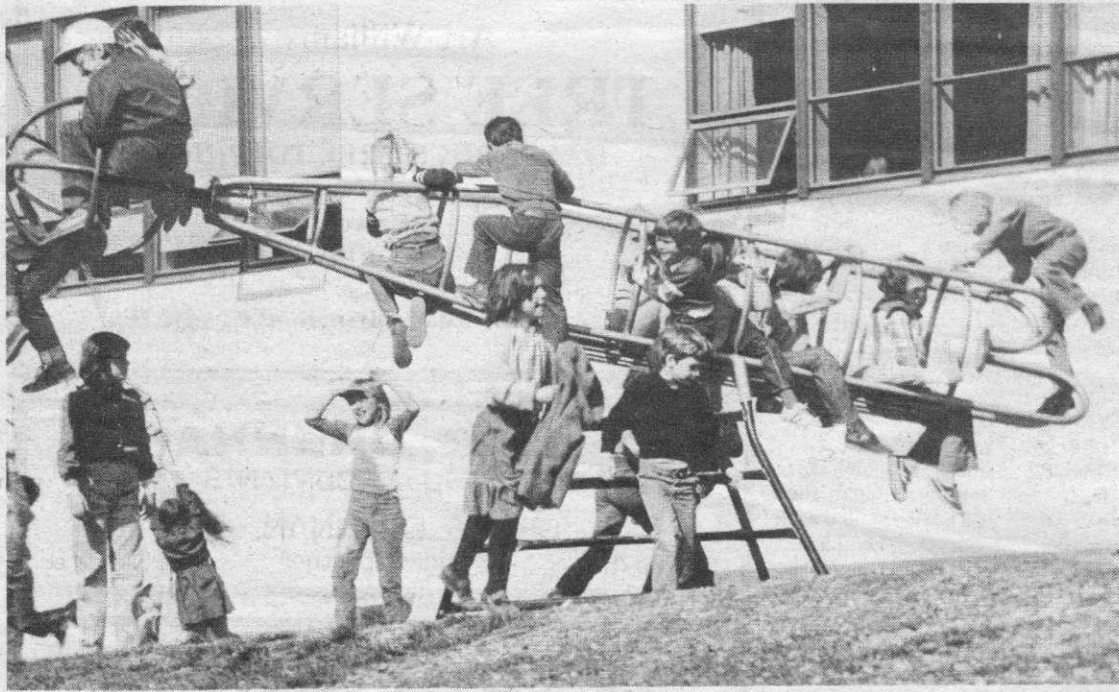

New toy has proved popular, as students have been swarming over it at every opportunity this week.

Year of Disabled Persons is being extended by society

The year has become extended for a group of handicapped people in the Gulf Islands.

Last year was the International Year of Disabled Persons and from it sprung the Gulf Islands Handicapped Society. From a shaky beginning caused by a grant application refusal by the federal government, the group today is active and pursuing its goals.

The federal grant was denied despite entreaties from Jim Manly, the local MP, Hugh Curtis, the local MLA, and the provincial health minister. Ottawa kicked in \$500,000 to the efforts of groups across the country and the money was spread thinly with only seven grants coming to B.C.

The provincial government took up the slack with a \$2 million fund for handicapped endeavours. The Gulf Islands group was awarded \$8,000.

The society formed itself in anticipation of funding and the seven-member board of directors went to work.

SHOWED FILMS

They showed films to the public, to school children and to service clubs. They tackled the red tape necessary to become a non-profit, charitable organization.

Currently the group is seeking legal advice on various aspects of being handicapped. They are also attempting to secure needed wheelchairs. They counsel the handicapped on careers and help purchase aids such as talking books for the blind and visual aids for captioned television programs for the deaf.

If a handicapped person needs

something and cannot pay for it, the group searches for sponsors. They have approached the Kinsmen Rehabilitation Foundation in Vancouver but have had the most success with the local Lions Club.

PARKING SPACES

A project which will be under way with the warm weather is the creation of handicapped parking spaces around Ganges. The group has met with success in talking to various managers and owners of businesses in the islands about the matter.

A special parking spot will be made available near the front door to the post office, for instance. The spot will be marked with the words "Disabled Parking Only" and with the universal symbol of the little person in a wheelchair.

"We cannot stop the non-disabled from using or abusing the slots," said group spokesman Bryan Smith, "but our board of directors will be on the alert to leave a conscience note on the offender's windscreen."

Disabled drivers in the Gulf Islands will be given a sticker to place on the windshield of the vehicle to identify a proper user of the reserved space.

ACCESS RAMP

To help the handicapped enjoy community events, the operators of Mahon Hall have indicated a willingness to install a ramp to aid access to plays, shows and exhibitions.

Another project planned for the summer is an "Aid to the Handicapped Week" to be held in Ganges. The group plans to offer

posters and pamphlets to encourage people to learn about the handicapped and how they cope.

The grant for the Gulf Islands Handicapped Society runs out at the end of June and the group is planning a donation drive to allow them to carry the Year of the Disabled Person into the future.

"We have proved the value and need for such a society," said Smith, "and it will then rest on the response we receive to our appeals."

Fisherman saved after boat sinks

The lone occupant of a 36-foot fishboat was rescued Saturday morning by the B.C. Lifeboat Society at Pender Island after his boat, *Granddaddy*, sank between Sucia and Waldron Islands in U.S. waters.

Lifeboat Society rescuers picked up the fisherman, an American, at about 4:45 am after he had escaped from the sinking boat in a dinghy.

He was taken to East Point and transferred to a helicopter which flew him to Bellingham, Wash.



To meet with deputy

Members of the board of directors of Lady Minto Hospital on Salt Spring Island will meet with the deputy minister of health later this week.

The directors have sought the meeting to urge the ministry to look into charges of money mismanagement claimed by Capital Regional District director for Salt Spring, Yvette Valcourt.

Valcourt claimed that the hospital board could have saved money by putting the laundry out for contract and that failure to do so by the board cost taxpayers more than \$112,000 in the past two years.

Wes Edwards, chairman of the Lady Minto board, said the only correct action in light of the charges was to have the ministry of health look into the matter.

If the hospital had accepted the contract for laundry, he said, the hospital's operating costs would have increased, not decreased.
