

Restraint borne by staff of school district here

The budget cuts prepared by the Gulf Islands School Board will affect members of the Canadian Union of Public Employees working for the district.

By cutting back on the number of hours worked by some CUPE members, the board can save money not only on salaries but also on fringe benefits. The board would face reduced expenditures for pensions, as well as sick leave accumulations.

Problems crop up when the cuts are looked at closely. Some of the items are in violation of the collective agreement between the board and the union. Regardless of the amount cut this year, the restraint program continues and more cuts would have to be made in 1983 and 1984.

One of the areas of agreement which may fall by the way is an expressed intention to give local workers parity with CUPE members working for the Saanich School District.

Adjustments to the budget through cutting time for CUPE members comes to approximately \$53,000. The figure is arrived at by cutting \$10,400 from the budget for aides who supervise children

Teachers in the Gulf Islands Teachers' Association had reached an agreement with the school board to relieve the teachers of supervisory duties. GITA president Michael Hayes said that the letter of agreement would be adhered to and that no teacher would be forced into noon-hour or bus supervision.

COULD VOLUNTEER

He did not rule out a teacher volunteering for the duties, however.

One of the custodial staff is retiring and the board will not replace him which along with other cutbacks in custodial services would mean a \$19,000 savings on the reduced budget.

One of the instructors on the GIPSY program has also been let go to save another \$9,000. The remainder of the savings accrue through cuts to the aides program, reduction in the number of hours worked by other CUPE members as well as a related savings in benefits.

The executive of CUPE local 788 met with the personnel committee of the school board earlier this week to discuss the situation.

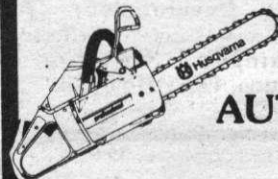

One child's parents see his work as 'vital, essential'

Consultant called upon to help 106 last year

This week *Driftwood* begins a series of three stories on the Gulf Islands School District personnel affected by restraints on spending.

The series will examine the positions that are to be terminated at the end of this month: the support services consultant, speech therapist, hospital-homebound teacher and the six aides.

This week's story, by *Driftwood* editor Tony Richards, looks at the role of the support services consultant, Ralph Miller.

The child was eight years old, enrolled in Grade 3 at Salt Spring Elementary School and he couldn't write.

A curious aspect of the case was that when he was approached by his teacher, his writing became worse. As the teacher got closer, the more gross his handwriting became.

The child was diagnosed as being dysgraphic and it was a problem he was expected to have for some time to come.

But within three weeks, with the help of the Gulf Islands School District's support services consultant, the child was writing satisfactorily.

The consultant was Dr. Ralph Miller and the story represents one of his successes as an educational psychologist in the local school district.

It remains to be seen, however, how much assistance Miller will be able to provide local children in future, as his position was one of those terminated by the district a few weeks ago.

In the case of the dysgraphic child, one of the basic problems was insecurity. A lot of children are insecure, says Miller, and will do whatever they have to to get the attention they crave.

One method of dealing with such a situation is to give attention to those who are doing their work properly — focus on those who are working rather than on those who aren't.

Miller terms it a positive energy approach.

Local couple see work as vital

During the past 12 months, Miller estimates that he has been called upon to help 106 local children.

One of them was the son of Rick and Judy Boylan of Salt Spring Island, and today they see Miller's work as "vital and essential".

They wrote to the school board last week, objecting to the termination of Miller's position.

They described his assistance to

their son as invaluable, and noted that he had diagnosed some previously unsuspected basic mechanical problems. Auditory discrimination and hand coordination, for example, had affected the child's performance and attitude.

Miller, they wrote, developed an effective remedial program.

Today, their son is far happier with learning — and with himself — than he has been for years.

Miller himself has credentials that are impressive, to say the least.

He took his undergraduate training in psychology at the University of Michigan from 1958-1963, where he worked on the development of language programs, conducted research on visual perception at the neuropsychology laboratory and taught undergraduate psychology laboratory courses.

Master's, doctorate degrees in psychology

Between 1963 and 1967 he took his master's and doctorate degrees in psychology, concentrating on personality development, neuropsychology of learning and perception, tests and measurement and methods in educational psychology.

It was in the fall of last year that the position of support services consultant was created here. It combined the position of community-school worker (a job which Miller took over from Nick Gilbert in January, 1981) and the contract position which Miller had held to provide psychological and educational services.

It was during the 1980-81 school year that Miller first began providing educational psychology services to the district.

Before that, children who were in need of such help were referred to the Ministry of Health's Integrated Services for Child and Family Development. The procedure was not very effective, according to supervisor of instruction, Larry Holbrook.

Although the demand was not great (three to five cases a year on average), it was difficult to get the service when it was wanted, he said.

Both Holbrook and Miller agreed that one of the shortcomings of Integrated Services was the lack of follow-up in cases involving islands students. Those who were referred to it were the students with serious problems.

The demand for psychological services is greater today, said Holbrook. Higher enrolment is one reason. Another is the attraction of the islands to people trying to get away from the problems of the city and bringing those problems with them.

Most live with only one parent

Single-parent family situations also contribute to the need for services such as Miller's. Most of the children he has worked with live with only one parent.

The support services consultant's job description, although it hasn't been given official board approval, includes the following terms of reference.

- * To provide educational support services in co-ordination with principals, teachers and other district staff.

- * To act as liaison between the community, home, school and related social service and health agencies.

- * To assist the schools in the solution of emotional and behavioural problems.

- * To provide individual psychological, behavioural and educational assessment and/or consultation.

- * To develop home and school programs and/or to provide counselling to assist teachers, parents and children to overcome social, psychological and educational difficulties; to provide in-service training for related individuals and groups; and to assist in implementing, co-ordinating and evaluating special programs and support services.

- * To act as child advocate or ombudsman in resolving conflicts involving the school, home and/or community.

- * To assist the school and community in prompt action when pupils, parents or other related people have unexpected personal crises or social problems.

Teacher counselling as well

Miller's duties have also taken him into the area of teacher counselling for anxiety, stress, depression and marital problems.

Of his cases over the past year, most have been of a short counselling, consulting or conflict resolution nature, says Miller, with ongoing monitoring.

Some cases have required full neuropsychological (psychology relating to the nerves), educational and social assessments with elaborate remedial programs.

Dealing with acute crisis situations is not uncommon, with occasional runaways, suicide attempts, violence in the home and trouble with the law.

"Most of the kids I'm involved with have learning difficulties and primary educational problems — either alone, or more commonly, in combination with emotional/social difficulties."

The job description of the traditional psychologist or social worker does not adequately describe Miller's position.

"Much of what I do fits under the headings of detective, trouble-shooter, coach, tutor and ombudsman..."

Traditionally, Miller says, services for children have been fractionated and isolated, as dictated by the sources of funding rather than the needs of the child.

As an example, the ministries of health and human resources are restricted in terms of classroom and academic involvement. On the other hand, the ministry of education usually focuses on education with little or no family and community involvement.

"This job, with both community social work and educational psychology aspects integrated... has enabled the design and delivery of simple and effective programs to meet the needs of the kids in this district."

Next week, reporter Bill Webster will examine the role and responsibilities of the district speech therapist.

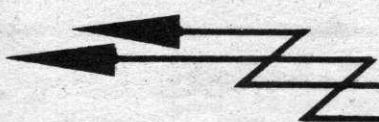

Knowledge Network

The dish must point to equator

Glen Mitchell, field representative for Knowledge Network West, met with a group of Salt Spring Islanders last week to discuss programming, equipment and provincial grants to bring the Network to the island.

Knowledge Network broadcasts approximately 14 hours per day, according to Mitchell, with programs prepared by various colleges, universities and other organizations on a wide range of subjects.

As the transmission is by satellite, the receiver must be a dish, three metres in diameter, set at an unobstructed 30° tilt towards the equator, explained Mitchell. Additional technical data was discussed with Brian Logan of Salt Spring Cablevision.

Transmission of the signal received by the dish is accomplished by either re-broadcasting on a frequency for direct reception by TV sets in the

area, or through a cable system to sets "on the line". Each method has advantages and disadvantages.

LOCATION OF SET

For direct-from-dish reception sets would have to be in a satisfactory location relative to the dish, a sort of line-of-sight situation. Mitchell and Logan agreed that one dish to serve all Salt Springers would not be possible due to geographical conditions on the island. However, for those in range the reception would be "free and easy". Servicing the dish, its transmitter and power lines, would be an expense in ratio to accessibility.

With dish-to-cable, the dish site considerations are less critical and no separate transmitter is needed. The incoming signal is converted electronically and is fed into the cable system as with the other channels. Logan indicated that Channel 10 would be the likely spot. S.S. Cablevision currently

served approximately 65% of the population. An additional 10% is likely in the near future. Sets not on cable would be unable to receive Channel 10. Servicing could be part of the normal routine of the cable company under an agreement.

PROVINCIAL GRANTS

Mitchell explained that the provincial involvement in Knowledge Network includes providing grants to cover up to 100% of costs. Included are dish, necessary electronics and hardware, and installation. Not included are yearly maintenance costs.

Grant applications are available to non-profit societies whose responsibilities would then include licence and site acquisition, letting of contracts for supplier and installer and yearly maintenance of the system.

Mitchell said that Lake Cowichan is the most recent applicant and there are 72 other B.C. Communities now in the Knowledge Network. Grants are generally in the \$20,000-\$30,000 range.

In summarizing, Mitchell stated that to get Knowledge Network on Salt Spring a society should be formed or a committee struck from an existing organization, several bids from supplier/installers secured, and the application submitted. If accepted, the application could then be acted upon by the society and the work on the system begun.

Nature notes

Binoculars are the basic tool of the bird watcher

Everybody can recognize some of the birds on Salt Spring Island and many of us would like to be able to identify more of them.

Of the 50-odd species which nest here, many are not familiar to all of us, even though some may be quite common in local gardens.

To identify birds, a guide book with colour illustrations, and a pair of binoculars, are required tools.

A bird field guide is a pocket-size book which contains a picture of every bird you are likely to see, as well as a brief text which will aid identification. Both book stores on Salt Spring carry the standard guides: *Peterson's Field Guide to Western Birds*, and *Birds of North America* by Robins, Bruum, Zim and Singer.

AND WHAT IT ISN'T

Both books contain material on many more birds than are to be found here and part of the process of identification is to determine what it is not.

Many of us who have lived in the east will know and love the blue jay, which does not occur here. Our crested jay is the dark Steller's jay.

Just to complicate the game, we do have the red-breasted yellow-bellied sapsucker. This is a small member of the woodpecker tribe

which has an all-red head but the red extends into a yellow breast and belly. Such differences and similarities are well illustrated in the field guides.

To comfortably observe birds and thus see the details of colour and structure binoculars are a must. They are the badge and constant companion of all bird watchers. Binoculars are available in various powers of image magnification and "brightness".

The favourite of most birders is marked "7x35" which magnifies the image seven times and is bright enough to see birds in forest shadows or on a dull day. I use a "7x50" which has the same magnification but is a bit brighter.

FOCUSING
The preferred type for field work focusses with a knob which adjusts both eyes at the same time. Some marine binoculars focus each eye separately and are suitable for looking at large, slow-moving objects at considerable distance. They are awkward for near-by, fast-moving birds.

For assistance in local bird identification, birders may contact the Salt Spring Island Trail and Nature Club. The outings of this active group are announced in *Driftwood* each month. You are invited to participate in their activities.

Juggling for industrial education at Mayne School

The Industrial Education Workshop for the Mayne Island School will require a juggling of accounts to keep costs in line.

John Zacharias, chairman of the building and grounds committee for the Gulf Islands School District told the trustees how the money will fit the project last week.

The architect has said the new

wing will cost approximately \$200,000 but the trustees have only grants to cover \$152,000.

Savings can be made by dropping insurance of \$1,000, not hiring a watchman for \$3,000, not building a covered walk way for \$11,000 and adjusting the heating for a \$4,000 saving. The total from such measures is \$19,000 which

reduces the architects estimate to \$181,000.

But the account would remain \$29,000 short.

Zacharias told the trustees that if costs and purchases were closely watched, a further saving of \$15,200, which is a normal cost-overrun, could be realized.

But the account would remain

\$14,000 short.

The juggling act would come into play by moving \$19,000 slated for improvements to the school board office on Salt Spring and taking another \$33,000 from the conveyance account. The board would have to ask the ministry of education for permission to switch the money.

Zacharias said that if economies are practiced, money could be stretched to cover the construction but if further money were needed, other accounts could be raided to cover shortages.

The costs have been kept in line by having a proposed planner room put off until 1983 when it would be included in the capital expenditure budget for that year.

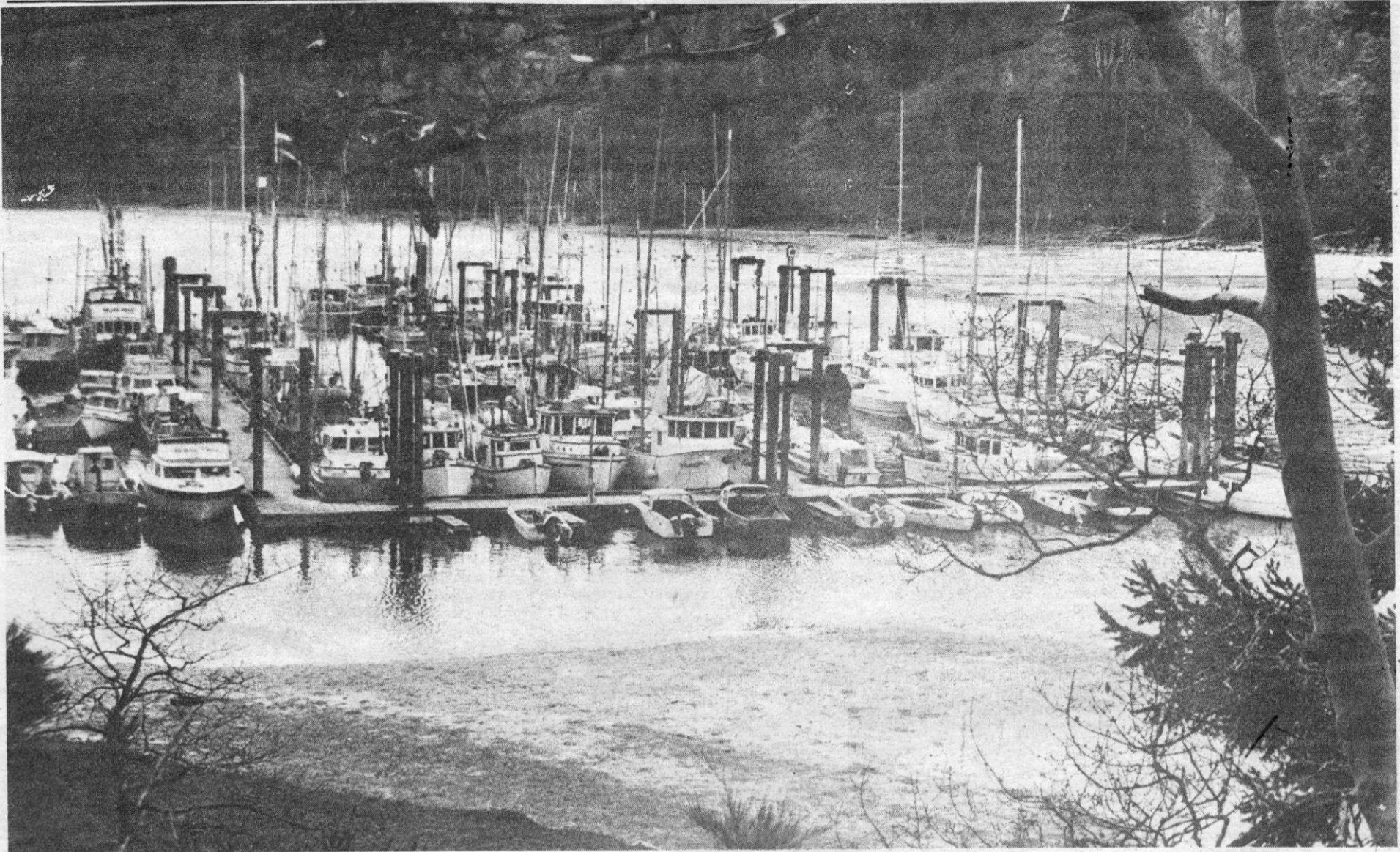

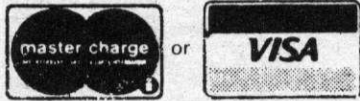

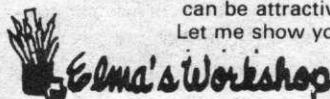

Wind too slow for trial of generator by B.C. Hydro

B.C. Hydro has completed a year of testing a wind turbine and officials concluded that it is an expensive way to create electricity.

The wind turbine, a joint project of the electric company, the National Research Council and the provincial ministry of energy, mines and petroleum resources, cost \$250,000 to design, manufacture, install and operate.

Hydro officials pointed out that the cost of power from the experimental turbine, if equipment and installation costs were spread over the 20-year design life of the turbine, would be approximately 50 times the cost of hydroelectric generation.

The test was to gauge the durability, performance and efficiency of the vertical axis turbine which resembles a large inverted egg beater. Project engineer, Nick VanderKwaak of B.C. Hydro said the turbine proved to be of sturdy design and no major problems occurred in either the mechanical or electrical components.

The windmill produced 28,000 kilowatt hours of electricity during the year of tests and the power was fed into the provincial grid. The winds at Christopher Point near Victoria proved to be lower in speed than expected.

Possible savings could be made if the turbines were used in conjunction with expensive diesel

generators in remote locations in the province.

Hydro is also currently studying wind speeds at five potential coastal sites. They have set up wind speed recording instruments at Masset, Sandspit and Tlell on the Queen Charlotte Islands and at

Bamfield and Walter's Cove on Vancouver Island.

The NRC paid \$125,000 for the design and manufacture of the turbine while B.C. Hydro paid the same amount for installation and operation. The ministry of energy contributed \$25,000 to the costs.

Saturna senior students all set to attend on Mayne

Grade 7 students from Saturna Island will travel to Mayne Island school again in September.

The Gulf Islands School Board will continue the practice of having the Grade 7 students join Grade 8 and 9 students at the Mayne School. The children travel from Saturna to Mayne by water taxi and are bused from Horton Bay to the school.

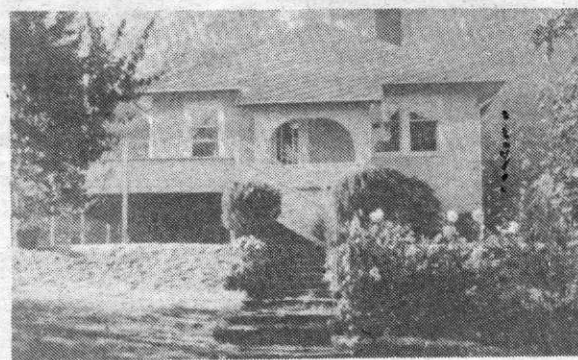
At least five Saturna children will be entering Grade 7 in September. The current population of the Saturna School is 18 compared to 33 students who were in attendance in 1980.

The Grade 7 students join 11 other pupils in the two higher grades for the trip to Mayne each day.

The school trustees do not anticipate additional costs for

water taxi because space is available on the vessel to handle the number of children commuting.

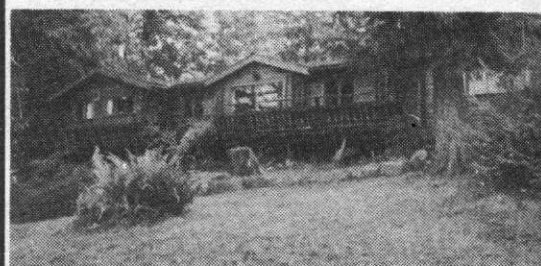

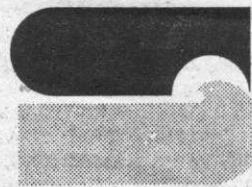

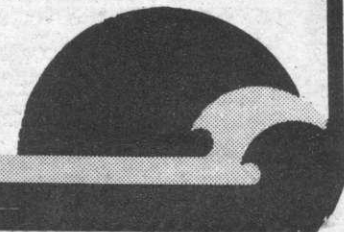

The Galiano project, classroom

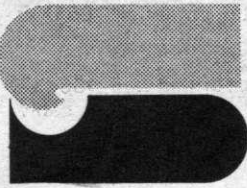
additions and a community centre, will require more of the foreman's time.

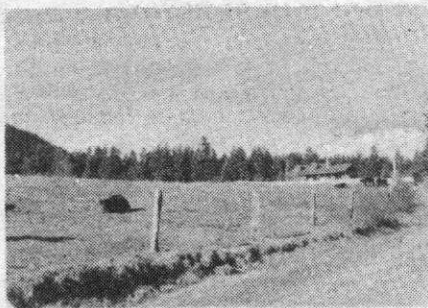

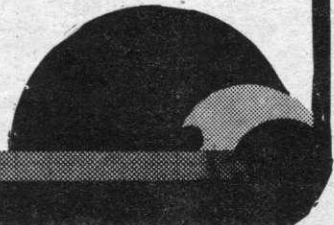

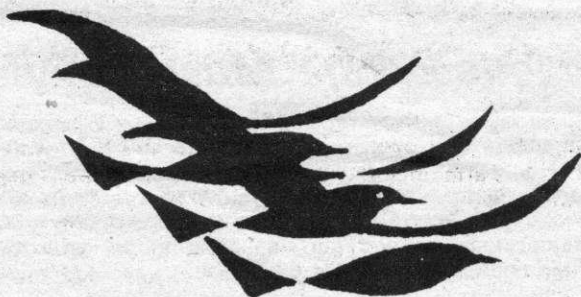

Students to take part in run for disabled

Wednesday, April 28, high school students from across British Columbia will run around the world 12 times.

For the fourth year, Gulf Islands secondary students from Grades 7 to 12 will participate in the "Milk Run". The event is sponsored by the B.C. Dairy Foundation and organized by B.C. School Sports.

The Salt Spring run will be organized by Larry Roy with the help of students from Grade 12. Each participant will run three kilometres and make a donation which will go to help disabled children in the province.

When the run is completed, each participant will receive a small carton of milk compliments of Island Farms. Adults are urged to take part and with 300 cartons of milk to distribute, organizers are hoping for a good turn-out.

The superlatives of the event see up to 290 schools in the province sending more than 150,000 students jogging up to 510,000 km and burning off 31.9 million calories.

The distance involved would see the students run 71 times across Canada or 12 times around the world.

Last year, runners donated \$27,000 after expenses which went to the Variety Club, B.C. Blind Sports and the B.C. Division of Canadian Wheelchair Sports Association.

Motion not rescinded

Islanders held up by courts to be held up little more

Plea by Salt Spring Island Regional Director to have documents released by a court was rejected by the Capital Regional District last week.

The island director asked the board to rescind a 1980 motion in connection with the ruling of the Pollution Control Board.

When the PCB ordered an extended outfall into Ganges Harbour in 1980 the Capital Regional Board resolved to appeal the decision, explained Valcourt.

She also referred to a petition which came before the Supreme Court challenging the authority of the provincial cabinet to make rulings on the installation of a sewer.

The court ruled that the cabinet did, in fact, have that authority, she explained.

As a result of the court action "certain citizens" who had filed documents before the court are unable to recover them.

The court will not release them until the board revokes its decision and announces that the appeal against the PCB decision is abandoned, said the island director.

The board might want to consider the motion after Saturday's tour of the Ganges sewer area, suggested Executive Director Dennis Young.

"The motion deals with the outfall and the decision to extend the outfall," said Valcourt. That outfall is completed, she noted.

The material involved is very costly, submitted Valcourt.

OTHER MATTERS

The PCB permit refers to other

matters, such as the times of discharge and the treatment plant, said J.D. Watts.

It also governs the quality of discharge and details of construction of the holding tanks, agreed Young.

"It seems to me we would be very foolish to pass this motion at this time," observed Watts. Normally a long outfall is balanced with short treatment, he suggested and a short outfall with a long treatment.

"We could want to continue this appeal. We might not want to, but we should keep our options open."

The motion had not been before the solid wastes and sewage committee, he added.

Could the people concerned not recover their material, enquired Ken Hill.

It was very valuable material, paid for out of their own pockets, noted Valcourt.

There was no seconder to the motion to cancel the appeal.

\$495 for 11 sheep destroyed

Total compensation of \$495 was approved last week for a Salt Spring Island farmer whose sheep were destroyed by dogs.

On February 1, seven Suffolk ewes and four Suffolk lambs belonging to J.T. Brown, Beaver Point Road, were attacked and killed by unknown dogs.

Chief Animal Control Officer Bill Leach reported that the CRD guidelines had been met and authorized the payment.

Compensation is based on 75% of the value of the animals lost. The seven ewes were valued at \$80 each and the lambs at \$25, to make a total of \$660. The payment is then calculated at \$495.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

A jeep parked in front of the Fernwood Store rolled away without anyone at the wheel. A couple of children who had been sitting in the jeep jumped out as it headed for the water. Near the bank, the vehicle swerved and ended the journey against a stump.

The Log Cabin Cafe offered a complete delicious Easter Sunday dinner for \$1.50 per person with children's portions at half-price. The meal consisted of choice roast turkey with cranberry sauce, baked or whipped potatoes, creamed cauliflower, golden corn, tasty dressing and old-fashioned giblet gravy. For those with other tastes, roast leg of lamb or honey-glazed ham were also available. also available.

Salt Spring residents were becoming upset at garbage and trash dumpers who had no concern for the environment. Garbage had been found in such out-of-the-way places as a creekbed near Musgrave Road and other secluded spots on the island.

The federal riding has been called simply Nanaimo but the name had been changed to Nanaimo, Cowichan and the Islands.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Gulf Islands School District set the school tax rate at 25.82 mills in order to raise \$423,798 as its share of the education budget. The province would be paying \$44,885 towards the cost of schools in the Gulf Islands which had been set at \$474,441 for the year.

The Red Cross fund-raising campaign came to an end on Salt Spring Island with a total of \$1,206.57 collected from residents. The amount represented the largest collection of money for the annual drive.

The Salt Spring Island Parent-Teacher Association voted itself out of existence at a meeting attended by 24 people. The group had been formed in 1945 and after 22 years of action many people had lost interest.

Centennial Memo: In 1865, James Douglas as a Hudson's Bay Company clerk was paid 60 pounds sterling a year.

Trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board decided to pressure the contractors who built the Gulf Islands Secondary School to fix the roof. It had been leaking for six months and repeated requests for repairs had been ignored.

Trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board voted themselves a 100% raise in pay and accepted, for the first time, remuneration of \$300 per year for their efforts on the board.

Ten Years Ago

Voters in the Gulf Islands would be able to go to the polls again to have a second shot at the school renovation referendum. The vote had failed at the regular elections in December and the trustees split the package in two and requested a second vote.

An adult drop-in centre being run by the Ganges United Church to help lonely adults was in danger of closing its doors because of lack of participation. The centre would remain open if signs of need could be found but one organizer put it bluntly when he said, "We have no desire to flog a dead horse."

Changes to land zoning requested by a Ganges businessman were opposed by two people on the grounds that the current use was illegal. The changes in zoning should await the installation of a sewer, one opponent to the changes suggested.

Galiano residents would be going to the polls to elect a representative to the Islands Trust. The incumbent had died and the islanders would be asked to name a replacement.

not receiving remuneration for their stewardship and a retiring trustee suggested that they should. Ratepayers attending the meeting declined to consider the matter.

The executive council of the Galiano Chamber of Commerce met for a monthly meeting. Residents of that island were urged to put forward suggestions or outline problems upon which the group could act.

The Paint and Sketch Club on Mayne Island held its seventh annual art show on Easter weekend. More than 300 people viewed the displayed works of Mayne artists.

The roller hockey season on Salt Spring Island ended with the annual banquet and presentation of trophies.

The meal consisted of choice roast turkey with cranberry sauce, baked or whipped potatoes, creamed cauliflower, golden corn, tasty dressing and old-fashioned giblet gravy. For those with other tastes, roast leg of lamb or honey-glazed ham were also available. also available.

Salt Spring residents were becoming upset at garbage and trash dumpers who had no concern for the environment. Garbage had been found in such out-of-the-way places as a creekbed near Musgrave Road and other secluded spots on the island.

The federal riding has been called simply Nanaimo but the name had been changed to Nanaimo, Cowichan and the Islands.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Gulf Islands School District set the school tax rate at 25.82 mills in order to raise \$423,798 as its share of the education budget. The province would be paying \$44,885 towards the cost of schools in the Gulf Islands which had been set at \$474,441 for the year.

The Red Cross fund-raising campaign came to an end on Salt Spring Island with a total of \$1,206.57 collected from residents. The amount represented the largest collection of money for the annual drive.

The Salt Spring Island Parent-Teacher Association voted itself out of existence at a meeting attended by 24 people. The group had been formed in 1945 and after 22 years of action many people had lost interest.

Centennial Memo: In 1865, James Douglas as a Hudson's Bay Company clerk was paid 60 pounds sterling a year.

Trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board decided to pressure the contractors who built the Gulf Islands Secondary School to fix the roof. It had been leaking for six months and repeated requests for repairs had been ignored.

Trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board voted themselves a 100% raise in pay and accepted, for the first time, remuneration of \$300 per year for their efforts on the board.

Ten Years Ago

Voters in the Gulf Islands would be able to go to the polls again to have a second shot at the school renovation referendum. The vote had failed at the regular elections in December and the trustees split the package in two and requested a second vote.

An adult drop-in centre being run by the Ganges United Church to help lonely adults was in danger of closing its doors because of lack of participation. The centre would remain open if signs of need could be found but one organizer put it bluntly when he said, "We have no desire to flog a dead horse."

The Paint and Sketch Club on Mayne Island held its seventh annual art show on Easter weekend. More than 300 people viewed the displayed works of Mayne artists.

The roller hockey season on Salt Spring Island ended with the annual banquet and presentation of trophies.

Three more systems break down in Ganges

At least two septic systems in Ganges aren't working anymore and a third system is suspect.

Capital Regional District health officer Dr. Alan Arneil said that dye tests conducted on two systems proved positive recently and the owners of the properties will be asked to correct the situations.

In another instance, a verbal complaint to Dr. Arneil's office of seepage from a septic system has

been looked at but the health officer needs a written complaint before acting. The situation is unusual, said Dr. Arneil in that three systems have failed within weeks of each other in different sections of the village.

WORSE IN WINTER

The problem in Ganges is generally worse in the winter and spring months because of the normally high water table is added to by run-off water. The septic tanks and fields don't work as well as in the summer months, which tend to be drier said Dr. Arneil.

The owners of the two confirmed failures will have up to six weeks to correct the faults and health officials will work with them to come up with a satisfactory solution.

Dr. Arneil indicated that when a written complaint about the third possible failure has been received, his department will act to test the system in question.

Directors examine corporation

When directors of the Capital Regional District took a close look at Ganges sewer area they took an interest in other matters.

The community of Ganges is urban in nature and should be incorporated, it was suggested.

Peter Pollen, Mayor of Victoria, suggested that incorporation was an excellent move.

Incorporation, already turned down by voters, in 1967, would transfer the responsibility for such installations as sewers from the region to the community.


